

GAMINE AND SWISS SKYDIVER FACE OFF IN KENTUCKY OAKS

The Sept. 4 Longines Kentucky
Oaks (G1) pits a pair of 3-yearold fillies who have proved to be the
"it girls" this season, despite taking
different paths to Churchill Downs.
The Oaks, at nine furlongs and worth
\$1.25 million, remains the top prize
for the division even after being
moved from early May to Labor Day
weekend.

The duo, Michael Lund Petersen's brilliant Gamine and Peter Callahan's consistent Swiss Skydiver, will face seven others in the Oaks. A later start date has allowed for résumé building as four of the other starters are graded stakes winners: Donna Veloce, Hopeful Growth, Shedaresthedevil, and Speech.

Gamine, a daughter of leading sire Into Mischief out of the Kafwain mare Peggy Jane, developed early, turning heads as a 2-year-old in training in central Florida with Bobby Dodd. She was a \$220,000 Keeneland September Yearling Sale purchase by Grand

Oaks, and Petersen was resolute while bidding on her at last year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale. He got her for a hefty \$1.8 million and turned her over to Bob Baffert, a three-time Oakswinning trainer.

The talented bay hasn't disappointed on the track. A sharp maiden win was followed by a hard-fought neck score over Speech going two turns at Oaklawn Park,

but that over Speech was short-lived as she was disqualified after testing positive for lidocaine.

Since then, Gamine wired the field in the oneturn-mile Longines Acorn Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park by 18 3/4 lengths and turned in a similar performance at Saratoga Race Course with a sevenlength victory in the seven-furlong Longines Test Stakes (G1). Both efforts produced stakes records.

The lone question is the extra real estate under the Twin Spires.

"I know we're fast and we're going a mile and an eighth for the first time," Baffert said on a rainsoaked Sept. 3 morning. "She went two turns at Oaklawn and ran a really fast time and beat a good filly. Speech is a really good filly.

"She's been going easy since she got here (Sept. 1), but the track is wet, so you can't do much. She's handled everything really well."

The trip is not a question for Swiss Skydiver, a winner of four consecutive graded stakes races against the girls around two turns, including a 3 1/2-length, geared-down score in the 10-furlong Alabama Stakes (G1) Aug. 15 at the Spa. Her lone defeat since February came at the hands of Art Collector in the July 11 Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2). She was 4 3/4 lengths clear of the third-placed male that day going 1 1/8 miles at Keeneland.

By Daredevil—Expo Gold, by Johannesburg, Swiss Skydiver was a \$35,000 Keeneland September buy. She's earned \$952,980 and the respect of horsemen who have run against the sophomore filly.

Swiss Skydiver's trainer, Ken McPeek, who was second in the 2017 Oaks with Daddys Lil Darling, sized up the matchup after drawing post 1 on Sept. 1.


"Her form pretty well proves herself," McPeek said. "The question about Gamine is two turns. She's only run it once, and she had to fight. It's going to be fun to watch.

"My filly is just so hickory. All week she's done nothing but dive into the feed tub. The biggest problem is keeping her settled when we don't feed her quickly."

Swiss Skydiver and Gamine are quick early and have a penchant for the lead—and they have shown an unwillingness to yield.

As much as those two stand out, the Oaks is far from a match race. Speech, a bay filly by Mr Speaker owned by Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, Madaket Stables, and Heider Family Stables, pressed Gamine at Oaklawn, was a good second behind Swiss Skydiver in the June 6 Santa Anita Oaks (G2), then took a big step forward with a three-length score in the July 11 Central Bank Ashland Stakes (G1) at Keeneland.

Trainer Michael McCarthy, who was based at Churchill Downs when he was a former assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher, knows about the heat.

"Being a part of three of these (Oaks) before when I worked with Todd Pletcher—Ashado (2004), Rags to Riches (2007), and Princess of Sylmar (2013)—and then coming here to participate in this on my own is a big deal."

Speech is also a forward-type runner, but expect Javier Castellano to track the big two here after breaking from post 4. Along with the top duo, Speech is the only one to record a triple-digit Beyer Speed Figure.

A year ago, trainer Simon Callaghan came to the Oaks with the favorite, Bellafina, and wound up with a fifth-place finish. He returns this year with Kaleem Shah and Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, and Derrick Smith's Donna Veloce. An \$800,000 purchase last year at The Gulfstream Sale, Fasig-Tipton's 2-year-olds in training sale in Florida, she was the favorite for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) and just missed by a neck to champion British Idiom. Adding an air of mystery, she ships to Kentucky from Southern California and has not started since a 4 1/4-length tally over Speech in the March 8 Santa Ysabel Stakes (G3) at Santa Anita Park. The Uncle Mo filly will be tracking the top pair from post 3.

Trainer Brad Cox had a major breakthrough in 2018 by winning the Oaks with eventual champion Monomoy Girl. She returns on the Derby Day undercard, but in the Oaks, Cox will send out Indiana Oaks (G3) winner Shedaresthedevil (by Daredevil) for Flurry Racing Stables, Qatar Racing, and Big Aut Farms. She takes a sizable step in class but has two wins on the local strip, just one fewer than the rest of the field combined. BH



OUR SPORT NEEDS A DERBY FOR OUR TIME

et's face it, for all the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) has done to carry horse racing into the mainstream of the modern American sports culture, there has not been much to show for the effort beyond name recognition. The Derby is lionized, while horse racing is marginalized. Not even the spectacle of the Derby and its two minutes of daredevil action has altered the reality of a sport that clings to its anachronisms, glorifies its elite, and resists the problems of the wider world by changing the subject to the esoterica of pari-mutuel takeout, veterinary minutiae, and the travails of the international bloodstock market.

Now comes a time in which all major sports are struggling to define their role in the changing cultural norms. As an industry built on agriculture and gambling, horse racing needs shop window events like the Derby to light the way. But the Derby, like all senior institutions, finds change to be difficult.

For instance, the Derby self-promotes a history of being won in its earliest years by a number of African-American jockeys, neglecting to note that they were either born into slavery or the sons of slaves, or that the color line was drawn in the early 20th century that effectively barred African-American jockeys from participation in America's most famous horse race. Between 1921 and 2000, not a single African-American jockey rode in the Derby.

For those who like their historical coincidences with a dash of irony, 1921 also was the year it was first reported that Stephen's Foster's antebellum slave lament, "My Old Kentucky Home, Good Night!," was heard at the Derby, complete with such original first verse lyrics as "'Tis summer, the darkies are gay."

(Editor's Note: In 1986 the Kentucky General



Assembly introduced, and adopted, a resolution to substitute the word "people.")

In 1928, "My Old Kentucky Home" was officially christened as the state song of Kentucky. In 1967, during the protests in Louisville over fair housing that threatened the running of the Derby, a sign was spied during the strife-torn demonstrations that read, "Not all the darkies are gay."

Eleanor Bingham Miller, an independent filmmaker with deep Louisville roots, and Keith Runyon, a retired editorial page editor with the Louisville Courier Journal, took to the paper's opinion page this week to put "My Old Kentucky Home" in the perspective supplied by a community currently in turmoil over the death of a young woman at the hands of police:

"Please let's come to our senses and use the moment the horses parade onto the track for the running of Derby 2020 to declare a moment of silence in honor of Breonna Taylor and all Kentuckians murdered under our nation's system of racist repression and police thuggery," they wrote. "Breonna Taylor was gunned down in her 'Kentucky Home,' and we must all weep for her."

The song's sanitized version sung for the past several decades serves only as a reminder of its original form, written in the accepted vernacular of 1853. Churchill Downs retaining the edited Foster tune as an uplifting Derby anthem has had the same tone deaf feel as the Ronald Reagan presidential campaign's flag-waving use of Springsteen's "Born in the U.S.A.," which in fact was a bitter indictment of America's war in Vietnam and its treatment of returning veterans.

