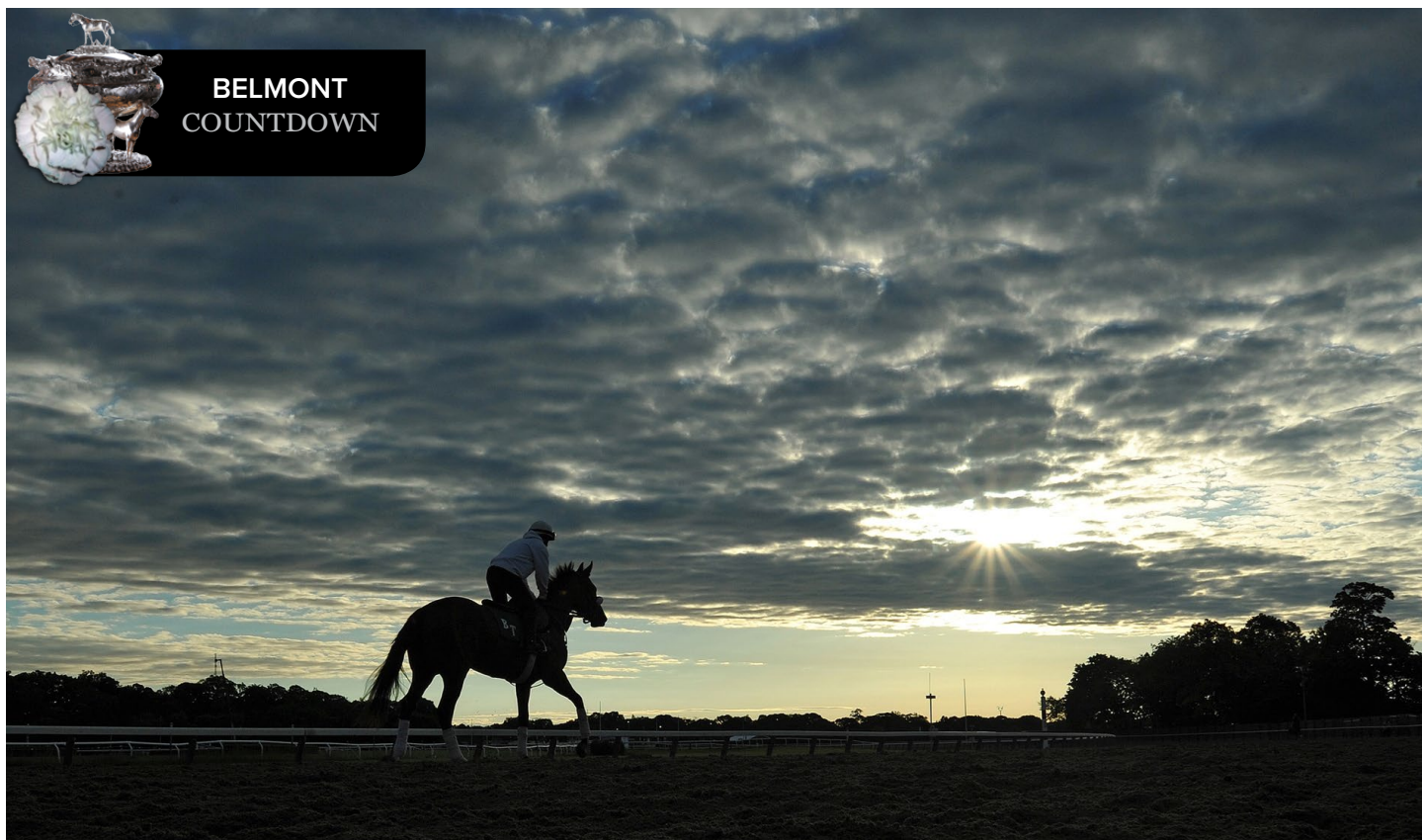

EVALUATING AVERAGE WINNING DISTANCE FOR BELMONT RUNNERS

The 1 1/2-mile distance of the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) is uncharted territory for all 10 entrants in the June 9 race. Few of them, if any, will cover that much ground in competition again.

Without past performance to determine who can best handle the distance, pedigree becomes a highly useful factor in identifying potential stamina ability. This can be measured by comparing the progeny's average winning distance of runners by an entrant's sire and dam.

It is not an airtight system for picking winners, but AWD figures can provide a snapshot of a sire or dam's general ability to pass on stamina to his or her foals. This can help find longer-priced horses whose natural ability at the distance might not be reflected in his past performances.

An entrant's standing is determined by ranking the field's sires and dams by their respective AWD numbers and adding those rankings together to create a combined score. Entrants with lower combined scores are by horses with the most successful histories of producing distance runners.

Tapwrit, winner of last year's Belmont Stakes, topped the 2017 AWD rankings for the race, while runner-up Irish War Cry and third-place Patch tied for the second-highest score. Previous toppers in the Belmont rankings include 2014 runner-up Commissioner and 2015 third-place finisher Keen Ice, each going off at odds of 17-1 or higher.

Once again, a son of Tapit leads the Belmont Stakes AWD rankings, topped this year by Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1) runner-up Hofburg. He is the field's only entry whose sire and dam each ranked second or better among their respective groups by AWD.

Hofburg will attempt to become the fourth son of Tapit to win the Belmont over the past five years, following Tonalist (2014), Creator (2016), and Tapwrit (2017). Tapit ranks second among

this year's Belmont sires with an AWD of 7.60 furlongs, meaning the average length of all the races won by Tapit's foals comes out to a mean of slightly over 7 1/2 furlongs.

A homebred for the Juddmonte Farms operation, Hofburg is out of the Touch Gold mare Soothing Touch, who is the dam of three winners from six foals to race. She ranked second among the Belmont broodmares with an AWD of 8.60 furlongs

Her produce is led by Emollient, an Empire Maker filly, who was a two-time grade 1 winner at 1 1/4 miles, taking the American Oaks (G1T) and Rodeo Drive Stakes (G1T), both on the turf. Courtier, by Pioneerof the

Nile, was a turf stakes winner at a mile and won an allowance at 1 1/16 miles.

Two horses tied for second in this year's standings: Restoring Hope and Tenfold.

Restoring Hope is by Giant's Causeway, who was the runaway leader among the field's sires with an AWD of 8.42 furlongs. Giant's Causeway is the field's only sire with an AWD over a mile, and he is nearly a full furlong greater than next-closest, Pioneerof the Nile.

