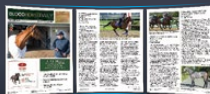

# ACCELERATE, 'CRUISER' TAKING DIFFERENT PATHS TO BREEDERS' CUP

Relaxed and admittedly a bit tired sitting on the stairs outside of his office on the Del Mar backside in between training sessions Aug. 19, trainer John Sadler reflected on one of the signature victories of his career.

"I'm just very happy—very pleased," Sadler said of Accelerate's 12 1/2-length victory in the TVG Pacific Classic (G1) a day prior.

"It was such a good race for him. I looked at him once early and he looks good. We'll check him out the next two, three days. I feel like he's not even really that cooled out. He got back at about 8:30 last night.

"We'll let the adrenaline get down and see exactly where he's at. We're looking forward to the Breeders' Cup."

The Sept. 29 Awesome Again Stakes (G1) at Santa Anita Park will likely serve as a prep for the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) for Accelerate, but Hronis Racing's other standout chestnut, San Diego Handicap (G2) winner Catalina Cruiser, won't be joining him in the 1 1/4-mile feature at Churchill Downs.

Sadler's plan, for now, is to keep the two separate, and have Catalina Cruiser run in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1). His next start will come in the Aug. 25 Pat O'Brien Stakes (G2) at Del Mar, which won out over the Sept. 1 Woodward Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course.

"We can do all that with Catalina Cruiser next year, because he's got off to a late start, and he's definitely going to run at 5," Sadler said of the lightly raced 4-year-old Union Rags colt. "That was at the bottom of my decision not to run him in the Pacific Classic. Three starts, lightly raced horse, a mile and a quarter—a lot of people were pushing me to run.

"But why would I want to make it harder on my other horse? It's all different if it's different owners—then you have to represent them—but it's the same owners."

Sadler indicated he leaned toward the Pat O'Brien over a trip to Saratoga in part because the race at Del Mar is a "Win and You're In" qualifier for the Dirt Mile, and because the weather has been so poor at Saratoga this summer.

"What I keep going back to is how tough a year it's been with the

weather over there," the trainer said. "I was talking to a radio show the other day, and they asked if I was going to come, and I said, 'Can you turn off the water?' If it was Accelerate (who won the grade 1 Santa Anita Handicap on a wet track), I wouldn't have to worry about it." **BH**

# HOFBURG TO MISS TRAVERS AFTER SPIKING FEVER

Hofburg will miss the \$1.25 million Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1) after spiking a fever, Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott said Aug. 19 at Saratoga Race Course.

The chestnut son of Tapit, owned by Juddmonte Farms, appeared to be coming into top form following a third-place effort in the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) and a convincing five-length score in the July 27 Curlin Stakes at Saratoga in his most recent start.

"Hofburg will not run in the Travers," a disappointed Mott said. "He's been off the training list the last two days and we're not going to force ourselves into the Travers."

Hofburg placed fourth in his 2-year-old maiden debut Sept. 2 at Saratoga, but returned in 2018 to score in his first start of the year, winning a 1 1/16-mile maiden race at Gulfstream Park. In his next start he finished runner up to Audible in the Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1) before splashing to a rough-and-tumble seventh-place finish in the Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve (G1). Mott chose to skip the Preakness Stakes (G1) with his charge and sent him out to a credible run in the Belmont.

The 3-year-old colt has a record of 2-1-1 in six starts and earnings of \$432,950.

The field for Saturday's Travers remains large, with as many as 12 starters, including betfair.com Haskell Invitational (G1) winner Good Magic and the back-to-back Canadian stakes-winning filly Wonder Gadot, as well as Irish trainer Aiden O'Brien's group 2 winner Seahenge and grade 1 winner Mendelssohn. **BH**

## SEVERAL TRAVERS CONTENDERS HAVE FINAL TUNE UP

Several contenders for the \$1.25 million Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course put in their final works Aug. 19. Among those were Robert LaPenta's Catholic Boy, who won his last two starts on the turf in the Pennine Ridge Stakes (G3T) and Belmont Derby Invitational (G1T).

The son of More Than Ready turned in his final work Sunday morning after the renovation break on the main track and logged a half-mile in :49.44. New York Racing Association clockers caught the gallop out to five furlongs in 1:02 3/5 under jockey Javier Castellano.

"I liked the way he worked today," Castellano said. "He's happy. It was just a maintenance work. We're

not looking for a fancy work. Our target is next week. Two weeks before we had a real solid work. Today we were looking for something just to stretch him out before the race."

