JUSTIFY'S DERBY WIN 'JUST SINKING IN' FOR BAFFERT

The expectations had been met in a fashion befitting their magnitude, leaving behind in the mud of the most famed racetrack in Thoroughbred racing all the pressure that had been sitting on Bob Baffert's shoulders since Feb. 18.

As Justify hit the wire 2 1/2 lengths in front in the May 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), validating all that was hoped for and said on his behalf, relief set in for his Hall of Fame conditioner. The son of Scat Daddy delivered in the exact manner his connections dreamed, and with a sunny backdrop to work with May 6, Baffert led the rust-colored colt out of his barn for the morning-after onlookers to admire—and let himself absorb the significance of the moment.

"That's why I never get ahead of myself anymore. ... Just enjoy the moment and take it all in," Baffert said. "It's just sinking in now that we won the Kentucky Derby, because it was just so stressful these last few weeks to get him there. Trying to figure out ... do I

take him there early? Do I wait?

"It's been stressful for me all week, coming in here with a favorite that I knew was a real favorite. I knew we had the horse, but everything has to go well."

The reflective mood Sunday came easy for Baffert, a perk of

having his fifth Kentucky Derby winner less than 24 hours earlier. With Justify showing positive signs the morning after he turned back champion Good Magic over the sloppy (sealed) Churchill Downs track, the conversation shifted to whether any rival could stymie the chestnut colt in the May 19 Preakness Stakes (G1) at

Pimlico Race Course and prevent him from heading to Belmont Park three weeks later with Triple Crown history on the line.

"I think we won the toughest one—the Kentucky Derby, that's the toughest and most important one," Baffert said. "If he wins the Preakness, then after that we'll see. But I'm not like, we're going to do this or that. We're going to take it one race at a time."

Based on what Justify has shown since his debut at Santa Anita Park Feb. 18, it will either take a monster step forward from one of his rivals or a series of unfortunate circumstances to prevent the budding superstar from making his expected time in Baltimore the latest exhibition of his brilliance.

As efficient as Justify looked when he put away Bolt d'Oro in the April 7 Santa Anita Derby (G1)—his first try against stakes company—Baffert said he didn't even

think the colt's run that day was as impressive as his prior two outings. What he saw from his charge in the Kentucky Derby was another level to a horse he already deemed superior.

In addition to having the mental soundness to handle the wild atmosphere around him, Justify was completely unfazed by the wet going Saturday, as he prompted a wicked pace and still had more in reserve to keep Good Magic at bay in the stretch.

"We saw another gear that we hadn't seen yet," Baffert said. "The Santa Anita Derby was OK, but it wasn't like his second race. Yesterday, when I saw the fractions, I was like, any horse like that is going to lay down or whatever. But he just kept on going. ... The great ones do that.

"It looked like it was nothing for him. When he came out of his stall this morning, he was pulling me around there. He looks phenomenal today."

Baffert said Justify would remain at Churchill Downs for the next week before shipping to Baltimore.

He added that Solomini—who finished 10th under Flavien Prat—came back in good order and could turn up in the Belmont Stakes (G1).

If ever there was a race that has been good to the white-haired one, however, it is the 1 3/16-mile middle leg of the American classics. Of Baffert's six Preakness wins, four were on the tail of a Kentucky Derby victory, including eventual Triple Crown winner American Pharoah in 2015.

But it might be a small welcoming party waiting to take on Justify.

Good Magic sat just off the early leaders and ran a race good enough to win most editions of the Kentucky Derby, inspiring more praise from his trainer Chad Brown as the two-time Eclipse Award winner watched the colt graze Sunday morning.

"He came out of the race really well," Brown said of Good Magic's runner-up effort. "I'm so proud of this horse and the way he ran and prepared for this race. He was so straightforward and focused. We asked him to do something, and he did it. Even the track—he handled the track fine—so no excuses there. He ran terrific. He was just second-best.

"Yesterday, I think the horse that was supposed to win, won."

Brown said he would ship Good Magic back to New York May 7 and evaluate the son of Curlin before making any decisions on the Preakness.