His dam, the unraced Tapit mare Symbol of Freedom, has had two winners from as many runners, giving her an AWD of 8.25 furlongs and ranking her fifth.

Tenfold is by Curlin, whose AWD of 7.57 furlongs ranked him third, highlighted by 2013 Belmont winner Palace Malice. The colt is the first foal out of the winning Tapit mare Temptress, who was also third among the mares with an AWD of 8.50 furlongs.

Coming in fourth is Free Drop Billy, a son of Union Rags out of the grade 3-placed Giant's Causeway mare Trensa, who led the Belmont mares with an AWD of 9.61 furlongs, making her the only mare with a number higher than 1 1/8 miles.

Trensa's three winners from as many runners are topped by international standout Hawkbill, a son of Kitten's Joy whose 10 wins include four victories at 1 1/2 miles, highlighted by the Longines Dubai Sheema Classic (G1). Free Drop Billy is himself a grade 1 winner at 1 1/16 miles.

Justify, who could secure the Triple Crown with a win Saturday, is tied for sixth in the field, even though he has already proven his two-turn capabilities with authority by winning the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), Preakness Stakes (G1),

and Santa Anita Derby (G1).

He is by the late sire Scat Daddy, who was seventh among this year's Belmont sire class with an AWD of 6.88 furlongs.

Justify's dam is the grade 3-placed Ghostzapper mare Stage Magic, who ranked fourth with an AWD of 8.32 furlongs. Her three winners from as many runners also includes The Lieutenant (by Street Sense), a grade 3 winner at a mile who broke his maiden at 1 1/16 miles; and Holiday Music (by Harlan's Holiday), who is also a winner at a mile. **BH**

DUAL CLASSIC WINNER JUSTIFY ARRIVES AT BELMONT PARK

Dual classic winner Justify was the first horse off a large Brook Ledge Horse Transportation van at 2:10 p.m. June 6 at Belmont Park.

The son of Scat Daddy is the 4-5 morning-line favorite in the \$1.5 million Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) June 9 at Belmont, where he'll try to become the 13th horse to win the Triple Crown.

The van trip completed a journey from Churchill Downs. Justify was vanned to Louisville International Airport on Wednesday morning before being flown to Long Island MacArthur Airport, where he arrived after 12:30 p.m. He was then vanned to the Elmont, N.Y., track, with assistant Jimmy Barnes keeping him company for the entire journey.

Once off the van, Justify was led by trainer Bob Baffert, who walked him in the barn for several minutes. Baffert and Elliott Walden, president and CEO of co-owner WinStar Farm, arrived outside the barn about 10 minutes before the van. Some 60 or 70 media members observed the arrival.

"He didn't get hot (and) drank a lot of water when he got off," Baffert said. "We feel pretty relieved he

made this stage of the journey. He came in here safe and sound. He was just dragging me around there. All the horses in the barn were screaming and yelling. It's almost as if they were greeting him."

Justify is staying in John Terranova's barn, Barn 1, on the Belmont backstretch. It is the same barn that 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah occupied for Baffert ahead of his Belmont win. **BH**

DHS AUTHORIZES ADDITIONAL 15,000 H-2B VISAS FOR FY2018

Following several weeks of tense discussions between Congress and the Trump administration, the Department of Homeland Security published a final rule May 31 in the Federal Register authorizing issuance of 15,000 additional H-2B visas for the remainder of fiscal year 2018.

As reported this spring, Congress authorized the DHS to raise its cap on H-2B temporary worker visas from the current cap of 66,000 to 129,500 visas for FY2018 within the context of the omnibus appropriations law passed in late March. DHS states that by issuing 15,000 extra H-2B visas—significantly below the additional 63,500 authorized by the FY2018 omnibus—the agency will prioritize employers who demonstrate that they would suffer "irreparable harm" to their business unless they are able to hire additional seasonal workers during the summer and fall 2018 seasons. DHS further states that it seeks to avoid possible abuse of the H-2B program by limiting the pool of extra visas to 15,000.

According to the rule, DHS punted the broader temporary worker shortage issue to Congress, urging lawmakers to reform the Immigration and Nationality Act, which establishes the H-2B visa program. During the course of the extended back-and-forth discussions between the legislative and executive branches this spring, DHS claims that only congressional action can provide long-term certainty with respect to the issuance of more guest worker visas. According to federal regulators, addressing worker shortages through the annual appropriations process fails to create certainty, undercutting the ability of the business community to plan long-term.

Since moving forward with a limited cap increase, DHS's United States Citizenship and Immigration Service has outlined some practical considerations for filing an H-2B petition per the new regulation:

- An employer "must meet all existing H-2B eligibility requirements," which includes receipt of "an approved Temporary Labor Certification from

the Department of Labor that is valid for the entire employment period stated on the petition." DHS reminds employers that "the employment start date on the petition must match the employment start date on the TLC, even if that date has passed."

- Employers must also "conduct a fresh round of recruitment for U.S. workers if the TLC contains a start date of work before April 15, 2018."

- A business must "submit an attestation on Form ETA 9142-B-CAA-2 in which the petitioner affirms, under penalty of perjury, its business will likely suffer irreparable harm if it cannot hire all the requested H-2B workers before the end of the fiscal year." The agency provides Form ETA 9142-B-CAA-2 Instructions to properly complete the attestation.

- DHS further states that it "will not accept" an "expired ETA

9142-B-CAA from fiscal year 2017." The agency will reject any "petition that does not include the new ETA 9142-B-CAA-2 attestation form for fiscal year 2018."

Recognizing the time constraints associated with the application process, DHS states that it will "adjudicate" applications within 15 calendar days for employers opting for "premium processing," and 30 days for standard applications. The unprecedented demand for guest worker visas this year will create a narrow time frame in which to submit an application.

As details unfold related to practical considerations associated with the new rule, American Horse Council will continue to inform members about developments and helpful notes for members who are considering moving forward with summer applications.

POWER SISTERS: PREACH AND YARN

Owner/breeder Tanya Gunther spied a potentially rich vein of talent while prospecting for mates for her family's graded-placed winner Stage Magic. A mating with Ashford Stud's Scat Daddy created a 4x4 inbreeding to the full sisters Preach and Yarn.

