

BREEDERS' CUP SATURDAY PREVIEWS

ESSENTIAL QUALITY RALLIES TO WIN BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE

When the starting gate opened for the \$2 million TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile Presented by Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance (G1) Nov. 6, 14 runners shook the Keeneland grandstand with the thunder of their collective stride and rode off toward the first turn and into a sunset worthy of a John Wayne Western.

But it was only the opening credits.

In a race that largely decides who will be the early favorite on next year's Triple Crown trail, 2-year-old Godolphin homebred Essential Quality stamped himself the "One to Watch" when he took a late-running trip down the center of the lane to win by three-quarters of a length.

Guided by Luis Saez, Essential Quality broke slowly and bumped briefly with another runner, a collision that forced the colt to settle just off the pace in eighth. The early speed came in the form of Dreamer's Disease, who clicked

off fast fractions of :22.58, :45.31, and 1:10.48 through the first six furlongs.

"I was concerned," said trainer Brad Cox, who hoped Essential Quality would break closer to the lead. "I was a touch concerned going into the first turn—Luis had asked him to run out there. I thought the horses were faster in the early part of the race, and it kind of got away from him. He took some dirt going into the turn and up the backside."

Up at the front of the field, Likeable, heavy favorite Jackie's

Warrior, and Classier were second, third, and fourth as they stalked the pace behind Dreamer's Disease. Tipped out three wide by jockey Joel Rosario, Jackie's Warrior forged a path to the outside of the frontrunner exiting the backstretch and managed to eke out a half-length advantage coming off the final turn. By that point, Essential Quality had made his own four-wide advance toward the front, outside of Jackie's Warrior. He took aim at the leaders.

"Once again, he was sitting out wide," Cox said. "I wasn't sure he was really carrying himself into the bridle. I think I saw :45 and change for the half-mile, and I could see Luis starting to pick up. When he picked up and picked off a couple of horses and once he straightened up ... the horse has a tremendous amount of stamina."

Longshot Hot Rod Charlie—a half brother to champion Mitole—commenced his own rally under jockey Tyler Gaffalione at the furlong pole and began to pose a serious threat to a waning Jackie's Warrior. But running just to Hot Rod Charlie's inside was Essential Quality, who switched leads and kicked home in the final strides. With Hot Rod Charlie hot on his tail, Essential Quality kept pushing to the wire and managed to hold off his rivals. The final time for the 1 1/16-mile dirt test was 1:42.09 on a fast track.

"Luis said something like when he got to the three-eighths pole, 'I knew we were full of run,'" Godolphin's Jimmy Bell said. "But I said, 'Well, I wish you could have let us know that because going down the backside, I wasn't as confident as you were.'"

But Saez knew what he had underneath him.

"I knew there was going to be a lot of speed, so we were in the right spot," he said. "At the three-eighths he gave me that kick so I knew we had a chance to win the race. He can run all day. He's a nice horse."

Hot Rod Charlie, who went off at odds of 94-1, held on for second, followed by Keepmeinmind in third. Jackie's Warrior faded to fourth, three lengths ahead of Rombauer in fifth.

"It's so exciting to win any Breeders' Cup race, but when you have a 2-year-old colt that is a homebred ... it's the cherry on top," Bell said. "I was just saying earlier how exciting that was; so much of the farm staff was able to come over and watch because this is in our own backyard. That's where the joy is: in celebrating with people who put so much time in behind the scenes of all this. It made it so special to have the team here, and it's a tribute to Sheikh Mohammed and his overall breeding plan.

"There is nothing more exciting than a 2-year-old that looks like he might get a little further going two turns."

With three victories from as many starts, it's clear that Kentucky-bred Essential Quality enjoys racing on his home turf. The son of Tapit broke his maiden on

debut going six furlongs Sept. 5 at Churchill Downs by four lengths before traveling to Keeneland next out to contest the Oct. 3 Claiborne Breeders' Futurity (G1).

He delivered another dominating performance, drawing off in deep stretch to win by 3 1/4 lengths and earning an automatic berth in the World Championships. It was the second consecutive win for a Godolphin homebred in the Futurity after Maxfield's score last year.

Trained by Brendan Walsh, Maxfield's connections had hoped that the colt, like Essential Quality, would use the Futurity victory as a springboard to success in the 2019 renewal of the Juvenile at Santa Anita Park. However, that would not be the case as the colt was scratched days before the race due to an unspecified issue with his right front leg. Although he returned to winning ways in the Matt Winn Stakes (G3), Maxfield also was withdrawn from consideration for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) after suffering a condylar fracture.

Now, with one sweeping move at the Breeders' Cup, Essential Quality has revived visions of roses for Godolphin while relieving some of the sting of last year's disappointments for the Godolphin team. The fourth foal out of the Elusive Quality mare Delightful Quality and her only winner from two to race, he pushed his earnings to \$1,335,144.

"I have to hand it to Brad and his team," Bell said. "In particular Brad, who said to me early on, 'I think he's going to love two turns.' Every time he works and runs, (Brad) tells me, 'Jimmy, this horse isn't breathing.' He just loves the distance. It's been a great day for everybody."

"He's obviously the best Tapit colt we've ever had, and he's obviously been good since day one," Cox said. "He has an amazing amount of talent. He's an amazing animal. We ran him three-quarters knowing he was a two-turn horse, but he had shown us enough speed in the mornings to let us know that he would make a good account of himself going shorter. He did that, overcame some traffic troubles, and split horses. That gave us a lot of confidence."

With the highest honor of the Breeders' Cup's "Future Stars Friday" in the bag, both Cox and Bell said it would be hard not to dream of the future and a trip to Churchill Downs with Essential Quality on the first Saturday in May.

"It's the obvious thought or the dream, as you say, but the Godolphin team—first and foremost—puts the horse first," Cox said. "We will see how he comes out of the race and let the dust settle. We will map out a plan this winter, but I'm very excited for this horse and for next year with his 3-year-old campaign."

"If you didn't dream, you probably wouldn't be in this business," Bell said. "A lot of this is based on dreams. For those lucky and fortunate enough to have lived the dream—which we have done—certainly you dream. Brad said all along that every indication was about distance in this colt. We've asked a lot of a very young, Baby Huey-type 2-year-old, and to see him progress from his first start ... to see him grow mentally and physically and see him handle this kind of competition certainly makes you want to dream a little bit." **BH**



SUPERSEDING INDICTMENT FILED AGAINST SERVIS, OTHERS

A group that includes trainers Jorge Navarro and Jason Servis that was previously indicted in four separate cases of conspiracies to manufacture, distribute, and administer adulterated or misbranded performance-enhancing drugs administered to racehorses has been hit with a superseding indictment handed down by the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York.


The superseding indictment, filed Nov. 5 and first reported by Thoroughbred Daily News, includes the original charges, plus additional charges of mail and wire fraud conspiracy against three defendants—Servis and veterinarians Alexander Chan and Kristian Rhein.

Among those named in the original indictment but not in the superseding indictment are Gregory Skelton, Ross Cohen, Nick Surick, Chris Marino, and Henry Argueta.

Argueta is the former assistant to Servis, whose most prominent trainee was Maximum Security, the 2019 champion 3-year-old male who is scheduled to run in the Nov. 7 Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) under the care of Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert, who took over the training of the colt after Servis' indictment in March.

Navarro and Servis were among 19 individuals indicted March 9. The two trainers entered not guilty pleas during an April 2 teleconference arraignment before United States District Judge Mary Kay Vyskocil.

At the time of the original indictment, Assistant United States Attorney Andrew Adams said it was a case that has "focused on doping and the use of performance-enhancing drugs to win professional horse races in the Thoroughbred and Standardbred industries. It has involved a number of different forms of information-collecting that would include in-person meetings and covertly recorded meetings by confidential sources. It cites a number of wiretaps over a series of phones and in a total span of one year of time."

The original indictment claims Navarro "executed this scheme by using PEDs designed to evade drug tests, physically concealing containers of PEDs and drug paraphernalia from state regulators and racing officials, administering and directing others to covertly administer PEDs, and shipping certain products designed to mask the presence of PEDs through a straw purchaser."

It also charged that Servis "orchestrated a widespread scheme of covertly obtaining and administering adulterated and misbranded PEDs, including a PED called SGF-1000, to virtually all of the racehorses under his control."

The superseding indictment alleges Servis, Chan, and Rhein, along with others "known and unknown, willfully and knowingly did combine, conspire, confederate, and agree together and with each other commit mail fraud and wire fraud," including the billing of clients for the "undisclosed use of adulterated and misbranded drugs on the owners' horses."

While trained by Servis, Maximum Security won the Saudi Cup, but The Jockey Club of Saudi Arabia will not finalize payment of the winner's share of the \$20 million purse until there is resolution of criminal charges in the United States against Servis. **BH**

TAPIT SIRES SIXTH BREEDERS' CUP CHAMPION

Gainesway's hallmark sire Tapit continued to build on his already sterling career at stud Nov. 6 at Keeneland when his son Essential Quality became his sixth Breeders' Cup World Championships winner after taking the TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile Presented by Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance (G1).

Among his World Championships winners, Tapit has been represented by three others in juvenile races and two earned Eclipse Awards for their connections.

Tapit got off to a fast start as a stallion with 2008 champion filly Stardom Bound in his first crop. Stardom Bound not only won the Bessemer Trust Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1), she also captured the Del Mar Debutante Stakes (G1) and Oak Leaf Stakes (G1). Tapit's son Hansen came along in 2011 to score an upset in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile by holding off heavily favored Union Rags to win by a head.

Now comes Essential Quality, a Godolphin homebred trained by Brad Cox, who previously proved himself in top-level competition by taking the Oct. 3 Claiborne Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland.

