




# WAR FRONT ENTERS NEW PHASE OF EUROPEAN CAREER

Last week's action on the track emphasized how War Front's stallion career, and perhaps breeders' perception of him, has evolved.

The Claiborne Farm kingpin had faced something of a public relations crisis in Europe due to an unfortunate accumulation of top-class 2-year-olds who, for one reason or another, had failed to replicate their form at 3 or older: see Air Force Blue, Brave Anna, Faydhan, and War Command.

There must have been some

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
sleepless nights among the Coolmore directorate, wondering if they had made the correct decision to target

the son of Danzig as a worthy outcross for their many high-class and well-related mares by Sadler's Wells and sons Galileo and Montjeu in pursuit of breeding group 1 winners and, crucially for the operation, making commercial stallion prospects.

But their faith in War Front appears to have been vindicated.

Last year's European champion 2-year-old U S Navy Flag notched a first group 1 in his 3-year-old campaign for
Aidan O'Brien
and Coolmore with
a clear-cut victory in
the Darley July Cup (G1),
having tried to make the
running and faded over a
mile in top-flight company
on his last three starts. Another
son of War Front, last year's
Juddmonte Middle Park Stakes (G1)
second Fleet Review, followed U S
Navy Flag home in third.

Earlier at the July Festival, another War Front 3-year-old in Naval Intelligence—a rare good one that Coolmore appear to have let slip through their fingers, having bred him but sold him to race for Jane Chapple-Hyam—was a surprise yet impressive winner of the listed Edmond Hall Solicitors Sir Henry Cecil Stakes.

U S Navy Flag, Fleet Review, and Naval Intelligence are all out of Galileo mares in classic heroine Misty For Me, Rip Van Winkle's sister A Star Is Born and group 3 scorer Say, respectively. The mating of War Front with Misty For Me also came up with Roly Poly, who last year became the first group 1 winner for her sire at 3 or older in Europe since Declaration of War in 2013.

It is tempting to believe that the War Front-Galileo cross is the perfect recipe, marrying the best of current American and European bloodlines.

Similarly, Coolmore's Tattersalls Gold Cup (G1) winner this year—Lancaster Bomber, another who took his rivals off their feet with a bold front-running performance—is by War Front out of Sun Shower, a daughter of Indian Ridge who had already produced ace miler Excelebration. Again, refining the raw talent provided by the sire with a proven European group 1 pedigree.

Coolmore's announcement in the immediate aftermath of the July Cup that U S Navy Flag would be prepared for the lucrative Everest at Randwick in Australia in October is a laudable sporting decision and one that makes good business sense as the organisation will want to showcase War Front to Australian breeders for the sake of the important shuttle sire market, knowing there are likely many more group 1

winners like U S Navy Flag in the pipeline.

As for War Front's credentials as a sire of sires, his Coolmore-owned freshman and second-season sire sons War Command and Declaration of War registered new winners in the past seven days.

War Command supplied 3 1/2-length Wolverhampton Stakes winner Theatre of War and impressive Ascot debut scorerNuremberg, while Declaration of War's daughter Tobruk also won on the Wolverhampton all-weather.

# DEL MAR'S OPENING WEEK BRINGS FULL FIELDS, TURF RACING

As the racing circuit in Southern California moves to its southernmost point, overflow fields and quality turf racing will greet fans and gamblers during the first two days of Del Mar's summer meet.

The 10-race opening-day card July 18 features an average field size of 10.4 and four grass races, highlighted by the \$100,000 Oceanside Stakes, which drew 14 3-year-olds—including Faversham, a full brother to two-time Horse of the Year California Chrome—and two also-eligibles.

Faversham broke his maiden impressively last time out on the Santa Anita Park turf course June 21,

lengths. It was the Lucky Pulpit ridgling's sixth start but only the second on grass.

The turf racing is particularly enticing after three weeks at the turf-less Los Alamitos Race Course, and the eight-race July 19 card features three grass races and also has an average field size of 9.9.

The feature Thursday, however, will be on the main track, as a pair of graded winners from the barn of trainer Simon Callaghan will face off in a 6 1/2-furlong allowance race.