"I don't know what we're doing yet," said Brown, who won last year's Preakness with Cloud Computing. "I want to get the horse back home and evaluate his energy level. He looks real sound this morning, but I'm not really committed at this point."

Trainer Todd Pletcher said all four of his Kentucky Derby entrants came out of the 10-furlong test sound and would also all ship to Belmont Park to regroup. Grade 1 winner Audible was the best finisher of the bunch to get third, missing second by a head, with Vino Rosso (ninth), Noble Indy (17th), and Magnum Moon (19th) rounding out the efforts.

"Everyone seems OK—just a lot of dirt in their eyes, a lot of flushing out last night," Pletcher said. "Vino Rosso, I don't think I've ever had a horse with as much dirt in eyes as he did after that race. We're still flushing it out this morning, but other than that, they were sound.

"Magnum Moon, I think (Instilled Regard) was inside of him and didn't break great. It was just bumper cars for a while, and he just got into a position he'd never been in before behind horses, eating a lot of slop. Just never was able to get into a comfortable rhythm at any point."

Audible, who like Justify is owned by WinStar Farm, China Horse Club, Starlight Racing, and Head of Plains Partners, is a possibility for the Belmont Stakes, along with Vino Rosso. WinStar Farm also co-owns graded stakes winner Quip, who bypassed the Kentucky Derby with designs on pointing to the Preakness. WinStar Farm president Elliott Walden

said Sunday the plan for now is still to run Quip in the middle leg, but a final decision has yet to be made.

"If Justify is meant to win the Triple Crown, he'll win the Preakness and nobody will be able to beat him—and that is Quip included," Walden said. "I think you look at it and make the best decision for each horse. I'm not sure what we're going to do yet, but we'll figure it out in the next couple days."

D. Wayne Lukas said Bravazo, the Risen Star Stakes presented by Lamarque Ford (G2) winner who finished sixth in the Derby, will be pointed to the Preakness, as will Sporting Chance, the 2017 Hopeful Stakes (G1) winner who finished fourth in Saturday's Pat Day Mile Stakes presented by LG and E and KU (G3).

"He's good. I was concerned when I saw the track, but he survived that track pretty darn good," Lukas said. "We had a fairly good trip with Bravazo. I haven't talked to (owner) Brad Kelley yet, but he's game, so I'm sure we'll go (to the Preakness). I think we'll put Sporting Chance in there, also."

Trainer Keith Desormeaux said multiple graded stakes winner My Boy Jack, fifth in the Kentucky Derby, will return to California and be given a break from competition.

"Everything was going beautifully. He was making a sustained move where he (was) clipping off horses and then came to a dead stop," Desormeaux said. "He didn't just check. He checked and retreated, and he had to muscle his way out to finally get a run. He got

relegated to last, and when he finally got out, he had to muscle his way through to make his run.

"After all that, for him to rally the way he did and run down good horses in the stretch was awesome. He's had three races in six weeks, so I don't think we're going to beat him up again in the Preakness. There are no set plans right now."

Christina Jelm, assistant for Hall of Famer Jerry Hollendorfer, said Instilled Regard was well following his Kentucky Derby fourth-place finish and will return to California for a break

"He is great today. After the race, he came bouncing back off the racetrack and was ready to go another round," Jelm said. "His legs are good, he ate well and went out for a bite of grass. Things are good. He's happy."

Bill Mott was pleased with Hofburg's seventh-place finish that was impacted by traffic problems and said the Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1) runner-up would likely be aimed at the Belmont Stakes.

"He ran well. Naturally, we would think about the Belmont," Mott said. "He had a couple of horses ... in front of him. He had taken the rail, and (jockey Irad Ortiz Jr.) said horses stopped at the same time in front of him, and he couldn't get around."

What most everyone agreed upon Sunday morning was that something exceptional had taken place on an otherwise dreary day only hours earlier.

"I put him up there with that kind of superior kind of horse that just has speed—and more speed on top of that," Baffert said. "He's got that big, long stride, and he's just so efficient. He does it so easily."

