# LIFE IS GOOD FACES ELDERS IN KELSO **HANDICAP**

Thile Pennsylvania will be the focus of attention this weekend for the 3-year-old crop, another sophomore runner of note will be continuing his comeback in New York.

After a highly promising runnerup finish in the Aug. 28 H. Allen Jerkens Memorial (G1), while racing after nearly six months on the sidelines, Life Is Good will face older horses for the first time. running in the one-mile \$300,000 Kelso Handicap (G2) Sept. 25 at Belmont Park.

"As great as he ran last time, you're always concerned if they will run as well or better the next time, but he's trained like he's ready to roll," said Todd Pletcher, who trains the 3-year-old grade 2 winner for China Horse Club and WinStar Farm.

That last race was indeed impressive.

Back in March, the undefeated Life Is Good was one of the most—if not the most-heavily touted—Triple Crown candidates. Then ankle chips sidelined him for nearly six months and the owners switched trainers, shifting him from Bob Baffert's barn to Pletcher's. The Allen Jerkens Memorial at Saratoga Race Course was chosen as his return to the races, and it was a highly viable plan. Except that the multiple grade 1 winner Jackie's Warrior also targeted the seven-furlong Jerkens.

Life Is Good, with a 3-for-3 record before the race, turned in a superb effort, but wound up second. After leading on the turn, the son of Into Mischief was passed in the stretch and then battled back in the final yards to lose by a neck to Jackie's Warrior, the current favorite for the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) who will also be racing Saturday as an odds-on favorite in the Gallant Bob Stakes (G2) on a Parx Racing card that also includes Triple Crown runners-up Hot Rod Charlie and Midnight Bourbon in the \$1 million Pennsylvania Derby (G1).

"We were giving up a lot of recency to a real nice horse and I thought he ran terrific (in the Jerkens) and came out of it in good shape," Pletcher said. "He's trained how you would expect him to since then."

Since Life Is Good is already a graded stakes winner around two turns, the Oct. 2 Woodward Stakes (G1) at 1 1/8 miles and Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) seemed like possible options after the Jerkens. But due to all the lost training time, Pletcher said the two-turn Big Ass Fans Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) at Del Mar will be next if the son of the Distorted Humor mare Beach Walk runs to expectations Saturday.

"We've talked about this as a prep for the Dirt Mile and we hope he keeps moving in that direction," Pletcher said about the \$525,000 purchase from Paramount Sales' consignment to the 2019 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. "This gives him a little

Though the stars of the 3-year-old division will be battling without him at Parx around two turns in a grade 1 stakes Saturday afternoon, once 2022 rolls around they could very well have to contend with Life Is Good in rich races such as the Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes (G1) and Saudi Cup (G1).

"The conversation I've had with the connections indicate those are the races we're talking about," Pletcher said about the Pegasus and Saudi Cup.
"So we're hopeful, should the Kelso go well and the Breeders' Cup go well, that the Pegasus would be the next target."

While the Kelso will be at the same distance as the Dirt Mile, it will offer a different trip around the racetrack than the one at the World Championships. While the Nov. 6 Dirt Mile will be a two-turn journey around Del Mar, the Kelso will be contested over one turn at the 1 1/2-mile oval at Belmont Park.

Irad Ortiz Jr. will be aboard Life Is Good for the first time, replacing Mike Smith.

Only four rivals turned out to face Life Is Good Saturday, topped by Shooting Star Thoroughbreds' Chance It.

Trained by Saffie Joseph Jr., the grade 1-placed, multiple stakes-winning Florida-bred son of Currency Swap has four firsts and four seconds in 10 career starts. He is coming off a third in the Forego Stakes (G1), 2 1/2 lengths behind Yaupon.

The field also includes Doubly Blessed, who was seventh in the Forego, Informative, who was seventh in the Charles Town Classic Stakes (G2), and Fort Peck, an easy winner of a \$50,000 claimer in his last start.

Though Life Is Good is the lone 3-year-old among the five starters and 3-year-olds generally receive three pounds from older rivals in the weights at this time of year, he will tote the co-highweight of 119



## NEWMARKET HOSTS QUALIFIERS, NON-CHALLENGE RACES AT PARX

n efore 14 Breeders' Cup Challenge races are Contested in the United States and France Oct. 1-3, a quiet week concludes September in the Challenge Series. Only two races remain on the month's schedule, both at Newmarket in England.

