



Horses break from the gate at Turfway Park

Fans of old-time television sitcoms might remember the memorable intro to the popular series "The Odd Couple."

It asked whether "two divorced men can share an apartment without driving each other crazy?"


The answer, famously played out from 1970-75, was a resounding "no."

In horse racing, there's a different twist on that question that can be mentioned as another presentation of the Eclipse Awards approaches.


This one asks whether four men, highly successful in their professions, can own hundreds of horses together for a decade and remain the best of friends while putting aside their egos and thriving on several fronts as they navigate the turbulent ups and downs of horse racing?

The answer to that much longer query—if you're talking about Michael Dubb, Mike Caruso, Stuart Grant, and Sol Kumin—is affirmative in every possible way.

In a sport where partnerships can be a revolving door, the four horsemen have banded together to enjoy

success at the sport's highest levels while reveling in an experience that has brought them thrills on the racetrack and a friendship away from it that one of them describes as priceless.

"The experience, the friendships, the camaraderie

you get from having great partners in racing is something you can't put a price tag on," Caruso said.

The four men have been involved in a supremely long list of partnerships, but since they first came together as a unit in 2016, they have enjoyed a remarkable amount of success—plus boundless enjoyment—from just two ventures.

They gave BSW Bloodstock partner Liz Crow roughly \$300,000 to shop at the 2016 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, and one of the five yearlings she bought for them turned out to be Monomoy Girl, the winner of the 2018 Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) and Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) and that year's champion 3-year-old filly trained by Brad Cox.

Purchased for \$100,000, the daughter of Tapizar races under the banner of Dubb, Kumin's Monomoy Stables, Grant's The Elkstone Group, and Caruso's Bethlehem Stables and has earned \$2,954,750 through nine wins in 11 starts.

"Monomoy Girl was an awesome experience," Kumin said. "We enjoyed going on the ride together and spending time together, so we did it again."

Reunited in 2018, they dispatched Crow to the yearling sales. Using Kumin's Madaket Stables group instead of Monomoy Stables, they gave Crow a budget of about \$650,000. This time, she bought 11 yearlings, including a daughter of Flashback bred

by Hargus Sexton, Sandra Sexton, and Silver Fern Farm who sold for \$40,000 at The October Sale, Fasig-Tipton's sale in Lexington, from the Warrendale Sales consignment. Named British Idiom, she won her debut at Saratoga Race Course for Cox, then captured the Darley Alcibiades Stakes (G1) at Keeneland to provide her sire with his first stakes winner. That set the stage for a dramatic neck victory in the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1).

"Only two yearling groups together and they have two Breeders' Cup winners and two champions. That's incredible," Crow said.

Now, with a 3-for-3 record and two grade 1 wins, British Idiom is a cinch to be named champion 2-yearold filly Jan. 23 at the Eclipse Awards dinner and give her delighted owners a second champion in as many years.

"It was surreal to win at the Breeders' Cup again," Dubb said. "I sometimes have to pinch myself when I think about how we will have two champions in the barn."

Beyond that, having good friends who are delighted to share those victories with him has only taken the

experience to a higher level.

"The common thing among us is that we really enjoy the camaraderie and the fun. It's great to have friends you can hug in the winner's circle. It's not a syndicate. We're partners, and it's more fun doing it

with friends," Dubb said. "If I never met racing, I'd have more money, but I never would have met the people I've met in racing, and I wouldn't trade the money for the people I've met. Where else could I meet people like Mike Caruso, Stu Grant, and Sol Kumin, who are good guys and we have so much fun."

The story of the men having such a ball owning Monomoy Girl and British Idiom dates well past their initial 2016 venture.

Each of them owned horses before that, and they currently have horses in other partnerships.

Caruso, a three-time NCAA champion wrestler at Lehigh University and founder of a prosperous benefits management company, has owned horses as far back as the 1980s. He enjoyed his finest moment back then with the Phantom House Farm group that campaigned Tale of the Cat and sold him for more than \$12 million as a stallion to Coolmore's Ashford Stud.

Dubb, the CEO of the Beechwood Organization, the largest developer of real estate on Long Island, bought his first horse about 15 years ago and in that time has not only evolved into a seven-time leading owner in New York and New York Racing Association board member but has been a guardian angel to backstretch workers through charitable work such as the construction of the Anna House child care facility at Belmont Park.