"We were doing it more for us than him," said trainer Jonathan Thomas. "I asked Javier to let him gallop out a little piece, and he jumped right into the bridle and showed he was there for him, and then he slowed him down a little to show he was there. It wasn't exciting, but we weren't looking for exciting."

Catholic Boy has made three starts on dirt. He won the Remsen Stakes (G2) at Aqueduct Racetrack as a 2-year-old, finished second in the Sam F. Davis (G3) at Tampa Bay Downs, and came in fourth in the March 18 Xpressbet.com Florida Derby (G1).

Phoenix Thoroughbred's Gronkowski also put in his final breeze before the Travers with a five-furlong drill in 1:00.02, in company with Instilled Regard on the main track.

The work was his fifth at the Spa since Gronkowski made his North American debut in the June 9 Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1).

"He breezed super," said trainer Chad Brown. "The horse has gotten stronger and fitter. He couldn't be coming into the race any better."

Calumet Farm's Bravazo was another to turn in his final breeze for the Travers for trainer D. Wayne Lukas.

The 3-year-old Awesome Again colt took to the Oklahoma training track just before 6 a.m. and worked five furlongs in 1:00.11, in tandem with 3-year-old maiden Royal Edition to his inside. The pair covered three furlongs in :35 2/5 before Bravazo drew ahead at the finish.

"It went real good," Lukas said. "We wanted him to go right at a minute, and that's what we got, so that's probably all we need. He did it easy, like they all say. He's doing well, eating well, getting in the tub. I'm looking forward to it. I'm anxious to run him."

King Zachary tuned up for his upcoming engagement in the Travers over the main track, where he breezed five furlongs in a bullet :59.66 under exercise rider Tammy Fox.

NYRA clockers caught the Curlin colt in :35 3/5 for the first three furlongs and with a gallop out to six furlongs in 1:12 3/5.

"He worked great," said Dale Romans, who trains the chestnut colt for Thomas Conway. "I wasn't looking for much. Just that he is happy and consistent—safe and sound. He did it all perfectly."

Steve Asmussen sent Tenfold and Meistermind out for their final workouts, with each of the trainer's colts posting leisurely times over the Oklahoma training track.

Winchell Thoroughbred's Tenfold covered four furlongs in :50.09, while WinStar Farm, China Horse Club International, and SF Racing's Meistermind ran the same distance in :50.19.

"Good. Looked good," Asmussen said of Tenfold. Meistermind "worked really well here," he said of the bay colt by Bodemeister, adding that his workers "looked a little tired this morning, but they should be."

Gary Barber's Wonder Gadot exited her final breeze in good order and will return to the track in the first set Aug. 20, trainer Mark Casse said.

The 3-year-old Medaglia d'Oro filly enjoyed an easy Sunday morning, her second walk day

since she breezed a four-furlong bullet in :47.60 Aug. 17.

"She's been very good. All is well," said Casse. "We gave her today off—she just went around the shedrow—and she'll go back tomorrow."

Seven fillies have won the Travers, with the last being Lady Rotha, who was elevated to victory via disqualification in 1915.

A decision by Barber regarding the riding assignment for Wonder Gadot in the Travers is expected Monday. Casse mentioned Mike Smith, Florent Geroux, and Tyler Gaffalione as possibilities. **BH**

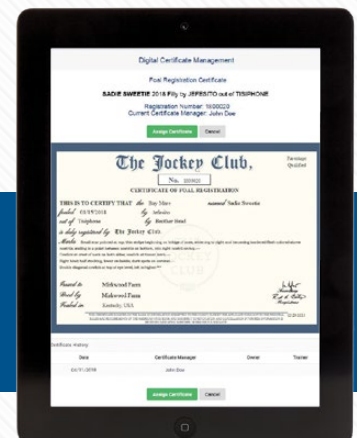

## DUBAWI COLT TOPS DAY 2 OF ARQANA YEARLING SALE

Last year the Arqana August Yearling Sale was topped by a son of Dubawi out of a group 1-winning mare, and history repeated itself in Deauville Aug. 19 as Ballylinch Stud's John O'Connor went to an auction-topping €1.4 million (US \$1,601,320) for a colt out of Just The Judge.

A hush descended in the packed auditorium as the highly anticipated Lot 137 made his way into the ring, but by the time the bid board was showing a seven-figure sum, matters had boiled down to a straight duel between O'Connor and David Redvers, racing manager for Qatar Racing, who co-bred the yearling with the China Horse Club.

