BAFFERT SUSPENDED, HORSES DQ'D AFTER DRUG POSITIVES

Oaklawn Park stewards have announced a 15-day suspension for Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert after two of his standout horses failed post-race drug tests May 2 at the Hot Springs, Ark., track.

Following a July 13 hearing, the stewards forwarded decisions, dated July 14 and announced July 15, calling for a Baffert's suspension beginning Aug. 1, and the disqualification of both Charlatan, who won a division of the May 2 Arkansas Derby (G1), and Gamine, a filly who won an allowance-level race on the same card and later won the Longines Acorn Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park in record time.

The decision calls for purse money to be redistributed and elevating the finishing positions of those horses who ran behind them. The stewards reported that Charlatan and Gamine each tested positive for the local anesthetic lidocaine, specifically 3-hydroxylidocaine.

An attorney for Baffert said they will appeal the stewards' decision as a case of environmental contamination that did not impact the running of the race.

"We are very disappointed in the stewards' ruling and we will exercise our right to appeal," attorney Craig Robertson III said. "In this instance, we presented a compelling case of mitigating circumstances, including the following undisputed facts: This is a case of innocent exposure and not intentional administration. The trace levels of lidocaine found in

both Charlatan and Gamine would have had no pharmacological effect, much less a performance-enhancing one, on either horse. Zero.

"As such, a suspension of Mr. Baffert and a disqualification of either horse is completely unwarranted. We will pursue our legal rights until justice is obtained."

An appeal would go before the Arkansas Racing Commission, whereby commissioners would consider the evidence and case and then issue a determination, Oaklawn state steward Bernie Hettel said. An appeal of the commission's decision would proceed in civil court, Hettel added.

Lidocaine is a recognized therapeutic in the racing environment that carries a withdrawal guideline of 72 hours before a race to ensure it doesn't impact racing or endanger the horse. Guidelines for the lidocaine threshold—the permitted level on race day—in Arkansas match the guidance provided by the Racing Medication and Testing

Consortium: 20 picograms per milliliter in plasma or serum.

In the post-race tests, Gamine tested at 185 picograms and Charlatan at 46 picograms. While Gamine was more than nine times above the threshold and Charlatan was more than twice that threshold, Robertson noted that the sport is testing at very small levels. He said the positives were caused by contamination.

Though lidocaine is used in racing, Robertson said July 6 that neither horse was administered the local anesthetic. He said both positives were caused by contamination from an employee who was wearing a Salonpas patch, which applies topical medication for pain.

for Foreign Substances and Recommended Penalties Model Rule, lidocaine is a Class 2 violation calling for a Class B penalty—both second-highest on the scales. If the regulator determines a violation, the guidelines call for a trainer suspension of at least 15 days and a fine of at least \$500. Under the guidelines, the horse owners would face disqualification of their horses and loss of purse money.

The Arkansas Derby would have been the first stakes win for Charlatan, a son of Speightstown who has raced for SF Racing, Starlight Racing, Madaket Stables, Stonestreet Stables, Fred Hertrich III, John Fielding, and Golconda Stables. Gamine, a daughter of Into Mischief, is campaigned by Michael Lund Petersen.

In the days after the Arkansas Derby, Hill 'n' Dale Farms secured the breeding rights to Charlatan.

Jackpot Farm's Basin, trained by Steve Asmussen, crossed the wire six lengths behind Charlatan in the Arkansas Derby and has now been proclaimed the winner by the Arkansas ruling. He originally earned \$100,000 for finishing second but now has been awarded first prize of \$300,000 under the redistributed purse.

The Arkansas Derby is a points race on the Road to the Kentucky Derby, which is used to determine the field should more than 20 horses be entered. Churchill Downs recognizes disqualifications as they are reported by Equibase, and updated its points standings Wednesday.

Charlatan is currently sidelined while recovering from minor ankle surgery and is targeting a fall return. He is not expected to be ready for a race until after the Sept. 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1). Basin, who now is awarded 100 points from the race, and Gouverneur Morris, who now gets 40 points, also are not being considered for the Derby, according to Churchill.

With Gamine's disqualification from the May 2 allowance-level race, Speech is declared the winner. Speech followed that effort with a runner-up finish in the Santa Anita Oaks (G2) and a victory in the Central Bank Ashland Stakes (G1).

Pari-mutuel wagering is not affected by disqualifications from post-race test results. **BH**

To be honest, we had little idea what would happen when Keeneland announced it would hold a five-day mid-July meeting to take the place of its April program that had been scuttled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. While hoping for the best for the one-of-a-kind summer soiree, there appeared to be several obstacles in the way, yet the Keeneland Association pulled off an unforgettable stand.

It's amazing what a three-day stakes schedule featuring four grade 1 races and a gaggle of grade 2s and grade 3s will do to bring in the best horses and the brightest horsemen. We wondered how it might play out, with Belmont Park's late start in early June, Del Mar opening July 11, and the definitive Saratoga Race Course meet on the horizon, but the stakes team headed by Ben Huffman was able to bring in the talent.

That talent was able to produce "Fast Times at Keeneland High" with stakes and track marks falling with remarkable consistency.

Three standards fell in consecutive races. Amy Dunne, Brenda Miley, Westrock Stables, and Jean Wilkinson's Leinster won the Shakertown Stakes (G2T) in a course record 1:00.86 for 5 1/2 furlongs. Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and Madaket Stables'

Speech lowered the 1 1/16-mile track mark to 1:41.26 after winning the Central Bank Ashland Stakes (G1). And e Five Racing Thoroughbreds' stellar Rushing Fall lowered the 1 1/16-mile mark on turf to 1:39.02 with her score in the Coolmore Jenny Wiley Stakes (G1T). In all, three track and three course records were set.

"When they announced their schedule of races, I think everybody circled those dates, and it gave them enough time to come up with a plan of action," said Jacob West, vice president of bloodstock for Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners. "When you give the best trainers in the world that much time to dial their horses in, it ends up with more track records falling and things like that.

"The real horses that showed up in these races, it wasn't like they got lucky with trips or something like that. When you walked into the starting gate and you looked left or right, there were some serious horses around you. The bottom line is there were really good horses going across the Keeneland turf and dirt tracks, and we saw some very good horses put up spectacular performances. It's a credit to Keeneland for putting that together."

And Keeneland did it with owners being allowed to watch their horses run.

"It's hard to keep the owners away from their horses. That's the heartbeat of the whole industry—people who love animals," West said. "It was incredible that they let the owners in. It was nice to be back at a racetrack and put some money through the windows and be able to hoot and yell in person instead of screaming at my TV as I've been doing for the last couple of months."

And West wasn't the only one putting money through the windows.

Keeneland reported the July 8-12 meet handled more than \$63 million with an average daily all-sources handle of \$12,659,866. The July 11 card, which handled \$23,834,972, was second only to last year's Toyota Blue Grass (G2) day program.

That's also a testament to an industry that has seen handle hold its own in comparison to last year, despite a clear lack of on-track handle due to COVID-19. It's proof positive that racing has better technology and infrastructure than we might think. The strength of TVG, FOX Sports Network, and NBC Sports, along with the ability to wager through mobile platforms, has our sport up to speed. We've been able to garner a deeper customer bench as other sports have been sidelined.

The down note of Keeneland's summer weekend has been the emergence of jockeys who have ridden at the track testing positive for COVID-19. Luis Saez was first, testing positive July 10 after riding in New York, California, and Indiana before riding at Keeneland, and later Flavien Prat, who tested positive July 12 after riding in six races at Keeneland July 11. West Coast riders Martin Garcia and Victor Espinoza also tested positive.

Is jetting from track to track, day to day a bit cavalier? We think so, despite the proper protocols in place.

If we've learned anything during this pandemic, it is that the rules of engagement change day to day and are different from jurisdiction to jurisdiction. Sound familiar? **BH**

DEL MAR CANCELS RACING JULY 17-19 DUE TO COVID-19

Del Mar has preemptively canceled its upcoming weekend of racing—July 17-19—after 15 jockeys tested positive for COVID-19. All of Del Mar's jockeys and jockey room personnel were tested July 14 by San Diego County Health and Human Services Agency staff as requested by the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club.

Joe Harper, CEO of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, confirmed the Southern California track will be "taking the weekend off."

This weekend cards were to include the July 18 San Diego Handicap (G2) featuring the return of Maximum Security and the July 19 Eddie Read Stakes (G2T).

"After a good number of jockeys tested positive out of the Los Alamitos meet we decided to test everyone in the room," he said. "We took a look at the entries ... and decided to take the weekend off. They have to stay out for 10 days, but if the riders don't show any symptoms and are asymptomatic, but with a clear test can ride."

Harper praised the work done by the medical and administrative staff of the San Diego County Health Department as well as the Scripps Mercy Hospital in San Diego with assisting with the testing.

"We are doing what we think is right," Harper said. "We are listening to the doctors, not the politicians. We will be vigilant."