First up is the Sept. 24 Unibet Rockfel Stakes (G2), which offers its winner a paid, automatic berth into the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T). Then the next day, the Juddmonte Royal Lodge Stakes (G2) provides the same qualifying entry into the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Presented by Coolmore America (G1T). The two Breeders' Cup races will be held Nov. 5 at Del Mar.

Regardless of the absence of automatic Breeders' Cup qualifiers in the U.S., Breeders' Cup contenders will be in action this weekend, mainly in the east. Parx Racing hosts the Pennsylvania Derby (G1) and Cotillion Stakes (G1) Sept. 25, along with a series of supporting stakes that could propel horses into the Breeders' Cup. About 100 miles away at Belmont Park, Life Is Good is the headliner of the one-mile Kelso Handicap (G2), and should he perform well, a



Runners from other years fared better. The 2017 Pennsylvania Derby winner West Coast was third to Gun Runner and Collected in that year's Breeders' Cup Classic at Del Mar. Farther back, Bayern won both races in 2014, surviving a stewards' inquiry to win the Classic after breaking inward into opponents.

That followed 2013 when Pennsylvania Derby winner Will Take Charge fell a nose short of catching Mucho Macho Man when second to him in the Breeders' Cup Classic.

> The Cotillion has similarly impacted the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1), notably in 2018 when Monomoy Girl won the Distaff

after being disqualified from victory for interference in the Cotillion and placed second in that race behind Midnight Bisou. The latter ran third in that year's Breeders' Cup.

Also during the prior decade, Untapable won both the Cotillion and Breeders' Cup Distaff in 2014. Numerous other 3-year-old fillies from the Cotillion

managed to hit the board on Breeders' Cup Day.

A year before, McKinzie and Axelrod, 1-2 in the Pennsylvania Derby, ran 12th and ninth in the Breeders' Cup Classic.

Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen, who trained Untapable and Midnight Bisou over the second half of her career, has four top prospects in competition Saturday at Parx. Besides Winchell Thoroughbreds' Midnight Bourbon, Stonestreet Stables' Clairiere races for him in the Cotillion, and he runs a couple of grade 1 winners on the undercard.

Winchell Thoroughbreds and Willis Horton Racing's Silver State starts in the Parx Dirt Mile, which is around two turns like the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile this year.

Asmussen also starts Kirk and Judy Robison's Jackie's Warrior in the Gallant Bob Stakes (G2), readying him for the six-furlong Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1).

## BAFFERT, NYRA TO MEET OCT. 5 IN U.S. DISTRICT COURT

An Oct. 5 court date in Brooklyn for oral arguments before U.S. District Court Judge Carol Bagley Amon has been scheduled for trainer Bob Baffert's motion to hold the New York Racing Association in contempt for its latest attempt to suspend him.

Baffert's attorneys filed a motion Sept. 22 with the U.S. District Court Eastern District of New York seeking to stop NYRA from pursuing what they called an "unlawful suspension."

NYRA has until Sept. 29 to respond in writing to Baffert's motion.

Baffert originally received a temporary suspension by NYRA in May, barring him from racing at its three tracks, after two blood tests revealed the Baffert-trained Medina Spirit won the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) with the corticosteroid betamethasone in his system. NYRA's actions were also sparked by Baffert's four other drug violations in the previous year and "other related information."

Baffert took NYRA to court over the ban and Amon ruled in his favor July 14, citing a lack of due process in NYRA's actions. In response, NYRA

announced new hearing rules and procedures Sept. 10 and set dates for pre-hearing scheduling conferences for Baffert and trainer Marcus Vitali, leading to Baffert's motion for contempt.

spirit of the court's order enjoining it from any further action."

The pre-hearing scheduling conferences for Baffert and Vitali in front of the designated hearing officers were originally scheduled for late September but have been moved to Oct. 11 for Baffert and Oct. 13 for Vitali. At that time, the dates for the actual evidentiary hearings will be determined.

While all of this is unfolding in New York, the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission has yet to make a final ruling on the order of finish in the Kentucky Derby or a suspension for Baffert, pending the results of a third blood test.

In addition to his legal issues in New York, Churchill Downs Inc. suspended Baffert from June 2 through the 2023 spring meet at Churchill Downs. In addition, beginning Sept. 30 Kentucky Derby qualifying points will not be awarded to horses trained by individuals such as Baffert who are suspended from the 2022 Kentucky Derby.

Baffert has yet to file legal actions against CDI over either ban.

Vitali has a long list of violations and suspensions and did not have a starter from July 21, 2019, until Jan. 4, 2021. During his career, he was suspended for 365 days in 2019 by the Delaware Thoroughbred Racing Commission for impeding an investigation. In 2016, he gave up his trainer's license in Florida while facing penalties for seven medication

violations, though he later accepted a 120-day suspension.