The price continued to climb in €50,000 increments until O'Connor, standing on the steps below Redvers' position at the back of the auditorium, struck the decisive blow.

"When you go to buy a horse like him you always know it'll be difficult but we were keen to have him," said O'Connor, who went on to explain the stud's affinity with this family was a major draw.

"He's a lovely colt by an exceptional stallion in Dubawi and this is a family we know well," he said. "Just The Judge was a real champion and we actually bred and sold her dam (Faraday Light), so it's an original Ballylinch family going back to the McCalmonts' time. It's the family of Mesopotamia, which is a great line.

"Those outstanding race mares, if they have a foal by an international stallion there's always going to be plenty of people who'll want to buy them, so sometimes you have to push the boat out."

He added: "Obviously we're hoping he'll be good enough to make a stallion at some point. It would be nice to think he can go to stud so the family can come back home. We may race him with some partners, but for

the moment it's just Ballylinch involved."

The colt, offered by La Motteraye Consignment, was following in his dam's footsteps, fetching a seven-figure sum at public auction, as Qatar Racing and China Horse Club went to 4,500,000gns (\$7,431,953) to secure the Etihad Airways Irish One Thousand Guineas (G1) and E.P Taylor Stakes (G1) winner from Tattersalls in 2014.

"We'll take him home to our own pre-training center and break him in and then make a decision about who'll train him over the next few months," added O'Connor. "But believe me, he'll go to a good trainer."

Ballylinch Stud also played a part in several of the other big-money transactions in Sunday's session.

A colt by the farm's flagship stallion Lope de Vega out of Black Dahlia was the recipient of a monumental pedigree update when the dam's Dream Ahead 2-year-old—listed merely as "in training in GB" in the catalog—suggested he was the best colt of his age in Europe with a smooth victory in the Qatar Vintage Stakes (G2) at Glorious Goodwood for trainer Mark Johnston last month. The unbeaten Dark Vision—sold as a yearling by Ballylinch Stud—has since been sold privately to Godolphin.

It is Godolphin's great rivals Coolmore who will race his year-younger half brother after M.V. Magnier stretched to €900,000 (\$1,029,420) to secure him.

The colt, presented by Ecurie des Monceaux, was bred by SF Bloodstock out of the listed-placed Dansili mare, a relative of group/grade 1 celebrities Can'thelpbelieving and Soviet Line.

The dam showed admirable toughness in her racing career, finishing on the board in 15 of her 42 starts. Despite that, SF Bloodstock was able to buy her for just 40,000gns (\$65,495) at the end of her racing career in 2010.

If that seems extraordinarily good value in light of the mare's recent exploits, the price Johnston paid to secure Dark Vision is quite implausible: 15,000gns (\$20,797) at Book 2 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale last year.

The operation consigned a second €900,000 (\$1,029,420) lot when a daughter of Invincible Spirit and the group 3-winning Whipper mare Mayhem went the way of Anthony Stroud, who was acting on behalf of Godolphin.

The filly shares her page with the likes of Royal Bench, Cerulean Sky, and Melbourne Cup hopeful Magic Circle, while she is also related to Propel, who topped the 2013 renewal of the August Sale when she sold to James Harron for €1.5 million (\$1,999,200).

American Pharoah was represented by two fillies in the Arqana August Sale and both lit up the bid board. The first, a half sister to Darley Yorkshire Oaks

(G1) winner Shareta, was knocked down to Coolmore for €750,000 (\$857,850) Saturday and will head to Ballydoyle, but the second is traveling in the opposite direction across the Atlantic after being knocked down to U.S. agent Deuce Greathouse for €850,000 (\$972,230).

Greathouse, who bought Uncle Mo as a foal and sourced champion Tepin as a yearling for owner Robert Masterson, reported the filly would be syndicated among a group of owners including Masterson, with Cindy Hutson, who was present during the bidding, taking a majority share.

"She's a beautiful horse," Hutson said while expressing her love for American Pharoah, before referring reporters to Greathouse for comment with an exclamation of, "I just write the checks!"

The filly, bred in partnership between Ecurie des Monceaux and Haras de Saint Pair, is the first foal out of Marbre Rose, a grade 3-winning daughter of Smart Strike. The dam's Frankel half brother, Gidu, was sold by Monceaux for €410,000 (\$457,683) at Deauville two years ago and also went to America for Zayat Stables.