Like the Derby itself, "My Old Kentucky Home" carries a heavy symbolic load that is becoming unsustainable in a changing age. Those changes landed like a ton of bricks earlier this year when Kentucky breeder and sales consignor Tom Van Meter found himself shunned by many of his peers over a Facebook post that could only be interpreted as racist. No one gets cut any slack nowadays for making politically infused remarks, informal or otherwise, especially in the presence of an electronic device. Just ask Barclay Tagg.

The trainer of Tiz the Law rubbed a raw spot on the social media rash early in Derby week that did nothing to dilute the image of horse racing as a world

apart. Tagg attempted to punch up his legitimate concerns over the safety his horse and his personnel in the face of possible civil unrest with a mordant line about not being able to shoot rioters, but he was dead wrong. Of course the authorities shoot back. Sometimes they even shoot first. And not for nothing, there's a guy who says things like Tagg did every day, on purpose, in front of as many electronic devices he can muster. He got elected president once, and he may get elected again.

If Tagg's off-the-cuff comments

were misinterpreted, welcome to the club. Precise communication has become a lost art. At least his record as a horseman requires no translation. Tagg won his first stakes race at Timonium in 1981, his first graded stakes in 1986 at Laurel, and his first grade 1 stakes event in 1991 at Hollywood Park in the Gamely, with the redoubtable Miss Josh. Since then there has been a handsome parade of major winners, led by Derby-winning champion Funny Cide and including Royal Mountain Inn, Nobiz Like Shobiz, Island Fashion, Showing Up, Snit, Tale of Etaki, Tampico, and A Little Luck, to name a few.

Tiz the Law is the best horse Tagg has ever trained, a Derby colt from the word go. Unfortunately, it was this Derby. Along with other owners and trainers with talented 3-year-olds, Tagg suffered through the drip torture of a Derby possibly cancelled, more likely postponed, and finally rescheduled to be presented with 50,000 fans, then 20,000, then none at all, until arriving at long last this Saturday in a Louisville fishbowl riven with pandemic fears and civil discord that could come right to the racetrack's doorstep.

It was a struggle getting to this point, with shifting ground still underfoot. Maybe this time, for a Derby like no other, it would be best to play any version of "Hallelujah" for the post parade, then step back and let the horses work their healing magic. BH

Though he may be just a 3-year-old, Finnick the Fierce has made a habit of defying the odds. It's a trait that, while born of physical necessity, is one his connections will be banking on when he enters the gate Sept. 5 in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) at Churchill Downs.

"Every time he's hit the board was when he's had the long odds," breeder Paige Gilster said. "I think he likes defying expectations as much as we like watching him defy expectations."

A Kentucky-bred son of Dialed In, Finnick the Fierce was born at Millennium Farms April 22, 2017, to Gilster's mare Southern Classic (by Southern Image). As it happened, Gilster, who was a senior at Iowa State University at the time, was on a class trip to Kentucky when she got the call that her new foal was on the ground.

"The mare was like a month late, so it was a crapshoot, but I was very lucky," Gilster said. "My good friend from school and I went out to see him the next morning, and that was when I noticed the problem with his eye and I immediately thought the worst."

Gilster called Hagyard veterinarian Dr. Arnaldo Monge, who came out to the farm immediately and determined that the foal had a rare congenital cataract in his right eye.

"My first impression was, 'Wow, this is a nice baby,"

Monge said. "He had big bones and was muscular and tall. He caught my eye immediately. But when I did my exam, I noticed the congenital cataract, which broke my heart for Paige because I knew she wanted to sell the baby in the future. That was going to be a deal killer."

Finnick the Fierce's bad eye was eventually removed by Monge's Hagyard colleague Dr. Dwayne Rodgerson. For several months, Gilster, who had planned to sell the foal commercially to help pay off student loans, continued to pursue the idea that she could enter him in a sale.

"A few months after he was born I talked to a couple bloodstock agents about putting him in the (Keeneland) November (Breeding Stock) Sale," Gilster said. "I asked them, 'Would you buy a one-eyed horse?' So many said yes they would, but if they have four or five other horses on their shortlist, a horse with one eye is an easy one to rule out. That's when I decided to call Dr. Monge."

Knowing the cataract and ensuing excision of the eye would dissuade most buyers, Monge floated the idea to Gilster shortly after Finnick the Fierce's birth that he would like to buy him for his own racing stable should she decide to sell privately. After brief negotiations, the pair reached a deal. Monge would buy Finnick the Fierce for \$3,000 and board his dam, Southern Classic, at his 20-acre farm in Nicholasville, Ky., for free for one year to help offset extra costs.

"My biggest goal for him at that point was for


him to go to a great home that would give him every chance to make it on the track," said Gilster, who now runs Blu-Sky Stables in Lexington and serves as assistant manager for Timber Town Stables. "It has since blossomed from a vet/client relationship to more of a family relationship. I consider him and his wife (Thena) to be like second parents. They've been wonderful keeping me in the loop with (his) training."

Monge introduced Finnick the Fierce as a yearling to trainer Rey Hernandez, who was also impressed with the horse's physicality. After the breaking and training process began, Monge sold half his interest in the gelding to Hernandez for the same price he paid—\$3,000.

Early Promise and Consistent Results

Finnick the Fierce broke his maiden on debut at 2 and made his first step up to stakes company two starts later in the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (G2) at Churchill Downs. He finished second in the 1 1/16-mile event on a sloppy track, ironically defeating heavy Kentucky Derby favorite Tiz the Law in the process.

"He has always shown a lot of talent, but we didn't know he was that good until he won the first time out," said Hernandez, adding that Finnick the Fierce was the first one-eyed horse he'd ever trained. "That was a five-furlong race but he was flying and that gave me a really good feeling that he was good horse."

His sophomore campaign got off to a slightly slower start. The gelding finished fourth in the Jan. 18 Lecomte Stakes (G₃) at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots before running off the board next out in the Feb. 15 Risen Star Stakes Presented by Lamarque Ford (G₂) at the same track. He bounced back two months later to win an allowance optional claiming race at Oaklawn Park, ran third in the May 2 second division of the Arkansas Derby (G₁), and third again in another allowance optional claimer June 13 at Churchill. He finished off the board once more in his most recent start, the July 11 Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G₂) at Keeneland.

Though his racing record is consistent, in any other year Finnick the Fierce would lack the points to qualify for the Kentucky Derby. But with the race postponed by the COVID-19 pandemic and several sophomores

unwilling to enter or unable to maintain their form ahead of the American classic, his connections decided to take a risk on their slightly myopic marvel.

During the Sept. 1 post position draw, Finnick the Fierce drew the oft-dreaded rail for the 146th Kentucky Derby. He will partner with jockey Martin Garcia, and his morning-line odds are 50-1.

Though only eight horses have won from the rail in the race's history, Monge said he thinks the position is exactly where his horse wants to be.

"It's a long race," Monge said. "But the trainer that broke Serengeti Empress, Mort Shirazi, said to me one day when we were trying different bits for him, that if you look at the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes and you see the head-on picture, (jockey) Sonny Leon was pulling Finnick the Fierce's head out. He was leaning in and Leon was afraid he would hit Silver Prospector. The horse lost momentum in that moment when he had to be jerked away. Mort said to us that he thinks the horse is trying to tell us that he likes the rail, so maybe it's a blessing that he drew that post. Maybe he feels more secure.

"What I do know is that if he makes his move on the turn and if he has a free path where he can accelerate the way he does, I think this is a horse to reckon with in the Kentucky Derby. It's a long stretch, but he can really accelerate."

"Obviously, it's not the most ideal post, but he had the 1 hole in the Arkansas Derby and ran strong there," echoed Gilster. "He's come out better from each of his races. With the new gate being not so tight to the rail and with Churchill using post positions 2-19 for the 18 horses in the field, I'm not concerned. He'll run his own race regardless of where he is at. That's him. He's very consistent about how he runs. He takes his time and then he takes over."

