

Tf the \$2 million TVG Breeders' Cup Juve-**⊥** nile (G1) is any indication of what awaits racing fans on the 2020 Triple Crown trail, then get some popcorn and buckle your seat belt. There's a wild, unpredictable trip ahead of us.

On paper, anyway, the 36th edition of the Juvenile looked like a rather formful way to decide the 2-year-old championship.

The three betting favorites—Dennis' Moment (4-5), Eight Rings (3-2), and Scabbard (5-1)—seemed to tower over the other five starters, none of whom were less than 23-1 on the toteboard at Santa Anita Park.

But one stride out of the starting gate, all of that changed, and it was a horse who was first purchased for \$5,000 that galloped off with the coveted seven-figure payday Nov. 1.

Albaugh Family Stables' Dennis' Moment stumbled at the break. He was a clear last in the field of eight passing the finish line the first time around and showed jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. little interest in playing catch-up.

"I think he tried to break too fast, and he stumbled," Ortiz said.

Then, passing the quarter pole, grade 1 winner Eight Rings—named for New England Patriots coach Bill Belichick, who won six Super Bowls with the Pats and two as an assistant coach with the New York Giantsbegan running like he was named for Belichick's forgettable tenure with the Cleveland Browns and dropped out of contention.

As for Joseph Sutton's Scabbard, who was second to Dennis' Moment in the Iroquois Stakes (G3) in

> September, he never fired and could come no closer to the lead than fifth until the final yards, when he moved into fourth.

And with that, opportunity knocked and Storm the Court answered.

Sent off at odds of 45-1 with jockey Flavien Prat after finishing third—8 1/4 lengths behind Eight Rings—in the American Pharoah Stakes (G1) at Santa Anita, Storm the Court (\$93.80) responded favorably to the addition of blinkers, taking the lead at the start and outdueling 28-1 shot Anneau d'Or in the stretch to take the Juvenile by a neck on "Future Stars Friday" before a crowd of 41,243.

"I don't know what to say other than I'm just so proud of this little horse," trainer Peter Eurton said. "He just never stops trying. When he was on the lead like he was in his original first race, he had three horses tackle him that day. And so I knew he was going to fight, but I just didn't know if there was going to be something so strong he couldn't fight back. But it's just his heart. He's an amazing little horse. And he's not that little anymore, actually. He's grown a bit since we bought him, obviously, a good two, three inches. But this feels pretty good."

The second-longest price on the toteboard, Storm the Court was originally bought by Bryan Rice for just \$5,000 from the Stepping Stone Farm consignment at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Mixed Sale. He was then part of the Woodside Ranch consignment at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training, and his \$60,000 purchase price has become a tremendous bargain for owners Exline-Border Racing, which partnered with David Bernsen, Susanna Wilson, and Dan Hudock.

"We were looking at another one, which we bought also, but it was really a back-ring buy. And for \$60,000, we felt we had a good mover and a good athlete. Wasn't a ton of pedigree on the page, but we got a horse that we felt had some talent," Ryan Exline said.

For Storm the Court's breeder, there was supreme satisfaction in seeing the colt shine on the famed stage of the World Championships.

"This horse is a fourth generation," said Jim Power of Stepping Stone Farm, which bred the son of Court Vision in Kentucky out of the Tejano Run mare My Tejana Storm. "I raised his mother, and I had her mother, and I had her mother. And I just was happy this horse got a chance to run his race today. I can't say enough for the small breeders. It doesn't take a million-dollar horse to win a race."

It did, however, take a \$12,000 late nomination fee to make Storm the Court eligible for Friday's race, but after collecting a \$1.1 million share of the Juvenile purse, Exline considered it a very wise outlay.

"It's the best \$12,000 we've ever spent," he said.
"It was a blessing."

Needless to say, the result created some chaos for Eclipse Award voters as 39-1 shot Wrecking Crew was third, while Scabbard was fourth, Eight Rings sixth, and Dennis' Moment eighth.

In 2016, Exline-Border Racing was part of the group that owned Champagne Room, who won the 14 Hands Winery Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) for Eurton at 33-1 odds and was eventually named champion 2-year-old filly. Could lightning strike twice for them? Exline said he'll leave that up to the voters to make the call.

"I will let the writers, you all, decide who wins those awards or let the voters decide that," Exline said. "We won one with Champagne Room, which was incredible. We'll have to see what's next for him—if we run again this year or wait and start his 3-year-old campaign. But he deserves to have his name mentioned (for the 2-year-old championship), and we're excited about that, and we'll see how it comes out."

The surprising outcome could wind up benefiting Sakatoga Stables' Tiz the Law, who won the Champagne Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park but skipped the Breeders' Cup in deference to running in the Nov. 30 Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (G2) at Churchill Downs.

As for future plans for Storm the Court, Eurton was uncertain but said after running the 2-year-old four times since his Aug. 10 debut victory at Del Mar, the colt would likely be given some richly deserved time off.

"I haven't given it any thought," Eurton said about Storm the Court's next start. "We'll see how he comes out of this race today and go from there. We're so proud of him, and he really deserves this moment in the spotlight. So we're very happy."

Whenever and wherever he starts his 3-year-old campaign, he will have a nice head start toward the first Saturday in May at Churchill Downs as he received 20 points for winning the Juvenile in the Road to the Kentucky Derby point series. He has 22 overall.

It was Prat's idea to put blinkers on Storm the Court, which proved to be a wise suggestion by the jockey who won another well-known grade 1 stakes at long odds this year. He was aboard Country House, who was declared the winner of the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) via disqualification at 65-1 odds.

"I thought last time he ran a little green," Prat said. "He broke well, and then he was kind of looking around. On the back side, he kind of lost his focus and kind of dropped back. So I thought the blinkers might help him."

The change of equipment, combined with Storm the Court's stamina, helped convince Eurton his colt could spring an upset in the Juvenile.

"The fact he was so far back and then he fought down the lane, and we didn't see the speed, so we were just hoping we would put it all together. And, sure enough, (Dennis' Moment) broke horrible, and that allowed us to take the lead. And I think they didn't really take him serious down the back side, so he got kind of his own way there," Eurton said.

Aside from the American Pharoah, Storm the Court won his debut by 1 1/2 lengths. In his next start, the Runhappy Del Mar Futurity (G1), he was bumped, dumping Prat in the early stages of the race. Eight Rings veered to the rail in that race and also lost his rider, Drayden Van Dyke.

With the blinkers, Storm the Court was able to lead in the early stages for the first time Friday, though he also received some help in that regard when Dennis' Moment, breaking from the rail, stumbled and trailed the field.

Ortiz tried to coax Dennis' Moment back into the race, but on a surface that was kind to speed, the son of Tiznow faced a nearly impossible task.

"I just concentrated on the horse and tried to do the best for him and see how he would react. When he didn't make up any ground getting to the quarter pole, I said just let me take care of him," Ortiz said. "It's tough to get beat like that. You want to see him in a fair race. He felt OK coming back."

For trainer Dale Romans and the Albaugh team, it was a bitter turn of events seeing the odds-on favorite's chances evaporate seconds after the gates opened.

"It was over. We had no chance from the start," said Jason Loutsch, racing manager for Albaugh Family Stables. "Dale just about took off out of the box when it started. We talk all the time about highs and lows of the game. I can tell you this is about as low as I've ever been in a horse race. But we have a lot of confidence in this horse, and I have no doubt he'll bounce back. I don't even know how Irad stayed on, to be honest. He went straight down all the way. It was unfortunate circumstances, but hopefully he came back good and we'll live to fight another day."

After an opening quarter in :23.49, Storm the Court led by a length on the backstretch over the Bob Baffert-trained Eight Rings, who seemed the most likely candidate to benefit from Dennis' Moment's misfortune.

Yet after a :47.07 half-mile and six furlongs in 1:11.60, the \$520,000 Keeneland September Yearling Sale buy was out of gas by the quarter pole.

"I was where I wanted to be. We had a nice position going to the first turn. I was where I wanted to be," jockey John Velazquez said. "I got to the second turn, and he didn't have anything."

Eight Rings finished 12 1/2 lengths behind Storm the Court, a turnaround of 20 3/4 lengths from the American Pharoah that left Baffert searching for answers and accepting the blame.

"I always blame myself. Maybe I missed something, but I thought he was ready. Everything was going great until the real race started. He didn't show up. The winner ran a great race," said Baffert, who trains the son of Empire Maker for a consortium of SF Racing, Starlight Racing, Madaket Stables, Fred Hertrich III, John Fielding, Golconda Stables, and Coolmore Stud. "He didn't show up. That's not like him. I thought he was training really well, but for some reason he just didn't show up today."

Once the bell tolled for Eight Rings, the race boiled down to a battle between Storm the Court and Peter Redekop's Anneau d'Or, a son of Medaglia d'Oro out of the Tapit mare Walk Close who was making his first start on dirt. A winner on turf in his previous start Sept. 29 at Golden Gate Fields, Anneau d'Or made a strong three-wide move and seemed poised to blow past Storm the Court but found a stubborn rival that would not surrender the lead.

"I thought he'd go by," said Juan Hernandez, who rode the 2-year-old for trainer Blaine Wright. "I was excited. I was pushing him real hard. It was the race of my life. I had to ride with all my heart. We just missed it today."

Storm the Court covered the 1 1/16 miles in 1:44.93 and combined with Anneau d'Or, who picked up eight points toward a start in the Kentucky Derby, for a \$2 exacta that paid \$976.40.

It also fueled some dreams about something that seemed so unlikely just a few days ago but just might bloom like a rose when May rolls around.

"Well, this horse obviously looks like he can handle two turns. The Kentucky Derby, the way it's structured now with the point system, we have 22 points. I mean, you really have to gauge a (prep) race, you have to go hunt for the points, something Bob Baffert does better than anybody else," Bernsen said. "I had a horse last year, Signalman, we had (38) points and didn't make the Derby. So I think Pete Eurton's got to come up with a plan (to get us there)."

BREEDERS' CUP REPORTS RECORD FIRST DAY HANDLE

ll-sources handle for the 10-race program the first Aday of the 36th Breeders' Cup World Championships at Santa Anita Park Nov. 1 reached \$56,517,228, a record for Breeders' Cup Friday and a 5.4% increase over last year's 10-race Breeders' Cup "Future Stars Friday" card at Churchill Downs.

The Future Stars Friday card featured five Breeders' Cup races for 2-year-olds, the second consecutive year of grouping all of the juvenile races on the same day since the event expanded to its current two-day format in 2007. The day kicked off with the Marathon Stakes Presented by Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance (G2), the only other graded stakes on the card.

Friday's attendance was 41,243, similar to last year's

AMERICAN PHAROAH LOCKS UP FRESHMAN SIRE TITLE

The "Future Stars Friday" edition of the Breeders' Cup World Championships Nov. 1 likely made Ashford Stud's American Pharoah a lock to be the leading freshman sire for North America.

The title will come with an additionally important designation as sire of a Breeders' Cup winner.

The American Triple Crown winner of 2015 and son of the late Pioneerof the Nile got his biggest win right from the start with his son Four Wheel Drive taking the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint (G2T) by three-quarters of a length as the favorite. Four Wheel Drive maintained his undefeated record, including two graded stakes wins for owner Breeze Easy and trainer Wesley Ward.

The Juvenile Turf Sprint was particularly lucrative for American Pharoah because he was also represented by third-place finisher Another Miracle, a colt owned by Leonard Green and Jonathan Green and trained by



American Pharoah at Ashford Stud

Gary Contessa.

American Pharoah picked up third-place money again when Robert and Lawana Low's Sweet Melania finished behind Sharing and Daahyeh in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T).

The Breeders' Cup results dovetailed with the arc of American Pharoah's first year of runners. Of his 20 winners to date, 13 excelled on the turf, and all his black-type winners throughout the year have won on the grass.


American Pharoah gained \$730,000 in earnings from the Breeders' Cup races alone, which was largely responsible for boosting his progeny earnings for the year to \$2,362,329 by day's end. Spendthrift Farm's Cross Traffic ended 2018 at the top of the freshman sires standings with more than \$2.11 million, with a boost coming from his daughter Jaywalk's win the Tito's Handmade Vodka Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1).

Another freshman sire to get a big boost Nov. 1 was Three Chimneys Farm's Palace Malice, who was represented by Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Presented by Coolmore America (G1T) winner Structor. Jeff Drown and Don Rachel's juvenile colt earned \$550,000 for his effort, which will likely push Palace Malice to the third spot on the leading freshman sires list.