"Assuming these individuals continue to show no symptoms, they will be isolated for a total of 10 days and should be able to resume their usual activities, including riding after that time," said Dr. Eric McDonald, medical director, Epidemiology & Immunizations Services, County of San Diego.

"Racing will return July 24," Harper said hopefully. "Canceling this weekend's races will give us additional time to monitor the situation and give the individuals who tested positive additional time to recover."

Based on DMTC protocols, as well as direction from medical advisers and county public health officials, the testing was administered by county medical staff. Contact tracing procedures are underway in conjunction with the San Diego Health & Human Services Agency.

A common factor among all but one of the riders that tested positive is that they rode at the recently concluded Los Alamitos meet. Del Mar officials ordered the testing of all the jockeys and jockeys' room personnel after two riders, Flavien Prat and Victor Espinoza, tested positive for COVID-19.

"We made the decision to test everyone as part of protocols we have developed in conjunction with local medical experts and the San Diego County Health & Human Services Agency," said Josh Rubinstein, Del Mar Thoroughbred president and COO. "We put these measures in place to help ensure the safety of all workers at Del Mar and our surrounding community."

Because of the Health Insurance Privacy and Portability Act, Del Mar is not allowed to release the names of the affected riders.

In a further safety measure, only jockeys based in California will be permitted to ride at Del Mar for the remainder of the meeting. Jockeys from jurisdictions outside of California will not be allowed to ride at Del Mar. The measure to restrict the riding colony follows a similar announcement by the New York

Racing Association concerning jockeys at Saratoga Race Course. Under Del Mar's new policy, until further notice, local jockeys who leave the track to ride at other venues will not be allowed to ride again at Del Mar for the remainder of the summer racing meeting.

Additionally, Del Mar officials are re-configuring and expanding the track's jockeys' quarters, including moving some of the functions that normally take place in the jockeys' room to an adjacent area.

Del Mar has been providing health screening, monitoring, and testing resources for barn area workers and essential personnel during its summer meet, which is being held for the first time in the track's 81-year history without spectators. The meet began July 10 and will conclude Sept. 7.

Del Mar's health and safety protocols have been formulated with direct input from medical experts in the community.

The Thoroughbred Owners of California said they are in agreement with Del Mar's measures.

"TOC strongly supports the actions taken today by the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club in conjunction with the San Diego County Department of Health," TOC said in a Del Mar release. "The health of our riders is our top priority now." **BH**

PANDEMIC BRINGS CHANGE TO SARATOGA RACE COURSE

Even a place as traditional and timeless as Saratoga Race Course has been unable to fend off the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

While the area around the serene Victorian-era racetrack has been remarkably free of the coronavirus, with just five deaths linked to the disease and less than 0.3% of 220,000 county residents diagnosed with it (a total of 624 cases) since the start of the year, racing at the Spa has not developed an immunity to the way COVID-19 has changed everyday life throughout the country.

"There will be a 2020 Saratoga meet on paper, but it will not be one to remember in a lot of ways in terms of the ambiance on-track," New York Racing Association CEO and president Dave O'Rourke said.

The 157th season at Saratoga will be unlike any other, with change the optimum word.

Reflective of that, change is happening on what seems like an hourly basis as the New York State

Gaming Commission waited until less than 24 hours before the July 16 start of the meet to finally announce that a limited number of owners will be allowed on the grounds for racing and morning training.

Prior to that July 15 release of new protocols, it appeared the Spa's opening day would feature the same ghost-town look of Belmont Park during its recently concluded 25-day spring/summer meet with no spectators of any kind, just essential personnel for the care of the horses and the conducting of races.

Now, at least, there will be some activity, though it will be a far cry from the throng of 22,591 that turned out for the 2019 opener.

"It's fantastic news," said Jack Wolf, who has a home in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., and is the founder and managing partner of Starlight Racing, which will send out two horses on Thursday's card, including Mo Hawk in the \$100,000 Peter Pan Stakes (G3). "I heard rumblings that owners may be allowed in, but I had been planning to watch our horses from home or at a restaurant, so to be able to go over there and watch is great news."

Under the new protocols, only people with a valid New York state owners license and a horse running on that day's card will be allowed to attend the races, with no more than eight owners per horse. Owners will have temperature checks before they are allowed in and must wear a mask and maintain social distancing during their time on the grounds. Guests will not be permitted.

Backstretch access will also be limited to licensed owners, though they will need a negative COVID-19 test in the past seven days for admission.

The ability to have owners in attendance brightened what had been an unusually lackluster lead-up to the first of 40 days of racing at the Spa and should be a shot in the arm for local business who depend on tourism for their financial well-being.

"It's a good day for Saratoga. Our businesses have been suffering, and this will help hotels attract owners who want to stay here. And once there's heads in the beds, it will help the restaurants and other businesses in the area," said Todd Shimkus, the president of the Saratoga County Chamber of Commerce. "It's the best first step we can have to potentially open safely for

fans. Our hope is that the owners and the groups that have access to the racetrack do everything they can to make sure there's not a spread of COVID-19 up here. That will hopefully allow us to bring more people in. There's now a lot of responsibility on the owners' part to do the right thing."

Whether fans will be permitted at some point during the meet remains to be seen, though it is a foregone conclusion that even on its best days in 2020, the Spa will bear little resemblance to the nation's premier racetrack that was jammed with 1,056,053 fans last year and handled \$146 million on-track alone.

The sights and sounds will surely be dramatically different. If any of the circuit's jockeys decide to leave Saratoga to ride at a different track, new COVID-19 protocols will bar them from returning for the remainder of the meet. There are coverings along parts of the track's perimeter to prevent people from gathering to catch a glimpse of the racing. Instead of thousands of fans at the grandstand railing cheering on their horses, about 20 restaurants around town will conduct viewing parties so that fans can watch the races from afar. Needless to say, the widespread anticipation that builds to epic proportions for opening day at Saratoga was barely palpable until Wednesday, when owners received a reason to cheer.

"It certainly doesn't have the electricity that you normally feel going up to Saratoga. It's the quietest I've seen on the backstretch leading up to the meet in a long time," said Todd Pletcher, a 13-time leading trainer at Saratoga. "We know it won't be a normal meet, but the main focus is to continue racing, so hopefully we can make the right adjustments along the way. Everyone has to be prepared for changes and adjustments."

Yet beyond all those issues, what Saratoga 2020 has going for it is a hallmark of the Spa since the days of the Civil War: sensational racing. Tiz the Law, Vekoma, Midnight Bisou, Code of Honor, Tom's d'Etat, and Gamine are just a few of the stars slated to race during the season, which runs through Sept. 7.

"It's still Saratoga, and we have large purses for what's going on in the world," NYRA senior vice president of racing operations Martin Panza said. "Saratoga is still a special place. It adds value to your horses, especially if it's a female. People are going to support racing here, and that's a good thing."

Pletcher also expects to see a high level of racing.

"There's still a lot of great racing and a lot of high-quality stakes," he said. "It's always a time when you look forward to seeing your 2-year-olds develop."

NYRA's hope is that quality racing on a daily basis will spark a boost in handle, as it did at Belmont Park, where wagering was up by 42%, to offset the potential loss of on-track handle and revenue from last year's meet as well as funds for purses from the still-shuttered casino at Aqueduct Racetrack.

"Our purses are generated by our handle," O'Rourke said. "The handle is doing well, but it's coming in through different channels, so it's not replenishing the purse account like a 40% increase normally would. Saratoga, with the power of its brand and the television exposure it will get, will help drive the handle and the purse replenishment. No one knows when (the pandemic) will end, and racing at Saratoga will allow us a better continuity into the fall than if we stayed downstate. The handle numbers would be lower if we stayed at Belmont, the purse replenishment would be

lower, and we might be sacrificing the ability to race through the fall at certain purse levels. At Saratoga, it's going to be a great television and gambling product."

Due to COVID-19 and travel restrictions, the backstretch at the Spa figures to be less crowded than in past years. Some horsemen from Kentucky who usually send a string of horses to Saratoga will only have a handful on the grounds. Some of the smaller trainers on the circuit who endured the financial sting of 80 days without racing during the height of the pandemic say they will not be stabling at Saratoga, preferring to van their horses north for races and then return them to Belmont afterward.

"It's all financial. Saratoga is the highlight of the year for any trainer. All we want to do is run up there and enjoy everything that goes into the meet. But for me, it means renting a house for me and my staff and moving the operation. When you own a lot of your horses yourself, it's expensive. It's a difficult situation, so I'm not stabling there," said trainer Chad Summers, who normally sends his 18-horse stable north for the meet but will remain at Belmont this season. "I don't want to ship up from Belmont a day before the race in 100-degree temperatures, but it didn't seem like there was any other alternative."

One potential problem with trainers keeping horses at Belmont could be a reluctance to send a horse to the Spa as a main-track-only entrant when weather is iffy, a common occurrence in the Adirondack region, where weather often changes in the blink of an eye.

