TAGG TARGETS TRAVERS FOR BELMONT WINNER TIZ THE LAW

Moments after Sackatoga Stable's Tiz the Law captured the 152nd running of the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) June 20, trainer Barclay Tagg could be heard asking those in charge of the trophy presentation to hurry things up—he had to get back to his horses.

The veteran conditioner, who accompanies each set of morning workers to the track on his pony, takes a hands-on approach to horsemanship.

Tagg said Tiz the Law has been easier to handle than many horses. "He's so easy to deal with. If you ask him to go fast, he goes fast. If you ask him to go slow, he goes slow," Tagg said.

Assistant trainer Robin Smullen also serves as the main exercise rider for Tiz the Law, and Tagg credits her with much of the Constitution colt's success.

"I'll say it: He's been handled perfectly, too. I've had Robin ride him, and Robin can ride

anything," Tagg said. "She's a brilliant horsewoman, and I can't say enough about her. She has the heart of a lion, the judgment of Solomon, and the patience of Job."

Tagg and Sackatoga Stable teamed in 2003 to campaign Funny Cide, who won that year's Kentucky Derby (G1) and Preakness Stakes (G1) before running third in the Belmont.

Though the connections are the same, and both horses are New

York-breds, Tiz the Law and Funny Cide have many differences.

Tiz the Law posted a number of strong works leading into the Belmont, including a five-eighths effort in 1:00.53 June 8 and an easy half-mile in :50.42 June 14 on Big Sandy. The controlled final breeze for Tiz the Law was in sharp contrast to the bullet :57.82 Funny Cide clocked heading into the 2003 Belmont.

Smullen credits Tagg for understanding what each of the horses in his care needs and for putting them in a position to be successful.

"Barclay is so good at getting them to the right spot at the right time," Smullen said. "We tightened the screws (on Tiz the Law), but in the last work, we go in :50. And everybody asks, did you want to go that slow? Yeah, we did. That was on purpose. He's just so good at it.

"Our work two weeks out is usually our serious work, and the last work before the race is the easiest work—if you have the horse that can do it. With Funny Cide, you couldn't. His last work before the Belmont, he went in :57, but this horse is easy to ride 90% of the time."

Tagg mapped out all the details as Tiz the Law prepared for his first start in nearly three months following his score in the March 28 Curlin Florida Derby (G1) at Gulfstream Park. Smullen said he even planned out the celebration for jockey Manny Franco, who offered the slightest of fist pumps along with a cathartic yell as the New York-bred hero crossed the wire to give Tagg a personal Triple Crown.

"Barclay told him not to be jumping around on the horse. Sometimes they shift their weight (in the saddle), and it's bad," Smullen said. "So Barclay said to Manny, 'If you're winning, don't do that. Just don't.' That's the stuff that nobody thinks about, but he does. It might be the difference between making the next race or not making it."

Tiz the Law's sophomore season kicked off with a win in the Feb. 1 Holy Bull Stakes (3), and Tagg will be charged with keeping the colt in good order through a campaign he would like to see include stops in the Aug. 8 Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1), the Sept. 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve, the Oct. 3 Preakness, and the

Nov. 7 Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1).

Tagg said he'll continue to listen to what his colt has to say.

"You have to pay attention to your horse. He tells you whether it's too much or too little," Tagg said. "He tells you all that stuff if you pay attention to it. You have to show up every day. You have to see if he eats every day and if he eats every night."

Tagg said he prefers to feed his horses later in the evening, and he's there each night to make sure each food tub is emptied.

"I like to come back at night, and if I can see his nose in the tub eating, I'm happy," Tagg said. "If one of them has walked away and is eating hay in the corner when his feed is sitting there, that's a signal there's something wrong. Maybe it's nothing too bad, maybe the groom gave the horse two cups instead of one cup, but you need to find all this stuff out.

"A lot of guys have horses all over the place, but we don't. So we have to make everything work."

The morning training, the perfect trip engineered by Franco, and even the celebration went according to plan.

And plans for Tiz the Law's next race in the Travers are already underway.

"He came out of the race great," Smullen said. "He ate up, and then he came out and grazed for an hour. His legs are good, his attitude and energy are good."

For the next few days, Tagg said Tiz the Law will walk the shedrow.

"He'll walk for three days, and we'll graze him every afternoon like we do," Tagg said. "The fourth day we'll take him out and jog him once around

backwards to see how he moves and how he is, and if he eats up that night, we'll go to galloping. And 10 days after that, we'll give him an easy breeze, a half-mile."

The wheels are already in motion as Tagg looks to add another trophy to his cabinet.