Grant, who has retired from his law practice in Delaware and now heads a litigation finance fund, has more than 15 years of experience as an owner and breeder. He bought the Camden Training Center in 2004 and bred multiple grade 1 winner and Spendthrift Farm stallion Mor Spirit.

Kumin is the newcomer of the bunch, but the Massachusetts hedge fund magnate has made a splash in the sport like few others. Since entering the game in 2014, Kumin has owned a share of more than 60 grade/group 1 winners, a staggering total that includes Justify, the 2018 Triple Crown winner he owned in a partnership without Dubb, Caruso, or Grant.

The first major horse for three of them was Grace Hall, named for the Lehigh wrestling arena where Caruso became an All-American. Caruso, Dubb, and Grant all had horses with trainer Tony Dutrow, who brought them together on Grace Hall, who won the Spinaway Stakes (G1) for them in 2011, finished second in that year's Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, and was sold for \$3.2 million in 2012 at The November Sale, Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky fall mixed sale.

A strong friendship quickly followed.

"We've become good friends. We see each other socially and will enjoy dinners together. It's been a great experience," said Grant, who pointed out how Caruso would come to Delaware and offer advice to his son, Sam, when the now 23-year-old Marine Corps lieutenant was a high school wrestler.

While the three continued to race together on occasion, Dubb and Caruso joined forces. Caruso now owns a share of each of Dubb's horses, a stable that totals about 100 but is subject to change at a moment's notice.

"People say, 'How many horses are you involved with?' and I'll say, 'As of noon,' because at 2 p.m. I'll get a text from Mike saying we bought two more horses or had one claimed," Caruso said.

For Dubb, teaming with Caruso has been a joy.

"I tell people the greatest part about owning racehorses is that it allows me to be partners with Mike Caruso. He's such a special person," Dubb said. "He's the epitome of class."

Working with Dubb can be a logistical headache. Check out Equibase.com and you'll see him listed in more than 275 partnerships since entering the sport, many of them with a different percentage of ownership in each group.

"Mike is my managing partner, and I don't know how he does it," Caruso said. "Our percentages will drive the top CPA in the country crazy. The guy who does it for Mike has to be sharp. That spreadsheet is unbelievable."

Dubb and Kumin's partnership was arranged by trainer Chad Brown, who brought them, plus Caruso, together for horses like Slumber, a winner of the 2015 Knob Creek Manhattan Stakes (G1T), and Wavell Avenue, who prevailed in the 2015 TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (G1).

"It's been great working with Sol," Dubb said. "He's great to be around, and we both love partnerships and the friendships we've built in the sport."

Kumin, who owns about 40 horses with Dubb and Caruso, believes that while each person might have a sweet spot in the sport, the group has been able to work for the common good.

"Mike Dubb and Mike Caruso think the way I do. We share a lot of the same opinions about trainers and how to manage things. We haven't had many issues at all. It's fun to enjoy winning with guys like them and Stu who you like and who share the same values," said Kumin, whose association with Grant has grown through both of them working with BSW Bloodstock founder Brad Weisbord. "We all like having partners, and we love being partners. We might look at things differently. I may like private sales, Mike Dubb might like claimers, Stu is more into breeding, but I benefit from their hard work and they benefit from mine. It's been an awesome partnership."

There are also times when all four are not involved in the same horses. For example, Grant did not join his friends when they teamed, sometimes with other individuals, to buy recent TVG Breeders' Cup Mile (G1T) winner Uni, multiple grade 1 winner World of Trouble, and Mr. Monomoy, Monomoy Girl's 2-year-old half brother trained by Cox who finished second in an allowance optional claiming race Dec. 21 at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots.

Yet Grant is fine with just rooting for his friends' horses and enjoys how they cheer for his horses, like the grade 1-placed Social Paranoia.

Horses like British Idiom and Monomoy Girl are a main reason for all the smiles, but ownership can also spawn a wealth of problems. Managing a stable can be problematic when it comes to issues like deciding on races, listing names in the program, and which silks to use, except that each of them is willing to check his ego at the door.

