



KEENELAND JANUARY KICKS OFF 2019 AUCTION SEASON

When Keeneland holds the first auction of 2019 with its January Horses of All Ages Sale, the Jan. 7-10 sale will be a test of whether the robust commercial market of last year will continue.

With the 1,574 head cataloged nearly equal to the 1,583 entered in the four-day 2018 auction that was trimmed from five days the previous year, Keeneland's sale offers a diverse group of horses with appeal to a broad range of buyer tastes and price ranges. Including two rounds of supplemental entries, there are 709 broodmares and broodmare prospects, 601 yearlings, 258 horses of racing age, and six stallions in the catalog.



While there are a plethora of solid graded stakes performers and producers in this year's catalog, the auction has two notable stars in the form of six-time grade 1 winner Abel Tasman, being offered by Taylor Made Sales Agency, and 2018 grade 1 winner Fatale Bere, a supplemental entry as part of the ELiTE Sales consignment.

Last year's sale—led by the \$1.6 million paid by agent Steve Young for grade 2 winner Mrs McDougal and the \$1 million winning bid of Coolmore Stud's M.V. Magnier for a yearling colt from the first crop of American Pharoah—produced gains of 21.6%, 28.5%, and 14.3% in gross, average, and median prices, respectively.

The January sale has established a foothold within the marketplace as a venue for which consignors can aim certain horses and buyers have a confidence level with what is being presented.

The quality of this year's catalog, along with recent reports showing strong economic indicators in the racing industry in 2018, are reasons for optimism coming into this year's sale, according to Bob Elliston, Keeneland's vice president of racing and sales.

"January used to be a catch-all sale," Elliston said. "January is now a niche market, especially for justturned yearlings that were late coming to hand and fillies coming off the track or racehorses that still have racing potential. And there is just such demand for mares. Whatever the value of Abel Tasman is, her owners putting her in the sale provides a confidence boost for the January sale. Even if you're not buying at that level, when you see the commitment to put such an expensive asset in this sale, that sends a message that they can realize a great return."

Elliston said there is no reason to believe that market polarization seen in the past several years will not continue, with the quality lots generating the most buyer attention.

"There is a very solid underpinning in the breeding industry right now for quality," he said. "It's all about quality, and there is significant quality in this catalog. If you don't have a well-bred horse or one that lacks conformation or an active family, it's still going to be a struggle."

Conrad Bandoroff of Denali Stud said January provides a good opportunity for both buyers and sellers.

"There is something for everybody," Bandoroff said. "It

provides an opportunity (for sellers) to start the year on a good note and maybe cash in on something. Also, if something doesn't fit a breeder's program, it's an opportunity to move it along and move forward. This sale is a great vehicle for someone who doesn't have a breeding program to sell a filly or mare off the track and provides an opportunity for someone to pick up a mare coming into the breeding season."

Although the recent fluctuations in the U.S. stock market are cause for concern for Elliston and others involved in the domestic Thoroughbred industry, they believe there will be minimal effect on the January sale.

"The stock market can have some effect on discretionary spending, like on horses, for people at the top end," Elliston said, adding there are signs of an overall strong economy. "I don't think the (stock market) volatility speaks to the fundamentals of the U.S. economy and key markets around the world."

Woods Edge Farm's Peter O'Callaghan, a regular January sale buyer, said the U.S. stock market gyrations will not affect his or his business partners' buying patterns.

"We think we live in our own bubble here in the horse world and will continue to buy as normal," O'Callaghan said. "For the quality, it never goes out of fashion. It will be similar to most sales at the moment

in that it is very competitive for the quality product. Having Abel Tasman in the book will be a good draw for the sale and will bring a few people out of the woodwork who don't always come for this sale. It should have a very positive impact on the sale. There

is always an effect when you have a draw like her in the catalog."

Andrew Cary, a partner in consignor Select Sales, said he believes there will be minimal Wall Street impact on the sale.

"There is still a lot of uncertainty with the world markets and geopolitics," Cary said, "but I don't see major corrections. A lot of longterm operations have been through the highs and lows and know how to hedge for those situations. The higher end might be affected, and

the bottom might be affected, but I think the middle is going to be healthy. The very top of the market may not be affected because there are a limited number of people that are in the business at that level."

"It certainly makes you nervous," Bandoroff said of the stock market. "You would like to see a continuation of what we saw over the summer and autumn. But I think the general strength of the global economy is going to continue to give people confidence.

