## TIZNOW RETIRED FROM STUD DUTY

s major farms are announcing stud fees for their 2021 rosters at this time of the year, the retirement from stud duty of 23-year-old Tiznow is of note in the Oct. 21 WinStar Farm release.

The remarkable son of Cee's Tizzy is not only the single twotime Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner, but the super-sized Calbred has been a cornerstone of the WinStar stallion roster for nearly two decades, siring 79 black-type winners.

"He's been a wonderful stallion here at WinStar," said Liam O'Rourke, WinStar's director of bloodstock services. "He's responsible for putting the farm on the map. He's long been a fan favorite and he's given us so much. We're excited that he'll hopefully get to spend many years turned

out on the farm and be here for the fans and visitors from Horse Country to come see."

The oversized bay out of Cee's Song, by Seattle Song, was bred by Cecilia Straub Rubens, raced by Cees Stable, and was trained by Jay Robbins. While he was a winner eight of 15 starts and an earner of \$6,427,830, it was his two wins during the season-ending Breeders' Cup World Championships at the turn of the century that left an indelible mark on the sport in the United States.

In early November 2000, having just made his stakes debut in July, the 3-year-old Tiznow came to the Classic at Churchill Downs as a 9-1 contender. The field was packed with sophomore talent headed by the Kentucky Derby (G1)-winning Fusaichi Pegasus, and 3-year-olds landed in five of the top six slots as Tiznow and European champion Giant's Causeway delivered a memorable stretch battle under the Twin Spires. The determined

Tiznow, with Chris McCarron up, edged the five-time group 1-winning "Iron Horse" by a neck. The score earned Tiznow Eclipse Awards as Horse of the Year and top 3-year-old male.

The following April, after winning two of three starts to begin his 4-year-old season, the big horse was rendered nearly immobile with muscular problems in his back and heat in a vertebrae. Starting over from scratch, Robbins slowly built Tiznow back up to where he could compete at the grade 1 level.

Tiznow's first start back was a third-place finish in the Sept. 8 Woodward Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park, just three days before 9/11 rocked the world.

After a third-place finish in the Oct. 7 Goodwood Breeders' Cup Handicap (G2) at Santa Anita Park, Tiznow returned to New York for the Oct. 27 Classic and was a 6-1 chance to repeat. As smoke could still be seen from lower Manhattan at Belmont Park, and armed guards prowled the paddock, McCarron and Tiznow rallied from third to somehow get up to defeat Godolphin's Sakhee by a nose. The roof-rattling result helped lift the spirits of Americans around the globe.

Tiznow entered stud for the 2002 season at WinStar, in partnership with the Taylor family's Taylor Made Farm. His fee was \$30,000, where it remained for his first four years before rising to \$40,000. His fee peaked at \$75,000 (2009-15) before being lowered to \$60,000. He stood the 2020 season for \$40,000.

Despite not racing at 2, as a sire he was an instant hit, getting Folklore, winner of the Alberto VO5 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) and an Eclipse Award in his first crop. He sired 13 additional grade 1 winners, including Well Armed and Colonel John, both major grade 1 winners bred and raced by WinStar. He is also the sire of classic winner Da' Tara, winner of the 2008 Belmont Stakes (G1).

He's also been popular in the sale arena. He has a career total of 805 sale yearlings that have averaged \$146,608, peaking in 2013 with 55 yearlings averaging \$272,782.

"He's been a commercial breeders' dream in what he threw: size, scope, and bone ... and flashy, correct horses," O'Rourke said. "There's still some opportunities here at the (Fasig-Tipton) October Yearling Sale, and there will be some weanlings in November and a handful of foals next year to chase after."

His success continues as a broodmare sire. Among the 37 stakes winners his daughters have produced is Tiz the Law, a top 3-year-old this year and winner of the Belmont along with the Curlin Florida Derby (G1) and Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1). Tiz the Law is aimed at making his own assault on the Nov. 7 Breeders' Cup Classic at Keeneland.

"He's turned into a heck of a broodmare sire, and he'll be a significant influence. His out-crossed pedigree and his physical-type horse he throws, it all contributes him to being a broodmare sire."

Tiznow has multiple sons at stud, including Breeders' Cup Mile (G1T) winner Tourist, who stands at WinStar; Three Chimneys Farm's Strong Mandate; Fury Kapcori, who stands at Journeyman Stallions in Florida; Slew's Tiznow at Rancho San Miguel in California; and A & A Ranch's Sporting Chance in New Mexico. ## PANDEMIC PRICING

Not everyone likes to be first out of the box. Being first sometimes has its advantages while introducing a new product line or setting pricing, but being in front can also leave a business out in the cold.