As an added bonus, the decision to exclude fans from this year's Kentucky Derby may work in Finnick the Fierce's favor, as his connections have noticed a tendency to get distracted by noises and large crowds.

"It might be better because he is always trying to look with his good eye to the outside," Monge said. "He wants to cock his head and he can lose momentum, but maybe now that there is no crowd, it will work for us."

"I know that he will be fine. The less noise he hears, the more relaxed he'll get," said Hernandez. "It's just amazing to be here. It's a dream that we all carry and I'm very excited."

Finnick the Fierce will be the fifth recorded horse

to run in the Kentucky Derby to have either been missing one eye or be blind in one eye. The first to run with one eye was Cassaleria, who injured his left eye in an accident when he was a foal. Contesting the 1982 Kentucky Derby, the horse finished 13th. Next to run was Pollard's Vision, who contested the 2004 renewal. Blind in his right eye from birth, he ran farther back in 2004 and landed in 17th.

Blind in his right eye from birth was Storm in May, who finished 16th in the 2007 Kentucky Derby. The most recent runner physically missing his left eye was Patch, who finished 14th in 2017.

Outcome and ocular defects aside, Monge, Gilster, and Hernandez are looking forward to cheering on their once-in-a-lifetime horse in what is sure to be a once-in-a-lifetime experience. They like their odds.

"This isn't just a big race, this is a race that people spend years and years and millions of dollars trying to make it into and we're here. We get this chance," Gilster said.

"We're enjoying every moment of this. God blessed us to be here, and we are going to make the best of this," Monge said. "We drew the No. 1 post, and we'll be watching in suite No. 1. Maybe that means we will come out No. 1 in this race. You've just got to dream big." BH

DERBY POLISHES HARD SPUN'S ALREADY STERLING CREDENTIALS

Established sire Hard Spun has been on a hot streak lately that has included a new milestone for Darley's 16-year-old of Danzig. He is one of two sires with multiple starters in the Sept. 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1).

Hard Spun's Derby contenders are Attachment Rate, who was third in the Gotham Stakes (G3) and runner-up in two other stakes this year, and Necker Island, who was third in the Indiana Derby (G3) and third in the Runhappy Ellis Park Derby behind Attachment Rate. Both Attachment Rate and Necker Island finished behind Art Collector at Ellis Park. Art Collector was scratched from the Kentucky Derby Aug. 31 when he injured a foot during a morning gallop.

The other stallion with multiple Derby starters this year is Lane's End's second-crop sire Honor Code, who will be represented by Runhappy Santa Anita Derby (G1) winner Honor A. P. and multiple grade 1-placed grade 3 winner Max Player.

From 10 crops of racing age, Hard Spun has sired only one Kentucky Derby starter before this year. His son Wicked Strong finished a respectable fourth in the 2014 Derby. Such light representation in the highest-profile American classic is a bit surprising considering Hard Spun's credentials as the runner-up in the 2007 Kentucky Derby, a race in which he led the field for a mile before Street Sense and Calvin Borel stormed past him along the rail. Hard Spun went on to finish third in the Preakness Stakes (G1), fourth in the Belmont Stakes (G1), and second in the Breeders' Cup Classic Powered by Dodge (G1). He managed to pick up another grade 1 during his sophomore year by winning the seven-furlong King's Bishop Stakes (G1).

Already the sire of 81 black-type winners worldwide, of which 41 are graded/group winners, Hard Spun doesn't need a starter in the Kentucky Derby to prove he's capable of getting an elite runner. But it's still exciting for the team at Darley that launched his stud career in 2008.

"While this is great, this is not something that has happened overnight. He has been performing at a very high level for some time," said Darren Fox, the sales

manager for Darley America's stallion division. "He's really been hot as of late."

Hard Spun got off to a fast start as a sire, finishing second by a relative nose to Scat Daddy in the 2011 freshman sires standings. The two stallions were separated by only \$11,175 in progeny earnings. Hard Spun got revenge during his second-crop year when he ended the year on top, ahead of Scat Daddy by \$104,624. He also sired his first champion in 2012 when his daughter Questing won the TVG Coaching Club American Oaks (G1) and the Alabama Stakes (G1) on her way to earning the title of champion 3-year-old filly. Hard Spun did sire a classic starter in 2012 with Hard Not to Like in the Kentucky Oaks (G1), where the future grade 1 winner finished sixth.

Most recently, Hard Spun has been among the leading sires by number of graded and grade 1 winners. In 2019, he was the second-leading North American sire by number of grade 1 winners with three behind Lane's End's Quality Road, who had four. That year he was the co-sixth-leading stallion by number of graded/group winners with seven alongside Speightstown and Kitten's Joy.

If this year's Kentucky Derby has an impact on Hard Spun's stallion career, it is likely to be seen at the upcoming yearling sales more than attracting a greater number of mares during the coming breeding season. The stallion already has not bred fewer than 140 mares since 2015 and averaged 153 mares during the past five years.

"We need to get on the other side of the race to see how it plays out and then take stock," Fox said. "If he were to get a winner or even hit the board, there is no doubt that everyone with a Hard Spun in the September sales would be ecstatic. It is certainly great timing heading into the yearling sales, and then that has a positive correlation in November."

Hard Spun is represented by 57 yearlings cataloged in the Keeneland September Yearling Sale and eight in Fasig-Tipton's Selected Yearlings Showcase Sept. 9-10. In 2019, Hard Spun was represented by 57 yearlings that sold at auction for an average of \$83,798. Sixteen of the yearlings sold last year brought \$100,000 or more, with his top seller bringing \$410,000.

Aside from the commercial recognition, Fox said a farm's entire operation benefits when a stallion on the roster has starters in the highest-profile races.

"Anytime the farm can be represented in the bigger races, and there are none bigger than the Derby, there is reflected glory—first on the stallion, and next on the farm for achieving that," Fox said. "We are certainly enjoying the moment."

Oaks Doubles

Two second-crop stallions also have multiple starters in the Kentucky Oaks.

WinStar Farm's former stallion Daredevil, who was exported to Turkey last fall, is the sire of Oaks morning-line second choice and grade 1 winner Swiss Skydiver and longshot Shedaresthedevil.

Hill 'n' Dale Farms' Bayern has two starters as well in grade 2-placed winner Tempers Rising and multiple grade 3-placed winner Bayerness.

Though Daredevil no longer stands at WinStar, farm president and CEO Elliott Walden said the accomplishment still reinforces the quality of WinStar's stallion and breeding program.

"We bred Swiss Skydiver and always loved that filly," Walden said. "She got to the sales grounds where there was an issue that the vets knocked her on, and sure enough, she's become a grade 1 winner."

Trainer Kenny McPeek ended up buying the filly for \$35,000 at the 2018 Keeneland September sale, and she now races for Peter Callahan. Swiss Skydiver has won four graded stakes and earned \$952,980.

"The rewarding thing for our farm is that we

continue to breed good horses by our stallions in their first couple of years," Walden said, noting that WinStar's Distorted Humor got a Kentucky Derby winner in his first crop with Funny Cide, as did former stallion Bodemeister with Always Dreaming. "It is a remarkable achievement of the team here in mating them the right way and raising them the right way, and then we sell 95% of our yearlings, so we put a great opportunity in the marketplace." BH

With so much uncertainty surrounding this year's North American racing going into one of the biggest weekends of the year, there is one thing for sure: Horses offered at public auction will figure in the outcomes of the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) and Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1).

Of the 27 3-year-olds entered in the two races that were rescheduled to Labor Day weekend from the first weekend in May, 25 went through a sales ring, many having been offered and sold or bought back multiple times. All nine Oaks starters are sale graduates (defined by sales companies as having been offered at auction, whether sold or bought back), with 16 of the 18 Derby starters having been presented at auction.

The priciest sophomore on display at Churchill Downs on Friday and Saturday will be Gamine,

the Into Mischief filly whose \$1.8 million price tag when bought by Michael Lund Petersen at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale represented a record for the auction in Maryland.

