



JUSTIFY CONQUERS APOLLO CURSE IN KENTUCKY DERBY

He comes from a barn used to doing great things. Not just great things, but feats of strength capable of breaking down barriers thought to be rusted shut or reserved for those with transcendent ability.

His predecessors include—to a name a couple—the gentle bay beast who took a 37-year drought in the classics and ended it with ease and a steel gray wunderkind who earned the biggest, richest prizes in the sport. These were deep and wide shoes to fill, ones most trainers wouldn't dare ask an inexperienced baby to even try on. Yet in the weeks leading up to the May 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), trainer Bob Baffert used the same descriptors with Justify as he had with American Pharoah and

The adjectives were the same—superior, exceptional—inspired by a three-race sample size as brilliant as it was small. While Baffert said he wasn't concerned Justify would attempt a task on Saturday that hadn't been achieved in 136 years.

he did acknowledge the son of Scat Daddy would have to be everything he thought he was and then some to overcome an assembly of fellow 3-year-olds as competitive as any his Hall of Fame eyes had seen.

"I was fretting all week trying to get this big horse there," Baffert said of Justify, who gave him his fifth triumph in the first leg of the Triple Crown. "It's like having (NBA star) LeBron James. You better win a championship with him."

Through every point of call of the 1 1/4-mile classic at Churchill Downs, Justify did his billing more than justice. He chased the expected pacesetter through lethal fractions. He had the reigning juvenile champion come at him at the head of the lane and show him the depths of his class. He did it

all over a rain-soaked, sloppy (sealed) surface that has undone many with far more seasoning.

He emerged triumphant, kicking history in the teeth along the way.

The so-called "Curse of Apollo" can now take a seat next to those who believed they would never see a No. 16 seed beat a No. 1 seed in the NCAA men's basketball tournament. In an effort Baffert called "the best Kentucky Derby-winning performance I've brought up here," the big red prodigy turned back gallant 2-year-old male champion Good Magic in the stretch to win the Kentucky Derby by 2 1/2 lengths. He became the first horse since Apollo in 1882 to capture the 10-furlong classic without having raced as a juvenile.

"He just put himself up there with the greats," exclaimed Baffert, who knows a thing or two about all-timers, having had 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah and champion Arrogate, racing's all-time richest racehorse, emerge from his barn. "It takes a horse, you know, like American Pharoah. We knew he was capable. He showed me that—we were talking about it—but I didn't want to say it. I knew I had something really special, but he had to prove it today."

It takes some kind of special for a horse to even earn the opportunity Justify afforded himself before a crowd of 157,813, the eighth-largest attendance in Kentucky Derby history.

The big-bodied but supremely athletic colt had his connections buzzing from the time he started getting serious on the work tab during the winter. Justify needed time to grow into his impressive frame, but Baffert nonetheless started concocting a plan to get him to the first weekend in May.

"This colt was really special as a yearling," said Elliott Walden, president of WinStar Farm, which owns Justify in partnership with China Horse Club, Starlight Racing, and Head of Plains Partners. "Like Bob said, he's kind of like LeBron. And I got excited when Bob told me that he was going to run him, that he had a plan to get to the Derby. I said, 'Bob, don't rush this horse.""



Justify leads the way for home in the Kentucky Derby

When Justify finally debuted at Santa Anita Park going seven furlongs Feb. 18, he emboldened his connections' instincts when he cantered to a 9 1/2-length victory. Instead of going right into stakes company, Baffert gave his young charge another bit of seasoning in a one-mile optional-claiming allowance test March 11, where the track—fortunately, as hindsight reveals—came up muddy during his equally sublime 6 1/2-length rout that day.

Even with a pack of standout sophomores touting themselves across the country, the buzz on Justify was such that he was made the favorite for his first graded stakes, a showdown with multiple grade 1 winner Bolt d'Oro in the April 7 Santa Anita Derby (G1). That test marked the second time Hall of Fame jockey Mike Smith was aboard the chestnut runner, and after Justify relaxed on the front end, then put Bolt d'Oro in his place en route to a three-length victory, the man who piloted Arrogate, Zenyatta, and countless other greats was effusive about what lay ahead four weeks later.

"I mean, this horse, I just keep using (these words), but he's so above average, it's unbelievable," Smith said after his second Kentucky Derby victory, to go along with his 2005 upset aboard Giacomo. "When Bob picked this one out, he told me, 'You are going to ride him the next time.' I have been losing sleep ever since, but in a good way. I have been so excited just dreaming about this horse.

"What happened today is what I have been daydreaming about all afternoon. I just knew he was capable of this. ... My job was just to get him out of there. And I did that part, and I figured the rest is up to him. He's just an amazing horse. I have never been on a 3-year-old like this."

One of Baffert's default lines is to always stress how key the break is. Leaving out of post 7 in the 20-horse Kentucky Derby field, 5-2 favorite Justify and Smith got away in picture-perfect fashion over the wet going, matched strides with Good Magic just to his inside past the stands for the first time and settled into second to the outside of pacesetter Promises Fulfilled through a wicked opening quarter-mile in :22.24.

He stayed at the longshot's hip down the backstretch through a taxing half-mile in :45.77, with Bolt d'Oro just behind him in fourth and Good Magic rating between that one and Flameaway on the rail.

"After that (half-mile) I was like, 'Wow, man, this poor little horse,'" Baffert said. "I thought, 'He's going

to lay down. There's no way. He's going to lay down."

While his connections looked at angst-inducing fractions, Smith took his cues from the handy specimen beneath him, and Justify was going along like those air-sucking fractions were routine.