Moonshine Memories, who won the Del Mar Debutante Stakes (G1) and Chandelier Stakes (G1) in 2017, but is winless in two starts this year, is targeting the Prioress Stakes (G2) at Saratoga Race Course Sept. 2. Treasuring, who won the Senorita Stakes (G3T) at Santa Anita May 5, doesn't have a defined target just yet.

"We have always wanted to try dirt at some point (with Treasuring), so (we'll) see if it opens up some more doors," Callaghan said of the Havana Gold filly, whose four wins have all come on grass.

Also in the Thursday allowance is California-bred stakes winner Show It N Moe It; stakes winner Steph Being Steph, who has placed in back-to-back grade 2 races at Santa Anita; and stakes-placed Secret Spice.

Opening-week stakes racing resumes July 20 in the \$75,000 Osunitas Stakes, which is followed by the \$200,000 San Diego Handicap (G2) and \$200,000 San Clemente Stakes (G2T) July 21, and the \$250,000 Eddie Read Stakes (G2T) and \$75,000 Wickerr Stakes on the turf July 22. BH

# **GAMBLE'S GHOST** VICTORIOUS IN WOODBINE'S MATRON STAKES

7ith a four-wide rally in the stretch, Gamble's Ghost surged from next to last to win the \$125,000 Ontario Matron Stakes (G3) July 15 on Woodbine's all-weather track.

After a break from post 7 in the field of nine older fillies and mares, the 5-year-old daughter of Ghostzapper lacked early speed and settled in comfortably second from the back under jockey Eurico Rosa da Silva. The fast-moving Mark Casse trio of My Arch Enemy, Malibu Bonnie, and Let It Ride Mom took the lead three across the track as My Arch Enemy set fractions of :24.65, :50.21, and 1:14.85 through the first six furlongs.

Two wide as they hit the clubhouse turn, Gamble's Ghost looked unhurried entering the backstretch. Pressuring the leader on the outside, Let It Ride Mom managed to eke out a short-lived lead over My Arch Enemy in the final furlong as Malibu Bonnie drove ahead for a late challenge.

Angled out farther in the stretch, Gamble's Ghost found a clear path to the front and kicked away in a ground-saving ride that sent her across the finish in a final time of 1:44.88 for 1 1/16 miles.

"I had a lot of confidence," da Silva said. "When we were in the paddock, (trainer) Josie (Carroll) told me, 'Eurico, just let her run her race.' She was very, very relaxed all the way. ... I chose to save a little more ground, and I knew she was going to run in the end. She ran beautiful. When she turned for home, all she wanted to do was catch all the horses."

Let It Ride Mom took second and was followed by My Arch Enemy and Malibu Bonnie.

Sunday's ride was almost an exact replay of Gamble's Ghost's June 17 trip in the Trillium Stakes (G<sub>3</sub>), when she rallied from last to win over the same distance. The Trillium even sported a similar lineup, including fellow Matron runners My Arch Enemy, Malibu Bonnie, Grizzel, and Sister Nation.

"This mare, when she sees a horse in front of her, she's going to catch it," Carroll said. "She's just getting better and better, which is unusual as a mare gets older. But she just loves to chase horses. ... You can't change her. She likes to make that one run."

Off at odds of 2-1, Gamble's Ghost paid \$6.50, \$3.10, and \$2.50. Bred in Ontario by owner and breeder Ivan Davlos, Gamble's Ghost improved her record to 9-3-1 from 19 starts, with earnings of \$721,560. BH

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# MAIDEN BEAUTY UPSETS BELMONT'S LYNBROOK STAKES

off as the longest shot on the board, Pines Stables, John Irwin, Sam Arci, and Paul Zysset's Maiden Beauty opened up to a 3 1/4-length score in the \$100,000 Lynbrook Stakes for New Yorkbred 2-year-old fillies in her July 15 debut at Belmont Park. The victory gave freshman sire Revolutionary his first black-type winner.

Trained by Gary Contessa,

Maiden Beauty sat off the pace for
jockey Joel Rosario while Native Dawn
brought the eight-horse field through a quarter-mile in
:22.88 and a half in :47.25 in the six-furlong contest.

