MONOMOY GIRL CRUISES IN COACHING CLUB AMERICAN OAKS

There's no doubt the 3-year-old championship for the boys and almost assuredly Horse of the Year, too—was signed, sealed, and delivered June 9 when Justify crossed the finish line in the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) and became the 13th Triple Crown champion.

Now you can pretty much write in July 22 at Saratoga Race Course as the clincher for the 3-year-old fillies' crown.

Monomoy Girl did her part to make Eclipse Award voting academic by cruising to a convincing, frontrunning, threelength victory over Mother Goose Stakes (G2) winner Midnight Bisou in the 102nd edition of the Coaching Club American Oaks (G1).

The victory was the fifth straight for the daughter of Tapizar, with the last four—the CCA Oaks, Acorn Stakes, Longines Kentucky Oaks, and Central Bank Ashland Stakes coming in grade 1 races.

Eclipse Award voters will have the ultimate say, but for Monomoy

Girl's connections, it's game, set, and match after her dominant performance at the Spa.

"I think she locked up the championship," said Sol Kumin of Monomoy Stables, who owns the multiple grade 1 winner along with Michael Dubb, Stuart Grant of The Elkstone Group, and Mike Caruso of Bethlehem Stables. "I am so proud of her. She's a special horse. Horses like her only come around once in a lifetime. I'm so happy for (trainer Brad Cox) and everyone else."

Dubb offered the same opinion.

"Whatever happens from here, I think she won the championship," he said. "There were some doubters, but Brad wasn't one of them."

"How could you doubt her?" Grant chipped in. "She's overcome everything. She overcame post 14 in the Oaks. She's won on top. She's won stalking. She won from all the way behind. She's showed you how versatile she is. She's just a great filly."

Kumin had an even more powerful hand than his partners in the CCA Oaks as he bought a share of Midnight Bisou from Jeff Bloom of Bloom Racing Stable and Allen Racing after the filly finished third in the Kentucky Oaks. He did not expect the two fillies to meet at Saratoga, but he came away from the matchup savoring a happy ending.

"She's the one (I rooted for)," Kumin said about Monomoy Girl. "It was an awkward spot to be in before the race. The other filly was doing really well, but Monomoy Girl is a special horse. I couldn't be happier with the way it turned out."

What's next for Monomoy Girl on the path to a year-end date in the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) and an expected 4-year-old campaign is still up in the air. The Aug.18 Alabama Stakes (G1) at Saratoga and the Sept. 22 Cotillion Stakes (G1) at Parx Racing are the top options, and while Cox is not settled on a plan, there are strong indications Monomoy Girl will skip the \$600,000 Alabama at 1

"It's Brad call, but it's my guess it's Cotillion and then Breeders' Cup Distaff and then give her a rest and bring her back at 4," he said.

Facing boys could be a possibility, especially if the powers that be at Parx get a little creative with the purse for the Pennsylvania Derby (G1), also on Sept. 22.

"If there was a great purse differential between the Pennsylvania Derby and the Cotillion, we'd think about it," Dubb said, "but's it's the same million dollars."

"Now," Grant said, "if you want to convince the folks at Parx to chip in an extra half-million to get her to run against the boys, we'll talk about it."

Speaking of boys, with long-range forecasts calling for severe weather at Saratoga on race day, Kumin said there was a group discussion about the possibility of scratching Monomoy Girl if the track turned out to be a sea of goo and target males in the betfair.com Haskell Invitational (G1) at Monmouth Park. But in the end, the weather forecasters were wrong as the skies were sunny and the track was fast for the CCA Oaks.

"We talked today that if the weather turned out to be really bad, we would scratch and look at the Haskell," Kumin said. "But the weather cooperated, we stuck to the plan, and it worked out perfectly, which is a rare thing to happen." BH

1/4 miles in favor of the \$1 million Cotillion at 1 1/16 miles and run only once before the Breeders' Cup.

"Today answered some questions for us. A mile and an eighth is not an issue for her," Cox said. "A mile and a quarter is something she will never have to do unless we run in the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1), so it's kind of like, why do it? We'll see." Kumin said the

decision rests in Cox's hands.

