

SARATOGA DERBY BIG MOVER IN NEW GRADED STAKES LISTINGS

In its first year of eligibility to receive a grade, the Saratoga Derby Invitational Stakes (G1T) will make a splash as a top-level race in 2021.

The Saratoga Derby at Saratoga Race Course is the lone race to be upgraded to grade 1 status in the listing of graded and listed stakes races for 2021 in the United States unveiled Dec. 18 by the American Graded Stakes Committee of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association.

The Saratoga Derby was added to the New York Racing Association schedule in 2019 as the middle leg of the racing association's "Turf Trinity" for 3-yearolds racing on the grass. It typically will be bookended by a pair of races at Belmont Park: the Belmont Derby Invitational Stakes (G1T) and the Jockey Club Derby.

In 2020 the Jockey Club Derby, also launched in 2019, was not contested and the Belmont Derby was moved to October. Assuming the Jockey Club Derby is returned to the schedule in 2021, it would be eligible for a grade in 2022 as races need to be run at least two years before being considered.

The Saratoga Derby's sister race, the Saratoga Oaks Invitational Stakes (G3T), also received a grade

for 2021 although at grade 3 it didn't fare as well as the Saratoga Derby. The Saratoga Oaks also was launched in 2019 as NYRA unveiled its "Turf Tiara" for sophomore fillies on the grass.

Like the turf series for 3-yearold males, the Turf Tiara also saw changes in 2020 for the typical schedule of the Belmont Oaks Invitational (G1T), Saratoga Oaks, and Jockey Club Oaks. Mirroring the changes to the male turf series, the Jockey Club Oaks was dropped in 2020 and the Saratoga Oaks was run first, followed by the Belmont Oaks. It's hoped the series will return to its regular schedule in 2021, which would make the Jockey Club Oaks eligible for a grade in 2022.

In releasing its grades for 2022, the committee noted that it took care to consider any pandemicrelated circumstances that might have affected races in 2020—positively or negatively. With that in mind, there were not too many dramatic changes announced by the AGSC.

The committee reviewed 849 U.S. stakes races that offer a purse of at least \$75,000 and assigned graded status to 445 of them, three fewer than were graded in 2020, and listed status to 193 races. Three graded races were upgraded. Besides the new grade 1 Saratoga Derby, four new grade 3 races were named and 12 new listed races were upgraded from nonlisted black-type status. Fifteen races that carried graded or listed status in 2020 are no longer eligible for grading.

No races were downgraded from grade I to grade 2 for 2021.

(In the listed changes that follow, all races are stakes unless noted as a handicap.)

Three races were upgraded to grade 2 status for 2021: the Red Smith at Aqueduct Racetrack and Franklin-Simpson and Kentucky Turf Cup at Kentucky Downs.

Three races were downgraded from grade 2 to grade 3 in 2021: the Knickerbocker at Belmont Park and Palos Verdes and Las Virgenes at Santa Anita Park.

Four races were upgraded to grade 3 status for 2021: the Gulfstream Park Turf Sprint at Gulfstream Park; Tourist Mile at Kentucky Downs; and the Caress and Saratoga Oaks Invitational at Saratoga.

Five races were downgraded from grade 3 to listed status for 2021: the Discovery at Aqueduct; Palm Beach and Rampart at Gulfstream Park; Red Bank at Monmouth Park; and Senator Ken Maddy at Santa Anita Park.

Twelve races were upgraded to listed status for 2021: the CTT and TOC at Del Mar; Kentucky Downs Preview Ladies Turf and Kentucky Downs Preview Tourist Mile at Ellis Park; Pago Hop and Tom Benson Memorial at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots; Dueling Grounds Oaks at Kentucky Downs; Oaklawn Mile and Oaklawn at Oaklawn Park; Desert Code at Santa Anita Park; Mahony at Saratoga; Suncoast at Tampa Bay Downs; and Kentucky Cup Classic at Turfway Park.

Five races were downgraded from listed to nonlisted black-type status for 2021: the Correction at Aqueduct; Delta Mile at Delta Downs; Azalea at Gulfstream Park; Dixie Belle at Oaklawn Park; and John Battaglia Memorial at Turfway Park.

The Arlington Classic, Arlington Matron, and Stars and Stripes at Arlington International Race Course; the C.E.R.F. S., Daisycutter Handicap, Osunitas, and Wickerr at Del Mar; Skip Away at Gulfstream Park; Maxxam Gold Cup at Sam Houston Race Park; Lone Star Park Handicap at Lone Star Park; Iowa Distaff and Saylorville at Prairie Meadows; and Adoration, Black Pearl, and Midnight Lute at Santa Anita Park were not eligible for grading in 2021. By now it is clear that certain industries come under higher levels of scrutiny when it comes to testing for COVID-19, and individual health departments have different standards of tolerance for incidence of infection before shutting things down. The backstretch at Golden Gate Fields, located across a county line from the frontside, was identified with an outbreak of coronavirus positives in November, most of them asymptomatic. Aggressive measures were taken to remove and isolate more than two-thirds of the workforce testing both positive and negative, leaving in place a skeleton crew defined as essential to care for the horses. (Trainers were deemed non-essential, which is the subject for another day.)