"The strength of racing and betting have been improving, and that's a positive factor. We've had increases in yearling and bloodstock sales, and there is no reason that should not be maintained. The right people are here shopping, and the forecast looks good."

Bandoroff said tax reforms in 2017 that make it more lucrative to invest in horses are an additional lure to buyers.

"It played a role in (buying) towards the end of last year, with people trying to buy mares for tax purposes," he said. "It's certainly advantageous, and there are major tax benefits for investing in bloodstock right now. It's a great thing for our industry and something we need to promote more. It's a great way to encourage more people to get involved."

The Keeneland sale sessions begin at 10 a.m. daily. BH

LIVING LEGEND A.P. INDY THRIVING AT LANE'S END AT 30

E very morning at 6:30, the multitude of grooms at Lane's End go through the motions. One by one, the farm's stallions are retrieved from their paddocks and marched back toward the barns to be washed, groomed, fed, and prepped for the breeding shed.

When 2 p.m. rolls around, the process begins anew. One by one, with military precision, the stallions are led from their stalls and turned out for the evening, where they remain until the dawn breaks and the familiar jangle of lead ropes echoes across the fields.

It's a comfortable and reliable routine; a set of motions as familiar and innate as circadian rhythms.

Every one of Lane's End's 15—soon to be 17—stallions listed on the roster at the Kentucky farm are active Thoroughbred studs tasked with perpetuating the gene pool of one of the most coveted breeds of equine in the world.

Every one of them but one.

A.P. Indy, the 30-year-old foundation sire of the Lane's End legacy—and one of the greatest North American sires in Thoroughbred history—keeps the same schedule as his younger colleagues, minus the trip to the breeding shed.

But if it wasn't for him, many of the stallions in the property's historic barns wouldn't exist.

Day after day, season after season, pensioner A.P. Indy—who will celebrate his actual 30th birthday March 31—is still the head of the stallion ranks, leading the charge from the barns to the paddocks and back again.

Standing on the threshold of a stall he has occupied for almost 25 years, a stallion show in full swing, A.P. Indy is less than enthusiastic about having his routine disturbed. With a grip that calls to mind some of the famous strength that earned him fame and fortune at the races, he grabs a hold of his groom's arm with his mouth and tugs him past the gate.

"Come on, man," Asa Haley laughs while nudging A.P. Indy playfully in return. "Are we doing this today?"

Back and forth, like kids playing tug of war, they go, as the audience in the barn looks on and smiles.

As an onlooker, I'm struck by the thought that the stallion in front of me predates me by two years. He won his first grade 1 race a month after I was born. He was named Horse of the Year before I could walk. The enormity of his achievements cannot be overstated.

But with 22 years of experience at Lane's End, Haley looks at A.P. Indy more as a brother. He has been there to witness most of the horse's life, and their relationship is one of familiarity and respect, sprinkled with the occasional peppermint.

"He loves peppermints," Haley said. "He used to be in to apples when he was younger, but now it's mostly peppermints. But only the puffy, soft ones."

Haley took over for the pensioned stallion's former groom, Kenneth Burress, when Burress made the transition to night watchman. After A.P. Indy was pensioned in 2011 due to declining fertility, the decision was made to keep the stallion on the same schedule he'd known for most of his life.

According to Haley, the routine keeps him young and helps remind the others he's one of the guys, even if he's 30.

"I've worked with him for close to 15 years, give or




A.P. Indy and his groom, Asa Haley, at Lane's End

take," said Haley. "He's just a really nice horse; really gentle. He's so easy to get along with—all you have to do is tap him on the leg and he knows what to do. Maybe when he was on the track he was a different story, but ever since I've known him, he's only been gentle.

"He does bite on me all the time," Haley added, still chuckling. "I guess I'm his chew toy. That's something that just started one day out of the blue. He just reached up and grabbed me, and I looked at him like, 'What are you doing?' The next thing I knew, he had me in his mouth again, and it's been going on ever since. He just loves to play. I let him bite all over me."

While most know him as simply "A.P.," Haley calls the legend "Head"—a fitting name for a stallion who is undeniably the foundation of a Thoroughbred dynasty that has left an indelible impression on the breed.

A Legend in the Making

Bred by Lane's End founder William S. Farish and his partner William Kilroy, A.P. Indy was born Thoroughbred royalty, a son of Triple Crown winner Seattle Slew. At the time of his birth in 1989, his dam, Weekend Surprise—a daughter of Secretariat had already proved her prowess as a broodmare by producing champion 3-year-old Summer Squall.