ACCELERATE WORKS FIVE FURLONGS AT DEL MAR

A day after Catalina Cruiser dominated the \$200,000 San Diego Handicap (G2), trainer John Sadler worked last year's San Diego winner at Del Mar.

Sadler scratched favored Accelerate from the San Diego July 21, but the two-time grade 1 winner got to stretch his legs July 22 at Del Mar in preparation for a possible start in the Aug. 4 Whitney Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course or the Aug. 18 TVG Pacific Classic (G1).

Accelerate was clocked in :59 3/5 for five furlongs (from the half-mile pole to a furlong past the wire) and galloped out strongly through the turn.

"We've got three or four more works before the Pacific Classic, so we're happy with that," said Sadler, who said after the San Diego he would not run Catalina Cruiser and Accelerate (they're both owned by Hronis Racing) against each other in the Pacific Classic. "Two (works) if he goes to (the Whitney)."

Sadler said he hasn't decided who will run in the Pacific Classic, but if it ends up being Accelerate,

Catalina Cruiser could land in the Sept. 29 Awesome Again Stakes (G1).

"We'd probably run (Catalina Cruiser) in the one at Santa Anita (the Awesome Again)," Sadler said. "Somebody will run in the Awesome again and somebody will run somewhere else. (A race in between for Catalina Cruiser is) going to be bad timing no matter what. He runs so fast you have to space things out, but I've got to look." BH

ESPINOZA INJURED AFTER BOBBY ABU DHABI'S FATAL INCIDENT

Jockey Victor Espinoza fractured the C3 vertebrae in his neck July 22 after a fall during training at Del Mar.

According to Espinoza's agent, Brian Beach, the rider will stay overnight at Scripps Memorial Hospital La Jolla for observation. Beach said there have been no signs of paralysis and no other fractures but that Espinoza is experiencing numbness in his left shoulder

and arm from a "stinger," an nerve injury often associated with football.

"He has regained about 50% of the feeling already," Beach said. "Doctors are optimistic he'll fully recover fairly quickly."

Beach said he was "not sure how long (Espinoza) will be out at this point."

Espinoza's injury occurred during a work aboard Kona Gold Stakes (G2) winner Bobby Abu Dhabi. Espinoza was unseated as the chestnut colt fell near the wire. Both horse and rider were motionless on the racetrack immediately after the fall.

Espinoza was on his side until paramedics arrived.

Paramedics carefully rolled Espinoza onto his back, put a neck brace on him, and slid a backboard under the rider to take him off the dirt track and load him into an ambulance.

Bobby Abu Dhabi died from an apparent cardiac event, according to Brian Trump, the racing manager for Rockingham Ranch, which owned the Macho Uno colt in partnership with David Bernsen. Trump said the Peter Miller-trained Bobby Abu Dhabi was working for a start in the July 28 Bing Crosby Stakes (G1).

Espinoza, 46, was inducted into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame in 2017. He rode American Pharoah to Triple Crown victory in 2015. BH

JERRY HOLLENDORFER HOLDS STRONG HAND AT DEL MAR

The first week of racing at Del Mar is over, and one set of connections could have the top three juveniles on the grounds.

Standing on the balcony of his barn, which overlooks the Del Mar backstretch, Jerry Hollendorfer's smile July 22 revealed just how well his string has performed at the seaside racetrack, and he has more to come.

He and Larry Best's OXO Equine have three 2-yearold debut winners in the barn. The most recent was Rowayton, who won by 1 3/4 lengths over Hollendorfer stablemate Dueling July 21, and the most eye-catching was Instagrand, who crushed a maiden special weight field by 10 lengths at Los Alamitos Race Course June

> 29. Both are by Into Mischief. Instagrand will make his next start in the Aug. 11 Best Pal Stakes (G2) at Del Mar, and Rowayton's next start has yet to be determined.

"I'm not trying to compare them," the Hall of Fame trainer said. "Both horses are talented. One may be faster than the other one, but we're not quite sure about all the facts yet."