To suggest track management failed in some

A Trophy for the Old Pro

Not long after the holidays, Eclipse Awards will be unwrapped and passed around to a festively remote gathering of the usual suspects, hosted by Spendthrift Farm. Despite pandemic snags in travel and scheduling, most of the champions will boast records of which history will approve. Those betting against the favorites will be disappointed—everyone likes an upset—but very rarely are their gasps of stunned surprise.

So, despite the best efforts of Brad Cox in winning four Breeders' Cup races, Steve Asmussen accomplished the improbable by displacing Chad Brown atop the trainers' money list, while winning more than 400 races to lead the other table, and that will result in his third Eclipse trophy. Asmussen remains only one of four trainers in the last 100 years to win both titles in the same season, which he also did in 2008 and 2009 on the coattails of Curlin and Rachel Alexandra. The others who doubled up were Sam Hildreth, Jack Van Berg, and Wayne Lukas.

In what looks like a toss-up category, the Eclipse Award winning male sprinter of 2020 will have won exactly one grade 1 sprint during the season. Vekoma, Volatile, and Win Win Win took grade 1 sprints for all comers. No Parole and Echo Town took down grade 1 sprints for 3-year-olds. Collusion Illusion, also 3, defeated his elders in the Bing Crosby (G1), while C Z Rocket and Firenze Fire each bagged a pair of well-established grade 2 events. Vekoma added the Metropolitan Handicap (G1) to his earlier score in the 7-furlong Carter Handicap (G1).

Then there was 7-year-old Whitmore, the Nolan Ryan of starting sprinters, still bringing the heat at an age when most hardcore speedballs would be dropped for a tag or pasture playthings. His grade 1 victory was the one that counted most when he defeated C Z Rocket, Firenze Fire, Echo Town, and Collusion Illusion at the Breeders' Cup. Add his Count Fleet Sprint Handicap (G3) and his second to Volatile in the Alfred G. Vanderbilt Handicap (G1), and the choice of Whitmore as a popular and worthy champion should be apparent, except that elections aren't that simple anymore.

Thankfully No Drama from the All-Powerful Committee

An early gift was carefully unwrapped Dec. 18. You never know if the annual pronouncement from the American Graded Stakes Committee will be a lump of coal or a juicy Valencia orange. (They did the same thing this time last year for 2020 and look what happened.)

The gathering of racing secretaries used to be called the North American Graded Stakes Committee until Canada decided it was grown-up enough to evaluate the quality of its own marquee races. The audacity. That gave the AGSC less work, which is always a good thing for this bunch, whose annual rite of inexplicable fussing with the rating of stakes races based on shaky statistical logic incites no end of second-guessing and hair-pulling.

This time around there was a lot of editing in the lower ranks. The obligatory New York race was elevated to grade 1 status (extra credit: name the last three winners of the Saratoga Derby). California suffered its annual degradings of familiar old stakes, but the Santa Anita Handicap (G1), badly marginalized in recent years by competing mega-events, somehow survived. Guess it helps to be a true legacy race.

A Shout from the Rooftops for the SAFE Act

Somehow, with the blessing of Kentucky Sen. Mitch McConnell, the Horse Racing Integrity Act sailed through the upper house of Congress without so much as a "hang on, what about states' rights" from his side of the aisle.

Now it would be in the best interests of the sport if the various interests in the Thoroughbred industry could put the same energy behind the Safeguard American Food Exports Act. The SAFE Act—which would ban the sale and transport of horses for slaughter—has been on the table since 2013, bottled up primarily by a combination of congressional inertia, opposing Quarter Horse interests, and an inconsistent message of nominal support from the Thoroughbred world.

The recent call by the Stronach Group to increase scrutiny of Thoroughbred sales to South Korea was sparked by a PETA report on the slaughter of racehorses in that horse meat-friendly country. How friendly? This was in a report in the Korea Observer from 2015:

"The horse meat industry can become a potential blue ocean, which might be able to revive the domestic rural economy," a spokesman for Korea Racing Authority said. "The most important thing at this moment is to increase the supply of horse meat."

The heightened awareness helps, but South Korea should not be singled out. Canada is a major exporter of horses for slaughter to South Korea, and Canada will import about 10,000 slaughter-bound horses from the United States each year until the SAFE Act is passed. BH

GULFSTREAM READY FOR LASIX-FREE STAKES RACING IN 2021

1/st Racing, a division of The Stronach Group, officially announced Dec. 18 that stakes races run next year at the TSG-owned Gulfstream Park will be conducted without Lasix.

The move to medication-free stakes racing reflects the Lasix-reduction commitment made last year by TSG and other members of the Thoroughbred Safety Coalition.

The medication-free format for stakes races includes the Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes (G1) and the Pegasus World Cup Turf Invitational (G1T) Jan. 23, as well as the Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) and Florida Derby (G1) later in the winter and spring. The two Pegasus races were conducted Lasixfree last year.

Lasix, the brand name for furosemide also

known as Salix, is a diuretic used in horses to control exercise—induced pulmonary hemorrhage, or respiratory bleeding. It is criticized for its alleged performance-enhancing properties and for its pervasive use, even among unestablished bleeders. It is banned from racing in many other parts of the world.