Sent to the 1990 Keeneland Summer Select Yearling Sale, the striking bay was purchased for a stunning \$2.9 million by BBA Ireland as agent for Japanese businessman Tomonori Tsurumaki.

From there, as they say, the rest is history.

A.P. Indy broke his maiden on second asking for trainer Neil Drysdale on Oct. 27, 1991, at Santa Anita

Park. He followed that effort with another win in a Dec. 4 allowance race at Bay Meadows and added yet another win 18 days later in the Hollywood Futurity (G1) at Hollywood Park.

Back at 3, A.P. Indy took the San Rafael Stakes (G2) and then the Santa Anita Derby (G1) before his connections set their sights on the Kentucky Derby (G1). When a foot bruise and blind quarter crack in the colt's left front hoof derailed his chances of a win beneath the Twin Spires, he was rested—only to bounce back even better. A.P. Indy won the Peter Pan Stakes (G2) and finally added a classic score in the 1992 Belmont Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park.

A.P. Indy ran fifth in the Molson Export Million Stakes (G2) at Woodbine, then fell in the gate next out in the Jockey Gold Cup (G1) at Belmont, rallying in deep stretch to finish third.

A short 21 days after his fall in the Gold Cup, he came back to dominate by two lengths in his final race, the 1992 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) at Gulfstream Park.

He was named 1992 champion 3-year-old colt and Horse of the Year in one fell swoop, and all thoughts turned to his potential at stud.

Despite being classified as a ridgling—the undescended testicle was surgically removed during his racing career—it didn't take long for the accomplished racehorse to prove his fecundity in spades.

From Classic Winner to Franchise-Maker

Active between 1993 and 2011, A.P. Indy is the sire of 18 crops and 693 winners from 947 starters, for an overall win rate of 57% and a stakes-winning rate of 13%. Among those winners were 94 graded stakes winners, 164 stakes winners, and 12 champions.

As a broodmare sire, A.P. Indy proved equally impressive. From 2,657 starters, 1,844 of those foals (69%) are winners, 214 (8%) are stakes winners, 106 are graded stakes winners, and 11 are champions. Total earnings to date for his progeny as a broodmare sire exceed \$227 million.

"He's had a tremendous impact in a time when his average book size over 18 seasons was 68 mares," said Bill Farish of Lane's End. "Nowadays, that's laughable. It's amazing to see that kind of influence from such small crops. He had 13% stakes winners over 18 seasons. You just don't see numbers like that."

And while A.P. Indy has been enjoying retirement, his sons and grandsons have excelled in breeding sheds around the world. Four of the top 25 stallions standing in North America are sons of A.P. Indy: Flatter (ranked No. 10), Malibu Moon (11), Congrats (24), and Majestic Warrior (25). Three more sons—Bernardini (33), fellow Lane's End stallion Mineshaft (35), and Jump Start (43)—can be found in the top 50.

Those sons, as well as others, are responsible for an additional three grandsons of A.P. Indy who have cracked the top 50: Tapit (5), Tapizar (30), and Dialed In (34).

A.P. Indy was named leading sire in the United States in 2003 and 2006 and leading broodmare sire in 2015. He is one of only 20 horses to have been awarded both titles during their stallion careers in the past century.

"It's incredible what he means to us," Farish says. "He revived the Bold Ruler line that we were desperately

in need of as breeders. With the Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector lines being so prominent, we needed another branch, and he almost single-handedly provided that. There's no way to know where we would be if that hadn't happened."

"For Lane's End, he really is the franchise-maker. The farm had been in existence for 20 years before he was born, and the last 30 years with him have been incredible."

Among the many grandsons and great-grandsons climbing in the sire ranks, several can be found in the

same barn as their esteemed ancestor. Grandsons Mr Speaker and Tonalist, as well as sons Honor Code and Mineshaft, are staples on the Lane's End roster.

In addition to taking care of A.P. Indy, Haley is also the lead groom for Mineshaft and new recruit

West Coast, a grandson by Flatter.

"I've had Mineshaft since he came off the track,"

Haley said, "and West Coast is settling in really well. He's part of the first family, so it's great to have him. I can't complain."

The Legend at His Finest

Situated among the paths where the stallions are shown on the farm, a bronze statue of A.P. Indy keeps watch over the barns. But for all the perfection of its metallurgical conformation, it still pales in

comparison to the real thing. Even today, when the farm hosts an open house, the first name everyone asks for, as both Farish and Haley will tell you, is A.P. Indy.

"He's not a horse to me—he's a person," Haley said. "But when people come, that's who they want to see—A.P. Indy. If people see me out in public and recognize me, they always ask how he's doing. He's very close to my heart."