Vitali has won with 14 of his 90 starters through Sept. 22 at various tracks in 2021. He is currently racing primarily at Presque Isle Downs and Finger Lakes.

In a career that dates back to 1989, he has sent out 5,725 starters with 902 wins and \$14,874,338 in earnings. BH



# POWERFUL TRADE AS KEENELAND SEPTEMBER CLOSE NEARS

As the Keeneland September Yearling Sale nears the end with one day left of selling, all figures show a healthy increase from the COVID-19 pandemic year of 2020. Consignors are setting realistic reserves and buyers are still struggling to get orders filled, both of which helped lend to a record low RNA rate of 12.2% for the Sept. 23 session.

"It's been an excellent sale—very strong," Derek MacKenzie of Vinery Sales said. "If they vet well and look the part, then you are rewarded with more than expected, so that's great."

A total of 303 yearlings sold for \$9,194,000 during the 10th session Thursday at Keeneland, for an average of \$30,343 and a \$23,000 median.

The third day of Book 5 will start tomorrow to conclude the 11-day sale. Cumulatively Keeneland has sold 2,538 horses for \$360,194,000, for an average of

\$141,920, and a median of \$75,000. The overall RNA rate is 16.6%.

At the conclusion of Book 5 in 2020 (a two-day session), Keeneland reported 244 horses sold for gross receipts of \$4,764,900, an average price of \$19,528, with a median of \$13,000, to represent the 301 horses on offer. Fifty-seven horses failed to meet their reserve,

representing an RNA rate of 18.9%.

With 24 yearlings sold from 24 offered, Paramount Sales was the leading consignor for session 10 with total receipts of \$1,169,000, achieving an average price of \$48,708. Cumulative leading sale consignor Taylor Made Sales Agency has grossed \$36,430,000, representing 267 horses sold of the 335 on offer, carrying an average price of \$136,442.

In comparison to 2020, this year Book 5 sells over three days, with the last day presenting 453 horses (before outs).

"I think (the new format) is fantastic because it helps concentrate the sale—there are so many outs in the last book, so it makes a full day of selling for today," said Pat Costello of Paramount Sales. "The end of the sale this year is amazing. Everything going up to the ring is selling, and

coming into the sale, I didn't think it would be anything like this. It's solid."

A \$145,000 son of Tapiture led the day early on to hold as the session topper. The colt consigned as Hip 3173 by Paramount is out of the winning Dayjur mare Informative Style, who has also produced Watch This Cat, winner of the 2017 Las Cienegas Stakes; Canadian stakes winner Stylish Citizen; stakes-placed Point Blake; and a recent catalog update with full sister Li'l Tootsie, who placed in the Sept. 4 Prioress Stakes (G2) at Saratoga Race Course. The colt was bred in Kentucky by Davant Latham, who watched the horse go through the ring to be secured by John Greathouse, purchasing for Al and Arlene London's Glencrest Farm.

The second-highest price of the day was the \$120,000 paid for a filly from the first crop of Bolt d'Oro, also consigned by Paramount. Offered as Hip 3182 and purchased by Maddie Mattmiller, agent for Black Type Thoroughbreds, the filly is out of the stakes-placed Julie's Jewelry (by Distorted Humor), from the family of grade 1 winners General Challenge, Notable Career, and Evening Jewel. Offered initially by Small Batch Sales at the 2021 Keeneland January Horses

Beech Forest consigned as Hip 3186 by Warrendale Sales was their top purchase. Klimt rounded out the session as leading sire with seven progeny sold, accumulating \$289,000. Lothenbach also acquired a \$65,000 Goldencents filly (Hip 3211), a \$50,000 Candy Ride filly (Hip 3385), and a \$20,000 daughter of Connect.

The day concluded with Hip 3579, the final horse to go through the ring and the last horse to carry the South Point Sales name, leaving the back ring with no dry eyes. The agency's co-founder Mike Recio left the community far too soon when he died Sept. 16, and he is sorely missed. A celebration of life will be held in Recio's



honor Oct. 1 at The Thoroughbred Club of America adjacent to Keeneland from 6:00-9:00 p.m. ET.

The sale concludes Sept. 24, with the first horse of the day set to go through the ring at 10 a.m. ET. BH

## UPDATE PROPELS \$145,000 TAPITURE COLT AT KEENELAND

A Tapiture colt with a solid update collected \$145,000 Sept. 23 to top the 10th session of the Keeneland September Sale, marking a home run for his Darby Dan sire.

