# CLOUD COMPUTING, OTHERS HEAD TO NEW YORK

With the glow of the sun pink on the horizon and most of the Pimlico Race Course stakes barn just beginning to rustle with activity, Preakness Stakes (G1) winner Cloud Computing departed from Baltimore to return to his Belmont Park home base May 21, just hours after his 13-1 upset in the second leg of the Triple Crown.

Trainer Chad Brown was not at Pimlico the morning after his first Triple Crown classic score having already returned to New York the night before. Brown said after the Preakness May 20 that a June 10 Belmont Stakes (G1) run was "a possibility" for Cloud Computing and reiterated that stance Sunday.

"We haven't ruled it out," Brown said. "We're just going to evaluate the horse this week and probably by next weekend we may have a decision."

Trainer Mark Casse was hands-on with 2016 2-year-old champion male and second-place Preakness finisher Classic Empire the morning after. Manning the shank as the Pioneer of the Nile colt got his legs rinsed Sunday, Casse said a Belmont run is under consideration.

"Right now I'd say there's a very good shot he's going to run in the Belmont," Casse said. "But we won't make that (decision yet). We'll see how he acts and does everything."

Casse said if Classic Empire

does run in the 1 1/2-mile classic, an equipment change may be in order. Because he felt the colt may have been caught by surprise late in the stretch by Cloud Computing, Casse said removing blinkers to keep Classic Empire engaged could be an option.

"If I could do it all over again, the only thing I would do differently is I would take the blinkers off him. I'm not so sure how much he saw that horse coming," Casse said of Classic Empire's final furlong in the Preakness. The Arkansas Derby (G1) winner had a three-length advantage at the eighth pole, but lost by a head at the wire. "He dug back in, but the other horse had some momentum on him, and if you watch him going on out, he took off again."

Trainer Todd Pletcher said Kentucky Derby Presented

by Yum! Brands (G1) winner Always Dreaming came out of the Preakness healthy, but was still a bit unsure as to why the son of Bodemeister backed up so severely late and finished eighth.

"He's healthy and happy," Pletcher said. "We'll head back to Belmont... and regroup. When I spoke to the ownership after the race yesterday, we all decided we wouldn't make a decision (regarding his next start) until we got him home and evaluated him.... Talking to (jockey John Velazquez) a little more, he was concerned down the backside that (Always Dreaming) wasn't taking him there the same way he was taking him there in the Kentucky Derby and Florida Derby (G1).

"Other than that, I don't have a good explanation. He came back healthy and looks good.... The surface—I hate to use that as an

excuse, because he's run well over all kinds of different surfaces, (but) this one was a little bit different, because it was in that drying-out phase. But it wasn't his day, I suppose."

In for the Belmont are third-place Preakness finisher Senior Investment and fourth-place Lookin At Lee, who will both depart for New York Sunday.

"We just used this as a prep race," joked Senior Investment's trainer, Kenny McPeck. "We felt all along he wanted a mile and a half, but the Belmont is tougher than this sometimes, because the pace can be much slower. Does it suit him? He's just going to keep coming.... We made a decision yesterday before the race, if he finishes fourth or better, he punches his ticket."

Trainer Steve Asmussen said both of his Preakness runners—Lookin At Lee (fourth) and Hence (ninth)—exited the race healthy, but only Lookin At Lee will continue on the Triple Crown trail.

"We're just going to regroup with (Hence). I don't think the Belmont distance or the stage suits him right

now," Asmussen said. "Lookin At Lee is vanning on to Belmont this morning."

Also under consideration for a Belmont try are Preakness runners Multiplier (sixth) and Conquest Mo Money (seventh).

Multiplier left Pimlico early Sunday and is en route to Kentucky. Trainer Brendan Walsh said a Belmont run for the Illinois Derby (G3) winner is "possible."

Conquest Mo Money is staying local, at least for the time being, and will soon be stabled at Fair Hill Training Center in Elkton, Md., where he will train for a potential Belmont start.

"I think we'll go (to the Belmont), but it's not 100%" said Conquest Mo Money's trainer, Miguel Hernandez.