PACIFIC WIND BLOWS BY THE COMPETITION IN RUFFIAN STAKES

Pacific Wind drove through the Belmont Park stretch for her second straight win this year, taking the \$250,000 Ruffian Stakes (G2) by one length May 6, for her first graded victory.

The one-mile Ruffian for older fillies and mares was the feature race Sunday at Belmont and drew a field of five that included grade 1-placed Faypien and Mother Goose Stakes (G2) winner Unchained Melody. With those two the co-second choices in the betting, Pacific Wind was made the 3-2 favorite off an 8 1/4-length score at Keeneland in her season debut for trainer Chad Brown.

In the Ruffian, the 4-year-old daughter of Curlin sat behind the pacesetters midpack as Faypien led the field through a quarter in :23.04 and a half-mile in :46.39, with Unchained Melody keeping the pressure on to her outside. Unchained Melody put a head in front briefly coming off the turn, but it was Highway Star who gained the lead to run six furlongs in 1:10.60.

While Highway Star looked to maintain the lead, Pacific Wind got to the front in deep stretch to prevail in a final time of 1:36.22.

"I broke good and got a nice trip. I waited there, just following horses. When I got in the clear, I asked her and she took off," said winning rider Irad Ortiz Jr. "I really like her. Chad has done a great job with her so far. She enjoys it. She's doing really good."

The winner paid \$5.00, \$3.40, and \$2.40, and runner-up Highway Star returned \$5.90 and \$3.20. Tequilita rallied from last to return \$2.90 to show. Faypien and Unchained Melody completed the order of finish.

"She's really been training well, and we were cautiously optimistic that she could step up in a race of this caliber," Brown said. "Cutting back to one turn was a little bit of a concern. She had run well in a two-turn mile in Keeneland. But she got a favorable setup in front of her. She showed her versatility running at one turn today. She showed a real good closing kick. All-around, she's a really nice filly."

Owned by Sharon Alesia, Ciaglia Racing, Peter Brant, and Dominic Savides, Pacific Wind brought her record to 4-1-2 from 9 starts and boosted her earnings to \$312,545.

As a 3-year-old, Pacific Wind broke her maiden by 4 1/2 lengths on debut in March of 2017 going a mile on the Santa Anita Park turf before finishing third in both the Senorita Stakes (G3T) and the Honeymoon Stakes (G2T) there. After placing second in a Del Mar

optional-claiming allowance race, she finished off the board in the Del Mar Oaks Presented by The Jockey Club (G1T).

Moved to the dirt for her last two races of the year, she showed promise, winning a Santa Anita optional-claiming allowance race by 1 3/4 lengths and then finishing fifth behind winner Majestic Heat and runner-up Champagne Room in the 1 1/16-mile Bayakoa Stakes (G2) at Los Alamitos Race Course in December.

Bred by Sarah Farish in Kentucky, Pacific Wind is out of the Dixieland Band mare Shag and was a \$200,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase by Joe Ciaglia from the Lane's End consignment. **BH**

BEE JERSEY DEFEATS GIRVIN IN STEVE SEXTON MILE

Chuck Fipke's homebred Bee Jersey earned his first stakes win and third straight victory in the \$200,000 Steve Sexton Mile Stakes (G3) May 6 at Lone Star Park.

Defeating a seasoned grade 1 winner was just icing on the cake.

On an uncontested lead under jockey Ricardo Santana Jr. through much of the dirt test, the 4-year-old Jersey Town colt comfortably kicked away from the field turning for home and cruised to the wire unchallenged for trainer Steve Asmussen.

For a moment, 2017 Betfair.com Haskell Invitational Stakes (G1) winner Girvin, who was making his 4-year-old debut, loomed at the top of the stretch with a closing bid. But his rally from last in the seven-horse field took its toll, and he flattened out in the stretch to finish second, 5 1/2 lengths behind Bee Jersey.

"We are (excited). The Fipke breeding program and the success it has had over the last few years—this horse is just another example of it," Asmussen said. "(He's) by his horse Jersey Town, a very good grade 1 miler, and we feel this horse is possibly of that caliber."