With agent Donato Lanni signing the ticket on behalf of Petersen, Gamine has gone a long way toward living up to her hefty price tag under the tutelage of Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert. The filly has finished first in all four starts, including the Longines Test (G1) and Longines Acorn (G1) stakes, but was disqualified and placed 11th following an allowance-level win at Oaklawn Park.

"I was hoping it wouldn't go that high, but we had Bob on the phone and he thought it was still a good idea, so that's why we decided to buy her," Petersen said at the time. "When something good shows up, I solely rely on Bob. If he thinks it's a good purchase and it's my turn, I'm going to buy them. I don't know enough about horses to spend \$1.8 million, I can tell

you that. I need a little bit of advice."

Baffert said the filly's presale breeze of an eighthmile in the co-fastest time of :10 and her looks were factors in the auction price.

"She looked like a queen; we call her Queen Gamine," Baffert said on the Churchill backside the morning of Sept. 3. "She (turned in an) impressive breeze (before the sale) and she is an eloquent-looking filly with a lot of leg on her. They can (work impressively before a sale), but you never know how they will pan out."

Gamine's sale represented a major windfall for Brad and Misty Grady's Grand Oaks, which bought the filly for \$220,000 as a yearling and offered her at Midlantic through the consignment of Bobby Dodd.

Baffert also trains the most expensive sale purchase entered in the Derby: Albaugh Family Stables and Spendthrift Farm's Thousand Words, a Pioneerof the Nile colt who cost \$1 million when bought from Brookdale Sales, agent for Florida breeder Hardacre Farm, at the 2018 Keeneland September Yearling Sale.


"We loved that horse," Dennis Albaugh said at the time. "All the boxes were crossed on that one. We stretched and we got a good partner (Spendthrift) on it, and we're excited about it. We can't wait to get him to the racetrack. You know, all the boxes were there—the pedigree, the bloodlines. He's among the very best individuals we saw here."

Thousand Words also has taken big strides toward justifying his purchase price, with earnings of \$327,000 gleaned from four wins and a second in seven starts. The colt's three stakes victories include the Los Alamitos Futurity (G2) and Robert B. Lewis Stakes (G3). BH



THIS YEAR'S DERBY HORSES BRING ADDED EXPERIENCE

Looking at the number of starts in the past performances for horses entered in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), one half expects to see Real Quiet or Thunder Gulch listed among the runners.

In terms of starts ahead of the Derby for this year's 3-year-olds, pushing the race back four months seemingly has pushed the classic back a few decades. With those added months to get some races under their belts, the average number of races for the 18 horses entered is 7.4.

In 2019, when the Derby was conducted in its usual first Saturday in May slot, the 19 horses who started the race had made just 5.6 starts—nearly two starts fewer than the average for this year's field. Only three horses in the 2019 field had more than seven starts going into

the Derby: War of Will, Long Range Toddy, and Gray Magician.

Of course, the increased average this year is attributable to the race date being pushed to September. As 2-year-olds have not been making their debuts until later in the calendar year—if racing at all as juveniles—and horses are having their starts more spaced out, Derby runners are entering the 1 1/4-mile test with fewer starts under their belt.

From 2000-19, the Derby winners averaged six pre-race starts, and only two of those winners, California Chrome with 10 races ahead of his 2014 win and Mine That Bird with eight races before his 2009 upset, had raced more than seven times.

The added experience of this year's field reminds us that it wasn't that long ago when horses had more races under their belts when they lined up at Churchill Downs. If you go back just one more decade from the 20 years examined above to 1990-99, four of the Derby winners started 10 or more times, and the average winner had nine previous starts. Leading the way was Charismatic, who started 14 times before closing the decade with an upset Derby win.

Leading the way in starts in this year's field is South Bend, who has made a dozen, including 10 stakes and five starts on turf. He exits a fourth-place finish to winner Tiz the Law in the Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1), which marked his first start for Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott. Before that effort, he was trained by Stanley Hough and raced for different owners.

Other horses in this year's Derby with more than seven starts are grade 1-placed Finnick the Fierce, grade 3 winner Enforceable (10 starts), champion 2-year-old male Storm the Court (nine), grade 3-placed Necker Island (10), grade 3-placed Attachment Rate (eight), longshot Winning Impression (nine), and grade 1-placed Ny Traffic (nine).

Morning-line favorite Tiz the Law, the winner of the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) and three other grade 1s, has raced seven times. BH





NY TRAFFIC A DERBY LONGSHOT FOR BREEDER CULNAN

Brian Culnan's forays into Thoroughbred breeding have always been a hit-or-miss affair. But on Sept. 5, Culnan will have his first starter in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) in Ny Traffic. BloodHorse MarketWatch spoke with Culnan ahead of the great American classic about his history in the industry, how he became involved in breeding, and his expectations for Ny Traffic on Saturday.

MarketWatch: How did you get started in breeding and racing?

Brian Culnan: I'm a lawyer by trade and I grew up in Saratoga, N.Y., and practiced law down in Albany. I've been going to the races since I was a young kid and I've continued to followed the races. In 2003, a couple fellows that I used to hang out and do off-track betting with decided we should start up a racing partnership, which became Epona Racing Stable.

The breeding part of it was different, and it was done under the name Crusader Racing. We tried on and off over the course of time, when we had some

fillies we've raced, to try and breed them. I think in all we've had four fillies that we raced and consequently tried to breed. Mamie Reilly, the dam of Ny Traffic, we actually owned her dam, French Song, and had her as a broodmare. I think that mare produced five foals during her tenure and Mamie Reilly was her first.

Mamie Reilly was supposed to sell as a yearling, but a couple of weeks before the sale when we did the vet work, she had an immature throat that didn't scope. We just kept her and said we would see what happens. We raced her, but she eventually got injured after her

second start. We always thought she had a fair amount of ability, but some of the physical issues got in the way. I decided to keep her on my own and breed her to Cross Traffic.

MW: How many mares do you have and where are they boarded?

BC: Right now I don't have any mares. When I did, I typically boarded the mares in New York, and they were foaled out at Gallagher's Stud.

MW: When you began breeding with Crusader Racing and then on your own, was the goal to sell the foals or keep them to race?

BC: I don't think that we started out to sell commercially, but eventually that's the way we decided to go. We didn't have a tremendous amount of luck with it. We do have one foal left that is part of the group from French Song. He's a half brother to Mamie Reilly by Mucho Macho Man, and he will sell with South Point Sales at the Fasig-Tipton (Selected Yearlings Showcase). He will be the last horse bred by the current iteration of our program.

MW: Do you have any plans to build a new broodmare band?

BC: I want to wait and see how things shake out with the market before I buy again. I think that if nothing else, we will have left our mark on the breeding industry with Ny Traffic.

Looking back in terms of what we've done with it, notwithstanding with what has happened with Ny Traffic, my take on the marketplace is that I think we're in a spot where if you're not trying to breed a \$100,000 horse, you shouldn't even bother. We didn't go to the top, top sires. Even with French Song, we only had one success where we bred her at a good price on a season to Tiz Wonderful, and she produced a foal that sold for \$120,000. That season, and ironically the season we booked her to Mucho Macho

Man, both of those were bought from the (Thoroughbred Charities of America) auctions because we were trying to get good prices on the seasons. What's deemed to be "sexy" at the sales nowadays is very difficult to breed. In my opinion, you have to get a broodmare with pedigree and be in a position where you can breed to a sire standing for somewhere between \$50,000-\$75,000. Unless you have pedigree on a horse, it just

doesn't seem to happen for them at the sales.

Personally, I think even if I get back involved in breeding, I would stay with the New York-bred program. I think it's lucrative in terms of what horses run for, and it's a great program for someone that doesn't have a huge operation.

MW: Was Ny Traffic a standout foal from the beginning?