One horse who will definitely not be making the trip to New York is Gunnevera. Trainer Antonio Sano said the Dialed In colt bled for the first time in his 11-race career during his fifth-place Preakness run, and that he'll return to his South Florida base with an eye on a start at Saratoga Race Course, where he won the Saratoga Special Stakes (G2) in 2016.

"We're going to take him back to (Florida), give him a nice rest, then take him back to Saratoga," said Alessandro Sano, the son of Antonio Sano who also serves as his father's assistant. **BH**

## GRADE 1 VALIDATION

Hill 'n' Dale Farm's owner John Sikura saw raw athleticism and pure talent when Maclean's Music broke his maiden at first asking at Santa Anita Park in 2011.

Injury prevented the son of Distorted Humor from showing his full potential as a racehorse but in Sikura's mind his potential as a stallion was set.

"I was convinced this horse was as good a prospect as there has ever been go to stud," Sikura said. "It makes no sense. There is no historical basis for that, but anybody who watched that first race of his recognized his ability. To do what he did in his first start—a horse could not run better than that. For me, even though he only ran one time, I thought he was a grade 1 winner. He did supernatural things."

Bred and raced by Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stable and trained by Steve Asmussen, Maclean's Music won his sole start going six furlongs gate-to-wire by 7 1/4 lengths. But what impressed Sikura most was his dazzling speed—early fractions of :21.24 and :43.48 and a final time of 1:07.44. His performance earned a 115 Equibase Speed Figure and a 114 Beyer Speed Figure.

Sikura called Andy Beyer to make sure the number was correct. When Beyer called him back he first assured Sikura that he had no breeding interests or ties to the horse or its family in any way. Then Beyer said he stood by the integrity of the number.

Sikura's belief in Maclean's Music has now been rewarded with a classic winner in his first crop—Preakness Stakes (G1) winner Cloud Computing who was bred by Sikura in partnership with his father-in-law Edward McGhee. They sold the colt for \$200,000 at the 2015 Keeneland September yearling sale to agent Mike Ryan, who was acting on behalf of partners Seth Klarman and Bill Lawrence.

Cloud Computing is out of the graded stakes-placed winner Quick Temper (A.P. Indy), who Sikura bred in partnership with the late owner/breeder John Franks. Sikura believed previous success with crossing sons of Distorted Humor with A.P. Indy mares made the mating with Maclean's Music a good choice. The cross has produced grade 1 winners Any Given Saturday, Joking, and Lukes Alley and grade 2 winner Ironicus.

"We believe in the horse, and he's just getting started," Sikura said. "His numbers are fantastic. I believe he will become a prolific, major sire."

Maclean's Music, who stands for \$8,500, is now the leading second-crop sire with five black-type stakes winners and ranks second by earnings to WinStar

Farm's Bodemeister, the sire of Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) winner Always Dreaming.

"It is really gratifying when you raise and breed a classic winner and stand the stallion. Just breeding a good horse validates your program," Sikura said. "While we have a lot of high-end, exclusive pedigrees, it is nice to know that a solid individual from a middle-aged mare raised on the same land in the same program has an equal chance to become a serious horse as the sale-toppers." **BH**

## AGENT RYAN NOT SURPRISED BY CLOUD COMPUTING'S WIN

The sale grounds at Fasig-Tipton Midlantic were abuzz the morning of May 21 about the previous day's racing at Pimlico Race Course highlighted by the Preakness Stakes (G1) victory of Seth Klarman and William Lawrence's Cloud Computing.

The consensus was that while it is disappointing there will not be a Triple Crown winner this year, the entire day of racing and Cloud Computing's exciting late run to pass champion Classic Empire showcased the best of the horse industry.

Mike Ryan, the agent who bought the son of Maclean's Music for \$200,000 out of the 2015 Keeneland September yearling sale, and who is part of the Lawrence and Klarman's advising team, said he was not surprised that Cloud Computing was able to capture the Preakness after not racing in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1).

The Pimlico race was only the fourth in the career of the colt who finished second in the Gotham Stakes (G3) and third in the Wood Memorial Stakes presented by NYRA Bets (G2) after breaking his maiden for trainer Chad Brown.