John Greathouse purchased the colt out of stakesproducer Informative Style, consigned by Paramount Sales as Hip 3173, on behalf of Arlene and Al London's Glencrest Farm.

The bay colt benefited from potentially the most significant update of Book 5, as his full sister, Li'l Tootsie, recently placed third in the Sept. 4 Prioress Stakes (G2) at Saratoga Race Course. Li'l Tootsie is currently listed at odds of 3-1 on the morning line for the Sept. 25 Dogwood Stakes (G3) at Churchill Downs.

Davant Latham bred the colt, who was foaled and raised at Richie Donworth's Scarteen Stud. Latham, who recently retired the mare, bred Informative Style to Tapiture for three consecutive seasons, aiming to capture Tonalist's cross. The Belmont Stakes (G1) winner is by Tapit out of a Pleasant Colony mare; meanwhile, Hip 3173 is by Tapit's son, and his female family includes a second dam by Pleasant Colony.

Greathouse, the London's agent, was pleased to fill their order on the penultimate day of the sale, as the competitive market stymied multiple earlier attempts. "I thought it was an extremely athletic horse," said Greathouse. "The family is still really active. Obviously, he's got the full sister that's graded stakes-placed, and I think she's in this weekend in the Dogwood. ... I have been trying to buy a horse for (the Londons) all week, and we just keep getting outrun. This horse is for them. They have been clients of ours for a long time—lovely, lovely people. (Al London) was really keen on the horse, he loved the horse, loved the pedigree, and we liked the stallion.

"Wish them all the best... They have been in the business a long time. They love winning, they love racing, and they're happy to have the colt."

Thus far at the 2021 September Sale, nine of Tapiture's 10 yearlings to pass through the Keeneland ring have sold for an average purchase price of \$43,111. He has two additional yearlings scheduled to sell on the final day of Book 5 (Hips 3745 and 3936). Hip 3173 was Tapiture's top performer, by far, outdoing his second most expensive yearling (Hip 2620) by \$100,000. Nonetheless, Greathouse applauded the sire, who stood the 2021 season for an advertised fee of \$10,000.

"I've always felt like Tapiture gets a good, athletic horse," he said. "They're big-walking horses. This horse we bought today had a wonderful walk on him, good reach, good conformation. They seem like classy animals, and they seem to run—they win—and that's just the name of the game." BH

# MADDEN'S FAIRYTALE LIVES ON WITH BUCKLAND SALES

Thoroughbreds run in Lexington native Zach Madden's blood. The manager of Buckland Sales, Madden started his consignment in partnership with Millennium Farms in 2015 and never looked back.

Growing up in the bluegrass on his grandfather's farm, Madden fell in love with horses at an early age.

"My grandfather had a small farm out Tates Creek Road. It had 40 acres, (and) at the peak they had maybe 20 horses on the farm. It was kind of a boutique operation; he bred to race, bred to sell. I remember going to foalings as a little kid, I grew up on the farm, essentially," Madden said.

"It was like a fairytale, to grow up out there. We had chickens, horses, llamas, we chased frogs, all the fun stuff."

Madden graduated from the University of Kentucky in 2009 and worked for Three Chimneys Farm throughout school. He initially considered a career as a trainer, but discovered that he enjoyed the sales aspect of the industry the most.

"I went to UK, and I hated school. It was a little bit ass-backwards ... I would base my school schedule around my work schedule," Madden said. "It was really boring; I would go to bed and work, but I loved it. I loved breaking yearlings, I loved the farm aspect of it ... It was tough. My first day I got bit, kicked; I sort of learned how to clean a track stall."

After staying with Three Chimneys for 10 years and eventually becoming the director of client development, Madden left to pursue the opportunity to start his own consignment with the help of the team at Millennium.

"I was the youngest person doing their own consignment," he said. "It was really intimidating, but I just put my head down. We sold some good horses at first and we're selling better ones now. Just

trying to up the quality. I think our reputation is built up. We try to do things right."

Madden's very first Buckland consignment was to the 2016 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Among those sold was Chocolate Martini, a Broken Vow mare who went on to win the 2018 Twinspires.com Fair Grounds Oaks (G2) and place in the Coaching Club American Oaks (G1).

"We sold Chocolate Martini, who won the Fair Grounds Oaks and was grade 1-placed at Saratoga. When she won that, it was one of the greatest days of my life," Madden said.