"Part of being a good partner is being sensitive to everyone's feelings," Kumin said. "We try to do the right things about who's in a lead position with each horse. Everything's not always perfect, but we haven't had any major issues."

Playing a key role in the harmony is having someone as respected as Caruso.

"There are a lot of egos in the group, but probably the guy with the least amount of ego is the guy who deserves to have the biggest ego, Mike Caruso," Grant said. "He's an All-American wrestler, the CEO of a company, and an all-around good guy, and he has no ego. When you see all the great things Mike has done, and he can put his ego aside and be so humble, why can't I do it? He's the calming influence."

They also agree on leaving decisions to their trainers.

"We have great trainers, and when push comes to shove, my feeling is, are you going to tell Chad Brown or Jason Servis how to train a horse? We are blessed to work with them," Caruso said. "After the way Brad Cox has trained Monomoy Girl and British Idiom, you think we're going to tell him how to train the next yearling? The best thing we as owners can do is stay out of their way."

Cox, for one, is appreciative of that.

"It's been good working with them," he said. "They are definitely not armchair quarterbacks. When you need to give horses time, they will let you do it. It's great when you have owners that you don't have to cringe when you are calling about a setback."

That patience was best reflected in the 2019 campaign of Monomoy Girl, who has yet to race since her win at the Breeders' Cup because of a mild case of colic and then a hamstring injury. The owners were quick to let Cox take his time with the filly, and she is now expected to rejoin Cox's stable in January and point toward the Apple Blossom Handicap (G1) in April.

"There's no telling where or when she'll run next, but it's exciting to get her back," Cox said. "She's an amazing filly."

Crow was thankful for the way the owners have gone out of their way to salute her for bringing Monomoy Girl and British Idiom into their lives.

"They all know how hard it is to get horses like Monomoy Girl and British Idiom," she said. "You see how much they love the sport when they walk the horses in together. It's great to see people have so much joy.

"Egos can get in the way in this sport, and that's why some partnerships don't work out, but it makes our jobs easy to have people like them. After the Juvenile Fillies, they were on television thinking about the people to thank, like me or Paul Sharp, who broke the horse. It's never about them."

What it's about hearkens back to a memory of a sitcom. Not "The Odd Couple." It's more like "Friends."

"This experience is like an expensive bottle of wine," Caruso said. "You can't just open it up and drink it yourself. You need someone to share it with you. Owning horses is the same type of thrill. It's so much better to win a big race with people you can share it with. That's the excitement and what I've learned from people like Mike, Stu, and Sol." BH



Joe Talamo achieves his 2,000th win aboard Rizzi's Honors at Los Alamitos Race Course

New Year's Eve in New Orleans is every bit as laissez les bons temps roulez as it sounds—at least, that's what I've been told—and Fair Grounds racing that day is mere prelude to the party. So it was Dec. 31, 2006, that the results of the \$74,250 Furl Sail Handicap figured to disappear into the mists of time, even though it was a cracking good horse race that came down to three on the wire at the end of the mile and a sixteenth on the main track.

First place went to Dash of Humor under Brian Hernandez Jr., the Eclipse Award-winning apprentice of 2004 and a native of Lafayette Parish who was more than holding his own as a journeyman. The runner-up was Aly's Vow, ridden by a New Orleans kid named Joe Talamo, who was coming to the end of his first season in the saddle still a dozen days shy of his 17th birthday.

The calendar pages turned. Talamo won an Eclipse Award of his own in 2007 as the nation's leading apprentice. The following spring he was firmly attached to Kentucky Derby (G1) favorite I Want Revenge when the colt was scratched the morning of the race. Hernandez likewise brushed close to greatness that same year as the rider of Rachel Alexandra in her first five starts before being replaced.

In 2009, Talamo, still a teenager, won the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1T) at Santa Anita Park aboard California Flag. Three years later, also at Santa Anita, Hernandez took the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) with Fort Larned. On his 27th birthday, no less.

It should come as no surprise, therefore, that on Dec. 19—one week after Talamo rode career winner No. 2,000 at Los Alamitos Race Course—Hernandez followed suit with his 2,000th winner at Fair Grounds. Also, Brian's middle name is Joseph.