Coming into the stretch, it looked as though the 7-2 Tossup had a good chance of putting the race away after rallying around the turn four wide. But with a patient ride by Rosario, Maiden Beauty found another gear in the center of the track to power by the frontrunners and finish in 1:13.41.

"It was a beautiful trip. I was on the inside a little bit and was just looking for room to go outside," Rosario said. "She was a first-time starter but very professional. She finished very strong, and it looks like she can go a bit further. I was very pleased with how she ran today."

At odds of 22-1, the winner returned \$47.60, 17.60, and \$9.40. First-time starter Tossup held on for second, just a head in front of Midnitesalright.

"She's been training really well," Contessa said.
"Yesterday, we ran a horse called Red Zinger, who had a really green trip and ran third (in the Rockville Centre), and she has been beating him pretty good, so I knew she was a hair better than him, so I thought we had a shot today.

"Joel (Rosario) happened to be available, and it's a big advantage to have him."

Bred by Sandy Glenn Stables, Maiden Beauty is out of the Eddington mare Alpha Charlie. Contessa acted as agent when Pines Stables purchased the filly for \$40,000 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales April Sale of 2-year-olds in Training, where she was consigned by Niall Brennan Stables.

Standing at WinStar Farm since his retirement, Revolutionary finished third in the 2013 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) after taking the Withers Stakes (G3) and the Louisiana Derby (G2). The son of War Pass stood for a fee of \$5,000 in 2018. BH

# GOLDENCENTS, APRIORITY GET FIRST BLACK-TYPE WINNERS

Spendthrift Farm's Goldencents was represented by his first black-type winner July 14 when his son Pickett scored a nine-length, gate-to-wire romp in the D.S. Shine Young Futurity for colts at Evangeline Downs.

Trained by Glenn Delahoussaye, the 2-yearold gelding broke sharply in the 5 1/2-furlong sprint, shook free from the rest of the pack as they hit the turn, and drew off in the stretch under a brisk drive to finish in 1:05.37.

Saturday's win was the second for Pickett, who broke his maiden May 30 with an equally speedy 6 1/2-length win going 4 1/2 furlongs.

Goldencents, whose three grade 1 wins included consecutive Breeders' Cup Dirt Miles, is the son of fellow Spendthrift stallion Into Mischief. The now 8-year-old horse broke his maiden on debut at Del Mar and competed in graded stakes races for the rest of his career.

Goldencents retired in 2014 with a record of 7-7-0 from 18 starts and career earnings of \$3,044,000. His advertised fee for the 2018 breeding season was \$12,500.

Also taking home the first black-type win for her

sire Saturday was Atchata, a 2-year-old daughter of Apriority. Competing in the filly division of the D.S. Shine Young Futurity for Louisiana-breds, she dueled for the lead and kicked away in the lane to win by 6 1/2 lengths.

The win was the second in three starts for the bay filly, who debuted May 24 on grass for trainer Steve Asmussen. She finished third in that maiden special weight debut at Belmont Park. Atchata won next time out going six furlongs on the Belmont inner turf but was switched to the dirt for the Futurity.

Bred in Florida out of the Storm Bird mare Midway Squall, Apriority was his best at 4, when he won the Mr Prospector Stakes (G3) at Gulfstream Park for trainer David Fawkes. The Donald Dizney homebred started 36 times and retired at 7 with a record of 6-9-3 and earnings of \$525,829.

The son of Grand Slam entered stud in 2015 at Elite Thoroughbreds in Louisiana, where he stands for a fee of \$2,000. BH

# MASAR INJURED, BUT APPLEBY SET FOR FUTURE

Trainer Charlie Appleby has quickly come to terms with Investec Derby (G1) winner Masar's forced absence from the second half of the season and is already looking forward to his return in 2019 for a campaign that will hopefully see him fulfill his destiny 12 months later than intended in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1).

Masar is believed to have knocked a leg in routine training on the eve of the July 7 Coral Eclipse (G1) at Sandown. News that he would miss the rest of the season came July 15, following a second scan Saturday. The injury is not serious, but the timing is unfortunate.

The trainer, whose disappointment has been tempered by a good long-term prognosis and the continued excellent form of his string, with six winners at Newmarket's July meeting, said: "There's no good time for a setback, but when you're dealing with a horse of Masar's calibre and looking at the races we'd have been looking at, the timing is particularly bad.