BC: Everyone thought he was a nice foal, but a little immature. Of course, you never dream that you're going to breed a horse like this, and you certainly don't think about your horse going to the Kentucky Derby.

As a racehorse, I think he's obviously benefited from the Derby being postponed in terms of him having additional time to improve. He's also benefited from the attrition that has occurred like the Baffert horses getting hurt and others who just aren't going to run in the race. It's cool to breed a horse that will be in the Derby,

but if it had been held in May, I don't think Ny Traffic would be—in all candor—a horse that would have had the same shot he has now. I think now as I look at the race objectively, there are a couple horses on top of everyone else. But in terms of the other runners, I think he fits with the group and I don't think it will be a shock if he hits the board. The one thing I can say about him is that the folks that broke him down in Ocala (Fla.) always told us they thought he would be a horse that would relish more distance.

MW: Mamie Reilly was unfortunately euthanized due to complications from colic. However, you have Ny Traffic's half brother by Normandy Invasion. Do you plan to race him?

BC: The half sibling is down at Belmont Park right now. His name is Purple Hearted. I think he's another one that everyone thinks will like distance as well. At no point did we plan to run him 5 1/2 furlongs this summer at Saratoga, but when the distances get longer, and if he stays healthy, we're hoping to start him this year.

MW: What are your expectations for the Derby this year considering all the changes that have been made in order to adapt to the COVID-19 pandemic?

BC: It's funny because I was listening to someone talk about the Derby on the radio, and they said they thought that it would be interesting to see if—considering there will be no fans—the run to the first turn will be as frantic as it is in a normal year when you have thousands of people yelling and the jockeys are all keyed up? Or will the Derby atmosphere take over and will we see the first quarter in :22 and change like usual? It will be a surprise to us all. BH



NEW YORK CASINOS SCHEDULED TO REOPEN NEXT WEEK

asinos in New York state, a major source of purse money for the horse racing industry, will be allowed to reopen next week for the first time since mid-March when COVID-19 accelerated its spread across the state.

Gov. Andrew Cuomo, a Democrat, said Sept. 3 that casinos, including the video lottery terminal facility at Aqueduct Racetrack, can resume limited operations Sept. 9. Admission will be restricted to 25% of a facility's capacity, extra spacing of slots and VLTs will be required, and drinks and food will not be permitted to be served on gaming floors.

The Aqueduct facility, located in Queens in New York City, also will not be permitted to offer indoor dining; New York City restaurants can serve patrons outside, but the indoor dining ban has not yet been lifted by the state.

Four commercial casinos and racetrack-based VLT facilities contributed more than \$1 billion in tax revenues to state and local governments in the 12 months preceding the March shutdown order by Cuomo. The facilities, especially Aqueduct,

also provide tens of millions of dollars to Thoroughbred and Standardbred purse accounts; the Aqueduct casino is also a major driver of money to the New York Racing Association for its capital projects. The facilities also pay into horse breeding funds.

"Horsemen will look forward to the added revenue as it will help secure the thousands of statewide jobs that rely on horse racing," said Joseph Appelbaum, the president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association.

Appelbaum said it was too soon to tell how much purse money was lost to the COVID-19 shutdown of the casinos. He noted that VLT revenue-sharing proceeds account for about 38% of NYRA purse accounts in a typical year, with the rest coming from pari-mutuel wagering revenues. He noted the 38% funding level is one of the nation's lowest.

"This is yet another positive step for New York that reflects the progress made throughout the state to combat the spread of COVID-19," NYRA spokesman Patrick McKenna said.

McKenna said NYRA applauds Cuomo's decision to reopen casinos with what he called "common-sense health and safety protocols in place" that will also resume VLT revenue payments to NYRA that "will solidify the purse account that supports hundreds of small businesses and thousands of hourly workers."

The state several years ago authorized four new commercial casinos with slots and table games, which are spread around upstate areas. There are also VLT casinos at most racetracks, though not at NYRA's Saratoga Race Course or Belmont Park. The new Cuomo reopening order bans table games at the casinos unless there is some sort of state-authorized physical barrier erected to separate bettors.



Uncertain is how many casino workers will be brought back in the initial phase of the facilities' reopenings. Thousands lost their jobs this spring. Earlier on Thursday, the state labor department, in its daily update on large-scale layoffs, posted a notice from MGM, the owners of the Yonkers harness track and casino, stating that the furloughs of 860 workers at the Westchester County casino would be made permanent in mid-September.

Sen. Joseph Addabbo, a Queens Democrat and the chairman of the state Senate's racing, gaming, and wagering committee, said Cuomo's decision "will result in many of the furloughed casino workers returning to their jobs and providing for their families, while permitting our residents to visit these gaming sites to safely enjoy the amenities during these difficult times."

Addabbo said Cuomo's decision is a "productive first step" but that he hopes the administration will put in place protocols for casinos to meet every two weeks that could lead to more portions of the casinos reopening at a quicker pace.

Casino operators have been heavily lobbying for the reopening plan for months as other segments of the state's economy reopened. Jobless casino workers also took to protesting on the grounds of the state Capitol outside Cuomo's office. The reopening also comes as the governor has expressed concerns about a possible second COVID-19 wave this fall when the flu season kicks in. Cuomo said additional regulators will be at the casinos to ensure compliance with his reopening order. BH

Now the owner is looking to keep the party going for two more days, maybe two more months. In partnership with Spendthrift Farm, Albaugh Family Stables co-owns the Bob Baffert-trained Thousand Words, an entrant in the Sept. 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1).

Girl Daddy certainly ran like a Breeders' Cup contender in improving to 2-for-2. After breaking slowly amid jostling at the start, she recovered to stalk the pace three wide on the outside, never far off the pace set by Inject with fractions of :22.22 and :44.97. Then the filly, whom trainer Dale Romans called the best 2-year-old filly he has ever trained, showed off her skill.

She took command with three-quarters in 1:10.17 and spurted away to win by two lengths. Girl Daddy finished the distance on a fast track in a quick 1:34.94. She paid \$8.60.

"I tried to wait as long as possible to push the button, and when I did, she responded very nicely," winning rider Joe Talamo said.

Favored Crazy Beautiful rallied through traffic on the turn to grab second but could not threaten the winner, who kicked away at the head of the lane. Her jockey, Brian Hernandez Jr., told trainer Kenny McPeek that she grabbed herself early in the race—meaning she caught the heel of a front leg with a rear hoof.

Alexandria settled for third, 3 3/4 lengths behind Crazy Beautiful, in a strung-out field of nine. Xtrema was a distant fourth.

Minutes after the Pocahontas, Romans said he was inclined to go straight to the Juvenile Fillies for Girl Daddy's next start. But Romans admitted that the final decision would be made after sitting down with the "bosses," Albaugh and his son-in-law and racing manager, Jason Loutsch.

Girl Daddy gave Romans his fourth win in the Pocahontas, the most by any trainer.

Bred in Kentucky by China Horse Club, Girl Daddy is out of the stakes-winning Unbridled's Song mare Cara Marie, who placed third in the Lake George Stakes (G2T) at Saratoga Race Course in 2015. Girl Daddy is her lone winner and starter. She was a \$500,000 purchase at the 2019 Keeneland September Yearling Sale from the Bluewater Sales consignment, selected by bloodstock agent Barry Berkelhammer, Romans said.

"When we bought the filly, we loved everything about this horse, and it's turned out exactly what we hoped that we purchased," Albaugh said.

The Pocahontas was the leadoff leg on the 2021 Road to the Kentucky Oaks series, providing points on a 10-4-2-1 scale to its top four finishers. The race was downgraded by the American Graded Stakes Committee for 2020 after being a grade 2 from 2010-19.

Typically run later in September, it was moved up this year for a rescheduled Derby week of fanless racing amid COVID-19. BH

SIMPLY RAVISHING ROMPS IN P. G. JOHNSON STAKES

After defeating open company in her debut, New York-bred Simply Ravishing scored against stakes company next out Sept. 3 in an off-the-turf edition of the \$93,000 P. G. Johnson Stakes for juvenile fillies on the fast main track at Saratoga Race Course.