"Not a person comes to the stallion barn who doesn't want to see him," Farish said. "(Even) if they're not coming to see him, specifically, in the first place.

> "He's part of my dad's legacy. While I get to be a part of it, this is his doing, and it means so much to him. It dawned on me this year that Dad turns 80 this year, A.P. Indy turns 30, and the farm turns 40—all in the same year. Dad and A.P. Indy also have their birthdays in the same month, which is great. It's great to see A.P. Indy so happy."

> Secure in his legacy and his place as "Head" of the Lane's End stallion barn, A.P. Indy is happiest when turned out in his paddock. He trots to the center, surveys the farm, then takes one turn around the fence before settling in to graze under his favorite trees. And when Haley comes to fetch him in the morning, he'll follow the same routine all over again.

Someone has to show them how it's done. BH

With more than 1,500 horses spread across four days and subject to often unpredictable weather, a sale page of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale often has to be exceptional to entice buyers to take a look.

Enter Hip 40 from Baccari Bloodstock.

Out in full force with less than 24 hours before the start of the sale, buyers were invariably drawn to Barn 6 and the dark bay or brown filly named M d'Oro, consigned by Baccari as a racing or broodmare prospect.

"She has a very good profile and a lot of nice lines," said Chris Baccari. "She has so much going on with her immediate family. She's being sold as a racing or broodmare prospect but probably leans more towards the broodmare side."

Bred in Kentucky by Dell Ridge Farm and Hill 'n' Dale Equine Holdings, M d'Oro is an unraced 3-yearold filly out of the Gone West mare Violent Beauty. A winner of more than \$50,000, Violent Beauty is most recognized as the dam of Hill 'n' Dale Farms stallion Violence, a full brother to M d'Oro by Medaglia d'Oro. Now the sire of three crops of racing age and 12 stakes winners, Violence had a significant increase in his stud fee this year—from \$25,000 to \$40,000.

The siblings have another full sister in Wild Mint, an \$850,000 weanling purchase by Richard O'Gorman, agent, from Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency during the 2014 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Stale. Expecting her first foal this spring, the mare is in foal to two-time Horse of the Year Curlin.

M d'Oro, who went unsold as a weanling at a final bid of \$295,000 during the 2016 Keeneland November sale, is also a half sister to a 2-year-old Curlin colt who was purchased for \$1 million by Andre Lynch at the 2017 Keeneland November sale from the Hill 'n' Dale consignment.

The filly's second dam, Storming Beauty (Storm Cat), was a winner at 3 and a full sister to grade 3 winner Hurricane Cat. Her third dam, Sky Beauty (Blushing Groom), was the 1993 Filly Triple Crown winner, 1994 champion older mare, and winner of nine grade 1 stakes with earnings of \$1,336,000.

"She's not just a (full sibling) to Violence. There is so much going on in her pedigree and so much more development than what you can see on the page," Baccari said. "The pedigree is going to keep getting better.

TOM'S D'ETAT CONFIRMED FOR PEGASUS WORLD CUP

Following some consideration, G M B Racing's Tom's d'Etat has officially been confirmed for the \$9 million Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes (G1) Jan. 26 at Gulfstream Park, according to trainer Al Stall Jr. and G M B racing manager Greg Bensel.

On the morning of Jan. 6, the 6-year-old son of Smart Strike began serious preparations for North America's richest race with a half-mile breeze in :49 flat over a fast Fair Grounds main track under jockey Shaun Bridgmohan. It was the horse's first work since his Dec. 22 Tenacious Stakes victory.

"This will be a true test," Bensel said. "We don't know where he fits in the Pegasus, but I do know that he's won six out of his nine career races, so he deserves a chance. He's a horse that can definitely go the distance up against that type of talent. It will be the most talented field there can be."

Lightly raced for a 6-year-old, Tom's d'Etat scored his fourth victory in a row in the Tenacious Stakes, which was also his stakes debut. Ankle issues put him on the sidelines for 16 months following a ninelength allowance win at Saratoga Race Course in July 2017, where he defeated graded stakes winner Far From Over. He was able to return from the hiatus in winning fashion to defeat stakes winners Pioneer Spirit and Guest Suite over a fast main track at Churchill Downs in November in a third-level allowance race.

"I think he is getting to that point where he seems to be getting better with age," Bensel said. "Our hopes are that he can compete and can shock some people."