"You need your preparation for those group 1's to be faultless, and I was counting back from the calendar with every day that passed and thinking, 'That's another day lost, that's another day lost.'

"After the news that Masar would need at least another six to eight weeks rest, I knew we could pretty much write those races off. The vet saw a change in the soft-tissue damage to Masar's off-fore, and after speaking to (Sheikh Mohammed), we decided to call a halt immediately. It's just a matter of time and rest. There's nothing to be done surgically."

He added: "It's frustrating, but we're confident the 4-year-old career that His Highness wants us to concentrate upon is very realistic, and we're really looking forward to it. We'll give him all the time he needs and start his preparation in the new year for the season ahead. He wintered in Dubai last year, and it's good to get that sun on their backs, so he'll probably go back there.

"We're unlikely to be looking at a Sheema Classic (G1),

though, as we're focusing more on a European season."

Despite Masar's injury, Appleby can reflect on a superb 2018 season, both at home and abroad, since the stable's group 1 wins with Jungle Cat and Hawkbill on World Cup night.

He said: "I can't fault the way the season's going. It all started off at the Craven meeting, where we had six winners, and then we had five at the Guineas meeting and another six at the July meeting, so Newmarket is obviously a favored venue for myself and the team.

"It's gone great, with the Derby the highlight, and it's great His Highness and the royal family have been able to be at these meetings and enjoy the fun and success we've managed to achieve."

The six July meeting winners included highly promising Dubawi colts Quorto, winner of the group 2 Bet365 Superlative Stakes, and Al Hilalee, who took a maiden Friday, plus a Melbourne Cup (G1) possible in Hamada. At Ascot on Saturday, there was a valuable handicap success for another progressive type in Cross Counter.

Appleby said: "I see no reason to come back in trip with Quorto, who we want to step up to a mile in the future. The way he races, I think the right way to go is for the National Stakes (at the Curragh on Irish Champions Weekend).

"Al Hilalee has a very stout pedigree and hadn't done a lot of work. I was keen to get a run under his

belt, and what we saw was a lot of raw natural ability, because he'd not really been educated to win first time out.

"We should see a lot of improvement, but we'll keep in the back of our minds that his is most definitely a 3-year-old pedigree. It was a very pleasing debut, and further down the line we might hope to look at something like the Racing Post Trophy, but he's got a long way to go.

"It was frustrating that Art Du Val had to be withdrawn at the start of the same race as he'd never put a foot wrong and had shown more. He'll have a stalls test at the end of the week."

Hamada is no bigger than 12-1 and is disputing favoritism for the Sky Bet Ebor at York after his sevenlength handicap success, but he is not a certain runner.

Appleby said: "We'll take a good look at the Ebor (Handicap), but he's potentially on a trip to Australia. He could do both, but we've got to keep an eye on what the handicapper does with a view to something like the Melbourne Cup and then make sure we proceed in a sensible manner."

He added: "Cross Counter looked progressive at Ascot. There are no immediate options, but we're in the realms of getting into some black type. I was pleased with his Sandown second under a double penalty, and the winner also won at Ascot Saturday, so they look two smart colts."

# ZAC PURTON EDGES JOAO MOREIRA IN HONG KONG JOCKEY RACE

A fter a season-long duel, Zac Purton ended Joao Moreira's run as Hong Kong's champion jockey as he held on through the final program of the year July 15 at Sha Tin for a two-win edge.

Purton had only one winner on the 11-race card Sunday, but that was enough to survive a triple by Moreira. Purton ended the year with 136 winners to 134 for the three-time champion Moreira, who is leaving Hong Kong for new challenges in Japan. Demonstrating the duo's dominance, Keris Teetan finished third with 52 winners.

"It's been a long, damp day," Purton said after he competed through the rain. "It's good to finally put it to bed. It's a relief. Joao's a fierce competitor, and we both gave it our absolute all."

Moreira, a fan favorite since his arrival from Singapore, was sent off with a rousing ovation.

"The relationship I have with the fans here in Hong Kong is something special, and I really do love them all," the Brazilian said. "All of these great times I've had over here, including today, it is something that I won't just remember, but it's something that will always sit in my heart."