Brill, a Medaglia d'Oro filly who won by 1 1/4 lengths July 18, might end up being the best of the trio. In her better-than-it-looks-on-paper debut, Brill broke a bit slow, was never comfortable in the five-furlong sprint as two horses from the outside crossed in front of her, and jockey Drayden Van Dyke had to encourage her to get into the race in the turn. She also figures to improve at longer distances. Van Dyke rides all three of the OXO juveniles.

"We always knew we loved her a lot, and she worked really good and did everything we asked her to do," Hollendorfer said. "When we ran her, she broke so hard she slipped a little bit and got behind, but we think she's a very good prospect."

Instagrand was a \$1.2 million purchase, and Brill hammered at \$1 million. Rowayton was a relative bargain at \$320,000. All were purchased by Best at auction.

"The guy has done a remarkable job, considering he picks his own horses and hasn't been around the game for that long," Hollendorfer said.

Hollendorfer has won seven of his 17 starts at Del Mar through Sunday (with four seconds), and Don Alberto Stable's multiple grade 1 winner Unique Bella is primed and ready for the Clement L. Hirsch Stakes

(G1) at Del Mar July 29.

"Unique Bella had a great work (July 19), and we're going to gallop her into the race,"

Hollendorfer said. "I'm not going to blow her out this week. She's doing really well, and we think she'll run well." BH

CATAPULT JUST GETS BY SHARP SAMURAI IN EDDIE READ

Catapult finished 1 3/4 lengths behind three-time graded stakes winner Sharp Samurai in an optional-claiming allowance June 17 at Santa Anita Park, but it came with context.

Woodford Racing's 5-year-old son of Kitten's Joy was making his first start for trainer John Sadler and suffered a poor trip, but he still finished well to get second.

There was no trouble for Catapult July 22 at Del Mar in the \$250,000 Eddie Read

Stakes (G2T), however, as he closed from sixth in the final furlong to nip Sharp Samurai at the wire in a neck victory.

Catapult raced in seventh early under jockey Drayden Van Dyke, about five lengths off pacesetter Prime Attraction through a quarter-mile in :23.75, a half in :47.65, and six furlongs in 1:11.00, while Sharp Samurai pressed the pace in second.

Prime Attraction dug in late and only finished a head behind Sharp Samurai, but Catapult was traveling best late on the outside and hit the wire in 1:46.07 for 1 1/8 miles on firm turf.

"I could see there wasn't a whole lot of speed in the race, so I wanted to stay up relatively close," Van Dyke said. "He was in a nice rhythm—moving just like

I wanted him to. Then, when I wheeled him out, he went. He catapulted me."

Sharp Samurai may have had to move a touch earlier than needed in the final turn, as Multiplier came up alongside the top pair three wide in the final bend, but he still nearly eked out his fourth graded victory.

"He was super, super game today," said Sharp Samurai's jockey, Gary Stevens. "He gave me all he had. The winner was just best this time."

Another three-quarters of a length behind Prime Attraction came Bowies Hero in fourth. He was followed by Multiplier, Next Shares, True Valour, Fashion Business, Itsinthepost, and Hunt to complete the order of finish.

Catapult was previously trained by Chad Brown on the East Coast, where he was a stakes winner and placed in three other stakes, including a second in the 2017 Baltimore/Washington International Turf Cup Stakes (G2T) at Laurel Park.

"This is a nice horse," said Sadler, who won four races and two graded stakes from eight starters during the weekend at Del Mar. "He comes from the East Coast, where he had good form last year. The owners gave him a little time off at the end of last year and decided to try him here in California."

Bred in Kentucky by Breffni Farm, out of the Storm Cat mare Gata Bella, Catapult has a 5-3-1 record from 14 starts and \$501,384 in earnings. He was a \$350,000 purchase out of the 2014 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. BH



SIGNORA CABELLO STRIKES IN PRIX ROBERT PAPIN

Trainer John Quinn's decision to reroute Signora Cabello from the valuable Weatherbys Super Sprint at Newbury July 21 to Sunday's group 2 Darley Prix Robert Papin (G2) paid off when she was driven home by Frankie Dettori.