Bee Jersey set fractions of :23.91, :47.62, and 1:11.97 through six furlongs and finished off the mile in 1:36.78.

"Today he broke so good, and I took the lead pretty nice and comfortable," Santana said. "He's an amazing horse."

In his first start since the Sept. 24 Oklahoma Derby (G3), Girvin finished a neck ahead of Shotgun Kowboy for second. Last week, trainer Joe Sharp indicated the Sexton Mile was a prep of sorts for the June 16 Stephen Foster Handicap (G1) at Churchill Downs.

"We wanted him to get a race under his belt," Sharp said.

Bred in Kentucky, out of the Rahy mare Bees, Bee Jersey has a 4-3-1 record from nine starts and \$326,293 in earnings. He began his 4-year-old season with a six-length win in an Oaklawn Park allowance Jan. 20, then took an optional-claiming allowance at Keeneland by 7 3/4 lengths April 14. In all three races this season, he led at every point of call. **BH**

FAULT FINDS JUST ENOUGH IN ADORATION VICTORY

The margin was slim, but Fault's victory in the \$100,000 Adoration Stakes (G3) May 6 at Santa Anita Park may have been one of her best.

It didn't have the eye-popping pizzazz of her open-lengths grade 1 victory last time out in the Santa Margarita Stakes (G1), but the deep closer encountered a slow pace Sunday in the 1 1/16-mile Adoration and still got to the wire first under jockey Geovanni Franco.

As she did in the Santa Margarita, the speedy Mended took to the front and set the pace, but this time she got away with fractions of :24.16, :48.40, and 1:12.87 through six furlongs, while the Phil D'Amato-trained Fault took up the rear in the six-horse field, 8 1/2 lengths behind the leader.

By comparison, in the 1 1/8-mile Santa Margarita, Mended set pressured fractions of :22.92, :46.79, and 1:11.11.

Even with the slow pace in front of her, Agave Racing Stable and Little Red Feather Racing's 4-year-old Blame filly, off at odds of 3-5, began her closing rush as the field entered the second turn, moved three

to four wide in the bend, and surged to the wire on the outside in the stretch. In the final three-sixteenths, she first inhaled fellow grade 1 winner Vale Dori, who stalked in third in the backstretch but flattened out late, then blew past La Force, Mended, and longshot Shenandoah Queen to win by a half-length.

"I knew the pace was slow and the filly wanted to be closer, but I decided to wait," Franco said. "I wanted to try and do what we did last time, which was to swing out and let her make her run. That's what she really loves to do, and she made the same run she did last time. She's really special."

Shenandoah Queen, who hadn't placed in five starts since her score in the Aug. 25 Tranquility Lake Stakes at Del Mar, made a simultaneous move with Vale Dori on Mended midway through the final turn but appeared to lose touch with the frontrunner, who answered the challenge and kicked away.

But Mended tired in late stretch, and Shenandoah Queen re-rallied on the rail to take command before being passed in the final strides by Fault.

"She did her thing today," said Billy Koch of Little Red Feather Racing. "It's really incredible and impressive with those fractions to be able to close like that, especially after losing all that ground."

Mended held for third, a length in front of La Force, who was followed by Vale Dori and Demigoddess to complete the order of finish.

Bred in Kentucky by Claiborne Farm, out of the Horse Chestnut mare Charming N Lovable, Fault has a 6-3-2 record from 16 starts and \$618,795 in earnings. In 2018, she's earned \$420,000 from three wins, all in graded stakes. Prior to the Santa Margarita, she won the Buena Vista Stakes (G2T) on grass at Santa Anita. **BH**

BILLEDON BROOK PULLS 66-1 UPSET IN 1,000 GUINEAS

Trainer Richard Hannon's Billesdon Brook was the shock winner of the QIPCO One Thousand Guineas (G1) at Newmarket May 6, coming home 1 3/4 lengths clear of 14 rival 3-year-old fillies and returning the biggest price in the race's history.

The daughter of Champs Elysees completed the mile test in a time of 1:36.62 on a good to firm track.