Back in the formative days of the commercial bloodstock world, "Cousin"

Leslie Combs II, master of Spendthrift
Farm, wanted to be out front. James E.

"Ted" Bassett told the tale several years ago of Combs' not liking his spot in one year's yearling catalog of the old Breeders' Sales Co.

"All the consignors would draw straws to see who was going to sell on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday," Bassett regaled. "I think one year Les drew Friday, and he didn't like it. Well, nobody liked it that drew on Friday. But he got up and said, 'Just give me Monday. I want to sell the first day because I want to set the tone of this sale.' And he did."

More than a half-century later Spendthrift Farm has continued to push the industry forward while under the stewardship of B. Wayne Hughes. Hughes' success in developing Public Storage gave him the wherewithal to purchase Spendthrift in 2004. Applying his aggressive business tactics to the Thoroughbred market through "Breed Secure" and "Share The Upside" programs he pushed the industry forward as it was coming out of the Great Recession.

The farm, having returned to a spot as a sizable stallion operation, has been out front in setting stud fees for the coming season. While usually setting prices in August in front of the Fasig-Tipton sales in upstate New York, this year it waited until last week, but was still the first in announcing its pricing.

"With the way things were going this year, with no Saratoga sale and not being sure how the September sale was going to go, it was a very odd year for us," said Mark Toothaker, Spendthrift Farm's stallion sales manager. "We would have already been hot and

heavy into selling seasons, but we waited. We wanted to see what was going on—September is the barometer for the whole season.

"It was very unusual for us to wait that long. By waiting we didn't know if we would be the first, but maybe some other farms were waiting to see what we were doing as well."

Spendthrift's roster sees lower fees for 15 of 21 stallions. Reduced revenues for 2021 places pressure on the farm and other stallion stations; however, it also offers a balm for breeders who have seen reduced revenues from the sale of their yearlings earlier this year.

The reductions, which have been echoed by many other farms as well, came from the Spendthrift team but were led by Hughes.

"We actually had three different prices as we went along," Toothaker said. "We sat down and thought we had some good pricing. We talked to some of our breeders and got some feedback that we needed to be more aggressive than we were, so we sat down again and were trying to come up with a game plan to take to Wayne. He wants to go over every stallion, one by one, to make sure that we are getting where we need to be mare-wise. We told him we were going over it one more time before we got with him. He made our job easier, saying, 'Listen, if you can go in there and set prices how you think I would want to set them, being as aggressive as possible, that is what I want you to do.'


"He took all of that pressure off of us," he continued.
"He said, 'We have to keep our breeders in the game. If you think you are being aggressive, you are not being aggressive enough.' When we did that and went through them one by one, he was happy, and we felt like our breeders would be happy with what we were doing."

While every business is competitive, one of the many marvelous things about the Thoroughbred industry is that there is a collective spirit. After all, we're all in the same game and have the same love of the horse. Our hopes and dreams offer a beacon in the dark—be it recession, depression, or even a pandemic.

"We have to be optimistic in this business or we wouldn't be in it. This whole thing is about trying to keep our breeders in the game," Toothaker said. "Our hope is we can get through the COVID situation, get through the election; let things settle into next year.

"By the time September rolls around next year, we're hoping things have 'normaled' back out."

That's a tall order for sure  $\dots$  regardless of who goes first. BH



## WINSTAR FARM LOWERS MAJORITY OF STUD FEES FOR 2021

Headed by Speightstown and leading second-crop sire Constitution, WinStar Farm has set 2021 stud fees for its 22-stallion roster, most with fees reduced from this year. The farm is also welcoming new stallions Improbable, Laoban, Tom's d'Etat, Global Campaign, and Promises Fulfilled.

Some stud fees are good through the Breeders' Cup Nov. 6-7 and subject to change pending the race results. Fees for Tom's d'Etat and Global Campaign will be established after the world championships at Keeneland, where both are expected to run in the Longines Classic (G1). Limited seasons are available at established prices on Laoban, Outwork, and Improbable before the Breeders' Cup, according to Liam O'Rourke, WinStar's director of bloodstock services.

Speightstown is the farm's highest-priced stallion at \$90,000, stands and nurses, followed by Constitution at \$85,000.