The Queen Mary (G2) winner, who runs in the colors of Phoenix Thoroughbreds and Zen Racing, held on to deny Sexy Metro, providing British trainers with their fifth straight win in the race that set Special Duty, Natagora, and Divine Proportions on their way to classic glory.

A daughter of Camacho, Signora Cabello was having her fifth outing of 2018 and she broke well, racing just off the Robert Cowell-trained Pocket Dynamo, who also had Royal Ascot form after finishing second in the Norfolk Stakes (G2).

Dettori began to push away on her, as the Karl Burke-trained True Mason loomed alongside, knuckling down to land the £65,575 (US\$86,099) first prize and edge out Sexy Metro by a neck, with True Mason third.

That does not match the £122,925 (\$161,398) purse Newbury's Super Sprint offered, but Quinn was in no mood to rue what might have been.

"When they came round her, you thought, err, and she got a bit unbalanced and maybe a little bit intimidated, but when she got back on an even keel, she was going away at the line," said the trainer.

"She was very tough, and there's no one better on the big day than Lanfranco Dettori." he continued. "It was quick ground, but like what she's been winning on and the track was in very good condition."

Quinn, a Cheltenham Festival winner thanks to 2012 Stan James Champion Hurdle ace Countrywide Flame, added: "There are no easy races in this game. It looked like she might've had a tremendous chance in the Super Sprint, but as you saw in it yesterday, there was barging

and bumping. She's a stakes filly and that's where we decided to keep her, and she vindicated our decision, which is great because it doesn't always happen."

A step up to six furlongs and the group 1 Darley Prix Morny at Deauville Aug. 19 is next for Signora Cabello, which Quinn has fond memories of after winning it with The Wow Signal in 2014.

He said: "She's in the Lowther (Stakes, G2), but if she's as well as she was before today, she'll run in the Morny. The Wow Signal was similar to her in that they're two very tough horses who improved with racing. He was phenomenal, but I think her performance today was very good, and the second is very good. There weren't many runners, but I'd say it was her best performance.

"It doesn't look like six furlongs would be a problem, and over five and a half today, she was going away from them at the line."

Regarding the juvenile's prospects of developing into a classic contender next year, Quinn said: "On what we see at the moment, you'd think six is well within her compass, but the difference between six and a mile is massive, so you may be thinking more of Commonwealth Cups, but we'll leave every option open and look after this year first."



TIZ A SLAM DOMINATES IN WOODBINE NIJINSKY STAKES

O nly 21 days after his second grade 3 score, Chiefswood Stable's Tiz a Slam proved a step up in class was warranted when he ran gate-to-wire to win the Nijinsky Stakes (G2T) at Woodbine.

From the moment the gates opened until the

moment he crossed the finish line, Tiz a Slam never looked back.

Breaking from post 6 under jockey Steven Bahen, the 4-year-old son of Tiznow went to the front of the pack for the 1 1/2-mile test, setting moderate fractions of :25.85, :51.97, and 1:17.19 through the first six furlongs and leading the field through 10 furlongs in 2:05.83.

Holding a comfortable lead as they headed into the stretch, Tiz a Slam refused to yield to late challengers Johnny Bear and Mekhtaal, holding steady under a drive to win in 2:29.06.

Mekhtaal took second, with Johnny Bear a neck behind in third. Final Copy, Seeking Albert, Bangkok, Pumpkin Rumble, and Vettori Kin rounded out the order of finish.

"This is huge," said Chiefswood Stable owner Robert Krembil.

Sent off at odds of 10-1, the winner paid \$22.70, \$10.60, and \$7.50.

As impressive as Sunday's win was, it came as no shock to his connections, who have watched the colt improve steadily with every start.

"He's a big horse. He's taken a long time to mature," said trainer Roger Attfield. "He's still maturing, he's learning. The last two races, he trained up to both of these races better than he's trained up to any race in his career so far, so it doesn't surprise me. We looked after him as well as we could as a 2-year-old, and he's just getting bigger and stronger, and maybe he just keeps getting better, also."

A versatile runner on both the grass and the allweather track, Tiz a Slam entered the Nijinsky off another dominating, gate-to-wire romp in the July 1 Dominion Day Stakes (G3).