"I've never won the Travers, and I want to win it," Tagg said. "It's very important to me." **BH**

LEADING SIRES AT ROYAL ASCOT

We could all see it was a Royal Ascot like no other—decidedly lacking in crowd noise and atmosphere but, happily, not in the most important ingredient of top-class racing. It was a different Royal Ascot in the composition of the five-day program, too, with the addition of six £35,000 handicaps over the five days. Normally there are 30 races, of which 22 are black type, with the other eight consisting of seven handicaps and one condition race, the 21-furlong Queen Alexandra Stakes. This year, the Queen Alexandra was run for a £35,000 purse, as was the 2 1/2-mile Ascot Stakes, another handicap. So for the purposes of this analysis, I've separated the meeting into the 28 races run for a purse greater than £35,000 (the 22 black-type races and six handicaps) and the eight £35,000 races.

Among those 28 races, three sires had three winners each: Giltown Stud's Sea The Stars, Darley's Dubawi, and Ireland's Tally-Ho Stud's specialist 2-year-old/sprint sire Kodiak. All three of Kodiak's winners came June 20, the meet's final day. He sired the winners of both of Saturday's 2-year-old races, the five-furlong Queen Mary Stakes (G2) for fillies (this was Campanelle for Stonestreet/Wesley Ward) and the six-furlong Coventry Stakes (G2), won by 150-1 shot Nando Parrado. Kodiak followed up with 4-year-old Hello Youmzain's gritty pillar-to-post win in the six-furlong Diamond Jubilee Stakes (G1) for his happy new owners, France's Haras d'Etreham and New Zealand's Cambridge Stud. Kodiak is also the sire of Prince of Lir, the only freshman sire with a winner at Royal Ascot, The Lir Jet in the five-furlong Norfolk Stakes (G2).

Eight stallions tallied three or more top-3 finishers and/or two winners among the 28 races. Coolmore's world No. 1, Galileo, was the leading sire of top-three finishers with five, of which two were winners, including group 1 winner Circus Maximus and group 3 winner Russian Emperor. Kodiak, Dubawi, and Sea The Stars each had one place-getter to go along with their three winners. Sea The Stars' winners were the great Stradivarius, galloping away to win his third consecutive Ascot Gold Cup (G1); the Hardwicke (G2) winner, 4-year-old filly Fanny Logan; and the King George V winner, Hukum. Terebellum, a daughter of Sea The Stars, was second in the Queen Anne Stakes (G1). Dubawi had the impressive Prince of Wales's Stakes (G1) winner Lord North, plus handicap winners Khaloosy (ran away with the one-mile Britannia Handicap for 3-year-olds) and Onassis. Yeomanstown

Stud's Dark Angel had two "main event" winners, including the now 6-year-old top five-furlong sprinter Battaash (one of six winners during the week for Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell operation), who romped in the King's Stand Stakes (G1); Dark Angel also had the impressive 3-year-old five-furlong winner Art Power in one of the £35,000 handicaps, giving him also three winners for the entire week.

Darley's veteran Exceed And Excel had four place-getters from the 28 races, two seconds (including Queen Mary second Sacred) and two thirds (including Diamond Jubilee third Sceptical). Coolmore's Camelot had three seconds, including in two 12-furlong grade 2s, and the leading European second-crop sire, Darley's Night of Thunder, had the winner of the Jersey Stakes (G3), Molatham, for Shadwell (chinning American Pharoah's Monarch of Egypt), as well as a second and a third. He also had his 11th black-type winner in Ireland on Saturday, which leads all North American/

European second-crop sires. American Pharoah now has 19 black-type horses to lead that category, and North America's leading second-crop sire, Constitution, now has a classic winner with Tiz The Law's convincing win in the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1). Among second-crop sires, it's striking that the three who are now confirmed as top-drawer sires are the best son yet of Tapit (Constitution, who stands at WinStar Farm), the best son yet of Dubawi (Night of Thunder), and American Pharoah, who might be initiating a new, turf-friendly branch of the Fappiano sire line for Coolmore. Incidentally, last year's European freshman 2-3 also hit the board at Royal Ascot: Highclere's Cable Bay is the sire of 3-year-old filly Liberty Beach, who ran a bang-up third against "olders" in the King's Stand at five furlongs; and Coolmore's Gleneagles is the sire of Highland Chief, who won the £35,000 10-furlong 3-year-old handicap at the meet.

A quick word about broodmare sires at Royal Ascot. Two tied with four top-three placings each, Coolmore's Danehill Dancer and Galileo, who looks in time like he'll break all the records for broodmare sires like he is for sires. Of Danehill Dancer's four, including Queen Anne winner Circus Maximus, three were by Galileo and the other was by Galileo's son Teofilo.

Galileo's four broodmare sire placings included two by War Front, one of whom was Chesham Stakes winner Battleground, the first foal of Found, as well as Barney Roy (by Exceed And Excel's son Excelebration) and Monarch of Egypt, by American Pharoah.