Tom's d'Etat is out of the Giant's Causeway broodmare Julia Tuttle, whose dam, Candy Cane, is a full sister to multiple grade/group 1 winner and sire Candy Ride. He was a \$330,000 purchase from the 2014 Keeneland September Yearling Sale from the Hunter Valley Farm consignment. He was bred in Kentucky by SF Bloodstock.

Stall said Tom's d'Etat would have two more works before shipping to Gulfstream Park Jan. 22. BH

G unmetal Gray showed plenty of grit and determination while charging from seventh to win the one-mile Sham Stakes (G3) Jan. 5 at Santa Anita Park. The 3-year-old son of the late Exchange Rate, out of Classofsixtythree, by Include, races for West Point Thoroughbreds, Pearl Racing, and trainer Jerry Hollendorfer.

He tipped his hand soon after being sent to J.R. and Katie Boyd's Brick City Thoroughbreds near Ocala, Fla.

The late-running colt was bred in Kentucky by Lee Pokoik. Pokoik has enjoyed a hot streak of late, as he is also the owner of 2018 Spinaway Stakes (G1) winner Sippican Harbor.

Offered through Taylor Made Sales Agency, Gunmetal Gray was an \$85,000 RNA at the 2017 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Purchased privately by bloodstock agent Steve Shahinian on behalf of Michael and Melvyn Ezekiel, the colt was then pinhooked in the Ocala Breeders' Sales March Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training, where Brick City Thoroughbreds sold him for \$225,000 to West Point and Hollendorfer, with David Ingordo representing Lane's End Bloodstock.

"He was actually quite a nice colt," Shahinian said of Gunmetal Gray as a yearling. "We didn't have a big budget. He RNA'd, and I went back and we made a deal. He was a handy colt but very immature at the sale, but he did everything the right way. He had a good shape with a good brain."

"From day one, he was at the top of all the horses we were breaking/training last year," said J.R. Boyd. "I was looking at my notes yesterday ... the third time we worked him, we knew he was a really good horse.

"The first time we breezed him, we said, 'We've got to slow him down and build bone on him,'" Boyd said. "That's the main thing we do. Katie and I try to lay down a foundation, lay down a lot of bone so that when they get to the next level, they are able to handle the racetrack."

Boyd's stepfather is Robbie Harris of the Harris Training Center. He worked there for several years before he and his wife went out on their own six years ago. They will offer some 50 juveniles at various sales this year.

"Our little consignment is moving in the right direction," Boyd said. "We're hoping this win will help build the business."

As for the 2-year-old market, Boyd has the same refrain as everyone else. "If you jump through the hoops with the right horse, you get paid. If you don't, it's truly tough sledding."

From the last crop of Exchange Rate, Gunmetal Gray was a 6 3/4-length maiden winner his second time out at Del Mar last summer. Gunmetal Gray showed his class early, finishing second to likely 2018 champion juvenile male Game Winner in Santa Anita's American Pharoah Stakes (G1) and fifth in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1). He is a complete outcross in his first five generations.

The second dam of Gunmetal Gray is Brereton Jones-bred Rambling Rose (out of the Nelson Bunker Hunt-bred, grade 2-placed Whip Cream), who was an \$82,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale yearling and

raced by Pokoik and trainer Gary Sciacca. A maiden winner at Aqueduct Racetrack, she was winless in five allowance attempts in New York and New Jersey.

Pokoik bred and raced Gunmetal Gray's dam, Classofsixtythree, who made 22 starts. Her last two came in graded company, with a third-place finish in the 2010 Ruffian Invitational Handicap (G1) and a fifth-place finish behind Persistently and 2009 Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra in Saratoga Race Course's Personal Ensign Stakes (G1).

Classofsixtythree delivered a filly by 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah May 2. She has been bred to 2017 Horse of the Year Gun Runner for 2019. BH The Share this story

good horse can show up at any sale. But as a general rule regarding broodmares and broodmare prospects, more of them show up in the fall sales than in the winter.

Because the fall and winter markets can be so different, sales averages from the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, for example, are not reliable indicators of how a sire's daughters might sell in January. But what a comparison of these markets can show broadly is relative demand.

BloodHorse MarketWatch started out with a list of the sires represented by five or more broodmares and/or broodmare prospects at the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale, which runs Jan. 7-10. They were then compared to the broodmare/broodmare prospect averages and number sold for last year's Keeneland January and Keeneland November sales (including horses cataloged as racing/broodmare prospects).

As mentioned previously, the fall sales generally attract horses with better pedigrees that command higher prices. In our group of 41 Keeneland January sires, their collective average from the 2018 November sale was \$77,990 compared with their collective 2018 Keeneland January sale average of \$39,032.