A 19-year-old son of Pulpit, Tapit has sired 138 black-type winners that include 86 graded/group winners. Of his stakes winners, 30 earned black-type at 2 and among these eight were grade 1 winners as juveniles.

His other elite performers at 2 include Laragh, another first-crop grade 1 winner that won the Hollywood Starlet Stakes (G1); Chasing Yesterday, a half sister to 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, who won the Starlet; Tell a Kelly, who won the Darley Debutante; and Sweet Loretta and Pretty City Dancer, who dead-heated in the 2016 Spinaway Stakes (G1).

Prior to the opening day of Breeders' Cup, Tapit ranked a close third on the North American general leading sires list with \$9,175,648 in progeny earnings for the year. Essential Quality's \$1.04 million share of

the \$2 million Juvenile purse will be enough to raise Tapit's progeny earnings in excess of \$10.2 million and push him past Ashford Stud's Uncle Mo for the runner-up spot behind Spendthrift Farm's Into Mischief.

Tapit is a fixture among the top sires and reigned as North America's leading sire for three consecutive years in 2014-16, while rewriting the record books each of those years for the most progeny earnings achieved by a stallion in a single season. In 2016, his runners amassed \$19,245,198 on the BloodHorse general leading sires list.

Darley's first-crop sire Nyquist likely sewed up leading freshman sire honors Nov. 6 when his daughter Vequist won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1). Nyquist, a son of Uncle Mo, was already at the top of the standings by progeny earnings with \$1,108,381. With Vequist's Breeders' Cup earnings, his total climbs to more than \$2.14 million, which can typically seal the deal.

Ashford's American Pharoah got a big boost toward the 2019 leading freshman sire title after his son Four Wheel Drive won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint (G2T), and Spendthrift Farm's Cross Traffic earned the freshman title after his daughter Jaywalk won the 2018 Juvenile Fillies. **BH**

VEQUIST STRIKES LATE IN BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE FILLIES

Trainer Butch Reid has noticed that Vequist doesn't mind racing inside, and that affinity proved useful Nov. 6 as she punched through in the stretch on her way to a two-length victory in the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) at Keeneland.

One start after chasing Dayoutoftheoffice around the track before settling for second to that rival in the Oct. 10 Frizette Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park, Gary Barber, Wachtel Stable, and breeder Swilcan Stable's Vequist turned the tables in the first try at two turns for both fillies. Reid said though they came up short at Belmont, he was looking forward to stretching out the daughter of Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) winner Nyquist to two turns.

"The way she finished in the Frizette, it absolutely gave me confidence," said Reid, who also won the 2011 Breeders' Cup Marathon (G2) with Afleet Again. "To be able to compete against horses of that level made me feel really good."

Under a perfectly timed move by jockey Joel Rosario, Vequist, who tracked from second or third throughout, took command near the 16th pole and drew off late. Dayoutoftheoffice just held second over Girl Daddy.

Darley Alcibiades Stakes (G1) winner Simply Ravishing, one of several fillies in the seven-horse field with early speed, bobbled at the start from her inside post while Dayoutoftheoffice quickly established a clear advantage under Junior Alvarado. Dayoutoftheoffice, a daughter of Into Mischief, maintained the advantage through a half-mile in :47.12 and six furlongs in 1:11.32 while Vequist tracked inside and 9-5 favorite Princess Noor stalked outside.

"She ran really hard. We're proud of her. No complaints," said Tim Hamm, the trainer of Dayoutoftheoffice. "We had a decent trip on the front end. Not a ton of pressure—no excuses. We talked about the race earlier, and we said if no one goes, I didn't mind seeing her on the lead. She has a lot of natural speed and does it fairly easy, so it didn't shock me."

Princess Noor, an undefeated grade 1 winner entered in her first start outside of Southern California, launched her move coming out of the far turn but steadied and faded to fifth. Vequist was able to sustain her move, which she launched in early stretch. Princess Noor's trainer, Bob Baffert, said the daughter of Not This Time didn't show her best.

"She was in a good spot, he had her in a perfect spot there, but she just didn't kick on," Baffert said. I'm pretty disappointed. She just came up empty. I had a lot of confidence in her, but the winner ran a big race. They were going pretty fast. She just didn't have it."

Rosario said racing inside can be a challenge for young horses, but Vequist proved tough enough.

"I tried to save ground. It was hard for her in the turn because I had a horse outside me. But she did great," said Rosario, who posted his 12th Breeders' Cup victory and second in the Juvenile Fillies. "I never gave up my position. As soon as I asked her, she went on with it. It was a very good performance."

Trainer Dale Romans liked Girl Daddy's effort.

"She ran super. I thought we had a chance turning for home. She ran a big race," Romans said. "She didn't have the cleanest trip, but I am happy with her. She got hung a little wide; it wasn't anyone's fault, it is just the way the race unfolded."

Vequist returned \$15.20, \$6.80, and \$4.40; Dayoutoftheoffice paid \$5.20 to place and \$3.60 to show; and Girl Daddy returned \$3.80 to show.

Barber, who joined Adam Wachtel to buy in after Vequist's runner-up debut at Parx Racing, said he talked it over with Wachtel and they decided that because Reid knew her best, it made sense to leave the filly with him. That decision paid immediate dividends as she won the Spinaway Stakes (G1) in her next start Sept. 6 at Saratoga Race Course.

"I was really, really adamant, and I'm glad that we keep her with Butch," Barber said. "Adam and I discussed that. He knows her better than anybody else."

Bred in Kentucky, Vequist is the first stakes winner among three starters—all winners—out of grade 2-placed Vero Amore, by Mineshaft. Reid, who also conditioned Vero Amore, appreciated that the new ownership group kept the talented filly with him.

"From the start, she's shown she has no limits," Reid said. "The first time I breezed her out of the gate back at Parx, we were just supposed to go an easy half a mile. When she went :48, 1:12, and 1:25, we had a pretty good idea that she can go click off 12-second eighths almost endlessly."

The victory will provide a lift to Nyquist, who entered the day atop the first-crop sires list but was in a close battle with Not This Time. **BH**

FIRE AT WILL UPSETS BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE TURF

A year after settling for second in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G2T) at Santa Anita Park with Chimney Rock, owner Three Diamonds Farm and trainer Mike Maker fared one better in the 2020 Breeders' Cup. The duo connected with Fire At Will, who upset 7-2 favorite Battleground and other international and domestic runners in the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Presented by Coolmore America (G1T) Nov. 6.



Although Fire At Will entered off two consecutive stakes victories, the off-the-grass With Anticipation Stakes at Saratoga Race Course, followed by the Pilgrim Stakes (G2T) at Belmont Park, bettors paid him scant respect. The 2-year-old son of Declaration of War was dismissed at 30-1 odds.

There was no overlooking him in the race itself. Once the gates opened, Fire At Will showed he belonged. He quickly secured a forward position under Ricardo Santana Jr., sitting an inside pocket trip in third as Outadore set the pace with fractions of :23.64, :48.12, and 1:12.60 in the mile race on good turf.

Angled a few paths off the rail for the stretch, Fire At Will asserted his superiority. He caught Outadore in midstretch and powered away by three lengths, covering the distance in 1:35.81, a tenth of a second slower than Aunt Pearl's clocking in the Breeders' Cup Juveniles Fillies Turf (G1T) about an hour later. He paid \$62.40.

"Last year we were unlucky to lose with Chimney Rock, and Fire At Will made us forget all about it," Maker said.



The colt gave his trainer his third Breeders' Cup victory following champion Hansen's frontrunning score in the 2011 Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) and Furthest Land's triumph in the 2009 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1).

Fire at Will is not a difficult horse to ride, Maker said, and Santana made it look easy.

"I got a beautiful trip. I had plenty of horse in the tank," said the jockey, who notched his second Breeders' Cup win after Mitole's score in the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) last year.

Battleground, bidding to give trainer Aidan O'Brien, jockey Ryan Moore, and his Coolmore-affiliated ownership their fifth Juvenile Turf victory, rallied to grab second, a neck ahead of Outadore. In traffic on the second turn, the runner-up found his best stride late, though not even he was as strong late as the winner.

Other participants had significant traffic issues. Several were steadied and jostled in the scramble to the first turn, perhaps none more so than Abarta, who was hampered so much that his jockey, Umberto Rispoli, lost his right stirrup. He recovered it as the field entered the backstretch, but the horse failed to mount a bid and ran 13th in the field of 14.

Fire At Will is led into the winner's circle

A \$97,000 yearling purchase by Three Diamonds Farm at the 2019 Keeneland September Yearling Sale from the Select Sales consignment, Fire at Will is the first foal from the unplaced Kitten's Joy mare Flirt. He was bred in Kentucky by Troy Rankin.

Although the colt is bred for turf—Declaration of War won the Juddmonte International Stakes (G1) overseas—Fire at Will does not seem limited to a turf career.

Kirk Wycoff, head of his family's Three Diamonds Farm, said Maker wanted to run Fire At Will in the TVG Juvenile Presented by Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance on Friday, though Wycoff's desire to run in the Juvenile Turf won out.

"We had that wrestling match about three weeks ago," said Wycoff, who won his first Breeders' Cup race. "But he's a lovely horse. He's good on both surfaces, as we saw at Saratoga."

Asked whether the colt could pursue next year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), neither Maker nor Wycoff committed to that pursuit. Wycoff said a race on dirt in the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (G2) at Churchill Downs had been floated as a possibility if the colt had not cracked the top three Friday.

Having won the race, he will instead get some well-earned rest in preparation for running as a 3-year-old, Maker said. **BH**

AUNT PEARL SHINES ON FRONT END OF JUVENILE FILLIES TURF

Aunt Pearl ran to a clear lead early in the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T) and had no problem keeping her 13 rivals behind her as she crossed the wire 2 1/2 lengths in front Nov. 6 at Keeneland.