Four broodmare sires had three podium finishes among the 28 main races. Pivotal's three as a damsire included Commonwealth Cup (G1) winner Golden Horde (by Dark Angel's son Lethal Force) and Jersey winner Molatham (by Night of Thunder). Dalakhani is the damsire of impressive Britannia Handicap winner Khaloosy (by Dubawi), as well as St. James's Palace (G1) second Pinatubo (by Shamardal). Dansili clearly has an affinity as a broodmare sire with Dream Ahead, as this combination produced both Royal Hunt Cup winner Dark Vision, as well as Dream of Dreams, beaten in a photo in the Diamond Jubilee for the second consecutive year. Both Dream Ahead and Lethal Force, the son of Dark Angel who sired Golden Horde, now stand at France's Haras de Grandcamp, having relocated from Ballylinch (Ireland) and Cheveley Park (England), respectively—so Grandcamp sure had a good Ascot. Finally, the venerable Kingmambo had three broodmare placings, including Hukum. The cross with Sea The Stars has been successful, including two grade 1 winners in Cloth of Stars and Zelzal.

TRAINERS PONDER OPTIONS FOR DR POST, MAX PLAYER

Trainer Todd Pletcher reported June 21 that Dr Post has emerged from his game runner-up effort in the June 20 Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) in good order and that the son of Quality Road will likely be slated for additional grade 1 races down the road.

Pletcher, a three-time winner of the Belmont, said the \$1 million TVG.com Haskell Invitational Stakes (G1) July 18 at Monmouth Park or the \$1 million Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course Aug. 8 are likely targets for the dark bay colt.

"Both of those races are in play. It just depends on how he bounces out of the race," Pletcher said at his barn Sunday morning. "We were always confident that a route of ground will not be an issue for him. He finished up well. It was a very encouraging effort."

Owned by Vinnie Viola's St. Elias Stable, Dr Post arrived at this year's first leg of the Triple Crown off a win in the April 25 Unbridled Stakes at Gulfstream Park after breaking his maiden on the South Florida oval just one day after Belmont Stakes winner Tiz the Law picked up a second top-level victory in the March 28 Curlin Florida Derby (G1).

"That's a lot of progress to make in a short period of time," Pletcher said. "Hopefully, he keeps improving."

Bred in Kentucky by Cloyce Clark, Dr Post is out of the graded stakes-winning Hennessy mare Mary Delaney and was a \$400,000 acquisition from the 2018 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, where he was consigned by Hunter Valley Farm.

Earlier on the card, Pletcher won the Wonder Again Stakes (G3T) with Robert and Lawana Low's Sweet Melania off a seven-month layoff. She took the one-mile turf event for 3-year-old fillies in gate-to-wire fashion. Never off the board in seven starts, the daughter of 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah was third in last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T) after winning the JPMorgan Chase Jessamine Stakes (G2T) at Keeneland.

"She came out of it in good order. We planned on giving her a little time off after the Breeders' Cup, and things went kind of crazy for a while," Pletcher said. "We didn't know where (she) would come back. We knew a distance like a mile was what we were looking for, so when this race came out, we pointed towards this."

Pletcher also debuted a potential rising star Saturday in Wertheimer and Frere's Happy Saver, who graduated at first asking by 5 1/2 lengths under Irad Ortiz Jr.

"He had been training well," Pletcher said. "We were looking forward to getting him started. I have to admit, the win was more impressive than I could have hoped for. It's always exciting when you have that. It surprised me when he showed as much as he did."

Pletcher is not in any hurry to run the talented son of Super Saver against stakes company.

"There are plenty of options, so we'll let him take us where we need to go," Pletcher said.

In the Belmont Stakes, Pletcher also saddled stakes-placed Farmington Road, who finished a distant eighth.

"We'll have to find a track that's more kind to closers," Pletcher said.

Options Open for Max Player

Trainer Linda Rice said George Hall and SportBLX Thoroughbreds' Max Player, who rallied from second to last in the 10-horse field to finish third in the Belmont, came out of his first race in four months in good order Sunday morning.

"He came out good and looked good this morning—no problems," Rice said of the son of Honor Code.

Max Player, with Joel Rosario aboard, tracked in ninth position as Tap It to Win led the field through the opening quarter-mile in :23.11 and the half in :46.16. While Tiz the Law made a strong move out of the turn that propelled him to his 3 3/4-length victory, Max Player went seven wide from the upper stretch but kicked on impressively, besting Pneumatic by 2 1/2 lengths to finish on the board.

"He was a little further back than I hoped," Rice said. "I was hoping we'd have been a little closer early in the midpack. He had a lot to do because of that. He ran a little green into the kick-back once again. Joel had to circle pretty wide, but he was running at the end of it."

Though showing some signs of inexperience, Max Player has been consistent with a record of 2-1-1 in four starts. The Kentucky-bred ran second in his debut in November at Parx Racing before ending his juvenile campaign with a maiden-breaking win at second asking in December at the same track.