Timelines with such happy coincidences are a pleasant surprise, except to students of odds and probabilities. The racing game is awash in dates and data, mounting by the hour, a feast for the numbers freaks among us. And yet, no one has ever been able to explain why Johnny Longden broke the career wins record of Sir Gordon Richards in 1956 on Labor Day at Del Mar, and then Bill Shoemaker broke Longden's record 14 years later, on Labor Day at Del Mar. Spooky.

Such moments have gained the national spotlight. The record stood until Laffit Pincay, tracked hourly by ESPN, surpassed Shoemaker's win total of 8,833 in December 1999 at Hollywood Park. Russell Baze took over from Pincay in late 2006 with win No. 9,531, then rode for another 9 1/2 years. The Baze total of 12,842 is exceeded only by the apparently indestructible Jorge Ricardo, the Brazilian iron man who recovered from serious injuries this year and has come within shouting distance of 13,000 winners.

Hernandez and Talamo have joined a club with at least the 51 North American members accessible through Equibase. Those well on their way to leaving the 2,000-win group include Joel Rosario, Tyler Baze, Paco Lopez, Julien Leparoux, and Irad Ortiz Jr. Awaiting them in the 3,000-win bracket are such household names as Chris Antley (3,480), Fernando Toro (3,555), Garrett Gomez (3,769), David Flores (3,608), and, to keep peace at home, Julie Krone (3,704).

The Talamo and Hernandez milestones mean a lot. And winners mean more than earnings, except in an individual's bank account, because purses

fluctuate wildly from one era to the next, or from one region to another.

A victory, though, is concrete. Finite. There's a picture to prove it and witnesses in the stands. The 3,854 winners ridden to date by Rodney Prescott in the Midwest required as much skill and fortitude as the 3,858 ridden by Cornelio Velasquez, whose mounts banked \$120 million more. John Grabowski's 3,401 winners meant just as much to the people behind them as the 3,404 accumulated so far by Victor Espinoza, the difference being that one is in the Hall of Fame and the other is the King of Finger Lakes.

While Hernandez continues to ply his trade in Louisiana and Kentucky, Talamo is among several Southern California jockeys who are feeling the pinch of smaller fields and shorter racing weeks out west. He is also enterprising enough to do something about it, which means he will be celebrating his 30th birthday on Jan. 12, 2020, in Hot Springs, Ark., getting geared up for the Oaklawn Park meeting that starts Jan. 24.

"Riding only two or three a day, I felt like I was kind of wasting myself, since I feel like I'm in my prime," Talamo said this week. "I'm sad to be leaving California, but I'm also excited."

Talamo will be represented at Oaklawn by agent Jake Romans, son of trainer Dale Romans. He is likely to encounter Hernandez come Keeneland and Churchill Downs later on, with a chance to reverse the photo of that Furl Sail.

"Hitting 2,000 was fun," Talamo said. "Now it's time to go to work on 3,000." BH Share this story

## THREE-YEAR TAX DEPRECIATION EXTENSION SIGNED INTO LAW

Akey provision that extends three-year tax depreciation for all racehorses through 2020 was signed into law Dec. 20 by President Donald Trump. The racehorse provision, which received bipartisan support within both Houses of Congress, was passed by the Senate Dec. 19 by a vote of 71-23 and passed by the House of Representatives Dec. 17 by a vote of 297-120.

"We are very pleased that Congress and the president worked together on a bipartisan basis to reinstate tax extenders legislation including three-year depreciation for racehorses," said Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. "We especially applaud Senate (Majority) Leader (Mitch) McConnell, Rep. Andy Barr, and Rep. John Yarmuth for helping to make this happen for Kentucky's signature industry and the many other jurisdictions throughout the United States that contribute to this \$36.6 billion sport and agribusiness. We also thank the sales companies and thousands of individuals who support our legislative efforts in Washington."

Uniform three-year racehorse depreciation was among numerous tax provisions across many industries that either expired at the beginning of 2018 or this year, or were set to expire as of Jan. 1, 2020. The bill reinstates the three-year schedule for all racehorses retroactive to 2018 and through 2020.

The provision allows taxpayers to depreciate, on a three-year schedule, racehorses 24 months of age and younger when purchased and placed into service, as opposed to a seven-year schedule.