Finding backstretch help will also be more of an issue this year.

"The labor situation at Saratoga will be tough," said trainer Rick Schosberg, who recently added horses from owners Leonard and Jonathan Green's D. J. Stable and will have a larger presence than normal at the meet. "Some trainers are sending satellite divisions up there and shuttling horses back and forth, which can be difficult.

But it's hard to get the labor to go up there, and I can't blame the people. If some people can't get second jobs in the afternoon, it's more economical to stay home. There will be less of a labor force than normal this year, and I'll probably be rubbing three horses a day myself, which isn't fun when you're 60. It will definitely be a different look this year, but I'm just happy they're racing."

Joe Appelbaum, the president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, said there are several main reasons behind workers' reluctance to be at the Spa.

"Logistically, it's a bear whether you come up to Saratoga or if you stay at Belmont," he said. "I think the No. 1 issue for us is getting enough workers because of restrictions on visas, restrictions on travel, and people's health concerns. We are pretty darn good at shipping horses up and down the Thruway, so we'll be OK with that, but the staffing is a huge issue. We all have to figure out ways around this.

"It's bittersweet. The sweet part is that the meet will take place with decent purse levels and a full complement of horses and jockeys. The bitter part is that there's no fans there. It's not the same without that community feeling. But for those of us in this business full time, it's important to race at Saratoga, and in this new world, let's be thankful for what we have. It will be great racing, and we're ready to put on a show."

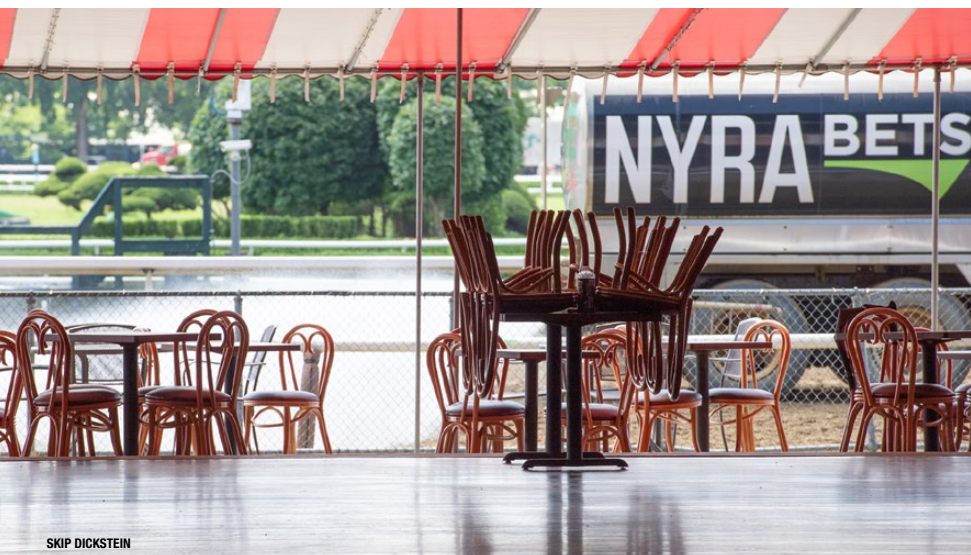
A more subtle difference is the addition of a new safety rail for the main track, which also allowed NYRA to improve the surface's drainage and make it better equipped for handling the freakish summertime rainstorms that have pelted the racetrack for more than a century and a half.

In another sign of the times, while NYRA's climate-controlled 1863 Club, which was unveiled last year, will not be open this year, some restaurants have found a way to capitalize on the track being closed to the public and offset the loss of dining revenue from tourists. According to Shimkus, about 21 restaurants in the county will be offering their version of a day at the races, providing day-long seating to watch the card on big-screen televisions.

At Prime at the Saratoga National Golf Club, director of sales and marketing Lauren Holmes said they have virtually sold out seating for a maximum of 200 people on each Thursday through Saturday during the meet. Prime is charging a \$50-a-person fee for 12:30-6:30 p.m. seating each racing day, with \$30 going toward food and beverage costs. In addition, Prime will offer programs and access to opening and funding NYRA Bets accounts. Patrons can also download Daily Racing Form past performances, and NYRA's Anthony Stabile and Capital Off-Track Betting personalities will make guest appearances to provide handicapping advice.

"It's a crazy time and it's been a challenge, but people want to get out," Holmes said. "We usually handle 400 people, so 200 will be a piece of cake. We're excited about doing this for racing fans. Bring on the good weather, and we're ready to go."

Another popular spot for racing fans, the West Side Bar and Grill, is offering reserved seating in its dining

room and patio for a maximum of 75 people from 12:30-5:30 p.m. each racing day at a cost of \$40 each, with \$20 allocated toward food and beverage.

Racing City Brewing Company, with a huge projection screen that measures 23 feet by 14 feet, will offer \$25 seating, with the money going toward the customers' final bill.

While the positive response at restaurants certainly reflects the evergreen appeal of Saratoga racing, and horsemen can take tremendous pride in the hard and dedicated work that went into keep racing afloat during the pandemic, there's no getting past the differences everyone will see at Saratoga in the coming weeks. There will indeed be strange sights, though, in a way, they may ultimately only enhance the fondness for what Saratoga used to be some 12 months ago and what it will hopefully be next year.

"We're all getting desensitized to it," O'Rourke said. "Belmont Stakes Day was a great day of racing, but it was strange on-site. We've set picnic tables up around the paddock and it's a nice scene, but without the crowds, it's not really Saratoga. Hopefully, the world will return to normal in 2021 and we can go back to the wonderful kaleidoscope this place is." **BH**

NYRA RELEASES GUIDELINES FOR OWNERS ATTENDING SARATOGA

A limited number of licensed owners will be permitted at Saratoga Race Course on the day that their horse is entered to race beginning July 17, the New York Racing Association announced following updated guidance issued by the New York State Gaming Commission July 15.

In order to reduce density and adhere to social distancing guidelines, the size of the ownership group will be restricted to eight people in possession of a NYSGC license per horse. With the exception of Friday's card, the application must be received 24 hours in advance of race day.

No same-day applications will be accepted. All owners within the group must be in possession of a valid NYSGC license. Horses with identical ownership will be limited to eight total admissions regardless of the number of horses running that day.

To align with required health and safety measures implemented in New York to mitigate risk and combat the spread of COVID-19, owners will be subjected to health screening prior to entry, including a temperature check. In addition, owners will be required to practice social distancing and wear a facial covering at all times while on the Saratoga property.

"Health and safety are our primary focus as we continue to work with New York state officials to determine the potential for broader spectator access

during the 2020 summer meet," NYRA president and CEO Dave O'Rourke said. "To be able to allow the participation of a limited number of owners reflects the progress made in New York to reduce the rate of COVID-19 infection."

A limited number of licensed owners will be permitted within the barn area at Saratoga Race Course during the 2020 summer meet. In order to secure access to the barn area, owners must provide NYRA with a negative COVID-19 test result taken within seven days of the request. Owners are not permitted to watch live racing from the barn area, and owner access ends at 11:20 a.m. ET. Prior approval is required to enter the barn area.

Owners approved to enter the barn area will be required to practice social distancing and wear a facial covering at all times.

Owners planning travel to New York from any of the states listed on the New York Travel Advisory are subject to a mandatory 14-day quarantine.

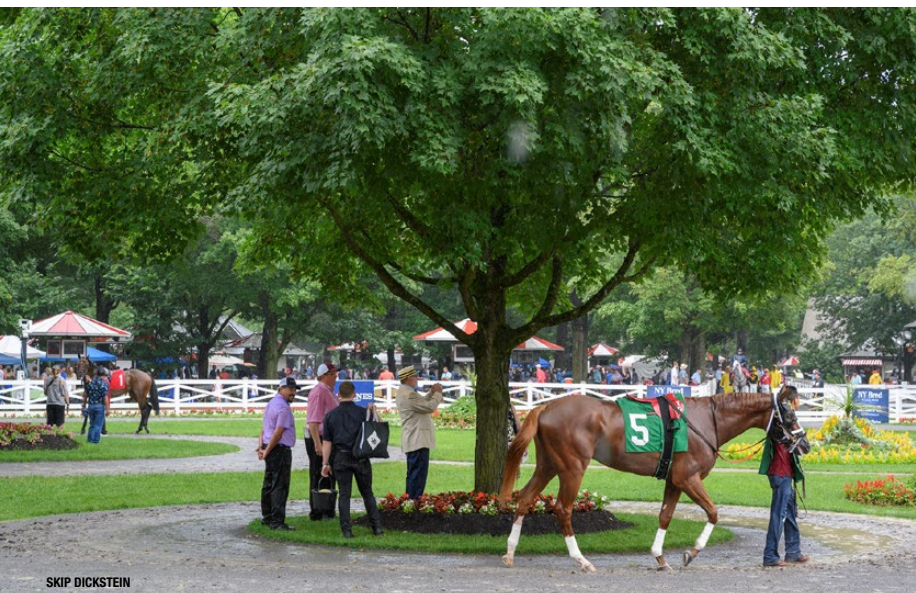
Per NYSGC guidance, owners are not permitted within any indoor areas at Saratoga Race Course, including the clubhouse and grandstand and all hospitality areas. As such, owners will be provided a socially distanced outdoor seating area and will be permitted to view races from the apron. Hours of access on race days will begin at noon, and owners must enter via the Clubhouse Entrance.