"This is a good family these mares come from, and I was hoping to bring together the best of the best from them," Gunther said about the daughters by Mr. Prospector out of grade 3 winner Narrate. "We tend to breed classic-type distance horses. We look at stamina versus speed. To be a good racehorse, you need that lethal combination of both."

The mating resulted in Justify, the undefeated Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) favorite who will be fighting this weekend to become North America's 13th Triple Crown winner.

Preach and Yarn are the products of a female family that Claiborne Farm has nurtured since 1951 when Arthur Hancock Sr. bought Knight's Daughter, who was bred and owned by King George VI, for 2,500 guineas at the Tattersalls December sale at Newmarket. The second foal Claiborne produced out of Knight's Daughter was Round Table, a six-time champion and 1958 Horse of the Year.

Yarn is the second foal out of Narrate, who distinguished herself on the racetrack by winning the Falls City Handicap (G3) and placing in three other graded stakes. Raced as a Claiborne homebred in the care of trainer Steven Penrod for her first four starts and later Robert Desensi, Yarn only managed a win, a

second, and a third out of six starts and earned a bit over \$19,000. Her lackluster racing career created an opportunity for Bourbon County breeder Shack Parrish, who acquired her privately for his Indian Creek Farm broodmare band.

"We bought her because it was a family on the move and then Preach came along right after that," Parrish said.

Preach was foaled in 1989, just a yearling when Yarn retired from racing. The tough-minded Claiborne homebred trained by Shug McGaughey won her first time out by 5 1/4 lengths in a six-furlong maiden special weight at Saratoga Race Course. In her second start she finished third in the Spinaway Stakes (G1) and parlayed that run into a victory in the Frizette Stakes (G1). At 3, Preach won the listed Bourbonette Stakes but would not manage another graded stakes victory. She did finish third in the Prioress Stakes (G2) and Test Stakes (G1). Preach retired with a 4-1-4 record out of 15 starts and \$304,656 in earnings.

As Preach wound down her racing career in 1993, Yarn produced her first foal—a filly by Ogygian named Myth. Like her dam, Myth did not turn heads at the

racers. She won once and finished second three times out of 16 starts and collected \$25,110 in purses.

Wayne Lyster III picked up Myth as a broodmare prospect at the 1997 Keeneland November breeding stock sale for \$350,000. He bred the young mare to Hennessy and got Johannesburg, who won a dazzling four grade/group 1 stakes in 2001 for Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor, including the Bessemer Trust Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1). He was named champion 2-year-old colt in both the United States and Europe.

Johannesburg got three graded stakes winners as a freshman sire, with his chief earner being grade 1 winner Scat Daddy. The colt out of Love Style (Mr. Prospector) went from strength to strength by winning the Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) and the Florida Derby (G1) at 3. Scat Daddy injured a tendon during an unplaced effort in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) and was retired soon after.

Preach, meanwhile, had earned a place in the Claiborne broodmare band and was mated to A.P. Indy during her first breeding season. She produced a big strapping colt named Pulpit.

"For her first foal, Pulpit was a standout," said Claiborne farm manager Bradley Purcell. "Usually they are not a mare's best effort, but Pulpit was just a big, athletic-looking colt from the day he was born."

Pulpit, like all of Preach's foals, had to be raised on a nurse mare because Preach was aggressively protective of her foals.

"Preach was tough. She didn't want people coming into her stall or paddock with her foals. She would run you out," Purcell remembered. "We had to raise all her foals on nurse mares to be protective of our people."

Without a foal at her side, Purcell said, Preach was not nearly as aggressive but never an easy mare.

"When she is on her regular schedule, turned out with seven or eight other mares, she is happy and easy to get along with," he said. "When the routine was off, whether the vet or the blacksmith was coming, she was smart and knew when these things were coming around. Anything you needed to do with her, she made you work."

Raced by Claiborne Farm and trainer Frank Brothers, Pulpit did not make his first start until Jan. 11 of his sophomore year when he blasted gate-to-wire through a seven-furlong maiden special weight, winning by 7 1/2 lengths. It was another eight lengths back to the third-place finisher.

Pulpit won an allowance race by 6 3/4 lengths in his second start before winning the Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2). He next finished second in the Florida Derby, won the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2), and finished a respectable fourth in the Kentucky Derby. Pulpit was also injured in the Derby and entered stud at Claiborne in 1998.

Among the 138 black-type performers sired by Pulpit is a grade 1-placed winner named Magical Illusion, who was bred in Kentucky by Joseph Allen and sold for \$110,000 as a yearling to William Clifton Jr. by Lane's End as agent. Magical Illusion won three times in six starts and was third in the Coaching Club American Oaks (G1). She only raced at 3 and was sold as a broodmare prospect for \$425,000 to John Gunther, Tanya Gunther's father, at the 2005 Keeneland January winter mixed sale.

Magical Illusion was bred in 2006 during her second breeding season to Adena Springs Kentucky's speedy new sire and 2004 Horse of the Year Ghostzapper. The mating produced grade 3-placed winner Stage Magic, the dam of Justify.

"It has been amazing watching the full sisters go along like they did and some of their younger relatives have appeared to keep going," said Parrish, who noted Yarn's stakes-winning daughter Spunoutacontrol went on to produce multiple graded winner Fed Biz and black-type winner Spun Silk, who is the dam of grade 1 winner Joking. Yarn is also the dam of Castanea, who is at Indian Creek and has two stakes-producing daughters, including Exit Three, who is the dam of graded winner Untrapped.

"Yarn and Preach both seem to be holding up their ends of the family," Parrish said.

Yarn, who died in 2015, produced five winners from five starters out of six foals. Her top performers were multiple group 1 winner Minardi (by Boundary), who was named the 2000 highweight 2-year-old in England and Ireland; and, grade 2 winner Tale of the Cat (Storm Cat), who won the King's Bishop Stakes (G2)

and placed third twice in the Vosburgh Stakes (G1) and was second in the Whitney Handicap (G1).

At the sales, Yarn's progeny generated \$2,345,000 in gross sales. Minardi rang the bell at the 1999 Keeneland September yearling sale when Coolmore's then-bloodstock agent Demi O'Byrne bought him for \$1.65 million from Indian Creek's consignment.

Yarn's progeny and the runners her daughters have produced include 16 black-type performers to date. In addition to the top horses already mentioned are graded winners Stanford and Hedge Fund, and black-type winners Mark My Way, Hard to Stay Notgo, and Haul Anchor.

