BC TO REQUIRE ENHANCED TESTING OF BAFFERT'S HORSES

All horses trained by Bob
Baffert that compete in any
2021 Breeders' Cup races will
have to undergo enhanced outof-competition, pre- and postrace testing, and other security
protocols, at Baffert's own
expense, to participate in the Nov.
5-6 World Championships at Del
Mar, Breeders' Cup announced
Oct. 17.

The organization previously announced Sept. 18 it had commenced a review process as to whether the Hall of Fame trainer would be permitted to participate in this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships.

Baffert currently is embroiled in legal battles connected to Zedan Racing Stables' Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) winner Medina Spirit, who tested positive for the corticosteroid betamethasone in both initial and split-sample blood tests. As betamethasone is not permitted on any level on race day in Kentucky, the finding could lead to the horse's disqualification and disciplinary action against Baffert by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission.

While no regulatory action has taken place on that failed test, Churchill Downs took action. The trainer currently is suspended from running horses through the spring meet of 2023 at the Louisville track. Churchill Downs

Inc. announced Sept. 10 that horses trained by Baffert or his staff are not eligible to receive qualifying points on the Road to the 2022 Kentucky Derby.

Baffert was granted a preliminary injunction to race in New York July 14 by a United States District Judge after the New York Racing Association sought to suspend him May 17, approximately a week after news of the failed test. The judge cited a lack of due process.

During an Oct. 11 pre-hearing scheduling conference, hearing officer O. Peter Sherwood set a Jan. 24 date for the NYRA's disciplinary hearing for Baffert. At the Jan. 24 hearing before Sherwood, NYRA will present its case in seeking to suspend the trainer while Baffert's legal representatives will argue on his behalf.

The Breeders' Cup's statement in full reads:

"Breeders' Cup conducts
Thoroughbred racing at the
highest levels of safety and

the Breeders' Cup board of
directors convened a special
review under legal counsel to
evaluate the recent conduct of

Mr. Bob Baffert in order to determine whether he should be permitted to participate in the 2021 World Championships. In the interest of fairness, Mr. Baffert was provided with advanced notice and an opportunity to take part in the process, and the board appreciated his participation and cooperation in connection with its inquiries.

"Based on the totality of the circumstances, Breeders' Cup has decided to require all horses trained by Mr. Baffert to undergo enhanced out-ofcompetition, pre- and post-race testing and other security protocols, at his own expense, in order to participate in the 2021 Breeders' Cup World Championships at Del Mar.

"In addition to operating under the rules and regulations of both the California Horse Racing Board and Del Mar for the 2021 World Championships, those competing in any Breeders' Cup race are subject to another set of rules specific to the Breeders' Cup, which include the Breeders' Cup Condition of Entry, the Prohibited Substance Rule, and the Convicted Trainer Rule. On top of our industry-leading protocols and standards, additional testing and security requirements for any horse under Mr. Baffert's care will be administered at his expense under a signed agreement to provide a more targeted layer of accountability. These additional measures include increased randomized out-of-competition testing for all prohibited and restricted substances, additional tests administered the week of the World Championships, increased veterinarian and security checks, and in-person 24-hour security surveillance ahead of the horse or horses' respective events. Mr. Baffert has agreed to abide by each of these additional measures.

"Working with horses and competing in the World Championships is a privilege, and medication restrictions and testing protocols are in place for a reason. The Breeders' Cup expects Mr. Baffert's complete cooperation in ensuring that every horse under his care is in full compliance with all medication restrictions and safety standards.

"Breeders' Cup looks forward to the uniform rules and enforcement mechanisms that the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority's antidoping and medication control program will bring to our sport."

Baffert, in a statement he texted to BloodHorse, said, "I share the values of the Breeders' Cup board and the principles which underlie the World Championships of our great sport. I welcomed the good-faith inquiry of the Breeders' Cup racing committee and we transparently answered their requests, through documentation and in-person meetings. I invite any pre-race scrutiny and testing for my Breeders' Cup entrants. I compliment the horsemen on the Breeders' Cup board that selflessly provided their time, diligence, and integrity in reviewing the true facts and not acting on a false rush to judgment."

Baffert's Breeders' Cup contingent is led by Medina Spirit for the Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) and champion Gamine, who will seek to defend her crown in the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (G1). BH

MUTAMAKINA DIGS IN FOR E. P. TAYLOR STAKES SCORE

Having already won the Aug. 22 Dance Smartly Stakes (G2T) going 1 1/4 miles on the Woodbine turf, Mutamakina used similar pace-stalking tactics to capture the CA\$602,000 (US\$486,331) E. P. Taylor Stakes (G1T) over the same course and distance Oct. 17.

Jockey Dylan Davis was back aboard the 5-yearold Nathaniel mare for trainer Christophe Clement. Mutamakina pressed the pace in second, and while she had control a quarter-mile out in the Dance Smartly before a half-length victory, it was a closer call Sunday.

She didn't get in front of E. P. Taylor pacesetter Kalifornia Queen until a sixteenth out from the finish line and her stablemate, La Dragontea, rallied from last of 10 to come within a neck at the wire.