The 2020 summer meet at Saratoga Race Course will begin July 16 and run through Labor Day, Sept. 7. Following the four-day opening weekend, live racing will be conducted five days a week, Wednesdays through Sundays.

Under current New York state guidelines, Saratoga Race Course will open without spectators in attendance.

Owner applications for admission to Saratoga Race Course are to be sent to NYRA's Horsemen's Relations Associate via email at horsemensrelations@nyrainc.com or by phone at 516-488-6008. NYRA will confirm all reservations via email. NYRA cannot consider or accept same-day applications.

The NYRA Office of Horsemen's Relations will begin processing applications Thursday at 9 a.m. **BH**

AUTHENTIC, DR POST TO BREAK ALONGSIDE IN HASKELL

Runhappy Santa Anita Derby (G1) runner-up Authentic drew post 2 and was pegged as the 4-5 morning-line favorite July 15 as part of a seven-horse field for the \$1 million TVG.com Haskell Stakes (G1) July 18 at Monmouth Park.

One of the favorites for this year's postponed Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) Sept. 5 at Churchill Downs, Authentic bids to give Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert his ninth win in the 1 1/8-mile Haskell, the richest race on Monmouth's schedule. Baffert has captured the New Jersey staple a record eight times, last taking it in 2015 with Triple Crown winner Americah Pharoah.

The race came up softer than in years past, with Authentic the only graded stakes winner in the lineup. The 3-year-old son of Into Mischief won the first three starts of his career, including the Sham Stakes (G3) and San Felipe Stakes (G2) at Santa Anita Park prior to a 2 3/4-length defeat by Honor A. P. in the Santa Anita Derby. He races for Spendthrift Farm, Starlight Racing, and Madaket Stables.

Baffert felt Authentic might not have been at his best in the Santa Anita Derby.

"Well, he had sort of a rough trip. He didn't break well and he broke out a couple lanes, and ended up getting caught wide, was a little rank," he said Wednesday during a National Thoroughbred Racing Association media conference call. "He came into the race a little bit fresh. I backed off of him because I didn't know when they were going to run the Santa Anita Derby. We like to make excuses for our horses because they are like our children. You know, he was a little fresh coming into there and he got tired and he was wide and the winner,

Honor A. P., ran a great race, went by him."

Authentic's leading challenger is Dr Post, the 5-2 second choice, who breaks from post 1.

Like Authentic, he comes off a second-place finish, running 3 3/4 lengths behind Tiz the Law in the June 20 Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) for trainer Todd Pletcher. The 3-year-old son of Quality Road owned by St. Elias Stable has won two of four starts, winning a maiden race and the Unbridled Stakes at Gulfstream Park earlier this year before his start in the Belmont.

Joe Bravo will ride Dr Post, while Mike Smith will be in from California for the mount on Authentic.

Due to COVID-19 health restrictions imposed by the New York Racing Association, which is not permitting its jockey colony to return to Saratoga Race Course after riding out of town, no jockeys based in New York this summer are coming to New Jersey to ride in Saturday's Haskell.

Besides Authentic and Dr Post, the only other stakes winner in the field is Euro Stable's Lebda, who captured the Miracle Wood Stakes and Private Terms Stakes at Laurel Park earlier this year before running sixth following a layoff of more than three months in the June 27 Ohio Derby (G3) at Thistledown.

"He was off for a long time. He had a lot of vacation, and that's why we're going to run back in the three weeks," trainer Claudio Gonzalez said.

The Raison d'Etat colt recorded a bullet half-mile breeze in :47 3/5 July 10 at Laurel under regular rider Alex Cintron.

"Alex breezed him that day and when we talked he said he was feeling good and did everything right, and he had a lot of horse," Gonzalez said.

The Haskell will be the fourth graded-stakes attempt for Lebda. Besides the Ohio Derby, he ran ninth last year in the Nashua Stakes (G3) at Aqueduct Racetrack and third in the Iroquois Stakes (G3) at Churchill Downs.

For the first time this year, owing to the Kentucky Derby being delayed from May 2 due to COVID-19, the Haskell is a race on the Road to the Kentucky Derby. It provides qualifying points on a 100-40-20-10 scale to its top four finishers.

The race is also a Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" qualifier for the Nov. 7 Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) at Keeneland. In addition, BetMakers, in partnership with Monmouth, is offering a \$1 million bonus to the connections of any horse that wins the Haskell, Kentucky Derby, and the Breeders' Cup Classic.

Saturday's card at Monmouth also includes five other stakes, four

graded. They include the \$250,000 Molly Pitcher Stakes (G3), the \$300,000 Monmouth Cup Stakes (G3), the \$300,000 United Nations Stakes (G1T), the \$150,000 WinStar Matchmaker Stakes (G3T), and the \$75,000 Wolf Hill Stakes.

The track is permitting limited attendance Saturday. Initial general admission tickets sold out, but the track has been authorized to place an additional 500 tickets on sale on its website Wednesday evening at 6 p.m. ET.

Attendees must submit to a health evaluation consisting of a temperature check and questionnaire. Masks are required to enter and must be worn unless eating, drinking, or smoking.

NBC will broadcast the Haskell in programming from 5 to 6 p.m. **BH**

SOPHISTICURL THE FIRST WINNER FOR RIDE ON CURLIN

Sophisticurl made her fourth start an impressive one, winning a July 15 maiden special weight for 2-year-old Florida-bred fillies at Gulfstream Park, and in doing so she gave freshman sire Ride On Curlin his first winner.

The filly was entered in the 5 1/2-furlong test by trainer Lester Barbazon III and was ridden to victory by jockey Samy Camacho. Off at odds of 15-1, Sophisticurl went straight to the lead but was met by Frankly My Dear. The pair battled, no more than a head apart, through the entirety of the race.

While Frankly My Dear led by a head at each point of call along the rail for the first five furlongs, the pair swapped blows for the lead as fractions went in :22.81, :46.39, and :58.94. With a lucky head in front at the wire, Sophisticurl posted a final time of 1:05.65 on a fast track.

Owned by Rolling Meadows Farm, Sophisticurl was bred by Helen and Joseph Barbazon. Sophisticurl is out of the unraced Tale of the Cat mare Sophisticattin and is from the female family of grade 2 winner Lottsia Talc, who is the dam of grade 3 winner and Foxwoods King's Bishop Stakes (G1) runner-up Fort Loudon.

Ride On Curlin raced for owner Daniel Dougherty and trainer William Gowan. The son of Curlin earned \$795,175 in 22 starts. In his second start as a 2-year-old, he ran 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:03 to set a track record at Ellis Park.

As a 3-year-old, Ride On Curlin placed third in the Southwest Stakes (G3) and Rebel Stakes (G2) before finishing as the runner-up in the Arkansas Derby (G1). In the 2014 Preakness Stakes (G1), Ride On Curlin finished second to California Chrome.

In May 2016, the Barbazons announced they would be standing the stallion at their Pleasant Acres Stallions in Florida the following year. Ride On Curlin has stood for a fee of \$5,000 since he entered stud. **BH**

NOT THIS TIME FILLY TOPS OBS JULY SECOND SESSION

The July 15 session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales July 2-Year-Olds in Training and Horses of Race Age Sale saw a precipitous decline in total sales as the market continues to feel the adverse effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

OBS reported Wednesday that 155 horses were sold from 213 offered for receipts of \$3,869,800. The average price for the session was \$24,966 and the median was \$13,000. The 58 that went unsold represented an RNA rate of 27.2%. During last year's session, held during the auction's original June spot on the sales calendar, OBS reported 225 horses sold for gross receipts of \$7,719,700 at an average of \$34,310 and median of \$17,000.

"People think that the market is depressed, and at the lower end, it is in trouble," said Mike Mulligan of Emerald Sales, who purchased Wednesday's session-topper for \$270,000. "It's tough to have horses that don't check all the boxes. But the horses that do, those horses are well received and in demand. I think maybe there are 40 horses here in the

upper market, maybe another 100 in the \$100,000 to \$150,000 range, and there are plenty of people trying to buy those horses at whatever level they're at."

Sitting at the top of the results for the day was Hip 640, a filly by freshman stallion Not This Time consigned by de Meric Sales, agent. One of only two juveniles to breeze an eighth-mile in :09 4/5 during the

under tack show, she was purchased by Emerald Sales, agent for Tobey Morton.

