OMAHA BEACH FENDS OFF IMPROBABLE IN ARKANSAS DERBY

Odd as it may seem, just 24 hours ago Fox Hill Farm's Omaha Beach was clinging to the last available spot for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1).

Now, in three weeks' time, the son of War Front may be in position to become the seventh straight betting favorite to win the Run for the Roses.

In a race that enabled the top three finishers to punch their tickets to the May 4 Kentucky Derby, it was Omaha Beach who grabbed the lion's share of qualifying points and accolades as he fended off Improbable to

register a length victory in the \$1 million Arkansas Derby (G1) April 13 at Oaklawn Park.

"I was hoping he'd hang in there (in the stretch), and he surely did," said trainer Richard Mandella. "He's learned to fight it out."

Country House was third in a race over a sloppy (sealed) track that could produce four Kentucky Derby starters. Long Range Toddy, who was sixth, already secured a spot in the Kentucky Derby field with 53.5 qualifying points when he turned back Improbable in the first division of the March 16 Rebel Stakes (G2).

A winner of his past three starts, Omaha Beach is expected to head to Churchill Downs off a pair of graded stakes wins at Oaklawn Park in which he defeated two of trainer Bob Baffert's top Kentucky Derby hopefuls.

"I think the horse certainly fits with the other horses. We'll see how he comes out of the race and see how things are going. We'll decide, probably, tonight (regarding the Kentucky Derby)," owner Rick Porter said.

Prior to defeating the Baffert-trained Improbable in the Arkansas Derby, Omaha Beach became a major Triple Crown contender when he edged Game Winner, Baffert's 2018 2-year-old champion male, by a nose in the second division of the Rebel Stakes.

"Since the Rebel, he has grown and is bigger," said Mandella, who is 0-for-6 in the Kentucky Derby, with a fifth by Soul of the Matter in 1994 his best finish. "Either that or the mud is making him look bigger, I'm not sure which, but we're sure excited. I hope he stays as good as he's been, because he has improved all year long."

The Arkansas Derby was the final stakes in the Road to the Kentucky Derby series, and with 100-40-20-10 points going to the top finishers, it put the finishing touches on the field of 20 for the Run for the Roses—for now.

With 137.5 points, the California-based Omaha Beach moved from 19th to second in the points standings behind Wood Memorial Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G2) winner Tacitus (150).

Improbable was 27th and out of the Kentucky Derby picture prior to Saturday, but he vaulted to 11th as the addition of 40 points gave him 65.

"(I was) happy with the way he ran," Baffert said about Improbable. "I was a little bit worried in the starting gate.

He was acting up in there. I had a few moments there of maybe he was going to rear up or do something and get left. Luckily, they unloaded him and put him back, and he left there well. I thought Jose Ortiz did a masterful job of riding him. We got beat by a good horse. They showed how these California horses are good horses."

Country House, owned by Mrs. J.V. Shields, E.J.M. McFadden Jr., and LNJ Foxwoods, entered the day 25th on the Derby leaderboard with 30 points but locked up the 17th spot with a total of 50.

"We'll talk to the owners (about the Kentucky Derby)," trainer Bill Mott said. "That's what we were looking for, and he ran well."

With Japan's Master Fencer assured of the 20th spot, once the smoke cleared after the Arkansas Derby, the 19th spot belonged to Twinspires.com Louisiana Derby (G2) runner-up Spinoff with 40 points. Missing out was Bodexpress, the maiden who finished second in the Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1). He also has 40 points but has \$36,000 less in graded stakes earnings than Spinoff, which left him on the bubble, needing a defection in order to run May 4.

A winner by nine lengths in a Feb. 2 maiden race over a sloppy track at Santa Anita Park, Omaha Beach used his early speed to gain a narrow lead under Hall of Fame jockey Mike Smith as the field hit the backstretch in the Arkansas Derby, and led by a half-length after a half-mile in :47.50.

Impossible made a five-wide move on the backstretch to take aim at Omaha Beach, and after six furlongs in 1:12.46, he drew within a length of the leader with three furlongs to go. But when challenged, the 8-5 favorite (\$5.40) dug down, just as he did in the Rebel to stave off Game Winner. He kept Impossible at bay through the stretch to cross the wire clear by a length in 1:49.91 for the 1 1/8 miles.