The trainers' race was decided long before the final day. John Size finished at 87 victories, and Frankie Lor came in second with 65.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club reported total turnover for the season of HK\$124.282 billion (about US\$15.9 billion). That's a 5.6% increase compared with the 2016-17 campaign. Hong Kong wagering dipped 3.4% but was more than offset by a 154.8% jump in commingling turnover.

"Commingling is quickly changing the global landscape, and that is seen in the fact that it made up 13.3% of our season's turnover this year compared to 5.5% last year," said Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, HKJC's CEO. "It is now a significant driver to Hong

Kong's turnover, and that is due to the ever-increasing international interest in our racing product, which is proving to be attractive as an exciting sports option founded upon the highest integrity."

The HKJC negotiated for years with the Hong Kong authorities to win approval for commingling and has aggressively pursued that revenue stream, announcing in June an agreement to host a "world pool" for Royal Ascot wagering.

"This trend comes at a time when our customers are showing a greater appreciation for international racing," said Engelbrecht-Bresges, who added that the Royal Ascot deal will "further strengthen our position as the international hub of commingling."

The 2017-18 season featured a new "Champions Day" in late April, which combined three group 1 races into a bookend festival for December's Longines Hong Kong International Races. "We will further expand this by announcing a new sponsor soon," Engelbrecht-Bresges said.

Attendance for the season was up 1.9% to 18,400 per meeting at the in-town Happy Valley, which races primarily on Wednesday nights and markets heavily to young fans, and down 2.8% to 28,000 at Sha Tin Racecourse in the New Territories, the site of the major international races. BH



# JUVENILE SALE METRICS DOWN, BUT 2018 MARKET STILL SOLID

Most key metrics produced by this year's six major 2-year-olds in training sales regressed from 2017's record-setting season for North America, but other indicators show 2018 was not necessarily a weaker market.

The collective average for Fasig-Tipton's Gulfstream and Midlantic sales, the Ocala Breeders' Sales' March, April, and June sales, and Barrett's Spring sale was \$93,656, which was 6.8% less than the equivalent average a year ago. A big factor influencing the decline is the number of seven-figure sales, with only five horses in this category this year compared with 12 in 2017. The top price last year hit \$2.45 million, while three horses shared 2018's top price of \$1.2 million.

The depth of the market remained stable, with the median holding steady at \$42,000.

One of the most telling statistics is the average price of horses failing to meet their reserve price, which increased 16.5% to \$66,495. A sharp rise in the RNA average indicates how much more sellers valued the stock they offered. The strength of the 2017 market seems to be more of a factor behind the rise in assessed value of this year's juveniles rather than an increase in the actual value of the horses. The best look into this

dynamic is the yearling-to-juvenile pinhook market. The average yearling price of this year's juvenile pinhooks rose only 3.6% to \$58,013 from \$55,998 last year.

The drop in the number of seven-figure purchases between 2018 and 2017 also had a profound impact on the results of the pinhook market, for which the overall rate of return fell to 34% from 55%.

The impact was most significant among horses that had been purchased for \$200,000 or more. A year ago, the horses in this yearling price range (56 of a total 1,263 pinhooks offered) accounted for nine of the juveniles that sold for \$1 million or more in 2017. This price range produced a \$554,065 average at the 2-year-old sales and a 90% ROR.

This year, the horses bought for \$200,000 or more as yearlings represented 60 of 1,354 pinhooked horses offered. Only three of the horses in this price range went on to sell for \$1 million or more. Consequently, the \$200,000+ yearling price range generated a much lower 2-year-old average (\$406,545) and a 39% ROR.

Only one of eight pinhook categories *BloodHorse MarketWatch* uses to analyze the market showed a gain in ROR—yearlings bought in the \$75,000-\$99,999 range. These horses had been purchased collectively for \$83,453 (slightly lower than the \$83,707 average last year) and were resold for an average of \$168,488 (up 12.8% from the 2-year-old average for this price range in 2017).

Though the overall ROR dropped among the yearling-to-juvenile pinhooks and the percentage of profitable pinhooks slipped to 36% from 40%, these changes may have been influenced as much by the increase in higher-priced RNAs as the decrease in seven-figure purchases. 