"My team and I thoroughly watch horses during the breeze show, and we felt like she was one of the top fillies in the sale, for sure," said Mulligan, who added that the filly will join the barn of trainer John Kimmel. "It's a huge bonus that she is a New York-bred, but she doesn't necessarily need that. It's a nice option for her. She is a real quality filly. She galloped out really well and got my best score on the track.

"We loved her on the end of the shank, and she jumped through all the hoops. She's a special filly and she's going to one of the best trainers. I can't be more pleased for the owners. They trust us to find them the right horses, and we do our best. We're just really, really happy to get this filly."

Bred in New York by Sequel Stallions NY and Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings, Hip 640 is from the first crop of Taylor Made Stallions' Not This Time and is out of the A.P. Indy mare Exotic Design. The filly's second dam is the Rahy mare Exotic Wood, whose 11 wins in 17 starts included three grade 1 stakes. Sequel New York bought Exotic Design for \$17,000 from Four Star Sales at the 2018 Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale while carrying the Not This Time filly in utero.

De Meric consigned the filly to the OBS July Sale on behalf of Silvestre Avila, one of the consignor's exercise riders.

"She was well received, and I'm happy for Silvestre and his family because no one deserves it more," Tristan de Meric said. "It's been a struggle for a lot of people, and I'm so happy that it worked out for him. For him to have one horse this year and that be the one, it's outstanding."

"Not This time, he's probably one of the most exciting first-crop sires there has been lately," Mulligan said. "But it all really comes down to a horse's performance on the breeze show. How they work, how they gallop out, everything that makes a racehorse a racehorse happens in the breeze show. If they work well and they're a physical horse at the end of the shank, you can look at the pedigree and figure out how much more you'll have to pay, but, regardless, the top performers at the breeze show will be expensive."

Mulligan purchased two other horses for Morton during the OBS sale beginning with Hip 199, an \$85,000 Anchor Down filly from the consignment of Woodside Ranch, agent. Bred in

Kentucky by Gainesway Thoroughbreds and Marylou Whitney Stables, the filly is out of the Tale of the Cat mare Storied Tale and worked an eighth-mile in :10.

Rounding out the buys for Morton was Hip 582, a \$70,000 Uncaptured colt consigned by Gene Recio, agent. Bred in Florida by Tracy Pinchin and Kenneth D'Oyen out of the Wildcat Heir mare Defying Gravity, the colt breezed an eighth-mile in :10 1/5.

"We're ready to put this one in the books and move on to 2021," said de Meric, who ended the day as the leading consignor with 12 horses sold for receipts of \$588,500. "All things considered, overall this year has been a good year for us. We've had a good group. We're happy we're able to keep moving forward and fight another year.

"We'll have to handicap (our yearling budget) going in. We'll have to adjust some things. But I think there will be a lot of opportunities out there, and we're ready to go look at yearlings." **BH**

Bloodstock agent Dennis O'Neill made his move early during the July 15 second session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales July 2-Year-Olds and Horses of Racing Age Sale for what many might consider an unlikely horse.

Consigned as Hip 383 by Blue River Bloodstock, agent, the colt by Louisiana stallion Half Ours fell O'Neill's way on a final bid of \$185,000 after a brief battle inside the pavilion. For O'Neill, the asking price was a steal for a horse who showed tremendous aptitude during the under tack show, working a quarter-mile in :20 1/5.

"The work was pretty insane, and we've done good with horses that have breezed good at the sale but didn't have much pedigree," said O'Neill, who purchased the colt on behalf of Paul Reddam's Reddam Racing. "That's pretty much where this horse fit in for us. We were talking about Pavel and I'll Have Another ... horses like that. They were all not by top sires, but they worked out for us.

"I loved his breeze, and I thought when I went to see him that he would be a Quarter Horse-looking dude, but he had size to him and some length to him, and I really, really liked him. I talked Paul into it and we took a swing."

Bred in Louisiana by Summer Hill Farm, the colt is the second foal out of the Into Mischief mare All About Ju Ju. His third dam was Mazarine Stakes (G3) third Lochlin, who produced stakes winner Wild Jazz and stakes-placed winners Stephentown and Da Cardinal.

Hip 383 had been purchased by Jaime Centeno for \$8,000 from the consignment of Kelli Mitchell to the OBS October Yearlings Sale. Sergio Centeno of Blue River Bloodstock said the colt was a standout from the start.

"I'm so happy," Centeno said. "I'm happy with the horse and the price. He vetted clean, and he's a nice, nice horse. I expected that was what the horse would bring. The good horses are bringing money, but horses with problems aren't bringing any money."

O'Neill said even with a relatively shallow pedigree, he was surprised the colt didn't attract more attention in the ring.

"I thought he might be more expensive than that, so I was a bit surprised," O'Neill said. "But I think everyone saw Half Ours and didn't want to push too far. There were three or four people I was watching bid, and once they got to around \$150,000, they started dropping out. He'll go to Doug (O'Neill) at Del Mar on Friday, and we will go right on with him. We're excited."

O'Neill also purchased a Tapiture filly Wednesday for \$45,000. Consigned by Gutierrez Sales, agent, as Hip 436, the gray or roan 2-year-old named Rosie Red Bear was bred in Kentucky by Mendy Abrahamson and Abrahamson Equestrian out of the Champali mare Bear Canyon. The filly breezed an eighth-mile in :10 2/5 during the under tack show. **BH**

At last year's Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training, agent Clay Scherer purchased a Paynter filly for \$150,000 on behalf of owners Al and Bill Ulwelling.

The transaction turned out well as the filly named Merveilleux has finished first or second in five of six starts, with two stakes placings, and has earned \$140,780.

During the July 15 session of this year's OBS July Sale of 2-Year-Olds and Horses of Racing Age, Scherer went to \$175,000 to obtain a half sister to Merveilleux consigned by Hoppel's Horse & Cattle Co., agent.

Bred by Mike Carroll, the Palace Malice filly (Hip 473) was purchased by Patrick Hoppel for \$80,000 from Cara Bloodstock at the 2019 Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

"She's a very nice filly," Scherer said. "I was underbidder on her as a yearling for the same owners. They own the half sister and she is a nice filly, and they have big plans for her. It was a no-brainer for them to go back to the well, trying to win the biggest races at Woodbine."

Hoppel said the filly brought a good price, considering the market conditions.

"That's about all the market will withstand," he said. "It's a tough market, and maybe it will improve in six to eight months. In this type of market, I was happy. You take your profit and move on. She's a really nice filly. She walked really good."

The Ontario-bred filly out of the winning Holy Bull mare Breech Inlet breezed an eighth-mile in :10 during the under tack show. The filly's second dam, the winning Storm Cat mare Muneefa, produced grade 2 winner Bauble Queen, the dam of multiple grade 3 winner Blitzkrieg, and stakes winner Leamington.

The filly's female family also includes By Land by Sea, a Sauce Boat mare who won 10 of 13 starts, including the Apple Blossom Handicap (G1) and Milady Handicap (G1), and is the dam of British group 3 winner Fahal.

Scherer said although it's been a bit of a buyer's market this week in Ocala, the better lots on offer attract a lot of attention.

"The good horses stand out," he said. "When they bring out good horses, they are being well rewarded." **BH**

BRADSHAW FINDS TALENT AND VALUE IN SPADES AT OBS JULY

With only a select few horses breaching the six-figure mark during the first sessions of the Ocala Breeders' Sales July 2-Year-Olds and Horses of Racing Age Sale, veteran horseman Randy Bradshaw was willing to pay that little extra to help support his colleagues.

"It's been a tough market this year with all that is going on," Bradshaw said. "I feel bad for a lot of my friends and those that are invested in this. For people that make a living at it, it's been very tough. Even though I had some horses of my own that didn't get sold, I feel like if I can help out the industry a little bit and some of my friends by buying some horses that are quality horses, that helps. And

these horses are discounted right now—some of them 50%—so right now it's a great time to buy. It's just been a tough year all around."

The more expensive of Bradshaw's two purchases so far came July 15, when he went to \$150,000 for a filly by Ashford Stud's Uncle Mo on behalf of a partnership that includes Commonwealth Stable.

Consigned as Hip 427 by Gayle Woods, agent, the filly was bred in Kentucky by Carhue Investments, Chelsea Bloodstock, and Paget Bloodstock out of the Giant's Causeway mare Bama Belle. Her extended female family includes grade 1 winner Funny Moon and champions Temperence Hill and Vanlandingham.

Bradshaw said he was impressed with the filly's speed after she spooked ahead of her breeze. She worked three-eighths of a mile in :34 2/5.

"She's a nice filly," Bradshaw said. "When I watched her breeze, she saw something when she turned for home and kind of bolted to the outside. The rider had to grab her for a minute, and by the time he got her back down and started running her, she took off. She worked well and finished out well, but she could probably have worked :32 and change if she hadn't spooked on the turn.

"I thought that for an Uncle Mo with a very nice pedigree, if we could get her bought reasonably, it would be a very good buy. I think she'll have a lot of value in the end."