The Brad Cox-trained filly is now 3-for-3 for owners Michael Dubb, Madaket Stables, Peter Deutsch, Michael Kisber, The Elkstone Group, and Bethlehem Stables. But unlike many of her luminous stablemates campaigned by the high-power ownership group, this daughter of Lope de Vega joined her connections' stable from Europe.

"We have been buying a decent amount of the horses, actually, unproven the last few years, Mike (Dubb) and I together," said Madaket's Sol Kumin. "Liz Crow, who bought (champions and Breeders' Cup winners) Monomoy Girl and British Idiom for us both, along with Brad Weisbord, had an idea of going to Europe and trying to do the same things.

"We put a group together, and Mike and I were sort of the first two that were part of it, and then we filled it in with some other members. They went over there and they did a lot of hard work, and this was one of the fillies that they bought in that group, so obviously a terrific job by the team scouting the horse out.

"From the beginning, we knew she was one of the better ones in the group. I think she obviously turned out to probably be the best one. Brad Cox has liked her from the beginning. Paul Sharp did a great job breaking her in Ocala, and we really are happy about where we are."

Cox's first Breeders' Cup win came with Monomoy Girl in the 2018 Longines Distaff (G1). Last year he won the Juvenile Fillies with British Idiom and the Filly & Mare Sprint (G1) with Covfefe. One race after Aunt Pearl on Friday, he took the TVG Juvenile Presented by Thoroughbred Aftercare (G1) with Essential Quality.

Dubb and Kumin credited Weisbord with his desire to grow the game for bringing in new partners on Aunt Pearl.

"Brad, he's a great ambassador for the game, and he's put together a stellar team with Liz Crow, and success speaks for itself," Dubb said. "People have reached out to him, and it's entirely possible Sol and I would have taken larger percentages of the horse, but for Brad's desire to get more people involved in the game. While we own a majority of the horse, there's two other partners in the horse that are good people, they have been around the game a long time, and I think for them it was their first Breeders' Cup win, so hats off to them."

The partners on the filly have also come together in another way off the track related to another Aunt Pearl.

"I have one thing with Aunt Pearl I'm very proud of. She's named after my Aunt Pearl, who is my grandfather's sister—crazy sister from Asbury Park," Dubb said. "And as what a small world it would be, one of our other partners, Stu Grant (of The Elkstone Group), knows Aunt Pearl's daughter from Delaware."

Aunt Pearl broke from post 5 under Florent Geroux as the 5-2 favorite and opened by three lengths at the beginning of the mile event. She ran a :22.55 quarter-mile before slowing down to a half in :47.30 and three-quarters in 1:12.21. Stonestreet Stable's Campanelle, whose victories include the Queen Mary Stakes (G2) and Darley Prix Morny (G1) in Europe, was back in second early. Miss Grillo Stakes (G2T) winner Plum Ali, who shares the winning connections of Dubb, Madaket, and Bethlehem, was still back in ninth at the quarter pole.

Undeterred by the field chasing her home, Aunt Pearl maintained her clear lead all the way to the wire. The final time on the good turf was 1:35.71.

"That was a devastating performance. She is an amazing filly. Very proud of her," Cox said. "Speed is her weapon and she knows how to use it. I was pretty confident (she would win) when I saw the :47, and (Geroux) obviously knows her well."

"I know she is extremely fast. I just tried to get away good. She was off to a flying start," Geroux said. "She went pretty quick early on, and after that I tried to get her to relax. On the backside she came back to me. When I asked her, she had plenty left. She's extremely talented. I think the sky is the limit for her. Over the winter, hopefully she'll grow a little bit and next year we can do it again."

Mother Earth, campaigned by Coolmore-associated connections, rallied from 12th to finish second at 22-1. She bested Doreen Tabor's third-place Miss Amulet by a neck. Campanelle was fourth, completing an Irish-bred superfecta. Plum Ali ran fifth.

Lope de Vega is also the sire of 2018 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf winner Newspaperofrecord. Bred by Ecurie Des Charmes & Ballylinch Stud, Aunt Pearl is out of the stakes-placed Hurricane Run mare Matauri Pearl.

She was purchased from Book 1 of the 2019 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale for \$358,767 from the Ballylinch Stud consignment by agent Liz Crow for BSW Euro Venture. The bay filly won on debut Sept. 1

at Churchill Downs, where she scored by five lengths at a mile. She then raced 1 1/16 miles in the JPMorgan Chase Jessamine Stakes (G2T) Oct. 7 at Keeneland, registering a 2 1/2-length score. All three efforts have come on the front end and led her to earnings of \$652,784.

"Liz is amazing. I don't understand her job, much like she probably doesn't understand mine, but she does it incredibly well and with little fanfare and very calm and very clear in her explanations to us, just a pleasure to work with," Dubb said.

"Hard-working, honest, and just clearly very good at what she does," Kumin said of Crow. "We just hope she can still buy the good ones for us, now that she's buying horses for lots of people now." **BH**

GOLDEN PAL TAKES BREEDERS' CUP JUVENILE TURF SPRINT


Randall Lowe took the long road, but he found redemption with his homebred Golden Pal in the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint (G2T) Nov. 6 at Keeneland, the first of the Breeders' Cup World Championships' 14 races.

The 4-5 favorite, Golden Pal is the first foal out of another Lowe homebred, Lady Shipman, who came up a neck short in the 2015 TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1T) at Keeneland to Mongolian Saturday.

Golden Pal delivered unequivocal redemption for his dam and for Lowe with a powerful frontrunning victory for trainer Wesley Ward, who won this race last year with Four Wheel Drive. The son of Ashford Stud's Uncle Mo finished three-quarters of a length ahead of a fast-closing Cowan, who was a length in front of longshot European challenger Ubettabelieveit. The final time for 5 1/2 furlongs on good turf was 1:02.82.

"Wesley has believed in this horse from day one," Lowe said from the winner's circle. "I've been telling everyone about this horse. It has been a long haul, but we did it."

Golden Pal shot out of the gate and gained an advantage by a couple of lengths down the backside when jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. took a hold of him and allowed those in close pursuit to catch him. The colt regrouped and rallied, quickly restoring a

comfortable lead by the time he reached the top of the stretch. Cowan and jockey Ricardo Santana Jr. continued battling furiously and were gaining with every stride at the end but couldn't catch the winner.

Golden Pal paid \$3.60, \$2.80, and \$2.60. Cowan paid \$8 and \$5.80, and Ubettabelieveit paid \$8.60. The \$2 exacta paid \$34.20, and a \$1 trifecta paid \$292.40.

"He's just amazing. I got a little worried on the backside. Irad kind of lost a little momentum there and took a pretty good hold of him, but then he just accelerated down the lane," Ward said. "When he accelerated past the quarter pole, I knew we were OK. I got a little worried on the last part and was hugging onto my son, but we got there. He's a champion colt. Thank God (Lowe) gave him to me to train. I really appreciate it. (Next year's Breeders' Cup) is where we're heading, but first we're going to Royal Ascot. Here we come."

Ortiz gave all the credit to Golden Pal for doing "the hard job."

"I just sat on him waiting for the time to go. He ran great. He really has a lot of potential," the rider said.

Cowan's trainer, Steve Asmussen, said he was disappointed to see the son of Kantharos finish another close second.

"Hopefully, one of these days it will be his turn. But he's obviously a very quality horse," Asmussen said. "I thought he'd win every day since the Indian Summer, and I'm disappointed he was second."

Jockey Rowan Scott, who was aboard Ubettabelieveit, the first Breeders' Cup starter for trainer Nigel Tinkler, said he thought his mount "ran a blinder."

"He was just a little bit slow here because his usual running style is coming from off the pace," Scott said. "He picked up well, but the first two were away and gone. I'm really happy with him."

Lady Shipman, a daughter of Midshipman, was an extraordinarily good racehorse with

11 black-type wins, including the Royal North Stakes (G3T). In 2015, she set track records at six furlongs at the Ocala Training Center in the OBS Sprint Stakes (1:08.80) and at 5 1/2 furlongs at Saratoga Race Course in the Smart N Fancy Stakes (1:00.46). She was retired with a 13-2-2 record from 21 starts and earned \$902,387.

Golden Pal is Lady Shipman's only foal to date. She was bred this year to Spendthrift Farm's first-year sire Omaha Beach.

Uncle Mo has now sired two Breeders' Cup winners, getting his first with Nyquist in the 2015 Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1). The sire is represented by four other starters during Breeders' Cup weekend. He was also represented in the Juvenile Turf Sprint by Lipizzaner, who was fourth by a nose. His daughter Girl Daddy finished third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1), and he has Harvest Moon in the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) and Yaupon in the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1). **BH**

A true route horse, Centennial Farms' Rocketry returned to winning ways in the \$200,000 Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance Stakes (G2) Nov. 6 at Keeneland.

It was the first time the 6-year-old son of Hard Spun crossed the wire first since his 2018 score in the same race, then the Marathon Stakes Presented by TAA (G2) run at Churchill Downs. That event was contested over 1 3/4 miles, and Friday's running was at 1 5/8 miles.

"We're going to enjoy this for a while," trainer Jimmy Jerkens said. "Centennial, they've been wonderful, loyal owners. We've had a bad year; for them to win this race was huge for both of us."

Last of 14 under Irad Ortiz Jr., Rocketry raced more than 12 length off the pace as Dack Janiel's led the way through an opening quarter in :24.40. Rocketry remained near the back of the pack through a half in :48.52 and was still far back as Plus Que Parfait took over through a mile in 1:13.59 and 1 3/8 miles in 1:38.54. Dack Janiel's battled back to regain the lead as the field turned for home while Mirinaque loomed large after moving up from fifth, but Rocketry came closing with a swift, sweeping move, reeled in his foes, and kicked away to a one-length score.