Impossible, the 9-5 second choice owned by

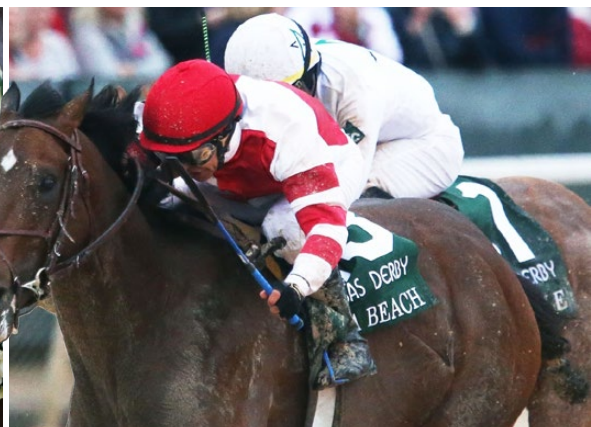
WinStar Farm, China Horse Club, and Starlight Racing, was 5 3/4 lengths ahead of Country House, who in turn had a length on Laughing Fox to grab third and squeeze into the Kentucky Derby field.

The result leaves Smith with a nice dilemma as he also rides Baffert's Santa Anita Derby (G1) winner Roadster.

"It's a lovely decision to have. We're going to go back and see how everyone comes back and go from there," Smith said. "(We'll) evaluate the situation. Then my agent will make the decision. That's why I pay him."

Bred in Kentucky by the Charming Syndicate out of the Seeking the Gold mare Charming, Omaha Beach was a \$625,000 RNA at the 2017 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. He is the most recently registered foal out of his dam, who was bred to American Pharoah for 2019. After making his first three starts on turf, he has won three of four starts on dirt and has career earnings of \$1,121,800. **BH**

OWENDALE RALLIES TO LEXINGTON BREAKTHROUGH

Given time to mature, Rupp Racing's Owendale rallied four wide to a breakthrough victory in the \$200,000 Stonestreet Lexington Stakes (G3) April 13 at Keeneland, beating out horses hoping to collect enough points to make the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) May 4 at Churchill Downs.

"Maturity was still that thing he had to overcome, and he did it today," Ricky Giannini, assistant to trainer Brad Cox, said Saturday. "He breezes good, he gallops good, he's a smart horse, and he finally showed up on race day."

Owendale broke his maiden third time out Sept. 22 at Indiana Grand and continued to improve through allowance company. The Into Mischief colt picked up another win at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots Jan. 17 before finishing eighth in the Risen Star Stakes Presented by Lamarque Ford (G2) Feb. 16.

In the Lexington, Hawaiian Noises showed the way through fractions of :24.33 and :48.23 while Owendale, off at 12-1, was near the back of the 10-horse field under Florent Geroux. Knicks Go, the 70-1 upset winner of the Claiborne Breeders' Futurity (G1) during Keeneland's fall meet, briefly took the lead as three-quarters of a mile went in 1:12.88, but Owendale turned for home and picked off the field. He completed 1 1/16 miles in 1:44.14 over a fast track, 1 3/4 lengths in front.

"I was glad he was clear, because he's one of those horses (who) doesn't really know about splitting horses," Giannini said. "So when he got wide and clear, it was just a matter of if he was good enough."

Owendale settled far back in the Risen Star but was closer to the pace in his three prior starts. Geroux said being farther back in the Lexington was not the plan.

"It changed a lot when the gates opened," Geroux said. "He didn't break so well, (Knicks Go) went out, and (Zenden) looked at me. Things change a lot—sometimes you need to go to Plan B very quick. He ran a very good race."

The Lexington awarded Derby points on a 20-8-4-2 scale to the first four finishers. El Camino Real Derby winner and Sunland Park Derby (G3) runner-up Anothertwistafate came off the pace for second ahead of Sueno, who hit the board in three other Derby preps heading into the Lexington. Knicks Go was fourth.

Anothertwistafate now has 38 points and Sueno has 32.