Heavy rain showers Wednesday forced the event off the inner turf and back to seven furlongs from its initial 1 1/16-mile distance. Simply Ravishing cut back in distance and changed surfaces from her 1 1/16-mile maiden victory Aug. 2 on the Spa's Mellon turf course, but the daughter of Laoban had no problems with the altered conditions.

Piloted by Luis Saez, Simply Ravishing broke from the outside post in the four-horse field just to the outside of Con Lima, who commanded the compact field through an opening quarter-mile in :22.82 and a half in :45.67.

Around the far turn, Simply Ravishing began inching her way to even terms with the pacesetter and was in command by the quarter pole. At the top of the stretch, Saez asked for more from his charge, and she opened on the field, drawing off to a 6 1/2-length win in 1:21.85.

Con Lima finished second as the favorite, and fellow Todd Pletcher trainee Union Gables was another 2 1/4 lengths back in third. Thursday finished last. Invincible Gal, Plum Ali, and Mischievous Dream were scratched.

"I knew (Con Lima) was pretty tough," said Saez, who won his fourth stakes race of the meet. "She came up from Florida where she won pretty nicely. We tried to break good and put pressure on her. I knew my filly was good, too. Last time, she ran on the turf and showed she had a lot of ability. Today, she proved it. She can run on anything. I had a lot of horse, so when I came close to the wire, I was saving some for next time."

Simply Ravishing gave trainer Kenny McPeek a second stakes win of the meet after sending out Swiss Skydiver to an impressive victory in the Aug. 15 Alabama Stakes (G1).

Harold Lerner, who owns Simply Ravishing with Nehoc Stables and Magdalena Racing, said he was not the least bit concerned with the surface change.

"We've been very happy with this horse and felt she could run on any surface," Lerner said. "What I saw

today was very impressive. You just love to see them draw off and win in the right way. Hopefully, she'll have a big future in front of her. She's a New York-bred and twice a winner against open company. Now, we know she can (run on) turf and dirt. She's gone two turns and she's gone seven furlongs, so I think we have a really nice filly on our hands and we're extremely happy with her."

Lerner said Simply Ravishing could stay on dirt for her next start, which could take place in the Darley Alcibiades Stakes (G1) Oct. 2 at Keeneland, a race that McPeek has won four times.

"Ken and I talked about it, and we're going to send her down to Kentucky to him and we're going to take a look at the Alcibiades at Keeneland," Lerner said. "We're hopeful she'd be up for the next step. She's nominated now to the Breeders' Cup, and after what I saw today, I think we're going to roll the dice and just keep going with her."

Simply Ravishing returned \$7.30 for a \$2 win bet and banked \$55,000 to increase her earnings to \$94,600.

Bred by Meg Levy, Simply Ravishing gave her first-crop sire his first stakes score as a stallion. She is out of the More Than Ready mare Four Wishes and was bought for \$50,000 from last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October Yearlings Sale in Lexington, where she was consigned by Bluewater Sales. BH

MCKINZIE RETURNS TO CHURCHILL TO DEFEND ALYSHEBA TITLE

The triumvirate of victors that is McKinzie, jockey Mike Smith, and trainer Bob Baffert will return to Churchill Downs Sept. 4 as they attempt to win their second consecutive \$400,000 Alysheba Stakes Presented by Sentient Jet (G2).

A multiple graded stakes winner and earner of more than \$3 million, Karl Watson, Mike Pegram, and Paul Weitman's McKinzie has shown little sign of slowing down at 5. The son of Street Sense has made three starts this season. He finished 11th in the inaugural Saudi Cup at King Abdulaziz Racetrack Feb. 29, then returned home in good form and bounced back to win the June 7 Triple Bend Stakes (G2) at Santa Anita Park.

Sent to the East Coast to contest the July 4 Runhappy Metropolitan Handicap (G1) at Belmont Park, McKinzie finished a credible fifth, running two lengths behind winner Vekoma.

Friday's return to Churchill Downs will be the first for McKinzie since winning last year's Alysheba. Partnered with Smith for the 1 1/16-mile test, he turned in an impressive performance around the Louisville track, leading at almost every point of call before pulling away to win by 4 3/4 lengths.

Smith and McKinzie will leave from post 2, just one slot outside the starting position from which they won the race in 2019.

Hoping to step into the winner's circle for the first time since February will be Jim Bakke and Gerald Isbister's Mr Freeze. Trained by Dale Romans, the 5-year-old son of To Honor and Serve started 2020 on a relatively high note, finishing second in the Jan. 25 Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes Presented by Runhappy (G1) and first in the Feb. 29 Gulfstream Park Mile Stakes (G2).

Running at Oaklawn Park amid the COVID-19 pandemic, Mr Freeze finished third in the May 2 Oaklawn Handicap (G2). He returned in the Met Mile and finished sixth behind McKinzie.

"I don't know why he didn't come out of there (more quickly)," Romans said of the Met Mile performance. "I asked the jock to ride him a little more aggressively. He still ran a mile in (1:33) and change. He's a fast horse. That's a tough race to win."

Back at Romans' home base in Louisville, Mr Freeze's last work before the Alysheba came Aug. 30. The chestnut worked five furlongs on the dirt in 1:00 1/5, the fifth-fastest of 47 at the distance. Manny Franco will partner from post 5.

Allied Racing Stables' By My Standards will look to take home his third grade 2 win of the season. A 4-year-old son of Goldencents, the Bret Calhountrained colt has not finished worse than second in five starts this season. His two graded wins came in the March 21 New Orleans Classic Stakes (G2) at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots and the Oaklawn Handicap.

By My Standards has raced at Churchill Downs already this year. He ran second in the Stephen Foster Stakes (G2) June 27 behind Tom's d'Etat and then was second in the Whitney Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course. Gabriel Saez will have the call out of post 6.

Silver Dust, Owendale, Hence, Title Ready, and Bodexpress complete the field. BH

SHARING SET FOR STATESIDE RETURN IN EDGEWOOD

Seven 3-year-old fillies will take aim at Breeders' Cup heroine Sharing in the \$300,000 Edgewood Stakes Presented by Forcht Bank (G2T) Sept. 4 at Churchill Downs, but the Speightstown filly is coming into the mile turf event with strong form to back up her 6-5 morning-line odds.

Having captured the Selima Stakes and the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T) to end her juvenile season, Sharing returned May 23 to win the Tepin Stakes over the same course and distance as the Edgewood. The chestnut filly owned by Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and Gainesway Stable then traveled to the Royal Ascot meeting, where she ran second to Alpine Star in the June 20 Coronation Stakes (G1).

Trainer Graham Motion said Sharing is doing "super" ahead of Friday's race. The filly was originally pointed to make her stateside reappearance in the Aug. 22 Del Mar Oaks (G1T), but a foot issue she's dealt with on and off came up after her return from England.

"That's what delayed her a little bit getting into more serious work, and eventually we decided just to push back to this race instead of running at Del Mar, which would have meant we were quite under pressure to get there," Motion explained. "Since we decided to point toward the Edgewood, she's had an ideal preparation. Things have gone without a hitch."

Manny Franco, who has ridden Sharing in each of her races outside Ascot, will be back aboard from post 3. Franco will ride Hopeful Growth later on Friday in the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) and is also in town to ride Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) 3-5 morning-line favorite Tiz the Law Saturday.

"That's another reason we decided to point toward the Edgewood because we knew Manny would be able to ride her, which was an important factor for us," Motion said. "Working with Aron (Wellman of Eclipse) and Antony (Beck of Gainesway) to choose these races, I like to think we've done right by her all throughout her career, even just getting to the Breeders' Cup. Manny's a huge part of this filly. He's got a lot of confidence in her. It's exciting that Manny's in the spotlight this week for all these races; it's well deserved. He's a top rider."