Bradshaw went to \$100,000 for a colt by fellow Ashford Stud stallion Air Force Blue during Tuesday's opening session. Consigned as Hip 120 by Brick City Thoroughbreds, the colt was purchased for the same partnership as the Uncle Mo filly and will likely join the stable of trainer Dallas Stewart.

"He's a nice, really smooth colt, and I really liked the Air Force Blues this year," Bradshaw said. "I have a filly I bought earlier in the year that I think is a really good filly. I've been high on the Air Force Blues that I've seen so far, so we thought if we could buy him right—and for a Louisiana-bred, that is probably a lot of money—hopefully he'll be good enough he won't have to run only in Louisiana."

Bred by Summerhill Farm out of the El Corredor mare Savviest, Hip 120 is a half brother to stakes-placed

Take Ten. His second dam, stakes winner Terre Haute, produced Hollywood Futurity (G1) winner Tactical Cat.

The colt was purchased by Brick City for \$30,000 from the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment to the Keeneland September Yearling Sale. He worked a quarter-mile in :21 during the under tack show. **BH**

Kevin McKathan bought the colt for \$165,000 on behalf of Newday TC from Candy Meadows Sales at last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October Yearlings Sale.

"I believe he's a standout here, but I believe he would have been a standout in a lot of places," McKathan said. "Everyone says he's the best horse in the sale. He's had plenty of vet work. Everyone who can afford him is on him. We're going to go in there and have some fun selling him. He's a big, stretchy two-turn horse that moves like silk."

McKathan said the colt impressed in his under tack show workout of an eighth-mile in :10.

"In his breeze, I was concerned that he didn't look like he was going anywhere because he has such a long stride," the consignor said. "He just keeps going. He came around the turn after the workout in :32 and change, and he just kept on going. He moves like a horse that could do that all day long because he does it so effortlessly." **BH**

LOS ALAMITOS SUBMITS REQUIRED SAFETY PLAN TO CHRB

Under pressure from the California Horse Racing Board to curb a spike in equine fatalities in recent months, Los Alamitos Race Course has submitted a required safety plan to the CHRB before a follow-up meeting with the board July 20.

The Los Alamitos plan calls for enhancement of practices at the track in six areas: training, pre-race procedures, entry-review panel, post-incident assessments, equine illness and recovery, and rules and conditions.

According to CHRB statistics, 21 horses have died from racing or training at Los Alamitos in 2020, including 10 since May 26—a rash that caused the CHRB to call an emergency meeting to discuss the circumstances July 10. Two of those fatalities, a Quarter Horse and a Thoroughbred, happened since the meeting.

The Orange County track conducts a regular nighttime mixed-breed meet of Quarter Horses and Thoroughbreds in addition to periodic afternoon meets exclusive to Thoroughbreds. It also serves as a major training facility.

The track's most recent fiscal-year fatalities from racing or training are essentially flat—32 from July 2019 through June 2020, one fewer than during the same time period the year before.

In its plan, distributed to BloodHorse from the CHRB, Los Alamitos officials wrote that the track shares the board's "commitment to improving the health and safety of each and every horse and rider." While stating that since 2008, Los Alamitos had "consistently and significantly reduced the frequency of equine fatalities," the track acknowledged that "our management team has never been entirely satisfied with the progress made."

Proposals by Los Alamitos include:

- Adding one qualified veterinarian each morning the track is open as a dedicated observer of horses entering and exiting the track for training purposes.
- Requiring examinations by attending veterinarians during the specified days immediately preceding a work or race entry for the express purpose of evaluating the horse's soundness to work or race.
- Requiring qualifications for horses eligible to start, including examinations for long-layoff entries.
- Prohibiting the entry of any horse in any race if the horse has received an intra-articular injection during the 14 days immediately preceding a start.
- Not permitting any horse to participate in a workout or race if the horse receives nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs during the 48-hour period immediately preceding the workout or race or has been treated with a second NSAID that could appear in a post-work or post-race blood or urine test.
- Have a review panel analyze race entries, and based on information deemed of concern, deny entry or request the scratch of any horse the panel determines unsuitable for reasons of horse and/or rider safety.

• Place each fatality occurring on the grounds—regardless of causation—under a "fatality review" conducted by a panel consisting of a qualified representative of track management, the track veterinarian, and the racing secretary.

During a CHRB meeting last week, issues were not raised about the track surface at Los Alamitos or the regulatory oversight of Los Alamitos track veterinarian Dr. Rebecca Fitzgerald.

Dr. Rick Arthur, the equine medical director for the CHRB, criticized the pervasive use of intra-articular injections in horses, one of the areas the Los Alamitos plan addresses. **BH**

RISPOLI LATEST JOCKEY TO CONTRACT COVID-19

Umberto Rispoli, the leading rider at Del Mar, became the latest jockey to test positive for COVID-19 following a handful of others in the past week. He announced on Twitter his intention to come back "stronger than before."

Formerly a top rider in Italy and other parts of the world, Rispoli made a splash on the Southern California circuit this year and seemed poised for a rewarding summer. During the Santa Anita Park meet that ended in June, he finished third in the jockey standings behind meet leader Flavien Prat, also recently diagnosed with COVID-19, and runner-up Abel Cedillo.

Rispoli tweeted that he is asymptomatic, quarantined, and "feeling more than well."

The rider was off to a fast start at the Del Mar meeting, winning on seven of 21 mounts, including Hit the Road in the July 10 Runhappy Oceanside Stakes and Cordiality in the July 12 Osunitas Stakes.

He had scheduled mounts in five races July 17 at Del Mar and in six races July 18 at the seaside track—rides that will now be reassigned.

Besides Prat, he joins Florent Geroux, Luis Saez, Victor Espinoza, and Martin Garcia as prominent riders having tested positive over the past seven days.

Following a spike in riders contracting COVID-19, many tracks across the country have issued enhanced

health and safety measures meant to reduce its spread.

Joe Harper, CEO of Del Mar, told BloodHorse that the Southern California track will be "taking the weekend off," canceling July 17-19 racing due to multiple members of the jockeys' room there testing positive for COVID-19. **BH**

ALLOCATIONS TO MA THOROUGHBRED INDUSTRY REVISED AGAIN

The portion of the money allocated from the Massachusetts Race Horse Development Fund to the state's Thoroughbred horsemen is set to change again, following key votes by the Horse Race Committee of the Massachusetts Gaming Commission July 15.

The HRC, which is a subcommittee of the MGC, voted to shift the splits of the millions of dollars in the fund, which was established as part of the state's 2011 expanded gaming law to benefit both the Thoroughbred and Standardbred industries, so that the harness horsemen's share dedicated to purses increases. Breeders awards will remain unchanged.

In a victory for the Thoroughbred horsemen, the HRC also voted to change the percentage of the fund dedicated to backstretch welfare so that they receive a greater share.

Prior to the vote, the Standardbred horsemen were to receive 65% of the entire fund for purses, breeders, and welfare, while the Thoroughbred horsemen got 35% of the pool. Moreover, of each breed's total share, by law 80% had to go to purses, 16% was for the breeders, and 4% was dedicated to welfare programs.

But the MGC had earlier ruled that the HRC

now has the authority to determine all three of the programs, referred to as "buckets" for discussion purposes, on an individual basis and is empowered to adjust the percentages of each as it sees fit.

After Wednesday's votes, purse subsidies will now be split 70%-30%, Standardbred-Thoroughbred; breeders awards will be allocated 65%-35%, Standardbred-Thoroughbred; and monies for horsemen's welfare will be shared 60%-40%, Thoroughbred-Standardbred.

When the RHDF was established in 2014, the entire fund was allocated 75%-25%, Thoroughbred-Standardbred.

But over the years as live Thoroughbred racing dates dwindled to just six or eight per year, and then the state's only facility, Suffolk Downs, was sold and closed, the HRC continually whittled down the Thoroughbred horsemen's share.

Regarding Wednesday's votes, Gayle Cameron, who is a member of the MGC and the commission's representative on the HRC, said during the meeting: "These are three difficult decisions that have to be made. Concerning the health and welfare benefits, I am persuaded by letter after letter after letter that I get from the Thoroughbred horsemen, and it all goes back to their inability to race (and earn purse money and paychecks). These people are hurting."

The motion to alter the percentage of health and welfare benefits from 35%-65%, Thoroughbred to Standardbred, to 60-40% in favor of the Thoroughbred horsemen passed on a unanimous 5-0 vote.

Paul Umbrello, the executive director of the New England chapter of the HBPA, was pleased with the measure to help his members but said the relief is only a Band-Aid.

"We've already had to cancel the health insurance and cut back many other benefits for some of our members, so this is a lifeline for us," said Umbrello, who added that benefits include eye glasses, prescription medication, and other necessities. "But it's only short term."

The RHDF is funded by a percentage of the profits from the state's casino industry, and because of COVID-19 protocols, they were shut down for months. Although they have reopened as part of the state's phase-in, they must operate at a significantly reduced capacity and with reduced gaming, entertainment, and food and beverage offerings.