The final time was 2:42.57 on a track rated fast.

"We broke out of the gates, and he doesn't have too much speed, so I let him settle," Ortiz said. "He relaxed so well. By the five-eighths pole, he started picking it up on his own and he was moving really good. When I asked him going by the three-eighths pole, he responded really well. He likes this kind of race with the long distance, and he ran great. He was picking up a ton of ground in the stretch, so I knew I had a good shot to get there."

Rocketry paid \$25.20 to win at 11-1 odds.

Mirinaque was second and Dack Janiel's faded to third, one length back. The order of finish was completed by Danny California,

Muralist, Plus Que Parfait, Signalman, Tenfold, You're to Blame, Job Security, Farmington Road, Cupid's Claws, Militiaman, and Ry's the Guy.

Rocketry improved his record to 6-5-5 from 26 starts for Jerkens with earnings of \$789,710. The win turned around a frustrating two-year span, as he went 0-for-9 after his Marathon score. He came in off a poor third in the Sept. 18 Miner's Mark Stakes at Belmont Park, from which he emerged with health issues.

"He ran so bad last time," Jerkens said. "He came out of it with a real bad, out-of-whack blood count. I was scratching my head. It looked like he was training good into it, and he ran so flat. We freshened him up. Didn't train him quite as hard, just tried to put some flesh on him. It looked like it was a good lively race for this far, and that's what he needs."

"He was doing better overall than he was last time, and the horses came back to him last time. Which is what he needs. He sat way back off an honest pace. He needs to see them coming back to him, and that's what happened."

The bay runner was bred in Kentucky by Gainesway Thoroughbreds out of the winning Smart Strike mare Smart Farming, whose family includes Dream About, Lockout, and Sleepless Knight. **BH**

HIGHLY MOTIVATED SHAVES TRACK RECORD IN NYQUIST STAKES

Favorite Highly Motivated and 8-1 shot Joy's Rocket were the juveniles that prevailed in a pair of \$125,000 stakes going 6 1/2 furlongs that kicked off the Breeders' Cup World Championships Nov. 6 card at Keeneland.

Highly Motivated, a son of Into Mischief who left the gate in the Nyquist Stakes at 5-2, stalked a quick pace set by Dare to Dream Stable's highly regarded Quick Tempo, who led the field through brisk opening fractions of :21.73 and :44.65. The front end started to become more congested as they rounded out of the turn and into the top of the stretch where jockey Javier Castellano moved Highly Motivated toward the middle of the track. The favorite steadily erased the gap separating him from Quick Tempo and took command of the race with a furlong to go, then drew away to win by 4 1/4 lengths and shaved the track record by 1/100th of a second in 1:14.99. C Z Rocket, who will be competing in the Nov. 7 Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1), set the previous record of 1:15 back in July.

The winner paid \$7.20, \$3.80, and \$3. Quick Tempo hung in for second and paid \$5.80 and \$3.80. Roderick was third, paying \$6.40.

Seth Klarman's Klaravich Stable bred Highly Motivated out of the stakes winner Strong Incentive, which Klaravich also campaigned with trainer Chad Brown, who is the conditioner of Highly Motivated.

The colt was run through the 2018 Keeneland

November Breeding Stock Sale as a weanling because Klaravich was buying out a partner. Bloodstock agent Mike Ryan made the final bid of \$240,000. The colt made his debut Aug. 29 at Saratoga Race Course, where he finished second by a neck. He won his second start at Belmont Park going 6 1/2 furlongs in 1:17.82 and winning by 1 3/4 lengths.

Highly Motivated is the fourth black-type-winning 2-year-old for Spendthrift Farm's marquee sire Into Mischief this year and his 27th black-type winner among all starters for 2020.

The daughter of Anthony's Cross went right to the lead and never saw another horse. She got some pressure throughout from Farsighted, but shook free of that rival at the top of the stretch and drew away to win by three lengths. The final time was 1:16.18.

The winner paid \$19, \$8.40, and \$5.80. Farsighted held on for second and paid \$6.40 and \$4.20. Roc's Princess, a 70-1 longshot, rolled in for third and paid \$19. A \$1 exacta paid \$77.90, and the 50-cent trifecta paid \$1,276.85.

Joy's Rocket was one of three fillies in the field that had already been tested in a graded stakes. She came into the Songbird off a fourth-place finish in the Frizette Stakes (G1) at Belmont Park. The Songbird gave her a third win from five starts.

A few days of disappointment for co-owner Randy Hill and trainer George Weaver, caused when Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) prospect Vekoma needed to be scratched due to a fever, was met with elation during the undercard of the first of two Breeders' Cup days Nov. 6 at Keeneland.

Hill and Reeves Thoroughbred Racing's Ever Dangerous lit up the tote board at odds of 74-1 by winning the \$150,000 Bryan Station Stakes, setting off a jubilant celebration from Hill, who watched trackside. Mutuel backers of the 3-year-old son of Kitten's Joy had a right to feel almost as good—he paid \$150.60 for a \$2 win wager.

Hill, who races as R. A. Hill Stable, campaigned Vekoma with Gatsas Stables. Vekoma will stand at stud next year at Spendthrift Farm. "He'll be leaving for Spendthrift to start his new career tomorrow," Hill said.

Ever Dangerous lived up to his name in the Bryan Station, securing victory despite a tricky draw in post 14. Just getting into the starting gate required some luck. Originally an also-eligible, he needed two scratches to draw into the field.

Once the Bryan Station began, he made his own good fortune under Javier Castellano. He settled into a comfortable stalking position, advanced three wide on the second turn, and closed down the stretch to catch the speedy Fancy Liquor and win by a half-length.

"He trained like a stakes horse and he ran like a claiming horse," Hill said. "It seemed like in his last race, the light bulb finally came on. I thought if he improved, he could be right there. Javier rode a masterful ride."

Bye Bye Melvin ran third, followed by Pixelate in fourth. Reconvene and Ajourneytofreedom finished in a dead heat for fifth in the field of 14. Just a length separated first through fourth.

Taishan, Don Juan Kitten, No Word, Angelus Warrior, Spanish Kingdom, Enforceable, Mo Ready, and Fighting Seabee completed the order of finish.

A \$135,000 purchase by Reeves Thoroughbred Racing at the 2018 Keeneland September Yearling Sale from the Lane's End consignment, Ever Dangerous is the lone winner from two foals to race from the dual-winning Rahy mare The Rahy Angel. Bred in Kentucky by Knowles Bloodstock, he raced 1 1/8 miles on a good turf course in 1:48.74. **BH**

Early speed and an inside post proved a winning combination as Novogratz Racing Stables' Amy's Challenge cruised along on the lead and posted a 2 1/4-length victory in the \$150,000 McConnell Springs Stakes for fillies and mares Nov. 6 at Keeneland.

The grade 1-placed 5-year-old Artie Schiller mare broke from post 2 and covered the six furlongs in 1:09.17 in winning for the eighth time in 19 starts for trainer McLean Robertson while increasing her earnings to \$647,273.

The win was the second in seven 2020 starts for Amy's Challenge, who was an easy victor in a Delaware Park allowance optional claiming race Aug. 8.

Able to grab a clear lead early on the turn, she led by two lengths at the quarter pole after a half-mile in :44.80 and had little trouble holding off late bids in the stretch from Unique Factor and Wildwood's Beauty.

Pantofel Stable, Wachtel Stable, and Peter Deutsch's Unique Factor, a daughter of The Factor trained

by Peter Miller, was second by a head over William Stirtz's Wildwood's Beauty, a Kantharos filly trained by Scott Becker.

Sent off as the 5-2 favorite, the daughter of the Jump Start mare Jump Up bred by Sienna Farm paid \$7.80 to win.

Amy's Challenge was a \$20,000 purchase by Novogratz from Paramount Sales' consignment to the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling sale in 2016. Her dam produced a Kitten's Joy filly this year. **BH**

IMPROBABLE LEADS BAFFERT TRIO IN BREEDERS' CUP CLASSIC

Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert plans to send out the past two horses to reach the finish line first in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) in this year's Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1), but it's a third starter, Improbable, who could be favored as he enters off three consecutive grade 1 wins.

With six of the top eight horses in the National Thoroughbred Racing Association Top Thoroughbred Poll entered in this year's \$6 million Classic, the lineup for the 1 1/4-mile test Nov. 7 at Keeneland is considered an especially loaded deck. And Baffert, looking for his fourth Classic score since 2014 and second at Keeneland, holds three of the aces.

Carrying the most momentum of the trio will be WinStar Farm, China Horse Club, and SF Racing's Improbable, who ended a three-race skid in June by winning the Hollywood Gold Cup Stakes (G1) and followed with scores on both coasts in the Whitney (G1) and Awesome Again (G1) stakes. It seems ancient history when Improbable, who won a grade 1 at age 2 and was sent off the favorite in last year's Kentucky Derby, didn't quite live up to expectations in 2019—winning just one of seven starts.

All that has changed as he's earned Equibase Speed Figures of 120 in his two most recent starts—the highest figures earned this season by any horse racing on dirt. Baffert said the City Zip colt, who was bred in Kentucky by St. George Farm and G. Watts Humphrey Jr., has put it all together at age 4.

"He always showed a lot of talent as a 3-year-old, but he wasn't really mentally mature, wasn't physically mature," Baffert said. "We always refer to him as a little Justify because he's a beautiful mover and he has athleticism—the way he covers or goes over the ground and his mechanics."

While Improbable finished fourth in last year's Derby, Baffert also will send out the horse who reached the wire first in that 1 1/4-mile classic in Maximum Security, who is campaigned by his breeders, Gary and Mary West, as well as the Coolmore-affiliated owners of Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, and Derrick Smith.