Shang, Roiland, Harvey Wallbanger, Zenden, Hawaiian Noises, and Chase the Ghost completed the order of finish.

Owendale was bred in Kentucky by Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings and is the fifth foal out of the unraced Bernardini mare Aspen Light, who has three winners from five starters. John Wentworth purchased Owendale for \$200,000 from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment at the 2017 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. The Lexington win improved his record to 3-1-1 from eight starts and increased his earnings to \$187,225. **BH**

WAR OF WILL TUNES UP FOR DERBY WITH KEENELAND GATE WORK

Gary Barber's War of Will breezed five furlongs from the starting gate at Keeneland April 13, firing a :59 bullet over a fast track in preparation for the May 4 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1).

The War Front colt's move was fastest of 44 at the distance. Trained by Mark Casse, War of Will has 60 points on the Kentucky Derby leaderboard and a guaranteed place in the 20-horse starting gate.

With regular rider Tyler Gaffalione aboard, War of Will clocked splits of :22 4/5, :34 3/5, and :46 1/5 and galloped out to six furlongs in 1:11 3/5.

"He broke sharp and had running on his mind," Gaffalione said. "He did everything very easy. Mark said he wanted a good five-eighths, so I just let him do his thing. He cruised along and pulled up great and came back happy. He is really proud of himself."

"Horses sometimes get more (conditioning) from working from the gate," said David Carroll, Casse's Keeneland assistant. "He broke very sharp, worked beautifully, and the gallop out was tremendous. He cooled out really well, and we are very happy."

At Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots this year, War of Will won the Risen Star Stakes Presented by Lamarque Ford (G2) and the Lecomte Stakes (G3). On March 23, he was ninth in the Twinpires.com Louisiana Derby (G2) after losing his footing at the start. He arrived at Keeneland four days later.

Carroll said War of Will likely will have another work next week at Keeneland and a final tuneup at Churchill Downs in the days leading to the Kentucky Derby.

He is encouraged by the extra energy War of Will has displayed at Keeneland.

"He is a kind horse to be around, and in the past week he has really been on his toes and is very sharp," Carroll said. "He told us coming into (today) that he is ready for a good workout. In the paddock on his way to the track, he was very playful." **BH**

War of Will wins the Risen Star Stakes at Fair Grounds Race Course

RUSHING FALL BETTER THAN EVER IN JENNY WILEY STAKES

Rushing Fall returned with a sparkling performance April 13 in the \$350,000 Coolmore Jenny Wiley Stakes (G1T) at Keeneland, showing no signs of rust after time on the shelf.

The 4-year-old More Than Ready filly ran for the first time since her victory in Keeneland's Oct. 13 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes Presented by Lane's End (G1T) and scored her fourth stakes win at the Lexington track, where she has never been defeated.

Regular rider Javier Castellano was in the irons for trainer Chad Brown on the e Five Racing Thoroughbreds runner, who set the pace and held by a length over stablemate Rymaska.

Making her first start against older runners, Rushing Fall was sent to the lead and showed seven rivals through fractions of :23.81, :48.41, and 1:13.62 while owning a daylight advantage.

Approaching the stretch as the field began to close in, the fleet-footed bay kicked clear again, with the only threat

coming from Rymaska, who dove to the rail for a late rally. It was a half-length to Got Stormy, who completed the trifecta.

"She's come off of 90-plus-day layoffs and won phenomenal stakes races, but to come out after a long break, the next year older in a grade 1, and being tested by really good horses was phenomenal," said Bob Edwards of e Five. "She's multidimensional. I love to see that, kind of reminiscent of Ghostzapper, changing up her game a little bit. Not to say she's in that league at this point, but reminiscent of classic horses changing their game as they get older and being more mature and being able to change their running style."

Sent off as the 9-10 favorite, Rushing Fall returned \$3.80 on a \$2 ticket and ran 1 1/16 miles over the firm Keeneland turf in 1:42.77. The Jenny Wiley victory was worth \$210,000 and increased her earnings to \$1,518,000, with seven wins and a second from eight starts.

"I give all the credit to Mr. Brown, the way he's been training this horse since the layoff," Castellano said. "This filly, she's so nice—the way she broke out of the gate, the way she relaxed. I just enjoyed the ride. She (got) tired, but just a little bit. But she finished strong and did it very easy."