"That (pace) actually comes very comfortable to him," Smith said. "I was actually slowing it down. Although we went in :45, I was leaning back on him probably more than I normally would, just because Bolt d'Oro came outside and kind of pushed him along a bit.

"It takes a lot to try to keep up with him, and you got to try to run him down after that. You got to let a fast horse be fast sometimes."

As they made their way around the far turn and reality hit for Promises Fulfilled, Justify took command and opened up about a length as Bolt d'Oro briefly tried to mount a challenge. By the head of the lane, however, Good Magic was rolling on the outside as the only major threat to the Adonis in front of him, which gave his trainer Chad Brown a momentary stomach flip that his first Derby win was on the horizon.

"I'm very proud of him. He attended a very fast pace. We knew going in that Justify looked like a big monster, and we didn't want to be too far away," Brown said of Good Magic. "The winner did all the work up front, and my horse was attending close to a very fast pace and was still second. Those two horses showed they were the two best horses in the race.

"I certainly felt in deep stretch we had a really good chance to get there. Given the fractions up front, and that Justify was doing a lot of the heavy lifting up front, I felt by the eighth pole maybe this horse would come back to us, and maybe he's not a super horse. But he found more, and he is a super horse."

The same ability that earned Good Magic the victory in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) in November kept him in the fight until deep stretch Saturday, but Justify was too much for even the elite of his classmates to handle, as he crossed the wire in 2:04.20.

Good Magic held off fellow grade 1 winner Audible by a head for second, with 85-1 longshot Instilled Regard putting in a top effort to get fourth and My Boy Jack running on the far outside under Kent Desormeaux to round out the top five.

"I had a perfect trip. That's why I was looking forward to today, because I knew there was a lot of speed," said Javier Castellano, who rode Audible. "He was the only horse that came from behind. I was proud the way he did it. He finished good. I'm satisfied (with) the way he did it."

Bolt d'Oro and Flameaway both faded after racing near the quick pace to finish 12th and 13th, respectively. Grade 1 winner Magnum Moon, who came into the Derby unbeaten in four starts, never fired and was 19th, with fellow grade 1 winner Mendelssohn last after being bumped hard in the early going.

"He just got knocked over coming out of the gate, and then he got knocked over again going into the first bend, but he'll be fine," said Aidan O'Brien, trainer of Mendelssohn. "He was never used to getting that much kickback. It's a totally different experience, you know, so we'll be fine. We'll take him home and give him a break and come back (for the grade 1 Breeders' Cup Classic)."

Bred in Kentucky by John Gunther, Justify is out of the Ghostzapper mare Stage Magic and was purchased by China Horse Club and Maverick Racing for \$500,000 out of the 2016 Keeneland September yearling sale. In addition to busting Apollo's doors down, he also gave co-owner Sol Kumin of Head of Plains Partners the distinction of becoming the first owner since Calumet in 1952 to own the winners of both the Kentucky Oaks and the Kentucky Derby. Kumin co-owns Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) heroine Monomoy Girl.

"Unbelievable, just unbelievable," Kumin said of Justify. "He was everything Baffert said he was."

Added Baffert, "It's one of these things—just enjoy the moment. That's the way I feel about it right now. Just enjoy it, because I'm just very fortunate to have a horse like this. It hasn't really sunk in yet." BH



DERBY DAY RAIN DOESN'T DAMPEN RECORD BETTING

The 2018 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1)—and the day overall—saw record wagering despite historic rains that held down the on-track crowd.

All-sources wagering for the Derby and the Derby day card both set records with 8% gains. The full-card handle of \$225.7 million topped last year's record of \$209.2 million. The all-sources Derby race total of \$149.9 million beat last year's record of \$139.2 million.

All-sources wagering for the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) and the Oaks day card May 4 were records as well.


Louisville-based Churchill Downs Inc. said Derby week earnings also set records. An additional \$11-13 million is expected to be added to earnings before taxes, depreciation, and other factors, although about \$2.5 million of that growth is because of a change in accounting standards.

"We are deeply grateful to all the fans of the Kentucky Derby around the world who once again made this an amazing and memorable experience," said Churchill chief executive officer Bill Carstanjen in a statement.

The National Weather Service in Louisville reported about 3.15 inches of rain as of about 9:30 p.m. ET, which surpassed the century-old Derby Day record of 2.31 inches of rain set May 11, 1918, when Exterminator won the 44th Run for the Roses.

In spite of the more than 14 hours of rain in Louisville, 157,813 showed up at Churchill Downs. It was the eighth-largest crowd in Derby history, but down from last year's 158,070 and the record in 2015 of 170,513.

The on-track handle of \$23 million for the day was up

from last year's \$21.9 million and was the eighth-highest in history.

"I want (racing) to do well," said trainer Bob Baffert, who won his fifth Derby. "I love when I hear recordbreaking handle. That means people are still involved—still into it. You love to win on a a card at events like the Breeders' Cup (and) Derby day. Even if it's the undercard, it means a lot, because there's 100,000 people watching you win a race. Everybody wants to win when the whole world is watching."

Churchill's TwinSpires.com advance-deposit wagering service posted gains over last year despite being unable to accept bets for about 20 minutes before the Derby. The \$39.2 million bet through TwinSpires.com on Churchill races was up 15% from last year, and the \$24.6 million bet on the Derby itself was up 18% over last year.

Derby week at the racetrack saw many increases, as the track showcased new suites and other improvements aimed at making entering easier.

"We were excited to introduce our latest round of renovations, and our investments in the facility continue to pay off as we strive to improve the guest experience every year," track president Kevin Flanery said in a statement.