The other sires represented by Friday card winners include Diamond B Farm's Flashback, who was represented by Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) winner British Idiom; WinStar Farm's Speightstown, who sired Juvenile Fillies Turf winner Sharing; and Court Vision, who sired TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) 45-1 longshot winner Storm the Court. Court Vision delivered his own upset when he won the 2011 TVG Breeders' Cup Mile (G1T) at 64-1.

WinStar's internationally renowned shuttler, More Than Ready has four Breeders' Cup entrants this year, and three of them ran Friday. He was not represented as a sire by a Breeders' Cup winner, but he distinguished himself as the broodmare sire of winners Four Wheel Drive and Structor. More Than Ready has one entered on the Saturday card in multiple grade 1 winner Uni, who is in the Mile. BH

BARGAIN BUY BRITISH IDIOM WINS BC JUVENILE FILLIES

\$40,000 filly with an unflappable nature and remarkable talent won the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) Nov. 1 at Santa Anita Park.

British Idiom—a 2-year-old daughter of Flashback trained by Brad Cox—laid it all on the line in a thrilling stretch duel with 2-1 favorite Donna Veloce and emerged victorious by a neck in the shadow of the wire.

It was her quiet presence
and composure that first drew
bloodstock agent Liz Crow of BSW Bloodstock to
British Idiom at The October Sale, Fasig-Tipton's
Kentucky yearling sale, where she was shopping
for partners Michael Dubb, The Elkstone Group,
Madaket Stables, and Bethlehem Stables.

"Mentality—that was what really sold me on her," Crow said. "Every time I saw her at the barn, she was just so chill, so relaxed, and very professional. I like to watch them in the back ring before they go in to sell, and she couldn't have been any more blasé about the whole thing. I think that helps them a lot when they have to be in a paddock, when they have to ship to a place like this—when they have that mental fortitude, it really helps. She just has an unbelievable

attitude about everything."

Now 3-for-3 and coming off another top-level score in the Oct. 4 Darley Alcibiades Stakes (G1) at Keeneland, the chestnut filly rated just off the pace for much of the 1 1/16-mile test under Javier Castellano.

Longshot Two Sixty showed the way through opening fractions of :22.71 and :46.02 but relinquished command soon after to Bast, who went three-quarters in 1:11.93. A hard-driving Donna Veloce took the lead off the turn

for home, but British Idiom had the new leader in her sights and swung wide to lay down a determined challenge through a 1:39.65 mile. The final time was 1:47.07 on a track rated fast.

British Idiom returned \$7.40 on a \$2 win ticket. Donna Veloce held for second, followed by Bast in third.

"She had to fight to get by (Donna Veloce)," Cox said of the finish. "I'm very proud of her. She's 3-for-3, she's done nothing wrong, and she's taken her show on the road every time. She's a tremendous filly."

It was the second Breeders' Cup win for the trainer, who took the 2018 Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) with Monomoy Girl. British Idiom's similarities to the champion 3-year-old filly of 2018 were also what drew both Cox and Crow to the daughter of Flashback.

"She's got a very good mind and knows when to turn it on and off," Cox said. "Monomoy Girl is just like that."

Bred in Kentucky by Hargus Sexton, Sandra Sexton, and Silver Fern Farm out of the Mr. Sekiguchi mare Rose and Shine, British Idiom improved her earnings to \$1,381,250. Her sire stood

STRUCTOR DELIVERS FOR BROWN IN BC JUVENILE TURF

had Brown became the winningest grass trainer in Breeders' Cup history when Structor prevailed in the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Presented by Coolmore America (G1T) Nov. 1 at Santa Anita Park on "Future Stars Friday."

The victory provided Brown, 40, with his 11th grass win in the Breeders' Cup and 13th overall—all since 2008—and his success in the turf category pushed him past Aidan O'Brien, with whom he had been tied with 10 grass wins. The win was Brown's first in the Juvenile Turf.

Structor needed to defeat a couple of O'Brien trainees, Fort Myers and Arizona, the latter the 2-1 favorite. But beat them he did, aided by a ground-saving trip under Jose Ortiz, and the horse delivered after finding racing room in the stretch, defeating 55-1 longshot Billy Batts by three-quarters of a length.

Despite Friday's grass victory and his personal accomplishment, Brown had dirt races on his mind when interviewed in the winner's circle. That could potentially make the colt a participant in next spring's prep races leading toward the Kentucky Derby

Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1).

"He trains very well on it," Brown said. "He deserves it, and he's got the right running style to potentially run on both surfaces."

Brown complimented Ortiz for the jockey's ride, noting he was able to tuck inside. Still, Ortiz wished he had been able to launch Structor's rally earlier.

"I had nowhere to go at the three-eighths pole," he said. "Once we got into the clear, he really finished strong. He's a very nice horse."

The victory improved Structor, a 2-year-old owned by Jeff Drown and Don Rachel, to 3-for-3 following victories in the Sept. 28 Pilgrim Stakes (G3T) at Belmont Park and an Aug. 31 maiden race at Saratoga Race Course. He raced a mile on firm turf Friday in 1:35.11, about a half-second slower than the 1:34.59 clocking from Sharing in winning the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T) over the same distance two races later.

The Juvenile Turf was worth \$550,000 to the winner and improved his earnings to \$709,500. He paid \$12.60 for a \$2 win wager.

Bred in Kentucky by Three Chimneys Farm, Structor is from the first crop of Three Chimneys stallion Palace Malice, winner of the 2013 Belmont Stakes (G1) and 2014 Metropolitan Handicap (G1). He is out of the More Than Ready mare Miss Always Ready.

Mike Ryan, as agent, purchased him for \$850,000 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales' March 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale from the Pick View consignment. He was a \$160,000 Keeneland September Yearling Sale purchase by Marquee Bloodstock from Gainesway, agent.

"He's just improving so much every week, this horse. We've always thought a lot of him," Brown said.

Some of Friday's other participants did not have the racing luck of the winner, notably Arizona and 3-1 second choice Decorated Invader, both of whom broke poorly. This contributed to the two horses racing near the back of the pack, more than five lengths off a modest pace set by Graceful Kitten with splits of :23.14, :47.55, and 1:11:68.


After shaking clear of backstretch traffic, Irad Ortiz Jr. on Decorated Invader and Ryan Moore on Arizona chose to launch wide rallies, but it was too little, too late. Decorated Invader settled for fourth and Arizona was fifth. Both were beaten less than two lengths.

"We're not too disappointed," O'Brien said of European invader Arizona. "He's going to be a lovely 3-year-old."

Their poor starts and traffic issues opened the door for Billy Batts and another longshot, 67-1 Gear Jockey, to pick up the largest of the secondary prizes, with Billy Batts, who took the lead from Graceful Kitten inside the eighth pole, holding second by a neck over Gear Jockey in third.

The Juvenile Turf was a rough race, one that resulted in the disqualification of Hit the Road, who crossed the wire in a dead heat for seventh, only to be demoted to last for interference with Deviant, who clipped heels on the second turn when impeded. He backed up through the pack thereafter, losing by 18 3/4 lengths. BH

Racing for Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and Gainesway Stable, the 2-yearold daughter of Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) winner Speightstown

tracked in fourth early before surging in the stretch to post a 1 1/4-length win, completing the one-mile race in 1:34.59 on firm turf.

"I was able to get the position I wanted going into the first turn, and that's what we planned, and it worked out great," Franco said.

Four-time Breeders' Cup winner Graham Motion, who also trained Shared Account, said he took some amount of risk in prepping Sharing in the nongraded Selima Stakes at Laurel Park, but he thought

it was the right fit to prepare for Friday's big test.

"We wanted to get her here in the best shape," Motion said. "We realized we ran the risk of maybe not getting in, but that was what got her here. It was the best timing, and we took the chance and it paid off."

Sharing returned \$29.60, \$10.60, and \$8.40. Fastclosing Daahyeh paid \$5.60 and \$3.80, and Sweet Melania—who tracked early, opened a clear lead in the stretch, then held for third returned \$4.60 to show.

Eclipse Thoroughbred

"She's just a really athletic, racy-looking filly," said Aron Wellman of Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners. "When we go to the sales, we're typically bargain shopping, which is a hard thing to do, especially at Saratoga. But what I like to do is find athletic fillies with big pedigrees and track them through the ring and hope that we get them within our budget.

"This filly was no bargain at \$350,000 at the time, but I thought that there was plenty of upside and a lot of inherent residual value."

Shared Account has also produced stakes winner Riley's Choice, by Distorted Humor. BH

Four Wheel Drive seized the lead early and held off Chimney Rock by three-quarters of a length to win the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint (G2T) Nov. 1 at Santa Anita Park.

Trained by Wesley Ward and ridden by Irad Ortiz Jr., the bay colt completed the five-furlong race for 2-year-olds in :55.66 on firm turf. Another Miracle finished third.

Four Wheel Drive races for Breeze Easy, a partnership headed by Mike Hall and Sam Ross. They've had tremendous success with juveniles of late, winning last year's Norfolk Stakes (G2) at Royal Ascot with Shang Shang Shang. Their latest top-level winner is a son of Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) and Triple Crown winner American Pharoah. Heading into the day, the Ashford Stud stallion ranked as the top first-crop sire by progeny earnings. Four Wheel Drive's score, along with Another Miracle's finish, will pad American Pharoah's lead.

"We got it. It's great for the owners, fantastic for Coolmore (Ashford Stud), fantastic for everyone that put a lot of money behind American Pharoah," Ward said. "There is a lot riding on him as far as how his progeny will turn out. For this horse to turn out to be a Breeders' Cup winner is sensational. (Four Wheel Drive) is a real cool dude. He takes it all in. He popped right out like a real professional horse will, and he kind of settled. When (Ortiz) called upon him, away he went."

Four Wheel Drive broke sharpest of 12 runners from post 9 and was joined by Chimney Rock, who broke from the rail, and Band Practice. The opening quartermile went in :21.55. As the field ran through the bend, getting a half in :44.03, Four Wheel Drive separated himself from Chimney Rock, with a host of others chasing without cutting into his lead.

"He broke good and put me on the lead," Ortiz said.
"He was relaxed, and turning for home when I asked him, he responded. He ran really well. He's a nice horse."

Four Wheel Drive ran the final furlong in :11.63. After Chimney Rock, it was 1 1/2 lengths back to the closing Another Miracle. Kimari, the 5-2 second choice, rallied for fourth.

The winner paid \$5, \$3.40, and \$3. Chimney Rock returned \$8.20 and \$5.40, and Another Miracle paid \$7.80 to show.

Trainer Gary Contessa was pleased with Another Miracle's third-place effort after the colt ran into traffic trouble.



Four Wheel Drive is out of the stakeswinning More Than Ready mare Funfair. At 2, Funfair won the five-furlong Colleen Stakes at Monmouth Park for breeder Dr. Catherine Wills and trainer Christophe Clement. Funfair is out of the Distant View mare Fleuron, a half sister to Flagrant, the dam of Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) winner Furthest Land.

Funfair was bred back to American Pharoah for 2020.

Stud, was entered into the 2017 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale but was an out for Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency. Randy Hartley and Dean DeRenzo paid \$525,000 for him last year from the Paramount Sales consignment at The Saratoga

> Sale, Fasig-Tipton's select yearling sale. Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds ran him through The Gulfstream Sale in March, and he was an \$825,000 RNA. Hartley/ DeRenzo did sell Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) morning-line favorite and runner-up Donna Veloce for \$800,000 at the same sale.

Four Wheel Drive's half sister Monthly, by Malibu Moon, is cataloged as a racing or broodmare prospect in the Keeneland November sale.

Four Wheel Drive entered the Breeders' Cup off two starts: a 3 1/4-length debut win in the Aug. 31 Rosie's Stakes going 5 1/2 furlongs on the turf at Colonial Downs and a three-length tour de force Oct. 6 in the six-furlong Futurity Stakes (G3T) at Belmont Park under Ortiz. BH

'PLAN B' HORSES REAP REWARDS FOR BREEDERS

ometimes Plan B trumps Plan A, at least when it comes to Thoroughbred auctions.

The connections of some entries in this year's Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) and Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) were unable to find willing buyers at the desired price and, out of necessity, added them to their racing stables.

Plan B has been quite successful for many, including owner/breeder William S. Farish, whose Code of Honor is in the Classic, a 4-1 morning-line second choice along with Vino Rosso.