In his stakes debut, he topped an eight-horse field to win the Withers Stakes (G3) by 3 1/4 lengths at Aqueduct Racetrack.

"Coming off a 4 1/2-month break, I thought it was a very creditable effort," Rice said. "You can build on this going forward. Going a mile and a quarter shouldn't be a problem as well."

Rice said she had no confirmed next steps yet for Max Player but will talk with Hall and come up with a plan. The July 16-Sept. 7 Saratoga summer meet has multiple options for 3-year-olds on the main track, including the Travers and the \$150,000 Jim Dandy Stakes (G2) at 1 1/8 miles Sept. 5.


"We'll keep all the options open for now and sort it out when we get him back to the track in a week to 10 days," Rice said.

Rice saddled her first Belmont Stakes entrant since Supervisor finished fifth in 2003. Though the race was run at a shorter distance and without spectators, Rice said earning black type in a Triple Crown race for the first time in her career was special.

She also said Max Player showed the potential to run in the Sept. 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) and the Oct. 3 Preakness Stakes (G1) if things continue to go well.

"It was pretty exciting. It would have been more exciting if we had our typical crowd that could join us, but it was great and I think he ran well enough to show that he could possibly win a classic in his future," Rice said. **BH**

NO PAROLE ACHIEVES FIRST GRADE 1 WIN FOR COTEAU GROVE

When No Parole crossed the Belmont Park finish line 3 3/4 lengths clear June 20 in the Woody Stephens Stakes Presented by Claiborne Farm (G1), the Violence colt helped fulfill a dream for his breeders almost a decade in the making.

"It was an awesome day," said bloodstock agent Andrew Cary, who helped the Violence colt's breeders, Keith and Ginger Myers, build their Louisiana-based breeding operation beginning in 2014. The Myerses, who own and operate Coteau Grove Farms in Louisiana, began racing in 2008 before re-configuring their strategy to prioritize breeding.

No Parole's victory in Saturday's seven-furlong test marked the first top-level score for the Myers' program which now boasts a band of over 25 broodmares.

"They were thrilled but they were actually out in Colorado and didn't see the race live," said Cary. "I had taped it and sent them the video and they were absolutely thrilled. It's their first grade 1 win as breeders so they are over the moon.

"I think it's still sinking in for all of us. It's hard to win a grade 1 and to see him rise through the ranks in the Louisiana-bred program and then win on a big day in New York was incredible."

A registered Louisiana-bred, No Parole is a son of the Bluegrass Cat mare Plus One, a stakes winner who earned over \$160,000 from 15 starts. The mare was just the second purchased by Cary for the Myers in 2014, when she was plucked out of the Mullholland Springs consignment to the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale for only \$67,000.

"I bought One Plus out of the back ring, basically," Cary said. "She was a beautiful, strong, stakes-winning mare with a body type I like. She was from a good family and in foal to Violence. She had a beautiful foal the next year we sold as a weanling. Then we bred her back in the Louisiana program to Songandaprayer and she had a nice filly who is now 4. But I liked the first Violence

foal so much we went back and we got No Parole.

"From the get-go he was very laid back and well minded," Cary added. "Nothing ever bothered him. He was one of those horses that you never see get upset or fret. When he came up to Kentucky to prep he would sleep a lot or take it easy. He really acted like a 5-year-old and he did everything he was asked. Those types usually turn out to be good race horses because they look after themselves. He was a cool customer for sure."

Cary said the majority of all foals bred at Coteau Grove are destined for the commercial market, barring the occasional filly that could eventually join the broodmare band. Most, like No Parole, are sold as yearlings across the country in a variety of sales held in Louisiana, Texas, New York, and Kentucky.

No Parole was consigned by Select Sales to the 2018 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, where he was purchased by Maggi Moss for \$75,000. The colt now races for Moss and Greg Tramontin and is trained by Tom Amoss.

"We were thrilled that Maggi got him because we knew he would be given every shot with Tom Amoss, and that they understood the Louisiana program. You just hope that your foals can help your mares out and achieve black-type. He's done that and then some."

No Parole won his first three starts in Louisiana for Amoss including a score in the Feb. 8 LA Bred Premier Night Prince Stakes at Delta Downs. The colt made a brief pass at the 2020 Road to the Kentucky Derby, stretching out with a start in the March 14 Rebel Stakes (G2) at Oaklawn Park. When he finished off the board, connections rerouted the colt back down to resume sprinting and set sights on the Woody Stephens.

"We're very pleased," said Cary. "It's really exciting and we're very happy for them. They've put a lot of money, time, and patience in to this and really supported both the Louisiana and Kentucky programs with the amount of horses they breed. It's really gratifying to see them have success. The whole farm takes a lot of pride in the success of their graduates."