The Jenny Wiley victory was the third in the race for both Brown and Castellano. Brown won with Ball Dancing in 2015 and Sistercharlie last year, when Brown trainees secured a 1-2-3 finish. Castellano, who won the race on Ball Dancing and Hard Not to Like in 2014, earned his sixth stakes victory of the spring meet.

Rushing Fall's other Keeneland victories came in the 2017 JPMorgan Chase Jessamine Stakes (G3T) and last spring's Appalachian Stakes Presented by Japan Racing Association (G2T). The four stakes wins tie her with Take Charge Lady for second-most at Keeneland, behind only Wise Dan's seven stakes victories.

"She definitely loves the (Keeneland turf) course," Brown said. "Big team effort. Just a great day. So many people that played a part in her development are here today."

BOURBON RESOLUTION PROVES UNSTOPPABLE IN BEN ALI UPSET

It was a family affair in the Keeneland winner's circle for trainer Ian Wilkes April 13 as son-in-law and jockey Chris Landeros rode Bourbon Resolution home to a stunning upset victory in the \$200,000 Ben Ali Stakes (G3).

Despite being bothered at the start, favorite Flameaway got up quickly as expected to set the pace in the 1 1/8-mile test. The multiple grade 3 winner led the field through fractions of :24.36, :49.06, and 1:13.75 for six furlongs, tracked closely by Noble Commander to his outside.

Shifting into the three path on the far turn, Flameaway lost momentum at the top of the lane and drifted back, allowing Bourbon Resolution a chance to make his move on the outside.

Driving hard, Bourbon Resolution glided past his rivals in midstretch and kicked clear to cross the wire 4 1/2 lengths in front of Nun the Less in a final time of 1:38.45.

"Little change of tactics today," Landeros said. "He's a naturally fast horse. My instructions today were to use it a little bit. Let him get into gear early and keep his momentum going. Last time, I engaged them early, took him back, and they outfooted him late. We're learning a lot about him. Don't think we've seen the best yet. (On the backstretch), I thought I had a gear left, but I had a really big gear left."

Nun the Less, who was second-to-last in the 10-horse field at the half-mile mark, got up for second after running six wide in the far turn. Third Day took show honors, three-quarters of a length ahead of Just Whistle in fourth.

Sent off at odds of 18-1, Bourbon Resolution returned \$38.60, \$17.20, and \$9 on a \$2 wager.

The victory marked the first stakes score for Bourbon Lane Stable's 4-year-old son of New Year's Day, who entered Saturday's race off a third-place finish in the March 9 Challenger Stakes at Tampa Bay Downs. It also marked the first stakes win for Wilkes' new grandson Rory, who, at just shy of a month old, remained firmly asleep in his mother Shelby's arms despite the cheers of excitement from his family.

"He's developed a lot—he's bigger, stronger," Wilkes said of Bourbon Resolution. "We were forced to give him some time, and now he's a more mature horse. He's only getting better, and I finally figured him out. He's got a high cruising speed. I was probably a detriment to him trying to rate him. Today, I just told Chris, 'Let him run. Let him find his way.'"

Bred in Kentucky by Gary and Mary West Stables, Bourbon Resolution is only the second foal out of the Vindication mare Vindicated Ghost. With no reported foals born the past three years, Vindicated Ghost was bred to American Freedom in 2019.

Bourbon Resolution's connections celebrate at Keeneland

MITOLE RECORDS FIRST GRADED STAKES WIN IN COUNT FLEET

The graded stakes debut of William and Corrine Heiligbrodt's brilliant sprinter Mitole turned out to be a splashing success as the 4-year-old son of Esken-dereya fended off an early challenge from the grade 1-winning Whitmore and drew clear in the stretch to post a 2 3/4-length victory in the \$500,000 Count Fleet Sprint Handicap (G3) April 13 at Oaklawn Park.

In a field of just five racing over a sloppy (sealed) racetrack, Whitmore had to forgo his late-running style and pressed the frontrunning Mitole from the break. The 6-year-old gelding drew alongside Mitole midway on the turn, but in the stretch, after comfortable fractions of 22:49 and 45.54, Mitole had little trouble kicking clear and registering his fifth straight win for trainer Steve Asmussen.