"He's a horse we've liked for a long time," said Ryan, who watched the Preakness from his hotel room as he interspersed watching pre-sale workout videos with the Pimlico races. "He had a few issues as a 2-year-old and they gave him time to get over that. We knew he had a lot of courage and the hope was that the pace would set up, up front, and it did. It was a great ride by Javier (Castellano) because he had 2 1/2 lengths, and maybe more in mid-stretch, to make up on Classic Empire up from the

top of the lane to the wire.

"I was incredibly impressed with Classic Empire. That was a monstrous performance. He is the real deal."

Ryan said the decision to not run Cloud Computing in the Derby, won by Preakness eighth-place finisher Always Dreaming, was also a factor in Saturday's victory.

"The six weeks (break between the Wood and Preakness) was huge," the agent said.

Ryan said he works closely with Brown in the selection of Klarman and Lawrence's horses, which are sent to three different facilities to be prepped.

"I know what he likes and he knows what I like and we work very well together," Ryan said.

"I spend a lot of time with Chad and at the farms

in Lexington. It's wonderful to be a part of their team."

Cloud Computing was prepped for racing at Stonestreet Farm under the direction of Ian Brennan, who along with Nick de Meric and J.J. Crupi, handle the preparation of the Preakness owners' horses in Florida.

"Stonestreet is an unbelievable facility," Ryan said. "You could run barefoot around that place. It is spectacular and we feel very fortunate to have horses there."

Ryan said it is gratifying that Klarman and Lawrence could have a horse win a Triple Crown race.

"I'm very happy for Seth Klarman because he is a tremendous guy and a tremendous participant in

the horse business," Ryan said. "He has invested a lot of money, has a lot of horses in training, and he loves the game. He is a rare guy."

Nick de Meric echoed those sentiments.

"If there is anybody in the horse business who deserves success on a day like yesterday other than Bill Lawrence and especially Seth Klarman, I don't know who it would be," said de Meric, who has handled Klarman's horses for more than 20 years. "It is richly deserved and my heartfelt congratulations go to them. They have paid their due.


"I've handled plenty of stakes horses for them over the years and we break and train many of their yearlings and 2-year-olds and send them on to trainers, primarily Chad Brown at the moment. Everything we and anybody has done for them is a product of a team effort, right down to the riders and grooms who work for Chad and other trainers. It's a product of a lot of work by a lot of good

people, but most of all it's a product of the faith by Bill and Seth."

Among the prominent Klarman and Lawrence horses prepped by de Meric have been grade 1 winners Annals of Time, Practical Joke, Currency Swap, and Subordination, among others.

De Meric said there are high expectations for the Klaravich and Lawrence horses this year, including juveniles being prepped to begin their careers.

"We have some exciting young horses coming up through the ranks and some 3-year-olds getting ready to come back to the track," de Meric said. "I just hope this is part of a sensational year for these guys." **BH**

### MIDLANTIC SALE FORECAST: MORE OF THE SAME

The bull market seen in the previous 2-year-old in training sales is expected to continue at the May 22-23 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale, with high hopes that the strong top-end market will have a trickle-down effect on the middle and bottom price points.

The sale at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium begins at 11 a.m. EDT daily. Of the 572 head cataloged, 117 had been withdrawn through mid-day May 20.

Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning said the auction has gained in stature as Midlantic graduates have achieved success on the racetrack

and consignors brought another solid group to market this year.

"This sale has gotten to the point where it is a significant sale on the calendar for both buyers and sellers," Browning said. "Consignors have continued to support us with nice horses and I think it's a good group overall."

Browning said one of the strengths of the sale is its appeal to horsemen based in the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic regions who might not otherwise attend one of the other major sales in Florida as well as its diversity of offerings.

"There is something for everybody—whatever you need, we've got it," the executive said. "That's one of the strengths of this sale."

The Midlantic auction has a greater regional flavor among its entries and is also a lure for

consignors with late-developing 2-year-olds not ready for one of the early season sales.

The sale had its first seven-figure transaction two years ago when a Smart Strike filly fetched a sale record \$1.25 million and last year an Uncle Mo filly also sold for \$1 million. This year's catalog cover boy is Malagacy, a colt bought from de Meric Sales for \$190,000 who won the Rebel Stakes (G2) for Sumaya U.S. Stable.