Maximum Security already has one of the strangest careers in racing history, rising from his debut in a maiden claiming race to win grade 1 races and a divisional championship at 3. But he also is the first horse in history to be disqualified from victory in the Derby because of interference. Of more concern, his initial trainer, Jason Servis, was indicted on federal charges related to doping.

The 4-year-old son of the Wests' 2013 Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) winner New Year's Day was moved to Baffert's barn after his Feb. 29 victory in the world's richest race, the Saudi Cup. The \$20 million purse is being held up as Saudi officials observe developments in the federal case against Servis.

Baffert's three Classic wins have all come with 3-year-olds. He won in 2015 at Keeneland with Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, and he'll send out this year's Derby winner, Authentic, for owners Spendthrift Farm, MyRaceHorse Stable, Madaket Stables, and Starlight Racing.

Authentic isn't the only 2020 Triple Crown race winner entered in the Classic. Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) winner Tiz the Law will look for his fourth grade 1 win of the season. The son of leading second-crop sire Constitution also won this year's Curlin Florida Derby (G1) and Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1).

Jack Knowlton, the managing partner for owner Sackatoga Stable, loves that trainer Barclay Tagg has

shipped to Keeneland early to prepare for the Classic.

"I'm in communication with Barclay if not every day, every other day, and he is just glowing in his description of how he's doing," Knowlton said. "For Barclay to take off out of New York for three weeks to be down there with him at Keeneland ... it's a huge commitment, unprecedented in the 20-plus years I've been with him.

"I think he feels that this is an opportunity that he can't let pass by."

While Tiz the Law has made Keeneland his home, Kentucky-based Tom's d'Etat and By My Standards look capable of scoring for the home team. Al Stall Jr., who knows something about knocking off a big horse

as trainer of 2010 Classic winner Blame, has patiently handled 7-year-old Tom's d'Etat for owner G M B Racing throughout his career, and the son of Smart Strike rewarded him with four straight stakes wins to close 2019 and begin 2020. He'll enter the Classic off a 14-week break following his third-place finish in the Whitney.

Allied Racing Stable's By My Standards also has proven to be a top 4-year-old after showing promise at 3. Trained by Bret Calhoun, the son of two-time Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) winner Goldencents has won three grade 2 stakes this year.

And then there is Juddmonte Farms' homebred Tacitus, who has placed in six grade 1 races but has never won at the highest level. He'll get another try for Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott, a two-time winner of the Classic. Rounding out the field are Woodward Handicap (G1) winner Global Campaign, grade 1 winner Higher Power, and grade 2-placed Title Ready. **BH**



BC CLASSIC NEXT STOP ON MAXIMUM SECURITY'S WILD JOURNEY

In a world where seemingly everything is recorded, all of Maximum Security's races are out there—including his ultra-competitive 2019 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) where he holds off every challenger and powers to the wire 1 3/4 lengths ahead of his closest rival.

Also readily available for viewing is Maximum Security's courageous victory in the most lucrative race ever contested: this year's Saudi Cup where he most assuredly proved on the money—changing lanes in early stretch to surge past Mucho Gusto and then hold off a late charge from Midnight Bisou.

In what is usually a simple sport that celebrates the first horse to the wire, those videos would usually tell the story: raw athleticism, focused determination, a champion. But in the case of Maximum Security there seemingly is always more to the story. Events that would follow the two aforementioned efforts have made his racing career one of the strangest in history.

While he reached the wire first in the Derby, the stewards then reviewed the race when objections were lodged. After looking at events, specifically an incident near the 5/16th pole where Maximum Security came

out several paths, the stewards reached a decision some 22 minutes after the race: Maximum Security was disqualified and placed 17th—the first horse in history to be taken down for interference from an apparent Derby victory.

An ensuing request by owners Gary and Mary West to appeal the stewards' decision to the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission was denied. That denial was contested in a Kentucky federal court, where it was tossed. That court decision was appealed, but in late August of this year the U.S. Court of Appeals sided with the lower court's decision not to hear the case.

The evening of the Derby, moments after a Churchill Downs official took back the roses that had been given to his wife Mary, Gary West attempted to describe an event that no other owner had ever been put through.

"We've been in this game for 40 years. In 2002 we had Buddha; I think he was the second choice on the morning line for the Kentucky Derby, and the horse came up lame and didn't even get to run," West said. "So we've had some big wins and some big losses, but this is the biggest. You can't have a bigger loss than this in horse racing."

While finishing first in the Derby only to have it taken away would sting the connections of any horse, DQs are part of the sport. The next headlines Maximum Security would be involved in were of more concern.

Five days after sending Maximum Security out to victory in the Saudi Cup, his trainer, Jason Servis, was among 27 trainers, veterinarians, and others indicted on federal charges related to doping horses. That indictment specifically alleges that a designer, performance-enhancing substance was administered to Maximum Security in 2019.

The indictment of Servis, which has not yet been resolved in court, saw the Jockey Club of Saudi Arabia decide to hold the race's first-place purse, \$10 million, until the court case against Servis was resolved.

During the 2018-20 timeframe of the indictment's accusations against Servis, the trainer doesn't have a single failed post-race drug test—a fact that could be in the trainer's favor or could suggest shortcomings in a current system highly reliant on post-race tests that may be missing designer drugs.



from a maiden-claiming debut win to racing's heights, but he graciously declined—preferring to wait until his standout's racing career ends for any summations.

The next stop for Maximum Security, in one of the oddest racing careers in history, will be the \$6 million Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) where he'll be among the favorites. Performance on the track has never been a problem for the son of 2013 Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) winner New Year's Day.

West did offer that Maximum Security, now trained by Bob Baffert, will be facing another high hurdle in this year's Classic as he faces stablemates Improbable, who has won three straight grade 1 races; and 2020 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) winner Authentic; as well as Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) victor Tiz the Law; among others.

"This is one of the deepest Breeders' Cup Classics in many years and if one of four horses wins this race, I think they should win Horse of the Year," West said.

Baffert recalls being impressed by Maximum Security's competitiveness after watching the champion 3-year-old of 2019 race for the first time out of his barn in the July 25 San Diego Handicap (G2) at Del Mar. In his first race in nearly five months, Maximum Security led early, dropped back to stalk, then took back sharply coming out of the first turn.

Maximum Security surged again in the backstretch, making up ground. Turning for home he drifted out before finally getting down to business, dueling with Midcourt through the stretch to prevail by a nose.

"The first time I ran him at Del Mar, he was in position then stopped. He came back around but turning for home, he had every reason to get beat," Baffert said. "And for some reason I'm watching him thinking, 'If you're a great horse, you're going to get up.' And he did. Great horses—they find a way to win."

The 2019 Derby win—that wasn't followed an unlikely rise to the top. Maximum Security debuted in a \$16,000 maiden claiming race Dec. 20, 2018 at Gulfstream Park, went right to the lead, and drew off for a 9 3/4-length win. He followed with two victories in starter condition races before making his stakes debut in the Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1), which he led every step to score by 3 1/2 lengths.

Before the Derby, Servis said he initially didn't see much in the mornings from Maximum Security. Baffert said to this day Maximum Security rarely looks like a champion before noon.

"He can be very deceiving," Baffert said. "In that way he reminds me of Silver Charm. Silver Charm was very tough but whether I worked him with a stakes horse or a \$30,000 maiden-claiming horse, he was only going to outwork either one by a nose. That's just who he was—he's not going to give you anything extra in the mornings. And I can see why they ran this horse in a maiden \$16. But one thing about it, he has another quality that Silver Charm has that you can't measure, and that's heart. He has heart galore."

Maximum Security missed the final two legs of the Triple Crown but closed out his 3-year-old season with victories in the TVG.com Haskell Invitational Stakes, Bold Ruler Handicap (G3), and Cigar Mile Handicap (G1).

Before his 4-year-old debut in the Saudi Cup, owners associated with Coolmore Stud would buy in. After the indictment of Servis, Maximum Security would be transferred to Baffert.

He won his debut for his new trainer in the San Diego, and followed with a three-length win in the TVG Pacific Classic Stakes (G1). He'll enter Saturday's test off a runner-up finish to stablemate Improbable in the Awesome Again Stakes (G1).

Baffert said it was important to gain an understanding of Maximum Security when the standout was first moved to his barn.

"When you get a horse like that, especially as he was trained a little bit differently than I train, I got to know him. I really got to know him probably the last few months—what he likes, what he doesn't like," Baffert said. "He's a big, strong, heavy horse but he's got a tremendous heart and lung capacity. He doesn't ever come back blowing. ... He can be empty and still keep finding more."

So Maximum Security will try 1 1/4 miles for the third time Saturday. His previous two efforts at the distance? He won this year's Pacific Classic—and he reached the wire first in last year's Kentucky Derby. **BH**

MONOMOY GIRL, SWISS SKYDIVER FACE OFF IN BC DISTAFF

The apparent top older dirt mare in the country meets the nation's leading 3-year-old filly in the \$2 million Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) at Keeneland Nov. 7. Put simply, it is a Monomoy Girl vs. Swiss Skydiver showdown.

Monomoy Girl, the champion 3-year-old dirt filly of 2018 and the winner of the Distaff and Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) that year, looks to clinch her second championship with a victory in the Distaff, while Swiss Skydiver aims for her first divisional honor. Having beaten the boys in the Preakness Stakes (G1), following in the footsteps of 2009 Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra, she appears on her way.

Though they are far from the only high-class fillies and mares in the 1 1/8-mile race—Ce Ce, Dunbar Road, Horologist, Harvest Moon, Ollie's Candy, and Valiance are just some of those opposing them—it is not difficult to envision a stretch run between Monomoy Girl and Swiss Skydiver.

