# THE 146TH KENTUCKY DERBY MOVED TO SEPT. 5

The 146th Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) at Churchill Downs will be rescheduled from May 2 to Sept. 5, and the 146th Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) will be rescheduled from May 1 to Sept. 4. These dates are contingent upon final approval from the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, which is expected at its next meeting March 19.

"For the second time in the 145-year history of the Kentucky Derby, the first time being at the end of World War II, we will move the date of the Derby," Churchill Downs Inc. CEO Bill Carstanjen said during a March 17 teleconference with the media and investors. "Our team is united in holding the best Kentucky Derby ever and certainly the most unique in any of our lifetimes. While we are always respectful of the time-

honored traditions of the Kentucky Derby, our company's true legacy is one of resilience and embracing of change and unshakable resolve.

"We have moved past the fact we are changing a time-honored date that has not been touched in 75 years," Carstanjen continued.

"It had to be done. We own it and will make it a really special day. We are also excited that NBC is in talks to move the Preakness and Belmont Stakes to September and early October, respectively. We hope the parties can reach a final agreement. It will make for a really unique Triple Crown season and a perfect set-up for this year's Breeders' Cup."

As of 11 p.m. ET March 16, Maryland Jockey Club officials had not finalized any plans on this year's Preakness Stakes (G1), currently scheduled May 16 at Pimlico Race Course.

"Our first priority in these difficult times is the health and welfare of our industry participants and the public at large," read an MJC statement. "We are working with state

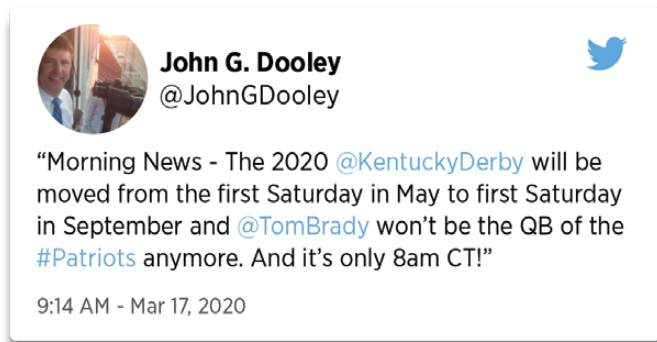

and local governments, our industry participants, media, and other affiliates to determine the most appropriate time to conduct the Preakness Stakes. While we are mindful of the challenges these times present, we also know that events like the Preakness Stakes can help restore our sense of place and economic well-being to our communities and state. As soon as we have further clarity on these matters, we will inform all."

Mike Ricci, the communications director for Maryland Gov. Larry Hogan, tweeted: "After Kentucky Derby announcement today, we are in active discussions to POSTPONE the Preakness Stakes until September."



The New York Racing Association also is working through the best date for the Belmont Stakes (G1), which is currently scheduled for June 6 at Belmont Park.

"NYRA is working closely with all appropriate parties, including media rights holder NBC Sports, to make a determination about the timing of the 2020 Belmont Stakes," NYRA CEO and president Dave O'Rourke said. "As the coronavirus pandemic continues to upend American life, decisions about large-scale public events must prioritize public health and safety above all else. NYRA will deliver an announcement only when that process has

concluded to the satisfaction of state and local health departments. The Belmont Stakes is a New York institution with wide-reaching economic impact. We look forward to its 152nd edition in 2020."

The past few weeks have been tumultuous for the sports world. Major League Baseball canceled spring training games, the NBA suspended games as of March 11, the NHL suspended play immediately, and college conference tournaments and the NCAA Tournament was canceled. The PGA also canceled The Players Championship, and The Masters has been postponed. As of March 16, only the May 24 Indy 500 was expected to continue as scheduled.

Like all businesses nationwide, Churchill Downs has been steadily making adjustments to its operations. The March 14 Jeff Ruby Steaks (G3) at Turfway Park was run spectator-free. The company then delayed the opening of its stable area at Churchill Downs and its Trackside auxiliary training center. The stabling areas had been closed since Dec. 31 for annual winter renovations and were scheduled to reopen March 17. CDI also suspended operations at its Derby City Gaming historical horse racing facility and simulcasting at Churchill Downs Racetrack for 14 days effective at midnight March 15.

While Carstanjen noted that conducting horse racing without spectators has been a good option in some instances where events can be held safely, he said the energy of the Kentucky Derby comes from the crowd.

"We are confident we will run the Kentucky Derby and run it with a crowd," he said. "The Kentucky Derby is a participatory event; its energy and its magic really comes from everybody being there to enjoy it. We will roll with the punches, but we feel very good that Sept. 5 is the right date."

In regard to qualifying to run, Carstanjen said new races will be added to the Road to the Kentucky

Derby schedule, allowing expanded opportunities for horses to earn a spot in the starting gate. Nothing about the rescheduling of the Derby or the expanded schedule affects the points that have been earned so far.

"We will take existing stakes races around the country and incorporate them into our point system. We will work with other prominent partner tracks that operate throughout the summer and determine the various paths to the starting gate at the Derby and enable the horses in the best form to compete," Carstanjen said.

As for the stakes schedule built around Kentucky Derby week, the entire schedule planned for the first week in May will be transferred to the first week in September, according to Kevin Flanery, president of Churchill Downs Racetrack.

"Our intention is to move that Tuesday through Saturday footprint to September, starting Sept. 1 through Sept. 5, and really replicate the racing we would have had leading up to the first Saturday in May," Flanery said.

Moving the Kentucky Derby to Sept. 5 will affect Ellis Park, which had been scheduled to run through Sept. 6. The track near Henderson, Ky., however, will now end its meeting Aug. 30, according to Skip Sayre, chief of sales and marketing for Ellis Entertainment, the parent company of the racetrack.

"We had fairly rapid discussions with Churchill Downs and the racing commission, and we were really more than willing to forgo the final weekend of our meet to make room for Kentucky's premier racing event. I think of it as the Super Bowl of racing," Sayre said. "Particularly as new players in the industry in Kentucky and with the unprecedented events we are dealing with right now, there wasn't a difficult decision for us to step aside

and make the Kentucky Derby happen. And so that's what we did."

Sayre said Ellis "will be made whole" in terms of the financial impact of shortening its meet but said he was not at liberty to disclose the financial arrangements.