"It's a very significant win. It's his first graded stakes win. He has an elite level of talent, and hopefully he holds together and he has many wins ahead of him," Asmussen said.

Getting Mitole to the races figures to be the major challenge facing Asmussen because the Kentucky-bred colt has the kind of speed that puts him among the division's best sprinters. Mitole has won his last five starts by a combined 29 1/4 lengths. Saturday's race was just his second start since May 19.

Jockey Ricardo Santana Jr. has been the regular rider for both Mitole (\$2.80) and Whitmore, a \$2.57 million earner, and clearly made the right choice in siding with the 2-5 favorite.

"We feel he has a lot of talent, and today he improved a lot," Santana said.

Final time for the six furlongs was 1:09.36. Mitole won for the fifth time in seven starts at Oaklawn Park and improved his career record to six wins in nine starts, with earnings of \$701,510.

Whitmore, the 8-5 second choice owned by Southern Springs Stables, Robert LaPenta, and Head of Plains Partners, was seven lengths clear of Bourbon Cowboy in third. Operation Stevie was fourth.

The Mitole-Whitmore exacta returned \$3.60 for a \$2 bet.

"Today was their day," said Ron Moquett, who trains and owns a share of Whitmore. "The short field, lone speed, that's not (Whitmore's) deal. Twenty-two

QUIP TAKES OAKLAWN HANDICAP BY A NECK

A year and a month since the day he claimed his first graded win in the Lambholm South Tampa Derby (G2) at Tampa Bay Downs, Quip finally found his way back to the winner's circle to take the \$750,000 Oaklawn Handicap (G2) April 13 at Oaklawn Park.

Pioneer Spirit was asked for early speed from the gate by jockey Luis Saez and took the lead just off the rail in the two path, tracked by Remembering Rita and Chris and Dave through the half-mile in :47.96. Quip stalked the pace from fourth, three wide on the backstretch, before moving up to make a bid as they approached the far turn.

Still ahead by a half-length as six furlongs went in 1:11.99, Pioneer Spirit fought to hold off the closers as Quip, guided by Jose Ortiz, edged him by a head at the sixteenth pole. Giant Expectations tried to run down Quip with a five-wide rally on the outside, but was easily passed even farther outside by grade 3 winner Lone Sailor, who got up on even terms with Quip in deep stretch but missed by a neck at the wire.

"We were expecting to be close," said trainer Rodolphe Brisset. "He looked like on the backside, the horse was not really taking us anywhere, but he was keeping position. He had to make an early move and was very wide on the turn, but the horse ran his usual race. He's been taking us on a fun ride. It's very sweet. This horse is special."

Pioneer Spirit was a neck back in third. Remembering Rita, Giant Expectations, Rated R Superstar, Tenfold, Lookin At Lee, and Chris and Dave completed the order of finish. Final time for the 1 1/8-mile race was 1:50.21 over a sloppy (sealed) track.

"He broke really clean," Ortiz said. "He put in a good position early, but I had to fight with Joel Rosario (on Giant Expectations) to keep I got a lucky I had the horse. Last time, they went really fast off the layoff. Quip was very game and never let them by him."

Campaigned by WinStar Farm, China Horse Club, and SF Racing, Quip won his first two starts at 2 for Brisset before stepping up to graded company in the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (G2) at Churchill Downs, where he finished seventh.

Back for his sophomore campaign, the son of Distorted Humor took the Tampa Derby by a length and set himself on the trail for the 2018 Road to the Kentucky Derby. He finished second one start later in the April 14 Arkansas Derby (G1), but bypassed the first leg of the Triple Crown for the May 19 Preakness Stakes (G1) at Pimlico Race Course, where he finished off the board.

On the bench for nine months, Quip finally returned to the track to make his first start of 2019 in the Feb. 23 Hal's Hope Stakes (G3) at Gulfstream Park, where he finished third. He now has a 4-1-1 record from eight starts, with earnings of \$942,500.