Trade in the two premier sessions of the Arqana August Sale was on a par with last year, with a clearance rate of 74%—down from 76%—and an average price of €234,735 (\$272,942), a decline of 2%. The median increased from €160,000 to €170,000 (\$200,165).

Over the weekend, €27,464,000 (\$32,111,041) was turned over on elite yearlings, down from 5% in 2017.

# CATAPULT WINS DEL MAR MILE ON VAN DYKE'S BIG DAY

They didn't do all of their winning together, but the \$200,000 Del Mar Mile Handicap (G2T) Aug. 19 put an exclamation point on quite a weekend for trainer John Sadler and jockey Drayden Van Dyke.

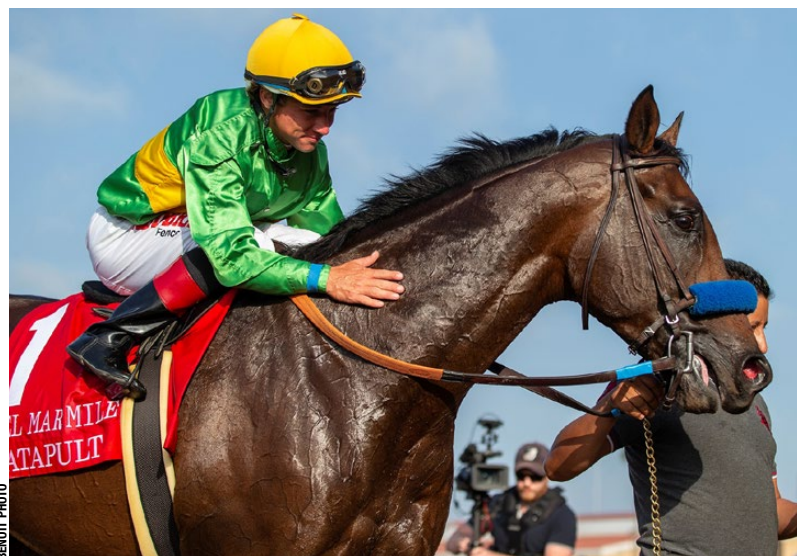
A day after Sadler won the TVG Pacific Classic (G1) with Accelerate, Woodford Racing's Catapult and Van Dyke closed with a rush in the stretch to pass Fly to Mars late and win the one-mile grass test by a half-length.

"I'm having a dream meet," said Sadler, who also won the Eddie Read Stakes (G2T) with Catapult, the San Diego Handicap (G2) with Catalina Cruiser, and the Rancho Bernardo Handicap (G3) with Yuvetsi during the summer session at Del Mar. "We're winning these big races and getting good trips, and I can't ask for more."

It was the fifth of seven victories for Van Dyke on the 10-race Del Mar card Sunday. The seven wins from eight mounts (his only loss was aboard Allaboutaction, who finished second) tied the Del Mar record for most wins in a day. Victor Espinoza also won seven races in a day at track in 2006. Van Dyke also won for Sadler aboard first-time starter Tantara in the fifth race, a maiden special weight turf sprint for fillies 3 and older.

"I had a day up at Santa Anita recently, where I won the first four races, including a grade 1, and that was the best. But I think today goes past it," Van Dyke said.

Fly to Mars, who led by 1 1/2 lengths with a furlong to run in the Del Mar Mile, crossed the line second but was disqualified to third by the Del Mar stewards for interfering with third-place finisher Sharp Samurai. Fly to Mars and jockey Tyler Gaffalione came into the path of Sharp Samurai in the stretch, which forced jockey Gary Stevens to check sharply between horses. Sharp

Samurai was elevated to second place.

"That not only cost me the place. It cost me the win," Stevens said. "I don't think Drayden is going to get by me if I don't get stopped."

Early in the Del Mar Mile—as grade 1 winner What a View set a pace of :23.25, :46.71, and 1:10.09 through six furlongs—Catapult saved ground after a break from the inside post and had to wait for traffic to clear late in the second turn, but once in the clear on the outside in the stretch, surged to victory.

"It was a little hairy there turning for home. I had to wait for room," Van Dyke said. "But then he got out and just went."

Catapult, a 5-year-old son of Kitten's Joy who was a stakes winner on the East Coast before he moved to Sadler's barn for the 2018 season, now has 6-3-1 record from 15 starts and \$621,384 in earnings. He was bred in Kentucky by Breffni Farm, out of the Storm Cat mare Gata Bella.