After both Pegasus races were run in January without Lasix, in which 22 horses competed. An informal BloodHorse survey found that at least three had minimal internal bleeding.

Other 2021 stakes races across the country that are part of the Road to the Kentucky Derby series also will be staged without Lasix.

In 2020 the administration of race-day Lasix was also banned for 2-year-olds racing at TSG tracks, a practice adopted by many other tracks that are a part of the Thoroughbred Safety Coalition, which is working to expand that prohibition to stakes races in 2021. BH

CHARGES FOR WORKERS' COMPENSATION INCREASE IN CALIFORNIA

A reduction in live racing in California together with statewide increases in workers' compensation costs have created a funding shortfall for the horse industry's workers compensation program covering jockeys and backstretch workers that is operated by Post Time Self Insurance Group, according to Thoroughbred Owners of California.

Golden Gate Fields suspended racing in November due to a COVID-19 outbreak, largely among its backstretch workers.

As a result, Post Time has found it necessary to increase the amounts to be paid by both owners and trainers, which fund the majority of program costs via per-stall charges from trainers and race per-start fees from owners, by approximately 10%. The owners' perstart fee will be raised from \$149 to \$162 effective Jan. 1. The per-start fee will continue to be automatically deducted from the owner's paymaster account every time they start a horse.

To offset increased workers' compensation per-start increases and provide additional financial support to California owners, TOC authorized an increase in the guaranteed participation purses earlier this year from \$351 to \$500 per start in Southern California and from \$300 to \$450 in Northern California.

Guaranteed participation purses are paid to owners

of horses competing in all races in which their horses do not finish first through fifth. They are designed to help owners cover core costs involved in getting their horses to the races—such as the mandatory veterinary exam fee required by the CHRB. Horses finishing sixth and further back (and to fifth place finishers when their share of purse money is less than the corresponding guaranteed participation purse) are paid \$500 to start in Southern California and \$450 to start Northern California. BH

A leading firstcrop, second-crop, and third-crop sire in the Mid-Atlantic region, Redeemed has sired 43 winners and has progeny earnings exceeding \$3.5 million. He will stand for \$2,000 as property of Teo Mallet.

On the track, Redeemed hit the board in 12 of his 13 starts with eight wins and \$832,140 in earnings. VEQUIST TARGETING DAVONA DALE TO START 2021 CAMPAIGN

A Florida path to the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) is in the works for Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) winner Vequist.

Trainer Butch Reid said Dec. 18 that Vequist is likely to get two preps leading up to the goal of the Kentucky Oaks, starting with the Feb. 27 Davona Dale Stakes, a \$200,000, one-turn mile for 3-year-old fillies at Gulfstream Park.

Reid is then targeting the \$250,000 Gulfstream Park Oaks (G2) March 27 as a 1 1/16-mile final Kentucky Oaks prep for the Nyquist filly.

"There could be variables, but the general idea is the Davona Dale, then the Gulfstream Oaks, and Kentucky Oaks," Reid said. "I want a two-turn race for her before the Kentucky Oaks so the Gulfstream Park Oaks should line up well."

A year ago, Jaywalk, winner of the Juvenile Fillies and champion 2-year-old filly of 2018, started her 3-year-old season in the 2019 Davona Dale and was

fourth. Jaywalk, like Vequist, was based at Parx Racing.

Vequist, owned by Gary Barber, Wachtel Stable, and Swilcan Stables, is currently galloping at Eisaman Equine near Ocala and is expected to join Reid's stable at Palm Meadows Training Center around the end of the month.

"She got a nice six weeks off," he said of the filly bred by Swilcan, who also won the Spinaway Stakes (G1). "She put on some weight and looks fantastic." BH

SMITH AND PETRUCHIO TAKE ON RED FLAG IN LOS AL FUTURITY

The six horses entered in the \$200,000 Los Alamitos Futurity (G2) Dec. 19 are all competing for the first time since the meet at Del Mar, as is one jockey: Hall of Famer Mike Smith.

Sidelined since Nov. 29 at Del Mar after testing positive for COVID-19 shortly before the start of the Los Alamitos Race Course meet that began this month, Smith plans to return Saturday. He tested negative Dec. 15, he said, clearing the way for a resumption of riding. He experienced mild symptoms of COVID-19 during his time away, primarily losing his sense of smell.

Smith, 55, is named aboard Petruchio in the Los Alamitos Futurity, in which the 2-year-old will be among the secondary betting choices behind likely favorite Red Flag, the winner of the Bob Hope Stakes (G3) at Del Mar.

Although many in the field are inexperienced at a route, Petruchio is proven around two turns. He broke his maiden in his fourth start when racing in a mile turf race Oct. 31 at Del Mar, stalking the pace and pulling away by 1 3/4 lengths under Smith.

Earlier efforts for Hall of Fame trainer Richard Mandella resulted in a runner-up finish in a mile grass race Oct. 4 at Santa Anita Park and a pair of thirds in main-track sprints at Del Mar over the summer for owners Perry and Ramona Bass.

"From what I hear about him, they thought a lot about him early on, but he was a bit of a renegade. He was ornery. They had to geld him, I believe," Smith said. "After doing so, he put all his ducks in a row and ran a bang-up race. That was pretty impressive. He won within himself and has come back and worked really well on the dirt."

