ARKANSAS REGULATOR **RESTORES WINS BY** CHARLATAN, GAMINE

Tn a ruling modifying the **⊥** decision of the Oaklawn Park stewards, the Arkansas Racing Commission April 20 restored the 2020 victories of Charlatan in a division of the Arkansas Derby (G1) and eventual champion Gamine in an allowance optional claiming race.

The stewards had disqualified Gamine and Charlatan after lidocaine, specifically, its metabolite 3-hydroxylidocaine, was discovered in the post-race samples of each horse at a level higher than the 20-picogram threshold after their respective May 2 wins last year at Oaklawn. Both horses are conditioned by Bob Baffert, and the Arkansas Racing Commission also modified the stewards' sanctions that had

been levied against the Hall of Fame trainer.

Baffert had been suspended for 15 days by the stewards, who considered the two positives as a single infraction because they happened on the same day. On Tuesday the racing commission eliminated the suspension but levied a pair of \$5,000 fines against Baffert for each infraction.

The six racing commissioners unanimously voted in favor of those modifications to the stewards' rulings Tuesday after a two-day appeals hearing that lasted more than 14 hours. After closing arguments, Arkansas Racing Commission chairman and horse owner Alex Lieblong called for a motion to uphold the stewards' findings, dismiss those findings, or modify the findings.

The only motion put forward was to leave the failed post-race drug tests in place but modify the sanctions for Baffert and eliminate the disqualifications of Gamine, owned by Michael Lund

Petersen; and Charlatan, owned by SF Racing, Starlight Racing, Madaket Stables, Stonestreet Stables, Fred Hertrich III, John Fielding, and Golconda Stables. It was the only motion considered and it was adopted.

During the hearing attorneys for Baffert brought up a number of concerns with the chain of custody—how the post-race samples were handled. Those attorneys, as well as an attorney for Petersen, also argued that the positives were the result of contamination, linked to a pain patch worn by Baffert's assistant trainer Jimmy Barnes or possibly from outside the barn.

In testimony Tuesday, Baffert said he's convinced that positive tests indicating lidocaine in a pair of his horses were caused by environmental contamination and that the finding was not necessarily caused by anyone in his stable.

In last year's stewards' hearing, Barnes noted that he had been wearing a pain patch that may have been the source of the horses' lidocaine positives. While not completely discounting that possibility Tuesday, Baffert said new information that another horse from the division of the Arkansas Derby won by Charlatan also indicated for lidocainebut below the 20-picogram threshold—makes him wonder if there was a contamination issue outside his barn.

During his testimony Tuesday, Baffert noted that there have

been stewards' decisions that he has accepted and not appealed, but in this case, he thought it was important to contest the ruling.

"I don't really feel like we did anything wrong," Baffert said.

Baffert said the combination of testing down to extremely precise levels, picograms; combined with guidelines and withdrawal times he doesn't believe have been fully tested in the real world have resulted in trainers being treated as "lab rats."

In his testimony, Baffert noted that he also trained Nadal, who won the other division of the Arkansas Derby that day but showed no level of lidocaine. He said that result was odd as Barnes also directly worked with Nadal. He also said Barnes was not wearing the pain patch on race day.

At Tuesday's hearing, Cynthia Cole, director of the University of Florida Racing Laboratory which oversees testing of racehorses in Florida, testified that lidocaine is present in many over-the-counter medications, and horses are being tested to a very precise level. She acknowledged that Baffert, as the ultimate insurer of the horse, was responsible if an assistant trainer wore a pain patch that resulted in contamination, but noted that at the level of lidocaine discovered, it also could have been caused by contamination in the testing barn.

"Horses don't live in bubbles; they live in the real world," Cole said.

Cole said if her lab had called the lidocaine positives, with one other horse testing positive for some level of lidocaine from the same race card, she would have advised an investigation for possible environmental contamination.

The possibility that the contamination could have been caused outside of the Baffert barn played into the larger chain of custody arguments made by Baffert's attorneys throughout the two-day hearing that started Monday. "Chain of custody" refers to the protocols and rules put in place by regulatory bodies and labs to ensure proper collection, transport, and, eventually, identification of collected samples.

W. Craig Robertson III, an attorney for Baffert, raised a number of chain of custody issues, noting that one of the two labs involved in the handling of the primary sample at one point identified Charlatan as a gelding when, in fact, he is a colt. Robertson also said the same lab, Truesdail Laboratories, had received two coolers with the samples but when it shipped them to a subcontractor lab for testing, Industrial Laboratories in Wheat Ridge, Colo., those tests were shipped out in three coolers—indicating the initial coolers were opened.



Byron Freeland, counsel for the racing commission, said the number of coolers was unimportant because the samples themselves were not disturbed from their collection tubes. Petra Hartmann, director of the drug testing services laboratory at Industrial, said Truesdail would register the samples but did not tamper with the samples in the tubes. Also, she later responded that opening the coolers alone would not present a significant risk of contamination.

Two labs were involved because the Arkansas Racing Commission had contracted with Truesdail to handle its testing for the 2020 meet but soon after the Irvine, Calif.-based lab lost its needed accreditation from the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium. With Truesdail unable to continue testing post-race samples from racing at Oaklawn, the racing commission approved a plan to have the lab subcontract with Industrial Laboratories to conduct the tests after March 17, 2020, through the end of the meet.

Oddly, samples continued to first be sent to Truesdail before being forwarded to Industrial, which is accredited by the RMTC. Then Truesdail compiled data packet reports based on Industrial's findings. In testimony Monday, Truesdail's Julie Hagihara conceded that adding an extra step in the process doesn't benefit chain of custody security. The loss of RMTC accreditation at Truesdail and the subcontract with Industrial that followed certainly created issues of concern for the regulator.

After the vote to modify the sanctions, Lieblong said he believes mistakes were made on both sides. He added that carrying out the regulation of racing was challenging last year as the COVID-19 pandemic forced changes in protocol and adjustments on the fly. **BH**

Recruiting new owners to Thoroughbred racing is as integral to WinStar Farm's mission as the raising and racing of championship caliber horses. Kenny Troutt's farm near Versailles, Ky., took a major step toward furthering that goal by announcing April 21 it is the strategic partner to a new microshare investment company called Commonwealth, which promises to significantly expand the accessibility of ownership at all levels of Thoroughbred racing, sales, and breeding.

Microshare ownership in Thoroughbreds had its coming out last year when Spendthrift Farm's MyRacehorse gave 5,314 people unprecedented and legitimate bragging rights to owning a piece of Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) winner and Horse of the Year Authentic.




partnership with Commonwealth is another step in the same direction."

Commonwealth, based in Lexington, is the brainchild of co-founders Brian Doxtator and Chase Chamberlin, who grew up together in a rural community near Gull Lake outside Kalamazoo, Mich. After high school, they took dramatically different paths. Doxtator went into technology where he spent 15 years working with start-ups and emerging business models. Chamberlin is a lifelong equestrian who has competed with multiple breeds and in multiple disciplines around the world. He never went into the horse business as a profession because he "didn't want anyone to own my passion" and instead developed a career in digital marketing and as a video strategist.

While doing research in 2018 on "cool companies doing things I think are interesting," Doxtator came across a company called Rally Road, which sold shares in high-end classic cars under the same federal regulatory rules that govern MyRacehorse.