"During these times we felt it appropriate to drop 75% of our fees," said Elliott Walden, WinStar's president, CEO, and racing manager. "We gave two horses a bump—Speightstown, the co-leading sire this year with three grade 1 winners and fourth general leading sire, and Constitution, who has overdelivered at every point of his career. As always, our mission is to offer breeders stallions of the highest quality. We are excited about Laoban joining our roster and three very live horses in the Breeders' Cup Classic joining our roster for the 2021 breeding season."

Improbable, City Zip's only four-time grade 1 winner, has rattled off three consecutive grade 1s in 2020 and should vie for favoritism in the \$6 million Classic. He was a runaway winner of the Hollywood Gold Cup Stakes (G1) at Santa Anita Park, earning a 105 Beyer Speed Figure, and then shipped to Saratoga Race Course and dominated the Whitney Stakes (G1), earning a 106 Beyer. Most recently, he romped by 4 1/2 lengths in the Awesome Again Stakes (G1) at Santa Anita Park, defeating champion Maximum Security and earning a 108 Beyer.

Tom's d'Etat, by sire of sires Smart Strike, is also a top contender for the Classic for G M B Racing. He registered a brilliant 4 1/4-length victory in this year's Stephen Foster Stakes (G2), running a career-best 109 Beyer. Tom's d'Etat covered 1 1/8 miles in an eyecatching 1:47.30, geared down late. The final time was close to Victory Gallop's track and stakes record of 1:47.28 set in 1999.

The Al Stall trainee has recorded 10 triple-digit Beyers, including nine in a row. Tom's d'Etat is out of the stakes-winning and multiple stakes-placed Giant's Causeway mare Julia Tuttle, who is out of a full sister

to Pacific Classic Stakes (G1) winner and leading sire Candy Ride.


Global Campaign, a son of two-time Horse of the Year Curlin, heads to the Breeders' Cup Classic following back-to-back graded stakes scores and is a winner in three of four starts in 2020 for WinStar Farm and Sagamore Farm. He emulated his sire by capturing the Woodward Handicap (G1) in his most recent start, earning a career-best

104 Beyer for trainer Stanley Hough. He also won the Monmouth Cup Stakes (G3) this year.

Promises Fulfilled won five graded stakes from six furlongs to 1 1/16 miles—winning the H. Allen Jerkens Stakes Presented by Runhappy (G1), Xpressbet Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2), John A. Nerud Stakes (G2), Stoll Keenon Ogden Phoenix Stakes (G2), and Amsterdam Stakes (G3), competing exclusively in graded stakes company following his first two victories at 2. In front in 15 of 17 starts no matter the distance, Promises Fulfilled competed in 15 graded stakes, including eight grade 1s, banking \$1,455,530 for trainer Dale Romans. BH

## TAPIT TOPS GAINESWAY 2021 STALLION ROSTER

G ainesway announced their 2021 stud fees Oct. 21 for their stallion roster which is topped by three-time champion sire Tapit, who has solidified his status as one of the most influential and breed-shaping stallions of the last half-century.

North America's leading stallion by lifetime graded stakes winners (84), grade 1 winners (27), and progeny earnings (\$159,714,395), Tapit will stand for \$185,000 in 2021. He is the only stallion to appear in the Top 5 General Sires list during nine of the past 10 years.

In 2020, Tapit is represented by recent grade 1 winners and Breeders' Cup hopefuls Valiance and Essential Quality. In the sales ring, yearlings by Tapit topped both opening sessions of Keeneland's September Yearling Sale, including the \$2 million sale topper.

Among the nation's leading broodmare sires, Tapit is also cementing his legacy as a sire of sires. His top sons at stud include Constitution and Tapizar, plus promising young sires Frosted, Tonalist, Tapiture, and Tapwrit.

"It has always been Gainesway's goal to provide breeders with quality and value," said Gainesway CEO Antony Beck. "The current economic climate that breeders are facing makes this more important than ever. Our stallion roster offers a diverse group of established stallions and exciting young studs who look to establish a new era at Gainesway,"

McKinzie, a brilliantly fast four-time grade 1 winner, will enter stud in 2021. The son of Street Sense will stand for \$30,000. A grade 1 winner at ages 2, 3, and 4, McKinzie posted eleven triple-digit Beyer Speed Figures during his career as well as an impressive 1/4 Ragozin in winning the Whitney

Stakes (G1). His seven graded stakes wins bring his career earnings to nearly \$3.5 million.

"I am excited about beginning this new chapter in the Gainesway stallions with McKinzie," said Beck. "His accolades on the racetrack speak for themselves with his brilliance and race record, I couldn't think of a better prospect to bring to Gainesway to compliment our champion sire Tapit."