Code of Honor races for his Kentucky breeder only because the colt from the first crop of Lane's End stallion Noble Mission out of Farish's homebred grade 3 winner Reunited was bought back at the 2017 Keeneland September Yearling Sale on a final bid of \$70,000, which was short of the reserve price.

"A lot of times when we have a colt like that, it's

because we didn't get (the price) we wanted as a yearling and decided to race him," said Bill Farish after the colt won the Xpressbet Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) in March. "He was a colt Dad was really high on and liked physically, so he was more than happy to keep him and race him."

As a son of Coolmore's top international stallion Galileo and a full brother to the top runner and

> emerging European sire Frankel, Noble Mission won three group 1 races on the grass in Europe, leading to the belief his runners would be predisposed to turf racing.

"Sometimes those European turf families benefit from a dose of American speed and that is certainly the case with Code of Honor's pedigree," Farish said of the colt who has now earned more than \$2.29 million, with top-level victories in the Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1) and Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1), the latter via a disqualification of Vino Rosso. Code of Honor is trained by Shug McGaughey.

Another 2017 Keeneland September buyback for Lane's End was War of Will, who went unsold on a final bid of \$175,000 but was subsequently purchased privately by Norman Williamson, who operates Oak Tree Farm in County Meath, Ireland.

The son of War Front bred in Kentucky by the Niarchos family's Flaxman Holdings was then entered in the Arqana Breeze-Up Sale at France's Deauville Racecourse.

Fortuitously, Florida bloodstock agent Justin Casse was attending that sale for the first time, selling a small group of 2-year-olds through another agent. Although Casse had not planned to buy at the auction, War of Will's pedigree caught his attention, and he was able to acquire the colt for €250,000 (US\$298,550) on behalf of client Gary Barber.

"He breezed really well and was a very refined, athletic-looking horse with a lot of stretch," Casse said. "He is an American-bred with a worldly pedigree."

Trained by Casse's brother Mark, War of Will was grade 1-placed at 2. As a sophomore, he won the Lecomte Stakes (G3) and Risen Star Stakes Presented by Lamarque Ford (G2) on his way to capturing the Preakness Stakes (G1). He has earned more than \$1.6 million to date.

Seeking the Soul has also proved an astute buyback for breeder Charles Fipke, who entered the son of Perfect Soul in the 2015 Ocala Breeders' Sales June 2-Year-Olds and Horses of Racing Age Sale through McKathan Bros. and bought him back on a final bid of \$37,000. The 6-year-old horse trained by Dallas Stewart has gone on to earn more than \$3.3 million.

Among Classic contenders who were sold the first time through the ring, McKinzie, the 3-1 morning-line favorite, was purchased from Lane's End by Three Amigos, the pseudonym for partners Michael Pegram, Karl Watson, and Paul Weitman, for \$170,000 out of the 2016 Keeneland yearling sale.

Awesome Again Stakes (G1) winner Mongolian Groom is the least expensive Classic starter sold at auction. He was purchased by Mongolian Stable for \$12,000 from Jesse and Samantha Hoppel's Coastal Equine at the OBS Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training. Through the name Calcutta Thoroughbreds, Hoppel bought the colt by Calumet Farm stallion Hightail for \$11,000 from Paramount Sales at The October Sale, Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky yearling sale, in 2016.

The 4-year-old gelding has won or placed in half his 16 starts and earned \$579,141 so far.

In the Distaff, Ollie's Candy races for breeders Paul Eggert and Karen Eggert only because the daughter of Candy Ride was bought back on a final bid of \$45,000 when offered through Denali Stud's consignment at the 2016 Keeneland September sale. Trained by John Sadler, the 4-year-old filly has won or placed in eight of nine starts, including a game victory in the Clement L. Hirsch Stakes (G1).

Secret Spice represents a major pinhook score for Paul Sharp, who acquired the Godolphin-bred daughter of Discreet Cat for \$4,500 from Blandford Stud at the 2016 Keeneland yearling sale. Pinhooked by Sharp into the 2017 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, the filly was purchased by Tom McCrocklin for \$125,000 on behalf of Little Red Feather Racing. Trained by Richard Baltas for Little Red Feather Racing and Bobby Flay, the filly won the Beholder Mile Stakes (G1) and placed second in two other grade 1 stakes this year. She has earned \$548,510.

At the other end of the price spectrum, the most expensive Distaff contender is Dunbar Road, the Quality Road filly bought by Peter Brant's White Birch Farm for \$350,000 when she was consigned to the 2017 Keeneland September sale by Indian Creek. Bred in Kentucky by Jeffery Drown, the filly trained by Chad Brown has never been worse than third in six starts, with \$637,900 in earnings. BH

REPOLE MAKING NOISE AT BREEDERS' CUP AGAIN

Tf Vino Rosso wins the \$6 million Longines ⚠ Breeders' Cup Classic (G1), it could create a scene football fans in New England will fondly recall.

Just like the sight of NFL commissioner Roger Goodell presenting the Vince Lombardi Trophy to New England Patriots quarterback Tom Brady after the "Deflategate" season, a Nov. 2 victory by Vino Rosso at Santa Anita Park would unite two parties that have not always seen things eye to eye.

It's been eight years since the last time a Repole Stable runner competed in the Breeders' Cup, and judging by the more than \$20 million Mike Repole's stable has earned since then, he surely could have entered a horse or two—if he wanted to.

"I could run in the Breeders' Cup every year. Everybody can," Repole said. "But it's about going there with a real chance of winning."

"Going there" was anything but appealing to Repole when he staged a one-man, one-stable boycott of the Breeders' Cup in 2012. Angered by the lack of a Breeders' Cup in his native New York since 2005 and upset at rules barring the use of Lasix in 2-year-olds, he turned Thanksgiving weekend at Aqueduct Racetrack into his own Breeders' Cup. He won three graded stakes on one card—the Cigar Mile Handicap (G1), Remsen Stakes (G2), and Demoiselle Stakes (G2)—and five stakes over the course of the weekend and delighted in each and every one of them as though they were \$1 million stakes at the World Championships.

"We had horses good enough to go, but he didn't want to go," said Ed Rosen, Repole's bloodstock agent since 2010. "He had a strong opinion."

Opinions are definitely one of Repole's strong suits. As much as his racing operation has changed since he was last seen in the entry box at the Breeders' Cup, he remains as controversial as ever.

Born a brash kid from Queens, N.Y., who made his first fortune by selling Glaceau, the maker of Vitaminwater, for \$4.1 billion and continues to thrive as a co-founder of the BodyArmor sports drink, he is

quick to speak his mind—even if the traditionalists in the sport would be happier if he followed the lead of a monk and took a vow of silence.

"Everything he does, he does with passion and intensity," Rosen said. "He rarely takes his foot off the gas pedal. He gets frustrated by the industry not changing, especially since he's willing to change his own operation."

The 50-year-old Repole grew up frequenting Aqueduct and nearby off-track betting parlors and made a big splash as he quickly grew his stable in terms of both quantity and quality. He started with claimers in 2005 and by 2010 had a 2-year-old champion and Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) winner in Uncle Mo, who has become an outstanding stallion at Ashford Stud. In 2011, he won the Travers Stakes (G1) with Stay Thirsty, a Lovacres Ranch stallion.

He still loves the sport as much as ever and remains quick to speak when he sees a problem. Given all the troubling issues these days, it's been impossible for him to remain quiet.

"Years ago, I was super vocal. Go back to 2011 and 2012, and I made statements saying that if racing doesn't change, it would not be around in 10 years," Repole said. "Today, the racing industry, because of a lack of evolution and change, is on a course where if there's no racing in three to four years, I would not be surprised. And if that happens, as disappointed as I would be, you could blame no one but all of the participants in the industry. If you're a track owner like The Stronach Group or a public company like Churchill Downs or a breeder or an owner or a jockey, we have all failed to evolve the sport and make the necessary changes.

"For years, I have asked for a commissioner to represent the sport as a whole. We have too many people looking out for their own interests. No one is looking out for the sport as a whole. That selfish attitude will kill the sport, and I'll be fine with it. I did my part. Others didn't. We dug the hole that buries us. If people ran their businesses like the sport, they'd be broke."

Ask Repole about how 2019 has unfolded for the sport and he will not pull any punches, calling it "a national embarrassment."

"It's been a year of national embarrassment for horse racing. From the issues we've had at Santa Anita to how they handled it and how the entire sport handled it, it was a national embarrassment. Then you have the Kentucky Derby (G1). The biggest race on the biggest platform and a chance for us to win back some fans, and we have a 20-minute inquiry that people don't even know what they are looking at."

Mindful of his outspoken nature, Repole understands why organizations are not knocking on his door asking him to become a board member.

"No one wants me on their board," he said, "because I have an opinion that's best for the sport, not just for that board. I'm not a puppet."

Yet for all the dire warnings he issues, Repole still

has a deep passion for spending a day at the races and watching his horses run while accompanied by a small army of family and friends, led by his wife, Maria, and young daughter, Gioia.

"I think he's as passionate as ever. He's very excited about the Breeders' Cup and his Uncle Mo babies and some yearlings we bought in September," said Todd Pletcher, who trains Vino Rosso and has teamed with Repole for the bulk of the stable's 892 wins. "Mike's a unique personality. He has a great mind and enjoys the competition, more so when he wins. He probably operates on less sleep than 99.9% of the population."

Vino Rosso, a son of Curlin, is foremost on the New Yorker's mind these days. Owned by Repole in a partnership with Vincent Viola's St. Elias Stable, Vino Rosso won the Wood Memorial Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G2) last year at 3. He is coming off a controversial performance under jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. in the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1) when he and Code of Honor staged a furious stretch duel. Vino Rosso reached the wire first by a nose but was disqualified for bumping with Code of Honor and was placed second behind his 3-year-old rival in a decision that upset the colt's connections to no end.

"It was frustrating," Pletcher said. "I feel bad for the horse, for Mike, and the Violas. To me, it was a tough call. The normal criteria for disqualifying a horse is when they make an opponent alter course, or steady or check, or bump them off stride, and none of those happened."

Vino Rosso will get a rematch with Code of Honor in the Classic. They are listed as the 4-1 program co-second choice behind the favored McKinzie.

"I am going in with full confidence," said Repole, who bought Vino Rosso with Viola for \$410,000 from the Glennwood Farm consignment at the 2016 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. "He's peaking at the right time. I wouldn't trade places with anyone. We have some unfinished business."

Vino Rosso heads into Saturday's 1 1/4-mile test as anything but your typical East Coast shipper. In May, he shipped to California and won the 10-furlong Gold Cup at Santa Anita Stakes (G1), giving him the invaluable advantage of a winning trip on the racetrack.

"I thought ahead. I knew 'Vino' loved a mile and a quarter, and in my heart I knew this would be his best year. I did something I never did before and sent him to California for a race over the track," Repole said. "It checked every single box."

Rosen will tell you Vino Rosso reflects how Repole's involvement in the game has changed in recent years but not his passion for it.

"Mike knows more about pedigrees now and has a greater appreciation of the bigger races. They turn him on. Being in a Triple Crown race or the Breeders' Cup Classic means more to him than it did in the beginning when he had the claimers," Rosen said.

Now that he's become more involved in the industry, Repole adjusted his business model and has taken on partners. In Viola, owner of the NHL's Florida Panthers, he has both a partner and good friend.

"Vin is an older brother to me. I've always had respect for Vinnie and his family. We share the same Italian heritage, and our families love each other. Winning a race with my wife, and Vinnie and his wife (Teresa) and our friends, it's like one big Italian party."

Saturday will be the final race of Vino Rosso's career before he heads off to life as a stallion at Spendthrift Farm, and as you might expect, Repole will not mince words about it. It's going to be a weekend of celebration.

"We're going to go out to California to have fun," he said. "We will celebrate Friday, and if we win Saturday, we'll celebrate some more. And if we lose Saturday, we'll celebrate even harder. Vino Rosso may not be the favorite, but he's the horse to beat." BH

LEADING THIRD-CROP SIRE TAKE CHARGE INDY NOW AT WINSTAR

eading third-crop sire Take Charge Indy, a regally bred son of A.P. Indy out of multiple grade 1 winner, graded stakes producer, and Broodmare of the Year Take Charge Lady, has arrived at WinStar Farm for the 2020 breeding season and will be available for inspection beginning at a Nov. 4 Open House from 11 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Take Charge Indy, who returns to the United States after a three-year tour of stud duty in South Korea, has progeny earnings this year of \$5,237,210 through Oct. 31. He is the fourth-leading sire of his class by number of black-type winners of 2019 with four. For his three crops to race cumulatively, the sire ranks as the cosecond-leading North American sire with 11 black-type winners.