The \$311.2 million all-sources handle for the six-day Derby Week was a record, up 9% from the prior record of \$285.1 million last year.

Attendance for the week of 375,346 increased 7% from last year. The April 28 opening-night crowd of 22,023 increased 5.1% from last year's 20,949. On Thursday, Churchill saw a record crowd of 48,134 for its "Thurby" card.

Finally, the 271,323 people who attended for Oaks and Derby represented the seventhhighest combined total in history and up from the 263,170 last year. BH

JUSTIFY'S VICTORY REWARDS PARTNERSHIP GROUP

Two years ago, China Horse Club entered into a partnership with WinStar Farm to buy yearling colts, with the ultimate goal of winning top races at age 3.

Among those first-year purchases was a striking son of then-up-and-coming Ashford Stud stallion Scat Daddy named Justify, who was purchased for \$500,000 at the Keeneland September yearling sale and sent to Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert.

Those decisions proved fortuitous May 5 when Justify posted a gutsy victory in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) for WinStar, China Horse Club, and later additions Starlight Racing and Sol Kumin's Head of Plains Partners.

WinStar president Elliott Walden said Kenny Troutt's farm already had a program in which they bought about 20 yearling colts annually, with the goal of winning classics, and the new partnership enabled the elite racing and breeding nursery near Versailles, Ky., to expand that number to 30.

"They have a great team, and they trusted us,"

Walden said of China Horse Club during the Derby post-race press conference.

When Walden and WinStar general manager
David Hanley sat down with Michael Wallace and
Mick Flanagan of China Horse Club—along with Tom
Ryan, whose SF Bloodstock was also involved in the
partnership—to compare notes on horses they were
inspecting at the Keeneland sale, there was unanimity
that the Scat Daddy colt consigned by breeder

John Gunther's Greenwood Farm fit the bill.

"This colt was really special as a yearling," Walden said. "He just stood out. Like Bob (Baffert) said, he's kind of like LeBron (James)."

"He was a beautiful yearling had great balance and leg, great shoulder, and lovely length and neck, and power," Hanley said. "He had great stature—was a very

impressive horse when he was pulled out in front of you. For a big horse, he was very light on his feet, with good action and good energy. All in all, he looked like a nice package. He moved like a horse that could be a powerful dirt horse."

"He was such a beautiful, upstanding horse who was light on his feet," Wallace said. "If we were going to push on a horse in the first few days of that sale, he was the one we were going to push hard for. He stood out head and shoulders above everybody else in that sale."

In addition to his looks and movement, Justify had a pedigree with appeal. He is by a once-promising young Ashford Stud stallion whose career was cut short when he died unexpectedly in 2015. Scat Daddy has since emerged as a top-10 sire.

"We were lucky we got in early on Scat Daddy," Wallace said. "A yearling like that walks into the Keeneland sale now, and he brings three times that amount."

"He is out of a Ghostzapper mare, and the second dam was by Pulpit, so you have two classic dirt horses on the bottom side in Awesome Again (Ghostzapper's sire) and A.P. Indy (the sire of Pulpit). So he ticked a lot of the boxes we look for," Hanley said. While the partners had high expectations for Justify, they were patient and allowed the colt to grow into his large frame.

"We always thought he would go a classic distance on dirt. He was a big horse, and as a 2-year-old we gave him a little bit of time," Hanley said of Justify, who did not make his first start until Feb. 18 when he won by 9 1/2 lengths in maiden special weight company at Santa Anita Park. That was followed by a 6 1/2-length victory in an optional-claiming allowance event before his Santa Anita Derby (G1) triumph.

"He has benefited from that time and has only matured into what he is as a 3-year-old," Hanley said of the decision to give the colt time to justify his owners' confidence.

The winning partnership was also represented by third-place finisher Audible, a son of Into Mischief who was acquired by China Horse Club and WinStar as a 2-year-old for \$500,000 from Crupi's New Castle Farm at the 2017 Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream 2-year-olds in training sale. Audible, who rewarded his owners with a win in the Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1), was purchased by Crupi for \$175,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling sale.

"They are both good-looking horses by good stallions, (and) are now grade 1 winners," Flanagan said. BH



OAKS WINNER MONOMOY GIRL A HOME RUN FOR FRANKFORT PARK

May 4 was the type of day to dream about for Lexington-based breeder Frankfort Park Farm.

From a small broodmare band of around 40, the farm had not one but two runners in the 144th Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) who were either bred or raised there—Take Charge Paula and winner Monomoy Girl.

"You're always hoping—that's why we are all in this business—to produce good racehorses.

And, unfortunately, more often than not, we're disappointed. To have the two of them run was really special," said Brendan Gallagher, who runs the operation with his wife, Olive.

Monomoy Girl was always well-regarded, but Gallagher never predicted he'd see her wearing the lilies in front of the Twin Spires.

"We always thought she was a nice filly, but (we) couldn't have imagined this," he said. "You also have to give credit to the whole team around her, (trainer) Brad Cox especially. She's been beautifully managed,

and they've done a fantastic job with her."

Monomoy Girl, who outran Wonder Gadot through the Oaks stretch, is out of the Henny Hughes mare Drumette. Gallagher and Gainesway's Michael Hernon, who operates under the name Highfield Ranch, purchased Drumette, carrying Monomoy Girl, at the 2014 Keeneland November breeding stock sale for \$75,000 out of Pope McLean's consignment.

"We saw her in the bottom ring, literally five minutes before she was supposed to go through the ring. We knew Michael was there looking at mares, so we each took half," Gallagher said.