"Because they were closed for so long, the revenue from the casinos into the fund was already way down, and now with them generating only a fraction of what they had been before, and no way to predict the future, it's a double hit," he said.

The HRC's votes are technically recommendations. Now they must go to the Massachusetts House of Representatives and State Senate for approval, but a rubber stamp from both chambers is standard procedure. Next, the change in the splits goes before the MGC for a final approval.

Should the MGC not agree with the HRC's recommendations, commissioners are not empowered to override them. Instead, the entire matter would be kicked back to the HRC for future action. Meanwhile, should the NEHBPA decide to challenge the votes, it has the right to do so.

Umbrello, who will report back to the membership, said Wednesday night that no decision has been made yet. **BH**

INDUSTRY FIGURES GET BEHIND TATTERSALLS' NEWEST SALE

It is only by fate that the Tattersalls August Sale has been added to this year's European sales calendar, but prominent figures on both sides of the docket have given the event their seal of approval, with some notable industry players suggesting the auction, which is due to take place Aug. 25-26 at Park Paddocks, could have a positive effect on the market beyond its two-day run.

Far from just being another date in an already congested auction calendar, there is a firm belief that the August Sale will provide a tailor-made marketplace for increasingly important international buyers, while also helping to grease the wheels of the domestic yearling market, with owners able to sell their older horses before the opportunity to reinvest in new recruits arises.

The concept has been driven by consignors such as Jamie Railton and The Castlebridge Consignment, whose director Andrew Mead explained: "The idea of a new Tattersalls mixed sale in August stems entirely from the difficulties generated by the COVID-19 crisis, whereby vendors were facing a reduction in the

considerable number of Middle Eastern buyers who would normally attend the July Sale.

"These are the buyers who normally buy the bulk of the colts and geldings on offer. The delayed resumption of racing was also a factor, since most trainers had been unable to run any horses prior to the original July Sale entry point, and with only a limited number then being able to run before the sale itself.

"While Castlebridge enjoyed a successful July sale, selling all 19 horses consigned, the directors are enthusiastic supporters of the new August initiative," Mead concluded.

Picking up the story, Railton continued: "When Goffs UK moved their Premier Yearling Sale to the first week in September it left a week's gap in the calendar so we approached Tattersalls and said, 'How about having a horses-in-training sale in that week?' Tattersalls very kindly agreed.

"We did a lot of research with buyers to gauge their thoughts on the concept and, across the board, everyone was hugely in favor of the whole idea. We're very keen that a high level of horse goes into the sale because we're certain that major buyers will be there."

The positioning of the August Sale is expected to prove a particular draw to overseas buyers, who often have bigger budgets to spend on account of foreign prize-money levels dwarfing those on offer in Britain. The timing of the August Sale aligns the event with lucrative targets in jurisdictions such as Australia, Hong Kong, and the Middle East.

Gassim Ghazali has played a leading role at past editions of the July Sale, including when spending 1,316,000 guineas on 18 lots in 2019, and the Autumn Horses in Training Sale, and his agent, Will Douglass of Charlie Gordon-Watson Bloodstock, said the Qatari champion trainer would be back in action at the August Sale.

"I think the August Sale is a really good addition," said Douglass. "Gassim Ghazali has booked his flights and is excited to be back at Tattersalls. The Qatar season starts in the middle of September so he can

come out in the middle of August, buy the horses and they're back in Qatar in time for the start of the season, rather than being in a race against time.

"We have such a brilliant product here in Britain and Ireland. The demand for our racehorses is staggering and I think the August Sale will get a lot of entries and people will support it so, as long as travel restrictions allow it, I expect a lot of people will be there."

Both Railton and Douglass noted that an end-of-summer horses-in-training sale was also likely to produce a catalog of horses with fast-ground form, thus providing significant overseas buyers with the types they most covet, which in turn raised the prospect of domestic owners maximizing resale value.

"When the overseas guys come, which is probably at least 50 per cent of that horses-in-training market, they're looking for the better horses with solid summer turf form," said Douglass.

Railton added: "Every buyer I've spoken to has mentioned to me that, invariably, the form from September to October comes on soft ground, and to overseas buyers that's a big negative. When these

horses have recent form on good ground, that's an easier sell. The Americans, Australians, those from the Middle East, without exception, much prefer the August date for proper horses, and I expect it would be a similar story for the jumping fraternity too."

Moreover, both agents and vendors have suggested holding a horses-in-training auction on the cusp of the yearling sales season makes better financial sense for domestic owners, with the opportunity there to move on their more exposed stock before potentially reinvesting.

"For years we've asked ourselves why is the horses-in-training sale after the yearling sales? If we could sell the horses-in-training before the yearlings, owners then know how much money they've got to spend on yearlings, rather than the other way around," Railton, a prominent vendor at the form-horse and yearling sales, said. "For many people this is a lot more logical and, as far as our industry goes, maybe this change is one good thing that'll come out of this wretched disease."

Those sentiments were echoed by Douglass.

"It makes total sense to have the horses-in-training sale before the yearling sales because the average owner can sell what they've got and then know what money they have in the bank to go again," he said. "I think that system would mean less risk for trainers or agents buying at the yearling sales as they'll have owners who are happy to go again, because they've already cashed in their horses-in-training so have a clearer idea of budget. In terms of the wider industry, I think it's a massively positive move."

"Generally the horses-in-training market is miraculously strong. The more money is put into the resale market, the more money goes into the yearling market, then the foal market and then the mare market."

The August Sale catalog is not yet out, with entries to close Monday.

"No one can be sure how well a completely new sale date such as this will work but already the signs are encouraging, with plenty of positive comments from vendors and potential buyers alike," said Mead. "A number of people have commented that an August Sale is actually a better position in the sale calendar for selling horses-in-training and already there is talk about the sale becoming an annual fixture."

Moreover, the health of the post-lockdown market has defied all expectations, with figures from the breeze-up sales and the Tattersalls July Sale—the latter boasting a clearance rate of 96%—making for positive reading. Of the 228 July Sale withdrawals, many are reportedly being targeted at the August Sale.

"All the sales that have taken place since lockdown have exceeded expectations, so there's clearly still a good appetite for a racehorse," said Railton. "We're hugely appreciative of Tattersalls taking up this concept, it's fantastic how great they've been to show the initiative."

Tattersalls Viewpoint

"The decision to stage a Tattersalls August Sale was taken very much in response to popular demand and in recognition of the unique circumstances surrounding the 2020 racing and sales calendar," Tattersalls marketing director Jimmy George said of the company's new initiative.

"With flat racing returning to Britain and Ireland only in June, we always felt that deciding what to enter in the July Sale would be much less straightforward for owners and trainers than under normal circumstances, and that was definitely reflected in a significantly smaller July catalog last week."

"It made a lot of sense to try to provide another fixture with a similar profile to the July Sale to accommodate vendor requirements, but without two major yearling sales moving out of their traditional August dates it would have been a lot more difficult to find an appropriate slot for a new sale, so we were fortunate in that respect."

"We have already had a lot of positive feedback about the new August Sale from vendors and purchasers alike and, as well as taking encouragement from a vibrant Tattersalls July Sale, the decision of the British government to ease travel restrictions has been particularly well received."

PORTRUSH MOVES ENABLE'S DAM CONCENTRIC TO 6-FOR-6

Enable's dam Concentric made it six winners from as many runners July 15 when her 3-year-old Frankel filly Portrush won a 1 1/4-mile maiden race at Yarmouth in her second start.

Khalid Abdullah's homebred filly—second to subsequent Investec Oaks (G1) runner Gold Wand in her debut at Newbury last month—got up in the final strides under a strong drive from Robert Havlin to deny the Raven's Pass filly White Mountain by a neck.

John Gosden trains Enable and her closely related half sister Portrush, who like her illustrious sibling by Nathaniel is inbred 2x3 to Sadler's Wells, with the pair both by Galileo stallions out of a Sadler's Wells mare.

Enable has struck 10 times at the highest level including the Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1) in 2017 and 2018, and she became the first Arc winner to win a Breeders' Cup race the same year when she took the Longines Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T) at Churchill Downs in November 2018.

Concentric has also produced the group 2-placed Champs Elysees mare Contribution and the Musidora Stakes (G3) runner-up Entitle, by Dansili.

The mare's other two winners, Tournament and Centroid, are by Oasis Dream and Dansili respectively, while she also has a 2-year-old Sea The Stars colt named Derab in training with Gosden, a yearling full brother to Enable, and paid a return visit to Sea The Stars last year.

Portrush hails from a deep Juddmonte pedigree—a hypothetical catalog page would not stretch beyond the second dam—with Concentric a sister to the group 2 winner Dance Routine, best known as the dam of multiple top-flight scorer Flintshire and the granddam of group 2 winner Headman.