"Three-year depreciation is important because it allows racehorse owners to better align the deduction for any yearling purchase with income opportunities when the horse is racing," said Jen Shah, director of tax services for Lexington-based Dean Dorton accounting firm and a consultant to the NTRA legislative team on federal taxation matters impacting the horse breeding and racing industry.

Three-year racehorse depreciation was most recently available to the industry in 2017, but Congress did not renew it for 2018 as part of the

Tax Cuts and Jobs Act passed in December 2017. The TCJA did include 100% bonus depreciation and a \$1 million Sec. 179 expense allowance for qualified depreciable property, two important investment incentives that lessened the need for three-year depreciation in many cases. However, three-year depreciation continues to be a beneficial option for many racehorse owners, especially racing partnerships with multiple passive owners, as it better aligns deductions with corresponding income opportunities on an annual basis.

The signing into law of three-year depreciation capped a nearly 24-month effort by the NTRA to have the tax option reinstated. The NTRA legislative team, which is supported by the Washington D.C.-based lobbying firm The Alpine Group, is charged with promoting and protecting the Thoroughbred industry's interests at the federal level. Funding for the NTRA's federal political activities are derived from contributions from thousands of individuals and national and regional horse sales companies that support the NTRA 1/4-Percent Check-Off Program and Horse PAC, the NTRA-owned and -managed Federal Political Action Committee.

Maintaining the three-year recovery period for racehorse purchases has been a top legislative priority for the NTRA federal legislative team since the provision's initial enactment as part of the 2008 Farm Bill. BH

#### SANTA ANITA POSTPONES OPENING DAY TO DEC. 28

S anta Anita Park will postpone the opening day of its 83rd season two days until Saturday, Dec. 28, because of next week's declining weather forecast, the track announced Dec. 21.

"Opening day is traditionally one of our biggest days of the year, but our commitment to safety is first and foremost," said Aidan Butler, the acting executive director of California for The Stronach Group. "It was very important to make this call as early as possible for our horsemen, fans, and employees. There are many moving parts, especially in the training of these wonderful horses, and this decision is being made at this time out of respect to give all involved plenty of advance notice."

"It is very difficult to predict weather forecasts in Southern California more than 48 hours in advance," said Dennis Moore, who has returned to his responsibilities overseeing Santa Anita track surfaces. "Right now, they have rain Monday through Thursday morning. But the models are continuing to change, and when they do that, they are usually building up moisture."

It would be the first time since the 1976-77 winter season that Santa Anita has not opened Dec. 26. Santa Anita last opened Dec. 28 in 1976. Last year's opening day on-track attendance was 41,373, with an all-time opening day handle record of over \$20 million.

"The stakes races set for Thursday will be brought back on Saturday," said Steve Lym, Santa Anita's vice president and director of racing. "With the rain in the forecast, it was extremely likely that the races would be off the turf on Thursday. Postponing opening day will allow for the high-quality turf racing synonymous with Santa Anita. We are planning on filling extra races throughout the opening week to give our horsemen the opportunity to run their horses."

Among the horses set to run is Fox Hill Farms' Omaha Beach, the likely heavy favorite in the Runhappy Malibu Stakes (G1), now set for Saturday.

"They are doing the right thing by moving the races," said Richard Mandella, Omaha Beach's Hall of Fame trainer. "I'm just very happy to be in the race with this horse."

The Malibu, seven furlongs for 3-year-olds, is one of five opening day stakes. The others are the La Brea Stakes (G1), seven furlongs for 3-year-old fillies; the San Antonio Stakes (G2), 1 1/16 miles for 3-year-

olds and up; the Mathis Brothers Mile Stakes (G2T), a mile on the turf for 3-year-olds; and the Lady of Shamrock Stakes, a mile on the turf for 3-year-old fillies.

Entries for opening day will be drawn Monday, Dec. 23, which was scheduled to be the entry day for that Saturday.

Santa Anita's revised opening week schedule has live racing Dec. 28-29, Jan. 1, and Jan. 3-5.