The future continues to look bright for Coteau Grove ahead of the yearling sales season. With more than 20 yearlings destined for sales around the country, Cary is optimistic that the quality of their

pedigrees in conjunction with sire power will make them popular at market.

"We have a good range of foals and a lot by Kentucky sires," said Cary. "We have the half sister to No Parole by Connect pointed to Keeneland September sale. Their crop has gotten progressively better each year. The pipeline is strong for the next year, so that's very exciting. We're also excited about what we've got coming out of the horses we've sold the last couple years as well, so it will be great to see what they can do."

As for Plus One, Cary and the Myers plan to wait and watch the rest of No Parole's season play out before choosing a new stallion for the mare. What is likely, said Cary, is that the mare will foal out in Kentucky in the next season.

"She's in foal to Curlin so we're really excited about that baby," said Cary. "We will see how No Parole goes the rest of this year to figure out which direction we want for her next year. She fits quite a few stallions. The Medaglia d'Oro line is an option, but we're lucky to have options and we have some time before the Fall to make that decision. It's a fun problem to have." **BH**

JEAN ELIZABETH ROCKETS TO VICTORY IN WHIMSICAL STAKES

Odds-on favorite Jean Elizabeth shot to the lead and never looked back June 21 in the CA\$128,800 (US\$94,656) Whimsical Stakes (G3) at Woodbine, posting her eighth consecutive stakes victory.

Ridden by David Moran in the six-furlong sprint, Jean Elizabeth carved out fractions of :22.36, :44.78, and :56.99 as she opened up a 2 1/2-length advantage in the stretch before hitting the wire in 1:09.86 under a strong hand ride. Painting, off at 14-1 odds, was involved in a bumping incident at the outset and was settled in midpack before rallying on the outside, but came up a length short of the winner. Summer Sunday, Canada's reigning champion female sprinter, chased the winner most of the way and finished third.

Jean Elizabeth, a 5-year-old Illinois-bred daughter of Adios Charlie trained by Larry Rivelli, paid \$3.40, \$3.10, and \$2.20 while posting her 15th victory in 21 starts, with six placings and earnings of \$662,786. The mare is owned by Rivelli, Richard Ravin, and Patricia's Hope. Produced from the Lit de Justice mare Rooney Doodle, the mare was bred by Rivelli and Ravin.

"She's a rocket," Moran said of the mare, who returned to the Canadian oval where she won two stakes last year to launch her win streak. "I wasn't expecting her to be that quick with her ears pricked down the back."

Moran noted the speedy mare was just toying with her rivals.

"She just pricks her ears, and I think she just waits for a bit of company to go on again," he said.

Moran, the father of nine children whose wife, Maria, is expecting in the coming weeks, took a moment after winning the first graded stakes of the meet to thank his kids for their Father's Day cards and gifts and gave a shout-out to his own dad back home in Ireland.

He also dedicated the race to a special horseman who died recently.

"I want to give a special mention today to Frank Forde, the backbone of horse racing here at Woodbine, one of the grooms who passed away suddenly last week," Moran said. "I'd like to dedicate this race to him."

Also on the Sunday card, Jason Hoyte, a longtime, respected exercise rider, celebrated his first Canadian win as he guided 3-year-old filly French Charm (\$3.30) to a maiden-breaking score in the first race.

"It means so much to me. It's just a blessing come true. Hard work does pay off," Hoyte said.

Hoyte began his riding career in Barbados in 2000 and arrived in Canada in 2004. He eventually became the go-to morning rider for Hall of Fame trainer Mark Casse for 16 years, breezing some of the biggest stars of the sport, including Hall of Famers Tepin and Sealy Hill, in preparation for the biggest races.

Hoyte, who was inspired by his friend and fellow jockey Keveh Nicholls to return to racing, made just his 13th start a winning one. **BH**

RED KING REIGNS SUPREME IN SAN JUAN CAPISTRANO

Red King returned to the Santa Anita Park turf June 21 to take a second crack at the \$101,500 San Juan Capistrano Stakes (G3T), and finally found his way to the winner's circle for the first time in a stakes.

Campaigned by Little Red Feather Racing, Gordon Jacobsen, and Philip Belmonte, Red King broke well under Umberto Rispoli from post 2 and was unhurried along the backstretch running in midpack. Favorite Ward 'n Jerry dueled with Kershaw from the break and got up to take the lead by one length at the mile mark.

Running only five lengths off the leader as the pack began to turn for home, Red King kicked forward to move into third and was angled out exiting the turn. He pulled clear at the start of the stretch, increased his lead to 2 1/2 lengths, and crossed the wire 4 1/4 lengths in front.