"I thought there was something interesting going on here that is tapping into this passion for investing," Doxtator said. He pored through all the Rally Road documentation and reverse-engineered the business model and then started looking for other applications. One of his first calls was to Chamberlin because they are both horse racing fans,

and his childhood friend had the inside knowledge of the horse world.

"I am a casual fan and really don't know how to get into horse racing, but there seemed to be something here. Chase is the person I know best in the horse community, so I bounced this idea off of him," Doxtator said. "People who know me, know I do this a lot. They are used to getting crazy emails from me, 'What do you think about this...' I probably gave Chase the driest email I'd ever sent because it was mostly about SEC regulations and shares. He came back with a list of questions in a long email and I thought, 'Oh wow, I think we struck a chord here.'"

Soon they began to see other ventures exploring the microshare market and decided to dive head first into Commonwealth. Doxtator put together a development team to build a mobile app that he wanted to be the heart of the Commonwealth ownership experience.


"We leaned hard into the technology because we wanted the experience a younger, more mobile-oriented generation expects," said Doxtator. "It is a state-of-the-art, slick experience where things are happening in clicks and swipes in a very natural way. It is a dynamic place where everything pertaining to your horses and social moments can all be shared."

Doxtator and Chamberlin also went looking for a major farm as a partner, of which WinStar became an early target.

"We felt WinStar is the ultimate racing and breeding entity," said Chamberlin. The farm was honored with an Eclipse Award as Outstanding Breeder in 2020 and had been previously recognized as Outstanding Breeder in 2016 and Outstanding Owner in 2010.

"Their tone and style matched ours the most. It just seemed like a natural fit," Chamberlin continued. Commonwealth also has gotten advice

from Claiborne Farm president Walker Hancock, who continues to serve on Commonwealth's advisory board.

The Commonwealth concept resonated immediately with Preston Troutt, the 26-year-old son of Kenny Troutt who works at Mount Vernon Investments, the Troutt's family office. When Troutt first heard the pitch about a year and a half ago, he saw the value but the development had not progressed far enough. Troutt and the Commonwealth team continued to trade ideas until August of last year when WinStar began exploring ways to be more directly involved.

"MyRacehorse had some success at that point and was getting ready to have more. There were more than 5,000 owners in Authentic, and we thought this is a space that gives people a reason to get into horse

racing," said Troutt. "Commonwealth's technology does a great job of catering to the younger generation that is either looking to get involved or at least willing to give it a try."

Just among his friends, Troutt said they might watch one of the Triple Crown races but then be completely disengaged from the sport for the rest of the year.

"With this concept, instead of betting \$50, you can invest that in a horse," he said. "Now you're not watching the races once a year, you're watching a horse race five or six times. That is a 500-600% increase in viewership just from one user. Then they are getting direct updates on their phones about works, what the trainer is looking for, the next race coming up, maybe watch an interview with a jockey. They are starting to learn more and get to see the personality traits of their horses, which all goes toward building that emotional connection to the horse."

WinStar is a minority investor in Commonwealth and as a strategic partner will assist in providing Commonwealth horses for its investments from some of the foals it breeds and provide the expertise of Walden and WinStar general manager David Hanley in finding racing prospects.

"It is a great concept," said Hanley.
"Commonwealth is giving young people the
experience without having to spend a bunch of
money. They can get into a bunch of different horses
and learn about the training and racing and feel the
excitement. This creates an opportunity that I think
is fantastic for horse racing."







30% of Country Grammer, will be offering 2,277 shares at \$50 each in the 4-year-old son of Tonalist.

"He's such a cool horse that ran great in the Californian," said Walden. "We are really excited about the year ahead."

Other Commonwealth offerings will soon include three 2-year-olds WinStar bought recently at The Gulfstream Sale, Fasig-Tipton's select 2-year-olds in training sale at Gulfstream Park. The offerings include a \$650,000 Frosted colt out of the Unbridled's Song mare Nickel; a \$250,000 Maclean's Music colt out of the Tiznow

daughter Je Suis Tizzy, a half sister to stakes winners Cherokee Artist and Cherokee Girl; and a \$230,000 Constitution colt out the of Tiznow mare Letchworth, who is out of grade 1 winner Harmony Lodge.

Commonwealth's inventory will focus on racehorses in the short term, but the plan is to

spread out into other areas, including broodmares and pinhook prospects.

PRICEY GUN RUNNER COLT KICKS OFF DAY 1 OF OBS SPRING

While the action may have been a bit slow to get rolling April 20 during the opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, there were plenty of competitive prices and equally competitive bidders who showed up ready to spare no expense for top-quality talent.

On Tuesday, OBS reported 181 horses sold from 225 offered for \$17,829,500 at an average price of \$98,506 and median of \$50,000. The 44 horses that went unsold represented an RNA rate of 19.6%.

During the 2020 renewal, which was delayed and held in June due to concerns over COVID-19, OBS sold 154 horses for \$13,209,500 at an average of \$85,776 and median of \$46,000. The RNA rate was comparable with 35 horses unsold for a rate of 19.7%.

"I thought it was good day, a good start to the sale," said OBS director of sales Tod Wojciechowski. "The

numbers looked good, a lot of horses got moved, and hopefully that trend continues over the next three days. It was a good step obviously beyond last year—because we all know what we had to deal with last year—but this was even an improvement over 2019."

As diverse as the prices were varied, the top 20 horses sold on Tuesday through the ring were all purchased by different buyers, the only repeat

> signature belonging to bloodstock agent Donato Lanni, who signed for two horses on behalf of different clients.

> "One of the great things about April is that buyers get to spread out on their horses and you don't find them concentrating on the same horses as much," said Wojciechowski. "It's great to see that depth and the activity in the barn."

Topping the sale on the day was Hip 118, a colt by Three Chimneys Farm stallion Gun Runner who was purchased for \$850,000 by Lanni on behalf of Michael Lund Petersen. Consigned by Eisaman Equine, the gray or roan colt was bred in Kentucky by his consignor out of the stakes-winning Successful Appeal mare Salamera, who had been purchased by the Eisamans for \$300,000 from the consignment of Taylor Made Sales Agency to the 2016 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale.

"She was a big, nice mare with a good pedigree," said Shari Eisaman, whose current broodmare band consists of only five mares. "We thought he (Hip 118) was going to sell well. I was going to be thrilled with \$500,000. He's a wonderful horse. It's the most I've ever sold a homebred for and the homebreds have paid for my farm. They've paid for everything. When you own the factory, your mares are working while you're sleeping."

Lanni said the colt, who breezed an eighthmile in :10 during the under tack show, impressed buyers with his sheer physical speed and presence. According to Lanni, he was at the top of the list for Petersen and he was briefly worried, considering the amount of interest, that they wouldn't be able to take him home.

"Gun Runners look like they're nice," said Lanni.
"It's a beautiful animal—a beautiful horse. He's just a cool horse, did everything he was asked to do and came out of it really in good shape. We're really happy, happy, happy to get him. He was the horse that we wanted. We wanted to go home with him. He looks like he's a cool horse.

"Barry (Eisaman) does a great job. He's a good horseman and I'm happy that they bred a nice horse like him and took him here. I was excited that we got him. It's the same thing every year. We all land on the same horses. There is no stealing. It's tough to buy them but again, I'm so happy we got him."