Since starting his consignment, Keeneland has been a staple in Madden's business, although he also sells elsewhere. This year, he brought 15 horses for the September Sale, consigned from Book 3 through Book 5, and sold 12 for gross receipts of \$705,000.

"We didn't start selling until Book 3 and it was awesome," Madden said. "I felt like it was really good trade up there. We were really busy showing those two and a half days. We sold four or five; I was excited about that.

"I feel like the market spills over each session. I have a lot of good friends and good agents that I've talked to that have filtered through the barn and said, 'Man, it's so tough to get stuff bought,' so I think that's going to spill over hopefully on into October. It's just one of those things; it's so unbelievable how relentless and resilient the whole horse business is."

Madden says he believes 2021 is a great time to sell a horse and that buyers are eager.

"I haven't been in the business 50 years or something, but I've been in it for 12, 13 years and I've never seen the scene in the back, people just hungry for horses," he said. "Bidding, 50, 60, 70K for horses they haven't even vetted."

For Madden, working in the Thoroughbred industry is a labor of love, and he would not have it any other way.


"One of my best friends at my wedding said, 'I remember when he would have to wake up and go to work really early in the morning and I just thought what the hell is he doing? It's never going to amount

to anything; he's just going to drive himself crazy.' Looking back on it, those were some of the most fun (times), working with those horses.

# '22 CHICAGO THOROUGHBRED DATES DROP WITH ONLY HAWTHORNE

Chicago-area racing in 2022 will be all Hawthorne, all the time.

With Arlington International Racecourse up for sale and track owner Churchill Downs Inc. declining to apply for racing dates, the Illinois Racing Board Sept. 23 approved a 2022 schedule that has Hawthorne Race Course hosting both Thoroughbred and harness racing. Barring a purchase of Arlington by an owner interested in continued racing or a change in CDI's plans, Arlington's last day of racing is Sept. 25.

The plan, developed with input from both horsemen's groups, provides for 76 Thoroughbred programs, a sharp drop from the 120 dates split between Hawthorne and Arlington in 2021, and for 75 Standardbred programs.

Hawthorne president Tim Carey acknowledged the reduction in racing days will be a hardship for horsemen but promised that, with Arlington out of the picture, Hawthorne's purse structure could increase from a daily average of some \$105,000 to \$165,000 for 2022, taking up some of the lost potential.

"The future of racing is very, very bright," Carey told the IRB. "There are skeptics who say racing is dead. They are wrong."

Carey said his family, which has operated Hawthorne through four generations, is spending \$400 million in a rebuilding project that includes the construction

of a casino authorized by the legislature in a 2019 gaming expansion bill. Amid competition, a lack of gaming revenue at tracks has contributed to a steady decline of Illinois racing and breeding for more than a decade.

"That obstacle is gone,"
Carey said. "Now we have the
opportunity and we're going to
seize it. We're investing \$400
million in Hawthorne because
we believe in the future of horse
racing."

Carey also promised a rebuilt stakes schedule going forward that

will be of sufficient quality to attract national attention and purse increases to as much as \$300,000 a day once the track and casino are in full operation.

While horsemen enthusiastically praised Hawthorne's long commitment to racing, Mike Campbell, president of the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, said the industry is far from out of the woods.

"I wish I could be as optimistic as Tim is," Campbell said, noting casino contributions to purse accounts are at least two years away.

"I'm afraid we're going to have a sad ending here if we don't see some casino revenue soon to help out with these purses," he said.

Ultimately, Carey and representatives of both horsemen's groups said Illinois racing badly needs a new harness racino targeted for the south Chicago suburbs. It is held up because of political issues.

The Hawthorne Thoroughbred schedule includes racing from April 2 through June 25 and from Sept. 23 through the end of the year. Harness racing will take place between those dates. Hawthorne takes up and replaces the Thoroughbred racing surface when the action switches between the breeds.

The board approved a 61-day Thoroughbred schedule for FanDuel Sportsbook and Horse Racing, a downstate track previously known as Fairmount Park, which also is building a casino and this year revived the long-dormant St. Louis Derby with a purse of \$250,000. That 2022 meeting will run from April 19 to Sept. 24. BH

# ASCOT STUD STANDS RISING SIRE TOWN PRIZE

A scot Stud owner Chris Blake saw a promising sire bereft of opportunity in Town Prize, when he went looking for a stallion for his roster that had been emptied by one retirement and another sidelined by a disability. He ended up getting much more than he anticipated.