"He ran a good race in the Eddie Read and I wasn't sure I was going to bring him back here," Sadler said.

"But I figured that, since he's so good on this turf course, I wanted to run him twice here. We're hoping he'll end up in the Breeders' Cup Mile (G1T)."

Behind Sharp Samurai in the Del Mar Mile came Big Score, B Squared, Hunt, Caribou Club, Le Ken, What a View, True Valour, Bowies Hero, Next Shares, and Om, to complete the order of finish. **BH**

# UTMOST PUTS BEST FOOT FORWARD IN SKY CLASSIC

It was a banner day at Woodbine for trainer Graham Motion, who took home his third straight renewal of the \$175,000 Sky Classic Stakes (G2T) when Utmost cruised past his four competitors to cross the wire in 2:17.61 for about 1 3/8 miles.

Sent off at post-time odds of 9-5, Utmost broke well and tracked the pace in second behind favorite Tiz a Slam, who led the field through fractions of :25.43, :50.25, and 1:15.29 in the first six furlongs.

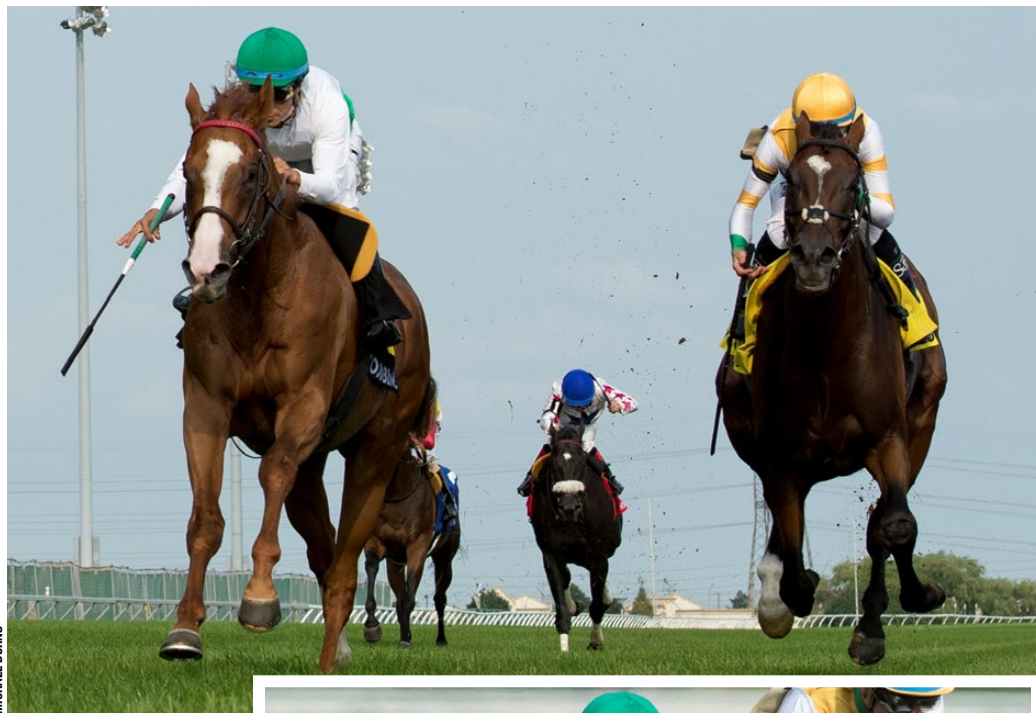
With jockey Alan Garcia in the irons, Utmost gained ground and then matched strides with Tiz a Slam as they entered the stretch. The tiring leader fought against his rival's advance, but Utmost forged ahead to win by a length over a turf course rated good.

"He broke well, and then after that, I put my head down and he was on cruise control," Garcia said. "I talked to the assistant and I talked to Sheena Ryan, because she gets on him in the morning sometimes, and asked how he was doing. She said, 'He's a nice horse. He's very relaxed. He's a classy horse. You're going to love him.' And she was right.

"I was only worried about the horses in the back. Before turning for home, I saw in the back nobody was coming, and I (thought) the only horse to beat is in front of me, so I (thought) let me take my time. ... He was the best today."

Seeking Albert finished third and was followed by Black Sea in fourth. Drumcliff's tack slipped mid-race, forcing jockey Ian Black to pull him up. Danish Dynaformer was scratched.

The win marked the first North American victory for Utmost, a son of Giant's Causeway. A two-time winner in England, the colt shipped to the U.S. for his

American debut at Delaware Park in the July 7 Cape Henlopen Stakes, where he finished third.

