

PENNY CHENERY, FIRST LADY OF RACING, DIES AT 95

Helen "Penny" Chenery, owner of 1973 Triple Crown winner Secretariat and a well-loved figure in her own right as a champion of Thoroughbreds and women in business and sports, died Sept. 16, in her Colorado home following complications from a stroke. She was 95.

Chenery's children announced her death through Leonard Lusky, her longtime friend and business partner.

Following Secretariat's retirement from racing, Chenery became an ambassador for Thoroughbred racing and remained so, even after the champion's death in 1989. She served as the first female president of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association and president of the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation.

She became one of the first women admitted to The Jockey Club, helped found the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, and

created the Secretariat Vox Populi Award, annually honoring racing's most popular horse, as well as the Secretariat Foundation, which assists and supports various charities within the racing community. Chenery received the 2006 Eclipse Award of Merit for lifetime contributions to the Thoroughbred industry, and in recent years, she advocated for laminitis research and care advancement as well as efforts to ban the use of performance-enhancing drugs in racing.

Secretariat's Triple Crown campaign and Chenery's meteoric rise in the sport were featured in the 2010 Disney Studios film *Secretariat*, in which she was portrayed by Diane Lane.

Chenery is survived by four children: Sarah Manning, Chris Tweedy, Kate Tweedy, and John Tweedy; and by seven grandchildren: Elena Grath, Alice McGrath, Chris Manning, Amanda Tweedy, Paige Tweedy, and Marcus Tweedy; and one stepson Jon Ringquist.

"We are deeply proud of our mother, her accomplishments, and her courage." said daughter Kate Tweedy. "As we mourn her loss, the example of her strength, her intelligence, and her enduring spirit continue to inspire us."

While the family requests that its privacy be respected for an initial week of mourning, Lusky says

that plans for a future public memorial service will be announced soon.

"We have always been overwhelmed and amazed by the love and support Mom received from her many fans," John Tweedy said. "We look forward to a time soon when we can celebrate her life in a way that honors that legacy."

Chenery was born on Jan. 27, 1922, in New Rochelle, N.Y., to Christopher and Helen Chenery. Chris Chenery was a New York utilities tycoon, whose first love was his small but esteemed racing stable in his native Virginia. As a girl, Chenery inherited her father's passion for horses and rode constantly, both at home and at the Virginia horse farm, The Meadow. "I had the horse bug," she recalled. "I wasn't 'National Velvet.' Horses were just my friends."

Chenery attended the Madeira School and graduated from Smith College in 1943. Eager to aid the war effort, she joined a naval architecture firm that designed Normandy landing craft, then served as a nurse's aide in a stateside hospital. In 1946, Chenery went to France and Germany with the American Red Cross, working with demobilizing GIS—one of her most formative experiences. "You had to be 23 to go," she recalled. "They thought younger girls weren't mature enough. And they were right!"

Coming home, Chenery entered Columbia Business School, one of only 20 women in her class. Only six months shy of graduation she was engaged to Columbia Law graduate John Bayard "Jack" Tweedy. Penny's father, who had initially encouraged her to go to business school, now told her to quit and concentrate on her wedding. With deep ambivalence, she complied.

The Tweedys settled in Denver in 1950. They had four children: Sarah (1950), Kate (1952), Chris (1955), and John (1960). She threw herself into every social, charitable, civic, educational and political pursuit to which a respectable housewife was allowed, from the Junior League to Planned Parenthood. She and Jack helped found and raise the initial capital for the Vail ski resort in the early 1960s, where Jack was the first board chairman and general counsel, and Penny's father was a major investor. They built a house in Vail, and skiing became her young family's passion. But it was only a matter of time before her thwarted energy and ambition would split the confines of motherhood and volunteering.

That chance to break free came in the form of a phone call on a November afternoon. Chenery's father Chris had been building a Thoroughbred racing stable since the 1940s based on carefully-selected broodmares. He had come close, twice, to achieving his life's dream of winning the Kentucky Derby. But by 1967 his health and mind were starting to fail. That fall his wife Helen died, and when Chenery received the call to return home for her mother's funeral, she realized her father needed help.