Town Prize, a 12-year-old stakes winner by Speightstown, had been standing at the late William Sorokolit Sr.'s JWS Farms but not getting much support. Blake, who had previously stood stallions for Shadwell Farm—Swain and Aljabr—whose progeny were more suited to a distance of ground, was attracted to Town Prize because of his speed. The horse won the six-furlong 2012 Woodstock Stakes at Woodbine by 5 1/4 lengths in 1:08.22, only 6/100ths of a second off the track record of 1:08.16, held at the time by Essence Hit Man.

"I was looking for something more sprint-oriented," Blake said. "He has his father's build with a big rump and big shoulder." WinStar Farm's Speightstown, a son of Gone West, also was fast and earned honors as Eclipse champion sprinter for 2004 after winning the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1) at Lone Star Park.

When Blake leased Town Prize and began standing him in March at his Ontario farm, the stallion had five winners from nine starters; a solid enough of a beginning for a stallion that has 16 foals of racing age. Town Prize's stature as a sire changed quickly.

His 3-year-old daughter Artful Ballerina started the momentum by capturing the five-furlong Georgian Bay Stakes Aug. 7 at Woodbine to become her sire's first black-type winner. The William Sorokolit and Vandyk Sunny Stables' homebred, who made her racing debut this year, came into the stakes off two second-place finishes and now has a win and three seconds from four career starts.

Nearly a week after the Georgian Bay, 6-year-old gelded son Town Cruise made his mark in stakes company with a runner-up finish in the King Edward Stakes (G2T) at Woodbine, which was his first stakes start. Then Town Cruise blasted one out of the park Sept. 18 when he won the Ricoh Woodbine Mile (G1T) gate-to-wire by 2 1/4 lengths for trainer Brandon Greer, who bred the gelding with his father Terrance Greer.

"He's only had a handful of foals and now he's thrown a big horse, so you have to wonder what this horse could do if he had a full book of mares," Blake said. "It will help him that his runners are doing well at Woodbine."

As of Sept. 23, Town Prize has seven winners from 10 starters and two (13%) black-type winners. Town Cruise's victory in the Woodbine Mile pushed his Canadian earnings over \$1 million (a total of US\$789,642) and drove his sire's total progeny earnings to US\$1,139,329. While a big purse like the Woodbine Mile certainly skews average progeny

earnings, it is worth noting that the sire's median progeny earnings is \$38,707, which is respectable considering his stud fee was CA\$5,000 his first year at stud and has been CA\$3,500 since then.

As noted earlier, Town Prize has not attracted many mares so Blake wants to give the stallion as much opportunity as possible going forward. He plans to stand him for CA\$2,500 next year but will consider for approved mares offering a complimentary season in exchange for an agreement to split any future breeders' awards. BH

# BROWN LOOKS TO CONTINUE ATHENIA ROLL WITH SHARP DUO

Pour-time Eclipse Award-winning trainer Chad Brown will saddle Pocket Square and Miss Teheran Sept. 25 in the \$200,000 Athenia Stakes (G3T), a 1 1/8-mile inner turf test for fillies and mares 3-years-old and up at Belmont Park.

Brown has won four of the last five runnings of the Athenia and has totaled five wins overall, including scores by Pianist (2013), Roca Rojo (2016), Off Limits (2017), Rymska (2018), and Tapit Today (2020).

Juddmonte homebred Pocket Square, a 4-year-old Night of Thunder chestnut, enters off a 4 1/4-length allowance optional claiming win traveling 1 1/8 miles on the Saratoga Race Course turf Aug. 25. She 3-5 on the morning line.

A group 3 winner as a juvenile in France for trainer Roger Charlton, Pocket Square posted a debut win for Brown in a 1 1/16-mile Keeneland allowance tilt in April. She followed with back-to-back fifth-place finishes in grade 1 events—in the one-mile Longines Just a Game Stakes (G1T) in June at Belmont and the 1 1/8-mile Diana Stakes (G1T) in July at Saratoga.

"We had very high hopes for her coming out of the allowance win at Keeneland and we tried her in some ambitious spots. She has always trained well," said Brown's Belmont-based assistant Dan Stupp. "She came back into form at Saratoga and hopefully that gave her confidence. She's made a good appearance at Belmont this fall."

Doubledown Stables' Miss Teheran, a 5-year-old Irish-bred daughter of Teofilo, captured a one-mile allowance optional claimer on the Saratoga turf Aug. 1 and rallied to finish second last out in the 1 1/16-mile Miss Liberty Stakes Aug. 28 at Monmouth Park. The late-running chestnut boasts a record of 4-4-1 from 13 starts with earnings of \$199,372.