A homebred, Petruchio has a dirt pedigree, being by Into Mischief—who won the 2007 Futurity on synthetic for Mandella—and out of the Distorted Humor mare Satirical. The dam's lone victory in seven starts came in a 5 1/2-furlong dirt race for Mandella in 2014. Satirical—out of Rockcide, a half sister to Funny Cide—

is a half sister to grade 2-winning dirt horse Rule and a full sister to grade 3-winning dirt horse Matrooh.

"The surface isn't going to be really that much of a worry for me," Smith said. "We've just got to be good enough to outrun 'em, that's all."

Red Flag has yet to race beyond seven furlongs, the distance of the Bob Hope, though he showed no signs of slowing over that distance. He romped by 7 1/4 lengths under Victor Espinoza.

The son of Tamarkuz comes off a sparkling fivefurlong workout at Santa Anita Park Dec. 13 in which he left his workmate, 11-race maiden Bristol Bayou, far behind.

Owned by Jerry and Tina Moss and trained by John Shirreffs, Red Flag was supplemented to the race for \$7,500. He has won two of three starts and made \$94,100.

Also in the field are Weston, Positivity, The Great One, and Spielberg, who bids to give trainer Bob Baffert his seventh consecutive victory in the Futurity. The race provides points on a 10-4-2-1 basis to the top four finishers as part of the Road to the Kentucky Derby series. **BH**

FIRENZE FIRE CLOSES 2020 IN MR. PROSPECTOR

When you think back on the Thoroughbreds who were among the foal crop of 2015, there was one grand superstar in Triple Crown champ Justify and a host of other talented runners.

Good Magic, Audible, McKinzie, Catholic Boy, Vino Rosso, Monomoy Girl, Midnight Bisou, Rushing Fall, and Firenze Fire are also among the grade 1 winners born that year, most of whom share a common denominator.

From the 10 aforementioned 5-year-olds, only two are still in training.

One is Monomoy Girl, who figures to be the champion older female of 2020, earning her a second Eclipse Award.

The other is a horse who possesses the kind of durability and consistency that is hard to find in any year.

In Mr. Amore Stable's Firenze Fire, trainer Kelly Breen and owner Ron Lombardi have a horse who has won 12 of his 30 starts and will close 2020 by running in the \$100,000 Mr. Prospector Stakes (G3) Dec. 19 at Gulfstream Park. The seven-furlong race will serve as a springboard into a 6-year-old campaign that Lombardi hopes will culminate with a fifth consecutive start in the Breeders' Cup.

"He's one of the few left in his crop," Lombardi said about the \$2.2 million earner. "He's sound. He's one of the best horses in his division, and I enjoy running

him. I had interest from Kentucky, Florida, New York, Maryland, Japan about breeding him, but I decided to run him one more year. It's such a thrill for me to watch him run. He'll hopefully run throughout the year, and who knows—maybe he'll get his fifth trip to the Breeders' Cup. That would be amazing."

Firenze Fire, the winner of the 2017 Champagne Stakes (G1), was scratched out of the Dec. 5 Cigar Mile Handicap (G1) at Aqueduct Racetrack due to a wet track, putting in motion Breen and Lombardi's Plan B for the Florida-bred that includes running in the Mr. Prospector, followed by two more Florida starts, including a Sunshine Millions stakes, before returning to New York for the April 3 Carter Handicap (G1).

The Mr. Prospector will be the first start for the homebred son of Poseidon's Warrior since he finished a troubled third in the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1), 3 1/2 lengths behind the victorious Whitmore.

"He didn't have the best of trips in the Breeders' Cup," Lombardi said about Firenze Fire's best finish from four starts at the World Championships. "He was moving right behind Whitmore, and as soon as Whitmore got through, the hole closed. If he got through, who knows what would have happened, Even with the trouble, he was right there at the end."

The bulky field of 12 also includes 2019 Mr. Prospector winner Diamond Oops, a Lookin At Lucky gelding who was sixth in the Sprint; multiple grade 1 winner Mind Control, a 4-year-old son of Stay Thirsty; and seven-furlong specialist Majestic Dunhill, a 5-year-old Majesticperfection gelding who captured the Bold Ruler Handicap (G3) two starts back. BH

COURT RETURN MAKES U.S. DEBUT IN VIA BORGHESE

T van Dalos' stakes-winning homebred filly Court Return, beaten a neck in the E. P. Taylor (G1T) last time out at Woodbine, will race south of the border for the first time in her career, facing eight rivals in the Dec. 19, \$100,000 Via Borghese Stakes at Gulfstream Park.

Trained by Canadian Hall of Famer Josie Carroll, Court Return is a younger half sister to multiple grade 1 turf winners Channel Maker and Johnny Bear, both Sovereign Award winners in Canada. The 4-year-old filly has run exclusively at Woodbine, with 10 of her 12 lifetime starts coming on the grass.

The daughter of Court Vision became a stakes winner in her second start of 2020, rallying for a 1 1/4-length triumph in the Aug. 22 Eternal Search Stakes.