Kentucky Oaks and Kentucky Derby tickets purchased for the originally scheduled dates are automatically valid for the new race dates. You may arrive on the new dates in September with your printed ticket or mobile ticket to be scanned for entry at the gates. Information on a new ticket shipment date will be sent directly to ticket purchasers.

If you have purchased a ticket and are not able to attend the newly scheduled race dates, information regarding refund requests will be available at this site ([KentuckyDerby.com/updates](https://KentuckyDerby.com/updates)) by the end of this week. If your ticket was purchased from a vendor or secondary market website other than Churchill Downs, Ticketmaster.com, or Derby Experiences, please contact that site directly. CDI said it is unable to process refunds for those tickets.

Bets placed as part of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager will pay off to the result of the rescheduled Sept. 5 race, said Darren Rogers, senior director of communications and media services for Churchill Downs. The subject will be discussed further March 19 during a Kentucky Horse Racing Commission meeting, and the track plans to request additional dates for future KDFW pools in July and August, he added.

# OWNERS, TRAINERS REACT TO KENTUCKY DERBY POSTPONEMENT

After pointing their 3-year-old colts for months toward the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) at Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May, horsemen began operating with amended calendars March 17 following the race's official postponement until Sept. 5.

The road map to get there is largely unknown, however, in a world and racing landscape dramatically altered by precautions undertaken to prevent the spread of COVID-19, caused by the coronavirus. Already, two Road to the Kentucky Derby prep races, the Sunland Park Derby (G3) and Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2), have been canceled, and entire race meets, such as the one at Keeneland, will not be conducted. More could follow.

In many jurisdictions, owners and trainers are uncertain whether their region's tracks will be racing next week, let alone beyond that, creating confusion about what to expect. Nor has the entire Triple Crown schedule, a sequence that also includes the Preakness Stakes (G1) and Belmont Stakes (G1), been finalized, if it remains a series for 2020.

Collectively, it adds up to an unclear lead-up to the Derby, though many are relieved it is still scheduled

for 2020. Other major sporting events went on a year's hiatus.

Bob Baffert, who has won five Kentucky Derbys and two Triple Crowns and has one of the most loaded stables of young horses in the country, is having none of the woe-is-racing mentality. He declined to speculate about what he would do with a couple of his 3-year-olds who were entered but will not run in the Sunland Park Derby: Azul Coast and High Velocity.

"The Kentucky Derby—at least they didn't cancel it, but at the end of the day, it still is just a horse race," he said Tuesday. "I'm more worried about everybody else in the world."

Baffert's sentiment was shared by several owners and trainers.

"The health of the people is most important. What is the Kentucky Derby compared with a worldwide sickness?" said Patrick Biacone, who trains high-profile contenders Sole Volante, who is likely headed next for the April 4 Wood Memorial Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G2), and Ete Indien, who is being aimed for the Curlin Florida Derby (G1). "They made the right decision. We'll see what happens, and I hope things will be better throughout the world as soon as possible with the least damage as possible."

"Obviously, we have been pointing toward the first Saturday in May, but we'll adjust," said Mark Casse, who trains John Oxley's Enforceable, who won the

Lecomte Stakes (G3) and is entered in the spectator-free TwinSpires.com Louisiana Derby (G2) on Saturday. "As important as the Derby is to all of us, it is not as important as everybody's health. We are going to be hit with adversities in life, and it comes down to how we deal with them."

Churchill Downs executives said in a teleconference Tuesday that new races would be added to the Road to the Kentucky Derby series, though no specific stakes or points have been established. Stakes schedules across the country could change, both from the immediate effect of the coronavirus and from the repositioning of the Derby and

“The Kentucky Derby—at least they didn't cancel it, but at the end of the day, it still is just a horse race. I'm more worried about everybody else in the world.”

potentially other races. Horses will retain the points they currently have.

Casse said he is happy the Louisiana Derby will still be run, and he hopes other tracks will consider running some races without spectators, as was done with the Jeff Ruby Steaks (G3) at Turfway Park.

"If anyone can do this, it is the Kentucky tracks," Casse said. "It is going to be hard for a while, but the quicker we are on this, the quicker it will be over."

While trainers and owners welcomed the relatively quick decision and announcement that the Kentucky Derby would be moved, the almost daily changes in racing schedules are making these uncharted waters particularly hard to navigate.

"We really can't make any real plans until we know which tracks are going to be open, which races are going to be run, and which races are going to have points," said Jack Wolf, the founder of Starlight Racing, which co-owns Derby prospects Authentic, Charlatan, and Eight Rings in large partnerships.

Lightly raced Charlatan and grade 1 juvenile winner Eight Rings, who has yet to start this year, might capitalize from the Derby postponement, potentially

picking up valuable starts. Though Wolf countered that the added time might not prove as beneficial to Authentic, who is perfect in three races, including the March 7 San Felipe Stakes (G2) at Santa Anita Park against a star-studded field.

"Eight Rings, the extra time could help him if he is going to compete in these two-turn races," Wolf said. "And, you know, Authentic, he seemed to be right on schedule. He seems to be the one you'd be more concerned with because he was in very good form. I guess he will still run in the Santa Anita Derby (G1) if, indeed, they have it.

"I guess he would have been the favorite for the Derby at this point— if it had been May 2—so the negative part of that sort of outweighs the additional time you get with the other horses."

Sol Kumin, whose Madaket Stables also owns a share of Authentic, Charlatan, and Eight Rings, said he also looks forward to seeing what races are assigned points toward the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1), which was moved to Sept. 4 by Churchill this year. Madaket is a part-owner in British Idiom, last year's champion 2-year-old filly.

"We have a few solid contenders for both the Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks, so the moving of the races wasn't ideal, but these are unprecedented

times and you just have to hope a few of these horses, or maybe some others, can be in form and peak in September," he said. "For now, I just hope they can run the Florida Derby, Wood Memorial, Santa Anita Derby, and Arkansas Derby (G1) as scheduled."

Along with Eight Rings, Maxfield, who has yet to run this year after off-season ankle surgery, might also be more apt to make the Derby with more time to prepare. A 3-year-old son of Street Sense, he broke his maiden on debut in September at Churchill Downs before taking the Claiborne Breeders' Futurity (G1) last fall at Keeneland. The Godolphin homebred is trained by Brendan Walsh.