Drumette has a 2018 colt by Shackleford on the ground and will be bred back to Mastery.

Take Charge Paula's dam, Perfect Paula (by Songandaprayer), was a client mare that has resided at Frankfort Park for quite some time. In 2017, she ran through the Keeneland January mixed sale and was a \$24,000 RNA. She went back through the ring at Fasig-Tipton February as part of the client's dispersal, and Gallagher bought her for \$3,000 under the name Roselawn Farm.

"We've had her a long time and she's a lovely mare, and we hope to have her for many more years,"


Gallagher said. "She has a very nice filly by Shackleford right now, and she'll go back to Medaglia d'Oro."

The two fillies were raised together, and for a portion of the race—as Take Charge Paula set the pace before fading—Gallagher thought they were going to finish 1-2.

Gallagher remembers the two fillies have always been different, personality-wise.

"Monomoy Girl was always tougher—a little more high-strung, a little more temperamental.

Take Charge Paula was more straightforward, an easier filly," he said. "These were two fillies that were raised together, they grew up in the same barn, so seeing them running the first bit there in first and second was very special." BH

YOSHIDA GETS FIRST **GRADE 1 WIN IN TURF** CLASSIC

Thina Horse Club, WinStar Farm, and Head of Plains Partners' Yoshida kick-started his 2018 campaign May 5 with a driving win in the \$500,000 Old Forester Turf Classic Stakes (G1T).

The 1 1/8-mile race over a soggy Churchill Downs turf course rated yielding was the first grade 1 win for the 4-year-old, Japanese-bred son of Heart's Cry, who was bred by Northern Farm out of the Canadian Frontier mare Hilda's Passion. Multiple grade 1 winner and heavy favorite Beach Patrol finished second.

Yoshida got a patient ride from Jose Ortiz, who let Shining Copper take the nine-horse field through fractions of :24.86, :50.61, and 1:16.44. Stalking the leader was Beach Patrol, who closed the gap to half a length with a quarter-mile to run. But Yoshida unleashed a powerful turn of foot that took him to the lead at the top of the stretch and carried him to the wire in a final time of 1:54.64.

"We thought Shining Copper might be on the lead and had the thought that they would send Beach Patrol after him, and that put us in the garden spot," said Hall


of Fame trainer Bill Mott.

Mott said a trip to Royal Ascot is likely in the colt's future. Yoshida has been nominated to the one-mile Queen Anne Stakes, which will be run June 19 on opening day of the prestigious meet.

"The ownership group is very interested in going," Mott said. "If he could run well over there, of course, it would increase his value as a stallion, because he could do dual hemisphere."

> WinStar Farm acquired Yoshida as a yearling through the 2015 Japan Racing Association Yearlings and Weanling sale for ¥94 million (US\$765,160). His dam won multiple graded races, including the Ballerina Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course.

> "We just thought he was special," said Elliott Walden, president and CEO of WinStar. "Tom Ryan (with SF Bloodstock) went with me, and we liked him. He is an unbelievable stallion prospect, being out of a grade 1 winner and by Heart's Cry, could win a grade 1 ... we would be a great alternative to breeders. He is a really good

MUD NO PROBLEM FOR AMERICAN GAL IN HUMANA DISTAFF

A harpened off a season debut that saw her finish a Close fourth in the Madison Stakes (G1) at Keeneland, American Gal registered a two-length victory May 5 in the \$300,000 Humana Distaff Stakes (G1) at Churchill Downs.

With a light mist in Louisville, the early races on Saturday's card were run on a track listed as fast. But a downpour arrived before the Humana Distaff, which resulted in a wet-fast (sealed) track for the seven fillies and mares.

The seven-furlong test marked the first start on an off track for the Southern California-based American Gal, but she handled the muddy surface well to secure her second grade 1 victory.

"She'd never run on a surface like this before, but she's a very talented filly and handled it," winning trainer Simon Callaghan said of the 4-year-old daughter of Concord Point.

Madison winner Finley'sluckycharm, who boasted

an unbeaten record in six previous Churchill starts, broke from the rail as the 5-2 choice. She was engaged by American Gal, who broke from the outside under Jose Ortiz. American Gal led through a quarter-mile in :23.03 but was pressed by Finley'sluckycharm into the

After Finley'sluckycharm's half-mile in :45.63, American Gal seized the lead in the turn and never relinquished it. Grade 2 winner Ivy Bell, who stalked in the four path early, mounted a bit of a challenge, but American Gal held sway and completed the race in 1:22.33.

"I didn't want anybody putting pressure on me early on the outside, so I stayed as wide as I could on the backside," Ortiz said of racing in the five or six path early.

American Gal, a Kaleem Shah homebred, closed out her 3-year-old season with a four-length victory in the Longines Test Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course. She returned April 7 in the Madison, where she came in just a head behind the winner. The Madison field also included Lewis Bay, who finished third in that race and Saturday's.

"We've definitely seen a good progression out of

the last race," Callaghan said. "Plus, being on the outside today. Last time we got sort of a tough trip with a lot of horses on her outside. This time we were on the outside and had a better trip."

The winner returned \$7.80, \$4.40, and \$3.20. Ivy Bell paid \$4.60 and \$3.40. Lewis Bay paid \$2.80 to show.

American Gal improved her record to 5-1-1 in eight starts, with \$904,980 in earnings.

American Gal is a Kentucky-bred out of grade 2-placed American Story, by Ghostzapper. American Story has also produced grade 2-placed stakes winner Americanize, a full brother to American Gal. BH

SAXON WARRIOR EARNS O'BRIEN NINTH 2,000 GUINEAS

S axon Warrior bested 13 rivals to land the QIPCO Two Thousand Guineas (G1) at Newmarket May 5, giving trainer Aidan O'Brien a record-extending ninth winner of the mile classic and third in the past four years.