Ward 'n Jerry was unable to hold on to his early lead. Though he battled briefly with Red King through the stretch, he crossed the finish in third behind Siberian Iris. Siberian Iris, who was in seventh through the early stages, made a three-wide move in the stretch just outside the rail before running clear to the finish to take second.

Tintoretto, Swamp Souffle, Avalanche, Soberano, and Kershaw completed the order of finish. The final time for the marathon mile and three quarters on firm turf was 2:46.67.

"It was my first time going from the top of the downhill and ... it is beautiful," said Rispoli, who was aboard Red King for the first time.

"The grass is amazing. It's a really good track. It's been a long time since I've gone so far in a race because in Europe, we used to go quite enough every day. But it was a good feeling. Obviously, you need a horse like that."

Red King entered the race off a May 24 allowance optional claiming win at Santa Anita. Sunday's race was the first stakes for the 6-year-old son of English Channel since last year's renewal, when he finished third.

"My horse won his last race, and that picked his confidence up," trainer Phil D'Amato said. "It looked like maybe the favorite moved a little soon, and Umberto was in the right spot.

"Growing up here in LA, this was always one of my favorite races as a kid. I remember I used to stand on the apron way past the wire and watch them come home in this race, just so I could take it all in. It's an amazing race, and it's really cool to win it." **BH**

BLITZKRIEG RETURNS TO WINNING FORM IN AMERICAN STAKES

With a solid work under his belt and a post position advantage, R3 Racing and Calara Farms' Blitzkrieg was hustled to the lead and made every pole a winning one en route to a one-length victory in the \$102,000 American Stakes (G3T) June 21 at Santa Anita Park.

Ridden for the first time by Victor Espinoza, the 5-year-old gelding by War Front got a mile on firm turf in 1:33.46.

In his second Santa Anita start since running in four races in Dubai over the winter, Blitzkrieg broke from post 3 and enjoyed a half-length advantage on speedy Bolo, who broke from the far outside, into the clubhouse turn.

Setting brisk fractions of :23.02, :46.42, 1:10.03, and 1:21.66, Blitzkrieg was never headed. He opened up 1 1/2 lengths on Bolo into the far turn and had plenty left to give, holding two-time grade 1 winner Bowies Hero at bay late. Sharp Samurai was 2 1/4 lengths back in third.

"His last work was phenomenal," said Leandro Mora, assistant to trainer Doug O'Neill. "He went six furlongs, on his own, in :58 and four (fifths) and galloped out in 1:12. He worked so good, we were tempted to put him back on the dirt, but we stuck to the plan and I'm glad we did. I told Victor that with Bolo drawn way outside, let's go and I think maybe we can steal it."

"He's back, no question. This is the horse we thought we had all along."

Eighth at odds of 57-1 in the May 25 Shoemaker Mile Stakes (G1T), Blitzkrieg was sent off at 7-1 in a field of nine 3-year-olds and up and paid \$16.80, \$7.80, and \$4.60.

Blitzkrieg, who was claimed for \$25,000 in January 2019, got his second graded stakes win and now has six wins from 21 starts, with earnings of \$388,097. He was bred in Kentucky by Ramona Bass out of the Arch mare Bauble Queen.

"The pace was pretty quick, but he was doing it so easy," Espinoza said. "For me, every time I ride a horse like him with speed, I like to just sit up there and have fun." **BH**

WESTON FIRST WINNER FOR SPENDTHRIFT'S HIT IT A BOMB

Chris Drakos and Ryan Hanson's Weston became the first winner for Spendthrift Farm's Hit It a Bomb June 21 when he turned in a decisive 1 1/4-length victory in a \$51,500 maiden special weight at Santa Anita Park.

Trained by Hanson and ridden by Drayden Van Dyke, Weston broke slowly in the field of eight juveniles. He quickly made up ground by cutting between horses before being angled to the inside and was in front by a half-length as the quarter mile went in :22.49.

Exiting the turn, Weston continued to inch away from the pack and extended his lead to three lengths at the top of the stretch. Van Dyke urged the gelding forward in the stretch as a fast-moving Ambivalent drove home to challenge late.

Although Ambivalent managed to chip away a chunk of his leading margin, Weston held on gamely to cross

the wire clear. The final time for the 4 1/2-furlong dirt sprint was :52.27 on a fast track.

Weston was bred in Kentucky by EVADI Farm Team out of the multiple stakes-placed Dixie Union mare Elke. The gelding was purchased by Drakos for \$7,000 from the consignment of Dromoland Farm to the Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

Hit It a Bomb, a son of War Front out of group 3 winner Liscanna, was a homebred raced by Evelyn Stockwell and trained by Aidan O'Brien. Undeclared in three starts at 2, he won the Irish Stallion Farms E.B.F. Star Appeal Stakes before taking the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1T). He is a full brother to Brave Anna, the winner of the Connolly's Red Mills Cheveley Park Stakes (G1) at Newmarket and the Albany Stakes (G3) at Royal Ascot.