With a vastly larger catalog last year, Fasig-Tipton reported 337 horses sold for \$23,136,400, up 2% from the previous year, with the average and median prices of \$68,654 and \$32,000, respectively, representing downturns of 23% and 29% from their record levels of 2015.

Consignor Nick de Meric is among those hoping for a continuation of the strong demand seen elsewhere this year, including last month's Ocala Breeders' Sales' spring sale that saw broad-based gains.

"I'm hoping it will carry on from the reasonably buoyant market that we experienced at OBS in April," said de Meric. "This sale usually goes in lockstep with that. I think it will be a good market; there is still an appetite for good 2-year-olds. Hopefully we can get some of the blue-collar types moved satisfactorily. The top-end horses are always going to do well but if there is some depth to the market that is what we all like to see."

The Florida-based horseman said the Maryland sale has a unique quality that draws a broader buying bench than many of the other 2-year-old sales.

"It's a great venue. There are people we see at this sale we don't see at the other sales, including a lot of Northeastern-based trainers," he said.

"You will see middle market buyers who didn't

go to the Florida sales and are only going to buy a few," said consignor Niall Brennan. "They can shop here and find what they want. People in this area have a lot of options where to run."

While he would like to see a stronger market for horses in the lower price ranges, Brennan said polarization will likely to continue Monday and Tuesday.

"The market is so polarized they are overpaying for the top horses and there is no market at the bottom end," Brennan said. "There is no balance. At the top end, it's going to be the same few buyers. That is not going to change."

Jimbo Gladwell of Top Line Sales said the strength of the juvenile auctions bodes well for the summer and fall yearling sales.

"The trade has been huge (in 2-year-old sales)," he said. "You can't even believe how strong the top has been. The middle and bottom markets have also been good. We got through the presidential election and people are seeing some stability and want to re-invest and start playing again. We targeted this sale and have done really in the past here. I think it will be really tough for the ones you want at the upcoming yearling sales."

Kevin McKathan of McKathan Bros. said there appears to be a broad group of buyers that still have not filled their orders as a result of being outbid at other sales and hopes they show up at the Fasig-Tipton sale.

"A lot of people haven't been able to get what they wanted because they cost so much," he said. "Rather than dropping back and punting we hope they come in here swinging. If they fall on your horse there is plenty of money out there. There is no reason to believe it will change right now."

McKathan said his consignment consists of horses specifically targeted for Midlantic.

"This seems to be a perfect spot for them. We like to bring the right horses to the right places." **BH**

### HIPS TO WATCH: DAY 1 FASIG-TIPTON MIDLANTIC SALE

**A** Smart Strike filly who was one of the fastest workers during the under tack show is among the horses to watch during the May 22 first session of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale of 2-year-olds in training.

The auction at the Maryland State Fairgrounds will be held May 22-23, with sessions beginning at 11 a.m. EDT daily.

Named Smart Response, the filly who breezed an eighth-mile in :10 is consigned by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds as Hip 79. Bred in Kentucky by Craig Singer, the filly is out of the stakes-winning Cozzene mare Salty Response, a half sister to grade 3 winner Salty Strike. Smart Response was also a pricey yearling when she was purchased for \$275,000 from the Lane's End offerings at last year's Fasig-Tipton August selected yearling sale at Saratoga.

"She's the fastest horse I think we've had in a long time," Randy Hartley said. "She looks like a sprinter, but she's stretchy and muscled and her pedigree says she can go long. She cost a lot of money as a yearling but with fillies like that, I don't mind paying that."

Hartley and his partner Dean De Renzo also have another Day 1 filly to watch in Hip 136, a Medaglia d'Oro filly who last went through the sale ring at this year's Fasig-Tipton Florida sale of 2-year-olds in training at Gulfstream Park. Reported sold to Breeze Easy for \$450,000, the filly was bred in Kentucky by Diamond A Racing and was initially bought by Hartley/De Renzo for \$310,000 from Taylor Made Sales Agency at last year's Keeneland September yearling sale.

Another quick filly on offer Monday is Hip 264, a filly from the first crop of Flat Out that also breezed an eighth-mile in :10 during the under tack show. The Kentucky-bred filly produced from the multiple stakes-winning Beau Genius mare Beau Watch is consigned by Paul Sharp, who purchased her for \$60,000 from Romans Racing and Sales at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton October yearling sale.