She took over management of the racing stable, with the help of her siblings, Margaret Carmichael and Hollis Chenery, and her father's business secretary, Elizabeth Ham.

The operation was losing money and nobody took her seriously. She poured herself into the work, commuting every month from Colorado to Virginia, but after two more years in the red, selling the stable seemed almost inevitable.

In 1971 her colt Riva Ridge swept the juvenile stakes and was named champion 2-year-old colt. In 1972, 'Riva' won the Kentucky Derby, fulfilling Chris Chenery's dream in the last year of his life.

That same year, Secretariat burst onto the scene, so dominating the 2-year-old races that he won Horse of the Year honors. Secretariat's 1973 Triple Crown season unfolded with record-setting performances that still stand, culminating in one of the most celebrated athletic performances of all time, a 31-length victory in the Belmont Stakes (G1).

Thrust into national prominence as the owner of Riva Ridge and Secretariat, Mrs. Tweedy—as she was known at the time—charmed the nation as an engaging and quickwitted owner, who represented her equine champions with poise, dignity, and keen business sense.

She quickly grasped her role as the voice of the silent equine hero. As she put it, "The horse can't talk—but I can."

Kevin Flanery, president of Churchill Downs said in a statement, "Churchill Downs and the Kentucky Derby family join all in Thoroughbred racing in mourning the passing of Penny Chenery. Fans embraced her as the owner of Secretariat, her legendary Kentucky Derby and Triple Crown winner and American sports icon, along with her ongoing role as the protector of his legacy and

"Whether as the owner of Secretariat, the brilliant Triple Crown champion she campaigned nearly a half-century ago, or as a leader and ambassador for the sport she loved, Penny Chenery led an extraordinary life that touched Thoroughbred racing fans and others in a unique and personal way," said Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. "Thankfully, her legacy will live on for many generations to come."

"We at Churchill Downs also fondly recall her 1972 Kentucky Derby victory with Riva Ridge and other occasions when horses carried her famed blue-andwhite blocked silks in races beneath our Twin Spires. Mrs. Chenery's wonderful life had a deep and lasting impact on all in Thoroughbred racing and to countless individuals beyond our industry. If anyone ever deserved the title "First Lady of American Racing," it was Penny Chenery, and our thoughts are with her family, friends and all who loved her."

STRONG MARKET CONTINUES THROUGH KEENELAND BOOK 3 By BloodHorse Staff

The market continued to show strength during the Sept. 17 Book 3 session of the Keeneland September yearling sale, headlined by the sale of a half brother to Saratoga Special Stakes Presented by Coors Light (G2) winner Copper Bullet for \$625,000 to Steven W. Young, agent.

Sunday's sessiontopper, consigned by James M. Herbener Jr., as agent, is from the first crop of Verrazano. Out of the winning Unbridled's Song mare Allegory, the ridgling is from the family of Rood & Riddle Dowager winner Louve Royale and European highweights Loup Sauvage and Loup Solitaire.

"I saw quite a few Verrazanos that were good looking horses," said Young, who purchased Hip 1921 on behalf of an undisclosed client. "Verrazano himself could train with basically any horse around. He was an unbelievable horse in many ways and I think he'll be a very good sire.

"This horse is not only a (sibling) to a 2-year-old

graded stakes winner at Saratoga, but he's out of an Unbridled's Song mare. He is very, very correct and I think when you deal with Unbridled's Song—whether it's as a sire or a broodmare sire—they need to look how this horse looked. He's got no ceiling on what he might do pedigree wise. He was a Book 1 horse in Book 3."

The ridgling was consigned by James Herbener Jr. as agent for breeder Dell Ridge Farm.

"This is a lovely colt. Had a great walk about him," Herbener Jr. said. "The amazing thing was for how many times we showed him—about 87 times yesterday and I don't know how many times today he still just had that great walk about him."

Dell Ridge's Des Ryan said he wasn't expecting the ridgling to sell for that much.

"We knew he was a nice horse coming in, but you never expect this much for him," Ryan said. "He's been a really nice horse all summer long. So we had high expectations for him, but this is beyond what we had for him.

On Sunday, the second and final session of Book 3, Keeneland sold 245 yearlings for \$26,875,500, for an average of \$109,696 and a median of \$80,000. With 111 horses not meeting their reserves, the RNA rate was 31.18%.