Karakontie, who has gotten off to a fast start at stud, will stand for \$10,000. A three-time grade/group 1 winner on the turf whose victories include the Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French Two Thousand Guineas, G1) and Breeders' Cup Mile (G1T), Karakontie hails from the family of Kingmambo. A testament to his versatility and international appeal, Karakontie is represented by stakes horses in three different countries which have achieved graded stakes victories on both dirt and turf. His 2-year-old daughter, Spanish Loveaffair, is a Breeders' Cup hopeful following a win in this year's Sharp Susan Stakes and a runner-up finish in the JPMorgan Chase Jessamine Stakes (G2T) at Keeneland in her last

outing. His 3-yearold daughter Princess Grace has won two of three starts and finished runnerup in the Pin Oak Valley View Stakes (G3T) at Keeneland Oct. 16. Karakontie also had a sessiontopping yearling sell for \$500,000 at the Keeneland September sale.

Tapwrit, a \$1.2 million yearling purchase turned classic winner and stakes-record setter,

will stand for \$10,000. Out of juvenile grade 1 winner Appealing Zophie (by Successful Appeal), Tapwrit is among the best bred sons of Tapit to ever enter stud. His much-anticipated first weanlings will be offered at the upcoming November Breeding Stock sales.

## WICKED STRONG TO PIN OAK LANE FARM IN PENNSYLVANIA

Wicked Strong is moving to Dr. William Solomon's Pin Oak Lane Farm in New Freedom, Pa., for 2021, the farm announced Oct. 21. The 9-year-old syndicated stallion, who stood this year at Spendthrift Farm near Lexington for \$6,000, will have a fee next year of \$3,500, payable when the foal stands and nurses.

"He's by far the leading second-crop sire in the Mid-Atlantic region with earnings of \$1.7 million," Solomon said. "And he comes with 154 2-year-olds and yearlings, so I think his chances of succeeding are good for that reason. He also has nine stakes horses in his first two crops to race. All these things make him one of the most attractive sires in the Mid-Atlantic."

A top-10 freshman sire nationally in 2019 by progeny earnings, Wicked Strong is currently 13th among second-crop sires. Among his first-crop runners, now 3, are Evil Lyn, the winner of the Hilltop Stakes at Pimlico Race Course this month,

and Wicked Runner, a stakes winner at 2 and 3 in Puerto Rico. His stakes-placed runners include juvenile Brooklyn Strong, who was third in the Bertram F. Bongard Stakes Oct. 2 at Belmont Park in his second start. Of his nine black-type horses, six earned black type at 2.

One of the top runners of his generation, Wicked Strong won the Twinspires.com Wood Memorial Stakes (G1) in stakes-record time at Aqueduct Racetrack and captured the Jim Dandy Stakes (G2) over Belmont Stakes (G1) winner Tonalist. Graded stakes-placed at 2 when third behind Honor Code in the Remsen Stakes (G2), he was second, a nose behind stablemate V. E. Day the next summer in the Travers Stakes (G1). He turned in strong showings in the 2014 classics, finishing fourth in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) won by California Chrome and running in a dead heat with California Chrome for fourth in the Belmont Stakes, less than two lengths behind Tonalist.

Wicked Strong competed in 14 consecutive stakes at 3 and 4, 10 of them grade 1s. During his 4-year-old season, he had four stakes placings, including a second to Tonalist in the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1) and a third behind Liam's Map in the Woodward Stakes (G1), and concluded his 19-start career with a fourth in the Las Vegas Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) won by Liam's Map. Racing for Centennial Farms and trainer Jimmy Jerkens, he was retired as the richest son of Hard Spun to stand at stud with a record of 3-4-3 and earnings of \$1,994,460. BH

## KENTUCKY DERBY RUNNER-UP LOOKIN AT LEE RETIRED

Millionaire Lookin At Lee, a two-time stakes winner best known for running second behind Always Dreaming in the 2017 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1), has been retired, co-owner Michael Levinson tweeted Oct. 21.

The winner of the Ellis Park Juvenile Stakes at 2 and the Downs At Albuquerque Handicap last summer at 5, Lookin At Lee struggled this year at 6. The son of Lookin At Lucky was winless in six starts in 2020, managing just one in-the-money finish, a distant third at Remington Park Sept. 11. He last raced Oct. 17, running ninth in an allowance race on the Remington Park turf.