"It would be a really good matchup from the standpoint of being a fan, and I am a fan of racing. I think it would be a tremendous matchup, and I'm looking forward to it," said Monomoy Girl's trainer, Brad Cox.

They might not meet again after the Distaff. Five-year-old Monomoy Girl is entered in The November Sale, Fasig-Tipton's breeding stock sale, which takes

place the day after the race. If her owners—Michael Dubb, Sol Kumin's Monomoy Stables, The Elkstone Group, and Bethlehem Stables—go through with the sale and don't buy her back, a purchaser could retire her from racing and breed her.

"I think a lot is going to hinge on what happens Breeders' Cup Day," Cox said.

Regular jockey Florent Geroux returns aboard Monomoy Girl, who captured the La Troienne Stakes Presented by Oak Grove Racing and Gaming (G1) Sept. 4 at Churchill Downs in her most recent start.

The daughter of Tapizar is 12-for-14 over her career and 3-for-3 in 2020. In her only start at Keeneland, she

won the Central Bank Ashland Stakes (G1) by 5 1/2 lengths in April 2018, giving Cox his first grade 1.

The trainer has added 14 top-level wins since, including three Breeders' Cup victories with three champions. Besides Monomoy Girl's victory in the 2018 Distaff, he won the 2019 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1) with Covfefe and the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies with British Idiom. Cox is 3-for-12 in the Breeders' Cup.

In an era when many horses are lightly raced, Peter Callahan's Swiss Skydiver is a throwback. She has started nine times this year, each at a different racetrack, winning graded stakes in Florida, California, Arkansas, New York, and Maryland. Besides her win in the Preakness, other achievements for the Daredevil filly include a victory in the Alabama Stakes (G1) and runner-up finishes in the Oaks and Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2).

"Here we are going on race 10, and she just seems to love what she does," trainer Kenny McPeck said. "So it's a really special filly to be around."

With multiple Breeders' Cup starters this year, led by Swiss Skydiver and Juvenile Fillies (G1) contender Simply Ravishing, McPeck has a good chance to pick up his first victory in the World Championships. He is 0-for-31 in the Breeders' Cup, an unlucky streak during which more than half of his starters (16) hit the board.

Jockey Robby Albarado is back in the irons on Swiss Skydiver. The veteran jockey decisively urged Swiss

Skydiver forward to pass Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) winner Authentic late on the backstretch in the Preakness, and she eked out a neck victory in a stretch duel.

"He had every opportunity to get by her, and he couldn't. She wouldn't let him, wouldn't let him get by," Albarado said.

Weeks after the race, Albarado still savors the victory, as he suspects others do.

"She not only thrilled us, but she thrilled the whole country at a time when I think horse racing kind of needed it," he said.

Beyond the two favorites, double-digit odds are likely for many of the Distaff competitors, even those who come into the race in career-best form.

Harvest Moon, a 3-year-old Uncle Mo filly, has

won four in a row, including two consecutive graded events, capped by the Sept. 27 Zenyatta Stakes (G2) at Santa Anita Park; Valiance and Ollie's Candy ran 1-2 in the Oct. 4 Juddmonte Spinster Stakes (G1) on the Keeneland main track; and Horologist has won two of three graded starts since joining the barn of Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott.

Horologist, who has recorded Beyer Speed Figures of 100 or more in her two recent victories, was supplemented for \$100,000 to become Breeders' Cup-eligible. **BH**

STRONG EUROPEAN CONTINGENT LINES UP FOR BC TURF

Despite the challenges of international shipping in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, a strong European contingent will take aim at the \$4 million Longines Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T) Nov. 7 at Keeneland.

Aidan O'Brien will saddle seven-time group 1 winner Magical and Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris (G1) winner Mogul, while John Gosden sends over Prince of Wales's Stakes (G1) winner Lord North and the group 2-winning, group 1-placed Mehdaayih. Tarnawa, winner of the Prix de l'Opera Longines (G1) and Qatar Prix Vermeille (G1) for Dermot Weld, and Donjah, a group 1 winner in Germany, complete the international cast.

Magical, a three-time group 1 winner this year, was third last out in the Oct. 17 QIPCO Champion Stakes (G1) at Ascot Racecourse.

"We've been delighted with her, obviously, this year," O'Brien said. "She ran very well (in the Champion Stakes) and ground was very heavy at Ascot. She seems to have come out of the race very well.

"She's done very well over the winter from 4 to 5 physically, and when she started racing, it was obvious that she had improved again."

Mogul was one of the contenders O'Brien was forced to scratch from the Oct. 4 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1) due to feed contamination, and the trainer believes the 3-year-old Galileo colt should relish the trip to America.

"He's in good form as well," O'Brien said. "He's a big horse, a powerful horse that takes his races very well and is always very happy to race. ... He loves nice ground, and a flat track suits him."

Gosden blames unforgiving ground for Lord North's 10th-place finish in the Champion Stakes last out. The 4-year-old son of Dubawi


was third in the Juddmonte International Stakes (G1) the start before.

"His last race unfortunately was run on a quagmire, which wasn't a lot of help to him," he said. "We'd have record rain here in October. ... You were running in the deepest ground I've ever seen, and it was that drying out ground, which becomes very sticky, very gluey. ... Prior to that, he ran a lovely race. We're looking forward to running him here."

Mehdaayih is lightly raced this season after suffering a back injury; she has made just two starts in 2020 and was fourth in her most recent start, the Oct. 17 QIPCO British Champions Fillies & Mares Stakes (G1). The 4-year-old Frankel filly will take on males in the 1 1/2-mile Turf after failing to make the main body of the field for the Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1T).

"She's a little bit of a wild card if you like, but she has plenty of ability," Gosden said. "And she comes to the race remarkably fresh with only two races in the whole year."

Channel Maker leads the U.S. contenders off a win in the Oct. 3 Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Stakes (G1T) at Belmont Park. United also comes in off a win, having taken the Sept. 26 John Henry Turf Championship Stakes (G2T) at Santa Anita Park. Arklow won the Sept. 12 Calumet Farm Kentucky Turf Cup Stakes (G3T) in his most recent start, while Red King took the Aug. 22 Del Mar Handicap Presented by The Japan Racing Association (G2T) last out. **BH**

TRIP THE KEY IN BREEDERS' CUP FILLY & MARE TURF

Turf racing is all about the trip, and with a full field of 14 expected for the \$2 million Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1T) Nov. 7, a clear lane in the stretch will be paramount to success. The distance of the Filly & Mare Turf varies to location, and at Keeneland the distance is 1 3/16 miles with a good run down the stretch before the first bend.

Alex Campbell Jr.'s homebred Mean Mary figures to be on the front end. The 4-year-old Scat Daddy filly won three stakes in a row while on the engine this year and carried the field to the wire of the Diana Stakes (G1T) at Saratoga Race Course, yielding by a neck to uber-talented Rushing Fall.

E Five Racing Thoroughbreds' Rushing Fall is perfect in three starts this year and is 11-2-0 in 14 career starts, including a score in the 2017 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T) at Del Mar.

Experience on the Keeneland course is a handy tool, and the 5-year-old More Than Ready mare is a Keeneland specialist, having won five of six starts on the local course. Her latest was a three-quarter-length victory July 11 in the Coolmore Jenny Wiley Stakes (G1T) at 1 1/16 miles.

Peter Brant's Sistercharlie won the Filly & Mare Turf at Churchill Downs in 2018 and was third last

year at Santa Anita Park. She's only made two starts this year—both at Saratoga—for trainer Chad Brown and might be making her final start this go-around and must be considered a strong player.

Another strong player is Allen Stable homebred Civil Union (War Front—Photograph, by Unbridled's Song), the winner of the Oct. 10 Flower Bowl Stakes (G1T) at Belmont Park. The 5-year-old has only made eight starts, but one was at Keeneland in October 2018.

"She came out of the Flower Bowl really well, and she had a good work on the turf here (Oct. 25)," said trainer Shug McGaughey from New York. "I'm in pretty good shape. The trip is important in grass racing. I have a top rider in Joel (Rosario), and I'll leave it in his hands and take it from there."

"Except for Mean Mary, we've pretty much beat everybody who will be in it, so I'm pretty confident we fit with them. I don't really know about the Europeans—I'm not sure they are as good as they have been, but they're always strong."

McGaughey ran another Allen-homebred daughter of War Front, and a Flower Bowl winner, in the 2017 Filly & Mare Turf. War Flag was sixth.

European invaders have won three of the past four, including last year with Iridessa. The big names from overseas this year feature classic winner Peaceful. **BH**

UNI, CIRCUS MAXIMUS RETURN IN BREEDERS' CUP MILE



This year's renewal of the \$2 million Breeders' Cup FanDuel Mile Presented by PDJF (G1T) has managed to lure back two of last year's runners, as defending winner Uni once again faces off against a preponderance of male competitors in the Nov. 7 Keeneland test.

The other is Circus Maximus, who will have to jump through all the hoops that come with transatlantic travel in the age of COVID-19 to try his luck at a North American grade 1 win for only the second time in his career. The bay finished fourth in last year's renewal of the TVG Breeders' Cup Mile, less than three lengths behind the winner.

Slated as one of the most talented turf runners in Europe, 4-year-old Circus Maximus found himself back in the spotlight early during his 2020 campaign when he scored the third group 1 of his career in the June 16 Queen Anne Stakes at Royal Ascot for trainer Aidan O'Brien. Owned by Flaxman Holdings, Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, and Derrick Smith, the son of Galileo next went to Glorious Goodwood where he finished second in the Qatar Sussex Stakes (G1).

Shipped next to France, he put in a pair of third-place finishes in the Prix du Haras de Fresney-Le-Buffard Jacques Le Marois (G1) at Deauville and the Prix du Moulin de Longchamp (G1) at ParisLongchamp.