Quip was bred in Kentucky by WinStar Farm out of the Indian Charlie mare Princess Ash. The mare has a 3-year-old Speightstown filly named Solstice, a 2-year-old Distorted Humor filly, and a yearling Constitution filly. She was bred to Pioneer of the Nile in 2019. **BH**

MONARCH OF EGYPT SCORES FOR AMERICAN PHAROAH AT NAAS

Monarch of Egypt—the first runner for U.S. Triple Crown hero and freshman sire American Pharoah—made a winning debut in the Irish Stallion Farms EBF Race at Naas April 13, promptly dispelling any doubts that the sire's progeny would not act on turf.

Monarch of Egypt is trained by Aidan O'Brien for Peter Brant's White Birch Farm and the Coolmore partners, for whom he was a \$750,000 Keeneland September Yearling Sale purchase, and he made most of the running under Ryan Moore before drawing clear impressively to win by almost three lengths.

Monarch of Egypt was bred in Kentucky by Ran Jan Racing, which enjoyed extraordinary success as a breeder in Europe last year with Cartier Horse of the Year Roaring Lion.

American Pharoah, a son of the late Pioneer of the Nile, may have done most of his racing on dirt, but Monarch of Egypt's female side of his pedigree is packed full of talented turf runners.

He is the third foal out of Up, a daughter of Galileo and the Spectrum mare Halland Park Lass. Up was added to the Ran Jan Racing broodmare band when bought with Jan Vandebos for \$2.2 million at the 2015 Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale.

At 3, the dam won the Irresistible Jewel Blandford Stakes (G2) and finished second to Beauty Parlour in the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French One Thousand Guineas, G1).

That evidence hints toward Monarch of Egypt progressing with age, although it is not difficult to see where he gets his precocity.

As a juvenile, American Pharoah won the Del Mar Futurity (G1) at Del Mar over the all-weather synthetic surface and the FrontRunner Stakes (G1) at Santa Anita Park on dirt. Up is a half sister to Darley Prix Morny (G1) victor Dutch Art.

Betfair introduced Monarch of Egypt at 14-1 for the Coventry Stakes (G2) at Royal Ascot.

O'Brien said after the race: "That was lovely. He's a straightforward and honest horse who has been showing us plenty on the gallops at home. Ryan (Moore) said he would have no problem getting six or seven furlongs.

"This was his first time away, so you'd imagine there will be plenty of improvement. He's still babyish and he was green when he got there. He's uncomplicated. He has a lovely mind. He would have to run again before Ascot."

Monarch of Egypt holds an early entry in next year's Investec Derby (G1), run over the same 1 1/2-mile trip as the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1), which American Pharoah won to become the first horse in 37 years to complete the U.S. Triple Crown in 2015.

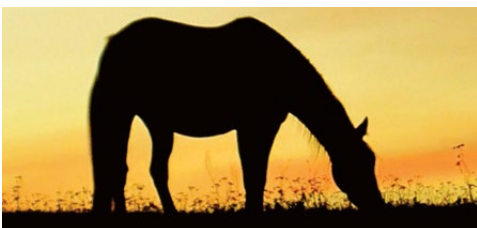

ONE FOR ROAD: WINX GOES OUT WITH 33RD STRAIGHT WIN

It was a perfect day and she was the perfect racehorse, but now her job is done.

On an afternoon of near unprecedented expectation, adoration, and emotion, the racing wonder that is Winx left the stage in style, bidding goodbye to her fans with one last virtuoso performance.

There are questions that can never be answered, truths we can never know, such as where Winx ranks in the all-time pantheon of great horses.

What can be said for certain is when she was first to cross the finish line of the Longines Queen Elizabeth Stakes (G1), Winx put the seal on a uniquely glorious career, one that has made her a true icon of Australian sport.

Each and every one of those present at Sydney's

Royal Randwick racecourse would testify to that. Tears flowed freely from those who have been at her side for so long as they realized that after four years of invincibility, the final line of the final chapter had been written.

Asked what had been his first reaction when the race was won, trainer Chris Waller said: "Relief. Given the global exposure, it would have been terrible to see her getting beaten. But whether she won or hadn't won, she would still have been this great horse who has touched our lives."