Trained throughout his career by Hall of Famer Steve Asmussen, Lookin At Lee won four of 35 races and more than \$1.3 million for L and N Racing, a four-way partnership composed of Lee, Andy, and Michael Levinson and Don Nelson. He raced in all three legs of the 2017 Triple Crown, finishing fourth in the Preakness Stakes (G1) and seventh in the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1). He also was fourth the previous fall in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) at Santa Anita Park.

His most productive years came at 2 and 3 when he ran second in the 2016 Claiborne Breeders' Futurity (G1) and third in the 2017 Arkansas Derby (G1).

"What a horse!" Michael Levinson tweeted. "We hope to stand him in a regional market in 2021."

A \$70,000 purchase by his owners at the 2015 Keeneland September Yearling Sale from the Penn Sales consignment, Lookin At Lee is out of the stakes-

> winning Langfuhr mare Langara Lass. He is a half brother to two stakes winners, including Blended Citizen (by Proud Citizen), a three-time grade 3 winner. BH

## SUNLAND DERBY WINNER RUNAWAY GHOST RETIRED TO STUD

Runaway Ghost, winner of the 2018 Sunland Derby (G3) and an earner of \$783,509, has been retired and will stand the 2021 breeding season at Double LL Farms in Bosque, N.M.

A 5-year-old son of Ghostzapper out of the Desert God mare Rose's Desert, Runaway Ghost won eight of 15 races, mostly under the direction of trainer Todd Fincher in New Mexico. Michael Machowsky and Steve Asmussen also trained him during his career. The horse won five black-type stakes, capturing four on dirt in New Mexico and another on synthetic at Golden Gate Fields as a 2-year-old in 2017. His stakes victories ranged from six furlongs to 1 1/8 miles.

His Sunland Derby win in 2018 secured him enough points to compete in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) at Churchill Downs later that spring, but he suffered a training injury while preparing for the race at Sunland Park that forced him to miss the Derby.

Runaway Ghost came back as a 4-year-old and won two stakes races at Sunland before shipping to Kentucky for the Commonwealth Stakes (G3) at Keeneland, where he ran 12th after twice clipping heels and exiting the race with an ankle injury. He returned a month later to win another stakes race at Sunland.

He raced three times this year, placing in his season debut at Sunland and following that with a win, before running seventh in the Lone Star Mile Stakes June 28 in the final start of his career at Lone Star Park.

A third-generation homebred for the late Joe Peacock of San Antonio, Runaway Ghost was retired sound and will continue to be owned by the Peacock family as he starts his second career, according to a release distributed by Peacock's son, Joey. A stud fee was not announced.

He is one of three winners for his dam, a multiple stakes winner within the New Mexico-bred ranks. Rose's Desert also produced stakes winner Sheriff Brown (by Curlin).

Bred in Kentucky by his owner, Runaway Ghost went through the 2016 Keeneland September Yearling Sale as part of the Shawhan Place consignment but fell short of his reserve when bidding halted at \$240,000. BH

## CHRB COMMITTEE APPROVES CHANGE IN THYROXINE APPROVALS

A California Horse Racing Board committee has approved a proposed regulatory change intended to curb the growing use of a medication prescribed to treat hypothyroidism, which is rare in racehorses.

According to unanimous action Oct.
21 by the medication, safety, and welfare committee, the full board at its Oct. 22 meeting will consider a requirement that before a veterinarian prescribes thyroxine to a horse at a CHRB-regulated facility, they must have made a hypothyroid diagnosis for the animal based on a thyrotropin-releasing hormone response test. According to information presented to the committee members, the TRH test is the only reliable way to diagnose hypothyroidism.

"Thyroxine has been associated with cardiac arrhythmias and atrial fibrillation in humans and anecdotally similar cardiac arrhythmias and atrial fibrillation have been reported in horses," the board was told in a staff report supporting the TRH test requirement. "The American Association of Equine Practitioners and Racing Medication and Testing Consortium issued a thyroxine advisory in August noting the practice of prescribing levothyroxine to large numbers of racehorses has drawn scrutiny and raised questions about the legitimacy of its use in horses engaged in training and racing. They also pointed to multiple instances where records indicate levothyroxine was prescribed for every horse in a trainer's care."

Dr. Rick Arthur, the equine medical director, explained that following a rash of equine fatalities in 2013, the board took steps to tighten the use of the medication.

"Subsequent to the sudden deaths reports where all the horses in a particular cluster we were investigating were on thyroxine, the board issued an advisory requiring specific diagnostic and other prescribing and reporting and labeling restrictions for thyroxine and any other thyroid hormone or thyroid hormone analogs," Arthur explained.