"He's been in good form," said O'Brien. "He likes a nice racing surface, he likes an even pace, he likes a flat track, and he loves to get into a battle at the end. So we think and hope that all those things might suit him. We think he's in good form. He's a tough, hardy, consistent miler that gets a mile away. So we think and hope that the conditions might suit him there."

Bred in Ireland by Flaxman Stables Ireland, Circus Maximus earned his first group 1 during his sophomore season in 2019, scoring in the St. James's Palace Stakes at Royal Ascot. In a season reminiscent of his 2020 campaign, the colt went on to place second in the Sussex Stakes that year before jumping up next out to win the Prix du Moulin.

With COVID-19 still raging around the world and with many countries locking down their borders for the second time this year, O'Brien said there was some obvious trepidation about sending runners from his Irish stable to the United States for the World Championships.

"We have been and all over the world, and I think we're the same here in Ireland as well, in most countries in England, France, and Europe ...

it's the same. Obviously we're delayed," said O'Brien. "Obviously everybody has to be careful and very respectful of each other's space and have their own space, the most important thing so that everybody stays healthy. We just felt it's important for the industry and racing and everybody in the business to buy and sell and breed and train, and doing everything."

Hoping to keep her crown firmly atop her head on Saturday is Michael Dubb, Head of Plains Partners, Robert LaPenta, and Bethlehem Stables' Uni, who will be making only her fourth start of the year in the Mile. Trained by Chad Brown, the 6-year-old More Than Ready mare opened her year with a third in the June 27 Just a Game Stakes (G1T) at Belmont Park.

Facing off against mostly males next out in the Aug. 22 Fourstardave Handicap (G1T) at Saratoga Race Course, Uni finished an uncharacteristic seventh—her lowest placing in a career spanning 21 starts. After a month off, the mare bounced back to take home her

first win of the season Oct. 3 at Keeneland when she took the First Lady Stakes Presented by UK Healthcare (G1T) by one length over Beau Recall.

Brad Cox will send out Factor This, who will also be hoping to take home his first top-level win. The son of The Factor has had only two missteps in seven starts this season—a second-place finish in the Sept. 5 Old Forester Bourbon Turf Classic (G1T) at Churchill, beaten less than a length, and a third in the Colonel E. R. Bradley Stakes Jan. 18 at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots. Owned by Gaining Ground Racing, the 5-year-old will enter the mile of a 2 3/4-length victory in the Dinner Party Stakes (G2T) Oct. 3 at Pimlico Race Course.

No doubt one of the more interesting competitors to watch on Saturday will be Qatar Racing's Kameko. The U.S.-bred son of Kitten's Joy has carved out a niche for himself in the world of British grass racing. He posted group 1 wins in the Vertem Futurity Trophy (G1), run on Newcastle's all-weather surface last year after Doncaster's turf became soaked, at 2 and the June 6 QIPCO Two Thousand Guineas (G1) at 3. Trained by Andrew Balding, Kameko last raced Sept. 25 at Newmarket when he won the Shadwell Joel Stakes (G2).

The Mile will be the first start outside of Europe for Kameko, who was purchased for \$90,000 by David Redvers from the consignment of Paramount Sales to the 2018 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. **BH**

EXPERIENCE MEETS YOUNG TALENT IN BREEDERS' CUP SPRINT

When the Breeders' Cup first visited Keeneland five years ago it was sophomore Runhappy who lit up the World Championships with a hair-on-fire stretch run in the Sprint (G1). For this year's \$2 million Sprint, will it be the 3-year-old Yaupon who streaks to the line, or will it be one of the many older horses with more expertise? There are plenty who fit that profile.

It only seems as if Whitmore faced Runhappy in 2015, but he was only 2 at the time. The venerable gelding will be making his fourth start in the six-furlong Sprint. Always game, the son of Pleasantly Perfect was third in last year's Sprint behind champion Mitole and Shancelot. Trainer Ron Moquett has the old boy as sharp as he can be based on a snappy :46 4/5 half-mile Oct. 25 at Churchill Downs.

Experience also plays into the hands of Firenze Fire, who makes his 30th career start in the Sprint. Fifth a year ago, he was a 2 3/4-length winner of Belmont Park's Vosburgh Invitational Stakes (G2) Sept. 26 while under the care of Kelly Breen, who took over the horse's training earlier this year.

"He was a nice horse when I got him and he's continued to be a nice horse," said Breen. "He looks like a nice horse, trains like a nice horse, and he runs like a nice horse."

"You don't get into the Breeders' Cup without having a quality horse. Anybody can win it and I'm glad to have an opportunity."

Diamond Oops showed he's just as good on dirt as turf last time out, taking Keeneland's Stoll Keenon Ogden Phoenix Stakes (G2), the route also taken by Runhappy. A non-factor in last year's Big Ass Fans Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1), he appears razor sharp for this.

But a pair of 3-year-olds may trump experience. Yaupon has dazzled in his four starts and the dark bay Uncle Mo colt was impressive Oct. 1 at Pimlico Race Course, waltzing to a four-length score in the Chick Lang Stakes (G3).

His speed may be matched the 3-year-old filly Frank's Rockette, a 7 1/4-length winner of the Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2) Oct. 3 at Belmont Park. By leading sire Into Mischief, she's a homebred for Frank Fletcher Racing Operations and has won three successive graded sprint stakes in New York.

She'll be facing C Z Rocket, who was raced by Fletcher before being claimed in late April. The 6-year-old City Zip gelding has climbed the ladder in Southern California with trainer Peter Miller, winning the Santa Anita Sprint Championship Stakes (G2) in late September. Miller has won the Sprint twice with Roy H in 2017-18, as well as the Turf Sprint (G1T) from 2017-19. **BH**

GAMINE, SERENGETI EMPRESS TANGLE IN FILLY & MARE SPRINT

The speedy fillies Gamine and Serengeti Empress highlight a talented cast in the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1) Nov. 7 at Keeneland, with the 3-year-old Gamine cutting back to one turn at which she has won by open lengths and the 4-year-old Serengeti Empress making her swan song.

Michael Lund Peterson's Gamine will return to seven furlongs after finishing third in the nine-furlong Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1). The Into Mischief filly trained by Bob Baffert previously won the seven-furlong Longines Test Stakes (G1) by seven lengths and dazzled in the one-mile Longines Acorn Stakes (G1) with an 18 3/4-length romp. Both races were won in stakes-record time. Gamine has been on the front end in all five career starts.

"One turn is her game right now, but as she develops later on we'll get the two turns," Baffert said.

While Joel Politi's Serengeti Empress made all in the 2019 Oaks, she will be making her third consecutive start at seven furlongs Saturday. The Alternation daughter wired the Ballerina Handicap (G1)—her first one-turn start in a year—before just getting beat a nose in the Derby City Distaff Stakes Presented by Derby City Gaming (G1).

Trainer Tom Amoss admitted it will be difficult to see his stable star leave his barn for her broodmare career.

"She keeps that first stall right next to the office no matter where we travel," he said. "I'm around her quite a bit. As a matter of fact I'm at the barn right now looking right out at her. As a trainer your thoughts are don't get too attached to them, but that's a rule that's made to be broken. Certainly I broke the rule here. I'm going to miss her a great deal. She'll always be the one."

"I used to say I found her at the sale, she wasn't anybody's top horse, she was about half of what the sale average was that day. But really I think we found each other. From my point of view she put me on the map. I had a reputation as a very good trainer, somebody who was good with claiming-type horses, and to develop her, I think that showed that we could take a horse from scratch."

Lothenbach Stables' Bell's the One will try to chase Serengeti Empress down again after notching her first grade 1 in the Derby City Distaff. The 4-year-old Majesticperfection filly won over this course and distance in the 2019 Lexus Raven Run Stakes (G2). Central Bank Ashland (G1) winner Speech and this fall's Raven Run winner Venetian Harbor also have won on the track. The latter also likes to race on the front end.

The Filly & Mare Sprint will be the final start for 2019 Ballerina winner Come Dancing, who was fourth in this year's event behind Serengeti Empress and last out won the Honorable Miss Handicap (G2). Graded stakes winners Sconsin and Sally's Curlin complete the field. **BH**

ART COLLECTOR, WAR OF WILL FACE DEEP BC DIRT MILE

A highly competitive slate of graded stakes winners will contest the \$1 million Big Ass Fans Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) Nov. 7 at Keeneland, led by top sophomore Art Collector and last year's Preakness Stakes (G1) winner War of Will.

Art Collector was considered one of the top contenders heading into the Sept. 5 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) off a win the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2) at Keeneland. His Derby dream faded, however, when he cut the bulb of his left front foot during a gallop and had to be scratched four days before the classic.

Trainer Tom Drury Jr. and owner/breeder Bruce Lunsford aimed for the Oct. 3 Preakness Stakes (G1), which came eight weeks after the colt last raced Aug. 9 in the Runhappy Ellis Park Derby. The disrupted schedule likely contributed to Art Collector's flat performance at Pimlico Race Course, where he was fourth beaten 10 lengths.

"(The Preakness) was a weird effort," said jockey Brian Hernandez Jr., who has ridden Art Collector in all but three of his races. "We'll have to throw it out and move forward. We feel we are back on schedule and back where he needs to be."

Drury has gradually re-honed the son of Bernardini's edge, which yielded a sharp four-furlong work in a bullet :47 at Churchill Downs Oct. 22.

"His gallop-out was huge. He galloped out all

the way to the three-quarter pole and was well within himself," said Hernandez, who was aboard for the work. "My brother Colby was on another one. He said, 'I've never seen a horse throw dirt up that high.' That shows you how well he worked."