To look at relative demand within the November and January markets, we next calculated the ratio of each sire's broodmare/ broodmare prospect average to the collective average for the group. The averages by dollars vary greatly between the two sales, but each sire's average compared to the collective average provides a sense of how a sire's daughters were valued relative to all others sold. The demand for Bernardini's and Broken Vow's daughters was strong and consistent at both 2018 sales.

Darley's Bernardini had a 2018 Keeneland January broodmare/broodmare prospect average of \$81,667, which equaled 2.09 times the collective average for sires represented at this week's Keeneland January sale. At the November sale, Bernardini had an \$85,625 average, which was 1.10 times the collective average.

Pin Oak Stud's Broken Vow had a 2018 January sale average of \$113,000, which was 2.90 times the collective average. At the November sale, Broken Vow's daughters averaged \$106,867, which was 1.37 times the collective average.

The sire represented by the highest demand across both sales is the late Unbridled's Song. His January average of \$92,333 was 2.37 times the collective average, and his November average of \$247,466 was 3.17 times higher than the collective average. The son of Unbridled is represented by nine broodmares in this week's January sale.

As evidence of how fickle the broodmare market can be, particularly in January, look at WinStar Farm's Pioneerof the Nile, whose 2018 January average of \$65,650 was 1.68 times the collective average. His

BELLAFINA UNTOUCHABLE IN SANTA YNEZ

It's safe to say jockey Flavien Prat didn't have much concern as to what kind of horse he had underneath him midway through the turn in the \$200,000 Santa Ynez Stakes (G2) Jan. 6 at Santa Anita Park.

Cruising aboard Kaleem Shah's Bellafina in the seven-furlong dirt test for 3-year-old fillies, Prat had just pulled ahead of early leader Mother Mother, whose jockey, Drayden Van Dyke, was already starting to shove on to keep up.

Prat's hands barely moved as his filly glided away, but he calmly took a set of goggles off his face, then took another set down a couple strides later.

There wouldn't be any more dirt in his face, anyway.

The rest of the race was a procession. Without any asking, the Simon Callaghan-trained Quality Road filly powered away at the top of the lane and extended her lead to the wire. At the furlong pole, she was five lengths in front. At the wire, she was 8 1/2 lengths ahead, geared down by Prat.

Mother Mother held second, 1 3/4 lengths ahead of Northern California shipper Tomlin.

Off at 2-5 with more than \$175,000 wagered on her to

show, Bellafina finished the distance in 1:22 but didn't get out of the gate great and was between horses in the chute before she worked out a pressing trip for herself in the backstretch.

"She wasn't super quick into stride," Callaghan said. "Flavien didn't rush her and just let her get comfortable. She pretty much took him to the front. Halfway through, I thought we were doing pretty good."

After Mother Mother ran the opening quarter in :22.67, Bellafina put her head in front through a half in :45 and dominated from there.

"She ... relaxed and dropped the bit around the turn, and then she took off," Prat said. "The (grade 1) Breeders' Cup (Juvenile Fillies) was just a bad day. She had trained well for Simon coming into this, and I expected her to run well, and she did."

Bellafina came into the Breeders' Cup off three straight graded stakes wins in the Sorrento Stakes (G2),

Del Mar Debutante Stakes (G1), and Chandelier Stakes (G1) but didn't run her best in the Juvenile Fillies at Churchill Downs in November and finished fourth, 9 1/4 lengths behind runaway winner Jaywalk.

"I'm here to get to a Breeders' Cup race. I keep telling Simon that," Shah said. "We went in so confident going into the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, but it just wasn't meant to be. It was not her day. Obviously, she needed to come back and show us what she did today to validate that she's among the best fillies in the country."

Callaghan said after the race he didn't have a set-in-stone plan to run Bellafina in the Santa Ynez, but the way she was training at Santa Anita forced his hand.

"After the Breeders' Cup, Kaleem said to just run her when she's ready," Callaghan

said. "I called him a couple weeks ago and told him, 'We *have* to run her.'"

Bred in Kentucky by JSM Equine, out of the Malibu Moon mare Akron Moon, Bellafina has \$708,000 in earnings from her six starts. She was an \$800,000 purchase by Shah out of The Gulfstream Sale in 2018.