O'Brien watched the win from Louisville, where later in the day he'll saddle Mendelssohn in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1).

Owned by Coolmore partners Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier, and Michael Tabor, Saxon Warrior was sent off as the 3-1 second favorite. He fits the profile of O'Brien's recent Guineas winners, making his first start of the season after rounding out his 2-year-old campaign with a group 1 success in the Racing Post Trophy Stakes (G1).

The Japan-bred son of Shadai Stallion Station's Deep Impact came with a strong challenge to lead inside the final two furlongs under Donnacha O'Brien and stayed on strongly in the run to the wire to keep his pursuers at bay, finishing 1 1/2 lengths clear of big outsider Tip Top Win, with Godolphin's Masar—sent off as 5/2 favorite—a further head back in third.

This was the first classic win for jockey Donnacha O'Brien, a son of Aidan O'Brien.

"A huge thanks to all the owners for giving me the chance to ride him and especially to dad for the faith in putting me on him in the first place," the winning

rider said "It's very special. Obviously, I'm winning this race and riding in big races because of the position I'm in. I'm just very grateful. He's a very, very good horse. A proper horse. He'll stay a mile and a half."

The final time for the mile test on a good Newmarket track was 1:36.55. Saxon Warrior was immediately cut to a best price of 11-10 by British bookmakers for next month's 1 1/4-mile Investec Derby (G1). The last Guineas winner to go to win at Epsom was Camelot in 2012 with the same connections.

O'Brien, the trainer, keeps totting up milestones and this was his 300th group/grade 1 success.

Tip Two Win ran a huge race in second for trainer Roger Teal. The Dark Angel colt had a most unconventional Guineas prep, with two local stakes wins in Qatar over the winter, but had finished second in the Tattersalls Somerville Stakes (G3) over seven furlongs when last seen on these shores. He stayed on gamely under David Probert to repel the late challenge of Masar, and Teal was thrilled with the performance.

"I'm still pinching myself," Teal said. "I was trying to watch out the front and couldn't see much. All I could see was his white breast girth. When he came out of the Dip, I thought, 'Oh my God, I've got a chance of winning the Guineas here'. It's amazing. We knew we had a decent animal, and it's a proud moment for us."

Masar, who finished sixth in last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1T), was never likely to get the uncontested lead that allowed him to dominate his field in the bet365 Craven Stakes (G3) here last month. James Doyle allowed him to track the pace for much of the race, but the Godolphin runner was unable to go with the winner in the later stages and settled for third.

Mark Johnston's Elarqam finished fourth. The son of Two Thousand Guineas winner Frankel and dual One Thousand Guineas winner Attraction had every

chance inside the final couple of furlongs and kept on well despite being slightly hampered, but he lacked the required pace to threaten further.

Roaring Lion, second to Saxon Warrior in last year's Racing Post Trophy and third behind Masar in the Craven, finished fifth. BH

HAPPILY TAKES AIM AT 1,000 GUINEAS IN SEASON DEBUT

Oolmore and Godolphin are again to the fore at Newmarket May 6, with six of the 15 declared fillies for the 205th running of the one-mile QIPCO One Thousand Guineas (G1) emanating from one of the two barns.

Aidan O'Brien saddles four for the Irish operation, headed by Moyglare Stud Stakes (G1) and Qatar Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere (G1) winner Happily. The daughter of Galileo—and the first female winner of the Lagardere since 1986—will be making her first start since the Nov. 3 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1). She failed to fire at Del Mar, trailing home last of the 14 runners. O'Brien, however, is not concerned by the absence.

"Happily is in good shape. She hasn't run (this

season), but she's in good form," O'Brien said. "She won a Moyglare and ran against the colts and won in France. She's a very good, professional filly with a good mind."

Happily has a strong pedigree for the classic as a full sister to triple group 1-winning miler Gleneagles (QIPCO Two Thousand Guineas, Tattersalls Irish Two Thousand Guineas, St James's Palace Stakes). Her sire was responsible for the previous two winners of the race in Minding and Winter (both from the O'Brien/Coolmore connections). Ryan Moore jets back from Kentucky overnight to take the ride.

I Can Fly broke her maiden on debut at Dundalk in September before backing up two weeks later and finishing third in the Godolphin Lifetime Care Oh So Sharp Stakes (G₃) at Newmarket. The Fastnet Rock filly returned to action at Leopardstown last month with another third place in the Ballylinch Stud Priory Belle One Thousand Guineas Trial Stakes (G₃), and

> all three of her career starts have been over seven furlongs.

"I Can Fly ran twice as a 2-yearold, and then we ran her at Leopardstown (in the Trial). She's experienced enough too, we think." O'Brien said. Seamie Heffernan rides.

O'Brien's other pair are group 3-placed Sizzling and maiden winner Sarrocchi.

Godolphin's assault on the race comes in the form of the Charlie Appleby-trained duo Soliloquy and Wild Illusion. Soliloquy returned to the track with a stylish victory in last month's Lanwades Stud Nell Gwyn

Stakes (G3), run over the final seven furlongs of the Guineas trip, having rounded out her juvenile career by breaking her maiden second time up in a minor stakes race over a mile at Ascot. The last winner of the Nell Gwyn to go and take out the big prize was Speciosa back in 2006.