Frustrating in the Derby announcement Tuesday by Churchill Downs was the lack of "coordinated response with the other Triple Crown players," said Jack Knowlton, the managing partner of Sackatoga Stable, which owns Tiz the Law, the expected favorite for the March 28 Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park.

"That would have made me feel better if there was a plan, but maybe it's too early for a plan. I'm not sure," he added.

By early afternoon Tuesday, Maryland Jockey Club officials had not publicly announced any plans for this year's Preakness Stakes (G1), currently scheduled for May 16 at Pimlico Race Course, though Mike Ricci, the communications director for Maryland Gov. Larry Hogan, tweeted that discussions were ongoing to postpone the race until September.

The New York Racing Association said in a statement following the Churchill announcement that it is working through the best date for the Belmont Stakes, which remains slotted for June 6 at Belmont Park.

Other races on NYRA's traditional schedule might need altering. While the Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1) has traditionally been contested a week before the new date for the Kentucky Derby, and the Alabama Stakes (G1) two weeks before the rescheduled Kentucky Oaks, NYRA says it has yet to release its stakes schedule for the Saratoga Race Course meet and will address it in time.

Knowlton, a native New Yorker, is hopeful the Travers could be repositioned earlier on the summer calendar so Tiz the Law could use a start there to make his way to the Derby.

This is "totally unprecedented, and we hope we can get through it and it will be an interesting one-timer," he said.

Aron Wellman, the president and founder of Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, said despite the challenges moving the Kentucky Derby has caused, the industry also needs to collectively embrace the opportunity the change could create.

If the Triple Crown races were moved to September and October, the positioning of the classics as lead-ins to the Breeders' Cup World Championships at Keeneland Nov. 6-7 could produce a compelling series for fans and sponsors.

"Hopefully, the racetrack operators get together and really mesh," said Wellman, whose horses include grade 3 winner and Sam F. Davis Stakes (G3) runner-up Independence Hall, who is being aimed for the Florida Derby. "We are doing ourselves a disservice if we just go through the motions here. With so many sports completely shut down, we're the only game in town. We are being presented with an incredible opportunity, and the only question is what we do with it. We have a very narrow window to act."

# CORONAVIRUS TO HALT RACING IN BRITAIN UNTIL MAY

Racing in Britain will be canceled from March 18 until the end of April, with the British Horseracing Authority taking the drastic step as a result of the spiraling coronavirus pandemic.

The radical action was implemented March 17 and brings to an end the sport's short-lived period of racing behind closed doors, which had been agreed by the BHA, racecourses, and horsemen following consultations with the industry's COVID-19 steering group.

However, following the March 16 ramping up of social distancing measures by the U.K. government, including advice to avoid all nonessential travel and social gatherings in an attempt to slow the spread of the virus, racing's leaders pulled the shutters down on the action.

BHA chief executive Nick Rust said in a statement: "This is a national emergency the like of which most of us have never seen before.

"We're a sport that is proud of its connection to rural communities and to the local businesses that support our industry. But our first duty is to the health of the public, our customers, and to racing industry participants and staff, so we have decided to suspend racing following the government's latest advice.

"Racing is a family, and I know we will pull together over the coming days, weeks, and months and support each other. By stopping racing, we can free up medical resources, doctors, and ambulances—be they private sector or NHS—to assist in the national effort to fight this virus. And we can support racing industry participants and staff as they face up to the personal challenges ahead and care for their own families.

"There will be difficult months ahead for many of us. We need to focus now on ensuring that we can continue to look after our horses as the virus affects the

thousands of participants and staff who dedicate their lives to caring for animals. We need to do what we can to support businesses inside and outside racing and the many people whose livelihoods depend upon this £4 billion industry."

The decision was taken after discussions with senior industry leaders and will be "kept under constant review."

Rust added: "We are in constant contact with government, which understands the very significant consequences of this decision for jobs and businesses. We will work with them to do our best to manage the impact.

"Racing leaders will keep today's decision under constant review and endeavor to keep all customers, participants, staff, and dependent businesses

informed as the situation progresses."

The impact of the virus, which has caused 55 deaths in Britain, had already caused the cancellation Monday of next month's marquee Randox Health Grand National meeting, and the BHA move will result in a number of other high-profile meetings being impacted.

These include All-Weather Finals day April 10, the bet365 Craven meeting at Newmarket from April 14-16, the Coral Scottish Grand National and Newbury's Greeham meeting April 18, and Sandown's bet365 jumps finale April 25.

Popular racing open days at Lambourn and Middleham on Good Friday have also been postponed as the sport deals with the fallout from the global crisis.

Mass cancellation and postponements have been taking place across the world of sport since last week

as organizations and governments grapple with the significant, continuing impact of COVID-19.

Premier League football, Euro 2020, Test cricket, the Six Nations rugby, Formula 1 motor racing, the Greyhound Derby, and The Masters golf are among the events affected by the virus. The Olympics in Japan is also in jeopardy.

Racing has been taking place without spectators in Ireland, Australia, the UAE, and Hong Kong. On Monday, racing in France was canceled until mid-April after initially being behind closed doors.

In the U.S., racing continues without racegoers in many parts of the country, but Keeneland's spring meeting has been called off and the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) is pushed back to Sept. 5.

The air was filled with uncertainty and no small amount of sanitizer March 17 when the doors opened for the first session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales March Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training.

But as consignors and buyers poured through the doors—graciously manned by OBS employees working to make sure attendees touched minimal surfaces in order to delay the spread of COVID-19—business proceeded without much interruption for the better part of seven hours.

OBS reported 134 horses from 241 offered were sold for gross receipts of \$12,550,500, at an average of \$93,660 and a median of \$50,000. The 107 that went unsold represented an RNA rate of 44.4%.

At last year's session, 157 horses changed hands for \$22,786,500, an average of \$145,137 and a median of \$77,000. Forty-eight went unsold for a buyback rate of 23.4%.

Despite a precipitous decline in sales, consignors and buyers remained hopeful but realistic about how the continued pressures of the COVID-19 pandemic have affected the market and the expendable income of many buyers looking to buy juveniles.

"It's not great and the atmosphere isn't great, but at the same time we're getting some horses moved, which is better than no horses moved," consignor Eddie Woods said. "It isn't great for everybody, but we'd be way worse off if we didn't have this sale and no horses got moved. What would we do with them all? We don't know what the future holds for us going forward or when the next sale will be. It's a gray area. So the fact that we are able to get a few done here is great."