Cumulatively, Keeneland has sold 1,179 yearlings for \$254,913,000, for an average of \$216,211 and a median of \$150,000.

"Book 3 went very well," Keeneland director of sales operations Geoffrey Russell said. "It was nice to have a big-priced horse today. Overall, the comments from both consignors and buyers were that the good horses sold very well and the buyers complained that they were hard to buy. So that's a positive note."

Oussama Aboughgazale's International Equities Holding paid \$500,000 for a colt from the first crop of champion Will Take Charge to be the second highest price of the session. A Distorted Humor and Curlin colt sold for \$450,000 each to be the day's third-highest priced yearlings.

ANDERSON FARM HAS SEPTEMBER SUCCESS WITH ONTARIO BREDS

Anderson Farms' David Anderson seemed pleasantly stunned after Hip 1846, a Will Take Charge colt that he bred and consigned, sold to Oussama Aboughazale for \$500,000 during the Sept. 17 Book 3 session of the Keeneland September yearling sale.

"I'm having a wonderful sale. It's just absolutely tremendous," Anderson said. "How cool to have the likes of WinStar underbidding and the likes of Oussama (Aboughazale), who is a good friend, buying the horse is terrific."

The Ontario-bred colt is from the first crop of Will Take Charge and is out of the winning Smart Strike mare Smart Believer. The colt's second dam is grade 1 winner I Believe In You.

"There were quite a few (Will Take Charge yearlings) this week that we liked, but in particular we liked this one," said Frances Relihan, bloodstock manager for Aboughazale's Sumaya U.S. Stables. "He's an Ontario bred and he comes from a very good outfit—a farm that raises very nice horses, which we think is very important also when buying a yearling where they come from and how they've been raised. So we're very pleased."

During Book 2, Anderson Farms sold a Scat Daddy colt, Hip 578, to M.V. Magnier for \$1.1 million. By the end of the sale's Sunday session, Anderson Farms sold five horses—all Ontario breds—for a total of \$2.4 million with an average price of \$480,000.

For Anderson, who started with one broodmare about seven years ago, the results are more than he expected. That one mare was Flawless Diamond (Saint Ballado), who was purchased by Anderson for \$55,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November sale. Since then, Flawless Diamond has produced two stakes winners, including Financial Recovery who won the Ontario Damsel Stakes at Woodbine July 1.

"I've built my broodmare band from one mare seven

years ago, up to 25 mares now," he said. "It's a lot of work by a lot of people and I'm fortunate to surround myself with some great horse people. So far we're having a terrific sale."

Anderson thought highly of his consignment heading to Kentucky, he said the success of Anderson Farms-bred horses on the track may have made more buyers take notice. In addition to Financial Recovery, the farm also bred multiple graded stakes winner Tower of Texas.

"I felt like (the consignment) had some good depth, but I didn't know what to expect coming in and what the competition was going to be like of course," he said. "But we've been very fortunate having a good year of racing—our horses are winning—obviously the market thinks so too." BH

RYAN REMINDED OF PALACE MALICE IN KEENELAND PURCHASE

When agent Mike Ryan first saw Hip 1630, a Curlin colt bred and consigned by KatieRich Farms, he was reminded of another son of Curlin that he purchased with Niall Brennan a few years ago.

"He reminded me a lot of Palace Malice. (He had) a lot of leg—a beautiful quality to him," Ryan said of the yearling colt he purchased for \$450,000 during the Sept. 17 sixth session of the Keeneland September yearling sale.

"He reminded me a lot of him (Palace Malice), just very smooth, light on his feet, (with a) great line of mechanics to him. Nothing I could really fault him on," he added. "I knew when I saw him on the farm Aug. 24... he wasn't going to be cheap. He oozes quality."

The colt, who is out of the winning A.P. Indy mare

"Bred by good breeders—Mt. Brilliant—(and he) looked like he could be a (good) 2-year-old. He's a lovely horse. We'll bring him back to England and see how he gets on."

Eventually, the agent said, the goal is to race the horse in Dubai.