For so long now, a constant in those lives has been the daughter of Street Cry. Many thought she would stop after capturing a record fourth Ladbrokes Cox Plate (G1) in October. Instead, her connections allowed her a farewell tour that ended on an unforgettable sun-blessed afternoon made brighter still by Winx entering retirement with her 33rd consecutive success.

It is a barely believable achievement made all the more extraordinary by the fact that 25 of those victories have come at the highest level. Quite exquisitely, that 25th top-flight triumph gave Waller his own 100th group 1 win.

It was the result a nation had been desperate to see, including prime minister Scott Morrison, who broke off from a general election campaign to be one of the 43,833 racegoers who left Randwick sold out.

Ninety minutes before the Queen Elizabeth, hundreds of those racegoers were packed deep around a rail in the racecourse stables, all of them hungry to get a glimpse of Winx in box 114.

When it was time to work, Winx came out of box nine. She began from a wide berth and was still four horses off the fence turning for home. Once in sight of the winning line, she knuckled down in characteristically determined fashion, coming clear of Japanese challenger Kluger to rapturous applause and cheers. Old foes Hartnell and Happy Clapper took third and fourth.

Those who might pointlessly seek to dismiss Winx's huge talent should consider the words of Kluger's world-class rider, Tommy Berry. "I've got no words, really," he said. "You just don't have a horse sprint like he did then and get beat."

He was beaten because since May 2015, Winx has allowed nothing to beat her. All those who tried were dismissed by a mare who has been a blessing to a sport in Australia that has been repeatedly battered by scandal. On so many levels, Winx has been a force only for good.

"It's going to be nice to have my life back," said jockey Hugh Bowman, who talked at length with

dignity, observing that during Winx's period of dominance, he had lost friends to cancer and shared with wife Christine the trauma of her brother last year taking his own life. Relative to all that, the pressure of riding the world's most famous racehorse was much more a privilege than a curse.

"We came here as confident as we have ever been," said Bowman. "What a journey it has been. I can't believe this is the end."

Yet this is the end, and Waller was therefore keen to pay tribute to all those who made the journey possible.

"My team has done an amazing job, and it's rare they get the accolades they deserve," he said, before insisting he had not allowed himself to dream of this moment. "I didn't think about it," he said, his voice quivering. "I thought about everything except winning. It's as simple as that. You don't set yourself up for these big wins. You just do your job."

He has done that job superbly, as was made clear by the owners of Winx, now the highest-earning horse of all time with a haul of more than \$19.7 million (U.S.)

"Winx is the most amazing, supreme athlete I've ever seen, handled by the best coach," said Debbie Kepitis, while Peter Tighe broke down when expressing gratitude to racing fans in Australia and beyond. "We love her to bits," he said. "I want to say a big thank you to everyone right around the world. It has been a great journey, and I'm glad everyone has enjoyed it as much as we have."

That journey is now over. As Bowman rode Winx back up the track to be acclaimed by the crowd, Tina Turner's "Simply The Best" played out across Royal Randwick, and a plane painted the word "immortal" in the sky.

Immortal, invincible, and utterly incredible. Motherhood beckons, but from the racecourse, Winx is now gone. She will never be forgotten. **BH**

Another Broad, Forever Liesl, and My Miss Lilly all came up to challenge the leader, with Another Broad and jockey Manny Franco splitting horses and getting up by 1 1/4 lengths. The final time was 1:52.99 over a muddy track.

"She shipped up here from Palm Beach Downs on Wednesday in good form," said Byron Hughes, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher. "We galloped her at Belmont for a couple of days, and she was ready to run. We wanted her to get into a nice rhythm, and Manny was very patient with her. Coming around the second turn, he found a good spot and he was able to split horses and get up. That was nice."

Forever Liesl, My Miss Lilly, Frostie Anne, Midnight Disguise, and Jump Ruler completed the order of finish.

"The pace was hot and I knew that, so I just tried to give my filly a chance and wait as long as I could," Franco said. "She was there for me when I asked her. By the three-eighths pole, I kind of followed Joe Bravo (aboard Miss Lilly). In the stretch, I stayed to the inside and waited for a hole to open. When it did, she was there for me."