"The sale overall, I would say we were all tied on for worse," said Nick de Meric of de Meric Sales. "There are people here trying to fill orders and buy horses, and I think we have to be grateful for that in the current climate. All things considered, I think we're very grateful that we had this sale and that we've been able to move some inventory."

Topping the sale Tuesday was Hip 237, a \$650,000 American Pharoah filly out of the Songandaprayer mare Megalicious. Consigned by Wavertree Stables, agent, and purchased by agents on behalf of Katsumi Yoshida, the filly is a half sister to stakes-placed My Sweet Stella.

Despite a general reticence to travel, the Japanese contingent remained active at the upper end of the market through the first session. A group of several agents representing Yoshida also signed the ticket on Hip 65, a \$420,000 Medaglia d'Oro colt from the consignment of Top Line Sales, agent.

"I was very nervous bringing that horse up here," said Torie Gladwell of Top Line Sales. "He's been extremely popular. We were really afraid of the market and watching what was going to happen. But watching closely, every good horse that has been brought up here has pretty much sold, so that gave us some confidence. The breeder and the partners will be very happy that the horse has sold."

Bred in Kentucky by Fred Hertrich, Hip 65 is out of the Dansili mare Flagstaff and from the extended

family of Prix de la Foret (G1) winner Etoile Montante and grade 2-placed Starformer.

"The Japanese traveled a long way, and they've been here and attended the breeze show," OBS director of sales Tod Wojciechowski said. "They were concerned and had to deal with this (COVID-19) in their home country as well. They have been able to buy nice horses out of here like Cafe Pharoah last year. They've been fortunate and have done a good job of getting some very nice horses out of the March sale. I wasn't surprised to see them active."

With 10 horses sold from 12 offered, Wavertree Stables ended the day as the top consignor. Gross receipts for its horses were tallied at \$2.06 million.

"It wasn't all pretty, and a lot of it was just getting our money back and getting out of Dodge," said Ciaran Dunne of Wavertree. "But we've been doing this a long time, and there haven't been many easy days. I'm

not sure this will even rank up there with some of the hardest. There was plenty of activity around the barns. The vetting was good. We were disappointed in a spot here and there, but there have been plenty of times where we've been disappointed before and when there were no excuses."

Four horses sold by Wavertree cracked the top 10, including Hip 319, an American Pharoah colt out of the Doc's Leader mare Please Sign In. Bred in Kentucky by Hurstland Farm and William Kartozyan, the colt was purchased by John Kimmel, agent, for \$320,000.

"There were a couple 'Pharoahs' in the sale," Kimmel said. "Actually, I had the half sister to (Hip) 237. I'm a big fan of the stallion. I thought this was a horse that is about half done. He's going to improve. He's a horse that's got some family, the stallion's starting to prove himself, and we think he's going to continue to improve. I think it was pretty good value for \$320,000, compared to some of these other ones, because he's actually got an aptitude to run two turns and be a nice 3-year-old."

"Some of them are just real quick, and I think the rest of the crop catches up to them pretty soon. The seller, Ciaran Dunne, was very complimentary of the horse's mental attitude, and it's a great mover. I got a lot of confidence in that because there are plenty of horses that come in here that might look good superficially, but once you get to pushing on them, they're not the horse that you thought you bought. I feel like we got a horse that's going to have a decent future."

Wavertree also commanded \$320,000 for Hip 226, a Frankel filly purchased by Team Casse, agent. Bred in Ireland by Coolmore, the filly is out of the Clodovil mare Manderley and is from the female family of group 2 winner Gregorian and stakes winner Naval Warfare.

"(I liked) the individual, the sire, and the pedigree," Justin Casse said. "She's a lovely filly, stood over a good amount of ground. Nice European family. Frankel's obviously one of the best sires in the world. I know the seller was quite high on her, so that meant a lot to us as well."

Hip 226 was one of only two purchases made by Casse, who said the market felt off in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. The bloodstock agent went to \$170,000 for Hip 85, an Upstart colt consigned by Pick View, agent, out of the Yankee Gentleman mare Gentleman's Joy.

"I'd say it's somewhat what we expected regarding the number of horses sold," Casse said. "I think they're maybe off of the top end by about 30%, but still I know we have to have the horse sale because people need income. I think everybody's expectations were really realistic heading in."

With no standard of comparison for sales impacted by the spread of a worldwide pandemic, Wojciechowski said he was pleased that the sale went off without incident and held high hopes that sales would continue to improve on Day 2.

"We certainly can't draw any comparisons to other sales because we operated under unprecedented circumstances," Wojciechowski said. "Certainly, the external forces that we're dealing with have an effect. It's unrealistic to think the status of the world right now has no effect. We're pleased to even hold the sale and allow some horses to be traded. That being said,

there were some nice horses that sold well. I think the buyers and traders showed a resiliency, while at the same time we're all concerned thinking about the circumstances we're currently dealing with.

"We try to balance between understanding there were a number of buyers and sellers that were happy that we moved forward with the sale, and, quite frankly, the horses and people have been on the grounds for a while, and stopping the sale may have been like shutting the barn door once the horse is already out. We took the extra sanitary steps and tried to warn people to be cautious and be diligent about thinking about where they are and if they didn't need to be here, not to come. We beefed up our phone bidding process and saw a pickup in that. I think

Consigned as Hip 258 by de Meric Sales, agent, Myracehorse.com and Spendthrift partnered on a \$500,000 Into Mischief colt out of the Montbrook mare Montessa G. Bred in Kentucky by Machmer Hall, the juvenile breezed a quarter-mile in :21 during the under tack show.

"He checked all of our boxes," said Joe Mishak, the racing operations manager for Myracehorse.com. "There is not much else to say about Into Mischief. He's got great runners all over the place and leading Kentucky Derby contenders this year with Authentic the No. 1. He's in high demand. As far as the individual goes, he was just as athletic as he could be in his breezes on the farm and at OBS. He was a gorgeous individual. What can you say? We're very excited and big fans as Montbrook is on the bottom side. We're very happy to have him in our barn now."

"We were very pleased with the sale," consignor Nick de Meric

said. "Tristan and Valerie have had this horse in their division all winter and done a bang-up job with him."

As for a potential trainer for the colt, Mishak said the details have not yet been ironed out.

"It's something we will work out," Mishak said.