For 2019, Take Charge Indy's top runners include Long Range Toddy, winner of a division of the Rebel Stakes (G2) and an earner of \$918,709; Preakness Stakes (G1) and Fasig-Tipton Holy Bull Stakes (G2) runner-up Everfast; multiple graded-placed Motion Emotion; and stakes winner Pole Setter, who was graded-placed last year.

Take Charge Indy is a grade 1-winning millionaire who won or placed in seven graded stakes from 2 to 4. He will stand the 2020 season for \$17,500 with a

O'BRIEN HOPEFUL CIRCUS MAXIMUS LAYS MILE GHOST TO REST

A idan O'Brien's dozen Breeders' Cup winners don't include a victory in the TVG Breeders' Cup Mile (G1T) but Circus Maximus could be poised to right that wrong under Ryan Moore at Santa Anita Park.

Ironically, it is the only race at the meeting any other Irish trainer has won, Vincent O'Brien and John Oxx mastering it in 1990 and 1995 with Royal Academy and Ridgewood Pearl.

It was also the race in which O'Brien suffered one of his most galling defeats, with Rock of Gibraltar failing narrowly to reel in the Niarchos family's Domedriver at Arlington International in 2002 after coming from the clouds.

Circus Maximus, in post 9, sports the distinctive Niarchos silks this time, so it would be a fitting way for O'Brien to conquer the race.

After running commendably in the Investec Derby (G1), the Galileo colt reverted to a mile for the St. James's Palace Stakes (G1) at Royal Ascot, winning with a little more authority from King of Comedy than the neck margin suggests.

He found Too Darn Hot a little too hot in the Qatar Sussex Stakes (G1) before failing to excel over 1 1/4-miles behind Japan in the Juddmonte International (G1). Back to this trip in the Prix du Moulin de Longchamp (G1), he duly regained the winning thread, albeit in controversial manner after veering across the track, taking the nose runner-up Romanised with him.

A third group 1 triumph could see him finish the season as the leading 3-year-old in the world at this distance.

"When we switched him back in trip he came alive,"

O'Brien said. "He is lazy at home and doesn't show an awful lot but he is much quicker when you run him.

"He is drawn out a little bit and he has handled fast ground when we have run him on it. We're very happy with him but he has had a busy season."

Fillies Spearhead Home Defense

The market suggests there is little to choose between the two American fillies Got Stormy and Uni. Got Stormy tends to run consistently well at this level, just failing to hold on when denied by El Tormenta in the Ricoh Woodbine Mile (G1T) in September.

"I thought her Woodbine Mile was good," said trainer Mark Casse, who has won two of the last four Mile renewals.

"She's a true miler. She can get a little farther if the turf is really hard, but the turf had some give to it and a mile turf race at Woodbine is not like a mile anywhere else.

"One of her strong suits is her ability to quicken and it's not as effective on that long stretch. She will be much more effective at Santa Anita."

Uni, who represents the potent Chad Brown-Joel Rosario axis, was a few lengths behind Got Stormy when third in the Fourstardave Handicap (G1T) at Saratoga Race Course in August, when she was conceding two pounds.

She likes to come from behind and subsequently won a second mile grade 1 confined to fillies and mares when taking the First Lady Stakes at Keeneland, although the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1T) was being considered.

"With her running style, I'm not sure it would be a good idea," said Brown, who will also saddle the 2018 St. James's Palace Stakes (G1) winner Without Parole.

"At a mile, I think she's better, especially with pace in front of her."

British Runners Have Something to Find David O'Meara's first Breeders' Cup runner

Suedois leads Lord Glitters off the training track at Santa Anita

Mondialiste ran a blinder to be second to Casse's Tepin in 2015. O'Meara takes a two-pronged approach this time, with Lord Glitters and Suedois both having something to find.

Lord Glitters landed a famous Queen Anne (G1) success in the summer but hasn't built on that since, while Suedois finished strongly when three-quarters of a length back in third in the Shadwell Turf Mile (G1T) at Keeneland.

"He has been a great servant and was fourth in this in 2017," said Joe Foley of Suedois on behalf of coowner Clipper Logistics.

"Even though he is 8 he seems to have maintained his form and has been a shade unlucky a few times, including when he was third in the Shadwell Turf from a wide draw. He has a good draw, so we are hoping for a nice run."

Like O'Meara, Richard Fahey has sent Space Traveller over from a Yorkshire base. When getting up late in the Clipper Logistics Boomerang Solonaway Stakes (G2) at Leopardstown, Space Traveller had Suedois back in fourth. The Jersey Stakes (G3) winner might still be on the upgrade.

> "It's nice to be drawn low," Fahey said of Danny Tudhope's mount, who drew post 3. "He needs to find eight or nine pounds but the fast ground will really suit him. He's in great form."

Billy Lee, who rode Space Traveller at Leopardstown, is on Ken Condon's new acquisition Trais Fluors, acquired for €370,000 (US\$406,210) by Robert Ng at Arqana a month ago.

"We're just getting to know him but he seems to have traveled over well," Condon said of his first Stateside runner. "He looks a tough, consistent horse and looks very solid."

MCGAUGHEY BELIEVES RACE SPACING HELPED CODE OF HONOR

After watching Code of Honor earn a placing in this year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), trainer Shug McGaughey made the rare decision to skip the final two legs of the Triple Crown.

The Hall of Fame trainer believes the patient approach has paid off for Code of Honor, who has put together a big summer and fall with victories in the Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1) and Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1).

Now the William S. Farish homebred is entered in the \$6 million Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) Nov. 2 at Santa Anita Park, where he is the morningline 4-1 co-second choice.

After the May 4 Derby, in which he reached the wire third and was moved to second after the

disqualification of Maximum Security, Code of Honor didn't race again until the July 6 Dwyer Stakes (G3), when he rallied from last of six to post a 3 1/4-length score in the one-turn mile test at Belmont Park. He then received a short break from racing as McGaughey trained him up to his Aug. 24 Travers score.

"That little bit of time he had (after the Derby) to get him to the Dwyer and his race there—then we just trained him up to the Travers—I think it gave him a lot of time to develop mentally and physically, also," McGaughey said.

In his first start against older horses, Code of Honor finished second, a nose behind Vino Rosso, but when the latter was disqualified for interference, Code of Honor was placed first. McGaughey didn't immediately commit to the Breeders' Cup for his 3-year-old son of Lane's End stallion Noble Mission but liked how his horse bounced out of the 1 1/4-mile Jockey Club Gold Cup.

For Farish, Saturday will provide an opportunity to secure a second victory in the Classic. He won the 1992 edition with A.P. Indy, who was campaigned by Farish, William Kilroy, Tomonori Tsurumaki, and Harold Goodman. Farish and Kilroy bred A.P. Indy, who went on to be a multiple leading sire at Farish's Lane's End.

OMAHA BEACH LIFE-CHANGING FRIEND FOR RIDER CAMBRA

The 145th running of the Kentucky Derby presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) is for the history books—a race remembered for the agonizing minutes of deliberation by Churchill Downs stewards who handed down one of the most historic decisions in Thoroughbred racing history.

But for the members of trainer Richard Mandella's team, and the connections of Omaha Beach, the Kentucky Derby was simply the race that got away.

Omaha Beach was scratched three days before the Derby because of complications from an entrapped epiglottis, a blow to the entire Mandella team and especially the colt's exercise rider, Taylor Cambra.

"It was definitely heartbreaking for all of us, but we all lived and learned from it," Cambra said. "The highs of this game are addicting. The lows make you question why you still do it. But I'm still very grateful for the opportunity I got to go there. I'm very grateful that the boss was willing to take me along for the ride, even though everything didn't work out like we had planned."

After Omaha Beach underwent surgery, many wondered whether he would be able to make a return to the top-level form that rocketed him to stardom at 3. But the months spent apart during his recuperation did little to alter the relationship between Cambra and Omaha Beach. When the colt was shipped back to California from Kentucky, the pair quickly picked up where they left off.

Omaha Beach was sent back to training in preparation for a start in the 36th Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita Park, and Cambra and his colleagues held their breath as their wily protégé stole the show in the Oct. 5 Santa Anita Sprint Championship Stakes (G1) and officially stamped his ticket to the World Championships.

Working together day in and day out, it's clear the two share an innate synchronicity that is hard to describe. From the quiet hours during early morning training to the thrill of the winner's circle on race day, Omaha Beach and Cambra are rarely out of each other's sight. The former professional cowboy and California native cut his teeth on the rodeo circuit riding broncos before arriving at the Mandella barn. But when he found himself on the back of the dark bay son of War Front at the start of the 2019 season, everything suddenly fell into place.

"He's a horse that changed my life, so he's definitely special to me," Cambra said. "He's just such a cool dude, and he has the best personality. It's great to see him still improving. He gets better and better, so you definitely take pride in watching him improve every time he gets to the track. He is better than ever right now, in my opinion."

Although his win in the Santa Anita Sprint awarded Omaha Beach a start in the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1), Mandella and the connections debated a start in the 1 1/4-mile Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1). Cambra said Mandella's decision to send the 3-year-old to the Big Ass Fans Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) will give him the best chance for success. Owned by Fox Hill Farms, the colt will make a bid for his third grade 1 score when he takes on nine others Nov. 2.

"Being young and dumb, of course, the Classic, I was like, 'Let's go!' But the boss knows what he's doing with these horses, and this might not be the main goal for him," Cambra said. "Coming out of a sprint, I think it could be hard to send him out for a mile-and-a-quarter race, especially with all those tough horses. If he can use this race to get around two turns and head for the Pegasus (World Cup Invitational Stakes, G1), that would be nice. Hopefully, this time we will get a little racing luck and win us a race."

While Omaha Beach is certainly not the only horse Cambra exercises for Mandella, the memories of a late Derby scratch and subsequent responsibility to keep his mount safe and happy ahead of the Breeders' Cup has weighed heavy on Cambra's shoulders in recent weeks.

"I do my best to take care of all the horses the best

I can, but there is definitely a little more pressure when there (are millions of dollars) invested in the horse," Cambra said. "I think he's been training really good, so I think everything is just the way we want it leading up to the race. We will just keep him happy and in bubble wrap until race day. I try to keep my head down and keep working so I don't think about it too much."

With Omaha Beach already announced as one of five new stallions slated to join the Spendthrift Farm roster in 2020, Cambra knows his time with the colt is more than likely drawing to a close. While the prospect of parting with his grade 1-winning comrade is an idea Cambra prefers not to think about, the 22-year-old will have plenty to occupy his time as he prepares to work toward his assistant trainer's license.

"As far as my future goes, I want to be an assistant here for a few years," Cambra said. "I'm definitely learning a lot right now. I want to take on more responsibilities and work up to getting my assistant trainer's license. I would like to work here for a couple years, then move out on my own. That would be the main goal.

"I'm hoping I can keep my weight down for one more year. The boss is always keeping me on track, making sure I don't get too carried away, but if it gets to be too much, I'm going to have to give it up. It's always about what's best for the horses. But I would still be out there. I'll get a nice pony. Being a pony boy and assistant trainer is all right by me."

With only hours to go before Omaha Beach will test his luck against the best Thoroughbreds in the world, Cambra knows it's just another race.

"I'm born and raised in this game, and it's something deeply rooted in me. Waking up every morning getting to see these horses—there is nothing else like it." BH

SIBLING RIVALS SET TO SHINE IN BC TURF SPRINT

In a quiet paddock at Saxony Farm in Lexington, surrounded by rolling hills and turned out with an old steeplechaser to keep her company, an unassuming broodmare crops away at the late-autumn grass.

The mare's name is Vassar. She is 20 years old. And as the rain falls down in the Bluegrass, not one, but two of her offspring are 2,100 miles away, putting in their final preparations for the Breeders' Cup World Championships.

When Stormy Liberal and Leinster break side by side in the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1T) Nov. 2 at Santa Anita Park in Southern California, the half brothers will become just the fourth pair of siblings to race against each other at the Breeders' Cup. Should Leinster deny Stormy Liberal's quest to win a historic third consecutive edition of the Turf Sprint, Vassar—a daughter of Royal Academy out of the L'Emigrant mare Dixie Fine—would become just the sixth mare to produce multiple Breeders' Cup winners in the event's 36-year history.