Hip 54, a bay colt by Bodemeister, is a half brother to 2011 Central Bank Ashland Stakes (G1) winner Lilacs and Lace. Consigned by Cary Frommer, the March 17, 2015 foal was produced from the Seattle Slew mare Refinement and was bred in Kentucky by Judy Hicks and Kathryn Nikkel. The colt, whose second dam is four-time grade 1 winner Stella Madrid, was a \$50,000 purchase by Robert Anderson from St George Sales at last year's Fasig-Tipton October yearling sale.

Niall Brennan's consignment includes Hip 237, a filly by The Factor out of stakes winner Alex's Allure, a Sky Classic half sister to grade 1 winners Justin Phillip and Greenpointercrusader, grade 2 winner Keyed Entry, grade 3 winner and sire Algorithms, and grade 3 winner Successful Mission. The filly was bred in Kentucky by Mike Harris and Westwind Farms. **BH**

Leading up to the June 23 test, the 3-year-old Colonel John filly will follow a similar training pattern as two-time champion Tepin did last year before her triumph in the Queen Anne (G1). Florent Geroux, who guided the filly to her last two wins, will ride.

"We just think she's a really good horse," Casse said. "Of course we enjoyed our experience there last year. The Oxleys, like (Tepin's owners) the Mastersons, are sporting. They've won the (Kentucky) Derby, they've won the (Kentucky) Oaks, but they've never been to Royal Ascot. It takes a special horse to go over,

and we think she is.

"One of the reasons we're taking her is that she doesn't mind a little give to the ground," he added of the filly who last won the Edgewood Stakes Presented by Forcht Bank (G3T) over a rain-soaked Churchill Downs turf course May 5.

Casse said he plans to work La Coronel on the Keeneland turf before she leaves for England, where she will likely stay at David Lanigan's yard in Lambourn, Berkshire, where Tepin was housed before her victory. Unlike Tepin, who raced on a straight away in the Queen Anne, La Coronel will have to make a right turn.

"She is going to have to make a right-hand turn, unlike Tepin," Casse said. "I think either they can do it or they can't do it."

Bred by Kim Nardelli, Rodney Nardelli, Susan Bunning, A. Jaffreys, and B. Jaffreys, La Coronel has four wins from eight starts, with earnings of \$345,175. **BH**

# SOUL STIRRING FRANKEL'S FIRST CLASSIC WINNER

Soul Stirring solidified her place among the top fillies in Japan after taking the grade 1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) for 3-year-old fillies May 21 at Hanshin Race Course while also giving her sire his first classic winner.

The daughter of Frankel, trained by Kazuo Fujisawa for Shadai Race Horse, was her sire's first grade 1 winner when she took the Hanshin Juvenile Fillies in December at 1,600 meters (about one mile).

While Soul Stirring finished third in her last out start in the April 9 Oka Sho (Japanese One Thousand Guineas, G1)—also run at 1,600 meters—in her only loss out of six starts, her regular rider Christophe Lemaire reported that the soft ground may have been the issue.

"The going was a bit soft for the Oka Sho, which made things a little difficult, as did the outside draw,"

Lemaire said prior to the Japanese Oaks. "She did switch leads a lot, which wasn't good, and her response in the stretch was a bit slow. Still, she got third..."

In the Japanese Oaks, which is modeled after England's Epsom Oaks (G1), Soul Stirring sat off the pace on the rail after a clean break from gate 2 in the 18-horse field. Flawless Magic, who broke to her outside, took the lead and held that spot until Lemaire took Soul Stirring off the rail just before the final turn. In the center of the track Soul Stirring took command with a furlong to run.

Mozu Katchan sprinted after the leader and momentarily drew even with Soul Stirring, but under a strong ride from Lemaire the 2016 Japanese champion juvenile filly drew clear to win by 1 3/4 lengths in a final time of 2:24.1 for the 2,400 meters (about 1 1/2 miles) over a firm turf course.

Bred by Shadai Farm, Soul Stirring is out of the classic winning mare Stacelita, who Lemaire rode to victory in the 2009 Prix de Diane (French Oaks, G1).

"It's such a thrill for me as I also won the Oaks back home with her mother," the winning rider said.