"Distorted Humor goes well in Europe. My (client Nass) races in Europe and he races in Dubai as well if he's good enough, that's where he'd like to take the horse. He won the Golden Shaheen (G1) a few years ago (with Krypton Factor in 2012) and he'd like to repeat it," St. Lawrence said.

"We had a good Distorted Humor named Shumoos," he added, of Nass' group 3 winner who was runner up

"We really liked him. We had a lot of people on him, so we put a couple-hundred-thousand-dollar reserve on him and we let them take it the rest of the way," Goodman said. "We we're very happy with the sale coming in here. We thought he'd bring \$300,000 or \$400,000, but to get \$450,000 is really good this time of year.

"We just try to bring a good horse here, we put a reserve on it that we think is good, and we let it roll." BH


The filly, out of the Gulch mare Lovely Reward, was bred in Pennsylvania by Two Sisters' Farm. Lovely Reward has produced five winners from as many foals of racing age. Stardoza is also her dam's first black-type winner.

Trainer Tim Girten acquired Stardoza for \$14,000 at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale through the Brookdale Sales consignment. The filly, raced by Girten and Muirfield Farm, has finished out of the money only once in first five starts, all at Presque Isle Downs. She broke her maiden in her third start Aug. 8 after finishing second in her first two starts. Stardoza has now earned \$89,320.

Data Link is a multiple graded stakes-winning son of Claiborne's top international sire War Front, out of the stakes winner Database (Known Fact).

Bred and raced by Stuart S. Janney III, Data Link also won at 2, but didn't hit his best stride until 4 when he won three graded stakes, including the Maker's 46 Mile Stakes (G1T), Monmouth Stakes (G2T), and the Citation Handicap (G2T). At 5 he took the Canadian Turf Stakes (G3T) and finished second in the 2013 Maker's 46 Mile to eventual Horse of the Year Wise Dan. Data Link won or placed in seven graded stakes overall, and banked \$831,335 upon retirement. He stood for \$7,500 this year. BH

CAPLA TEMPTRESS EARNS BREEDERS' CUP BERTH IN NATALMA

Exploding down the stretch while coming from well off the pace, Irish-bred invader Capla Temptress took the \$250,000 Natalma Stakes (G1T) Sept. 17 in her North American debut, stamping her ticket to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T).

The Breeders' Cup 'Win and You're In' event featured a field of nine juvenile fillies, going one mile over the Woodbine turf course.

Trained by Marco Botti for Team Valor International, Capla Temptress settled near the rear of the field under jockey Joel Rosario after being bumped at the start, while Dixie Moon set fractions of :23.69, :47.58, and 1:12.29 through the first three-quarters of a mile. Still midpack at mid-stretch, Capla Temptress shifted gears when a path in front of her opened up and she sped by the leaders to complete the mile in a time of 1:35.12 over a course rated firm. "I bought her with this plan in mind," noted owner Barry Irwin from Team Valor.

"She broke very nice and for a second I had a little clear spot," Rosario said. "I was just looking to follow Patrick (Husbands). He was on one of the speed horses (Wonder Gadot) on the outside. I was trying to let her be behind somebody all the time. She was very nice. I had to tap her a little bit on the backside to get her attention. After that, she did the job."

The daughter of Lope de Vega had three prior starts, all in Great Britain. She won her first start June 21 at Chelmsford City and then posted another win at Newmarket July 22, before finishing third in her stakes debut at the track Aug. 12 in the group 3 German-Thoroughbred.com Sweet Solera Stakes.

Bred by Pier House Stud, Capla Temptress is out of the Dansili mare Mrs. Beeton.

Sent off at odds of 5-1, the winner paid \$13.40, \$7.50, and \$4.90. Dixie Moon held on for second to pay \$11.30 and \$6.30. Wonder Gadot, who went off as the favorite, paid \$2.70 to show. BH

UNTAMED DOMAIN GRINDS OUT SUMMER STAKES VICTORY

A seight juvenile colts roared into the stretch at Woodbine in the \$200,000 Summer Stakes (G2T), it appeared that a game of chess had just been completed.

Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez, who scored in the Ricoh Woodbine Mile (G1T) a day earlier on World Approval, appeared to have timed another Canadian match just right. Riding favored Hemp Hemp Hurray close to the pace set by El Dulce and having been confronted by Count Alexander on the outside, Velazquez turned on another gear with the Wesley Ward-trained Artie Schiller colt in mid-stretch and left those challengers behind.

Even West Point Thoroughbreds' Untamed Domain, playing a cagey game of hide and seek near the back wearing blinkers for the first time under jockey Joe Bravo, didn't appear to stand a great chance when Hemp Hemp Hurray was set loose.

Untamed Domain's sire Animal Kingdom may have passed along a determined gene or two, as the Graham Motion trainee rallied from fifth at the top of the lane and nailed Hemp Hemp Hurray in the final strides after a prolonged stretch battle.

In addition to the chess match, there was the game of jockey musical chairs as Velazquez was aboard Hemp Hemp Hurray instead of the Todd Pletcher-trained El Dulce, whom he had ridden twice before. When El Dulce went right to the lead under Jose Ortiz without much of an argument with the field, it was only Hemp Hemp Hurray who chose to keep him company on the outside.

Ortiz had ridden Untamed Domain in his last two starts, most recently a third-place finish in the With Anticipation Stakes (G₃T) at Saratoga Race Course, but it was Bravo who was aboard this time.

For much of the race it appeared El Dulce and Hemp Hemp Hurray were going to travel to the wire exclusively after fractions of :23.89 and :47.53 through a half-mile, until jockey Slade Callaghan moved three wide with Count Alexander after three-quarters in 1:11.65 and appeared to have collared the two frontrunners. Then the real running started.

Count Alexander wasn't able to continue his momentum as they straightened into the stretch with Hemp Hemp Hurray pulling away.

Admiralty Pier, who acted up in the gate before the race, started to get going on the rail with a menacing run but never caught up to the leaders. Bravo coaxed just enough out of Untamed Domain to get the job done by a neck in a time of 1:34.73 for one mile over the firm ground.

"The whole puzzle really came together today," said Bravo. "Graham did a great job by putting the blinkers on for the first time."

Velazquez had no excuses. "Perfect trip," he said. "He was a little bit strong the first part of the race and that was it. He didn't have enough to fight down the lane."

Out of the graded stakes-placed Lear Fan mare Ciao,

Untamed Domain earned his second win from four starts and raised his earnings to \$165,600. Bred in Kentucky by Clearsky Farms, Untamed Domain was purchased for \$90,000 at the 2016 Keeneland September yearling sale.

Admiralty Pier finished third, followed by Count Alexander. Untamed Domain paid \$8, \$4.40, and \$2.90 across the board.

Malagacy broke his maiden on debut as a 3-yearold at Gulfstream Park by 15 lengths Jan. 4 and then took a Feb. 12 Gulfstream allowance by seven lengths before the Rebel.

Bred by John Trumbulovic in Kentucky, Malagacy was sold three times. First passing through the ring

during the 2014 Keeneland November breeding stock sale, he was purchased as a weanling for \$45,000 by Stoney Lane Farm out of the Paramount Sales consignment. He was later consigned by Stuart Morris to the 2015 Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's August yearling sale, where the colt sold for \$130,000 to De Meric Stables, who consigned the colt to the 2016 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale of 2-year-olds in training, where he brought \$190,000 from Steven Young, agent.

Owned by Establo Heluce and trained by Alexis Lopez, Mr. G T won the six-furlong race over the main track in a time of 1:14.05 at odds of 5-2.

Bred by Mary Haire in Florida, Mr. G T is out of the Peace Rules mare Mostly Elvis. He was purchased for \$3,500 at the 2016 Ocala Breeders' Sales August yearling sale by Hector Gonzales out of the Hare Hill Farm consignment. The victory brought his earnings to \$14,090 from three starts.

Duke of Mischief won the 2010 Oaklawn Handicap (G2) and captured three grade 3 races. Trained by co-owner David Fawkes, the chestnut son of Graeme Hall was also campaigned by Alex and JoAnn Lieblong, and Marilyn McMaster. McMaster bred the stallion in Florida.

Duke of Mischief stood the 2017 season at Northwest Stud in Florida for \$2,000.