Callaghan said Bellafina could get in another start before the April 6 Santa Anita Oaks (G1). The next

"We've loosely talked about two races before the Santa Anita Oaks, and we'll see how it comes out," Callaghan said. "We're in a good position now and have the first race of the year under our belt. Kaleem is ultra patient, and we'll just let the filly tell us the best plan." BH

SNITZEL FILLY EXHILARATES REWARDS GODOLPHIN VENTURE

E xhilarates earned herself a spot in the AU\$2 million Magic Millions 2YO Classic Jan. 12 and, in part, helped to justify Godolphin's long-awaited return to the Australian yearling sale market last year.

The James Cummings-trained filly, who decisively won the QTIS 2YO Handicap at the Gold Coast Jan. 5, was one of the first horses purchased by Godolphin last January at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale.

Having her fourth start, and ridden by Kerrin McEvoy for the second time, Exhilarates defeated the Chris Waller-trained Lubuk by 1 3/4 lengths. Spirit Of Boom Phelan Ready Stakes winner The Odyssey was another length away in third.

Cummings suggested Exhilarates will have

little problem handling the quick back-up after her maiden victory, which came after her second to Unite And Conquer in the Dec. 12 Magic Millions Wyong 2YO Classic.

"She has been improving all of the time. That is the best thing about Exhilarates as we didn't think she would be a summer horse when she first came in," Cummings said. "She is a different filly to the one you saw at Rosehill back in November at her first start. We had the blinkers on for the first time today, and she really traveled. From the grandstand, you could see how well she was going and how she was poised to strike."

Three of the past four Magic Millions 2YO Classic winners—Sunlight (2018), Houtzen (2017), and Le Chef (2015)—won the same Gold Coast race before taking out the main prize seven days later.



Godolphin made an immediate impact at the Australasian yearling sales in 2018 with the change in policy led by Vin Cox, who was installed as managing director of Sheikh Mohammed's Australian operation early last year after a seven-year stint leading Magic Millions. In total, Godolphin bought 20 yearlings in Australia last year at a cost of close to AU\$6.5 million, with Exhilarates among them.

Cummings said it gave him great satisfaction for the filly to make the Magic Millions race and was just reward for Cox and Godolphin bloodstock manager Jason Walsh, who was instrumental in Exhilarates' selection as a yearling.

"It's not just exciting for myself but the whole team to have a runner in the Magic Millions 2-year-old," he said. "It's a goal we had this year, and to have her rockhard fit and on season, it's really exciting. Jason Walsh and Vin Cox both had a very high opinion of her, so to see her start to fulfill that is encouraging."

McEvoy said he was pleased to be able to retain the ride on Exhilarates after her placing at Wyong.

"The improvement between then and now is light and day," McEvoy said. "James has just tailored her prep perfectly for next week's race. I've ridden for Godolphin all over the world but never in a Magic Millions 2-yearold race, so I can't wait to pull on that familiar blue." The second placing for Lubuk means it is unlikely the colt will gain a start Saturday, but the run was enough to confirm to his jockey, Larry Cassidy, that the juvenile is high class.

"He is a lovely horse, and he will be hard to beat in whatever they decide to put him in," Cassidy said.

Trainer Kelly Schweida also came away confident that The Odyssey can turn the tables on Exhilarates when they clash again.

"There is a two-kilogram turnaround, and my bloke got gassed early today. If he draws a good barrier, we are in with a chance," Schweida said.

Exhilarates, by Snitzel out of Samaready by More Than Ready, was a AU\$600,000 (\$470,520) purchase by Godolphin from the Vinery Stud draft at last year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. From four starts to date, she has returned AU\$108,750 (\$77,836) in prize money, with the promise of her biggest payday next weekend.

She is the first named foal out of dual group 1 winner Samaready, who was trained by Mick Price to win the Patinack Farm Blue Diamond Stakes (G1) and is a half sister to group 2 winner Night War and the stakes-placed Samartested. Exhilarates has a juvenile half brother by Vinery Stud-based stallion All Too Hard, but Samaready has not had a foal since. She was covered by Yarraman Park Stud's super sire I Am Invincible Nov. 20.

SKELTON CALLS FOR INDUSTRY RESPONSE TO STAFF SHORTAGE

By Jonathan Harding/Racing Post

D an Skelton called on racing to come together as a matter of urgency to devise an industry-led solution to the sport's staff shortage.

Like champion trainer Nicky Henderson, who said he was "frightened to death" by the current situation on ITV's "The Opening Show," Skelton agreed the issues of attracting and retaining staff are no longer a threat but a reality.

"It's not an approaching problem, it's a problem now," said the trainer, who feels other industries are facing similar issues. "We have to work out how to look after those working in the sport. Racing is very good at being quite insular and looking after its own, but there are various factors that make staffing difficult.