"It's likely he'll go to New York, but we will probably put him out on the farm at Spendthrift and let him take a little time off from the sale."

According to Mishak, the colt is one of a handful the operation have been scouting over the past months destined to start their careers in New York. batch of horses, Mishak said expanding the stable to New York is an important next step.

"As far as numbers, as a company we're looking to expand our operation in the New York area. New York clients have been very supportive of our program. We obviously started out several years ago in California, and once we went national last year, most of our horses had been in California, so we wanted to put emphasis on bulking up the New York program this year. We know our clients there have been eagerly awaiting new horses. We will probably be active tomorrow at the sale on at least one or two more.

"We wanted to see how the market would play out and at least when we bid on him (Hip 258). There

were a lot of high-priced horses that ended up being buybacks, so there was back-and-forth on what the sellers would be willing to take. It's been an honest market. If people like their horses, they're hanging on to them, and if they feel like they're getting the value they want, they're letting them go."

Myracehorse.com went solo to purchase Hip 166, a \$100,000 Mission Impazible colt from the consignment of Sequel Bloodstock, agent. Bred in New York by Sequel Thoroughbreds and Twin Creeks Farm, the dark bay or brown colt is out of the More Than Ready mare Kettle's Sister and is a half brother to Sam F. Davis Stakes (G3) winner Vinceremos and a full brother to stakes-placed Paz the Bourbon. The colt's second dam, Safe At the Plate, is a half sister to champion sprinter Safely Kept. **BH**

## DURANT SECURES RUNHAPPY COLT FOR \$475,000 AT OBS MARCH

Tom Durant bid to \$475,000 to secure a colt by Runhappy during the opening session of the March 17 Ocala Breeders' Sales March Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training.

Consigned by Pick View, agent, as Hip 320, the colt was the third-highest price of the day. He breezed a quarter-mile in :20 3/5 during the under tack show.

"That's extremely good for the market we're in," Pick View's Joe Pickerrell said of the colt's price. "He's a really nice colt, and in different market conditions he would have been quite a bit stronger, but we're really happy considering the current environment.

"We have a couple of really nice colts going tomorrow, and the good stuff, people are gravitating towards them. Maybe not as strong as they were a year ago, but people still want good horses. This storm is going to blow over, and we're going to be back to normal pretty soon. People are going to continue to gain confidence. People still want fast horses."

The dark bay or brown colt named Brother Lob belongs to the first crop of Claiborne Farm stallion Runhappy.

"Runhappy has been very popular, and obviously they've done a lot to support the horse, but he was the real deal on the track and we've been wanting to buy a Runhappy, and this horse did everything in the breeze show we thought he could do," said agent Josh Stevens of J. Stevens Bloodstock. "He's a great individual, and Joe (Pickerrell) is a great prep guy, so we had a lot of faith going into it. Everybody was screaming, 'Fire sale,' but it doesn't look like it has been. (Trainer) Bret (Calhoun) and I go out and find the horses, and Tom makes his own decisions. Tom has a value he puts on the horse, and if it comes close to that, he's game."

Bred in Kentucky by Millennium Farms, the colt is the third foal out of the stakes-placed Chatain mare Pledge Pin, a half sister to multiple stakes winner Great Mills. He made one previous trip through the auction ring at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale but did not meet his reserve when hammering for \$145,000.

"He was definitely the standout of our group here all week," Pickerrell said. "He's a big, strong physical and a big horse. He's surprisingly quick and fast for a big horse. We look for good things from him in the future."

Durant also purchased Hip 249, a Street Sense colt, for \$210,000 from Bird In Hand Stables. The bay was previously purchased for \$50,000 by Bird In Hand Stables from Gainesway's consignment to the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October Yearlings Sale.

Bred in Kentucky by Debby Oxley, the colt is out of the Birdstone mare Miss Mockingbird. His second dam is multiple stakes winner Superduper Miss, who was also second in the Barbara Fritchie Handicap (G2) and Safely Kept Stakes (G3). **BH**

## FULL SISTER TO BAR OF GOLD TO OXO EQUINE FOR \$330,000

With the market playing a bit spotty on the March 17 opening day of the Ocala Breeders' Sales March Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training, bloodstock agent Mike Ryan was more than a little pleased when the hammer came down on his Medaglia d'Oro filly for only \$330,000.

"To be honest, we were delighted to get her at that," said Ryan, who purchased the juvenile on behalf of Larry Best's OXO Equine. "If she runs, she'll be worth a fortune. But, if not, she'll never be worth less than what she brought today because of her pedigree."

Consigned as Hip 167 by Sequel Bloodstock, agent for Chester and Mary Broman, the filly was bred in New York by the Bromans out of the grade 3-winning Lemon Drop Kid mare Khancord Kid. The filly is a full sister to Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (G1) winner Bar of Gold.

"We're really excited for Mr. Best," Sequel's Becky Thomas said. "We're incredibly excited. Have a lot of respect for his program. I don't know who she'll go to trainer-wise, but we're really excited for that ownership group."

"We put a very low reserve on her. It's part of Mr. Broman's estate planning, and I think it's really, really good value. There's going to be a lot of good value here."

The first foal out of Khancord Kid, Bar of Gold was campaigned by the Bromans and raced from ages 2-5. She ended her career on a high note in 2017 when she scored a Breeders' Cup win for trainer John Kimmel. A versatile runner who also won on the grass, Bar of Gold had \$1.55

million in earnings in 25 starts.

Also showing a propensity for speed, Hip 167 breezed an eighth-mile in :10 flat during the OBS under tack show.

"First of all, she's by a great stallion and (is) a full sister to a Breeders' Cup winner," Ryan said. "She was a lovely filly, a very elegant filly with a lot of quality, and she breezed well. There is no downside on her. She's a really good Medaglia d'Oro, and she had the most elegant head and a really lovely aura around her. We're just delighted to get her."

Though several six-figure horses failed to retain their reserves Monday, Ryan said the market could pick up Tuesday during what he felt could be a stronger second book.

"I think the good horses are selling solid," he said. "The market is not running away, but I think the book is better tomorrow. It's just the way it all worked out." **BH**

## RICEHORSE SCORES WITH FLASHY AIR FORCE BLUE COLT

With fewer than 30 horses through the ring during the March 17 opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales March Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training, Brandon and Ali Rice of RiceHorse Stable made their first big sale of the day. Bidding over the phone, Willis Horton of Willis Horton Racing purchased their Air Force Blue colt (Hip 27) for \$390,000.