Concentric is a daughter of group 3 winner Apogee and granddaughter of the multiple Oaks-placed Bourbon Girl, whose own dam Fleet Girl entered the Juddmonte fold when Khalid Abdullah purchased Dr. Hubert Schnapka's Ferrans Stud in 1982.

Portrush, wearing a hood once again, completed a first-third for her sire Wednesday, with Frankel filly Tanita getting a placing for the third time in as many starts.

The latter is out of Shoal, an Oasis Dream sister to the exceptional middle-distance racemare Middy, whose own runners to date include the Bet365 Classic Trial (G3) winner Midterm and the Ribblesdale Stakes (G2) runner-up Mori.

WITH LESS FANFARE, LIVE OAK TAKES TOP FLORIDA HONORS

The Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association has announced its Florida-bred champions for 2019. Typically, the awards are presented at an annual awards gala held on the Monday before the Ocala Breeders' Sales' March auction. The event was not held this year, however, because of the COVID-19 pandemic, and it will not be rescheduled.

For the 16th time, Charlotte Weber was honored with a Florida-bred champion who was bred by her Live Oak Stud and owned by her Live Oak Plantation, located in Ocala, Fla., as Global Access was named the Florida-bred champion 3-year-old colt or gelding.

Live Oak Stud was named the Florida breeder of the year for the third time and the leading owner by Florida-bred earnings for the fourth time.

Weber also won the breeder title in 2006 and 2007 and the leading owner title in 2011, 2016, and 2017.

Global Access, a son of Giant's Causeway, ran to a 4-1-3 record from nine starts in 2019 for trainer Michael Trombetta. He finished the year with a career bankroll of \$373,401.

Another Florida-bred who took home multiple honors was Starship Jubilee, the champion older female and champion female turf horse. Bred by

William Sorren of Miami Beach, Fla., and trained by Kevin Attard for Blue Heaven Farm, Starship Jubilee received Sovereign Awards as Canada's Horse of the Year and champion female turf horse for 2019, adding to titles she also earned in 2017 and 2018. The Indy Wind mare finished the year with a 3-3-1 record from seven starts, and her career earnings were \$1,171,387 at the end of 2019.

Shooting Star Thoroughbreds' Chance It, a son of Currency Swap, was named champion 2-year-old colt or gelding, while Karl Pergola's K P Dreamin was named champion 2-year-old filly.

William Stiritz's Wildwood's Beauty used the Florida Sire Stakes program for older horses and Florida-bred stakes to catapult herself to the title as the champion 3-year-old filly and champion female sprinter.

In the stallion categories, Journeyman Stallions' Khozan was Florida's leading juvenile sire and leading freshman sire, while Ocala Stud resident Adios Charlie was Florida's stallion of the year.

Khozan had 44 runners, 19 winners, and three black-type stakes horses for progeny earnings of \$1,275,632, and Adios Charlie progeny acquired \$3,753,347 from 106 runners, 65 winners, and three black-type stakes winners.

Khozan was represented by his leading money earner and stakes winner Liam's Lucky Charm (\$233,800), while multiple graded stakes winner Jean Elizabeth was the leading money earner for Adios Charlie with \$264,888.

Kathleen O'Connell and Saffie Joseph Jr. are tied with 58 Florida-bred wins at Florida tracks. O'Connell was also the leading Florida trainer of Florida-breds by black-type stakes wins with six, and Joseph was the leading Florida trainer by Florida-bred earnings with \$1,977,046.

It was the 12th time O'Connell has won or shared the title as the leading Florida trainer by wins (2003, 2009-18) and the first time Joseph has won a Florida-bred title in either category. O'Connell has won or shared the Florida black-type wins title twice before in 2013 and 2017.

The Joe O'Farrell Memorial Award presented by Ocala Breeders' Sales went to William A.T. and Lyn Rainbow's The Acorn as the original consignor of Starship Jubilee, the year's top Florida-bred graduate of OBS.

Sally Andersen of Ocala was presented the Needles Award as Florida's small breeder of the year. Andersen bred multiple stakes winner Anyportinastorm and recorded earnings of \$843,513 as a breeder of Florida-breds. Andersen was presented a John Deere Riding Mower 330 as the Needles Award winner.

In June, the FTBOA recognized Imperial Hint as the Florida-bred with the top Beyer Speed Figure during 2019, as awarded by Daily Racing Form. Imperial Hint logged an electrifying 114 Beyer while setting a Saratoga Race Course track record for six furlongs in 1:07.92 in the Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap (G1). Imperial Hint is trained by Luis Carvajal Jr. for Raymond Mamone, and he was bred in Florida by Bert and Martha Pilcher's Shade Tree Thoroughbreds in Fairfield. **BH**

JOHN P. GRIER MADE MIGHTY MAN O' WAR WORK IN DWYER

Coming into the July 10, 1920, Dwyer Stakes at Aqueduct Racetrack, Samuel Riddle's 3-year-old talk of the nation, Man o' War, was a newspaper headliner. The chestnut son of Fair Play had taken his sophomore debut, the Preakness Stakes, in sterling fashion. He polished his reputation to even greater sheen with American track records for a mile (1:35 4/5) in the Withers Stakes and for 11 furlongs (2:14 1/5) in the Belmont Stakes. In the one-mile Stuyvesant Handicap, he packed 135 pounds to an eight-length victory over the far-outmatched Yellow Hand (103).

At 3, Man o' War defeated all his peers so handily that finding a fresh opponent who could possibly dent his reputation proved difficult. H.P. Whitney's Upset (the only horse to defeat Man o' War the previous year) and Wildair fell in the Preakness. G.W. Loft's Donnacona floundered 20 lengths in Man o' War's wake in the Belmont.

The only viable threat could come from Whitney's John P. Grier. Although Man o' War handily defeated John P. Grier in the 1919 Futurity Stakes at Belmont Park, that was last year. This year, John P. Grier was a much different horse.

Whitney's homebred son of Whisk Broom II made such an impression when he debuted at a mile event at Havre de Grace in April for trainer James Rowe that he was considered a contender for the upcoming classics. But, like milk left sitting in the sun too long, John P. Grier soured, refusing to work in the mornings and disappointing in any and all training efforts.

Turned out for a couple of months, he returned

with a different attitude. The Sir Walter handicap purse at Aqueduct July 6 marked his return. His two-length triumph over Donnacona and running 1 1/16 miles in 1:45 1/5 grabbed the attention of fans and horsemen alike, who claimed him a worthy foe.

In another part of Long Island, Man o' War was also on the track that day, working the nine-furlong Dwyer distance on Belmont's training track. Had the racegoers at Aqueduct known the results of that workout, they might not have been so cavalier in their assessment. On a track that played slow, Man o' War worked the distance in 1:52 and change.

A crowd of 25,000 spectators poured through the Aqueduct gates, most to see the mighty warrior, some to see whether John P. Grier could actually defeat Man o' War.

Conditions of the Dwyer found Man o' War toting 126 pounds and John P. Grier a feathery 108.

Speed and stamina would be tested from the outset. To get a mental picture of the running of the Dwyer, think Affirmed and Alydar in the 1978 Belmont, or Sunday Silence and Easy Goer in the 1989 Preakness.

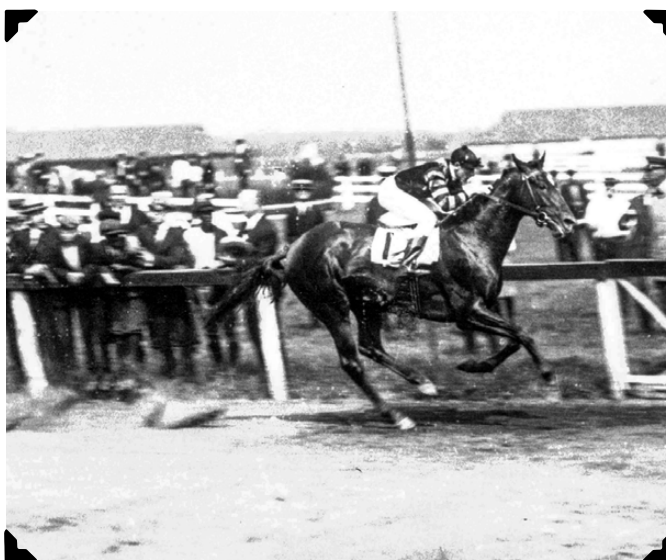
Man o' War, with John P. Grier never more than a half-length off his flank, set a torrid pace, so blistering that fractions within the race set records.

Throughout an epic struggle in the stretch, neither Clarence Kummer on Man o' War nor Eddie Ambrose on John P. Grier asked any quarter; nor was any given.

For only the second time, Man o' War felt the sting

of the whip, and not just once. As the champion began to pull away, John P. Grier surged again and valiantly thrust his nose in front.

Another sharp reminder from Kummer, and in three strides Man o' War gained the advantage over a spent John P. Grier to win by 1 1/2 lengths. The watch stopped at 1:49 1/5, a world record. **BH**