First post time Saturday will be 11 a.m. PT. BH

#### DIAMOND OOPS SHINES BRIGHT IN MR. PROSPECTOR STAKES

Diamond 100 Racing Club, Amy Dunne, D P Racing, and Patrick Biancone Racing's Diamond Oops battled back in the stretch of the \$100,000 Mr. Prospector Stakes (G3) Dec. 21 at Gulfstream Park to run down favorite Imperial Hint and score his second graded stakes win of the season.

All eyes were on battle-tested sprinters X Y Jet and Imperial Hint at the South Florida track. Making his first start since being scratched from the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) Nov. 2 at Santa Anita Park because of a hoof blister, Imperial Hint was an even-money favorite in the seven-furlong sprint. Also making his first start off an extended layoff was X Y Jet, who had not been seen since March when he won the Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored by Gulf News (G1) at Meydan.

X Y Jet broke sharply, bumping briefly with Zenden before driving to the lead. Jockey Javier Castellano took Imperial Hint in hand quickly and settled just outside the leader. The pair dueled relatively clear of

the competition along the backstretch as X Y Jet set fractions of :21.92 and :43.85 through the half-mile.

Guided by Julien Leparoux, Diamond Oops raced just off the pace through most of the race, settling in fifth in the six-horse field. Imperial Hint caught X Y Jet as they turned for home and pulled clear. X Y Jet weakened and drifted back as Diamond Oops cut down the center of the stretch to challenge Imperial Hint, who held gamely but did not have enough in reserve.

Diamond Oops rallied in the final strides and hit the wire one length in front in 1:21.36. Lasting Legacy made the widest trip of all to get up at the wire in a photo finish for second. Imperial Hint held for third.

"We obviously knew there was going to be a lot of speed in there. He broke sharp and settled really nice for me," Leparoux said. "At the three-eighths pole, I started to make my move. I was coming behind them loaded. I came out and he made a big run."

Zenden, Home Base, and X Y Jet completed the field.


Bred in Kentucky by Kin Hui Racing Stables, Diamond Oops is out of the Whywhywhy mare Patriotic Viva. Biancone, who trained both Whywhywhy and Patriotic Viva, said the Lookin At Lucky gelding's fighting spirit was typical of the family.

"He appreciates a little moisture in the track. He's had a good year of racing and training. He's still a young horse for his age because he missed a year," Biancone said. "We're very happy with him today. Even though the pace was fast, he was cruising behind them. Julien rode him perfect."

Trainer Luis Carvajal Jr. said he was pleased with Imperial Hint's third-place effort and hoped it would set him up nicely for a potential start in the Saudi Cup Feb. 29.

"Seven furlongs was a little too far. That's it. That's all I was worried about. Javier said he felt good. He just got a little tired. You could see him struggling a little bit at the end. His best distance is three-quarters. This will hopefully set him up good for Saudi. It gives us six weeks—almost two months to get him ready. And if all goes well, we'll jump to Dubai from there."

Diamond Oops' first graded win this year came in June, when he took the Smile Sprint Stakes (G3) at Gulfstream. He improved his record to 5-2-1 from 12 starts, with \$646,490 in earnings. BH

Gold Street, the even-money favorite, made his second consecutive start on a sloppy track after breaking his maiden Nov. 23 in the slop at Churchill Downs. The turf races were moved off the grass because of rain in the New Orleans area.

Jockey Ricardo Santana Jr. was aboard Gold Street, who was a head behind Ryan's Cat through the first half-mile. The fractions were :22.66 and :46.66. Ryan's Cat backed up after leading the first two-thirds of the race, and Amongst emerged from off the pace as a threat to Gold Street. Amongst tried to grind it out on the outside, but Gold Street handled the slop with ease and drew off by 3 1/2 lengths.

The final time was 1:11.20.

"He's a sharp horse that always breaks well,"
Santana said. "The track today is holding speed, so
I wanted to let him break and put us in a good spot
near the leaders. He's improving every day. He ran a
good race at Keeneland and then went to Churchill and
broke his maiden really nice. Today he just put us in a
good spot and got the job done."

McCarty purchased Gold Street for \$150,000 from St George Sales' consignment to the 2018 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. The colt was first bought by David Ross, with James Bredin Bloodstock as agent, for \$55,000 at the 2018 Ocala Breeders' Sales Winter Mixed Sale, where he was consigned by Abbie Road Farm.