"She's been an absolutely terrific broodmare," owner Jeff Bowen said. "She's had six foals to race, all winners. These horses are almost like my children, so when they go on and do this well, it means the world. I have pictures of 'Stormy' up all over my house. He's a hard-trying horse and has the heart of a champion, and he's shown it over and over."

Vassar might not know her status among an elite group of mares, but she knows the warmth and comfort of the boarding barn and the expert care provided by the team around her. She also knows not to worry as long as her pasture mate, a dark bay gelding named Gryffindor, is by her side.

"She's an interesting one," said Kate Sheehan, bloodstock adviser to Bowen, who owns the mare. "She's very quirky. She's extremely intelligent.

Gryffindor is her comfort blanket; she frets when she's alone. She's a neat horse and she's definitely a personality at the barn.

"Her progeny give us such a rush because they're so exciting. Stormy Liberal is such a neat little horse. He's a fighter. Leinster, when he finally got on the turf to sprint ... we've never been that excited about a horse to find where he belongs. I know it's super fun for Jeff—he loves the game and he loves his horses, so he deserves all the success in the world."

Vassar was bred in 1999 by Bowen and partner Mike Akers under the banner of Twin Hopes Farm. She failed to meet her reserve twice when offered at auction, no doubt in part because of her nervous nature.

"She was a beautiful specimen, but when she went to the sale, she kind of lost her mind on sales week and would hide in the back of her stall and didn't want to sell," Akers recalled.

Vassar was retained to race in France with trainer Nicolas Clement, but she only won one time and was retired after seven starts. It was as a broodmare that she made her mark.

The mare's first foal was a son of Belong to Me eventually named Garifine, who ended up as a \$105,000 RNA at the 2005 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Sent to Ciaran Dunne of Wavertree Stables to prep for a 2-year-old sale, he came into his own and sold for \$1.8 million at the Ocala Breeders' Sales March 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale in 2006.

Gold Square campaigned the colt for most of his career, and he wound up stakes-placed. Meanwhile, Vassar was foaling out the Stormy Atlantic horse Coast Guard, a \$300,000 Keeneland September yearling who went on to be grade 1-placed; Scholastic, a winning daughter of Johar; stakes winner Shimmering Moment; and Caminetto, a winning son of Stormy Atlantic who brought \$500,000 at Keeneland September in 2010.

Breeding under the Dapple Bloodstock and Gryphon Investments banners, Akers and Bowen went back to Stormy Atlantic in 2011, when the Hill 'n' Dale Farms stallion's fee was listed as \$30,000. The resulting foal, a plucky bay with a diamond star and a pencil-thin

blaze, was not as much of a hit at auction as his more expensive siblings. Agent Dennis O'Neill plucked Stormy Liberal from the 2014 OBS June 2-Year-Olds and Horses of Racing Age Sale for a mere \$100,000, and it wasn't until he was claimed by Peter Miller for Rockingham Ranch that the gelding began to excel.

Not only did he win the Turf Sprint in 2017 at Del Mar, Stormy Liberal doubled back at Churchill Downs last year and became just the second two-time winner in the race's history, a feat that earned him an Eclipse Award as champion turf horse of 2018. Although he has not won a race this season, he's only finished off the board once and comes in off a solid third in the Sept. 27 Eddie D. Stakes (G2T) at Santa Anita.

Bowen and Akers dissolved their partnership after Stormy Liberal was foaled, and Bowen ended up with Vassar. He sent the mare to Majestic Warrior, and Leinster was the result. Dunne picked up the colt in 2016 for \$85,000 under the Taconic Bloodstock banner at The July Sale, Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky select yearling sale, and when he failed to sell as a 2-year-old, the pinhooker and his wife, Amy Dunne, kept Leinster to race, first with D. Wayne Lukas, then with Rusty Arnold.

"Both Stormy Liberal and Leinster went through the Wavertree program," Sheehan said. "They were a little late-developing, but Ciaran always said they were smart, very pretty horses. He's had luck with the family all the way through. Obviously, he's a big fan.

"They're a little like her," Sheehan said of Vassar's foals. "They kind of like to find a little bit of trouble out in the field. They're mischief makers, smart, athletic, always light on their feet."

Leinster comes into the Turf Sprint off a runner-up finish to Stubbins in the Oct. 5 Woodford Stakes Presented by Keeneland Select (G2T) at Keeneland and will meet that rival again Saturday. He was third Sept. 7 in the Runhappy Turf Sprint Stakes (G3T) at Kentucky Downs, a race in which Stormy Liberal ran fifth. Leinster's breakout moment came Aug. 3 at Saratoga Race Course when he won the Troy Stakes (G3T) in a stakes-record 1:00.23.

"Under Rusty's tutelage, he became a world-class turf sprinter," Bowen said. "It was a very pleasant surprise, really. He's really blossomed. He set a track record in the Troy Stakes and ran extremely well in his last two."

Currently in foal to Uncle Mo, Vassar produced one other foal after Leinster, a Distorted Humor colt who failed to meet his reserve at \$240,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October Yearling Sale.

The colt will be retained to race by Bowen, who has owned racehorses for 20 years and currently owns the same amount. He said the sport's ups and downs make the victories all that more rewarding, and he couldn't be prouder to own the plain chestnut mare who will spend the weekend grazing in a quiet Kentucky paddock.

"As you can imagine, Vassar is an extremely special mare to me," Bowen added. "We treat her like she's the queen. She's been good to a lot of us for a long time. As a breeder, you wish you could get so lucky to have a mare like that." BH

KARP'S HUNCH LEADS TO FIRST GRADE 1 WINNER



wner/breeder Larry Karp bought his first broodmare at auction in 2011 on a hunch that paid off well beyond his boldest expectations. From the chestnut French Deputy mare Di's Delight, whom he bought for \$55,000, he's bred his first grade 1 stakes winner and will watch her Nov. 2 become his first Breeders' Cup World Championship starter.

The pride of Karp's nine-broodmare breeding program known as Barlar is Mirth, a 4-year-old daughter of Colonel John who races for Billy Koch's Little Red Feather Racing syndicate. She is one of 11 expected to start in the \$2 million Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1), coming into the race off a 1 1/4-length win in the Sept. 28 Rodeo Drive Stakes (G1T) at Santa Anita Park.

"I've had horses I raced win graded races, but I bought those horses at auction. This is really special," said Karp, a Texas resident who has been involved in Thoroughbred racing for 35 years but didn't start breeding his own runners until 2010.

"I stopped buying horses 12-14 years ago," he continued. "Now I just breed to race myself or breed to sell. I've never bred even a graded horse, so to breed a grade 1 winner is like winning the Kentucky Derby (G1) or winning the Breeders' Cup."

Karp bought Di's Delight out of Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency's consignment to the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. She began racing as a homebred for Asiel Stable and at the end of her career was owned by Carrie Brogden and Michelle Mullikin. She won five times during four years of racing, placed in a minor stakes at Hawthorne Race Course, and earned \$166,825. What Karp found intriguing about the mare was her half sister Copper State, a multiple grade 1-placed stakes winner by the Pennsylvania stallion Jump Start, in whom Karp owned some shares.

"It seemed like a cross that was working," Karp said. Di's Delight proved early to be a good investment. The first three foals she produced for Karp all became winners, and the third foal, a Jump Start gelding named Heat Dome, was runner-up in the Pennsylvania

Nursery Stakes.

In 2014, Karp had been doing business with Darby Dan Farm, and the farm's general manager had a season to Colonel John, a grade 1-winning son of Tiznow and the third-leading freshman sire of 2013. They bred the mare together and put her into the 2014 Keeneland November sale. Fortunately, the mare didn't generate enough interest, and Karp bought her back on a final bid of \$23,000.

The blessing of that unanswered prayer at Keeneland was Mirth. The filly went into training with mid-Atlantic trainer Bernie Houghton, who was boarding the owner's mares on his farm near Lancaster, Pa., where Mirth was born.

At 2, Mirth showed only glimmers of ability early on. She placed twice in her first four starts on dirt, once second—nine lengths back—and once third—7 3/4 lengths behind the winner. Houghton said she was such a beautiful mover he'd expected more, so they tried her on grass in a \$16,000 maiden claimer at Delaware Park. Mirth won by 8 3/4 lengths.

"I thought she was a nice horse, and the one time I ran for a price, I was taking a shot and saying my prayers that no one would take her. I was trying to win as many races with her as I could. She just had a beautiful stride, especially on the grass," Houghton said.

The filly got the winter off and returned to racing in a turf starter allowance at Laurel Park that she won with a driving finish by a neck. She came back in another Laurel allowance turf race about a month later and won by 3 1/2 lengths. Her consecutive wins caught Koch's attention. Koch and Karp quickly settled on a price.

"I have been in the business for 35 years now, so when someone makes you a good enough offer, you sell. Otherwise, you don't survive," Karp said of his decision to sell Mirth. He never lost his enthusiasm for watching her run, however.

"I am the biggest fan and the biggest rooter for that horse and for Little Red Feather, even before she won the grade 1," he said. "I was delighted that she was winning at Santa Anita and was second in a stakes race. I could not have been prouder. Then she wins the grade 1, and I thought, 'Oh my God.""

Looking ahead to the Filly & Mare Turf, Karp said he would be thrilled if Mirth just hit the board.

"There is a horse in that race who is so many pounds better than the rest of them, and that is Sistercharlie. But Sistercharlie doesn't have her rabbit, plus Mirth has the best rider in the United States on her back, and that can't hurt," he said, referring to Hall of Fame jockey Mike Smith, who already owns the most Breeders' Cup victories with 26.

"If Mirth hits the board, I'll be over the moon," he said. The "rabbit" is Peter Brant's Thais, a frontrunner who was entered in Sistercharlie's previous three races to help set up the race for the favorite's closing style. California state veterinarians scratched Thais Oct. 31 for indications of unsoundness, which trainer Chad Brown disputed.

Though Karp's high expectations of the cross of Di's Delight with Jump Start was not responsible for Mirth, his faith in that mating may yet produce more reasons to celebrate. Karp is racing a 3-year-old Jump Start—Di's Delight filly named Vault, who has won or placed eight times out of 11 starts and just won an allowance race at Hollywood Casino at Penn National Race Course by 10 lengths.

"I don't know what it is about Larry's horses, but the older they get, the better they get," Houghton said. "His homebred Imply broke her maiden as a 2-year-old, and then she got better every year." The 6-year-old daughter of E Dubai won four consecutive races this year, three of them in stakes.

Though decades in racing have tempered Karp's expectations, he allowed himself some exuberance when talking about Vault's future.

"I have to be careful and not say too much," he began.
"But she may be more talented than Mirth. She has not won a stakes yet, but she has the numbers that tell me it is a likely possibility that she could fall into the same category."

Di's Delight also has a yearling colt by Jump Start and produced a Maryland-bred colt by Karp's stallion Alliance this year. A long devotee of the Pennsylvaniabred program, Karp sent most of his mares to Maryland for a couple of years to take advantage of the rapidly growing breeders program there.

Karp stands Alliance at Bill Boniface's Bonita Farm, which is also managing his mares for now. Alliance is an unraced son of Harlan's Holiday and a half brother to multiple champion and six-time grade 1 winner Tepin (Bernstein) and multiple grade 1-placed grade 2 winner Vyjack (Into Mischief).

Di's Delight was bred back to Alliance this year, but Karp has not decided who he'll breed her to in 2020.

"I'll be back in the commercial market next year," he said. "I'm not going to sell her, though. No one wants a 20-year-old mare anyway, and that's OK.

"At this point in my life, another dollar or two in my pocket won't make a difference," Karp said. "From here on out, I'm going to try to breed a grade 1 winner ... another grade 1 winner. I absolutely love it." BH

OWNERS ENJOY LOVABLE COMPETITOR MIDNIGHT BISOU

Pew Thoroughbreds have an entourage as dedicated as that of Midnight Bisou. The 4-year-old filly has traveled throughout the country this year in what has been a perfect quest so far, always with her groom Geraldo Morales; her hot-walker Tom Semans; and her faithful pony Red.

Red ponies many of the Thoroughbreds at the Steve Asmussen barn, but Midnight Bisou, the 6-5 morning-line favorite for the \$2million Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1), knows he's really there only for her.