"Soul Stirring certainly has inherited the power both from her sire and her dam. I was quite confident coming into this race. I wasn't sure yet about the distance as it was her first time (at 2,400 meters) so I wanted her in a good position, which I did because she is quick out of the gate. She also has a good lasting speed so I was able to give her the go from early at the stretch and sustain our bid right up to the finish.

"There are similarities between her and her dam. She has the same build and the same air about her—long legs, a big stride, and is high-strung. They're very similar actually." **BH**

"It would certainly be nice to get him to the Breeders' Cup this year (at Del Mar)," he added. "It boosts the entire barn's morale when you have such a talented horse like this."

The 5-year-old owned by Gun Powder Farm has racked up \$1,047,950 in earnings with a record of 5-2-3 from 13 starts.

Other probables for the Manhattan include recent Longines Dixie Stakes (G2) winner World Approval, Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes (G1) winner Ribchester, and the Chad Brown contingent of Mr Maybe, Beach Patrol, and Time Test. **BH**

Through the first 13 days of the 38-day Churchill Downs spring meet, Texas native J.R. Caldwell is making his presence known with an impressive nine victories in 14 starts (64.3%), including a trio of wins May 20.

"We are very blessed for the opportunity we've had so far in Kentucky. We love it here," said Caldwell, who won the second race Saturday with Merilore, the fourth with Manhattan Mischief, and the seventh with Bob's Gone Wild.

The trainer had a full stable during Churchill's 2015 spring meet but could only manage three victories from 48 starters and did not return in 2016.

"Our goal is to build our Arkansas and Kentucky divisions," Caldwell said.

Caldwell also has horses at Texas' Lone Star Park and Louisiana's Evangeline Downs. He stays primarily in Texas and has left his Kentucky division under the watchful eye of assistant trainer Kylie Salisbury in Barn 21.

"We plan on staying the entire year in Kentucky," Caldwell said. "Now we just need a (Kentucky) Derby horse and clients to keep in Kentucky with fast horses."

The conditioner has 558 career victories with 3,866 starters (14.4%) and earnings of \$9,116,528 through May 20.



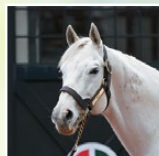

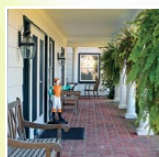

# GRIZZEL EDGES ENSTONE IN SELENE STAKES

In her fourth start in North America, Merriebelle Stable and Anna Doyle's Grizzel earned her first graded stakes victory when she edged favorite Enstone in the final furlong of the \$125,000 Selene Stakes (G3).

Going 1 1/16 miles on Woodbine's Tapeta May 21, Enstone broke well and took control of the pace early as Addictive pressured from a half-length back in second and Grizzel stalked from the inside in third. Enstone set fractions of :23.83, :47.98, and 1:12.02 through six furlongs.

Around the turn, Grizzel ran out of room on her inside path and was forced to make a move two wide

around Enstone. Jockey David Moran asked Grizzel in the stretch and the filly responded, opening up by 1 1/2 lengths on her competition at the wire. The Michael Doyle-trained daughter of Kodiak completed the 1 1/16 miles in 1:42.29.

Enstone held on to get a neck over Sister Nation for second. Silhouette was another three-quarters of a length back in fourth. Superduper, Financial Recovery, Cindervella, Gale Force, Ghostly Presence, and Addictive completed the order of finish.

Off as the 3-1 second choice, Grizzel returned \$8.40, \$3.70, and \$2.90 across the board.

Grizzel began her career in England and raced nine times in Europe before relocating to the U.S. The Selene was her second North American victory. She finished fourth in both the Melody of Colors and the Sanibel Island stakes earlier this year on

the Gulfstream Park turf before winning an April 28 allowance race at Woodbine by 1 3/4 lengths on the synthetic. After Sunday's win, she now has earnings of \$136,000.

Bred in Ireland by Martin Butler, Grizzel is out of the French-bred Mark of Esteem mare Milana. She was sold at auction three times and during her last trip through the ring she sold for \$112,132 at the 2016 Tattersalls Craven Breeze-Up Sale, where she was purchased by Peter and Russ Doyle Bloodstock. **BH**