"This is what we're trying to do," Krembil said. "I have to give Roger and his team a lot of credit for the patience they showed in this guy. He's as strong now as he's ever been. He gets himself a little hot as you saw, but that doesn't seem to stop him."

Bred in Canada by his owners out of the Grand Slam mare Flaming Rose, Tiz a Slam is a half brother to stakes-placed Holy Flame. His win in the Nijinsky improved his record to 6-2-1 from 18 starts and his earnings to \$655,990. BH

DOUBLE TOUCH UPSETS WICKERR IN FIRST STAKES WIN

The \$75,000 Wickerr Stakes proved to be profitable for those betting longshots as 29-1 Double Touch cut the corner, held off 8-1 Bombard in the stretch, and then survived a steward's inquiry to score in the Del Mar turf race July 22.

The one-mile event for 3-year-olds and up drew a field of 14, and after the scratches of Editore and Liam the Charmer, the main competition appeared to be Gary Barber's Conquest Tsunami and George Krikorian's Big Score.

However, Conquest Tsunami—ridden by Joe Talamo, who replaced Victor Espinoza after a spill during morning workouts sent the Hall of Fame rider to the hospital—set quick fractions of :22.29 and :45.66 through a half-mile and then faded at the top of the turn. With the field bunching up, Double Touch and jockey Gary Stevens moved through on the rail and

gained a length advantage heading into the stretch.

Several chased the pair, but it was Bombard who rolled late to just miss by head. Final time over the firm turf was 1:33.61. Perfectly Majestic was another length back in third at odds of 10-1 for a \$1,393.10 trifecta on a \$1 ticket. Big Score completed the superfecta, which paid \$11,594.40. The winner returned \$60.80, \$24.20, and \$12. Favored Conquest Tsunami finished last.

The inquiry involved the two top finishers in the stretch, where Double Touch had drifted out under strong right-handed urging by Stevens, but stewards ruled the late bumping did not interfere with the order of finish.

Trained by Dan Blacker, Double Touch had raced in England prior to making his first start at Santa Anita Park in April 2017. The 4-year-old Dutch Art gelding had won two optional-claiming allowance races from seven starts in Southern California, which included off-the-board finishes in the Del Mar Derby (G2T) and the La Jolla Handicap (G3T). The Wickerr marked his first black-type victory.

Bred by Honeypuddle Stud in England, Double Touch represents the first stakes winner out of the stakes-placed Dr Fong mare Classical Dancer. BH

SEA OF CLASS CONNECTIONS TEMPTED TO TRY ARC

A tilt in the Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1) has become a "very tempting" option for Darley Irish Oaks (G1) winner Sea of Class, not least because of her owners' history in the race, trainer William Haggas said July 22.

Sea of Class, owned by Sunderland Holding, the racing and breeding operation run by mother and son Ling and Christopher Tsui, put herself at the top of Europe's 3-year-old middle-distance fillies' division with a neck defeat of Investec Oaks (G1) winner Forever Together in the Irish Oaks under a perfectly timed ride by James Doyle.

And with the Tsui's Sea The Stars, sire of Sea of Class, and Sea The Stars' dam, Urban Sea, having both won the Arc, contesting Europe's richest race has become an inevitable discussion topic regarding her future. Sea of Class is 20-1 with Paddy Power and Coral for the Oct. 7 Longchamp showpiece, which has been won by a filly in six of the last seven years. The Aug. 23 Darley Yorkshire Oaks (G1) and Sept. 16 Qatar Prix Vermeille (G1) are also potential targets.

"We need to make a plan of attack now for the rest of the year," said Haggas. "We have a few things to decide, but we will see how she is first, and then I will talk to Mrs Tsui and make a plan.

"There are lots of races for a filly of her ilk. I don't plan to come back in trip. A lot will depend on the ground. It would be very easy for us to keep her against other fillies, but Mrs Tsui has won the Arc twice. That might prove tempting, but she may say let's leave it to next year and aim for the Arc then. There are lots of things to ponder, but we won't be making a decision today."