Another Broad was bred in Maryland by Fitzugh, which campaigned her at Laurel Park with trainer Michael Trombetta in 2018. The 4-year-old daughter of Include was second in the Geisha Stakes Nov. 24

before moving to Pletcher's barn. She was fourth on debut this year in the Royal Delta Stakes (G3) Feb. 16 at Gulfstream Park.

Another Broad is out of the Deputy Minister mare Dynamic Deputy, who won the Shine Again Stakes at Pimlico Race Course and was second in the Delaware Handicap (G2). She has produced five winners from seven starters, including three-time stakes winner Dynamic Strike. Another Broad now holds a 4-2-0 record from nine starts and has earned \$222,095.

Earlier on the card, Isabelle de Tomaso's homebred Regally Irish, from the family of multiple grade 2 winner Irish War Cry, nipped frontrunning Skole to win the \$100,000 Bridgetown Stakes. The Bridgetown was the first stakes win for the New Jersey-bred Regal Ransom colt, who completed the six furlongs over yielding turf for 3-year-olds in 1:10.28.

Skole set fractions of :22.39 and :45.32 through the first half-mile while Regally Irish, trained by Graham Motion, was fourth of five in the field. There appeared to be no challengers for Skole as the field turned into the stretch, but jockey Rajiv Maragh unleashed Regally Irish, the 8-5 favorite, and was up to win by a neck on the outside.

"I think he can go on for more distance as well," Maragh said. "He's a pretty versatile horse. He can go to the lead or come from behind and go different distances. (Motion) said this horse is pretty straightforward. This horse is pretty adaptable, so we

didn't have to commit to any specific thing. The horse always put himself in a good spot."

Skole, Mount Travers, Skychief, and Wonder Stone completed the order of finish.

Prior to Saturday's race, Regally Irish was third in the Dec. 15 Inaugural Stakes and then won a Jan. 11 optional-claiming allowance event, both at Tampa Bay Downs. The Bridgetown improved his record to 3-1-1 in seven starts and his earnings to \$110,945.

"That was good. He ran well down at Tampa," Motion's assistant Adrian Rolls said. "We weren't sure it would be on the grass because of the rain, so it was nice that they kept it on. When he got running, Rajiv said he really sprinted away from them. He appeared to be happy with him. We'll have to see how he comes out of this race (before deciding on a next start)."

Regally Irish is the first of three foals out of the Even the Score mare Irish Score. His second dam, Irish Sovereign, produced Irish War Cry—another homebred for Tomaso trained by Motion—who won the Lambholm South Holy Bull Stakes (G2) and the Wood Memorial Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G2) on the 2017 Road to the Kentucky Derby. **BH**

We closely followed La Verdad's career as a racehorse as she is by Yes It's True, who stood at Three Chimneys. The mare was an exceptional racehorse who is passing on her good looks to her progeny."

"La Verdad's Curlin filly is an outstanding physical at this stage, very strong with great angles, like her mother," said bloodstock agent Ben McElroy of McElroy Equine. "This is obviously a cross that has worked well with graded stakes fillies Terra Promessa

and Valadorna. I'm sure this filly will make the cross look even better."

"We are extremely pleased with the foal and the care she is receiving at Darley. Several prominent horsemen, including Ben, have told me that she is a standout," Rosenblum said. "La Verdad holds a special place in my heart. I am looking to provide every opportunity to have her become as influential a producer as she was a racemare, having bred her to Medaglia d'Oro, Tapit, and Curlin."

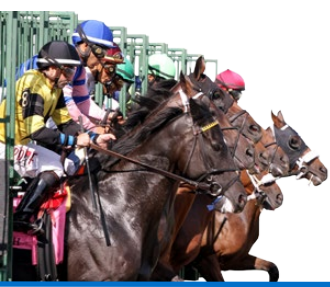

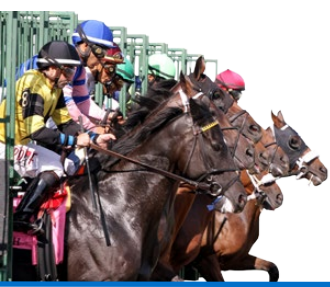