Preach is now a 29-year-old pensioner at Claiborne, spending lazy days in a paddock with eight companions that include Starry Dreamer, the dam of top international sire War Front; stakes-placed, black-type producer Cunning; multiple graded stakes producer Hidden Reserve; and, Matlacha Pass, the dam of five-time grade 1-winning sire Point of Entry.

Before her retirement in 2013, Preach produced 12 starters and 12 winners from 14 foals. Pulpit would be her only black-type winner, but her runners included

two other black-type performers—group 3-placed English winner Urban Poet (Dynaformer) and stakes-placed U.S. turf winner Tell It (Storm Cat). Preach's progeny raced in England, Ireland, and North America, where they amassed \$1,366,941 in collective earnings.

At auction, Preach's offspring generated \$7.67 million in gross sales. Her top sellers were Impervious, a son of Storm Cat, who Sheikh Mohammed's former bloodstock agent John Ferguson bought for \$3 million at the 2006 Keeneland September yearling sale; and, Urban Poet, who Ferguson bought for \$2.9 million at the 2007 Keeneland September sale.

The runners produced by Preach and her daughters include 12 black-type performers to date. Aside from those already mentioned, they include graded winner Wild Shot, group/grade 1-placed stakes winners Endless Chatter and Whitecliffsofdoover, grade 3-placed stakes winner Nun the Less, and black-type winners Nunnery and Dream Nettie.

"There are certain matings, a lot of matings, where you feel it all just clicks. That is when I feel really excited about it," said Tanya Gunther. "Justify was one of those that I had thought about every way and was excited about what the end results would be. I basically had hoped to concentrate good genes. It is amazing when it actually works out." **BH**

JUDDMONTE HOPES TO REPRISEROLE OF SPOILER WITH HOFBURG

He was standing under a phalanx of umbrellas, dodging both full cans of beer and obscenities being thrown his way. And today, 15 years later, Garrett O'Rourke would like nothing more than to do it all over again.

Even under the worst conditions, it's nice to be standing in the winner's circle at Belmont Park celebrating victory in the Belmont Stakes (G1). In 2003, O'Rourke, the American manager of the worldwide Juddmonte Farms juggernaut of Prince Khalid Abdullah, proudly stood on the valuable slab of real estate following the triumph of Empire Maker over the people's choice, Funny Cide, after denying the New York-bred dual classic winner the Triple Crown (actually, Funny Cide finished third, well behind runner-up Ten Most Wanted).

"It was pouring rain and the TV network went to a commercial, so we had to wait for the trophy presentation," remembered O'Rourke. "We were lucky they were holding umbrellas over Gov. (George) Pataki

and (trainer) Bobby (Frankel). The cans started flying our way, and the riot police had to come in. I looked over and the only two people who weren't rattled were Gov. Pataki and Bobby Frankel. They were like, "They're our boys; good old New York boys."

This time around, the Juddmonte team is hoping

to play spoiler against Justify as that colt seeks to become the 13th Triple Crown winner in U.S. racing history. The famous Juddmonte silks will be seen on the back of Hofburg, a homebred son of Tapit out of Soothing Touch, a daughter of Belmont winner Touch Gold.

Although just a maiden winner, the Bill Mott-trained Hofburg picked up steam with his closing second-place finish behind Audible in the Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1). After a ground-saving trip in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), Hofburg hesitated swinging off the final turn, got stuck behind the retreating Mendelssohn, and then swung wide, where he

picked up the running before settling for seventh place, 8 3/4 lengths behind Justify.

"Bill was as bullish as I've ever seen him going into the Derby and as gutted as I've ever seen him coming out of the Derby," said O'Rourke. "He is regenerated and bullish again heading into the Belmont, and I think he wants to prove it wasn't false confidence he had going into the Derby. We think he's a much better horse than he was able to prove, unfortunately, on Derby Day. The good thing is the horse came out of the race in good shape and has worked well since, so we're on target."

Long known for its global excellence with turf runners, Juddmonte now actively seeks out horses it thinks will excel at American dirt racing as well. Champion Arrogate, the all-time North American leading money-earner, is exhibit A in its success in that endeavor.

Juddmonte went to \$550,000 to purchase Soothing Touch from the 2005 Keeneland September yearling auction. Produced from the stakes-winning A.P. Indy mare Glia, Soothing Touch hit right out of the gate in her broodmare career. Bred to Empire Maker, she issued Emollient, a grade 1-winning filly on turf

and synthetic, and turf stakes winner Courtier (by Pioneerof the Nile).

"When you have these families, they can race on dirt or turf, and there's no way we would force them into one or the other," O'Rourke said. "That's when you hand it over to professionals like Bill Mott, and Bill felt from the beginning Hofburg was a natural on dirt. It's in the way he finishes his works. He's always impressed us working to the wire with a workmate, and then when they drop the reins he always gallops out in front. Turf horses don't usually do that. We think he's got a big future on dirt."

Having won the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1), Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes (G1), and Dubai World Cup Sponsored By Emirates Airline (G1) with Arrogate and trainer Bob Baffert, Juddmonte is now having to line up against that trainer in the Belmont. O'Rourke chuckled at the irony.

"You do become friends with your trainers, people like Bobby, Bill, Chad Brown, Brad Cox; you admire the talent and the work they do. But in the end it's Team Juddmonte," O'Rourke said. "I have every admiration for WinStar and Justify and for Bob Baffert. But we go in there with one goal in mind on Belmont day.

"We spoiled the party 15 years ago and we weren't very popular then, but it didn't sour the taste of victory." **BH**

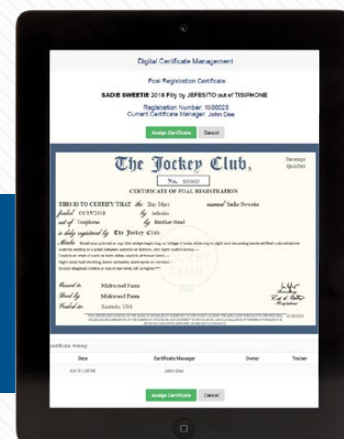

A HOFBURG WIN WOULD EXTEND TAPIT'S BELMONT SUCCESS

Dual classic winner Justify will not be the only horse aiming for history in the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) June 9 at Belmont Park. A victory by Hofburg would add another page to the 1 1/2-mile classic's record books for his sire, Tapit.