"Ali and I are a small, medium-sized operation," Brandon Rice said. "We still feel like kids in the business. So from the modest amount of horses that we receive at the farm, to have one that jumps up in early spring that makes you think he's God underneath the saddle, all you can do is get butterflies and think, 'I hope he maintains this, I hope he gets better, and I hope we don't drop the ball as young trainers that are learning and trying to make our horses thrive.'

"I think we managed to get a good enough job done for him. Ultimately, he did the real work. I think he's a great horse, and it doesn't matter who has him. He's going to make trainers look good. He's a superb, way-above-average horse."

Bred in Kentucky by Sierra Farm, the colt is out of the Meadowlake mare Dreamy Maiden, who also has produced group 2 winner and sire Daddy Long Legs. The colt was consigned by Sierra Farm to the 2019 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, where he went unsold on a final bid of \$95,000.

Hip 27 breezed an eighth-mile in :10 flat during the under tack show.

As the top seller to go through the ring from the RiceHorse consignment, the colt was one of only a handful to break the \$300,000 mark during the opening session. With the future of the 2-year-old sales season in limbo, Rice said he was thankful that OBS held fast in its decision to conduct the auction so that consignors and buyers move juveniles through the market.

"We were midway through the process of already having shipped in here. Horses were breezing, and

people were shopping and vetting the sale when basically the nation had all the shutdowns," Rice said. "We are nervous, but you can't get off the Ferris wheel. You have to do justice by your horses and your clients and all the agents that have put in more than a week's worth of work down here, and then we will get done with this sale even if the market is affected in a downward way and figure out how we're going to take care of the rest of our kids across the sales season—one step at a time, one day at a time, and one sale at a time."

Willis Horton Racing purchased two more juveniles Monday, beginning with Hip 20, a \$30,000 Twirling Candy colt consigned by Bold Arrow Thoroughbreds. Out of the Dixieland Band mare Dixie in Pink, the colt was bred in Kentucky by Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey and is from the family of stakes winners Pink Shoes and Prom Shoes.

Also purchased by Willis Horton Racing was Hip 180, a \$175,000 Malibu Moon colt from the consignment of Gene Recio. Bred in Kentucky by Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings, the colt is out of the First Samurai mare Lady Samuri, who placed third in the Molly Pitcher Stakes (G2). **BH**

## CURLIN COLT LEADS SIX-FIGURE SALES BY WOODS

A son of Curlin from the family of multiple grade 1 winner Champagne d'Oro was purchased for \$255,000 during the opening March 17 session at the Ocala Breeders' Sales March Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training.

The bay was the second 2-year-old consigned by Eddie Woods, agent, to sell for more than \$200,000 Tuesday.

"He's a good horse. He's got a bit of speed for a Curlin, which is kind of unusual, although he is just a great stallion," Woods said of the colt, who breezed during the under tack show. "He probably deserved to bring a bit more, but we're in the market we're in on the day we're here. I thought he was well sold today, and we were happy to get that for him."

Listed as Hip 241, the son of Curlin was purchased by the Sandin Syndicate Stable with W.E. Morey as agent.

"I liked his breeding and his pedigree," Gerald Sandin said. "I also like the fact that Curlin was a two-time Horse of the Year and a Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner."

The colt was bred in Kentucky by Southern Equine Stables and is the first foal out of the Bernardini mare Michelle d'Oro. The colt's second dam is Champagne d'Oro, the winner of the Betfair TVG Acron (G1) and Test (G1) stakes. Out of the grade 1-placed mare Champagne Glow, Champagne d'Oro is a half sister to Belmont Stakes (G1) winner Ruler On Ice.

Early in the sale, Woods sold the first six-figure 2-year-old of the day as Hip 21, a Speightster colt, was purchased by agent Steven Young for \$200,000.

The chestnut is out of the Smoke Glacken mare Done Smoking. He breezed a quarter-mile in :21 2/5 during the under tack show.

"Very nice horse. Horse came in here, he trained great. I saw him at the farm. He sold himself well then,

and he did here on the racetrack again," said Young, buying for an undisclosed client.

"(Speightster is a) first-crop sire—he won three out of four races," Young added. "These horses seem to have a buzz about them, and he's in with a chance."

"He's a lovely horse," Woods said. "We're in a delicate time, I suppose is the best way to put it. He sold, he's gone on. I think they got a great buy. Maybe later in the week he brings a bit more, but here we are. They got a nice horse, and they bought him right."

The colt was bred in Kentucky by George E. Bates Trustee. As a weanling at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, he was purchased for \$57,000 by Dundrum Farm from the Hunter Valley Farm consignment. Back at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale with consignor Blandford Stud, he was purchased by Quarter Pole Enterprises for \$195,000. His dam is a half sister to Matron Stakes (G2) winner Doremifasollatido and Pebbles Stakes (G3T) winner Fortunate Damsel. **BH**

Three years ago, David Meah of Meah/Lloyd Bloodstock purchased future graded stakes winner Gas Station Sushi at the Ocala Breeders' Sales March Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training, and March 17 he secured the mare's half sister for \$200,000 at the same auction.

Consigned by Harris Training Center, agent, as Hip 63, the 2-year-old filly is by Hit It a Bomb and out of the stakes-winning Five Star Day mare Five Star Daydream. She breezed an eighth-mile in :10 1/5 during the under tack show.

"I bought Gas Station Sushi as well from here a few years ago. She had a few issues. Her issue was she was so good that she was too fast for her own good," Meah said. "I've seen this filly train a couple times during the winter because we have horses with Robby Harris, and (I'm) just very happy about it.

"I've followed the dam, Five Star Daydream, ever since Gas Station Sushi, knowing how good she was. We didn't really want to go home without her, so I'm happy that we got her."

As a 2-year-old, Gas Station Sushi was a \$240,000

purchase. She went on to win the Beaumont Stakes Presented by Keeneland Select (G3) and Beverly J. Lewis Stakes and later sold to Spendthrift Farm for \$675,000 in 2018 at The November Sale, Fasig-Tipton's breeding stock sale. She delivered her first foal, a Lord Nelson colt, Feb. 9.

Spendthrift Farm bred the 2-year-old filly in Kentucky. The bay was previously purchased for \$95,000 by Solana Beach Sales and buyer agent Boomer Bloodstock at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale, where she was consigned by Four Star Sales.