Should the Edgewood go well, Sharing could then point to the Oct. 10 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Presented by Dixiana Farm (G1T) at Keeneland.

"We'd love to get to the QEII like anyone would with a 3-year-old (turf) filly at this time of year, so that would be certainly a goal if things went well," Motion said. "And the timing of this race works out for that race."

In Good Spirits, Walk In Marrakesh, and Outburst—fourth, seventh, and 11th in the Tepin, respectively—will meet Sharing again in the Edgewood. In Good Spirits finished third in the Regret Stakes (G3T) last out at Churchill and Walk In Marrakesh came back to run second beaten a nose in the Appalachian Stakes Presented by Japan Racing Association (G2T) at Keeneland.

Stonestreet Stables' homebred Hendy Woods will make the step back up to graded company after rallying to take the Indiana Grand Stakes Aug. 12 over yielding turf. The Uncle Mo filly's only loss in four starts came when she was seventh in the 1 1/8-mile Regret. All three of her wins have been at a mile.

Indiana Grand Stakes second Pranked, last out allowance winner Lucky Betty, and Mariafoot complete the lineup. $\ensuremath{\mathsf{BH}}$

FOUR GRACES, MUNDAYE CALL TO MEET IN EIGHT BELLES

Something will have to give in the \$300,000 Eight Belles Stakes Presented by Twinspires.com (G2) Sept. 4 at Churchill Downs when Mundaye Call and Four Graces meet in the seven-furlong test for 3-yearold fillies.

Both Mundaye Call and Four Graces boast three consecutive clear victories in sprints, with a combined margin of victory of 22 1/4 lengths between the two of them.

Starting from the inside in the expected field of seven will be OXO Equine's Mundaye Call, a daughter of Into Mischief who will make her second graded stakes appearance. She is coming off her first stakes win, a 7 1/4-length score in the seven-furlong Runhappy Audubon Oaks Aug. 9 at Ellis Park. Before that victory, Mundaye Call posted back-to-back wins in 6 1/2-furlong races, closing her juvenile season with a maiden score at Del Mar and opening her sophomore season with a July 11 allowance victory at Keeneland.

Mundaye Call, the 6-5 morning-line favorite, is trained by Brad Cox, who has won two of the past three editions of the Eight Belles. In 2017 he sent out Benner Island, and he captured last year's test with Break Even.

Four Graces will start from the outside after delivering front-end scores in the about seven-furlong Beaumont Stakes Presented by Keeneland Select (G3) July 10 at Keeneland and the seven-furlong Dogwood Stakes (G3) June 6 at Churchill Downs. Whitham Thoroughbreds' Four Graces is undefeated at the distance as she won her debut March 1 in a maiden test at Gulfstream Park, finished fourth in an allowance-level test there at one mile, then, back at seven furlongs, posted a clear victory at the allowance level at Churchill.

Four Graces, 7-5 on the morning line, is trained by Ian Wilkes. Two-time Eight Belles winner Julien Leparoux is scheduled to ride. Leparoux won the 2010 edition with Buckleupbuttercup and scored in 2016 with Carina Mia.

Wilkes said he considered the Aug. 8 Longines Test Stakes (G1) for Four Graces after the Beaumont but decided instead to rest his filly rather than try that seven-furlong event at Saratoga Race Course. Unraced

> at 2, Four Graces made at least one start a month this year from March through July.

"We had to give her a freshening at some point. We just decided to do it for this race," Wilkes said, noting that racing through the hot weather in summer can be taxing. "If we'd gone in the Test, we would have had to ship to Saratoga instead of just staying in Kentucky. We have the rest of the year and we had to back off sometime, so this little break made sense."

Lloyd Madison Farms IV homebred Sconsin has faced both of the top two choices in recent efforts. In the Beaumont, the daughter of Include finished second to Four Graces, and then she finished third in the Audubon Oaks behind Mundaye Call. BH

EXTRAVAGANT KID POISED FOR GRADED WIN IN TURF SPRINT

ARRS' Extravagant Kid is likely to earn the mantle of favorite in the \$250,000 Twin Spires Turf Sprint Stakes Presented by Sysco (G2T) Sept. 4 at Churchill Downs, having never finished off the board at the Louisville track and with the defection of morning-line favorite Bound for Nowhere.

Extravagant Kid, a 7-year-old gelded son of Kiss the Kid out of the winning With Distinction daughter Pretty Extravagant, is a true turf sprint specialist with a 7-6-3 record out of 21 starts on the grass at five or 5 1/2 furlongs. The Turf Sprint is contested at 5 1/2 furlongs.

The gelding also has done well at Churchill, where he's won twice and finished second once in his three starts there. His most recent start at the Louisville oval was May 29 when he won an allowance race by 1 1/4 lengths over Leinster, who went on to win the

Shakertown Stakes (G2T) at Keeneland. Extravagant Kid also was in the Shakertown and finished fifth.

"I don't know what happened to him last time out," said trainer Brendan Walsh, noting that Extravagant Kid had drawn the rail in the Shakertown alongside

> favorite Wildman Jack, who was expected to show early speed. "They both came out slow and hung together and Extravagant Kid got way back, but he made up a ton of ground. He really ran a sneaky good race."

> Extravagant Kid was 12th in the Shakertown at the top of the stretch, was swung wide, and closed brilliantly to finish only 1 1/4 lengths behind Leinster.

Walsh was encouraged to learn owner/trainer Wesley Ward intended to scratch 3-1 morning-line favorite Bound for Nowhere to instead run the 6-year-old son of The Factor in the Sept. 12 Runhappy Turf Sprint (G3T) at Kentucky Downs. Ward said the \$700,000 purse offered in the Kentucky Downs race was a key factor in his decision.

"I thought he was the horse we had to beat, so it's making my day," Walsh said about Bound for Nowhere's intended scratch. "Our horse's record at Churchill was a big factor for us to run here rather than go to Kentucky Downs. He's won multiple stakes for us, but I'd like to win a graded stakes for his owner. I'd love to get this done for him."


The ownership group DARRS, of which David Ross is the principal, acquired Extravagant Kid in January 2018 when Walsh claimed him for \$75,000 at Gulfstream Park. Since then, the gelding has been a model of consistency, having compiled a 7-7-1 record out of 20 starts and earned more than \$530,000. DARRS has won six black-type stakes with Extravagant Kid and finished second in three graded stakes, including the Highlander Stakes (G1T) at Woodbine.

Extravagant Kid will break from post 5 under Tyler Gaffalione, who won with him in last year's Mighty Beau Overnight Stakes at Churchill Downs and in the Janus Stakes and Sunshine Millions Sprint Stakes during the winter at Gulfstream.

Other key contenders in the Turf Sprint include multiple grade 3 winner Diamond Oops and multiple stakes winners Carotari and Tiger Blood.

Diamond Oops, a 5-year-old gelded son of Lookin At Lucky, won the seven-furlong Mr. Prospector Stakes (G3) at Gulfstream in December. Since then he ran fourth in the Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes Presented by Runhappy (G1) and most recently was second in a one-mile handicap at Gulfstream. Diamond Oops is trained by Patrick Biancone, who has Sole Volante in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1). Florent Geroux has the mount on Diamond Oops, who is breaking from post 1.

Carotari and Tiger Blood come into the Turf Sprint off respective 1-2 finishes in the 5 1/2-furlong Runhappy Preview Turf Sprint Stakes at Ellis Park. A 4-year-old gelded son of Artie Schiller, Carotari has won twice and placed twice out of five starts this year. He was one length the best in the Preview Turf Sprint with Julien Leparoux, who returns for the Turf Sprint. Tiger Blood, a 7-year-old gelding by Cowtown Cat, has won nine times out of 12 starts in turf sprints of five to 5 1/2 furlongs. He'll be ridden by Ricardo Santana Jr.