Another sire whose progeny earned a first victory Sunday was Despite the Odds, whose 2-year-old gelding Fenton's Four led at every call in a five-furlong race over the Laurel Park main track.

The Claudio Gonzalez trainee won the maiden claiming race by two lengths at even money.

Fenton's Four set fractions of :22.66 and :46.13 through a half-mile, crossing the wire in a final time of :58.58.

Owned by BB Horses and MCA Racing Stable, the bay gelding was bred by Legacy Farm and R. Larry Johnson in Maryland. He was purchased for \$4,500 at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling sale by Robert Labanca from consignor Becky Davis. The victory brought his earnings to \$47,631 and improved his record to 1-2-1.

Despite the Odds (Speightstown) won four races

from 19 starts for earnings of \$261,429. He captured the 2009 Hill Prince Stakes (G3) over a sloppy track at Belmont Park for trainer Michael Trombetta. Campaigned by R. Larry Johnson, Gerry Dilger, and TYB Stable, he was purchased by Johnson for \$300,000 at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-old sale out of the Scanlon Training Center consignment. He was bred by Walton Breeders in Kentucky.

Despite the Odds stood the 2017 season for \$1,500 at Heritage Stallions in Maryland. BH

VIOLENCE LEADS FRESHMEN BY AVERAGE AT KEENELAND SALE

Hill 'n' Dale Farms' stallion Violence may be second on the BloodHorse's leading first-crop sire list but he owns the title of top Keeneland September sire for his class through the auction's sixth session conducted Sept. 17.

The grade 1-winning son of Medaglia d'Oro has been represented by 24 sold out of 25 offered, for an average of \$229,750 and a median of \$157,500. His top seller is an \$850,000 colt out of blacktype stakes winner and stakes producer Melody Lady (by Unbridled's Song). European bloodstock agent Kerri Radcliffe bought the colt, which was bred in Kentucky by Hill 'n' Dale and Stretch Run Ventures.

Melody Lady is the dam of filly Buy Sell Hold, who owns a string of firsts. She is Violence's first starter, first winner, and first black-type stakes winner. She also is her dam's first foal, first winner, and first stakes winner.

The progeny of Claiborne Farm's Orb continue to thrive in the auction market. The son of Malibu Moon is the second-leading freshman sire at the Keeneland September sale with an average of \$196,355 and a median of \$165,000 for 31 sold out of 38 offered.

Orb also became the only freshman sire to be represented by a seven-figure yearling, when Radcliffe bought Hip 844, a colt out of stakesplaced Tally Ho Dixie, for \$1 million. Tally Ho Dixie has produced three winners included blacktype stakes winner and graded-placed Kyriaki.

Three other freshman sires have both averages and medians in six-figure territory.

Adena Springs' Point of Entry has the thirdleading average of \$121,250 and median of \$117,500 for four sold out of 10 offered. Ashford Stud's Declaration of War ranks fifth by average (\$105,545) for 22 sold out of 37 offered, while

Darley's Animal Kingdom ranks sixth by average (\$103,857) for seven sold out of 15 offered. Both Declaration of War and Animal Kingdom have \$100,000 medians.

Expatriate Take Charge Indy is the fourthleading sire by average, with five sold of five offered averaging \$112,800. His median is \$90,000. The son of A.P. Indy entered stud at WinStar Farm and was relocated to KRA Jeju Stud Farm Korea for the 2017 breeding season.

WinStar's freshman sire Overanalyze currently tops the freshman sire standings. He has been represented by two yearlings so far at Keeneland, with his top price bringing \$100,000. The son of Dixie Union is represented by 31 cataloged.

Spendthrift Farm's Jimmy Creed, who ranks third on the freshman sire list, has had two of his 20 cataloged yearlings pass through the ring with both returning to their sellers after not meeting the reserve price. His top fall-of-the-hammer price is \$160,000.

Ashford's Shanghai Bobby ranks fourth on the leading first-crop sire list and is seventh among his sire peers at the Keeneland September sale with a \$74,875 average from eight sold out of 13 offered. His median is \$70,000. Shanghai Bobby's top seller so far is a \$140,000 filly out of the Unbridled's Song daughter Rhapsody Queen. Kenji Ryotokuji bought the filly out of the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment. BH