Two horses attained the second-highest price of \$550,000. The first was Hip 185, a colt by WinStar Farm's Distorted Humor out of Silverpocketsful (by Indian Charlie). Bred in Kentucky by Sierra Farm, he was consigned by Mayberry Farm, agent, and purchased by the partnership of Spendthrift Farm and MyRacehorse.com.

The second horse to hit the \$550,000 mark, Hip 297, came late Tuesday afternoon. The colt, by



Taylor Made Farm stallion Midnight Storm, was purchased in partnership by WinStar Farm's racing arm Maverick Racing, and CMNWLTH.

Elliott Walden of WinStar Farm said he'd found the market to be particularly strong for those few individuals that ticked all the boxes.

"It was a strong price (for Hip 297), but we felt like that was the first time we got something bought," said Walden. "We were the underbidder a couple times before that. It's good to get something bought. The market has been strong for the ones we've bid on."

With three more days of sale still lined up, action will likely continue to pick up as the days progress.

"There is great activity on the top horses and if you're not one of those, it'll be tougher sledding," said Spendthrift Farm's Ned Toffey. "People have gotten really selective, but it's a good, full parking lot out there and there's plenty of activity so that's a good thing."

Day 2 of the OBS Spring Sale begins April 21 at 10:30 a.m. ET. BH

Of the Derby prospects that breezed at Churchill Downs Saturday, he was arguably the flashiest. Under a hold by jockey Florent Geroux in a team move with maiden winner Colonel Bowman, he zipped six furlongs in 1:11 2/5, not asked until his gallop out, timed in 1:25 1/5 for seven furlongs. Look for the Risen Star Presented by Lamarque Ford (G2) winner to bounce back from a Louisiana Derby sixth-place finish.

He came from last to grab third, only a head behind runner-up Midnight Bourbon. Caddo River's expected Derby participation should contribute to a lively pace to aid his charge.

Klaravich Stables/Chad Brown Into Mischief—Strong Incentive, by Warrior's Reward

Klaravich Stables (KY)

The Keeneland track record holder for 6 1/2 furlongs (1:14.99 in winning the Nyquist Stakes last fall), he was stubborn as the lone speed in the Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2), holding second to Essential Quality. Chief concern remains that he

Short on seasoning with three starts and didn't switch leads until late when second in the Florida Derby.

COX CONFIRMS CADDO RIVER FOR KENTUCKY DERBY START

After being on the fence to enter the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), Arkansas Derby (G1) runner-up Caddo River is a go for the 147th Run for the Roses, trainer Brad Cox said April 20.

Cox said the decision is based both on the longtime interest of owner John Ed Anthony of Shortleaf Stable to win the Derby and how the homebred colt has done since Oaklawn Park's signature race April 10. He will have a weekend workout to prepare for the May 1 Derby.

"We've had enough time to see him" since the Arkansas Derby, Cox told reporters at Churchill Downs. "Ultimately, we need to see what he does on Saturday morning breezing. We're scheduled, penciled in for Saturday morning. As long as he breezes well and bounces out of it Sunday in good order, you know, we would definitely plan on entering. That's basically what we're looking at right now."

The best Derby finish for Anthony, through his prior stable name of Loblolly Stable, was Prairie Bayou's second in 1993, which was Anthony's sixth try and last until now. Anthony—who won the Preakness Stakes (G1) twice, including with Prairie Bayou, and the Belmont Stakes (G1) once—longs for a Derby, Cox said.

"That's what he told me," Cox said. "He's been trying to win the Derby for 50 years, and he's won the

Preakness twice. So, you know, winning the Preakness doesn't really appeal to him quite as much as the Derby. It's obviously, you know, to some people it's the No. 1 race in America and in the world ... I mean he obviously has a voice and, you know, he has a lot of say in what's going on. But, you know, he's told me, you know, you watch the horse and if you feel he's doing well, we'll take a chance. And right now we're happy with the way he came out of the Arkansas Derby."

Cox said no decision on a jockey has been made, but he expects to have that discussion with Anthony in the next couple of days.

"We've got some guys in mind," Cox said.

Cox said the weekend work—which will be a week ahead of the classic—would be "probably nothing super flashy, back in three weeks and stuff. Just a maintenance work."

Caddo River, a son of Hard Spun out of the Congrats mare Pangburn, has two wins in six lifetime starts with three runner-up finishes. He broke his maiden in a 9 1/2-length frontrunning romp at Churchill in November.

"He's solid," Cox said. "He's a frontrunner," something Cox said he'd anticipate wouldn't be changed in the Derby.

Caddo River would "probably be somewhat forwardly placed, be aggressive with him the first part like we were in the Arkansas Derby. So that would be our tactics. You know, see if he can get around there on the lead going a mile and a quarter." BH

BROWN WANTS HIGHLY MOTIVATED OFF PACE IN KY DERBY

Highly Motivated nearly upset Essential Quality in the April 3 Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2) at Keeneland by going to the lead and trying to outlast him, but trainer Chad Brown doesn't expect—or want—his colt to employ similar upset tactics in the May 1 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1).

Speaking with reporters on the Churchill Downs backstretch April 20, two days after Highly Motivated tuned up for the race with a bullet half-mile workout in :47 1/5 at Keeneland, Brown indicated he wishes to see his Derby starter off the pace in the 1 1/4-mile classic. The Blue Grass, Highly Motivated's only race around two turns, was the first time the 3-year-old led early in a race, tactics that were partially the result of the Blue Grass being relatively short of frontrunners.

"I do think he's more effective with a target," Brown said. "What I'm hoping for is more pace in the Derby, where he can be close but following somebody. I think if that happens, you're going to see this horse get the mile and a quarter without any problems."

Told of trainer Brad Cox's announcement earlier Tuesday that Caddo River, the pacesetting runner-up in the Arkansas Derby (G1), would run in the Derby and not bypass it, Brown added that he welcomed the addition of pace. "I am in favor of more speed in the race, even though again, we were on the lead last time. It's not our preferred way to run. I do know that about the horse," the trainer said. "You know, I've been here before, and obviously with the Derby, a lot of luck has to go your way, as well. The post position draw—that's maybe the most dreaded part of the week for everybody. And then, getting out of the gate clean. There's always a weather factor. There's so many things."

Highly Motivated, a homebred Into Mischief colt for Seth Klarman's Klaravich Stables, will provide Brown with his sixth Kentucky Derby starter. Riding the colt is Hall of Famer Javier Castellano, seeking his first Derby win in his 15th attempt.

Brown's best Derby finish came in 2018 when champion Good Magic ran second to eventual Triple Crown winner Justify. His next closest finish was a fourth from Normandy Invasion in 2013. That 3-year-old, Brown's first Derby starter, took command at the head of the stretch and held the lead until the eighth pole before tiring to fourth behind Orb.

"So just getting to the quarter pole cleanly with a chance to win is really what you're looking for. So many things have to go right," he said.

Brown, whose lone Triple Crown victory came in the Preakness Stakes in 2017 with Cloud Computing, a colt owned by Klaravich Stables with William Lawrence, admits to being selective with the 3-year-olds he

brings to the Derby. With slower-to-develop types, including those that might not handle the rigors of a 20-horse Derby, he has opted to instead wait for other races such as the Preakness.

He will do that again this year with Klaravich Stables' Crowded Trade, third in the Wood Memorial Stakes Presented by Resorts World Casino (G2), sitting out the Derby in favor of the second jewel of the Triple Crown.