Wild Illusion lost her maiden tag at Yarmouth in August, then ran third in a Chantilly group 3 before rounding out her juvenile campaign by stepping up and landing the Total Prix Marcel Boussac (G1) on Arc day at Chantilly. All three of her runs have been over a mile. The daughter of Dubawi gets the assistance of regular pilot James Doyle, while Soliloquy will be ridden by William Buick.

Speaking of the pair this week, Appleby said, "We're very happy with both fillies. William rode Soliloquy in the Nell Gwyn and rode her in plenty of work before

that. He was always very happy with her and she shows more pace than Wild Illusion, but Wild Illusion has never been a work horse, so it was a hard decision for him.

"Visually, on race evidence, Soliloquy has got a bit more of a pace angle, whereas with Wild Illusion we are working back from an Oaks with her. Wild Illusion is ready to run and she brings group 1 form into the race."

Karl Burke has never tasted Classic success, but he has handled the careers of plenty of good horses down the years and is responsible for bet365 Fillies' Mile (G1) winner Laurens. That race—run over the same course and distance as the Guineas since 2011—is often a good trial, with Minding the last filly to do the double in 2016. P J McDonald, aboard for all four career starts to date, takes the reigns again.

"She's a well-balanced filly for one who is so big and who has such a massive stride," Burke said. "Now she's that bit stronger, if she can keep that great gallop up, it's going to be a good horse that gets by her." BH

time came, I pulled her out and she responded right away."


The win was the second Churchill stakes score of the season for Walsh, who sent out Newtown Anner Stud's Beckford to win the April 28 William Walker Stakes.

"I was having a ton of seconds and thirds, and of course it's frustrating, and people are telling you, 'Don't worry, they'll fire,'" Walsh said. "We had a great year last year and are trying to keep up to that standard, so thank God today, and last week with Beckford, they're starting to fire—and we've got a few more to come."

Proctor's Ledge returned \$15.60, \$8, and \$5, On Leave paid \$5.60 and \$3.60, and Dream Awhile finished another length back in third to return \$3.60. It was another half-length back to Dream Dancing, who was followed by Madame Stripes, La Coronel, Madam Dancealot, Thundering Sky, Res Ipsa, Pyscho Sister, and Insta Erma.

Proctor's Ledge boosted her earnings to \$579,090, with a 5-2-1 record from 12 starts. The 4-year-old Kentucky-bred, out of the stakes-placed Arch mare Archstone, landed her third graded stakes score. She won the Lake George Stakes (G3T) and Lake Placid Stakes (G2T) consecutively last summer at Saratoga Race Course and will eye the Diana Stakes (G1T) there as a major target this summer.

"There's a mile race on Belmont Day (and) there's a mile and a quarter race on Belmont Day," Walsh said of future starts. "The Diana at Saratoga, you would think, would be her main target, seeing that she has such an affinity for Saratoga. We'll be careful with her because I think she'll get better and better as she goes along. I think her best races are still in front of her." BH



MARAUD PREVAILS IN AMERICAN TURF WITH LATE MOVE

Maraud made a strong move down the middle of the Churchill Downs turf course rated yielding to capture the \$300,000 American Turf Stakes presented by Ram Trucks (G2T) for 3-year-olds under the Twin Spires May 5.

The son of champion Blame out of the Empire Maker mare Unbridled Empire won his second graded event after winning the Palm Beach Stakes (G3T) at Gulfstream Park in March. He was fifth in the Kentucky Utilities Transylvania Stakes (G3T) in his most recent start before the American Turf.

The bay colt is owned by Treadway Racing Stable and was bred in Kentucky by John and Frank Penn. He is trained by Todd Pletcher and was ridden to victory by John Velazquez.

Speed Franco was fastest into stride from the inside gate but was hounded every step of the way

by Inscom from the 2 post. They passed the opening quarter mile in :23.79 and went the first half in:48.39 pursued by Admiralty Pier. There was no change in the order up the backstretch. Favorite River Boyne made a move coming off the second turn as Speed Franco cut the corner and briefly opened up turning for home.

But the scene changed down the lane as Maraud, Untamed Domain, and Captivating Moon stormed down the center of the course, while Arawak was making a big move at the hedge. Arawak ultimately did not get cleanly through on the inside, however, and Maraud prevailed by 1 1/2 lengths in 1:47.52 for the 1 1/16 miles. Captivating Moon and Untamed Domain deadheated for the place spot, with Arawak checking in fourth.

"I didn't think my horse liked the soft turf, so I took him back and made one run with him," said Velazquez. "He showed me something and came through for me."

Maraud returned \$18.80, \$8.40, and \$6.20. Captivating Moon was good for \$5.40 and \$6.40, while Untamed Domain paid \$4.60 and \$5.80.

"I thought Johnny (Velazquez) gave him a clever ride," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "We were concerned about the weather today, and I'm glad we decided to take a shot."

With four wins in seven lifetime starts, all on turf, Maraud nearly doubled his lifetime earnings in the American Turf to \$337,770. He has won three of four starts this season. BH

LIMOUSINE LIBERAL REPEATS IN CHURCHILL DOWNS STAKES

ne year ago, the Ball family's Limousine Liberal caught a wet-fast (sealed) track in the Churchill Downs Stakes presented by Twinspires.com (G2) and won by a head. This year, he found a sloppy surface under the Twin Spires and got the job done again, scoring a head victory over Warrior's Club in the seven-furlong race.

With Jose Ortiz up again for trainer Ben Colebrook, the 6-year-old Successful Appeal gelding got the trip in 1:22.73. Warrior's Club was a game second while closing from the outside. Between those two, another head back in the photo finish, was Awesome Slew—who was second last year.