Carroll stepped Court Return up to graded company off her stakes victory, and she finished third in the 1 1/8-mile Canadian (G2T) Sept. 12 after getting away slowly. Stretched out to 1 1/4 miles for the E. P. Taylor, Court Return was again tardy from the gate but came with a strong rally only to fall just short of winner Etoile.

"I felt really good going into the race. That was

certainly her best performance yet," Carroll said. "I think the rider did a good job of not letting her get out of touch too much with the field, which is a danger with her. Sometimes they let her get too far back. You really sort of have to nudge her to stay in touch with the field, so that when she does make her run she is in a position to get there."

Two-time Championship Meet leading jockey Luis Saez will get that assignment Saturday from Post 3.

Christophe Clement won the inaugural Via Borghese with Paige in 2016, and the trainer has Stone Farm homebred Traipsing for this year's edition. The 4-year-old daughter of Stroll comes back three weeks off a runner-up finish to stablemate Mutamakina after setting the pace in the Nov. 28 Long Island Stakes (G3) at Aqueduct Racetrack.

"It's back a little bit quick, but she arrived at Payson Park well and she looks well. I think she's a nice mare," Clement said. "Because it is a little bit quick we'll monitor her during the week and as long as she's doing well we plan on running."

Robby Albarado is named to ride from Post 2. Gulfstream's 16-time training champion Todd Pletcher entered the pair of Always Shopping and Cap de Creus. Gainesway Stable's Cap de Creus is winless with four seconds in seven career tries at Gulfstream, and ran fourth in this year's Orchid Stakes Presented by Rood and Riddle (G3T). The 4-year-old Tapit filly was fifth last out in the Zagora Stakes Oct. 31 at Belmont Park.

Repole Stable's grade 2 winner Always Shopping most recently ran second by a head in the 1 1/2-mile Rood and Riddle Dowager (G3) Oct. 18 at Keeneland.

Rounding out the field are 2020 Ginger Punch Stakes winner Kelsey's Cross, third to Always Shopping in the Monroe; Great Island, winner of two straight making her stakes debut; Gun Society, second to Court Return in the Eternal Sunshine Stakes; Cambeliza and Lady Panda. BH

UNBEATEN MAXFIELD RETURNS IN TENACIOUS AT FAIR GROUNDS

The \$75,000 Tenacious Stakes at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots Dec. 19 marks the continuation in the story of Maxfield, now in part three.

The twice-sidelined Street Sense colt, who missed a start in the TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) at Santa Anita Park at age 2 due to injury and a possible tilt in this year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) following another physical setback, returns to action in the 1 1/16-mile Tenacious against six rivals. The race will be his first start since he won the May 23 Matt Winn Stakes (G3) at Churchill Downs, a win that pushed his record to 3-for-3.

The following month at Keeneland, where he was preparing for the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2), he exited a workout with discomfort, and a condylar fracture to his right front leg was diagnosed.

As unlucky as he has been—a bone chip in his right front ankle was removed last fall after the Breeders' Cup expectations remain high for the colt owned and bred by Godolphin. His skill has been on display in his victories, highlighted by a 5 1/2-length score in the Claiborne Breeders' Futurity (G1) last year at 2, and trainer Brendan Walsh believes he is training as well as ever. "We've got a lot to look forward to. It would have been disappointing to have his career ended prematurely. ...because I don't think we've seen anywhere near the best of him yet," he said. "Hopefully, we'll get a clean bill of health this year, get a constant run of races into him. It could be pretty exciting to see what he could do."

Maxfield resumed breezing Nov. 25, roughly seven weeks after the COVID-19-postponed Derby, and he has proceeded to record a regular set of works, which have increased in speed in recent weeks. He worked a half-mile from the gate in :47 1/5 Dec. 6 at Fair Grounds, followed by another local move at the same distance in :48 4/5 Dec. 13.

"He's working really, really well. He's ready to go," Walsh said.

Florent Geroux picks up the mount, replacing Jose Ortiz, who bases in Florida during the winter months.

The opposition is headed by Sonneman, Captivating Moon, and Locally Owned. Captivating Moon is also entered in the Buddy Diliberto Memorial Stakes at Fair Grounds on Saturday going 1 1/16 miles on turf.

The Tenacious and Buddy Diliberto are among six stakes at the New Orleans oval, all worth \$75,000. The Tenacious goes as the last race on a 13-race program at 6:50 p.m. ET. BH

FOUR WHEEL DRIVE TO TAKE SPIN AT TURFWAY PARK

Four Wheel Drive, unraced since his first defeat in a May 17 allowance race at Churchill Downs, gets back in gear in a \$40,000 allowance optional claimer at Turfway Park the evening of Dec. 19.

Winner of all three of his earlier starts last year at age 2, including the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint (G2T) at Santa Anita Park, the 3-year-old American Pharoah colt races for the first time on a synthetic surface Dec. 19. He is the 5-2 morning-line favorite under Gerardo Corrales, breaking from post 2 in the seventh race against nine older rivals, all of whom are more experienced.

Wesley Ward, who trains Four Wheel Drive for Sam Ross and Mike Hall of Breeze Easy, believes his colt is training far better than in the spring, during which time Ward described his breezes as lackluster.

He then ran that way in his lone appearance this year at Churchill, finishing seventh after compromised by a slow start. He finished more than 10 lengths behind Chimney Rock, whom he had beaten in the Breeders' Cup.