Brown has started just one horse for Klarman in the Derby, that being Practical Joke, who finished fifth for Klaravich Stables and Lawrence in 2017.

Klaravich Stables' Read the Footnotes was Klarman's first Derby starter, finishing seventh in 2004. The late Rick Violette trained him.

Highly Motivated, who set a track record at Keeneland last fall when he zipped 6 1/2 furlongs in 1:14.99 in winning the Nyquist Stakes Nov. 6, ranks among the fastest "handful" of Derby horses on the speed figures Brown uses to measure performances, the trainer indicated.

The bay is not the only horse he is excited about to race at Churchill next week. The four-time Eclipse Award-winning trainer has a contender in the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) with Klaravich Stable's Search

Results, a Flatter 3-year-old filly unbeaten in three starts who won the Gazelle Stakes (G3) at Aqueduct Racetrack April 3.

Her time for 1 1/8 miles over a tiring surface was 1:54.14—faster than the time posted by Bourbonic in winning the Wood Memorial in 1:54.49 also on the April 3 card.

Brown previously was third in the 2016 Oaks with Alpha Delta Stables' Lewis Bay, who also took the Gazelle in her final Oaks prep.

> "Any one of about a half a dozen horses in there I could see winning that race with a clean trip, but I think she's one of them," Brown said of Search Results. "It's exciting to come to the Oaks with an undefeated horse."

As coveted a prize as the Oaks is, it is not the Derby, a race watched by more than 16 million viewers on NBC when it was last run on the first Saturday in May in 2019.

"No matter where you're from or where you're based, you want to aim for the Kentucky Derby," Brown said. "It's something that—if you're lucky enough to win it—it's something that everybody understands whether they're a horse racing fan or not." BH

KHRC APPROVES MOVE OF STATE'S DRUG TESTING TO UK LAB

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission approved April 20 a motion to establish the University of Kentucky Equine Analytical Chemistry Laboratory as the commission's new drug testing laboratory.

The approval follows an April 9 recommendation for the change by the Kentucky Equine Drug Research Council, an advisory board for the full commission. Dr. Bruce Howard, the KHRC equine medical director, said the anticipated start of testing by the UK EACL would begin with the start of the Ellis Park meet on June 27.

The change to the UK EACL will see the KHRC terminate its contract with Industrial Laboratories in Wheat Ridge, Colo.

"The UK EACL under the direction of Dr. (Scott) Stanley is on the cutting edge of technology," Howard said. "The laboratory conducts ultra-modern antidoping testing and applied research, they've upgraded testing equipment to remain on the forefront of testing, and has recently broken ground on a new expanded laboratory and testing facility. The UK EACL is committed to identifying new emerging threats in racing. We believe this laboratory will be a leader in the testing world."

Howard said benefits of the KHRC's use of the UK EACL include facilities in close proximity to Kentucky race venues, reductions in time and cost of shipping test samples, the convenience of having a lab nearby for in-person consultation, and using tax dollars to support a Kentucky facility.

The UK EACL is ISO 17025 accredited and has been granted interim accreditation by the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium. During the April 9 EDRC meeting, Stanley told committee members that the interim accreditation is due to COVID-19 delaying RMTC's accreditation process.

Stanley again spoke at the full commission meeting.

"The racing commission work is something that we've worked with the commission staff for many years in order to get the accreditations required, upgrade the facilities. We've put about two and a half million dollars into the laboratory in the last year and a half, even during most of these challenging COVID times," Stanley said Tuesday. "So we're really excited about being able to provide that, being able to handle the service needs, as well as the research needs by the commission. We're in a position where we can address emerging threats. We can take challenges such as protein and peptide analysis and we can look forward into the future with methods like the equine biological passport, which many of our industry stakeholders have contributed their support."

Commissioner Alan Leavitt expressed concern of blood doping, "which is emerging as the biggest threat we have to the integrity of horse racing in this country," he said, and micro-dosing, and asked about tests the UK EACL has to detect the use of those agents in horses.

Stanley said the UK EACL has tests that the lab feels can identify blood doping and micro-dosing.

"We're implementing more out of competition testing, and we're doing more proteomic testing," Stanley said. "Both of those, I think, will facilitate the detection of micro-dosing and the use of blood doping agents."

The UK EACL, established July 2019, was formerly the drug testing laboratory for the United States Equestrian Federation and still conducts testing for the USEF and its horse shows. The laboratory, its assets, and facilities were transitioned from the USEF to UK, and is now part of the university's College of Agriculture, Food, and Environment. It's currently located on UK's Coldstream Research Campus in Lexington with the new facility being built close by. BH

The WinStar Farm team bided their time throughout the day April 20 before striking hard and fast in the final minutes of the opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale for a \$550,000 son of freshman stallion Midnight Storm. The sale topped off a strong day for the Taylor Made stallion as four juveniles were sold through the ring on Tuesday for \$1,033,000.

Consigned as Hip 297 by Woodford Thoroughbreds, agent, the colt was purchased on a final bid of \$550,000 to tie for the second-highest price of the day. WinStar Farm signed the winning ticket in the name of their racing arm, Maverick Racing, and CMNWLTH.

During the under tack show the colt worked a

quarter-mile in :20 4/5.

"We loved him," said WinStar Farm's Elliott Walden. "He is a really nice colt and breezed great. We felt like he looked a lot like his daddy. We have a few shares in his daddy. We bought one at the yearling

> sales as well. I'm very impressed with the Midnight Storms and I think everyone is. He's had a good sales season. He's going to go back to the farm and we will regroup."

Bred in Kentucky by Siena Farms, the colt is out of the Indian Charlie mare Tasunke and from the family of grade 1 winners Tap to Music and Cuddles. He was previously purchased by Woodford for \$180,000 from the consignment of Taylor Made to the Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

"We've been waiting all afternoon for this colt to sell," said Beth Bayer of Woodford Thoroughbreds. "He's a big, strong, beautiful colt by a freshman sire. We really loved him and Don loved him all season training. It's very exciting. He got vetted and he was well-received. We thought he would get close to that, yes. It's the first Midnight Storm I've ever dealt with. It makes you want to breed back to him right?"

Another strong sale for Midnight Storm came earlier in the sale when Hip 264, a colt from the consignment of Parrish Farms, agent, was purchased by John Fort for \$310,000. Bred in Kentucky by V. Gail Ray out of Summer of Joy (by Sky Mesa), the colt was previously consigned to the Keeneland September Sale where he was purchased by Parrish Farms for horses \$34,000.

The colt breezed an eighth-mile in :9 4/5 during the under tack show.

"It was awesome. Those were two really nice horses," said Taylor Made's Liam Benson. "The Woodford horse, that horse they paid a good bit of money for as a baby and he continued to develop the way you expect a horse like that to develop. The Parrish's horse was fast-looking and it came out here and worked like a monster and sold accordingly.

"It's hard to check every box at these sales because it's not just looks. They have to come out here and they have to work good, they have to vet after. The general feel is that things look pretty good for the horse

(Midnight Storm) so far but they still have to get to the races."

Benson said so far, the consensus was that Taylor Made had been pleased with the physicals they'd seen from the Midnight Storms.