Despite Warrior's Club being owned by Churchill Downs Racing Club, Limousine Liberal is the "house horse" and now sports a 6-1-0 mark over the track in eight starts.

"This has been his best year," said a soggy Colebrook in the winner's circle. "He's trained better than ever this year. His last race at Keeneland was good, he was just a little unlucky."

Limousine Liberal was a neck shy of Warrior's Club in the April 7 Commonwealth Stakes (G3) at Keeneland in his 2018 debut.

"These were ideal conditions for him, maybe. He loves the wet racetrack, and he's a fighter," Colebrook said. "He just wasn't going to get beat today. He was a little closer (to the pace) than we probably had planned, but they didn't go as fast as it kind of looked like. He was able to kind of sneak away there a little bit, and then he fought back after they passed him. And just a phenomenal ride by Jose and blessed, really, to have a horse like this."

Colebrook was also quick to point out the Breeders' Cup World Championships will be held at Churchill Downs this fall. Limousine Liberal ran fourth in the 2016 TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) and was 11th in the race in 2015.

Imperial Hint, runner up in last year's Breeders' Cup Sprint and the race favorite, broke on top in the Churchill Downs, and Javier Castellano let him cruise

to an open lead through an opening quarter in a brisk :22.10. Limousine Liberal was sitting in the second slot while being chased by Chief Cicatriz on the rail and Unbridled Outlaw on the outside.

Ortiz let off the gas for a bit as Imperial Hint was chased by Unbridled Outlaw after a half-mile in a brisk:44.57. Turning for home, Imperial Hint began to weaken as Limousine Liberal fought a fresh batch of closers in deep stretch. He drifted out inside the eighth pole (six furlongs in 1:09.76) but was able to prevail.

Limousine Liberal, who has also won the Aristides Stakes (G3) and two other added-money races under the Twin Spires, paid \$10.80, \$5.40, and \$3.40. Warrior's Club returned \$15.80 and \$6.80, and Awesome Slew paid \$3.20. The \$2 exacta, 7-8, returned \$252.60.

Out of the In Excess mare Gift of Gab, Limousine Liberal was bred by Mike and Katherine Ball and has earned \$1,333,261 off an 8-6-3 mark in 21 starts. Successful Appeal's dam is inbred to 1965 Kentucky Derby winner Lucky Debonair. The Ball's Donamire Farm purchased the California-bred Gift of Gab for \$110,000 at the 2006 Keeneland September yearling sale. Trained by Katherine Ball and Greg Foley, she was winless in eight tries. BH

FUNNY DUCK SPLASHES TO PAT DAY MILE VICTORY

n a wet day more suitable to ducks than people, aptly named Funny Duck posted a major upset in the \$300,000 Pat Day Mile presented by LG&E and KU (G3) on the Kentucky Derby Day card May 5 at Churchill Downs.

Longshot Lombo took charge out of the gate while pressured first by Smart Remark and then Greyvitos as the 14-horse field completed the first half-mile in :45.53. The group of 3-year-olds contended with sloppy conditions from a day-long rain that was heavy at times.

New York Central took control rounding the turn for home while Funny Duck, off at odds of 39-1 and stumbling at the start, raced near the rail. Jockey Brian Hernandez Jr. shifted Funny Duck out, split horses with three-sixteenths remaining, and launched a sustained drive that resulted in a 4 3/4-length victory in a final time of 1:37.16.

"We had a great trip," Hernandez said. "We just went out there. There was no pressure with the horse. He stumbled a bit leaving there. I think it worked to his advantage because when he got up, he turned off for me. We were able to find a nice, smooth rail trip

and had to go around only one horse. He traveled like a winner the whole way. It was a great race for him."

Mask, the 5-2 favorite who was undefeated in two starts, including the Mucho Macho Man Stakes at Gulfstream Park, contended until the turn before tiring to finish eighth.

The winner returned a whopping \$81.40, \$36.60, and \$14.20. New York Central held second at odds of 31-1 and returned \$27.80 and \$12.40. Givemeaminit paid \$10 to show. The top two combined for a \$2 exacta of \$1,753.60, and a \$1 trifecta returned

\$17,138.50.

"He ran real well. We felt good," trainer Steve Asmussen said of runner-up New York Central. "He handled an off track real well. He showed a good side of himself. He made a pretty quick move, but (Lombo) was getting out, and I think he wanted to get away from him."

A chestnut son of Distorted Humor making his seventh career start for Brad Kelley's Calumet Farm and trainer Rusty Arnold, Funny Duck improved to 2-2-0 in seven starts, his second on the main track. The victory increased his earnings to \$214,040.

Seventh in a dirt debut at Churchill Downs last fall, the colt was unplaced in his first grass start, also at a mile,

before finishing second twice on turf. Funny Duck broke his maiden at Gulfstream Park in February in a mile turf test and came into the Pat Day Mile off a seventh-place effort in the Kentucky Utilities Transylvania Stakes (G3T) over a yielding turf course at Keeneland.

Arnold said owner Kelley gets credit for the decision to run Funny Duck on dirt again.

"Mr. Kelley called and said, 'I would like to try this horse on the dirt again.' We were set for running him in a turf race, and we said, 'OK,' and we tried him on the dirt again. So he gets all the credit because we would have been in the turf race.

"We love the horse. He had really become leaps and bounds better through the winter. His last race (Transylvania Stakes), he had some traffic issues. We liked the horse, but he got good on the turf and some trainers tend to stick with it, and when he said to go to the dirt, we did. He had a great work here last week. We do think he likes the mud, too, so it worked out great. It's going to open up a whole lot of races, obviously, for him now."