Motion's prior wins in the event for older horses came in 2017 with Can'thelpbelieving and with Messi in 2016. Motion also captured the race in 2006 with Better Talk Now.

After setting a pressured pace, Little Miss Raelyn drew off to win by 3 1/2 lengths when asked by jockey Jorge Vargas Jr. She had previously turned in quick workouts for trainer Jeremiah Englehart at both Saratoga Race Course and Belmont Park.

Bred in Maryland by Kenneth Lowe Jr., Little Miss Raelyn is out of the Louis Quatorze mare Helen Louise.

Super Ninety Nine, trained by Bob Baffert for Tanma Corporation, showed promise when he broke his maiden on debut and then placed second in the Hollywood Prevue Stakes (G3) as a 2-year-old. After starting his sophomore year with a score in an allowance optional-claiming, he followed the effort

with a 11 1/4-length romp in the Southwest Stakes (G3). With a step up in class he placed fifth in the Rebel Stakes (G2) and third in the Santa Anita Derby (G1).

The son of Pulpit is out of unraced Unbridled's Song mare Exogenetic, a full sister to the ill-fated grade 1 winner Exogenous who had earned \$945,560.

## PRETTY POLLYANNA THRILLS IN PRIX MORNY AT DEAUVILLE

**P**retty Pollyanna preserved her place as favorite for the QIPCO One Thousand Guineas (G1) with success in the group 1 Darley Prix Morny at Deauville—but she was given a scare.

Silvestre de Sousa let the Michael Bell-trained filly stride on in the six-furlong feature and everything looked to be going to plan as her rivals started to come off the bridle. However, John Quinn's Signora Cabello burst out of the pack under Frankie Dettori to lay down a challenge that momentarily looked as if it would succeed.

The pair drew clear impressively in the final furlong

but Pretty Pollyanna rallied to give Bell a second win in the race 24 years after the success of Hoh Magic.

Pretty Pollyanna provided compensation for owner Bill Gredley, whose 3-year-old colt James Garfield was cut down close home at the track two weeks ago in the LARC Prix Maurice de Gheest (G1).

"She really toughed it out in the last furlong and what pleased me for the future was her last furlong was her best furlong," Bell said.

"That bodes very well for her getting a mile, the way she kicked in the last 150 yards. For the future that is very important."

She remains the 12-1 favorite for next year's One Thousand Guineas.

Bell, who will be hoping to add Newmarket classic glory to his Derby and Oaks triumphs at Epsom, added: "She has a very good temperament, eats and sleeps and is very easy to train. She's from a very good staying family which includes User Friendly, who won three versions of the Oaks for Mr. Gredley.

"I hope she'll get a mile. She's in the Moyglare and Cheveley Park so we'll talk together and decide."

Group 1 success wasn't coming out of turn for De Sousa, who has struck up a fine partnership with Pretty Pollyanna—named after Gredley's daughter Polly, who is married to James Garfield's trainer George Scott—and who said afterwards he had drawn plenty of encouragement from her sixth-placed effort at Royal Ascot.

"It's my first group 1 of the year and it's great," said the Stobart jockeys' title leader. "I go everywhere, but you still need the good horses to take you to the big stage. I'm very lucky to get on this filly so thank you to Mr. Bell and of course (my retainer) Prince Faisal, who was the first to bring me to France to ride for Mr. Fabre. Maybe without that I wouldn't have got the opportunity.

"Even at Ascot she was less of a surprise for me than she was for the trainer and she felt very comfortable at Newmarket. She went up in class today but proved she's a good filly because we've beaten horses that have

already won good group races."

John Quinn looked the more likely of the two trainers to be celebrating a second Prix Morny win at the furlong marker and felt Signora Cabello lost little in defeat.

"She's run a screamer and they're two very good fillies," Quinn said. "I thought she might have done enough and she showed a great turn of foot to run the other one down in the first place."

Phoenix Thoroughbreds bought a majority share in Signora Cabello from Zen Racing shortly before her Royal Ascot success, and chairman Amer Abdulaziz was looking to the future.

He said: "We have always believed in her but she was beaten by a better filly so we're happy to finish second. Frankie gave her a good ride and we'll target the Cheveley Park, where hopefully we'll meet the winner again.

"She'll be a beautiful broodmare, but before then she'll go to the Cheveley Park and then the Breeders' Cup."