"They're all just pretty," said Benson. "They all have a gorgeous top line on them and they're all just well-made horses. In general across the board, we've been very happy with what we've seen so far. I've bred a couple mares to him myself this year. I've been drinking the Kool-Aid hoping it turns into Dom Perignon." BH

DISTORTED HUMOR COLT COMMANDS \$550,000 AT OBS SPRING

Almost the entire Spendthrift Farm team was on hand April 20 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, but it fell to general manager Ned Toffey to sign the \$550,000 winning ticket on a flashy colt by WinStar Farm stallion Distorted Humor.

Consigned by Mayberry Farm, agent, as Hip 185, the bay is out of Siverpocketsfull (by Indian Charlie), who placed in the Central Bank Ashland Stakes (G1). Bred in Kentucky by Sierra Farm, he had been purchased as a yearling for \$170,000 by bloodstock agent Bo Bromagen when consigned by her breeder to the Fasig-Tipton Selected Yearlings Showcase.

"We knew he was a nice horse," said Bromagen.
"He's been a nice horse all along. If I'm being 100% honest I wanted to keep him. I wanted to keep him up until two minutes before he went into the sales ring.
April (Mayberry) does such a good job at keeping my expectations on a level that are reasonable. I love going

to the racetrack and I like taking all the horses. I'd keep them all if I could.

"I'm not sure if this is the best horse I've ever bought, but he showed up and did everything just like you'd want him to do it. He was beautiful, he breezed amazing, and I'm really proud of the job that they did and of the product that we've sold. Spendthrift and those guys got the right horse at the right price. I'm happy for them, good luck to them, and I wish he was still mine."

During the OBS Spring Sale under tack show, the colt worked an eighth-mile in :10 1/5. Spendthrift said the colt was purchased as part of their continuing partnership with MyRacehorse, with whom they campaigned Horse of the Year and Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) winner Authentic and currently campaign dual-champion Monomoy Girl.

"He's fast and he's a great-looking colt," said Toffey.
"He's not totally atypical of Distorted Humor and he
had some pedigree out of a grade 1 stakes-placed dam.
He's a horse that, hopefully, after a good racing career
he'll wind up in the stallion barn at Spendthrift. That's
the goal. We bought him with MyRacehorse and we're
happy to go down that path again."

While the price was one of the highest paid for a juvenile during Tuesday's opening session, Toffey said he was pleased with the amount of action he'd seen at the barns and on the grounds through the week.

"That's the first horse that we've bid on and we were very close to where we expected to be. There are a lot of horses here but I think you see all the right buyers. What I would expect to see is what we've seen. There is great activity on the top horses and if you're not one of those, it'll be tougher sledding. People have gotten really selective, but it's a good, full parking lot out

there and there's plenty of activity so that's a good thing."

Operating on their own earlier in the day, MyRacehorse went to \$250,000 to purchase Hip 62, a colt by Taylor Made Stallions Not This Time out of Race Hunter (Dixie Union). Bred in Kentucky by Tenlane Farm, the colt was consigned by Randy Miles, agent, and breezed an eighth-mile in :10 1/5 during the under tack show. BH

NASS SPENDS \$425,000 FOR WELL-CONNECTED MUNNINGS FILLY

Trainer Gerard Butler got the action going early during the April 20 opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale when he went to \$425,000 for Hip 44, a flashy daughter of Ashford Stud stallion Munnings.

"She's by Munnings, had a great page, is a very nice filly, and very well-produced by Eddie Woods," said Butler. "She ticked all the boxes—all those cliches. You wouldn't get her for any less. Everybody was right where we were so that's what we expected to pay for her."

Consigned by Eddie Woods, agent, the filly was bred in Kentucky by SF Bloodstock out of the Belong to Me mare Private Feeling and is one of the more well-connected fillies in the sale. Hip 44's half siblings include grade 2 winner Kensei (by Mr. Greeley), and

more impressively, champion Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike).

Also a stallion on the Ashford Stud roster, Lookin At Lucky was a classic winner of the Preakness Stakes (G1) at 3 but also picked up top-level wins in the Del Mar Futurity (G1), CashCall Futurity (G1), and Izod

Haskell Invitational Stakes (G1). He retired in 2010 with a 9-1-1 record from 13 starts and \$3,307,278 in earnings.

Hip 44 impressed early during the under tack show ahead of the OBS Spring Sale where she worked a quarter-mile in :21.

"She was bought by a man called Fawzi Nass in Bahrain who also trains horses in Dubai," said Butler. "He's looking for some nice fillies and pedigrees and she's one. I don't know the plans yet. I'll call him and see what he wants to do, but I say she'll be here for a little bit and then we will ship her wherever he wants her to go."

"We're very pleased," said Woods. "When selling so early it's always a little tough but we were quite pleased with where she went at the end of the day. The market is very spotty, but the first day is always a bit spotty and then it seems to snowball a little bit." BH



PRECOCIOUS NOBLE BIRD COLT BRINGS \$400,000

In the crowded marketplace of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, Hip 104, a Florida-bred colt from the first crop of Ocala Stud stallion Noble Bird, separated himself from the crowd with a swift and professional quarter-mile breeze in :20 4/5 at the sale's first under tack preview. The breeze sent interest in the colt soaring, and during the sale's opening session April 20, Jacob West of West Bloodstock extended to \$400,000 to acquire the colt out of the Ocala Stud consignment for Robert and Lawana Low.

"He breezed incredibly well and galloped out big," said West who indicated that the colt will be trained by Todd Pletcher. "To me, he looks like a big, two-turn horse, and that's what Mr. and Mrs. Low are looking for. When I ran it up the flagpole with them, they were scratching their heads. I just told them, 'I loved the horse,' and they have faith and confidence in me. It's a lot of money for that horse, but there is a real pedigree underneath with C Z Rocket and Giant Expectations. He comes from a very good consignor in Ocala Stud, and they raised him on the farm.

"That was my last bid to be quite honest," West added. "I heard Mark Casse was the underbidder, which makes a lot of sense; he trained Noble Bird and he would know one as well as anybody at this point. Our jobs as agents are to find the best horses that are fast and sound and come from good people, and that is all I can do."

Ocala Stud's David O'Farrell said that the precocious colt had a progressive lead-up to the sale.

"He has been a thrifty horse from day one," O'Farrell said. "He has never had a bad day. He gives you his best every day. He's a really neat horse and he thrived all winter. You never expect a price like that, but we weren't surprised at all. He stood out in our consignment and amongst all the horses in this sale."

Bred in the Sunshine State by Herman Wilensky, the chestnut colt is out of the stakes-winning Tiger Ridge mare Rosebud's Ridge. The colt's active and running family includes the likes of multiple graded stakes winners and millionaires C Z Rocket and Giant Expectations. C Z Rocket won this year's Count Fleet Sprint Handicap (G3) and the Hot Springs Stakes at Oaklawn Park. Last year, he won the Santa Anita Sprint Championship Stakes (G2) before finishing second to Whitmore in the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) at Keeneland.

Noble Bird, a track record-setting son of Birdstone and a grade 1 winner of \$1,327,945, stands this season for \$4,000. He scored his biggest career victory in the Stephen Foster Handicap (G1) at Churchill Downs in 2015 for owner John Oxley and trainer Casse. He also won the Pimlico Special Handicap (G3), the Lukas Classic Stakes at Churchill, and the Hagyard Fayette Stakes (G2) at Keeneland where he added a track record to his impressive résumé. He won the Fayette by 5 3/4 lengths in 1:47.75, setting a new record for 1 1/8 miles.