Spendthrift also stands Hit It a Bomb, whose first juveniles will hit the track this year. The son of War Front won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1T) for Evelyn Stockwell and trainer Aidan O'Brien.

"Aidan O'Brien has good horses. The sire's well bred. I think he's going to be fine," Meah said. "This filly, physically, she has all the attributes of a runner, and that's kind of what we're looking for."

Meah, who signed for an undisclosed client, said there are no current plans for the 2-year-old filly.

"The way things are going around the world, we just take it day by day," he said. "I think she may go back to Robby's for a couple of weeks just to let down because this sale takes a lot out of them. We'll see where we go from there." **BH**

## TATTERSALLS CANCELS ASCOT MARCH; GOFFS MOVES AHEAD

Tattersalls has responded to the far-reaching government guidelines announced March 16 and the subsequent British Horseracing Authority decision to suspend British racing until the end of April by making significant date changes to its forthcoming schedule of U.K.-based sales.

The Tattersalls Ascot March Sale—scheduled to take place Thursday and comprising 190 lots—has been canceled.

The Tattersalls Ascot Breeze-Up Sale, due to be staged March 31 and April 1, and the Craven Breeze-Up Sale, due to take place April 13-15, have both been postponed and will be amalgamated into a new combined fixture in Newmarket from April 29-May 1.

The Tattersalls Guineas Breeze-Up and Horses in Training Sale will be postponed until May 27-29.

All those changes will be kept under constant review and follows the decision of Bloodstock South Africa to postpone its flagship National Yearling Sale until May.

Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony said: "We are making these changes in response to the unprecedented circumstances arising from Monday

evening's new government guidelines and the subsequent BHA decision to suspend British racing until the end of April.

"These decisions have not been taken lightly, and we are mindful at all times of our joint responsibility to the requirements of our clients and the wider public health issues, which have overtaken normal daily life throughout the world.

"Full details of the revised formats associated with the amended sales schedule will be released as soon as is practical, bearing in mind the speed at which events are constantly changing.

"In the meantime, we would like to reiterate our commitment to minimizing the impact of this national emergency, which has engulfed us all, and to stress that we will at all times endeavor to keep our clients informed of any further necessary changes affecting the wider Tattersalls group."

### Goffs Plans to Go Ahead With April and May Auctions

Goffs has announced that its forthcoming sales during April and May are still scheduled to go ahead—although the auction house will await direction from the relevant authorities amid the gathering coronavirus crisis.

Events in America have been canceled, and the Osarus Breeze Up Sale in France has been delayed.

Goffs, however, has already taken action against potential infection and disruption at its own premises and has been ramping up online technology for future sales that could be used in a "broader and more comprehensive manner."

A work-from-home policy has been implemented for the team, and the physical Goffs offices in Kildare and the U.K. will be closed until further notice, with the situation being monitored and reviewed on an ongoing basis.

In a statement, Goffs group chief executive Henry Beeby said: "As things stand, we are planning for our sales to go ahead as scheduled, but we will, of course, monitor events and take advice and direction from the authorities as the situation evolves.

"However, whilst we cannot predict the future, we wanted to let you, our valued clients, know how we are addressing the problems presented and how we are planning in the short and medium term."

The boutique Aintree Sale is slated for April 2, and Goffs indicated in the statement its intention to proceed subject to the meeting going ahead. But it was announced Monday night that the three-day meeting has been canceled.

## Arqana Moves Ahead With Breeze-Up Sale

Arqana said it is still planning to host its May Breeze-Up Sale May 8-9 but acknowledges that changes could be made closer to the time as the global coronavirus pandemic spreads.

Last year's sale was topped by Grove Stud's American Pharoah colt out of the Giant's Causeway mare Tare Green who was knocked down to Broadhurst Agency for €1.1 million (US\$1,235,850).

Since named Ocean Atlantique, the André Fabre-trained youngster opened his account in impressive style when he won his maiden by eight lengths on the straight mile at Saint-Cloud in October.

"The plan is to keep the Arqana Breeze-Up Sale on its May 8-9 schedule," said the company in a statement Tuesday. "The selection is now final, and a provisional catalog will be released online on March 25 according to the original schedule.

"Amendments may occur, however, in view of the collective responsibility required to face the COVID-19 epidemic."

In keeping with confinement measures pronounced by the French government, Arqana has said all its teams bar the ground staff are working remotely from Tuesday onward.

Contact details remain unchanged and may be found on the Arqana website. All departments continue to attend to their daily business.

Planning of yearling and store inspections is also underway. They will start as soon as confinement measures allow.

Arqana president Eric Hoyeau said: "All industry stakeholders stand united to face this unprecedented crisis. On behalf of all at Arqana, I extend my thoughts and sympathy to those affected by

the virus and their loved ones. On our own scale, we are striving to contribute to curb the spread of the epidemic.

"We shall also take every possible action to keep the market operating in support of the industry."

## Bloodstock South Africa Postpones National Yearling Sale to May

The Bloodstock South Africa board issued a statement Tuesday morning, saying it will postpone its flagship National Yearling Sale from April 22-24 until May 20-22, although the new dates are provisional and will be reviewed again April 16.

The National Yearling Sale usually coincides with the AGM and grade 1 awards of the Thoroughbred Breeders Association of South Africa, and these events have also been pushed back to tie in with the new dates.

The sale record for South Africa was broken last

year when Mike de Kock went to 9 million rand for a Silvano colt on behalf of Shadwell.

This year's catalog includes a colt by the same sire out of the budding South African blue hen Halfway To Heaven, whose first three foals have all struck at the highest level and who is believed to be the only mare to have achieved this feat.

The statement from Bloodstock South Africa read: "These are unique times that the world finds itself in dealing with a pandemic such as COVID-19, and Bloodstock South Africa is mindful of the challenges facing us all on a global level and, in particular, those that face the Thoroughbred breeding community in South Africa.

"Following President Cyril Ramaphosa's address to the nation on March 15 and in line with his urging for a responsible approach to the COVID-19 virus, there are specific restrictions on public gatherings that need to be adhered to.

"As such, Bloodstock South Africa will be implementing the following change of dates regarding its sales program this year—the Emperors Palace National Yearling Sale will be postponed from its current date of April 22-24.