Bred in Kentucky by SF Bloodstock, Funny Duck was produced from the stakes-winning Seattle Slew mare Slow Down, who has also produced French group 3 winner Slow Pace as well as Segway, who placed in two grade 2 stakes.

Consigned to sales as a weanling and yearling, Funny Duck was bought back for prices of \$120,000 and \$65,000 before finally being purchased by Calumet for \$110,000 from Kirkwood Stables at the 2017 Ocala Breeders' Sales March auction of 2-year-olds in training. BH



ROBERT BRUCE REMAINS UNDEFEATED IN U.S. DEBUT

Frank Sinatra said if you can make it in New York, you can make it anywhere.

Clearly, a 4-year-old colt named Robert Bruce can make it anywhere in North or South America.

An undefeated, four-time group 1 winner in his native Chile, Convento Viejo's homebred Robert Bruce was not fazed by the challenge of his first start in the United States May 5, winning by three-quarters of a length in the \$150,000 Fort Marcy Stakes (G3T) at Belmont Park.

"The expectations were high," said assistant trainer Whit Beckman, deputizing for trainer Chad Brown, who saddled Good Magic to a second-place finish in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) at Churchill Downs. "When a horse is undefeated, you expect him to stay undefeated."

The Fort Marcy was one of two graded turf stakes on the May 5 card. The program also featured a victory by Queen's Plate winner Holy Helena in the \$200,000 Sheepshead Bay Stakes (G2T).

Robert Bruce was the winner of Chile's major

turf race, the El Ensayo Mega (G1) in October before shipping to the United States and landing in Brown's talent-laden barn.

The good vibes about him were reflected in the way he was bet down to a 3-2 favorite (returning \$5.30 to win) and the manner in which he accelerated in the stretch run of the 1 1/8-mile test.

Tracking a modest pace of 1:14.34 for six furlongs, Robert Bruce was fourth at the quarter pole but split horses with gusto in the stretch and surged to his impressive debut win in the U.S., covering the nine furlongs on firm turf in 1:47.56.

"I sat in a great position inside and saved all the ground," jockey Tyler Gaffalione said. "At the top of the lane, a spot opened and he just accelerated right through it. Chad and his team did a great job with him.

"I worked him one time over at Palm Meadows and loved him. He looked like a real classy horse, and you could tell by his form he's a champion, and today he proved it."

The victory made Robert Bruce seven-for-seven. The son of Fast Company out of the Orpen mare Lady Pelusa pushed his earnings to \$330,457 with the \$90,000 winner's share of the purse.

Spring Quality was second by three-quarters of a

length over Lucullan.

Ticonderoga, Silverware, Manitoulin, Blacktype, Markitoff, and Small Bear completed the order of finish.

As for the Sheepshead Bay, trainer Jimmy Jerkens understands that when the boss speaks, it pays to listen.

In early April, after Holy Helena posted wins in her first two starts on turf, Jerkens wanted to return the Ontariobred to dirt, where she raced in the first two starts of her career and broke her maiden.

"I thought a good time to try her back on dirt was the Top Flight (Invitational Stakes) at Aqueduct (a \$200,000 stakes April 15).

Mr. Stronach very seldom puts his foot down, but for some reason he didn't have a good feeling about it, and he didn't let me do it."

Instead, Jerkens entered Stronach's homebred 4-year-old filly in the Sheepshead Bay, and the boss's decision proved to be sage advice.

Holy Helena overcame a slow pace to post a halflength victory in the 1 3/8-mile turf stakes, improving her turf record to three-for-three and giving her backto-back graded turf stakes wins.

"Mr. Stronach is a smart man," Jerkens said.

Holy Helena's victory followed an optional-claiming allowance win at Gulfstream Park in her turf debut and a 1 3/4-length score in the March 3 The Very One Stakes (G3T). It also confirmed a wise decision by Jerkens to test the daughter of Ghostzapper on turf this winter, in a tip of the hat to her status as a winner on a synthetic track.

"We were sending her down to Florida, and rather than turn her out for the winter, I thought we might as well freshen her up a bit and try her on the turf and see if she likes it. There was nothing to lose," Jerkens said. "They always say if they like synthetics, they'll like turf, and vice versa. I didn't think there was a downside to it, and it worked out."

Jerkens did not have any specific race in mind for Holy Helena's next start, but he said it would be in a "turf stakes going long" and that the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf (G1T) was the long-range goal.

"She's gotten stronger and added some muscle at 4," Jerkens said. "Like most horses by Ghostzapper, she's gotten better with age."

The biggest problem in the Sheepshead Bay for Holy Helena, the 7-5 favorite (paying \$4.80 to win), was a dawdling pace set by 20-1 shot Palinodie, who led through fractions of 1:15.86 for six furlongs and 1:41.20 for the mile while Holy Helena was fifth in the field of seven.

Taken outside by jockey Manny Franco, Holy Helena was a little more than two lengths behind at the eighth pole.

"I didn't worry too much about the fractions because I was where I wanted to be," Franco said. "I knew I had a lot of horse under me."

Holy Helena kicked into top gear in the stretch and surged past Palinodie to grab the lead in the final sixteenth of a race that was completed in 2:15.15, with a last furlong going in :10.92.

"Some horses, when they pick it up and can't gain ground, they start spinning their wheels. She was relentless," Jerkens said. "She kept going until she got there."

A winner of six of nine starts, Holy Helena earned \$120,000 to push her career total to \$1,009,333.

Lottie was second by a nose over Santa Monica, with Palinodie another half-length back in fourth.

Estrechada, Peru, and Summersault were next under the wire. BH