"It's huge for the stallion," O'Farrell said. "A result like this can pick up his book a bit. He is doing well. There have been some good vibes around town (Ocala, Fla.) about how well the Noble Birds have been doing, even prior to the sale. Hopefully, this tips the scales in his favor and puts some buzz on him." BH

VALIANT MINISTER FILLY GENERATES BIG RETURN FOR HOPPEL

It was all smiles, high-fives, and handshakes in the back ring for Jesse Hoppel of Coastal Equine April 20 as the price on his Valiant Minister filly climbed to \$360,000 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale. Consigned as Hip 132, the filly generated a strong return for Hoppel, who previously purchased the filly as a yearling for a pinhook prospect.

"We were expecting to sell a good filly," said Hoppel. "But the stallion has been unmeasured, so where that was going to stop I didn't know. But I knew I had a six-figure filly on my hands. Over the week I thought she would break into the \$200,000s. But I don't get greedy. I reserved her at \$75,000 and let her roll. The market appraised her."

The filly was bred in Florida by Baoma Corp. out of the stakes-winning Kantharos mare Savingtime. Previously consigned by Abbie Road Farm to the OBS October Yearlings, 2-Year-Olds, and Horses of Racing Age Sale, she was purchased by Hoppel for a steal at \$27,000.

During the OBS under tack show, the filly breezed a quarter-mile in :20 4/5. She was purchased on Tuesday by Solis/Litt.

As Hip 132 matured and trained ahead of the juvenile sales season, Hoppel said learning to work with the dark bay or brown filly's big personality proved to be a bit of a challenge.

"She's one of those fillies who has got a mind of her own," said Hoppel, "When she figured out what we were doing and applied herself, that's when we knew we had a really good horse but it wasn't easy at first."

A winning son of Candy Ride, Valiant Minister joined the Bridlewood Farm stallion roster in 2018 and his first crop are 2-year-olds of 2021. Hip 132 is now the most expensive horse sired by the stallion to be sold at public auction.

Bred in Kentucky by Hill 'n' Dale Equine Holdings, Valiant Minister was a \$680,000 2-year-old purchase by Baoma's Charles Chu from the consignment of Eddie Woods to the OBS June 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale. He is out of the unraced Deputy Minister mare Spooky Minister and is a full brother to grade 1-placed Moe Candy and grade 3-placed Holy Candy. The stallion made only one career start before a stall accident forced his connections to retire him to stud. BH

Consigned by de Meric Sales, agent, the colt—who breezed an eighth-mile in :10 at the under tack preview—was bought as a yearling last year for \$17,000 by Silvestre Avila out of Stuart Morris' consignment to the OBS October Yearlings, 2-Year-Olds, and Horses of Racing Age Sale. He previously sold to Tanner Wingo, agent, for \$13,000 as a weanling at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale when consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency.

"He is a beautiful colt," said Tristan de Meric. "We have always thought highly of him. He has tons of presence and class, and American Freedom already having his first winner didn't hurt."

The colt is out of the unraced Stormy Atlantic mare Red Menace, a half sister to multiple stakes winner Saratoga Snacks, an earner of \$693,500, and Rajman, a multiple graded stakes-placed runner in Peru.

Like the colt at OBS, American Bound is out of a Stormy Atlantic mare. She is produced from Grace Abounds. BH

REGALLY-BRED ARROGATE FILLY TURNS HEADS AT OBS SPRING

The appropriately named Triple a Okay, who sells ▲ April 21 as Hip 486 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, hails from a family that is no stranger to high expectations.

From the first crop of the late sire Arrogate—a champion and earner of \$17,422,600-the royallybred gray or roan filly is out of the multiple grade 1 winner and near-millionaire Artemis Agrotera, making her a half brother to Chestertown. Before that son of Tapit won last year's Albany Stakes at Saratoga Race Course, the gray or roan colt sold at the 2019 OBS March 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale for a March Sale record \$2 million to L.E.B., agent for West Point Thoroughbreds, Robert Masiello, and Siena Farm.

A homebred for leading New York breeders Chester and Mary Broman, Triple a Okay is consigned by Sequel Bloodstock, agent for the Bromans. While Triple a Okay, who breezed an eighth-mile in :10 at the under tack preview, is the same color as her record-setting brother, the similarities end there, according to Sequel Bloodstock's Becky Thomas.

"I've been blessed to have trained for the Bromans for a long time," said Thomas who estimates she has trained for the Bromans for nearly 20 years. "I had Artemis Agrotera and having had Chestertown, he was a big, scopey, heavier-boned, good-sized Tapit. This one, with Arrogate—and I love the name Triple a Okay—this filly is more refined and lighter framed. She is very feminine, very elegant. She is very much a twoturn horse. Artemis Agrotera has an Into Mischief colt behind this filly and he is another big giant.

"Going into a 2-year-old sale we try really hard to get them to go fast, but sometimes we have to do it their way," Thomas added. "She had a lot of long gallops before we ever got here, and she has done so well to be able to get here. The Arrogates have been very well received. She performed on the racetrack and she has the family."

Artemis Agrotera, a 2011 daughter of Roman Ruler, flashed her quality right out of the blocks, winning a Saratoga maiden special weight by 11 3/4 lengths in her career debut at 2. She went on to win the Frizette Stakes (G1) that year and annexed the Ballerina Stakes (G1) and the Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2) at 3 en route to earnings of \$943,800. SUBURBAN, KY TURF CUP ADDED TO BC CHALLENGE SCHEDULE

The Breeders' Cup announced its 2021 Breeders' Cup Challenge Series schedule April 20, consisting of 84 automatic qualifying stakes races into the Breeders' Cup World Championships. This year's series, which includes a record nine "Win and You're In" races for the \$6 million Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) division, is available online.

Horses from around the globe will be qualifying through the Challenge Series for the 38th Breeders' Cup World Championships, which is scheduled to be held at Del Mar in California Nov. 5-6, and will be televised live on NBC and NBCSN.

The Challenge Series, now in its 15th year, will be hosted at many of the world's premier racetracks in Argentina, Canada, Chile, England, France, Ireland, Japan, Peru, South Africa, and the United States.

As part of the benefits to horsemen, the Breeders' Cup will pay the entry fees and guarantee a starting position in a corresponding Championships race for all Challenge Series race winners. The Challenge winner must be nominated to the Breeders' Cup program by the Championships' pre-entry deadline

of Oct. 25 to receive the rewards.

In addition, Breeders' Cup will provide a \$40,000 travel allowance to the connections of all Championship starters from outside of North America and a \$10,000 travel allowance for starters within North America that are stabled outside of California.

There are two new Challenge Series races in 2021: the Suburban Stakes (G2) at Belmont Park July 3, which grants a berth into the Breeders' Cup Classic, and the Calumet Kentucky Turf Cup (G2) at Kentucky Downs Sept. 11, which offers a spot in the \$4 million Longines Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T). The latter race is worth \$1 million for Kentucky-bred horses.

"There already were a million reasons for owners and trainers to send their turf sprinter or distance grass horse to Kentucky Downs," said Ted Nicholson, vice president for racing for the Southern Kentucky track. "Now there's even more incentive."

In support of the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act, which was signed into law in the U.S. last December, all Breeders' Cup Challenge races this year will not permit medications to be administered within 24 hours of race day, the organization announced.