Tapit's dominance as a sire in the final and longest leg of the Triple Crown is unmatched in recent years. He has sired three of the past four Belmont Stakes winners. Tonalist kicked off the run in 2014 with his victory over Commissioner where California Chrome's Triple Crown efforts ended. Tapit added to his Belmont success in 2016 with Creator and last year with Tapwrit.

Those victories surround 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, who was followed home in the Belmont by Frosted, another son of Tapit.

The only other sire to manage three Belmont Stakes winners in four years was Lexington, starting with General Duke in 1868, then Kingfisher in 1870, and Harry Basset in 1871. Lexington also sired a fourth Belmont winner: Duke of Magenta in 1879.

Tapit's success in the 1 1/2-mile Belmont has helped him finish as leading sire of 2014, 2015, and 2016.

Tapit did not compete in the Belmont. In 2004, he skipped the race because of a recurrence of a lung infection. The illness had cropped up earlier that season, lingering in the days before the Wood Memorial Stakes (G1). Even so, Tapit won that 1 1/8-mile Kentucky Derby

(G1) prep at Aqueduct Racetrack with a thrilling stretch drive, surprising even his trainer, Michael Dickinson, who said at the time a third-place finish would have been solid for the recovering colt. In the Kentucky Derby, Tapit finished ninth before being retired that year.

The horse's determination in the Wood Memorial, though, is one of the traits apparent in his progeny.

"If you have a photo finish and a Tapit horse is in the finish, they nearly always win," said Michael Hernon, director of sales at Gainesway in Lexington, where Tapit stands for \$300,000.

On Saturday with Juddmonte Farms' Hofburg, Tapit has a chance to send a Belmont runner to the winner's circle for the fourth time in five years and become the first sire to have three winners in a row.

The 2018 Belmont Stakes also has the potential to deepen Tapit's influence through his female families. Two entrants—Tenfold, by Curlin, and Restoring Hope, by Giant's Causeway—are out of Tapit mares.

As Tapit's progeny have succeeded, the quality of mares sent to him has also improved. The fillies produced in those matings are starting to achieve their own breeding successes. "Many of his daughters are daughters of royally bred broodmares," Hernon said.

Tapit's status as a sire of sires also figures to be on display this weekend. Monomoy Girl, who won the 2018 Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1), is a daughter of Tapizar, a Tapit son who won the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) and entered stud duty in 2013. Monomoy Girl is entered in the Acorn Stakes (G1) Saturday.

Trained by Brad Cox, Monomoy Girl's record is an impressive six wins in seven races, two of which were grade 1. Her only loss was a second-place finish by a

neck as a 2-year-old in the Golden Rod Stakes (G2) at Churchill Downs.

Hofburg, trained by Hall of Famer Bill Mott, finished seventh in the 2018 Kentucky Derby after some traffic trouble. But Hernon said the "ultra-competitive spirit" embedded in the line is a key, as well as a tendency toward blooming later: "They improve with age."

"He has a lot of natural speed," Mott told BloodHorse, after Hofburg's final pre-Belmont workout of five furlongs at the Oklahoma track at Saratoga Race Course.

Mott noted that Hofburg has the key Tapit trait: stamina. "You know it seems like that's been his forte. He keeps coming," Mott said.

If Hofburg wins, it will be a breeding achievement for Tapit—and a positive narrative to balance the 2018 Triple Crown that would have been. **BH**

MIND YOUR BISCUITS BACK HOME FOR MET MILE

After he won the Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored By Gulf News (G1) with Mind Your Biscuits the first time around in 2017, co-owner and trainer Chad Summers thought the Metropolitan Handicap (G1) a couple months later might be a possibility.

When the New York-bred son of Posse took a few steps off the trailer upon his return from quarantine after his trip overseas, however, that idea quickly went out the window.

Summers estimates Mind Your Biscuits lost about a 100 pounds from his Dubai trip in 2017, and for his 2018 journey the trainer was determined to make a change for the better. He picked the brains of other trainers—including Kiaran McLaughlin, who ran Frosted in the 2016 Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (G1), then saddled the gray to one of the most dominant Met Mile performances in the race's history—and set a course of action ahead of Mind Your Biscuits' repeat win in the March 31 Golden Shaheen.

Instead of shipping back to the U.S. immediately after the race, Mind Your Biscuits stayed in Dubai an extra 10 days.

"It was a strategic decision," Summers said. "Myself and (trainer Jorge) Navarro talked about it after we saw what happened last year. The horses came back and lost so much weight. Talking with Kiaran McLaughlin, they were there with Frosted for 90 days. When they came back he looked great, and then Frosted did what he did.

"There might be an advantage to staying a little longer to recover. Obviously, we weren't there for 90 days (the entire trip for Mind Your Biscuits was about three weeks), but I thought if we could stay a little longer, it might change things."

When Mind Your Biscuits exited the trailer at Fair Hill Training Center after his quarantine this year, the result was clear. Instead of 100 pounds, he had lost 10. What took five weeks to get his weight back a year ago took almost no time at all.

So now the Runhappy Metropolitan Handicap is not only on the table, but Mind Your Biscuits is the 5-2 favorite on the morning line and the highweight at 122 pounds for the June 9 race at Belmont Park. And while Summers is confident in his horse, even at a distance at which he has yet to win, the trainer sees his main challenger in Chuck Fipke's homebred Bee Jersey, a speedy son of Jersey Town.

"To me, Bee Jersey is the horse to beat," Summers said of the May 6 Steve Sexton Mile Stakes (G3) winner, who earned his first graded win by 5 1/2 lengths and

won a Keeneland allowance (also at a mile) by 7 3/4 lengths in April. "That may sound silly, but if he's loose on the lead and I'm giving him five pounds—if your horse is in front, it's your race to lose. Anything can happen when you're behind. If you're in front, all you have to do is not let the ones behind you pass you."

Two in the 11-horse field who could challenge Bee Jersey on the front end are One Liner, the 2017 Southwest Stakes (G3) winner who finished second to Irish War Cry last time out in the sloppy Pimlico Special Stakes (G3) May 18, and multiple grade 1 winner Bolt d'Oro, the lone 3-year-old in the field.

Off a testing, 12th-place run in the May 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), the Medaglia d'Oro colt owned by trainer Mick Ruis and his wife Wendy is dialing back to a distance that may be in his sweet spot. Although he has raced in two-turn races in his last five attempts, Bolt d'Oro won the seven-furlong Del Mar Futurity (G1) in September with a stalk-and-pounce trip and a late punch.