"There was nothing physically wrong with the horse. He just wasn't showing that sizzle he had as a 2-year-

old when every work was just an eyeopener," Ward said.

The bay has picked up his pace this fall, working five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 at Keeneland Dec. 11. He has been breezing without blinkers and will have them removed for this upcoming start.

"This guy has been cruising right along, working great. Looking forward to getting him back to his old self," said Ward.

Saturday night's race is the longest race of Four Wheel Drive's career at 6 1/2 furlongs, a sixteenth of a mile beyond the six-furlong trip over which he won the Futurity Stakes (G3T) at Belmont Park as in his race preceding the Juvenile Turf Sprint. The plan is to keep him in sprints, according to Ward, who compares the colt's body type to that of a Quarter Horse used for roping in rodeos.

"He's just all speed, a kinda-short compacted speed horse," he said.

The race also includes three other black-type stakes winners: Secretary At War, Awesome Gent, and grade 3 winner Kingly.

The latter won the La Jolla Handicap (G3T) on turf and the California Derby on Golden Gate Fields' synthetic main track as a 3-year-old while in training with Bob Baffert on the West Coast. The Clearview Stables-owned Tapit colt now races for Hall of Fame trainer Mark Casse and comes off a runnerup finish to dual graded stakes winner Ride a Comet in an allowance optional claiming race on Tapeta at Woodbine Oct. 16.

Bred in Kentucky by Clearsky Farms out of the Dixie Union mare Justwhistledixie, the impeccably bred colt is a full brother to four-time grade 2 stakes winner Mohaymen and this year's Lecomte Stakes (G3) winner Enforceable. A half brother, New Year's Day (by Street Cry), scored in the 2013 Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1).

Kingly is 3-1 on the morning line with Chris Landeros in the saddle.

Post time for Turfway's seventh race on Saturday is 9:14 p.m. ET. BH

ASAHI HAI FUTURITY TESTS TOP JAPANESE 2-YEAR-OLDS

There's a lot of sorting out yet to be done among the top Japanese 2-year-olds and the Dec. 20 Asahi Hai Futurity (G1) at Hanshin looks like it will be a good start to that process.

Sixteen colts are entered for the 1,600-meter (about one mile) race, run right-handed around the outer turf course. A case can be made for most of them, with victories in grade 2 and grade 3 preliminaries scattered up and down the past performances.

Among the first to catch the eye is Red Belle Aube, a Deep Impact colt produced by the Unbridled's Song mare Red Fantasia. He enters the Futurity off a victory in the Daily Hai Nisai Stakes (G2) over the course and distance Nov. 14. That was his second win in a row following a career-opening second in August at Nagata.

Hideaki Fujiwara, looking for his first win in the Asahi Hai Futurity Stakes, trains Red Belle Aube. Yuichi Fukunaga, in command for the colt's last two starts, again has the mount.

"He's in good shape and running well, keeping his mind on things," Fujiwara assistant Nobuyuki Tashiro said after drawing gate No. 8. "It's good that he's back at the course where he's won and his last two wins have been achieved in (race) record time. While he's just a young horse, the power he has right now would certainly put him in with a chance, even though it's a grade 1."

A major threat is Stella Veloce, a Bago colt out of the Deep Impact mare Oh My Baby. Stella Veloce won at first asking at 1,600 meters at Hanshin July 5, then was idle until Oct. 10 when he jumped up to win the Saudi Arabia Royal Cup (G3) at Tokyo Racecourse by three lengths.

"The jockey (Norihiro Yokoyama) has been putting him through his paces, and he knows what to do with him to keep him on task, without overdoing things," said Stella Veloce's trainer, Naosuke Sugai. "The horse is in good shape and can run well on good ground, plus he's already won over a mile at Hanshin.

"Hopefully things will go well, and I want to look to next year's Classic races with the horse," Sugai added.

Both Red Belle Aube and Stella Veloce have posted good recent works.

After those, the question becomes which of the youngsters can continue their progress from promise to performance.

Godolphin's Japanese contingent fields Blue Spirit, an Invincible Spirit colt out of the Galileo mare Jasmine Blue. He is 2-for-2 but steps up in both class and distance for trainer Mitsumasa Nakauchida.

Also in with a 2-for-2 mark is Dura Mondo, a Duramente colt whose second start produced a victory in the Aster Sho going 1 mile at Nakayama. Takahisa Tezuka trains for Silk Racing.

Ho O Amazon, a King Kamehameha colt, returns after finishing second, just a head back of Red Belle Aube, in the Daily Hai Nisai. He has two wins and two seconds, all at the 1,600 meters, and one of those wins came at Hanshin.

Mondreise won the Keio Hai Nisai Stakes (G2) at Tokyo Racecourse in his last start after finishing

second in the Kokura Nisai Stakes (G3) one race earlier.

Grenadier Guards, a Frankel colt out of the Harlington mare Wavell Avenue, took three tries to get a win and backed up to 1,200 meters (about six furlongs) to do that at Hanshin on Nov. 7. He was bred by Northern Racing and campaigns for Sunday Racing. Wavell Avenue won the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (G1) at Keeneland in 2015 and was second in the same race a year later at Santa Anita Park.