Clear best of the rest was True Mason, and Karl Burke may not be finished with group 1 ambitions for the colt.

"The two fillies are very, very good and so it was a very good run from our fella," said the trainer. "In that grade we'd want a little bit more cut and we'll keep our eye on the Middle Park. He's certainly entitled to take his chance."

## NONZA SWOOPS IN LATE TO TAKE PRIX JEAN ROMANET

Among the ranks of jockeys and trainers in France the names Alexis Badel and Henri-François Devin have been talked of for some time as group 1 winners-in-waiting.

For both men the wait is over as Nonza came from well back to overhaul Urban Fox and James Doyle in the Aug. 19 Prix Jean Romanet (G1), sparking emotional scenes in the tight Deauville winner's enclosure.

A homebred product of the Devin family's Haras du Mesnil, Nonza started her run out wide and, from a furlong down, always looked to be getting there.

Navaro Girl came from a similarly long way back to take third but Rhododendron was eased right down by Ryan Moore after appearing to be struck early in the straight.

Nonza had been climbing the ladder gradually of late, but had won only a listed race before this in her previous start.

"She's very progressive and has improved with time, as a lot of the family can," said Devin, who missed the presentation as he rushed off to saddle a runner in the following Prix de Pomone (G2).

"The thing about her is that you can't really rush her. She has a fantastic morning rider, Marcos Santos, who has ridden her for quite some time and gets on very well with her. Full credit to him, he's done an incredible job."

Devin took out his training license only in 2013 but has quickly made a name for himself.

But he reserved his warmest praise for Badel—the son of former jockey Alain and trainer Myriam Bollack—who has been an ally of the yard ever since finishing second aboard Physiocrate in the 2015 Prix de Diane Longines (G1).

"Alexis is a fantastic jockey and I'm so happy for him," said Devin. "He's been riding for so long and it seems amazing to me that this is his first group 1

win. See what he achieved in such a short time in Hong Kong. If he'd stayed he would be one of the top guys."

Urban Fox now has group 1 figures of 122 since joining William Haggas, who found nothing to reproach in her performance.

"James just felt she was there plenty soon enough, but he had to go when he went," said Haggas.

"He's just got done close home but she's run a very solid race again. I think this is her trip, and faster ground—James said the ground felt a bit dead on her—would suit her better.

"I'll be definitely be looking abroad with her. We've got to make a plan, both short term and long term."

Favorite Bateel did not pick up quite as expected in the straight under Olivier Peslier and was well held in fifth.

"She didn't really breath properly during the race and the ground has gone a bit quick for her on what was her first run since May," said trainer Francis Graffard.

## HALL OF FAME PUTS ON 'WOMEN IN RACING' PANEL

As a prelude to a major exhibition that will open next year, the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame held a "Women in Racing" panel Aug. 19 in Saratoga Springs, N.Y.

Beginning with a video that recalled racing luminaries like Mary Hirsch, Elizabeth Daingerfield, Allaire du Pont, and Marion du Pont Scott, the panel featured women across the Thoroughbred racing industry, including jockeys, trainers, breeders, and executives.

Originally slated to be moderated by Charlisie Cantey, who was unable to attend for medical reasons, the discussion was instead hosted by Tracy Egan, the executive director of the New York Thoroughbred Breeding and Development Fund.

Two of the panelists, jockey Julie Krone and trainer Janet Elliott, comprise half of the women inductees into the Hall of Fame. Joining them on the panel were champion steeplechase jockey Blythe Miller Davies, trainer Linda Rice, owner/breeder Charlotte Weber, racetrack owner Stella Thayer, and racing analyst Gabby Gaudet.

Asked about both their professional and personal lives, the panelists offered animated anecdotes about their parents' reactions to their career choices, their favorite moments in racing, and their experiences with sexism.

The latter topic was initially prompted by a question from John Hendrickson, the museum's president. His wife Marylou Whitney was present and honored with a bouquet of her namesake roses.

While the panelists acknowledged that it was hard to break into the industry as a woman, many also said that persistence and hard work were the keys to their success.

Acknowledging she, too, was often reluctant to ride women early in her career, Rice told a story of the first time Krone, at that time a well-established jockey, rode

for her, on a horse named Fabulous Force, who was notoriously difficult to control.

"If you tried to restrain him," Rice said, "he'd run faster."

Krone breezed Fabulous Force once, and, satisfied, Rice named her in the horse's next race. Fabulous Force ran wide and nearly ran off, but Krone got him to the wire for his first win and set a new track record at Saratoga Race Course.