"We look forward to the return of the Breeders'
Cup Challenge Series with horsemen from around
the world participating in and taking advantage
of the many incentives, such as automatic starting
positions and paid entry fees, to qualify for the World
Championships," said Breeders' Cup president and
CEO Drew Fleming. "We also thank our international
and domestic racetrack partners for their important
work and dedication to support the Challenge Series."

The first North American Breeders' Cup Challenge Series race of the year will be the Shoemaker Mile Stakes (G1T) at Santa Anita Park May 31. The Shoemaker Mile winner will gain a free starting position into the \$2 million FanDuel Breeders' Cup Mile (G1T).

There are several highlights to this year's Challenge Series, such as providing fans with a path to the World Championships through NBC Sports. The network will televise the "Breeders' Cup Challenge Series: Win and You're In Series presented by America's Best Racing," featuring 12 live programs in the U.S. this summer and fall. The full 2021 television schedule will be announced April 21.

There will be a record nine automatic berths awarded for the Breeders' Cup Classic. The 4-year-old Cafe Pharoah became the first horse to qualify for this year's Classic when he won the February Stakes (G1) at Tokyo Racecourse in Japan Feb. 16. The next automatic qualifier in the division will be the Stephen Foster Stakes (G2) at Churchill Downs June 26; followed by the Suburban at Belmont Park July 3; the TVG.com Haskell Stakes (G1) at Monmouth Park July 17; the Whitney (G1) at Saratoga Race Course Aug. 7; the Juddmonte International Stakes (G1) at York in England Aug. 18; the TVG Pacific Classic (G1) at Del Mar Aug. 21; the Jockey Club Gold Cup (G1) at Saratoga Sept. 4; and the Awesome Again Stakes (G1) at Santa Anita Oct. 2.

In the United States, there will be six "Win and

You're In" races for the \$2 million Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1), starting with the Ogden Phipps (G1) June 5 as part of the Belmont Stakes (G1) day program at Belmont Park. The Ogden Phipps will be followed by the Fleur de Lis (G2) at Churchill Downs June 26; the Clement L. Hirsch Stakes (G1) at Del Mar Aug. 1; the Personal Ensign (G1) at Saratoga Aug. 28; the Juddmonte Spinster (G1) at Keeneland Oct. 3; and the Zenyatta Stakes (G2) at Santa Anita Oct. 3.

The European leg of the Breeders' Cup Challenge Series will begin with four races at the Royal Ascot meeting in England: The Queen Anne Stakes (G1) June 15 with an invitation to the Breeders' Cup Mile; the Prince of Wales's Stakes (G1) June 16 with an invitation to the Breeders' Cup Turf; the Norfolk Stakes (G2) June 17 with an invitation to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint (G2T); and the Diamond Jubilee Stakes (G1) June 19 with an invitation to the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1T).

Three other prestigious European automatic qualifiers for the Breeders' Cup Turf are also back this year: The King George VI & Queen Elizabeth QIPCO Stakes (G1) at Ascot July 24; the Irish Champion Stakes (G1) at Leopardstown Sept. 11; and the Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1) at ParisLongchamp Oct. 3, one of five Breeders' Cup Challenge races on the Arc day program.

Canada will also be represented by three grade 1 Breeders' Cup Challenge Series races at Woodbine, led by the Ricoh Woodbine Mile Sept. 18 with an invitation to the Breeders' Cup Mile, and Natalma Stakes with an invitation to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T) and the Summer Stakes with an invitation to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1T), both Sept. 19.

The international portion of the series began on Dec. 19 when the 3-year-old Cool Day captured the Gran Premio International Carlos Pellegrini (G1) at Hipodromo de San Isidro in Argentina to gain the first automatic starting berth into the Breeders' Cup Turf.

Last year, five Breeders' Cup Challenge Series winners also won a World Championships race: Authentic, Tarnawa, Glass Slippers, Essential Quality, and Aunt Pearl. BH

STRADIVARIUS TO WARM UP FOR GOLD CUP IN SAGARO STAKES

Three-time Ascot Gold Cup (G1) winner Stradivarius will kickstart his bid to emulate the mighty Yeats and bag a fourth successive stayers' crown when he starts his season at the Berkshire track next week.

The 7-year-old is set to run in the Longines Sagaro Stakes (G3) April 28, his first appearance in the two-mile contest won by subsequent Gold Cup winners Colour Vision and Estimate in 2012 and 2013. Despite the delayed start to the flat season last year, the Sagaro was saved and staged on the all-weather at Newcastle, although the Stradivarius camp opted to stay closer to home to run in the rearranged Hurworth Bloodstock Coronation Cup (G1) at Newmarket.

Stradivarius ran over a mile and a half on three of his six appearances in 2020, a campaign highlighted by a 10-length victory to give him a third Gold Cup, and a fourth triumph in the Goodwood Cup (G1).

After that, the Bjorn Nielsen-owned chestnut finished second in the Qatar Prix Foy (G2) and seventh in the Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1), before disappointing on unsuitable soft ground in the QIPCO British Champions Long Distance Cup (G2) at Ascot in October.

John Gosden, who trains Stradivarius in partnership with his son Thady, said: "We're looking at the Sagaro Stakes at Ascot on April 28 for Stradivarius.

We didn't fancy taking him all the way up to Newcastle for the race last year so he was forced to run in the Coronation Cup. He ran well to finish third that day considering he was taking on Ghaiyyath and Anthony Van Dyck."

He added: "He has wintered well and Frankie (Dettori) was happy with him when he rode him in work last week. The idea is to try to go back to Ascot for the Gold Cup, which is shaping up to be a very good race this year."

More immediately, Palace Pier is to reappear earlier than first planned for the

Gosdens in the bet365 Mile (G2) at Sandown April 23.

The son of Kingman began his 3-year-old campaign in handicap company at Newcastle before progressing to land back-to-back group 1s in the St. James's Palace Stakes (G1) at Royal Ascot and Prix du Haras de Fresnay-Le-Buffard Jacques le Marois (G1) at Deauville last summer.

Palace Pier, who escapes a penalty for Friday's contest, ran well in defeat when losing his unbeaten record in the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes (G1) at Ascot in October, when he finished third behind The Revenant.

Gosden added: "We were thinking of going straight to the Lockinge (G1) with Palace Pier, but he's been so fresh in himself that we're running him at Sandown first. It looks a nice place to get him started."

The Clarehaven team have had a great start to the domestic season but have been even more productive overseas, with Mishriff winning the \$20 million Saudi Cup and \$5 million Longines Dubai Sheema Classic (G1), and Lord North landing the \$4 million Dubai Turf Sponsored by DP World (G1).

Gosden added: "Both horses have done very well and are now having breaks until the summer. The plan for Mishriff is to drop him back to a mile and a quarter for the group 1 Eclipse Stakes at Sandown in July, while Lord North will be heading for the group 1 Prince of Wales's Stakes at Royal Ascot which he won last year."

SNOW LANTERN TO SKIP ONE THOUSAND GUINEAS FOR YORK

Richard Hannon has confirmed impressive Newbury winner Snow Lantern will not run in the May 2 QIPCO One Thousand Guineas (G1).

The 3-year-old filly shed her maiden tag in style at Newbury April 18 and was promptly cut by bookmakers into as short as 7-1 for the fillies' classic at Newmarket.

However, Hannon released a statement that the daughter of Frankel would not try to emulate her dam Sky Lantern, winner of the 2013 One Thousand Guineas, and would instead be aimed at one of two targets at York next month.