Then there's Shock Action, by Gleneagles, dual Guineas (G1) winner in 2015. He is 2-for-3 with his last race a victory in the Nigata Nisai Stakes (G3) in August. Trainer Ryuji Okubo's thoughts about Shock Action could apply to most of the field:

"As he's developing," Okubo said, "it'll be interesting to see what he can do this time." BH

The winner will receive an automatic berth into the 2021 Longines Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T) through the

Breeders' Cup Challenge Series.

Pinball Wizard wins the Copa de Oro-Alfredo Lalor at Hipódromo de San Isidro

The Gran Premio Internacional Carlos Pellegrini, which was first run in 1887, is the first Breeders' Cup Challenge Series race of the 2021 season.

Owned by Haras Don Teodoro and trained by Jorge Mayansky Neer, Pinball Wizard won two group 1 races in October, among his four wins in nine starts on turf. A dark bay son of Orpen out of Pink Pony by Pure Prize, Pinball Wizard scored a half-length victory in the Gran Premio General San Martin (G1) on Oct. 3 at Hipódromo Argentino de Palermo and improved on that performance Oct. 31 when he dominated the Copa de Oro-Alfredo Lalor (G1) at San Isidro, crossing the wire five lengths in front in 2:25.34. As he was in his last two wins, Juan Cruz Villagra has the mount on Pinball Wizard, breaking from post 7.

Due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on racing in Argentina, Egalite de 9's Tetaze will be making his first start since his biggest career score in March, when he won the Gran Premio Latinoamericano (G1) at San Isidro by two lengths over a heavy turf course. Trained by Roberto Pellegatta, Tetaze, a bay son of Equal Stripes, will try to improve on his fifth-place finish in last year's Carlos Pellegrini. He will be ridden by Gustavo Calvente from post 11. Haras El Angel de Venecia's 6-year-old Village King, a bay son of Campanologist out of the Pleasant Tap mare Villard, has enjoyed success in both Argentina and in the United States during his 15-race career. Trained by Carlos Etchechoury, Village King won three races in Argentina and finished third in the 2017 Carlos Pellegrini. He spent the following two years in the U.S. under the care of trainer Todd Pletcher, making eight starts. He won the Red Smith Stakes at Aqueduct Racetrack in 2018 and finished third in the 2019 Pan American Stakes (G3T) at Gulfstream Park.

After an eighth-place finish in the Man o' War Stakes (G1T) at Belmont Park in May 2019, Village King was returned to Argentina and was back racing on Oct. 10 of this year, winning the Progreso (G3) at San Isidro, going wire-to-wire in an eight-length victory. In his last start, the Copa de Oro, he gained the lead into the stretch, but was no match for Pinball Wizard, finishing five lengths behind the winner. Village King will be ridden by Brian Enrique from post 3.

Emotion Orpen, Rohit Joy, and Cool Day complete the field. ${\sf BH}$

MEHMAS COLT TOPS DAY ONE OF GOFFS NOVEMBER FOAL SALE

The Goffs November Foal Sale got under way a month later than scheduled Dec.18 with the now familiar coronavirus precautions and restrictions strongly enforced.

Tally-Ho Stud has unearthed another diamond in Mehmas, who has swept all before him this year, with the Juddmonte Middle Park Stakes (G1) scorer Supremacy one of 54 individual winners sired by the son of Acclamation.

The combination of record-breaking freshman sire and the Veitch family's Ringfort Stud, breeders of Mehmas's Al Basti Equiworld Dubai Gimcrack Stakes (G2) winner and Middle Park (G1) third Minzaal, proved irresistible to buyers who waited late into the evening for lot 279.

It was the O'Callaghan family of Tally-Ho Stud who went to €75,000 (US\$92,026) to purchase the colt they already know an awful lot about.

"We sold the yearling full brother this year for £26,000 and he is with Richard Hannon. This colt is a much better model than him, and he will be for resale next year," said Tony O'Callaghan.

On Mehmas, who has obliterated the record for winners by a freshman sire, O'Callaghan added: "We are so pleased with Mehmas, he has done brilliantly. It's unreal to think that he has 54 winners now and he could get a few more before the end of the year."

O'Callaghan's purchase is out of Vida Amorosa, an unraced Lope De Vega half sister to the dam of Listed Westow Stakes winner Garrus, who hails from the family of the champion 2-year-old, group 1 winner and influential sire Danehill Dancer.

The final lot of the evening was another fine Mehmas colt, thus ensuring that plenty of buyers hung around until the hammer fell for the last time on Friday night.

Vinesgrove Stud consigned the first foal out of

an unraced Morpheus mare from the family of the multiple group 2 winner and five-time group 1-placed Stormy Antarctic.

The colt was purchased for €40,000 (US\$49,081) by Paula Flannery of Egmont Stud, helping Mehmas achieve an average price of €39,333 and a median of €40,000—which was four times that of the session as a whole.

Avenue Bloodstock cut out the running

Much of the early running for session-topping honors was made by a son of Two Thousand Guineas (G1) and St James's Palace Stakes (G1) winner Dawn Approach who sold for €70,000 (US\$85,891) to Mark McStay of Avenue Bloodstock.