"The proposed new dates are May 20-22 but remain provisional and will be reviewed on April 16, as this mirrors the government's target date for the evaluation of the situation surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic."

The statement added: "Bloodstock South Africa thanks everyone for their understanding in this matter and assures them that decisions were not taken lightly but in the interests of the safety of the Thoroughbred breeding community at large.

"The safety of our staff, vendors, buyers, and suppliers is of utmost importance, and we will be closely monitoring the designated channels of authority within South Africa and provide relevant updates where necessary. ## NADAL UPHOLDS WINNING RECORD FOR BLAME SIRE LINE

One of the earliest racing upsets that this writer recalls watching live came in the inaugural running of the Benson and Hedges Gold Cup in 1972. The race was presumed to be at the mercy of the mighty Brigadier Gerard, seeking his 16th victory in as many outings. At the start, that year's Epsom Derby (G1) victor, Roberto—ridden by Braulio Baeza who had been brought over from the U.S. by Roberto's owner, John W. Galbreath—shot to the front and proceeded to set a scorching pace. In the straight, Brigadier Gerard closed to within a length of Roberto but could get no closer, weakening inside the final furlong as Roberto powered on to score by three lengths, setting a record for York's 10 1/2-furlong course.

We were put in mind of this event by the victory of Nadal—a fourth-

generation descendent of Roberto—in last weekend's Rebel Stakes (G2). Rather in the manner of his ancestor at York nearly 50 years ago, Nadal dictated a swift pace from the off, and, in his case, he accelerated again late to defy a closer. In this case, it was Nadal who preserved, rather than spoiled, an unbeaten record as his previous two outings brought victories in a Santa Anita Park maiden special weight and the San Vicente Stakes (G2).

When Roberto retired to his owner's Darby Dan Stud in Lexington, it might have been hoped that he, along with his contemporary, Halo, could found twin pillars of the Hail to Reason sire line. Both proved to be excellent sires represented by a number of stallion sons. However, while Halo

had Sunday Silence, a sire superior to himself, Roberto's pillar has looked a little more shaky at times. He did have several good stallion sons—among them Dynaformer, Kris S., Silver Hawk, Lear Fan, and Red Ransom, as well as Brian's Time and Real Shadai in Japan and Al Mufti in South Africa. None of his North American or European sons prove to be exactly dynasty-founding, though. If the Roberto line is going to continue to flourish in North America, it will be down to either Dynaformer—who has Americain, Point of Entry, and Temple City at stud in Kentucky—or Kris S. Like Dynaformer, and unlike Roberto, Kris S. was a tall horse. Lightly raced, he won three of five starts before retiring to stud in Florida, subsequently moving to Prestonwood Farm (now WinStar) in Lexington.

Kris S. proved to be an excellent sire, his 88 black-type winners including champions Hollywood Wildcat, Action This Day, and Soaring Softly as well as Epsom Derby (G1) victor Kris Kin. Unfortunately, his sons too generally proved a disappointment, and Kris S.'s branch of Roberto would have died out had it not been for Arch, who arrived when his sire was already 18 years old. A later-maturing individual, Arch won his only race at 2, then came good in the second half of his 3-year-old season when he took four consecutive races, including the Super Derby (G1) and Fayette Stakes (G3). He ended his career running off the board in one of the strongest renewals of the Breeders' Cup Classic (G1), taken by Awesome Again.

Although he somewhat drifted in and out of fashion, impacting the consistency of his books, Arch ultimately compiled a respectable record as a sire with 137 stakes winners—42 graded and 13 in grade 1s. Among his best

were champion older male Blame; Canadian Horse of the Year Arravale; Les Arcs, a champion older horse in England; Overarching, a three-time champion sprinter in South Africa; the ill-fated Alabama Stakes (G1) and Gazelle Stakes (G1) winner Pine Island; Arkansas Derby (G1) winner Archarcharch; and last year's Woodward Stakes (G1) hero, Preservationist.

Blame has shown a little of the stop-start pattern of his sire but is beginning to put together a solid record. With seven crops of racing age, he has 29 stakes winners, 16 graded, headed by Prix de Diana Longines (French Oaks, G1) victress Senga; Marley's Freedom, successful in six graded events, including the Ballerina Stakes (G1); and Fault, who numbers the Santa Margarita Stakes (G1) among four graded victories. Blame's current 3-year-old crop includes not only Nadal but another classic prospect in Remsen Stakes (G2) scorer Shotski and Abscond, winner of the Natalma Stakes (G1) last year.

Nadal is the second foal of the Pulpit mare Ascending Angel. She is half sister to Reform Act, a daughter of Lemon Drop Kid (dam a three-quarters sister to Pulpit's sire, A.P. Indy), a listed winner in Ireland, and graded-placed in the U.S. She is also a three-quarters sister to the

A.P. Indy daughters Soul Search (multiple grade 1-placed and the dam of graded scorer Journey Home) and Lunar Colony, the dam of stakes winners Lunar Victory and The Tea Cups.

The second dam, Solar Colony, is a winning sister to champion 2-year-old filly Pleasant Stage, to graded winners Stage Colony and Colonial Play—the dam of the Patterson Canadian International (G1T) and Northern Dancer Turf Stakes (G1T) scorer Marsh Side— and to Meteor Colony, the dam of grade 1 winner Changeintheweather. Solar Colony's second dam, Northern Meteor, also produced two top-class horses in A Phenomenon and Seattle Meteor. Northern Meteor's dam, Patelin, was one of the best 2-year-olds of her crop, winning the Selima Stakes, Schuylerville Stakes, and Alcibiades Stakes. She subsequently became an important tap-root mare, and among those descending from her are leading sire Into Mischief and his siblings, the four-time Eclipse Award winner Beholder and grade 1 winner Mendelssohn, as well as I'll Have Another, who took the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) and Preakness Stakes (G1) in 2012.

Blame is one of five stakes winners and 13 black-type performers from 59 starters by Blame out of A.P. Indy-line mares, with French Oaks winner Senga providing a classic-winning precedent for the cross. **BH**

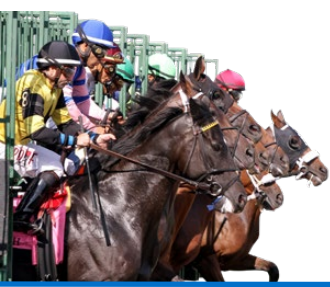