The Sugar Bowl leaves Gold Street with a pair of firsts and seconds in five starts. He's earned \$135,218.

Juddmonte Farms' homebred 2-year-old filly Taraz romped in the \$75,000 Letellier Memorial Stakes, running six furlongs in 1:10.83 under jockey Florent Geroux. The Brad Cox trainee, by Into Mischief, remained undefeated in two starts with her 11 1/4-length win.

"She felt great underneath me. One of the best horses I've been on, feeling what I had underneath me," Geroux said. "We've liked her from the beginning, and sometimes you don't know how they will perform in the afternoon, especially with an off track like today, but she handled it perfect. The goal is to stretch her out and run her long. We just wanted to sprint her one more time and give her a race. She's a big, beautiful filly and is well bred, so we have high hopes for her."

Michael Hui, Hooties Racing, and WSS Racing's Pete's Play Call earned his first stakes victory in an off-the-turf \$75,000 Bonapaw Stakes, beating favorite Wilbo by 2 1/2 lengths. The 6-year-old Munnings gelding, claimed by trainer Mike Maker for \$80,000 in September, completed the 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:04.38 with Santana up.

Stonehaven Steadings' Notapradaprice pushed her earnings over the \$500,000 mark by winning the \$75,000 Blushing K. D. Stakes off the turf. The 5-year-old Paddy O'Prado mare trained by Eddie Kenneally wired the field, drew off by 6 1/2 lengths under Corey Lanerie, and wrapped up 1 1/16 miles in 1:45.88.

The majority of the field scratched after the \$75,000 Buddy Diliberto Memorial Stakes was moved off the turf, but Lothenbach Stables homebred Captivating Moon made the best of the sloppy conditions and rallied to his first stakes win, scoring by 1 3/4 lengths. Chris Block trains the 4-year-old Malibu Moon colt, who completed 1 1/16 miles in 1:45.82 with Brian Hernandez Jr. in the irons.

Lawrence Roman, Heads Up Racing, and Lucky Dog Stables' Pioneer Spirit, a \$150,000 claim last out, returned to win the \$75,000 Tenacious Stakes in an all-out effort under David Cohen. Robertino Diodoro trains the 6-year-old Malibu Moon son, who won by a head and ran one mile and 70 yards in 1:44.09.

Ballard High was pulled up after leaving the backstretch in the Tenacious and vanned off. He suffered a broken shoulder and was euthanized due to the extent of the injury, as first reported by Daily Racing Form.

Mr. Monomoy, a half brother to champion Monomoy Girl, headlined an allowance optional claiming event for 2-year-olds but was caught late as Lynn's Map got his head in front at the wire. The winner completed one mile and 70 yards in 1:45.09 with Lanerie aboard. Lynn's Map, a Liam's Map colt, is trained by Mark Casse for HRH Prince Sultan Bin Mishal Al Saud. BH

## LOCAL ADVISORY PANEL CREATED FOR BELMONT PARK

After 10 years of delays, neighborhoods groups near Belmont Park have won their fight to get the state of New York to create a local advisory panel that will have input on development and major issues that arise at the track.

Similar advisory panels have already been in place for more than 10 years at Saratoga Race Course and Aqueduct Racetrack.

The Belmont legislation, approved in June by state lawmakers in Albany, was signed late in the evening Dec. 20 by Gov. Andrew Cuomo.

The Belmont advisory board will have 15 members serving without compensation for two-year terms. Five will be appointed by the Nassau County executive, with four of them required to be a resident of Elmont. Two will come from Hempstead, appointed by that town's supervisor, and those members must reside in Elmont, too. Other local mayors and village boards get appointees to the

panel; the New York Racing Association, which runs Belmont, gets to name three people to the group; and two will be appointees of the Queens Community Board 13 in New York City.

The measures were sponsored by Sen. Anna Kaplan and Assemblywoman Michaelle Solages; both are Democrats from Nassau County.

Lawmakers had said creation of the advisory group had become a top priority for many neighborhood leaders in areas near the track. Kaplan, in June, said the panel will "finally give our constituents the voice that they deserve."