"Julie crawled off the horse," Rice recalled. "She whispered, 'He ran great.'"

The night before the panel, a new statue of Krone was unveiled in a private ceremony at the museum, and it was she, ebullient and loquacious, perfectly at home in front of the microphone, who often commanded attention Sunday. She regaled the packed Hall of Fame with stories of the strategies she used to get rides early in her career and the feeling she would get on race day, when she knew she had a slate of live mounts.

Several of the women on the panel spoke of the paucity of women involved in racing when they were starting out, asserting that those days are gone.

"There weren't many women at the track when I became involved," said Thayer, who owns Tampa Bay Downs and noted the number of women in management positions at her track. "That has significantly changed and improved at all levels."

"It took me a long time to get accepted to The Jockey Club, and it's a great honor," said Weber, who owns Florida's Live Oak Plantation. "Today it's not quite so difficult. Women are recognized as equals to men. The stigma is over."

The women were also asked about how they plan for the retirement of the horses in their care, and what advice they would offer to women hoping to work in the industry.

When Rice told her father she was going to be a trainer, she said his response was, "It would be easier if you were one of my sons," and Rice said frankly that the current state of racing makes it difficult for anyone to have success, given the smaller foal crop, short fields, and level of competition. Pointing to Gaudet, an on-air race analyst and handicapper, she also observed that women have options other than working on the backstretch.

"Being a trainer is tough," Rice said. "But there are so many other things women can do." **BH**

## SOCIETY'S CHAIRMAN TOPS KEENELAND SEPTEMBER VALUE SIRES

Looking at proven stallions to be represented at the upcoming Keeneland September Yearling Sale by the highest percentage of stakes winners yields a familiar list of commercial leaders—Galileo, War Front, Distorted Humor, Speightstown, Tapit, and Frankel.

The 2017 median yearling prices for these six sires range from \$150,000 for Distorted Humor to either \$587,500 for Tapit, if looking only at North American sales results, or \$600,000 for War Front, if including yearling results worldwide.

If you're a buyer with a smaller budget, there are still plenty of opportunities to acquire a successful runner.

BloodHorse MarketWatch identified 15 value sires worth considering, provided the

sale yearling meets all other physical requirements. To get this list, *MarketWatch* first sorted all Keeneland September sires whose first foals are 3-year-olds or older by the sire's lifetime percentage of black-type winners. From the sires 5% or more stakes winners, we then carved out those that have more than 30 named Northern Hemisphere foals and had 2017 North American yearling medians below \$50,000.

The leading sire on the list is Shannondoe Farm's multiple grade 1-placed, graded stakes winner Society's Chairman. The 15-year-old son of Not Impossible has 8.1% black-type winners from the smallest crop of foals among the value sires. His three black-type winners include two graded stakes winners,

which even more significantly include Caren, the 2016 Canadian Horse of Year. Society's Chairman will be represented by six yearlings cataloged to the September sale, with the first ones appearing in Book 3.

Society's Chairman's low foal count is the result of bad timing. The stallion entered stud 45 days before the Ontario government shut down its slots-at-racetrack program and threw the provinces breeding and racing industry into turmoil.

"Things continued to spiral down, and I didn't want to raise horses without knowing where I could go with them," Arika Everatt-Meeuse, manager of her family's Shannondoe Farm, told *BloodHorse* a year ago about the 2014 breeding season. "He is a nice horse and had earned his keep, so we concentrated on surviving. He was basically moth-balled."

While he had a limited number of foals in his first crops, Society's Chairman is well positioned to see some upside in his progeny performance stats. He has 53 foals in his 2017 crop, more than his first three crops combined.

The value sire with the greatest representation at Keeneland September is Hill 'n' Dale Farms' top turf sire Kitten's Joy, who has 76 yearlings cataloged. The son of El Prado is no stranger among the top North American sires. He is currently the leading North American turf sire and ranks third on the 2018 general leading sire list. Kitten's Joy topped the general leading sire list in 2013. To date, Kitten's Joy has 6.7% stakes winners, which equates to 84 black-type winners and the second-highest total among the value sires behind the late Elusive Quality (93, 6.3%).

Kitten's Joy had a 2017 yearling median of \$40,000, which is the co-highest median among the value sires at \$40,000 along with Ashford Stud's Munnings (6.8% stakes winners) and Hill 'n' Dale's Kantharos (5.8%). **BH**