"She always wants to know where Red is," said Lori Allen, who co-owns Midnight Bisou with her husband Chuck under their Allen Racing banner along with partners Bloom Racing and Madaket Stables.

It's a quiet, hard-working team. Red is more likely to vocalize than Morales (known as Cho-co-LA-tay) or Semans. But between the three of them, they keep Midnight Bisou safe and happy.

"They are her constant traveling companions," said Jeff Bloom of Bloom Racing.

Red and Asmussen assistant trainer Scott Blasi accompany Midnight Bisou to the track each day, and Morales and Semans take over from the pony upon her return. As Semans holds the filly, Morales gives her a bath. Midnight Bisou constantly turns her head to see where Morales is, and she likes to stick out her tongue at Semans.

"I love her—she's one of my favorites," is about the most Semans will say about her. But his non-verbal communication attests to his devotion.

"Tom is ridiculously protective of her, which is great," Bloom said.

Asmussen sent Blasi and the whole 'Bisou' crew to California early to give the daughter of Midnight Lute plenty of time to acclimate. Though she raced at Santa Anita at 2 and 3—when trained by Bill Spawr—and won three stakes including the Santa Anita Oaks (G1), the filly hadn't been back since midway through 2018.

Midnight Bisou has had four works on the Santa Anita track leading to the Distaff, most recently four furlongs Oct. 28 in :50 4/5 following a more serious move Oct. 21 of five furlongs in 1:00 2/5. Bloom

is based in California and sees her daily, while the Allens, who live in Texas, traveled to California early to spend time at the track with her.

"She loves peppermints," Allen said. "She's just our little girl. She's the happiest horse you could imagine."

Midnight Bisou also loves kisses, fitting given that "bisou" means "kiss" in French. Bloom's family—wife Susie and daughters Hannah, 23, and Ashley, 21—also spend plenty of time with her.

"Jeff's daughters kiss and love on her all the time," Allen said.

Midnight Bisou is great at compartmentalizing. Around the barn, she is sweet and affectionate.

"You can treat her like a pet you would have in your backyard or your house," Jeff Bloom said. "And then you get the saddle on her, and she's immediately this fierce competitor, a prizefighter, a dominant force. It's so interesting to watch this transformation as soon as the saddle gets on her back and she knows it's go time and it's all about business."

The Allens like to visit Midnight Bisou back at the barn after a race.

"She's still a little feisty," Allen said. "She still in beast mode—that's what we call it. And then the next day she's back to her sweet little self."

Seven times this year, at five different tracks in four states, Midnight Bisou has successfully used that feistiness to win graded stakes and remain undefeated so far this season.

In one case, Bloom witnessed Midnight Bisou's transformation up close and personal. A former jockey and exercise rider, Bloom rode Midnight Bisou one morning at Monmouth Park, where the filly was preparing for the July 20 Molly Pitcher Stakes (G3).

"She went in there and didn't have a lot to do; we didn't bring a rider," Bloom said. "So Scott had told me to bring my gear. There was a time when they were thinking about galloping her that morning, which would have been fine, but we just jogged her."

Lori and Susie admit they had phones at the ready to capture the moment in photos and video.

And afterward, just as they always do, Morales and Semans took over back at the barn.

"The attention to detail these guys put in on a day-in and day-out basis with this filly—it's a passion of love and commitment and devotion," Bloom said. "It's fun to watch the team." BH

ARKLOW SEEKS ANOTHER MAJOR UPSET FOR DONEGAL

As much as Arklow faces a formidable challenge in the \$4 million Longines Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T), he hails from a stable well versed in overcoming even greater odds.

Remember Triple Crown champion American Pharaoh?

Remember the 2015 Travers Stakes (G1)?

It was Donegal Racing's Keen Ice who became a permanent part of Saratoga lore by beating American Pharoah. So it follows that Donegal president Jerry Crawford knows better than most owners that even if there are few Goliaths on hand, if you have the right horse, you can't shirk from being a David.

"What I learned from that Travers," Crawford said, "is to take a shot."

And so Nov. 2 at Santa Anita Park, Arklow will be among a field of 12 that includes Horse of the Year favorite Bricks and Mortar, Investec Derby (G1) winner Anthony Van Dyck, and multiple grade/group 1 winner Old Persian. He's listed at 12-1 on the morning line, and the goal is similar to four years ago in the Midsummer Derby—to topple a giant or two.

"I have all the respect for Bricks and Mortar, and I have an equally high opinion for the Europeans, and then you can make a case for any of us. It's a tremendous opportunity, and we're looking forward to being there and taking our shot," Crawford said.

Owned by Donegal along with Joseph Bulger and Peter Coneway, Arklow is one of the more intriguing contenders in the 1 1/2-mile Turf after turning in the best performance of his 23-race career for trainer Brad Cox.

The 5-year-old son of Arch came into the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Stakes (G1T) as a consistent sort who seemed content to fill out the bottom of the exacta or trifecta rather than pay off on win bets. In his six 2019 starts, Arklow's lone win came in the Joe Hirsch, but he was second in the Calumet Farm Kentucky Turf Cup Stakes (G3T), Belmont Gold Cup Invitational Stakes (G2T), and Man o'War Stakes (G1T), losing the latter two by a neck.

Yet in the 1 1/2-mile stakes at Belmont Park, everything fell into place as Arklow prevailed in a tight, three-horse battle to the wire, winning by a half-length over fellow Turf starter Channel Maker.

"What you hope is that he's ready to take a step up to the next level. The speed figures he put up in the Joe Hirsch were very strong," Crawford said. "He shows up all the time, and there's nothing better than that in horse racing. You don't have to worry about him turning in a clunker unless there's some crazy event."

Based on what Crawford saw after the Joe Hirsch, he's hopeful that after a 13-month gap between wins, Arklow will prove to be yet another horse who becomes addicted to winning after settling for the minor spoils for a prolonged period of time.

"I told my wife, Linda, after the Joe Hirsch it seemed like Arklow knew he won. I always go out and meet the horses on the racetrack because you can learn a lot there, and his air was different," Crawford said. "He can be contentious while saddling or after the fact, and there was none of that after the race. He was calm and seemed very proud to me. Unfortunately, horses don't talk, so we can't ask him how he feels, but I'm hoping he liked the experience and we'll see yet another level out of him—he will be a contender."

Cox also likes what he has seen in the bay horse since his breakthrough effort in the Joe Hirsch.

"He's doing really well and has been working fantastic," said Cox, who is putting jockey Javier Castellano back on Arklow for the first time since March 2018. "I feel he's better this year than last year. He's a bigger, stronger horse who has gotten better with age as his pedigree would suggest."

The path that has taken Arklow to the Turf actually started on dirt as a Triple Crown hopeful, which is not surprising. Donegal's business model is to offer all the horses it buys in a year in packages called "Derby Dreams." Bred in Kentucky by John Penn and Frank Penn out of the Empire Maker mare Unbridled Empire, Arklow was bought by Crawford for \$160,000 from the Penn Sales consignment at the

2015 Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

"We only have one offering a year, so you get every horse and don't miss out on the big one. Our people are in it to run and try to win the big races. We're good for the sport," said Crawford, whose investors in Arklow's package include Nick Nurse, coach of the NBA champion Toronto Raptors.

"We use a mathematical approach and algorithms along with bloodlines at the sales, and we loved his physical look," he said. "We were able to buy him in the first book for \$160,000, which is unusual, but that's our M.O. Most of our grade 1 winners have been at that price range. We've been skilled at finding inexpensive horses with high-quality results."

Arklow's first three starts—all on dirt—resulted in a second and a third. He finished fourth in his 3-year-old debut as a maiden in the Lecomte Stakes (G3). But after Arklow finished eighth—14 1/2 lengths behind the winner, Girvin—in the Risen Star Stakes (G2), Cox shifted him to turf and was rewarded with an easy maiden win followed by a score in the 2017 American Turf Stakes Presented by Ram Trucks (G2T).

Two years later, and after a fourth-place finish in last year's Turf, Arklow has six wins and five seconds in 18 turf starts, with earnings of more than \$1.7 million.

"I can't say enough about Brad," Crawford said.
"He gave the horse a real shot on the Derby trail and was honest, as he always is, when he said he needed to move (Arklow) to the grass. He does not blow smoke and tell you all of your horses are good. He's very candid, and he's liked Arklow from the beginning."

He'll surely like him even more Saturday if Arklow can duplicate the feat of a former stablemate and outshine some stars on one of the sport's biggest stages. BH

KAMEKO UPSETS BALLYDOYLE RUNNERS IN FUTURITY TROPHY

Pinatubo might not have have everything his own way next year as Kameko looked a real horse for the future with an impressive success in the rearranged Vertem Futurity Trophy (G1), the first group 1 in Britain to be held on the all-weather under lights.

The Andrew Balding-trained winner was the only non-Aidan O'Brien-trained juvenile to be declared in the original race six days ago, but we will never know whether he would have been as effective on the bog-like turf at Doncaster.

Balding said: "He was impressive but he's a very good horse who is improving all the time. I'm grateful to everyone for transferring the race here to Newcastle and I'm not certain he would have done so well in the testing ground last week.

"Things didn't go quite right for (jockey) Oisin (Murphy) last time at Newmarket and, although he was perhaps in front a bit sooner than we would have liked today, he quickened up in good style.

"How far will he stay? A mile and a quarter will be no problem but we'll have to wait and see whether he stays a mile and a half. If he does, there is only one place he will go. We will probably start him off in the Guineas and go from there. We can still dream."

Oisin Murphy said: "I'm delighted to have won my first domestic group 1 for Andrew and all the team at Park House. At Newmarket when I switched him out to follow Frankie he got a bit lit up, but he relaxed brilliantly today and showed that instant acceleration which is the mark of a really good horse.

"He's by the same sire at Roaring Lion but he has a way to go to emulate him. I'm not so sure that Newmarket is his ideal track but we'll see. He got the mile well today and should certainly stay a bit further."

The winner is owned by Qatar Racing, whose racing

manager David Redvers added: "He's a decent horse. His dam struggled to stay a mile so I thought that he wouldn't want any further than this, but he wasn't stopping."

Kameko, who won his maiden at Sandown in July, has proved quite a bargain for his owners as Redvers bought him for just \$90,000 at the Keeneland sales last September.

Sent off a well-supported 11-2 shot in the 11-runner field, Kameko came home by three and a quarter lengths from Innisfree, who fared best of the O'Brien quintet. His rider Seamie Heffernan said: "I'm very pleased with that. He's a stayer."

Third home was another O'Brien runner, Year Of The Tiger, who finished a short head in front of stable companion Mogul.

The disappointment of the race was impressive Newmarket debut winner Kinross, who started favourite at 13-8 but never got into contention.

Abdulaziz, chief executive of Phoenix

Thoroughbreds, added: "As a group 1 winner at 2 and 3, Advertise has given us some brilliant days. His win in the Commonwealth Cup (G1) at Royal Ascot this year was a particularly special and happy day.

"We are really excited to stand him as a stallion at the National Stud alongside Aclaim, and we will be supporting his progeny in the sales ring. I would like to thank Martyn for the expert handling of his career and Frankie (Dettori) for his great rides and invaluable insights."

Speed, precocity, and toughness were the

hallmarks of Advertise's racing career, and when he was first unleashed by Meade, he hinted to the trainer he could be something out of the ordinary with an impressive debut success in a competitive Newbury maiden.

He was then pitched straight into pattern company and went down by just a length to Calyx in the Coventry Stakes (G2). He maintained his rapid upward curve when he landed the Arqana July Stakes (G2) by clear water on his next outing in what proved to be his final start outside of group 1 company.

The colt gained his first taste of top-level glory when he showed speed and spirit in equal measure to claim the Keeneland Phoenix Stakes (G1) at the Curragh, becoming the first British-trained runner in more than two decades to land the coveted prize. He rounded off his 2-year-old campaign with a hugely creditable second to Too Darn Hot, who now stands for £50,000 at Dalham Hall Stud, in the Darley Dewhurst Stakes (G1).

Advertise returned at 3 and, after a reappearance run in the QIPCO Two Thousand Guineas (G1), took his form to new heights when he produced a devastating performance in the Commonwealth Cup. He saw off Forever In Dreams and subsequent group 1 winners Hello Youmzain and Ten Sovereigns in a quicker time than past winners Caravaggio and Muhaarar.