Gary Barber's War of Will is coming into the Breeders' Cup World Championships off a good third in the Ricoh Woodbine Mile Stakes (G1T). Prior to the Woodbine Mile, he won the Maker's Mark Mile Stakes (G1T) at Keeneland back in July. This month the versatile son of War Front, who has won grade 1s on dirt and turf, produced two brilliant five-furlong

works Oct. 17 and Oct. 23 at Churchill Downs, both in :59 4/5, that convinced trainer Mark Casse that the

Dirt Mile was a better spot than the FanDuel Breeders' Cup Mile Presented by PDJF (G1T). In his final tune-up at Churchill Oct. 31, the colt worked four furlongs in :48 1/5 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:00 2/5.

"He's been working so well on the dirt, we want to give it another try and the turf Mile is coming up extremely tough," Casse said. "Actually, there are no easy spots this year. It's a heckuva Breeders' Cup."

Another factor in choosing the Dirt Mile is the anticipated condition of Keeneland's turf course, which Casse said is always softer in the fall than in springtime—or in this year's case, the track's summer meet.

"It is also the reason I don't have Got Stormy going a mile," Casse said of the 5-year-old daughter of Get Stormy, who has won two grade 1s on the grass and was second in the 2019 Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita Park. "I dropped her back to sprinting with the Breeders' Cup in mind."

Got Stormy has been entered in the 5 1/2-furlong Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1T).

The 2-1 favorite in the Dirt Mile is Klaravich Stables' Complexity, a 4-year-old son of Maclean's Music, who has won all of his three starts at a mile and comes into the Dirt Mile off a 2 1/4-length win in the one-mile Kelso Handicap (G2) at Belmont Park. Complexity was a grade 1 winner at 2 and was second in this year's Forego Stakes Presented by America's Best Racing (G1). **BH**

IMPRIMIS LOOKS TO CROSS WIRE FIRST AGAIN IN TURF SPRINT

When trainer Joe Orseno appraises Imprimis' chances in the Nov. 7 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1T) at Keeneland, he believes the 6-year-old Broken Vow gelding has done everything perfectly in his abbreviated two-race 2020 campaign.

He cannot say the same about the stewards at Saratoga Race Course.

While Breeze Easy's Imprimis crossed the finish line first in both of those starts, it was what happened after the Aug. 8 Troy Stakes (G3T) at the Spa that still irks Orseno.

Running for the first time since finishing sixth in last year's Turf Sprint, Imprimis rallied from third and finished first by a decisive 2 1/4 lengths. But during that stretch run, according to the Equibase chart, he came in while rushing past his rivals and forced Shekky Shebaz to steady.

While American Sailor, who was unaffected, finished second in the 5 1/2-furlong stakes, Shekky Shebaz was a head behind in third and the stewards

ruled that Imprimis cost him a placing. They dropped him from first to third.

"He's done everything we've asked him to do. I know he was taken down that day, but you can't take the race away from him or what he got out of the race. We accomplished what we needed," said Orseno, who became Imprimis' trainer when Breeze Easy bought him in 2018 from owner-breeder Craig Wheeler and trainer Tim Hills after his second start. "We were disappointed but we were ecstatic, too. We didn't let that ruin our day. It was a good ending, except for the three stewards. Some people who saw it thought it was the worst takedown they ever saw."

After the Troy, Imprimis won the six-furlong Runhappy Turf Sprint Stakes (G3T) at Kentucky Downs by a neck to secure a Breeders' Cup Challenge berth in the upcoming \$1 million Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. As a result, after his gelding endured a nine-month layoff caused by two surgeries to remedy breathing issues, Orseno, a two-time Breeders' Cup winner, is brimming with confidence that Imprimis is set for a peak effort.

"Both feet are on the ground but we're excited. I wouldn't trade places with anyone. I'm getting him there in top form, in perfect shape, just the way I want him," Orseno said about the winner of eight of 15 starts. "He's at his best and will bring his 'A' game. It's just a matter of will it be good enough."

A full field of 14 will clash in the 5 1/2-furlong Turf Sprint, with some of the top threats including a trio of distaff entrants: the multiple grade 1 winner Got Stormy, Oleksandra, who will be making her first start since winning the June 20 Jaipur Stakes (G1T) and suffering a fractured splint, and Glass Slippers, a multiple group 1 winner shipping in from Europe.

Also entered are Leinster, a winner of two grade 2 turf sprint stakes at Keeneland this year, and Front Run the Fed and Bombard, who finished in a dead-heat for second behind Imprimis in Kentucky Downs' Turf Sprint. **BH**

LOPE DE VEGA ON THE MARK AGAIN AT BREEDERS' CUP

Ballylinch Stud's star stallion Lope de Vega supplied his 12th elite winner Nov. 6 when Aunt Pearl landed the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T) at Keeneland.

The Brad Cox-trained filly became the second daughter of Lope de Vega to land the grade 1 prize, following Newspaperofrecord's victory in 2018.

Newspaperofrecord became something of a poster girl for U.S. buyers' raids on Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale, and that is where Bradley Weisbord and Liz Crow secured Aunt Pearl at a cost of 280,000 guineas (US\$358,767) in 2019.

The filly was already among Lope de Vega's 125 stakes performers, a list containing 42 group/graded winners and 35 listed scorers, having run out a ready winner of the JPMorgan Chase Jessamine Stakes (G2T) this season.

Aunt Pearl becomes Lope de Vega's second group/grade 1-winning juvenile this year after Lucky Vega struck in the Keeneland Phoenix Stakes (G1) for Jessica Harrington and owner Zhang Yuesheng.

The son of Shamardal stood the 2020 breeding season at a career-high fee of €100,000. He is not without a chance of notching a Breeders' Cup double, with son Lope Y Fernandez set to contest the FanDuel Breeders' Cup Mile Presented by PDJF (G1T) on Saturday.

Aunt Pearl was bred in partnership by Ballylinch and Ecurie Des Charmes, who purchased the dam, Matauri Pearl, through Meridian International for €400,000 (\$435,400) at the Arqana Breeding Stock Sale in 2015.

The listed stakes-placed daughter of Hurricane Run, who was named champion 3-year-old filly in Scandinavia in 2012, has since produced a filly by Sea The Stars who was bought by Daniel Cole for €450,000 (\$527,445) at last month's Arqana October Yearling Sale and delivered a Lope de Vega brother to Aunt Pearl April 30.

In turn, Matauri Pearl is a sister to Wekeela, who has twice fetched seven figures when offered at public auction.

She brought €1.1 million (\$1,233,540) from Oceanic Bloodstock on behalf of Martin Schwartz when offered at the Arqana Arc Sale in 2015 before David Redvers

gave 1,800,000 guineas (\$2,547,342) for her at Tattersalls two years later.

Wekeela has produced colts by Dubawi and Roaring Lion in the past two foaling seasons and was among Kingman's 2020 book of mares.

KAMEKO IN 'SUPER CONDITION' FOR BREEDERS' CUP SWAN SONG

Kameko is seeking to end this muddling season as he started it, with a blazing performance over a mile at one of the world's most prestigious meetings in the Nov. 7 FanDuel Breeders' Cup Mile Presented by the Permanently Disabled Jockey Fund (G1) at Keeneland.

The 3-year-old kicked off the year in spectacular fashion when winning the delayed QIPCO Two Thousand Guineas (G1) in a record time, but was unable to strike in his next three races when he finished a non-staying fourth in the Investec Derby (G1), fourth in the Sussex Stakes (G1), and then a further fourth in the Juddmonte International (G1) at York.

If some gloss had started to come off the dual group 1 winner throughout the summer, he showed that there was still plenty left under the bonnet when defeating older horses in the Shadwell Joel Stakes (G2) back at Newmarket in September.

Soft going at Ascot prevented the Qatar Racing-owned colt from finishing his season in Britain, with Kentucky chosen instead as the destination for his final run before he is retired to stud.

Kameko appeared to handle the track well in a light breeze on Thursday in front of trainer Andrew Balding and Qatar Racing's David Redvers, who said: "He looks amazing and the ground holds no fears. What we will need is luck in running from stall two but if all the stars align then I'd like to think he'll have every chance of running very well."

Jockey Oisin Murphy agreed that the passage Kameko gets through the race will be crucial, and said: "His work and preparation has been very good leading into the race. He seemed to wing around that bend when we didn't press too many buttons, it was just a light blow.

"He's in super condition and I just hope he gets a good trip around, so it's all down to me now. All the hard work's been done and hopefully he can show how good he is."

He added: "A Breeders' Cup win would be massive for me personally but also for the horse as it's his last race. I think he has the quality to do it."

Kameko works Oct. 5 ahead of the Breeders' Cup at Keeneland

The Breeders' Cup Mile has so far eluded Aidan O'Brien and the trainer saddles three contenders this year in the shape of Circus Maximus, Lope Y Fernandez, and Order of Australia, a late replacement for One Master after she was ruled out on Thursday.

O'Brien said: "Circus Maximus has a good draw (in stall one). He's hardy and very tough. There is plenty of pace in the race and that will suit him.

"Lope Y Fernandez has a nice draw too (in stall three). This guy has plenty of speed, but probably just about gets a mile. He quickens well and I'm looking forward to seeing how he gets on because it's the sort of scenario which might be set up for him to run well.

"Order of Australia works and looks like a miler. He works very well and it will be interesting to see how he gets on over this trip."

Ground rather than trip would appear to be the main concern for Safe Voyage, with the majority of his best form coming with cut in the ground. Nevertheless, trainer John Quinn expects a typically tough showing from the 7-year-old.

"He seems to have really settled in now and is happy in himself," Quinn said. "I'm really looking forward to it. He's got a heart of a lion so I'm sure he'll give it his all as he always does."

The European challenge for the race is completed by Siskin, with the Tattersalls Irish Two Thousand Guineas (G1) winner set to retire to stud in Japan following his Keeneland run.