Hit It a Bomb was retired with a 3-0-2 record in seven starts and earned \$626,476. He joined the Spendthrift Farm roster in 2017 and stood for a fee of \$5,000 for the 2020 breeding season. **BH**

CAFE PHAROAH LOCKS DOWN JAPAN BID TO KENTUCKY DERBY

Cafe Pharoah, a Kentucky-bred son of American Pharoah, has won first call to represent Japan in the Sept. 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), the race that started his sire on the way to the 2015 Triple Crown.

And he did it with style.

Facing several other Japan Road to the Kentucky Derby contenders in the June 21 Unicorn Stakes (G3) on the Tokyo Racecourse dirt, Cafe Pharoah quickly moved into a stalking position from the outside post 16 gate, came to even terms with the pacesetter at the top of the stretch, and kicked away under a hand ride by jockey Damian Lane to win by five lengths.

Full Flat, a Speightstown colt making his first start since winning the Feb. 29 Samba Saudi Derby Cup in Riyadh, finished sixth. The world traveler was fifth in the TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) last fall at Santa Anita Park.

Cafe Pharoah, out of the More Than Ready mare Mary's Follies, completed the one mile on a fast track in 1:34.90. He remains undefeated after three starts, including the Hyacinth Stakes over the course and distance in February.

The colt, trained by Noriyuki Hori and owned by Koichi Nishikawa, entered the Unicorn leading the Japan Road to the Kentucky Derby with 30 points. He earned another 40 with the victory.

One race remains in the series, which was expanded from four races to six when the Kentucky Derby was rescheduled because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Japan Dirt Derby July 8 at Oi Racecourse also offers 40 points to the winner, but

none of his competitors can overcome Cafe Pharoah's 70-point total even with a win in that event.

No. 2 on the list is Dieu du Vin, a Declaration of War colt who finished second in the Unicorn with a late run that was no threat to the winner. He accounted for the first race in the series, the Cattleya Sho, in November, earning 10 points. The 16 added for the Unicorn leaves him with 26. Vacation, who did not contest the Unicorn, is third on the list with 20 points.

The overall leader at the end of the series receives an automatic invitation to the Kentucky Derby. The Japan road is separate from the main points competition encompassing races in the United States and—most years—in Dubai.

Hori customarily does not discuss plans for his runners. Accordingly, he had no comment when asked after the Unicorn about the possibility Cafe Pharoah might follow the path of his sire to the Louisville starting gate. The colt is, however, among the original nominees to the Triple Crown, as are Dieu du Vin and Vacation.

The Japanese series has not produced a Kentucky Derby winner, but it has had an impact on the Triple Crown.

Lani finished third in the 2016 Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) after off-the-board efforts in the first two legs of the Triple Crown.

Master Fencer finished fourth in the 2019 series

and accepted the invitation to the Derby when the top three points-earners declined. He finished seventh, placed sixth after Maximum Security's disqualification, and went on to finish fifth in the Belmont Stakes.

Cafe Pharoah was bred by Paul Pompa. He was sold at the Ocala Breeders' Sales March Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training for \$475,000. **BH**

TAGHROODA OFF THE MARK AS SON ALMIGHWAR WINS AT KEMPTON

Exceptional race mare Taghrooda was represented by her first winner as a broodmare June 21 when her 3-year-old son Almighwar broke his maiden in emphatic fashion at Kempton.

Almighwar—like his dam, trained by John Gosden for owner and breeder Hamdan Al Maktoum—finished down the field on his previous start in a novice stakes over a mile at Newmarket in October.

But the son of Dubawi showed the benefit of a long break and a step up in trip as he scored by 4 1/4 lengths in the Kempton novice stakes over 12 furlongs.

"He was devouring the ground towards the end of the race. He really stretched," jockey Jim Crowley told Racing UK. "He's a big sleeping baby—he had

just the one run last year. Look at the size of him, it probably took him until now to fill his frame, and he's a very nice horse.

"It probably wasn't a strong race, but I just like the way he did things. He was relaxed and went through the gears nicely. He's a big galloping horse, bred to be very good, and let's hope he is."

Taghrooda, a daughter of Sea The Stars and multiple listed winner Ezima, landed the Investec Oaks (G1) and King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes (G1) by wide margins at 3, and capped her classic season by finishing an admirable third behind Treve and Flintshire in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1).

Almighwar is her second foal but first runner since she retired to join Sheikh Hamdan's broodmare band.

Taghrooda's first foal, a 4-year-old Kingman filly named Jahafil, is unraced. She has no 2-year-old produce but does have a yearling colt by Muhaarar and was covered by Dubawi again last year.