Sea of Class does not have an entry in the Arc, and the supplementary entry fee is €120,000. She had only just made her debut when the May 9 entry deadline passed, finishing second in a mile maiden at Newmarket.

"It's obviously more expensive, but we are talking about the Arc," said Haggas, whose blinding Saturday included five winners in the space of just 65 minutes. "They have got to have done great things to warrant a supplementary. She's done plenty of good things so far. The Arc should be closing now in my opinion, not in May.

"She may have run at Newmarket over a mile and got beaten. Only a genius can say that must be an Arc de Triomphe-winning performance."

Enable, Treve, and Danedream took advantage of the weight allowances to win the Arc as 3-year-olds, which makes tackling the race this year "very tempting indeed," Haggas said.



"There are a couple of races coming up, including the Prix Vermeille and the other against older horses (Yorkshire Oaks), and there are lots of things towards the end of the season which could be tempting. I don't think she would do both."

Haggas added that Young Rascal, the Centennial Celebration-MBNA Chester Vase (G3) winner and leading fancy for the Investec Derby (G1) in which he finished a well-beaten seventh, is back in training and being prepared for the Aug. 22 Sky Bet Great Voltigeur Stakes (G2) at York as a trial for the Sept. 15 William Hill St Leger (G1).

"He is fine," he said. "He worked yesterday for the first time since the Derby and is on schedule for York. He is in the Leger, but we are going to run him in the Great Voltigeur first and see. He never raced at all at Epsom for whatever reason."

SECOND TIME COULD BE THE 'CHARM' IN HONORABLE MISS

t the sixteenth pole in last year's edition of the Honorable Miss Handicap (G2), trainer Bret Calhoun had every reason to think his charge Finley'sluckycharm was about to notch a victory that would have stamped her as one of the nation's leading female sprinters.

The daughter of Twirling Candy came off the final turn of the six-furlong test with multiple grade 1 winner Paulassilverlining at her hip, and as the duo battled down the lane, it was Calhoun's hard-knocking distaffer who began to edge clear, showing just how much her form had progressed since the end of her 2016 campaign. But with only about four strides separating Finley'sluckycharm from what would have been her third consecutive graded stakes victory, Paulassilverlining showed why she would go on to become an Eclipse Award finalist with a remarkable re-rally on the outside to nail her foe by a neck at the wire.


"She looked like she was going to win that race last year," Calhoun recalled. "She went by Paulassilverling, and Paula came back and beat her on the line ... just a top-notch filly."

Since that brutal beat, Finley'sluckycharm has made good on her top-level potential. She finally got her grade 1 triumph, this time getting the best of a slobber-knocker finish in the April 7 Madison Stakes at Keeneland. She returns to the \$200,000 Honorable Miss July 25 at Saratoga Race Course as the standout

> in the field of six, once again trying to cement her spot in the picture for divisional leadership.

In terms of consistency, Finley'sluckycharm has had few peers since making her debut in December 2015. In addition to her 10 wins-four gradedand nearly flawless record in her home state of Kentucky, Carl Moore's 5-year-old mare has been worse than second just three times in 16 starts.

Unfortunately for her connections, one of those off-the-board outings came in her most recent effort. After a brilliant run in the Madison Stakes where she prevailed by a nose after pressing American Gal through wicked early fractions of :21.96 and :44.31, Finley'sluckycharm finished

fourth in the May 5 Humana Distaff Stakes (G1) at Churchill Downs—her first loss in nine starts within the Bluegrass State. Though that result marked a rare off day for the mare, Calhoun said they were guilty of maybe asking too much too soon after the gutwrenching Keeneland run.

"I think mainly it was just too quick back off a very, very hard race at Keeneland there," Calhoun said of the Humana effort. "She ran hard gate to wire (at Keeneland), and I think it just took too much out of her. You run a race like that, it's tough to bounce back in four weeks, but we were running out of her own stall, so we took our shot. Then we drew inside and it was a muddy track (at Churchill), so there were a couple factors. But I think more than anything it was just she took a step back off that hard win in the Madison."