The staff report and analysis noted that despite those efforts, there have been 256 prescriptions written for thyroxine through the first week in October at Southern California Thoroughbred tracks and their auxiliary training centers.

"Over half of the prescriptions are for two trainers, and 80% of the thyroxine has been prescribed by just three veterinarians," the report stated. "Hypothyroidism is rare in horses and especially so in young racehorses."

"There is no room for the use of thyroxine in racehorses," said Dr. Greg Ferraro, an equine veterinarian and the CHRB chairman. "This ruling is long overdue."

The committee also approved a change to a regulation scheduled to go into effect Jan. 1, 2021, regarding when horses can be removed from the official veterinarian's list that consists of horses deemed to be unfit to compete in a race due to veterinary treatment, physical distress, injury, lameness, unsoundness, or infirmity.

The new regulation, approved by the California Assembly this year, also specifies the amount of time a horse must spend on the veterinarian's list. The committee Wednesday approved a recommendation that the regulation also allow the official veterinarian to require diagnostic imaging prior to removal from the list.

The committee also received a report on postmortem exams conducted during the July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019, fiscal year that showed 144 examinations were performed, six more than the previous year. Of the equine fatalities during the period, 126 were in Thoroughbreds and 18 in Quarter Horses.

"The largest cluster of fatal injuries—77%—occurred in 2-, 3-, and 4-year-old racehorses," the report stated. "In 2018-19, 79% of the total primary injuries in all breeds were due to musculoskeletal, which is consistent with what has started several years ago."

Arthur also presented the medication violations report for fiscal 2019-20 that showed 119 medication or drug violations, 99 of which were for Class 4 or 5 medications and 20 for Class 1, 2, or 3 medications.

The committee discussed but held off on a vote until further consideration is given to proposed changes in its fire prevention regulation that would remove many of the specifics that must be met before clearance is given prior to a race meet or opening of a training center each year.

Each facility under the CHRB regulatory umbrella would have to receive approval of fire clearances from local fire authorities, the proposal said.

"Board Rule 1927 has existed since the development of the first CHRB regulations and has never been modified. Additionally, based on recommendation from feedback from stakeholders, it is determined that this rule is outdated and difficult to comply with," the analysis stated. "Board staff spoke with the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection regarding the requirements of Board Rule 1927 and the best way to safely amend the rule to make compliance possible for racing associations, but also to ensure continued safety. Upon the recommendation of Cal Fire, it was recommended that the Board leave the approval of the fire clearances up to the local fire authorities and the requirements as outlined in already existing Cal Fire regulations."

After hearing feedback from representatives of racing associations and the general public, the committee decided to continue to work on the proposed changes. BH

## SISKIN TO STAND STUD IN JAPAN AFTER BREEDERS' CUP BID

Ger Lyons has revealed that his dual group 1 winner Siskin will head to stud in Japan after one final potential start in his care at the Breeders' Cup.

The Juddmonte homebred was unbeaten in a striking juvenile campaign, which culminated in victory in the Keeneland Phoenix Stakes (G1) at the Curragh.

He returned for 2020 to land the Tattersalls Irish Two Thousand Guineas(G1) under a steely ride from Colin Keane and was a commendable third behind Mohaather in the Qatar Sussex Stakes (G1). The First Defence colt was most recently seen finishing fourth to Persian King in last month's Prix du Moulin de Longchamp (G1).

"This year was about the Guineas, the Sussex, come back for a light campaign, maybe the Boomerang (G2), have a look at the QEII (G1), ground depending, and then put him away for next year, but that's been put on hold," said Lyons.

"I didn't want to send him as a 3-year-old to a Breeders' Cup, but he won't be staying in training at 4, so the Breeders' Cup now becomes an option. At this moment in time, he's being trained with that in mind."

After explaining on the Nick Luck Daily podcast that Japan would be Siskin's stallion destination, Lyons expressed a degree of both personal and wider disappointment.

Juddmonte announced in June that it had sold Siskin's breeding rights to undisclosed buyers, widely thought to have been Coolmore.

"I'm delighted for him because he's going to get a quality book of mares that he probably wouldn't get in Ireland, but I'd have loved to have trained him at 4," Lyons said. "But it just goes to show you where we are in the industry when powerhouses like Juddmonte, Coolmore still sell their best horses and have to sell their best horses for economic reasons.