Hannon said: "Following discussions with connections, Snow Lantern will not be taking up her engagement in the One Thousand Guineas at Newmarket and will instead be aimed for either the group 3 Musidora Stakes or the listed Michael Seely Stakes at York's May meeting.

"Both of these races give us options and an extra couple of weeks, with the Michael Seeley being run over a mile and the Musidora over a mile and a quarter.

"Either of these races will give us a good guide on where we stand for the rest of the season with her. She

also holds entries in the Cazoo Oaks (G1) and Prix de Diane (French Oaks, G1) and these engagements will be dependent on her York performance.

"There are plenty of options coming up for her. She is a special filly, with a beautiful pedigree, and has already proved an exciting prospect for her ownerbreeders Rockcliffe Stud."

LETRUSKA BECOMES FIFTH GRADE 1 WINNER FOR SUPER SAVER

Tt's no secret that eagerly anticipated matchups don't ■ always deliver a thrilling finish and fight between the expected principals. The Apple Blossom Handicap (G1) run April 17 at Oaklawn Park came through in one respect but not the other. The race drew two-time Eclipse Award winner, Monomoy Girl, first past the post in 15 of her previous 16 starts, and Swiss Skydiver, the champion 3-year-old filly of 2020, and conqueror of Horse of the Year Authentic in an epic renewal of last year's Preakness Stakes (G1).

That there wouldn't be a duel between the two superstars was apparent early in the stretch, as Swiss Skydiver began to fade. That didn't leave plain sailing for Monomoy Girl, however, as having been headed at the furlong pole, the longtime leader Letruska, in receipt of six pounds, battled back to get her nose in front at the wire.

Bred in Kentucky by her owners, St. George Stable, Letruska began her career in Mexico. Not surprisingly, in view of her subsequent form, she ran riot through her division there, winning all six of her starts by a

combined margin of better than 40 lengths. That included a pair of Mexican grade one events (although not recognized as black-type by the International Cataloging Standards), the Clasico Esmeralda and Clasico Diamante, which she took by 9 1/2 lengths and 14 lengths, respectively.

Letruska was first seen in action in the U.S. in December 2019, when Gulfstream Park hosted the Clasico Invitacional del Caribe meet. Contesting the Copa Invitacional del Caribe Stakes—a 10-furlong event for horses that have been imported to a country within the Caribbean Federation, she clicked off measured fractions on the lead to score by 4 1/4 lengths from a field that consisted mostly of older males.

Tried on the turf in the Tropical Park Oaks, Letruska failed to fire, but she's since won six of 10 subsequent starts, including three stakes in 2020—the Added

> Elegance Stakes, Shuvee Stakes (G3), and the Rampart Stakes (G3). She captured the Jan. 31 Houston Ladies Classic Stakes (G3) this year as a 5-year-old. In her previous start, she was beaten a head by last year's Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) heroine, Shedaresthedevil, in the Azeri Stakes (G2).

> Letruska follows last year's Jockey Club Gold Cup (G1) scorer Happy Saver as the second grade 1 winner to emerge from the first two crops sired by Super Saver, out of the mares he received following a bright early start to his stud career.

> A a son of the short-lived champion 2-year-old Maria's Mon (by Wavering Monarch, from the Majestic Prince branch of the Raise a Native line),

took the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (G2) at 2, and a muddy rendition of the Kentucky Derby presented by Yum! Brands (G1) in 2010. He was quickly off the mark at stud, represented by four 2-year-old stakes winners in his first crop, including Competitive Edge who took the Hopeful Stakes (G1) and I Spent It, winner of the Toyota Saratoga Special Stakes (G2), and runner-up to Competitive Edge in the Hopeful. Ultimately, that first crop would deliver no less than nine stakes winners, also including champion sprinter Runhappy, the Alabama Stakes (G1) heroine Embellish the Lace, and graded stakes winners High Dollar Woman and Super Majesty. But, having sired six graded scorers and nine stakes winners from 118 foals in his first crop, Super Saver would then get just one graded scorer and nine total stakes winners from his next three crops, which contained 265 foals.

Super Saver's record did improve with his fifth crop—the first sired after the bright beginning by his initial juveniles—supplying three stakes winners, including Letruska and Super Steed, who captured the Southwest Stakes (G3). Super Saver's sixth crop, the one conceived after Runhappy and Embellish the Lace had emerged, has been his best since his first, with five stakes winners from 73 starts, including Happy Saver and the UAE Oaks Sponsored by Range Rover (G3) captress Down On Da Bayou. However, the emergence of this trio came too late to prevent the sale of Super Saver, alongside his WinStar Stud companion, Daredevil (now back in Kentucky and at Lane's End Farm), to the Turkish Jockey Club, the pair standing their first season in that country in 2020.

Letruska is half sister to another smart performer in the ill-fated Candy Ride son, Trigger Warning, a multiple stakes winner who was second in the Indiana Derby (G3), and third in the Pennsylvania Derby (G1) and Ohio Derby (G3). Their dam, the Successful Appeal mare Magic Appeal, was a sharp juvenile who broke her maiden at Saratoga Race Course, and took runner-up spot in the Wings of Jove Stakes, and third in the

Adirondack Stakes (G2). Magic Appeal is a sister to a very accomplished 2-year-old in J P's Gusto, who captured the Del Mar Futurity (G1), Best Pal Stakes (G2) and Hollywood Juvenile Championship (G3), and ran second in the CashCall Futurity (G1) and Norfolk Stakes (G1). Kid Majic, a black-type placed half sister to Magic Appeal and J P's Gusto has also made mark appearing as the dam of Miss Mischief, champion female sprinter and champion older mare in Canada, and granddam of the Del Mar Futurity second, Rowayton.

Call Her Magic, the granddam of Letruska, was a smart performer in the mid-Atlantic region, winning the Ocean Hotel Stakes at Monmouth Park, and the listed Walking in Da Sun Stakes at Delaware Park. Call Her Magic is half sister to Pacific Spell, dam of Proud Spell, who earned honors champion 3-year-old filly of 2005 with a campaign that saw her triumphant in four graded stakes, including the Kentucky Oaks and Alabama Stakes.

Call Her Magic's dam, Malibu Magic, a daughter of Encino—a lightly-raced brother to Royal Academy—was half sister to Imaginary Lady, another standout female. Imaginary Lady ran second to stable companion Open Mind in the Kentucky Oaks, but was successful in four other graded contests, including the Santa Anita Oaks (G1) and the Black-Eyed Susan Stakes (G2), which she took in a new track-record. Though the 1917 mare, Virginia L., Letruska traces back to a half sister to the 1888 Belmont Stakes victor Sir Dixon, also leading Sire in 1901. Virginia L. has also exercised an influence on the modern Thoroughbred, as she appears in the female line of Cryptoclearance (grandsire of Candy Ride) and Boldnesian (grandsire of Seattle Slew).

Letruska is one of only two stakes winners sired by Super Saver from only eight starts out of Valid Appeal line mares. It's interesting that Valid Appeal's sire, In Reality, turns up in eight of Super Saver's 28 stakes winners, also including his standout colt Runhappy, as well as four of the six stakes winners sired by Super Saver's son, Competitive Edge. In Reality has a pedigree heavily influenced by the I2a1 Achilli mitochondrial haplotye, and this just happens to also be the mitochondrial female line of both Letruska and Runhappy. BH