With Saratoga a clear target given how well she ran there last year, Calhoun gave Finley'sluckycham a few weeks off following the Humana and then refocused confident you ever are coming to Saratoga—it's the best of the best, they're all tough. But I like the fact she has had a previous out over this racetrack and ran well."

Finley'sluckycharm is the 123-pound highweight in the Honorable Miss field and will break from the outside post under Brian Hernandez Jr.

To her inside is Bob Baffert trainee Faypien, who is cross-entered in the \$200,000 Caress Stakes at 5 1/2 furlongs on the turf July 23. The daughter of Ghostzapper finished second by a neck to La Sardane in her first start on grass in the June 7 Intercontinental Stakes (G3T) at Belmont Park. She also has success on dirt, taking last year's Summertime Oaks (G2) prior to a runner-up finish in the Longines Test Stakes (G1) at the Spa.

J. Kirk and Judy Robison's Vertical Oak also has form over the Saratoga track, capturing the Prioress Stakes (G2) by 5 1/4 lengths Sept. 3. The Giant Oak filly was given a freshening after a seventh-place finish in the Thoroughbred Club of America Stakes (G2), won by Finley'sluckycharm in October at Keeneland, and she enters the Honorable Miss off a third-place run in the June 23 Roxelana Overnight Stakes at Churchill Downs. BH

for a second-half season. If she handles Wednesday's test as strongly as hoped, a run in the Aug. 25 Ketel One Ballerina Stakes (G1)—a race she missed last year because of a muscle strain would likely be her next start as part of the grand plan to bring her in top form into the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1) beneath the Twin Spires in November.

HONOUR AND GLORY'S GROWING LEGACY AS A BROODMARE SIRE

Progeny records for the late Honour and Glory, who died recently in Uruguay at 25, wouldn't put him among the world's elite stallions, but he proved to be a useful dual hemisphere sire. His strongest contribution to the breed may be still to come as a broodmare sire, with his daughters already putting him among the top 12 in this year's *BloodHorse* broodmare sire standings.

Retired to Ashford Stud in 1997 for an initial fee of \$20,000, the grade 1-winning son of Relaunch produced a first crop that included Caressing, who won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) on the way to earning Eclipse Award champion 2-year-old filly honors; Japanese grade 1 winner Name Value; and grade 2 winner and sire Put It Back.

Caressing did not lose any momentum as a broodmare, positioned now as Honour and Glory's most successful daughter by progeny earnings. Out of the Majestic Prince stakes winner Lovin Touch, the handsome dark bay mare is the dam of West Coast, the 2017 champion 3-yearold colt.

West Coast earned his championship in the Travers Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1), in which he beat the winners of that year's Triple Crown races—Always Dreaming (Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands, G1), Cloud Computing (Preakness Stakes, G1), and Tapwrit (Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRABets, G1). West Coast went on to finish second this year in both the Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes (G1) and the Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (G1). He has earned \$5,683,800 to date.

Caressing has also produced grade 3-placed runners Gold Hawk and Juan and Bina.

Another important Honour and Glory daughter is General Jeanne, the dam of multiple grade 2 winner Justwhistledixie (by Dixie Union), grade 2 winner Chace City (Carson City), and grade 2-placed Bakken (Distorted Humor). Justwhistledixie went on to produce Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) winner New Year's Day and multiple grade 2 winner Mohaymen.

> Honour and Glory was shuttled to both Australia and Argentina for 12 seasons and spent his last five years at stud in Uruguay, according to Haras Rapetti, where he stood. To date he has sired 71 black-type winners on dirt

and turf and 80 black-type placers. His top runners include 29 graded/group winners and five champions. His progeny have earned more than \$68.6 million worldwide (through July 16).

As a broodmare sire, Honour and Glory has been represented by 65 black-type winners and 65 blacktype placed runners so far. These black-type winners include 25 grade/group winners and seven champions. His progeny earnings as a broodmare sire have already reached nearly \$74 million.

Among the Top 25 North American broodmare sires, No. 12 Honour and Glory is represented by the third-lowest number of dams (118) behind No. 14 Ghostzapper (60) and No. 7 Dubai Destination (89). He seems well-positioned to continue occupying the upper tier of this list in the years ahead. BH