"She had a little bit of a trip and came with a nice late kick, but didn't quite get the job done. She gave a good account of herself and we were pleased with her effort," Stupp said of the Miss Liberty try. "Obviously, we would have liked to have won but she showed up

off her allowance win at Saratoga and gave another good effort."

Miss Teheran, 9-5 on the morning line, has breezed back twice since the Miss Liberty, including a half-mile effort in :50.05 most recently on the Belmont main track.

"She's had a couple maintenance works and seems to be doing well," Stupp said. "She's a very honest filly and tries every time. She's a one-run late filly—save a little ground, get a little cover, and then get out and make her run."

Irad Ortiz Jr. has the call aboard Pocket Square from post 4, while Manny Franco will guide Miss Teheran from post 2.

Godolphin homebred Lake Lucerne, a 4-year-old Dubawi bay, enters from a narrow nose score in a 1 1/16-mile allowance optional claimer Sept. 1 at Saratoga.

Out of the multiple grade 1-winning Awesome Again mare Round Pond, Lake Lucerne launched her career in England with trainer John Gosden before joining American trainer Brendan Walsh.

Made In Italy and Stand for the Flag complete the turf field. Spice Is Nice is a main-track-only entrant.

Rain is forecast in New York through Sept. 24 before clearing Saturday. BH

## KING FURY TOPS INAUGURAL RUNNING OF BOURBON TRAIL

Fern Circle Stables and Three Chimneys Farm's King Fury headlines a field of seven 3-year-olds entered for the Sept. 25 inaugural running of the \$275,000 Bourbon Trail Stakes at Churchill Downs.

Run at 1 3/16 miles, the Bourbon Trail is set to go as Race 9 at 4:55 p.m. ET on a Saturday program that also features the \$275,000 Dogwood Stakes (G3) and the \$275,000 Harrods Creek Stakes.

Winner of the Stonestreet Lexington Stakes (G3) at Keeneland, King Fury has run against some of the nation's top 3-year-old colts this year, including his most-recent fifth behind division leader Essential Quality in the \$1.25 million Runhappy Travers (G1) at Saratoga Race Course. Trained by Kenny McPeek, the son of Curlin broke his maiden at Churchill on debut and scored a half-length victory in the \$98,000 Street Sense Stakes there last fall.

King Fury's 3-year-old campaign includes his 2 3/4-length victory in the \$200,000 Lexington and a runner-up finish to Masqueparade in the \$500,000 Ohio Derby (G3). He will be reunited in post 4 with jockey Brian Hernandez Jr., who has been aboard for all three of his victories.

Also entered is Rupp Racing's stakes winner Gagetown. Trained by Brad Cox, the son of Exaggerator most recently finished third Aug. 28 in the \$250,000 St. Louis Derby Sponsored by FanDuel Sportsbook. He won the \$50,000 Prairie Mile Stakes in June. Martin Garcia has the call from the rail.

#### **Irish Unity Tops Harrods Creek**

Clearview Stable's recent \$250,000 St. Louis Derby runner-up Irish Unity tops a competitive field of 10 3-year-old colts and geldings that was entered in Saturday's first running of the \$275,000 Harrods Creek Stakes.

The seven-furlong Harrods Creek will go as Race 10 with a post time of 5:26 p.m.

Irish Unity, conditioned by leading trainer Steve Asmussen, has not finished worse than second in four career starts. The son of Pioneerof the Nile won his first two starts in June at Lone Star Park before shipping to Asmussen's Kentucky string. Irish Unity finished second to Beaver Hat in a conditioned allowance event at Ellis Park before his runner-up effort to Flash of Mischief in last month's St. Louis Derby. Hernandez has the mount from post 7.

Wayne Davis' Louisiana-based gelding Emerald Forest will look to break through in his first Churchill outing. Trained by Shane Wilson, Emerald Forest dominated his two most recent starts by a combined 18 lengths at Evangeline Downs and Louisiana Downs. Louisiana Downs-based Jose Guerrero travels to Kentucky to ride from post 5.

#### Carribean Caper Looks to Streak On

Columbine Stable's undefeated 3-year-old filly Carribean Caper will attempt to land her fifth consecutive victory Saturday as the likely favorite in the 46th running of the \$275,000 Dogwood Stakes.

The seven-furlong Dogwood drew a compact field of seven 3-year-old fillies and was carded as Race 8 with a post time of 4:22 p.m. ET.

Trained by Al Stall Jr., Carribean Caper began her career at Fair Grounds Race Course with a scintillating eight-length score. The daughter of Speightstown then cruised to a 4 1/2-length first-level allowance victory at Keeneland.