After a runner-up finish in the Darley July Cup (G1), Advertise beat his elders as he recorded his third group 1 success in the LARC Prix Maurice de Gheest (G1). He again proved thoroughly game as he got the better of group 1 winners Brando, One Master, Pretty Pollyanna (GB), and Polydream.

"Advertise has a great constitution," said Dettori, who was in the saddle for all three group 1 wins. "He's blessed

with a high cruising speed and a dazzling turn of foot."

Bred by Cheveley Park Stud, the top-class sprinter boasts a pedigree that marries two of the current era's most prominent bloodlines. He is the highest-rated runner by Showcasing, whose own stud record includes horses such as Quiet Reflection, Soldier's Call, and Tasleet.

He is out of Furbelow, a six-furlong winner by champion broodmare sire Pivotal and, therefore, a full sister to listed winner Red Diadem.

"Advertise was a joy to have in the yard," Meade said. "To have a horse with his combination of speed, soundness, and consistency is very rare. I very much look forward to seeing his progeny on the track in years to come, and I hope they inherit some of his father's star qualities."

ABSCOND

The ascent has been swift for Apogee Bloodstock and Mike Anderson Racing's Abscond. The 2-year-old filly, bred in Kentucky by Michael Niall, has gone from a 2-year-old in-training sale RNA to a grade 1 winner in the span of four months. And with a pedigree that suggests she'll only get better as she gets older, there is plenty of room to grow.

A \$90,000 purchase by Apogee Bloodstock at the 2018 Keeneland September yearling sale, Abscond was prepped for auction early at 2, but bucked shins. Turned over to juvenile sales expert Eddie Woods, she wasn't quite ready for a later sale, and the group held on to her.

"She had a really big step and a good demeanor about her," said Apogee's Dr. J. Christian Hays. "We were all of the mindset that she needed to grow. People do like a very set model of what's attractive. A plucky pony is not attractive to some buyers, but she's a lot more attractive in the winner's circle."

The group, which consists of Kentucky horseman Peter Kirwan and trainer Eddie Kenneally, started Abscond at Ellis Park, where she broke her maiden by a head

going 5½ furlongs on the turf. A runner-up effort to the electric Kimari in Saratoga's Bolton Landing Stakes at the same trip preceded her nose win in the one-mile Natalma Stakes (G1T) Sept. 15 at Woodbine. She's set for a start in the Breeders' Cup World Championships.

"We're blown away by the prospects," Hays said. "We've come a long way from May. What's proven about her is she has a will that won't yield. That is the kind of genetics you want passed on. She'll be a great broodmare when the time comes."

Abscond is a daughter of Claiborne sire Blame, winner of the 2010 Breeders' Cup

Classic (G1). Her dam is Solitary Life, by Grand Slam, who is inbred 4x3 to Tamerett. Tamerett, who is "an important mare for the breed," according to Hays, is the dam of grade 1 winners and sires Known Fact and Tentam. Tamerett's daughter Secrettame is the dam of important sire Gone West.

Abscond is offered at this year's sale by Hunter Valley Farm.

"If she stays healthy, she's going to be successful for awhile," Hays said. "Most Blames aren't particularly precocious. They really blossom as 3- and 4-year-olds. There's a continued upside with her."

CALLBACK

Callback (Street Sense-Quickest, by Forest Wildcat) won the Las Virgenes Stakes (G1) in 2015, two years after she had been a \$375,000 yearling purchase. She also placed in that year's Santa Ynez Stakes (G2) and Eight Belles Stakes (G3). Elevage Bloodstock paid \$2.8 million for her as a broodmare prospect in 2015. Callback has an unraced 2-year-old War Front colt, Side Hustle, and a weanling Medaglia d'Oro colt. She is back in foal to that top stallion. Her second dam is Supercharger, the dam of Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) winner Super Saver. Supercharger, an A.P. Indy mare out of the Mr. Prospector mare Get Lucky, is also the dam of grade 3 winners Brethren (by Distorted Humor) and Cyrus Alexander (by Medaglia d'Oro).

Get Lucky, the third dam of Callback, is a graded stakes winner who excelled in her second career as a broodmare. Her A.P.

Indy colt Accelerator was a graded stakes winner, and Accelerator's full sister, Daydreaming, was a multiple graded stakes winner. Their full brother Girolamo won the 2010 Vosburgh Stakes (G1) and the preceding year's Jerome Handicap (G2).

"Callback hails from that great Get Lucky family. She is a grade 1 winner, and there are very few families as prolific over multi-generations as the Get Lucky family," said John Sikura, who will be selling Callback through his Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency.

"I am very selective when I pick mares to buy," said Sikura, who bought Callback for the Elevage partnership. "They have to be highly credentialed, and we have to have a reasonable expectation that these great families still have room to improve. I've made a living getting involved in important female families that will most likely have influence over time. Mares like Callback fit that criteria in my mind. "I have mixed emotions about selling her. She is a core piece of my broodmare band. But the partners in Elevage want to concentrate their resources toward stallion investments, and that's why mares like Callback and Take Charge Brandi are in the sale. There is no chance this is a culling, or that the mares are being offered because we didn't like the foals. In fact, the foals will be seen with the mares at the sale, which tells you we're proud to show them."

DAME DOROTHY

Grade 1 winner Dame Dorothy will be offered through Arthur Hancock III's Stone Farm consignment, agent, at the Keeneland November breeding stock sale. A \$390,000 Keeneland September yearling, Dame Dorothy (Bernardini-Vole Vole Monamour, by Woodman) raced over three seasons for Bobby Flay, accumulating five stakes victories among her seven wins from 12 starts, and earning \$749,740. As a 3-year-old in 2014, she took the Turnback the Alarm Handicap (G3) at Belmont Park and the Malvern Rose Stakes. As a 4-year-old, she won the Humana Distaff Stakes (G1), Bed o' Roses Handicap (G3), and the Florida Sunshine Millions Distaff Stakes.

Since entering the breeding barn in 2016, Dame Dorothy has produced an unraced 2-year-old filly by Curlin named Spice Is Nice and a weanling colt by Medaglia d'Oro. She sells in foal to Uncle Mo.

"She is a big, good-looking mare who has a crackerjack, grand-looking weanling by Medaglia d'Oro," noted Hancock. "In my opinion, she'd fit in any-

body's broodmare band."

Spice Is Nice was certainly well thought of in the auction ring. At the 2018 Keeneland September yearling sale, West Bloodstock went to \$1,050,000 to secure the filly for Robert and Lawana Low, and she is scheduled to make her initial start in November.

Dame Dorothy is a half sister to dual continent grade/group 1 winner Mrs. Lindsay (by Theatrical), who in 2007 won the Prix Vermeille Lucien Barriere (G1) and Prix Penelope (G3) in France and the E.P. Taylor Stakes (G1T) at Woodbine. Mrs. Lindsay earned \$1,201,621.

Adding to Dame Dorothy's appeal is her sire, Bernardini, who is currently the hottest broodmare sire in North America.

His daughters have produced the winners of six grade 1 events already this season, including Serengeti Empress (Longines Kentucky Oaks), Dunbar Road (Alabama Stakes), Wicked Whisper

(Frizette Stakes), Maxfield (Claiborne Breeders' Futurity), and Hunter O'Riley (United Nations Stakes).

"All of those winners are by different sires, which adds to the impressive nature of what Bernardini mares have done," noted Stone Farm's director of sales Lynn Hancock. "Dame Dorothy is a beautiful mare; she has good size, is balanced, and has a lovely head. She'd be one of the nicest mares we've got. She's also well-tempered. We've foaled out both her babies, and they are both impressive. Dame Dorothy will sell herself with her race record, family, and everything else. And she is in foal to Uncle Mo on the same cross that produced Mo Town."

ESKIMO KISSES

Pedigree, performance, and a top-shelf mating to prominent sire Curlin will put grade 1 winner Eskimo Kisses on many major buyers' short lists ahead of the Keeneland November breeding stock sale.

Strong family credentials made for high expectations when the striking chestnut daughter of To Honor and Serve stepped onto the racetrack. Her dam, Silver Colors, is a daughter of champion and 1988 Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Winning Colors, whom Gainesway's Graham Beck bought for \$4.1 million from Eugene Klein at the 1989 Keeneland November sale.

Eskimo Kisses captured her first win in her second start at 3 and two races later

became graded stakes-placed with a second in the TwinSpires.com Fair Grounds Oaks (G2) for trainer Kenny McPeek and partners Gainesway, Harold Lerner, and McPeek's Magdalena Racing. Nehoc Stables joined the partnership two months later.



The filly next proved she possessed grade 1 quality with a second in the Central Bank Ashland Stakes (G1) behind future Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) winner and cham-

pion Monomoy Girl.

"Monomoy Girl was loose on an easy lead and was never going to get caught that day, but Eskimo Kisses ran second in what was a very significant race," said Michael Hernon with Gainesway. Eskimo Kisses was 4¾ lengths behind Monomoy Girl that day but 5½ lengths ahead of the rest of the field.

Hernon said Eskimo Kisses' "tour de force" came in the Alabama Stakes (G1) where her brilliant kick at the top of the stretch propelled her past eventual grade 1 winner She's a Julie and grade 1 winner Midnight Bisou to win by 6½ lengths.

"She is a lovely, big, rangy filly that is a

good mover and correct. Her huge win in the Alabama was most impressive," Hernon said. "You can't underestimate the significance of Winning Colors as her second dam either. We see this repeated over time: Blood will win out. These pedigrees endure and the quality is there."

Eskimo Kisses made one start in 2019 before she was retired and sent in March to Hill 'n' Dale Farms' Curlin. The filly retired with a 3-4-0 record from 12 starts and earned \$711,102.

"Curlin is a proven horse that fits the mare well," Hernon said. "She's from a top family and has the license to be a significant producer. This mating gives the mare a very good chance to put a quality runner on the ground in her first year as a broodmare."

NEREID

Lane Seliger, under the Baumann Stables banner, made a splash in the Thoroughbred business at the 2013 Keeneland January Horses of All Ages sale, reaching to \$1.3 million to buy the grade 1-winning Nereid from the Winter Quarter Farm consignment. The purchase was just his second in the game. Looking to scale back his operation, Seliger, along with Dr. Aaron Sones, offers the daughter of Rock Hard Ten in foal to Quality Road during Book 1 of this year's Keeneland November sale. She's part of the Lane's End consignment.

"It's been a really interesting ride for me, and I've enjoyed every minute of it," Seliger said. "With a mare like Nereid, you have the opportunity to run your business at the upper end of the sport. She's a beautiful mare, and she's been very, very good to me."

As for his association with Lane's End, Seliger said: "They've been really good to me and have been really good for me. I've learned a lot about the business from Bill

Farish to Mike Cline to Chance Timm. I have a lot of trust and confidence in them."

Nereid, out of the Belong to Me mare Dowry, is a half sister to stakes winner and grade 1-placed Sea Queen. Nereid was bred in Kentucky by Mr. and Mrs. Emler Neuman and was raced by Eric Kronfeld and trainer John Shirreffs. It didn't take long for Nereid to make her way to the top, winning the 10-furlong American Oaks (G1T) in her fourth start in the summer of 2011. Later that year she placed in the Del Mar Oaks (G1T) and Keeneland's Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes (G1T).

The following year she raced exclusively in graded company on the turf in Southern California and came away with a placing

in Santa Anita's Rodeo Drive Stakes (G1T).

Seliger noted she had the potential to keep running, but his plan was to build a broodmare band so Nereid was retired from rac-

ing. She's proved to be a valuable asset as a broodmare of runners and of sale yearlings. Five of her offspring have collectively sold for more than \$2 million, with her colt by Speights-town bringing \$825,000 during Book 1 of this year's Keeneland September yearling sale. Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate Co. signed the ticket from the Lane's End consignment.

Nereid's second foal, Figarella's Queen, a daughter of Medaglia d'Oro, won last year's Sanibel Island Stakes at Gulfstream Park and placed in the grade 3 Indiana Oaks. She's stakes-placed in 2019 for Qatar Racing, Hunter Valley Farm, and Marc Detampel.

OLLIE'S CANDY

Players in the breeding end of the Thoroughbred game for more than 10 years, Paul and Karen Eggert came up with a savvy purchase at the 2015 Keeneland January sale, going to \$85,000 to buy Afternoon Stroll in foal to Candy Ride.

"The dam had won a grade 3 at Keeneland. When I bought her, I thought, 'Jeez, I just bought a stakes-winning mare carrying a Candy Ride foal,' "Paul Eggert said. "In hindsight, I did pretty good."