Almighwar caps a good week for Dubawi, during which he supplied three winners at Royal Ascot—Lord North in the Prince of Wales's Stakes (G1), Khaloosy in the Britannia Handicap and Onassis in the Sandringham Handicap.

It was also an outstanding meeting for Sheikh Hamdan, whose silks were carried to victory six times, including by Khaloosy.

His other scorers were Battaash in the King's Stand Stakes (G1), Nazeef in the Duke of Cambridge Stakes (G2), Molatham in the Jersey Stakes (G3), Hukum in the King George V Stakes, and Motakhayyel in the Buckingham Palace Handicap.

SCOTTISH RACING RETURNS AFTER THREE-MONTH HIATUS

Racing in Scotland will return after an absence of more than three months at Ayr June 22, with the track's managing director, David Brown, describing the meeting as an "important first step."

Although racing has been back in Britain behind closed doors since June 1, Scotland has come out of lockdown at a slower pace.

But following last week's announcement that professional sport could restart as the Scottish government moves into phase 2 of its COVID-19 plans, Ayr will become the first track in the country to stage racing since Kelso March 16.

Flat meetings are also set to take place this month at Hamilton, starting Wednesday, and Musselburgh, and the resumption of jump racing will take place at Perth July 21.

Having lost its lucrative Scottish Grand National meeting in April, Ayr has been one of the tracks hit hardest by the coronavirus pandemic, and officials have welcomed the chance to restart the sport.

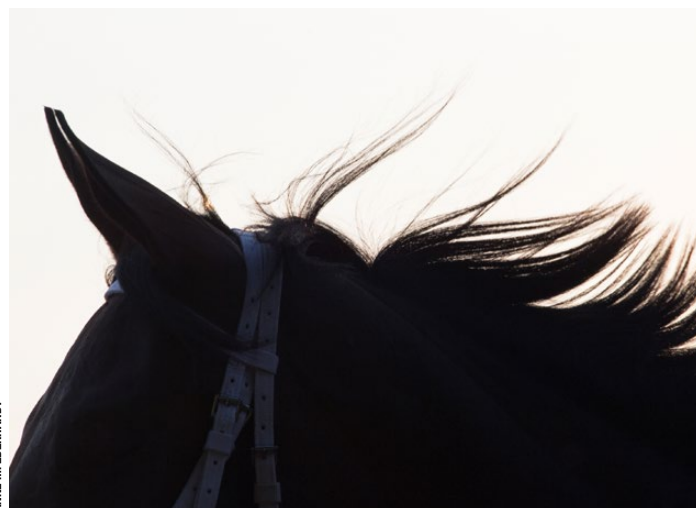
"We're very pleased and excited to have racing back, and while I have no doubt it will be surreal having no crowds or owners, it's an important first step for Scottish racing," Brown said.

"We've had to accept the government advice with regards to the timing of a return, and the important thing is to make it as safe as possible. The (British Horseracing Authority) and (Racecourse Association) have done a good job putting together the protocols in a constantly changing environment.

"Like other racecourses, the financial landscape is extremely challenging, and the loss of the Scottish Grand National and many of our flat fixtures is a major blow, but you have to look forward."

Ayr has had a troubled recent past, following the cancellation of the Ayr Gold Cup meeting in 2017 due to drainage issues, but Brown believes the course is resilient enough to bounce back from the latest problems.

"From a racing perspective, it's been a challenging few years at Ayr, but we've always tried to run the

business prudently so when the tough times come, we're able to weather the storm," he said. "The business has been there for 100 years, and you'd like to hope it will be there for another 100 years."

Dumfries trainer Iain Jardine, who saddles one runner on a nine-race card headlined by the EBF Land O'Burns Fillies' Stakes, is pleased to see the return of Scottish racing.

He said: "We're delighted it's back on. Scottish racing is important and provides a lot of good races, which attract runners from places like Newmarket and Ireland. There are a lot of racing fans in Scotland, and the racing public, as well as all the owners, will be mad keen to go back as soon as they're allowed to."

The safety protocols requiring horses to travel to meetings on the day of racing could become an issue for Ayr given its remote location. They have not prevented Malton trainer Richard Fahey sending up a strong team, although he is eager to see them relaxed.

"It's grand to get back racing there, but we need overnight stabling back sooner rather than later," he said. "We're going to be leaving at 4 a.m. when normally we'd go up the day before. The horses seem to take it fine, but it's tough enough on the staff."

Michael Dods, who trains south of the border in Darlington, said: "We like racing at Ayr, Hamilton, and Musselburgh, and it's great to have those tracks going again as it gives us more options."

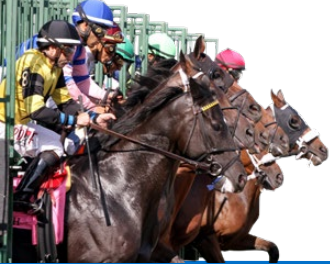