OLD FORESTER COLT TOPS CANADIAN YEARLING SALE

A colt by Canada's current leading sire Old Forester was purchased by John DiScola for CAN\$90,000 (US\$68,875) to top the Sept. 2 Premier Yearling Sale conducted by the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society's Ontario Division in Rexdale.

Offered by Bernard McCormack's Cara Bloodstock, the colt (Hip 15) was bred in Ontario by Whitford Bloodstock. The colt's dam, the multiple stakes-placed Smarty Jones mare Holidaysatthefarm, was purchased by the breeder for \$25,000 at the 2017 Fasig-Tipton Winter Mixed Sale out of the Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consignment.

Holidaysatthefarm is a half sister to
multiple grade 3 winner Rich in Spirit, the
dam of grade 2 winner and grade 1-placed
Wishing Gate, who herself produced stakes winner

Conducted under COVID-19 restrictions that included limitations on the number of attendees and other safety protocols, the auction was the first for the Ontario division since the CTHS incorporated online bidding into the live bidding process. The CTHS online bidding platform was developed by Direct Livestock Marketing Systems, an internet marketing company specializing in real-time internet auction sales and is part of the largest livestock marketing network in Canada.

CTHS reported 142 horses sold for gross receipts of CAN\$2,831,300 (US\$2,166,717), an average of \$19,939 (US\$15,259), and a \$14,500 (US\$11,096) median. The 55 head that went unsold represented a 27.9% RNA rate.

During the 2019 edition of the sale, 157 yearlings grossed \$3,381,400 (US\$2,541,064), with a \$21,538 average (US\$16,188) and \$13,000 (US\$9,771) median. Last year's RNA rate was 35.9%.

CTHS Ontario president and sales chair Peter Berringer said the results were gratifying, considering there were no six-figure transactions and the delayed start to the racing season at Woodbine due to the global pandemic.

"With no individual yearlings selling for over \$100,000 this year and with the delay of racing and the lifestyle changes due to the COVID-19 health pandemic, the CTHS was pleased to see the median of the sale increase by 12% from \$13,000 to \$14,500," he said. "We are thankful to all oour loyal supporters, breeders, and new purchasers at the Ontario Premier Yearling Sale. Showing the confidence that it still pays to breed, buy,

and race in Ontario."

Berringer said more than 200 potential buyers registered for online bidding and watching the sale, with CTHS still compiling statistics on how many purchasers it assisted in their buying.

Two yearlings bred in Ontario by the late Gustav Schickedanz and consigned by Glenn Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm shared billing for the sale's second-highest price of \$82,000 (US\$62,752). Schickedanz, who with his wife, Ann, operated Schomberg Farm north

of Toronto and had a large tract in Aiken, S.C., died last June 17 at age 90.

Bought by Jim Menzies, Hip 119 is a daughter of Mr Speaker that descends from one of Schickedanz's top female families. The filly's second dam, the multiple stakes winner Woodsmoke, produced grade 3 winner Grand Bili and stakes-placed Conquest City Girl and Enoree. Sharpening Up, the yearling filly's stakes-winning fourth dam, produced three stakes winners, including Queen's Plate winner and champion Woodcarverand grade 3 winner Firm Dancer, and was Canadian Broodmare of the Year in 1999.

Going to Derek Chin was Hip 136, a son of Schickedanz's leading sire Langfuhr named Langstaff Road that is a half brother to stakes winner Will She (Wando) and multiple stakes-placed Sweet Grass Creek (Wando) and a full brother to stakes-placed Sweet Crimson. The colt's dam, the stakes-placed City Zip mare Sweet Banana Breeze, is a full sister to the hard-knocking stakes-placed The Zipster, a winner of 12 races from ages 2 to 8. BH



PUBLIC BARRED FROM PARISLONGCHAMP FOR ARC

The general public will almost certainly be absent from ParisLongchamp for Enable's historic attempt at a third Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1), with race organizers now resigned to having to live within the current limit of 5,000 people on a racecourse.

France Galop had hoped to gain a dispensation from Paris police and city authorities to welcome 15,000 to 20,000 people to a socially distanced Arc.

But, with the French government now prohibiting localities with elevated levels of COVID-19 infections from applying such exemptions to the 5,000-person limit on public gatherings, the decision was taken at a Sept. 3 meeting to proceed with plans to stage an "industry-only" Arc.

That will comprise owners, trainers, and other racing professionals in addition to media for the centenary running of Europe's premier flat race.

Visitors from Britain and Ireland already faced the prospect of a 14-day quarantine on their return but those who went ahead and booked tickets in the hope—shared by the organizers—that a reasonable crowd might be allowed to attend, will hear in more detail over the coming days about plans to offer either a refund or a deferral to the 2021 Arc.

France Galop chief executive Olivier Delloye said: "We have not received authorization from the Paris police prefecture to have more than 5,000 people. As we feared might happen Paris has become one of the red zones in terms of the circulation of the virus and the prefects are no longer allowed to consider any exemption.

"We are now planning for an Arc with 5,000 people at ParisLongchamp. Unfortunately that number means no admission to the general public and it will be an Arc limited to the staff working at the racecourse, as well as trainers, owners and breeders with runners and limited entourages.

"There is a tiny hope that in the coming weeks we might be allowed to add a separate watertight zone on the racecourse for another 5,000 people. I think the chances are extremely thin that we will be allowed to do that but we have to hold out hope. In reality, it looks like an Arc with only 5,000 people."

The news will come as a huge disappointment to those who have made the trip to ParisLongchamp an annual affair, although it will not perhaps come as a great surprise following the latest communications from the French government, as well as the upward trend of new COVID-19 cases in several parts of the country, including the Ile de France.

French racing has fared well compared to many other sports since its return May 11.

The Tour de France belatedly got under way last Saturday and crowds have been allowed along the route although with restrictions in terms of how close they can get to the riders.

Just down the road from ParisLongchamp, Roland Garros is due to host the delayed French Open in late September and early October and the French Tennis Federation is continuing in its efforts to gain approval for more than 5,000 to attend.

ENABLE HALF BROTHER TO DEBUT AT ASCOT

Connections have tempered their enthusiasm as Enable's half brother Derab makes the first appearance of his career Sept. 4 in Ascot's Me2 Club EBF Future Stayers' Maiden Stakes.

The son of Sea The Stars will race in the same green and pink silks of Khalid Abdullah as his illustrious relative, the 11-time group 1 heroine Enable, who makes her likely farewell appearance in Britain in the Sept. 5 Unibet September Stakes (G3) at Kempton when she faces six rivals.

Most pairs of eyes are likely to be focused on Derab during the seven-furlong Ascot race, which has attracted 15 runners, including some well-bred types.

Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager to Derab's owner, is looking forward to the colt's debut, but warned: "He's quite a backward sort and is just coming on now.

"We are not expecting any fireworks at Ascot, but John (Gosden) has been pleased with him lately. He has improved every time he has worked. We're hoping for a nice run."

Gosden, who won the race 12 months ago with Enemy, has booked Martin Harley for Derab, with Frankie Dettori at Kempton to partner the stable's Kingman colt Megallan—an impressive winner on his Newmarket debut last month—in the seven-furlong novice stakes.

There are some potentially useful youngsters in opposition to Derab, with the Roger Varian-trained Greatgadian just one who takes the eye.

The fact that Varian has entered Greatgadian in the group 2 Juddmonte Royal Lodge Stakes at Newmarket later this month—Derab does not figure among those entries—suggests he is a colt with considerable ability.

Alastair Donald, racing manager to King Power Racing, owners of Greatgadian, said: "Roger says he's been training well and he should handle the ground at Ascot.

"He is bred to get further than seven furlongs and Roger has entered him in the Royal Lodge, which is encouraging."

Charlie Appleby is represented by La Barrosa, a son of Lope de Vega, while Richard Hannon's Escobedo sets the standard on form, having finished a promising third over the Ascot course and distance last month behind Lanequash.