Offered by Clare Manning's Boherguy Stud, the colt is a half brother to the Palace House Stakes (G3) winner Far Above, who will stand at Starfield Stud next season.

He is out of the winning Shamardal mare Dorraar from the family of Prix de l'Opera (G1) winner Nahrain, also the dam of Caulfield Cup (G1) winner Benbatl, and is bred on a variation of the cross that produced Prix Morny (G1) and Middle Park Stakes (G1) winner Earthlight who is by Shamardal and out of a New Approach mare.

"He's a very nice colt who I have bought for an existing client, and he will most likely be kept to race," McStay said. "He's a half brother to a very fast horse who is an exciting young sire for Jack Cantillon and Micheal Orlandi.

"Dawn Approach himself was a fast horse and he's a sire I have had a bit of luck with personally. The mare has already bred a good horse and hopefully this one will be too."

McStay was back in the thick of the action for Arglo House Stud's Dandy Man colt out of Rip Van Music, a daughter of Park Express Stakes (G3) winner Danehill Music.

The Avenue Bloodstock agent was forced to dig deep for the colt with an athletic walk, securing him with a bid of €60,000 (US\$73,621).

"He's a lovely horse, the nicest individual here today I think. He's been bought for a pinhooking syndicate to sell next year through Baroda Stud," said McStay. "The sire has had an excellent year and this colt's half brother is in training with John McConnell, whose horses are doing very well. This foal is a very nice type and we had to stretch a bit to get him but hopefully he will be lucky."

Murphy at the double

Jimmy Murphy of Redpender Stud bought his first Fast Company foal at Goffs on Friday, going to €40,000 (U\$49,081) for the colt out of the Montjeu mare Nisma consigned by Ballyogue Stud.

Nisma was placed in France and is a half sister to the listed Prix Six Perfections third Militante, who in turn is the dam of the Prix de Lieurey (G3) winner and dual group 1-placed Wind Chimes.

"I haven't had one by the sire before but he's a proven stallion and this foal has a very good pedigree and is a gorgeous-looking horse so it all added up," remarked Murphy.

Murphy's Redpender operation has enjoyed a fruitful association with the stallions who have stood at Ballyhane Stud down the years, having bred National Stakes (G1) winner Toormore by former resident Arakan, while the current roster's headline act Dandy Man gave them Dick Poole Stakes (G3) winner and Cheveley Park Stakes (G1) fourth Happy Romance.

Murphy returned to the source of success when going to €29,000 (US\$35,584) for a filly by Happy Romance's sire offered by Milestream Stud.

The March foal is the second produce of Nuclear Option, who was placed over a mile at three and is a half sister to listed Woodcote Stakes second Danielsflyer, a son of Dandy Man.

Sea The Moon in demand

The only foal offered for sale at Goffs this year by Lanwades Stud's Sea The Moon—sire of this year's Coronation Stakes (G1) winner Alpine Star, who was also second in the Prix de Diane Longines (G1), Prix du Haras de Fresnay-Le-Buffard Jacques le Marois (G1) and Prix de l'Opera Longines (G1) for Jessica Harrington and the Niarchos family—was the most expensive filly sold on Friday.

Brendan Holland of Grove Stud was the buyer of the January-born foal for €50,000 (US\$61,351).

The filly was offered by The Castlebridge Consignment and is the first foal out of the unraced Excelebration mare Exploitation, whose dam is a half sister to Paddy Mullins' Irish Oaks (G1) winner Vintage Tipple. It is the further family of American Derby (G2) winner and sire Overbury and the history-making Melbourne Cup (G1) hero Vintage Crop.

Friday was the first of three foal sessions for the Goffs November Sale and turnover was €2,188,200 (US\$2,672,665) from 158 foals sold with the clearance rate at 62.2%. The average price was €13,762 (US\$16,916) while the median figure was €10,000 (US\$12,270).

ast year's Investec Derby (G1) runner-up Madhmoon has retired and will stand alongside 2014 Racing Post Trophy (G1) winner Elm Park at Haras du Saz, near Nantes in France.

In a deal brokered by agent Richard Venn, the 4-year-old, who finished second to Anthony Van Dyck in last year's Epsom Classic, will take up stallion duties for the forthcoming season.

By QIPCO Two Thousand Guineas (G1) hero Dawn Approach and out of the stakes-placed Aaraas—a daughter of Haafhd (GB) and a half sister to Asheerah, the dam of Tattersalls Irish Two Thousand Guineas (G1) victor and first-season sire Awtaad—Madhmoon was an impressive winner on

debut at 2 and followed up with an easy success over the smart Broome in the KPMG Champions Juvenile Stakes (G2) at Leopardstown.

At 3, the Kevin Prendergast-trained colt was fourth behind Magna Grecia in the QIPCO Two Thousand Guineas before a half-length second at Epsom, beating subsequent top-level winners Japan, Sir Dragonet, Circus Maximus, and Line of Duty.

He could only finish fourth to Sovereign in the Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby (G1) but added a second group win to his name by landing the Invesco Pension Consultants Desmond Stakes (G3). He finished his career when sixth to Magical in the QIPCO Irish Champion Stakes (G1) and missed this season due to injury.

Madhmoon will stand for a fee of €2,500 (US\$3,601).