"I thought the best thing for him was to give him a couple extra weeks and look for this race. This race is speed and stamina," Ruis said of bypassing the Preakness Stakes (G1). "We know he has some speed, and he's bred for stamina. We just thought we'd take a shot here. He's training up to the race really good. We know we're up against some tough older milers, but I think he'll put in a good showing for himself."

Also cutting back in distance for the Met Mile is One Liner, longshot Discreet Lover, and multiple grade 2 winner Good Samaritan.

The sprinters stretching out include West Coast-based grade 1 winner Ransom the Moon, last-out Churchill Downs Stakes presented by TwinSpires.com (G2) winner Limousine Liberal, Churchill Downs runner-up and April 7 Commonwealth Stakes (G3) winner Warrior's Club, and Churchill Downs third Awesome Slew, who last found the winner's circle in the one-turn-mile Ack Ack Stakes (G3) Sept. 30.

One entrant who won't be switching up—other than a steep step up in class—is Whitham Thoroughbreds' McCracken. The 4-year-old Ghostzapper colt has earned all three of his graded wins around two turns but is undefeated at the one-turn-mile distance, including his first start of 2018, an optional-claiming allowance win May 5 at Churchill Downs. The Ian Wilkes trainee also won the Street Sense Stakes at the distance during his 2-year-old season in 2016.

"He's done nothing but go forward since (his last) race, so I'm very happy with him," Wilkes said. "(He) can run a mile and an eighth, too, but I might just concentrate on a mile. The horse has a great turn of foot. That's the key to it." **BH**

HOUSE OF TODD: PLETCHER AIMS TO ADD TO BELMONT SUCCESS

Home-court advantage in a championship series is always a sought-after commodity. In the heat of battle, when every physical and mental attribute is being tested, the comforts of familiar confines can be the difference between celebrating at the finish or wondering what might have been.

The 1 1/2-mile oval that sits in Elmont, N.Y., essentially serves as the backyard for seven-time Eclipse Award winner Todd Pletcher. Fittingly, his record in Belmont Park's signature test backs up how adept he is at making a visiting team feel out of sorts.

Where critics have poked holes at his record in the first two legs of the Triple Crown—particularly at the bagel in the middle—Pletcher's history in the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) is one that puts the future Hall of Famer in elite company. With three wins, five runner-up finishes, and a trio of third-place efforts in

the 12-furlong test, the New York-based conditioner has been at his best during the final bend of the Triple Crown, a reputation that was further enhanced last year when he saddled Tapwrit to victory in the marathon classic.

Should one of the two Pletcher trainees set to start in the June 9 edition of the race end up as his fourth Belmont hero, you could argue it would be the greatest testament yet of his aptitude in a race that has thrown some of the sport's best for a loop. His graded stakes-winning pair of Vino Rosso and Noble Indy have a monster they are trying to collectively slay in unbeaten dual classic winner Justify. While each has back class to draw upon and stamina in their blood to carry them, the base put into them by the man who has routinely humbled Big Sandy's toughest test might be the biggest intangible.

"I think it's a combination of a number of things," Pletcher said when asked his secret to success in the final leg of the American classics. "For one, we generally take the five weeks (between the Kentucky Derby and Belmont) to come here and prepare for it

and come here with a fresh horse. Two, it's part of the foundation that they've had over the last six or seven months of training and preparing for the Derby preps and the Derby itself. And I think there is a fitness component to that that is helpful in the Belmont."

Appropriately enough, Pletcher's first Belmont Stakes win also served as his first in a Triple Crown race—and it was an effort for the ages. When the brilliant filly Rags to Riches fought off eventual two-time Horse of the Year Curlin in 2007, she also showcased the blueprint each of her trainer's Belmont winners have followed.

Rags to Riches, Palace Malice (2013), and Tapwrit all came into the race off the five-week turnaround Pletcher favors, with the former having won the Kentucky Oaks (G1) in her prior start and the latter two entering off starts in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1). Of his eight horses that finished in the top two in the Belmont, only Commissioner was wheeling back on a shorter time frame, having four weeks between his runner-up efforts in both the Peter Pan Stakes (G2) and the 2014 edition of the Test of Champions.

"I think it's generally an advantage to have a fresh horse coming into any race, but especially in this particular race when you're catching some horses who are potentially making their third start in five weeks," said Pletcher, who also has two Kentucky Derby wins on his résumé. "And we have the luxury of training at Belmont the last five weeks, so I think it does help and it is an advantage. But sometimes if you're running against a superior horse, it might not matter."

Another commonality between Pletcher's top Belmont performers is they each boasted a pedigree that tipped their hand as to what was coming.

If there was ever a horse born to go a mile and a half, Rags to Riches—a daughter of A.P. Indy and half

sister to fellow Belmont Stakes winner Jazil—was it. Palace Malice counted Curlin as his sire, and Tapwrit became the third son of leading sire Tapit to triumph.

Based on those collective past performances, it wouldn't be the craziest thing if either Vino Rosso or Noble Indy stunned the racing community Saturday.

Vino Rosso has had the Belmont penciled in on his agenda since around the time he broke his maiden in November, and the son of Curlin has been training forwardly since finishing ninth in the Kentucky Derby.

Though Noble Indy could only manage a 17th-place run on the first Saturday in May, the grandson of A.P. Indy has the kind of tactical speed that is crucial in the Belmont and—most importantly—could keep Justify honest with the early fractions.

"So far (Justify) has been perfect, he's won every start. So you're going to assume he's going to show up and run his race, but that's why they line them up and do it," Pletcher said.

"With Vino Rosso ... we thought as he matured a little more that time would be on his side, and we always felt like this was the race for him. He's stoutly bred to stay the distance and has the right kind of mental makeup for this race in terms of he's not going to get rank or headstrong. He's going to fall into a rhythm and hopefully keep going."

Were it not for Tonalist's head in 2014 and Creator's nose denying Destin in 2016, Pletcher would likely already be on equal footing with the legendary Woody Stephens with five Belmont Stakes trophies in his case. If he pulls into a tie with his former mentor—four-time Belmont winner D. Wayne Lukas—he'll have denied one of the more brilliant intruders trying to steal thunder in his house.