"Pay is relevant within any industry. The problem

is if trainers have a downturn in prize money, the owners win less, so we have to put up our fees to pay people more—we aren't being directly supported by our industry to pay more.

"Trainers are responsible for paying their staff, but the money has to come from somewhere. If we were given some sort of remuneration further down the line, in areas such as prize money, we could put fees up with the sole aim of increasing wages.

"At the bottom of it all, trainers are all human. I would love to be able to pay staff as much as possible to eradicate the issue altogether—we want to do right by our people."

Skelton believes blame cannot be attributed to any one party, nor does he believe pay is the sole issue in retaining staff, with the hours another factor pushing people away as they get older.

"It's an industry-wide problem, and I'm not banging the drum saying trainers need more help. But it will come to the point where, if blame is left at trainers' doors, we will have to, because it's not fair.

"Stable staff prepare the horses to turn up on the day for everybody to enjoy, so we need to have another go at solving the problem. We need to ask staff how they'd bring more people in and what frustrates them."

Harry Derham, assistant to 10-time champion jumps trainer Paul Nicholls, makes the point the total care horses require complicates the issue.

He said: "From what I hear, we're doing numerically better than some. You'd love to have more, but we're lucky to have those we do. We make a conscious effort to look after those we have. They get paid well above the minimum for the industry.

"The hours are a big thing, so our staff have Thursday afternoons off. The nature of the beast is horses have to be looked after at all times."

The situation could be made worse by Brexit, which has been identified as a major threat to racing's already stretched workforce, and trainer Gary Moore is aware of the harsh reality.

"Staff are not well-paid, but how much can you charge owners? It's a vicious circle. They're only doing 40-hour weeks now, so you want more staff to compensate for the staff who are there less of the time. I don't know what the answer is.

"I'm very lucky my family are heavily involved because you can't do it all yourself. The hours and the money are the only way to retain staff. We're as prepared as we can be for Brexit—it's not making life any easier."



Following research in conjunction with the British Horseracing Authority, ITV reported there are 6,734 registered staff in Britain, and the estimated shortfall is said to be 1,000 spread evenly across the country.

However, the BHA has reported a 9% increase in people entering the industry in 2018 compared to 2017 and is working to tackle the issue in areas ranging from recruitment and training to staff welfare and retention.

In a statement, the BHA said: "The current staffing shortage is an issue which affects the entire racing industry and one which has been identified as a key priority to be addressed.

"We have taken on a leadership role, and our recruitment, training, and retention team work closely and collaboratively with key stakeholders through an industry program board solely focused on the challenges around racing's workforce."

The BHA added that industry funding to tackle the issue reached more than £2 million in 2018, and it believes there has never been a better time to work in the sport, with a great package on offer, including career progression opportunities, union-agreed pay structures, and bespoke qualifications.

TRAINER EVAN WILLIAMS COUNTERS THE STAFFING CRISIS

Trainer Evan Williams has stressed that racing's worries about staffing problems must be put into context and urged the sport to take a positive approach.

Research carried out by the British Horseracing Authority and ITV Racing estimated there to be a staffing shortfall of around 1,000 across Britain, despite high rates of worker enjoyment and increasing numbers of people taking up employment in racing.

Champion trainer Nicky Henderson said Saturday he was "frightened to death" by the issue, while Dan Skelton, another major employer, was among those to support his view as to some of the difficulties in attracting and retaining workers. However, Williams said Jan. 6: "I'm not pretending it's not a problem, but I don't think racing is alone in facing this type of thing. Look at the rural economy as a whole; it doesn't matter if you're milking cows, running a bed-and-breakfast, or whatever—getting people to work in a rural environment is harder than it's ever been.

"But you have to work it out. That's what being a businessman is all about—if something's not going right, you try to work a way around it."

Williams, who has trained under a full license in south Wales since 2003, also pointed to the size of top stables nowadays.

"Thirty years ago, if you had 50 horses in a yard, you were a very big yard, and, obviously, your staffing needs were very different to what they are now," he said. "The trainers moaning and groaning have hundreds of horses, so, of course, they need a different



level of staffing to cope with the amount of work they've got in one establishment now.

"But how is it going to encourage people into the industry and encourage them to stay if everybody who is interviewed starts moaning about things? We have to say: 'Yes, we could do with more people helping in the yard, but we can offer them this and that, they can do this and that.' Rather than moaning, let's be positive and get on with the job. Doom-and-gloom merchants get you nowhere."