After three months away from the races, Carribean Caper returned in a conditioned allowance event at Ellis Park where she dominated four rivals by 4 1/2 lengths. In her most recent start, the Kentucky-bred defeated Magic Quest by a length in the \$100,000 Runhappy Audubon Oaks at Ellis. Colby Hernandez, who has been aboard Carribean Caper for all four of her lifetime starts, will ride from post 2.

The Dogwood field also includes Joel Politi's Li'l Tootsie and Let It Ride Stables' Shesa Mystery, both graded stakes -placed contenders. BH

Bordonaro, a 20-year-old gelded son of Memo out of the Rajab winner Miss Excitement, goes to Old Friends through the United Pegasus Foundation in Tehachapi, Calif. The gelding raced as a homebred for Fred Carrillo and Daniel Cassella from 4 to 6 and won six stakes, including the 2006 Ancient Title Breeders' Cup Stakes (G1) and consecutive runnings of the Count Fleet Sprint Handicap (G3) at Oaklawn Park in 2006-07. He captured his first graded win in the 2005 Vernon O. Underwood Stakes (G3) at the now defunct Hollywood Park.

A California-bred, Bordonaro had his best year at 5 when he won three of five starts—adding the Sunshine Millions Padua Stables Sprint Stakes to his victories in the Ancient Title and Count Fleet Sprint—and placed second in the Bing Crosby Handicap (G1). # GOVERNMENT TO LISTEN TO REPRESENTATIONS FOR LEVY REFORM

Government said Sept. 23 it would listen to "detailed representations" for an early review of the levy after being warned there was a risk that Britain would be overtaken as a global hub of racing if action was not taken to improve its finances.

Chris Philp, the new minister with responsibility for racing and gambling, was speaking during a debate in the House of Commons on the contribution of horse racing to the economy brought by former cabinet minister Matt Hancock, whose constituency includes Newmarket.

Hancock told MPs it was a "crucial time for the British horseracing industry" which, aside from a contribution of around £4 billion a year to the economy, also acted as "a bridgehead for significant trade and investment into the UK."

However, he said there was a "significant problem" for racing coming out of the pandemic, with falls in prize-money and activity in the bloodstock sector.

Hancock added: "We've seen other countries around the world such as Ireland, France, and Australia stepping up to back their racing industries more and if we don't follow suit, we'll be overtaken as the home of racing, and we must not let this happen."

He called on ministers to fix "loopholes" in the levy through two changes, one changing its basis to turnover rather than gross profits, and applying it to all racing globally bet on by British customers, a move he claimed could be quickly enacted and which would generate around £20 million annually for British racing.

In response Philp said Hancock was right to highlight "the vital contribution racing makes to our economy" and agreed with his points about the sport's "contribution to the United Kingdom's soft power."

Philp pointed out a review of the terms of the levy was due in 2024, but added: "If there are particular reasons why a review ought to be considered sooner, I would be very happy to look at those detailed representations, either from my right honorable friend or from the industry, and consider those very carefully."

The minister reminded MPs that since the 2017 reforms of the levy, it had "exceeded expectations" in how much extra income it had brought in.

However, he concluded: "I think it serves our national interest and the interests of all of our constituents to have a vibrant and successful horse racing industry."

S anta Barbara, one of Ballydoyle's brightest talents, has died after a fractured pelvis worsened the night of Sept. 22, trainer Aidan O'Brien revealed. The 3-year-old daughter of Camelot was being treated for the injury but was unable to be saved after further complications.

Bred by O'Brien and his wife Annemarie O'Brien's Whisperview Trading, Santa Barbara impressed when she landed the Belmont Oaks Invitational Stakes (G1T) at Belmont Park against her age group, then won the Beverly D. Stakes (G1T) against older mares at Arlington International Racecourse.

"Santa Barbara fractured her pelvis and unfortunately the fracture displaced overnight," O'Brien told Racing Post Sept. 23. "It's obviously a real shame for everyone. She was a very talented filly."

A half sister to Breeders' Cup winners Iridessa and Order of Australia, Santa Barbara was memorably sent off 5-2 joint-favorite for the QIPCO One Thousand Guineas (G1) after winning a Curragh maiden on her only start as a 2-year-old.

She finished fourth to stablemate Mother Earth at Newmarket before failing to stay when fifth behind Snowfall in the Cazoo Oaks (G1), then ran Thundering Nights close in the Al Wasmiyah Stud Pretty Polly Stakes (G1) when second.