"When the Triple Crown is at stake, (the Belmont) becomes the premier race in the United States," Pletcher said. "I think it compares to any sporting event. There is an electricity to it that I think only really special events have, and you can feel it. I get jazzed up for it even when it's not a Triple Crown, but when there is a Triple Crown, I think it takes it up another level." **BH**

WINCHELL'S FAITH STRONG IN BELMONT CONTENDER TENFOLD

Given Tenfold's impressive third-place finish in the sloppy Preakness Stakes (G1), less than a length behind Justify, you might reasonably expect owner Ron Winchell to be heartened by the prospect of afternoon rain June 9, as his homebred colt prepares for the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1).

Quite the contrary.

"I am hoping not for rain," he said emphatically. "I want a fair, even track—a nice level surface on which Tenfold can gallop everybody into the ground."

The lightly raced son of Curlin out of the Tapit mare Temptress will be making just his fifth start this weekend, but Winchell has no reservations about running the colt back on three weeks' rest.

"After watching him run in the Preakness, we said that if he came out of the race with energy, the Belmont was definitely something we'd like to do," Winchell said.

"Look at his pedigree," the owner continued. "He has a high cruising speed, and in the Preakness he had to be used a little bit on the final turn to get position, and he was playing against the grain of the track that day, which favored frontrunners. In the stretch, he looked like he had a chance to win, but he changed leads and lost momentum."

"If he can get into an even pace, he can cruise and get the distance."

Tenfold inherited the sponsorship by Sentient Jet conveyed upon his stablemate Combatant before the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1).

Sentient Jet also arranged a partnership with Homes For Our Troops, a non-profit that builds homes for disabled and injured veterans and whose mission allied perfectly with Combatant's name.

But when Winchell and trainer Steve Asmussen elected to keep Combatant out of the Preakness and the Belmont, Sentient Jet and Home For Our Troops switched their allegiance to Tenfold.

"Everyone was happy with the way Combatant raised awareness about Homes For Our Troops," Winchell said. "So we decided to do it again for the Preakness, and that was fantastic, so we moved on to the Belmont."

As part of the arrangement—the financial details of which were not disclosed—veterans affiliated with Homes For Our Troops attended the first two races of the Triple Crown. On Saturday, veterans will once again be in the stands cheering for Tenfold.

"I told them they're invited to the winner's circle if we happen to be lucky enough to win," Winchell said.

Breaking from post 7, Tenfold is 12-1 on the morning line and will be ridden by Ricardo Santana Jr., who's been in the saddle for three of the horse's four starts. Despite Tenfold's odds, Winchell won't be surprised if he, and the veterans, end up in the winner's circle.

"He's a little bit like Gun Runner," said the owner, referring to his homebred who was named 2017 Horse of the Year on the strength of four straight grade 1 wins at age 4. "He's been continuously improving—getting bigger and stronger and better as he gets older."

"He was doing so good physically and mentally that we'd thought we'd give the Preakness a shot, and we fell three-quarters of a length short. He showed us that he is what we thought he was." **BH**

DEEP FIELD AWAITS BEACH PATROL IN MANHATTAN

After opening his season with a runner-up finish in the Old Forester Turf Classic Stakes (G1T) May 5 on the Churchill Downs turf, Beach Patrol figures to build off that effort when he starts in the \$1 million Woodford Reserve Manhattan Stakes (G1T) June 9 at Belmont Park.

Besides the benefit of having a start under his belt, James Covello, Sheep Pond Partners, Head of Plains Partners, and Al Shahania Stud's Beach Patrol should also like stretching out in distance in the 1 1/4-mile Manhattan on the inner turf. Beach Patrol closed out 2017 with a victory in the 1 1/4-mile Arlington Million XXXV Stakes (G1T), a win in the 1 1/2-mile Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Stakes (G1T), and a runner-up finish in the 1 1/2-mile Longines Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T).

A 5-year-old son of Belmont Stakes (G1) winner Lemon Drop Kid, Beach Patrol will look to improve on

his fourth-place finish in last year's Manhattan.

Eclipse Award-winning trainer Chad Brown will try for his fifth Manhattan win in seven years with Beach Patrol—the 5-2 morning-line favorite—as well as 3-1 second choice Robert Bruce, who enters off a win in the Fort Marcy Stakes (G3T) May 5 on the Belmont inner turf. That effort marked the North American debut for Convento Viejo's Robert Bruce, a four-time group 1 winner in Chile.

"They're both doing well," Brown said. "Beach Patrol looks to be more forwardly placed, while Robert Bruce comes from off the pace."

Awaiting that formidable duo is Argentine Triple Crown winner Hi Happy, who will aim for a third straight victory. La Providencia's Hi Happy returns to the Belmont inner turf where he won the Man o' War Stakes (G1T) May 12, a score that followed his 2 3/4-length victory in the Pan American Stakes (G2T) on the Gulfstream Park turf.

Todd Pletcher will saddle Hi Happy for the fourth time Saturday.

"He's a horse that performs well, very

straightforward and easy to train," said Pletcher, who is seeking his first Manhattan win. "When you are fortunate enough to get the opportunity to train a ready-made horse, it makes your job so easy. You just try to keep them sound and healthy and point them in the right direction."

Also back from the Man o' War are runner-up Sadler's Joy, who finished third in last year's Manhattan, and One Go All Go, who won the Dixiana Elkhorn Stakes (G2T) at Keeneland this year and figures to set the early pace from post 2. **BH**

ILLINOIS TRACKS FAIL AGAIN IN QUEST FOR GAMING REVENUE

The future of one of only three remaining Illinois racetracks hangs in the balance as the state legislature adjourned its spring session without acting on a bill that would allow tracks to operate casinos.

Officials from Fairmount Park, across the Mississippi River from St. Louis, said at the Illinois Racing Board's dates hearing in September the track would close in early July without such action.

"Members of the legislature understand this meet could be cut by 50%," Fairmount president Brian Zander said while accepting a 2018 schedule of just 41 racing days. "Hopefully, they'll understand that this is serious now."

While reiterating that "something has to happen," Zander told the board, "It could be something grandiose such as racinos and table games or something relatively small."

Zander told the board Fairmount was "not going to do anything unilaterally" and, following the legislature's adjournment without action, he did not immediately respond to inquiries about plans for the track.

Fairmount actually lost twice during the session as both the statewide gaming bill and a fallback plan that would have authorized 150 slot machines at the Collinsville, Ill., track both stalled without a vote in the Illinois House.