"I thought when I'd get to the stage when I'm winning a Guineas or an Oaks that you'd see their careers out. We've got to where we are by selling our best horses, and here we are at the top table, still

selling our best horses. Which is a little bit disappointing, frustrating, whatever, it's demoralizing to say the least."

Lyons has sought top of the ground conditions for Siskin this season, and the state of the going at Keeneland next month is the trainer's caveat.

"We're allowed 'go' if we're all happy with him, and that's a decision (Juddmonte racing manager) Teddy (Grimthorpe) and I will make in the coming days," he said. "It's been lovely fast ground over there of late, which would be perfect for him, but I wouldn't like to see him over there on soft ground."

## AL SHAQAB SCORES LOPE DE VEGA COLT AT ARQANA OCTOBER

n Oct. 21 Al Shaqab's sustained investment at the Arqana October Yearling sale passed the €1.7 million mark for the week across 19 horses, with the star of their acquisitions on Day 3 a son of Lope de Vega (Lot 465) knocked down for €95,000 (US\$112,314).

Bred by Haras de Castillon and carrying more than just the chestnut coloring in terms of resemblance to his sire, the colt is out of the Mr. Greeley mare Princess Aurora, whose most successful product to date is Weatherbys Stallion Book Flying Scotsman Stakes third Mohab, and boasting two siblings who won at listed level in the United States.

Al Shaqab chief operating officer Paul Hensey said of the session-leader: "He is a lovely individual, we liked him a lot. Lope de Vega is a proven sire and does it day in, day out."

Lope de Vega had indeed been to the fore earlier in the day when Godolphin's Parchemin maintained an unbeaten record across the road from the Arqana complex in the Prix Isonomy.

"This is a big strong colt with a great walk, out of a Mr. Greeley mare, which always brings a little bit of brilliance to a pedigree," continued Hensey. "Certainly he was a horse we were strong on."

After a couple of years of more low-key spending at the yearling sales while their breeding wing was allowed to bed in, Al Shaqab are now looking to a more mixed economy.

Hensey pointed out that plenty of their purchases have been linked to the eight-strong Bouquetot roster, no fewer than four of which have their first yearlings passing through the ring in 2020.

"We've been active at the sales—here in September, at Newmarket in Book 2 and this week—and we've bought almost 40 yearlings this year," he said.

"Breeders are having a tough time and Sheikh Joaan was conscious of that. We certainly tried to support the breeders as much as possible and as well as buying horses by non-Al Shaqab stallions, we've bought quite a few by ours to support those breeders."

## Al Wukair Crop Featuring Plenty of Precocious Types

Day 3 buys for the team were completed by a pair of fillies by Bouquetot sires: a €60,000 (\$70,936) daughter of Al Wukair from the Fairway Consignment (Lot 452), and the second by Olympic Glory out of the Dark Angel mare Petite Patch brought to the ring by the Haras de la Hotellerie (Lot 458).

## GOFFS UK HOSTS REFORMATTED AUTUMN SALE

Selling returns to Doncaster Oct. 22 as a bumper edition of the Goffs UK Autumn Sale gets underway at 10 a.m. local time.

The 308-lot catalog comprises three sections, namely Autumn Horses-in-Training (Lots 1-195); the Silver Yearling Sale, which has been rescheduled from its traditional post-Premier Sale pitch (Lots 196-254); and the Autumn Yearling Sale (Lots 255-308).

Recent editions of the Autumn Sale have featured a selection of point-to-pointers, but this section of the catalog has been reduced this year, with horses with point-to-point form instead bound for the new Goffs UK November Point-to-Point Sale, which is dedicated to pointers, bumper performers, and select form horses.

The November Point-to-Point Sale takes place at Yorton Farm Nov. 11 in a venue and date change necessitated by the lockdown in Doncaster that starts Saturday.

Among the National Hunt runners on offer at the Autumn Sale with recent winning form are

Clonguile Way (Lot 92, consigned by Gavin Cromwell's Danestown House Stables), Ferrobin (Lot 158, consigned by Dan Skelton's Lodge Hill Stables), and Jorgie, who made a successful hurdles debut for Jim Goldie (Lot 173).

The session also features some talented flat performers, notably Confide (Lot 49), a son of Lope de Vega and Confidential Lady who has won two of his four starts for David O'Meara and Cheveley Park Stud, and Vasco Da Gama (Lot 77), a €300,000 (US\$343,140) yearling son of Dansili who won a Vichy maiden on his second outing for Henri-Francois Devin and Sheikh Mohammed Obaid.