The foal she was carrying, Ollie's Candy, became a grade 2 winner in just

her third start in June 2018, and this year she took her game one better with a head victory going 1% miles at Del Mar in the Clement L. Hirsch Stakes (G1). That score, added with a close-up third

in Santa Anita's Sept. 29 Zenyatta Stakes (G2), makes her a player for the Nov. 2 Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1).

The Eggerts have a breed-to-sell plan for their breeding operation but aren't

about selling for less than they know they're worth.

"We board our mares with Sally Lockhart at Ballyrankin Stud (near Lexington), and Sally always said if you want to consider keeping one, this one was it," Eggert said. "She has a good work ethic and a good mind. You don't know if that will translate forward to having a fast horse on the racetrack, but she doesn't mind work."

"Sally said she was a brown paper bag. She's not flashy; she just slipped under a lot of people's radar (as a yearling). Thankfully, that worked our well for us."

Given time instead of pushing toward the 2-year-old races at Del Mar, Ollie's Candy debuted in April of 2018, drawing clear in a pair of races over the Tapeta at Golden Gate Fields under the care of Bill Morey.

Following the Summertime Oaks score, Ollie's Candy lost a pair of photos at Del Mar in the San Clemente Stakes (G2T) and Del Mar Oaks Presented by The Jockey Club (G1T).

Given time off and turned over to trainer John Sadler, she ran a solid second in Santa Anita's Wilshire Stakes (G3T) before her grade 1 score.

Regaring Ollie's Candy, Eggert is "certainly aware these don't come along very often."

Ollie's Candy will be offered through the Taylor Made Sales Agency

"I've purchased a few horses from them and bought Afternoon Stroll out of their consignment," Eggert said. "I enjoy working with them."

PURELY HOT

Striking while the iron is hot is a key element of the horse business. Looking to take advantage of a star on the rise, WinStar Farm is offering the 11-year-old mare Purely Hot for sale during Book 1 of the Keeneland November sale. In foal to rising star Union Rags, Purely Hot is best known in 2019 as the dam of Eight Rings, who figures to be the favorite for the Nov. 1 TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1).

"A couple of years ago we sold some mares of similar stature, and it worked well for us," said WinStar president and CEO Elliott Walden. "It's a normal business practice for us."

Purely Hot, a Maryland-bred daughter of Pure Prize—Wood Not, by Kissin Kris, placed in the Presque Isle Downs Masters Stakes (G2) in the summer of 2013 and the following spring won Woodbine's Whimsical Stakes for Unlimited Equine. At the end of a 32-start career, in which she won 12 times and earned \$426,905, she was sold for \$225,000 at the end of 2013, and then purchased by WinStar in



foal to WinStar stallion Bodemeister for \$250,000.

Purely Hot's second foal is Eight Rings, a strapping son of Empire Maker, who made his presence felt at last year's Keeneland September yearling sale, going to SF Bloodstock/Starlight West for \$520,000.

Turned over to Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert, Eight Rings made an early impression as he was 3-5 in his debut. A handy 6¼-length winner Aug. 4 at Del Mar, Eight Rings quickly came back in the Sept. 2 Runhappy Del Mar Futurity (G1), but bad racing luck had rider Drayden Van Dyke falling off Eight Rings soon after the start. The dark bay rebounded with a thrilling



six-length score in Santa Anita's American Pharoah Stakes (G1) at the Breeders' Cup Juvenile trip of 11/16 miles.

Purely Hot has a yearling by Win-Star stallion and

Breeders' Cup Mile (G1T) winner Tourist.

"He's really, really nice," Walden confirmed. "He's the best Tourist we've seen. He's a Canadian-bred, and we hope to win the Queen's Plate with him."

As for the broodmare market at Keeneland, Walden is bullish.

"The yearling market held up extremely well, and the appetite should be there to buy mares and breed more yearlings," he said. "The fundamentals in Kentucky right now with the purses at Churchill Downs, and Keeneland, and Kentucky Downs...and with Churchill buying Turfway, it's going to get better over the next few years. I don't think there is a better time to own a racehorse."

SAILOR'S VALENTINE

Anyone familiar with reading catalog pages in Keeneland sales should be familiar with Sailor's Valentine. The daughter of Mizzen Mast was a \$100,000 Keeneland September sale yearling in 2015 and sold for \$800,000 as a broodmare prospect last year by the Taylor Made Sales Agency for Ricki

and Ron Rashinski's Homewrecker Racing and Louise Lally and Dana Lally's Semaphore Racing.

Sailor's Valentine returns to Book 1 this year while in foal to top sire War Front and is being offered by Town & Country Farms and the Pollock Farms of Sam and Jo Pollock.

Town & Country Farms spreads over 320 acres in Central Kentucky near

Georgetown and is owned and operated by Louise and Kiki Courtelis. The Town & Country team has built a high-end broodmare band, which in turn has bolstered its presence at the top Thoroughbred sales in the U.S. On the track, Town & Country reached the pinnacle in 2015 with Stopchargingmaria's score in the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) at Keeneland.

As for Keeneland, Sailor's Valentine rang the bell in the 2018 Central Bank Ashland Stakes (G1).

"She's a grade 1 winner at Keeneland,

and you can't do much better than that," said Town & Country's president Shannon Potter.

"She's a big, good-looking mare as far as the physical goes. Not only does she check all of the boxes, she gives you that real excitement that, 'Man, if she produces something just like her...'

"We love how she's come along since she's been bred. She looks like a mother. She's big, pretty, carrying heavy; all of those things you like to see in a young broodmare. She's got a ton of bone; a lot of stretch to her. After she'd been bred, she's filled out well and come into herself."

Owning a share in Claiborne Farm's War Front, the Town & Country crew had an easy choice when it came to a mating for Sailor's Valentine.

"The physical match to War Front is perfect," Potter said. "She's a big, leggy mare. We think she'll stand out as being one of the top lots at Keeneland in Book 1. Keeneland does a wonderful job of bringing in the top buyers from around the globe, and we're looking forward to selling her in the first book and showcasing her to the world."

SPICED PERFECTION

A two-time grade 1 winner, Spiced Perfection has lived up to her name this year since stepping out from her base in Southern California. She has returned home for the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1) but appears to have plenty of blue sky ahead of her.

Bred in California by Premier Thoroughbreds, Spiced Perfection is a daughter of Smiling Tiger, a three-time grade 1-winning sprinter out of the Pleasantly Perfect mare Perfect Feat. Racing for the partnership group Dare To Dream Stable, she was a star at the state-bred level early in her career and really came of age Dec. 26, 2018, when she won the seven-furlong La Brea Stakes (G1) at Santa Anita Park. Watching was Thoroughbred owner Adam Wachtel, who along with partner Peter Deutsch, had bought into her.

"I bought her with my partners after she won the La Brea, and I was there when she won," Wachtel said. "I remember when I was handicapping the race, I

called one of my bloodstock agents and said, 'I love this filly.' The prior owners are ones I have dealt with before, and I wondered if I could buy in. I was so impressed with her. Afterward we were able to work out a deal that was good for everybody."

The idea was to showcase her around the country, and Spiced Perfection delivered on the group's plan of attack. She missed by a head in the Feb. 16 Barbara Fritchie Stakes (G3) at Laurel, then annexed her second grade 1 in Keeneland's Madison Stakes during the spring meet. After a fourth-place effort in the Humana Distaff Stakes (G1) at Churchill, she was given a break and returned

with a thrilling head score in Keeneland's Thoroughbred Club of America Stakes (G2) after stumbling at the start.

"What has excited me about her is

she is an incredible competitor," Wachtel said. "She takes her race with her; whether it is at six furlongs or at 11/16 miles. It doesn't matter whether it's Santa Anita, Keeneland, Laurel, Del Mar, or Los Al...she's just a runner. You have to love a horse that gives her all every time, and that's what she does.

"One of the other things that attracted me to her is the way she moves," he continued. "She moves so well; it gave me confidence. You give me a horse that moves like that, has a will to win, and talent, and that's a great combination."

Spiced Perfection will be offered as part of the ELiTE consignment.

TAKE CHARGE BRANDI

Continuing a trend that has seen it feature top lots year after year at the Keeneland November breeding stock sale, John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency boasts in its consignment this year champion and grade 1 winner Take Charge Brandi. The mare, 7, offers potential buyers the rare opportunity to buy into an unassailable family as Hill 'n' Dale acts as agent for a dispersal of bloodstock from the Elevage partnership.

Take Charge Brandi (Giant's Causeway—Charming, by Seeking the Gold) was a \$435,000 Keeneland September

sale yearling in 2013 who quickly justified her price by winning the Delta Downs Princess Stakes (G3), Starlet Stakes (G1), and 14 Hands Winery Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) en route to being named champion 2-yearold filly.

Sikura purchased Take Charge Brandi out of the 2015 November sale at Keeneland for \$6 million for the Elevage partnership and has bred her to Curlin, to Tapit twice, and to Justify.

Bolstering her appeal, Take Charge Brandi's half brother Omaha Beach has won this year's Arkansas Derby and Santa Anita Sprint Championship Stakes (both G1) and is a major contender in the Big Ass Fans Breeders' Cup

Dirt Mile (G1). He most certainly would have been the favorite in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) had a throat issue not sidelined him just before the race.

Take Charge Brandi's second dam, Take Charge Lady, was a multiple grade 1 winner who earned more than \$2.4 million and then was named Kentucky Broodmare of the Year for 2013. Take Charge Lady is the dam of grade 1 win-

ner and millionaire Take Charge Indy and champion and multiple grade 1 winner Will Take Charge, who earned better than \$3.9 million.

"She possesses a great pedigree and race record, and has all the achievements you could ask for," Sikura noted. "And then Omaha Beach comes along and is one of the most, if not the most, exciting stallion prospects of the year. So everything is teed up for her to be

one of the important mares in the stud book.

"Mark Casse has her 2-year-old Curlin colt and loves him, and Steve Asmussen loves the Tapit yearling. So as great as she is, there could be an explosion of greatness here very soon in that family.

"She is also carrying a filly by Justify, and any filly in this family is priceless.

"To give an analogy, this is like selling a finished home to someone who can move right in. All you need to add are your own finishings. This is a mare of special caliber."

The Elevage partnership group is dispersing its broodmare holdings to focus on stallion investments.

WILD FOREST

Quality has been the name of the game in the commercial bloodstock arena for the past several years, so offering a mare that has produced a runner with the star caliber of Paradise Woods along with course recordsetting stakes winners should bring a lot of traffic to the barn. Lane's End has in its consignment Jon Clay's Wild Forest, in foal to top sire Quality Road, selling as Hip 274c in Book 1 of the Keeneland November sale.

"She has a lot of commercial appeal, especially considering what's she's accomplished already," said Allaire Ryan, director of sales for Lane's End. "Physically she's a really lovely mare. She has plenty of size, depth, and substance. She's just a classy, very attractive mare. There's a lot of quality there."

And there is a lot of quality in Paradise Woods, who has made all but one start in Southern California first with trainer Richard Mandella for Steven Sarkowsky and Pam and Marty Wygod

and later with trainer John Shirreffs. Fourteen of her 17 starts have come in graded company, and she's proven to be among the best of her generation, having earned \$1,123,890.

By Lane's End sire Union Rags, Paradise Woods won the grade 1 Santa Anita Oaks and Zenyatta Stakes as a 3-yearold in 2017 and returned to top form in 2019 to win the Zenyatta a second time. She's pre-entered for the Nov. 2 Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) at her home base of Santa Anita.

Wild Forest, however, has produced

more than just Paradise Woods. Her second foal, Kentucky-bred Forest Chatter, by Dixie Chatter, won the 2015 California Flag Handicap and placed in a pair of stakes. In 2018

the dark bay gelding set a course record of :55.96 for five furlongs on the turf at Santa Anita. Another offspring, Broken Bridle (by Broken Vow) placed in the Dahlia Stakes at Laurel in 2018.

Wild Forest's 2018 foal, a full brother to Paradise Woods, sold to Juddmonte Farms earlier this year at the Keeneland September yearling sale.

The November sale, according to Ryan, will see "plenty of demand for young, attractive broodmares, especially if they're bred to proven sires."

And for the stellar lots, such as Wild Forest: "Any proven mare, especially one with a good commercial record, the commercial breeders are going to be there for a mare like this."