Lawmakers did approve, as part of the overall state budget, \$1,609,500 in purse supplements primarily for races restricted to Illinois-conceived and -foaled or Illinois-conceived stakes races and for Illinois horses finishing in the top three in open races at the \$10,000 claiming or higher level. That would be of limited benefit to Fairmount and, in any case, might be a while in actually showing up in cash flow as the funding goes onto a multi-billion-dollar stack of unpaid state bills.

"Clearly, this is a fraction of the boost Illinois horse racing truly needs to survive, let alone thrive,"

the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association said in a statement. "But as we inch closer to passage of legislation that will permit gaming at tracks for the purpose of substantially increasing purses, we appreciate the vote of support."

Horsemen cite hope for the future, provided they can continue to hold out for the future to arrive. A promising note is that the

current version of the statewide gaming bill that stalled in House committee calls for both slots and table games at tracks.

Legislation signed by former Gov. Pat Quinn, who twice vetoed gaming expansion that would have benefited racing, has resulted in a glut of slot machines throughout the state at gas stations, beauty parlors, taverns, fraternal halls, and the like. That legislation not only specifically prohibits tracks from participating, but also dilutes the potential impact of slots-only on-track wagering.

Racing interests are also eyeing possible revenue enhancements involving sports betting in light of the recent Supreme Court of the United States ruling removing a ban on that form of wagering.

Lawmakers are not scheduled to return to work until after the November general election—a so-called "lame duck session" in which otherwise difficult

legislation is sometimes shoehorned through to passage. If a gaming bill is passed then, it could be signed either by Gov. Bruce Rauner or Democrat challenger J.B. Pritzker, should Pritzker unseat the incumbent.

In a sideshow typical of long-standing industry infighting, horsemen's groups also have filed suit seeking to require the state to replace purse money taken by tracks as so-called "recapture"—a device originally intended to let track operators recover money lost through the advent of full-card simulcasting.

State law sets the formula for the amount of "recapture" due each track, mandates the Illinois Racing Board authorize the divestiture from the purse accounts to the tracks, and requires the state to reimburse that amount to the purse accounts.

For the past 17 years, the first two requirements of that equation have been met, but the legislature has failed to appropriate the reimbursement funding—costing purse accounts hundreds of millions of dollars. The racing board has declined to join in the suit. **BH**

THE TREMONT: HANSEL'S TRAIL TO THE CLASSICS

Belmont Park's Belmont Stakes weekend comprises a bonanza of stakes that contain something for everyone, from 2-year-olds and up, and from dirt to turf.

One of the first 2-year-old races on the June 8 card is the \$150,000 Tremont Stakes, a listed event contested over 5 1/2 furlongs that sets youngsters on a journey that just might—if they have the right stuff—bring them back the next year for a shot at the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1).

The race is named to honor Tremont, the Dwyer brothers' brilliant 2-year-old son of Virgil—Ann Fief, by Alarm, who won 13 stakes races in 73 days between May 27 and Aug. 7, 1886. Blessed with speed and cursed with unsoundness, the raven-black Tremont was shelved following his victory in the Junior Champion Stakes at Monmouth, in which he demolished a quality field of juveniles by eight lengths. His earnings for the year amounted to \$40,045, second only to 3-year-old The Bard, winner of the Preakness and six other stakes.

Foot issues were his demise, and the following year Phil Dwyer paved the way for the colt's retirement: "I cannot tell when (Tremont) will face the starter. The trouble with his foot is more serious than we at first thought. We prefer to retire him with an unbeaten record rather than risk a final breakdown."

Tremont never raced again.

But that same year, the Brooklyn Jockey Club, with Dwyer as president, carded the first Tremont Stakes at Gravesend Race Track on Coney Island. While it might appear nepotistic to name a race in his own horse's honor, public opinion noted that "his equal has never been seen in this country, if in the world."

Tremont's first two races were at Jerome Park. His first, the Juvenile Stakes accompanied a Metropolitan Handicap; his second, the Sequence Stakes, came on the undercard of the 20th Belmont Stakes. In an odd confluence of circumstances, those same races appear with the Tremont on the 150th Belmont Stakes Racing Festival weekend program.

Several Belmont Stakes winners have also won the Tremont: Jean Bereaud, Man o' War, and Bold Forbes.

Hansel in 1990-91 was the last to complete the double.

Marvin Little Jr. bred Hansel in Virginia, sending his unraced Dancing Count mare Count on Bonnie to Irish champion 2-year-old Woodman, who was standing his first year at Ashford Stud in Kentucky. The result was an exceedingly handsome bay with a blaze spilling from his forehead before splashing across his nose.

Joe Allbritton purchased Hansel for \$150,000 at the Keeneland September yearling sale and turned him over to trainer Frank Brothers.

Hansel jumped directly from his 3 1/2-length debut win at Arlington Park into the deep pool of the Tremont Breeders' Cup Stakes (G3) at Belmont Park. With Randy Romero riding, Hansel stalked the pace through the first part of the race before taking control in the stretch and delivering a three-length verdict to his six opponents. After placings in the Sapling Stakes (G2) and Hopeful Stakes (G1), he returned to Arlington to win the Arlington-Washington Futurity (G2).

At 3, Hansel and new rider Jerry Bailey won the Jim

Beam Stakes (G2) and the Lexington Stakes (G2), which sent him to Louisville as the Kentucky Derby (G1) favorite, only to finish 10th. He took the Preakness Stakes (G1) and out-dueled his Derby victor, Strike the Gold, by a head in the Belmont.

At year's end, Hansel earned an Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old male. **BH**

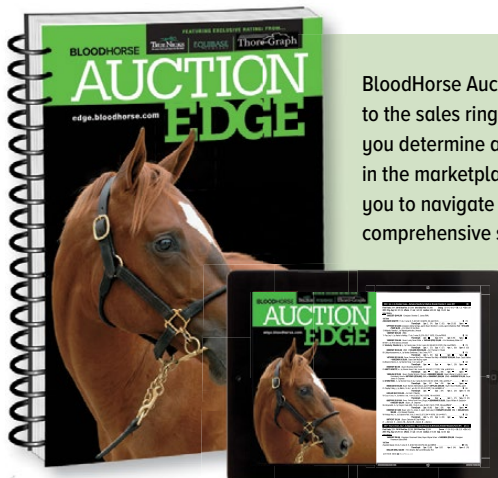