"This advisory board seeks to protect the quality of life for the surrounding communities and will offer great insight into the concerns and needs of the neighboring residents," legislators wrote this year in a bill memo supporting the idea.

The panel is intended to serve as a liaison between the community and NYRA to address everything from crowd control issues during the Belmont Stakes (G1) to any future development plans NYRA might have for the track. BH

A 4-year-old homebred for Mr. Amore Stable, Firenze Fire enters the six-furlong Gravesend off a 4 1/4-length victory in the Fabulous Strike Stakes Nov. 27 at Penn National. The Poseidon's Warrior colt has made eight starts this year, including an impressive 4 3/4-length win in the Runhappy Stakes May 11 at Belmont Park.

Firenze Fire had runner-up efforts in the Forego Stakes Presented by Encore Boston Harbor (G1) and Vosburgh Stakes (G1) ahead of a fifth-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) Nov. 2 at Santa Anita Park.

Servis assistant Henry Argueta said Firenze Fire is in prime condition.

"He's doing really well at the moment," Argueta said. "We know it's a little close coming back from the Fabulous Strike, but he came out of his last race well and has shown good energy. He certainly deserves the chance to pick up another stakes race following his campaign, and that's what we'll hope for."

Happy Farm, a 5-year-old Ghostzapper gelding for M and A Racing, was claimed for \$30,000 in March at the Big A. Following a second-place finish in his first start for his new connections, Happy Farm has reeled off four consecutive wins, including a frontrunning score last out in the Fall Highweight Handicap (G3).

"When we got him, we knew he had some talent and back form," Argueta said. "He's really turned a corner for us and has been able to stay healthy and has improved in every start. We took a shot with him in the Fall Highweight because he has done so well, and he proved he belonged with a hard-fought victory. Since then, he's continued to train well in the mornings, and we'll see if he can pick up another stakes win here."

The 5-year-old Tiz Wonderful son has made five starts this year, including two victories. He finished second in the non-black-type Rumson Stakes July 4 at Monmouth Park.

"He ran a game race last time out," Nevin said.
"Since then, he's continued to do well, so hopefully he can run another good race here."

With a record of 1-2-0 from three starts at Aqueduct, Wonderful Light will depart from post 4 under jockey Jorge Vargas Jr.

Also entered is fan favorite T Loves a Fight for trainer Orlando Noda in ownership with Noda Brothers who will look to improve off a second-place finish in the New York Stallion Series Stakes Thunder Rumble division Nov. 24; No Distortion for trainer Bob Dunham and Jupiter Stable; and Seethisquick for owner and trainer Darmindra Dharamiit. ## TOP NEW ZEALAND STALLION TAVISTOCK DIES AT 14

Cambridge Stud has announced the death of influential stallion Tavistock, who suffered complications to an injury sustained in a field.

Bred by Bloomsbury Stud in New Zealand, the 14-year-old stems from the outstanding family developed by the Duchess of Bedford from blue hen Mrs. Moss, whose progeny include 1986 Japan Cup (G1) winner Jupiter Island.

Tavistock, by Montjeu, struck at group 1 level in New Zealand for Mick Price and also made an impact in Australia but has become even more effective as a stallion in Australasia and Asia.

He has produced 19 stakes winners and 11 group winners, with particular success stories being the Hong Kong champion Werther and Sky Racing Rosehill Guineas (G1) and AAMI Victoria Derby (G1) scorer Tarzino. He was most recently standing for NZ\$50,000 (US\$32,556) but was being rested after his setback.

A statement from the stud read: "Cambridge Stud reported eight weeks ago that Tavistock suffered a lifethreatening injury in a freak paddock accident.

"Although he made significant progress from the initial injury, he sustained secondary complications following further surgery last week and was put down on yets' advice this afternoon.

"We want to thank our vet team of Dr. Rob Hitchcock and Dr. Alanna Zantingh of Cambridge Equine along with Dr. Ric Redden from Kentucky for their extraordinary efforts to save him.

"The Cambridge Stud staff have been nothing less than heroic in what has been an intensely difficult season for them. Tavistock's legacy will live on through his many sons and daughters. He cast a giant shadow at Cambridge and he will be sorely missed."