Among the stallions with yearlings cataloged to come under the hammer are the likes of Adaay, Bated Breath, Belardo, Havana Gold, Tamayuz, and Ulysses. Past graduates of the Silver Yearling Sale include Abel Handy, Pleaseletmewin, and the group 1-winning Quiet Reflection.

Goffs UK's managing director, Tim Kent, said: "This year hosts a different format compared to the traditional Autumn Sale with a notable addition, the Silver Yearling Sale, and a significant absence in the full point-to-point/form horse session.

## TAYLOR'S NEW PROVIDENCE SWEPT CANADIAN TRIPLE CROWN

When Larry Cordes' Ontario homebred Mighty Heart lines up for the 129th Breeders' Stakes at Woodbine Oct. 24, the one-eyed son of Dramedy could become the 13th—and the first in 17 years—winner of the Canadian Triple Crown.

The Canadian Triple Crown emulates its south-ofthe-border compatriot: the Queen's (King's) Plate Stakes (Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve, G1) at 10 furlongs, the Prince of Wales Stakes (Preakness Stakes, G1) at 1 3/16 miles, and the Breeders' Stakes (Belmont Stakes, G1) at 1 1/2 miles but on turf.

First run in 1860, the Queen's Plate is the oldest extant stakes in North America; the Breeders' Stakes came along in 1889, and the relative new kid on the block, the Prince of Wales Stakes, appeared in 1929. However, the Canadian three were not officially regarded as a Triple Crown—the earlier winners have been retroactively regarded as Triple Crown winners.

Appropriately, the winner of the first official Canadian Triple Crown, New Providence, was a homebred from Canada's leading breeding establishment, E. P. Taylor's Windfields Farm.

Coincidentally, anyone with \$10,000 and a willingness to take a chance on a bay colt by Bull Page out of One Thousand Guineas Trial winner Fair Colleen (Preciptic) could have owned the Triple Crown winner. Taylor offered him as part of his annual yearling sale

at Windfields Farm in 1957. Those lots that went unsold, Taylor raced.

Trained by Gordon "Pete" McCann, New Providence showed some promise as a 2-year-old. Certainly hardy by today's standards, he started 13 times with just two wins—albeit one was the Cup and Saucer Handicap—but 10 placings that included the Coronation Futurity.

The maturity from 2 to 3 fused the promise and experience of New Providence's juvenile season into a classic contender. He came into the 100th anniversary of the Queen's Plate with a single victory in five starts. However, his previous effort had been a half-length runner-up effort to the highly regarded Major Flight in the Plate Trial at Old Woodbine.

The third-largest field in the race's centennial history, 20 horses, assembled June 30. Under the expert guidance of U.S. jockey Bobby Ussery, New Providence had drawn the 18 post for the 10-furlong trip. Eighth through the first four furlongs, Ussery had moved his mount within striking distance with four furlongs remaining. By the time the field had reached the eighth pole, Ussery had not only claimed the lead, he extended it to four lengths midstretch and held on to win by 1 1/4 lengths over Major Flight and Winning Shot.

Six weeks later, the Canadian classic show moved to Fort Erie for the Prince of Wales Stakes. With jockey Avelino Gomez employing the same stalk-and-pounce tactics from the Queen's Plate, New Providence waited to make his move after a mile to sail through the stretch to a four-length win.

Caroming into the Breeders' Stakes after defeating older rivals in the Seagram's Cup Handicap, New Providence was the 3-10 favorite in the winnowed field of five for the last jewel of the crown. Gomez once again employed New Providence's preferred style of running to coax a 1 1/2 length victory over his five rivals.

In addition to his Triple Crown, New Providence also made an impact at stud. Among his important

stakes horses is Canadian Oaks winner South Ocean, whose Northern Dancer European champion son Storm Bird sired multiple leading sire and broodmare sire Storm Cat.

New Providence is not the only Triple Crown winner from the Windfields sale. English Triple Crown winner Nijinsky II is a 1968 alum. BH

As track superintendent at Philadelphia Park, a position he held for 31 years, Roy helped establish Track Superintendent Field Day to promote collaboration among track superintendents with the goal of increased safety of track surfaces.

"Track superintendents are such a vital part of the overall racing scene. As part of his lifelong passion for the industry, Roy has dedicated his life to the health and welfare of the horse, the rider, and the track personnel through his work," nominator Joe Carr said. "He is a global resource of racetrack management knowledge and shares that knowledge through the Track Superintendents Field Day he established over 15 years ago." BH