Group 1 winner Laurens finished second for trainer Karl Burke, while trainer Aidan O'Brien—attempting to double up after taking out yesterday's QIPCO Two Thousand Guineas (G1) with Saxon Warrior—had to settle for third with 11-4 favorite Happily.

Godolphin, looking for its first win in the fillies' classic since 2011, had two runners but could only manage fourth with Wild Illusion and sixth with Soliloquy.

Sent off at odds of 66-1—the longest shot in the field—Pall Mall Partners and Partners' Billesdon Brook had finished fifth behind Laurens in the William Hill May Hill Stakes (G2) at Doncaster to round out her juvenile campaign. She was fourth behind Soliloquy in the Lanwades Stud Nell Gwyn Stakes (G3) in her season debut.

She reversed form with both of those fillies, coming with a strong run to gain the lead approaching the final furlong and giving jockey Sean Levey the biggest win of his career.

"That's a massive shock to me—she had a lot to find," Levey said. "I've come out and said we could do with a bit of luck, she needs to find 17 pounds! Where she's found that from, I don't know.

"She ran in the Nell Gwyn and was a little bit gassy, so she ran well to be fourth," he added. "If she runs her best, she settles throughout, then shows that turn of foot at the end, which she did. I came there two furlongs out and thought, 'Jesus, I might be going a bit early here,' but I didn't want to disappoint her. I've had plenty of winners and have ridden in plenty of races. I've always needed a group 1, that good horse, and that's happened today. Fantastic."

Laurens, under P J McDonald, couldn't match Billesdon Brook's finishing kick when it mattered. The consistent daughter of Siyouni has finished first or second in all five of her starts, with four of those coming in group company.

Owner John Dance was thrilled with the effort.

"It was a fantastic run, and she gave it everything," he said. "She probably found the ground a bit lively coming down the Dip, and the first thing PJ said when he got off was, 'We'll go to France.' She's been a dream since day one. We're incredibly proud."

Happily, winner of last season's Moyglare Stud Stakes (G1) and Qatar Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere-Grand Criterium (G1) as a 2-year-old, was unable to quicken as the pace lifted inside the final two furlongs but only missed second by a half-length. O'Brien and jockey Ryan Moore had jetted back to Newmarket overnight following the disappointment of Mendelssohn's last-place finish in Saturday's Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1). **BH**

KEIAI NAUTIQUE UPSETS IN TOKYO'S NHK MILE

Keiai Nautique rallied from next to last with a furious stretch run to post a narrow upset May 6 in the NHK Mile Cup (G1) for 3-year-olds at Tokyo Racecourse.

The bay son of Deep Impact was up in the final strides to defeat Gibeon by a neck, giving his sire an exacta. Keiai Nautique is out of the Smarty Jones mare Keiai Gerbera, while Gibeon is out of the Ghostzapper mare Contested.

Keiai Nautique was slow out of the gate for jockey Yusuke Fujioka and was unhurried down the backstretch and around the turn. Swinging around the field, Fujioka found clear sailing and timed the late effort perfectly. Keiai Nautique finished the mile in 1:32.80.

"He was a bit slow to pick up speed, so we had to race from behind," said Fujioka, who scored his first Japan Racing Association grade 1 win. "But he more than made up (for it) with his speed and sheer determination. His potential is so great, and I think he can handle longer distance."

The favorite, Godolphin-owned and Darley Japan-bred Tower of London, stumbled at the start under jockey Christophe Lemaire, raced mid-field while saving ground, and was hopelessly bottled up on the

rail through the stretch run. The Raven's Pass colt, whose owners have Royal Ascot aspirations, finished 12th in the field of 14 colts and four fillies.

The winner was bred by Queens Ranch and trained by Osamu Hirata for owner Kazuhiro Kameda. The NHK Mile Cup was his third win from seven starts. He finished fourth in the Dec. 17 Asahi Hai Futurity Stakes (G1) at Hanshin in his 2-year-old finale and came into the Tokyo race off a second-place finish in the April 7 New Zealand Trophy (G2) at Nakayama.

All of his starts have been at the 1-mile distance. **BH**