"She ran well over here (last out in the Dance Smartly) and we saw an opportunity again to bring her out here," Davis said. "Christophe, first off, did a great job of getting her here. I've been breezing her, setting up for this race, and she's been breezing well and maintained herself and we knew that she would be tough coming here."

Mutamakina, who earned her first top-level victory, completed the 10 furlongs on yielding turf in 2:09.14. She paid \$19.80 to win.

"She handled everything great," Davis added. "Last time she put herself in a great position laying second. Today, again, she got her nerves going a little bit more than previously, but she put herself in a great position putting herself second. We slowed down the pace and she was handling it well for me and I just needed her to finish strong. Once she got a head in front there at eighth pole she was digging in nicely. She handled the turf well today."

La Dragontea, winner of the Sept. 18 Canadian Stakes Presented by the Japan Racing Association (G2T) at Woodbine, flew home under Joel Rosario to beat favorite Kalifornia Queen into third by a neck. Kalifornia Queen had led the field into the straight, crawling through fractions of :27.26, :54.46, 1:20.84, and 1:45.35 over the heavy going.

Mutamakina is owned by Al Shira'aa Farms and was initially campaigned in France by the same owner with trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias. She was moved stateside to Clement's barn last fall and has since won three graded stakes. She owns a 5-3-3 record from 16 career starts and has earned \$634,509.

Bred in Great Britain by Widgham Stud, Mutamakina is out of the Danehill mare Joshua's Princess, who has seven winners from as many

> starters and delivered a Camelot colt this year. Mutamakina's third dam is European Horse of the Year Ridgewood Pearl.

Agent Shawn Dugan purchased Mutamakina for the equivalent of \$137,225 from New England Stud's consignment to Book 2 of the 2017 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. BH

AVIE'S FLATTER HOLDS CHALLENGERS AT BAY IN NEARCTIC

Van Dalos' Avie's Flatter made amends for a winless 2020 campaign in landing a second graded stakes score on the year in the Oct. 17 Nearctic Stakes (G2T) at Woodbine. Under Luis Contreras, he finished with a flourish, prevailing by a half-length over Turned Aside and reaching the CA\$1 million mark in career earnings.

A Canadian champion 2-year-old in 2018, Avie's Flatter began his 5-year-old season with a facile allowance optional claiming win on the Woodbine main track before capturing the July 18 Connaught Cup (G2T) sprinting seven furlongs on the turf. After a fourth in the King Edward Stakes (G2T) when stretched out to a mile, he tackled the Ricoh Woodbine Mile (G1T) in his most recent start, finishing a troubled ninth.

Cutting back to six furlongs in the CA\$281,800 (US\$227,655) Nearctic, the son of Flatter went to post at 7-1 odds against a competitive field of 10 that included Woodbine Mile hero Town Cruise and King Edward victor Olympic Runner.

American shipper Momos grabbed the early the lead, as Town Cruise shadowed the pacesetter through an opening quarter timed in :22.72, with Avie's Flatter positioned fourth by Contreras. Past a half-mile in :45.95, Town Cruise began a steady retreat as Avie's Flatter and

17-1 shot Turned Aside began their assault on the leader. Avie's Flatter seized command down the lane and opened up a narrow advantage over a tiring Momos as Olympic Runner launched a furious rally from the back of the pack. At the wire, Avie's Flatter secured a half-length victory over a game Turned Aside. Another length back, Olympic Runner was third, besting Momos by a neck for the show.

"He handled it perfect," said Contreras. "I got a great trip and I'm so happy with the way he ran. I got a nice trip in the backstretch, and I was loaded the whole way."

The final time over yielding ground was 1:10.52. Avie's Flatter paid \$16.50 for the win.

"This is a good horse," said trainer Josie Carroll. "This

horse, from the time he was 2, every year, he shows up and gets it done. We have him back to sprinting now and he's thriving on it. It's wonderful. This horse is kind of a barn favorite so it's very special for all of us when he wins."

An Ontario homebred for Dalos' Tall Oaks Farm, Avie's Flatter is is now 7-3-2 from 18 starts. He is the second stakes winner produced from the Empire Maker mare Avie's Empire, who is the dam of Wonder Where Stakes victress Avie's Mineshaft (Mineshaft) and the grade 3-placed Avie's Mesa (Sky Mesa). Avie's Empire has a 2-year-old Shanghai Bobby filly and foaled a colt by Tapit this year. She was bred to Curlin for 2022. BH

HOT ROD CHARLIE, TRIPOLI BREEZE AT SANTA ANITA

Pennsylvania Derby (G1) winner and Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) runner-up Hot Rod Charlie worked six furlongs at Santa Anita Park Oct. 16 in 1:14 as he prepares for a bid in the Nov. 6 Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) at Del Mar.

"We were happy," said trainer Doug O'Neill after the work. "He cooled out good. If all goes well and he stays injury-free, we're two works away. He'll have one at Santa Anita and one at Del Mar.

"I'm a little biased because I'm part of the race, but I think it's coming up as one of the most contentious Classics in a while. It's a wide-open race with tons of contenders."

Tripoli, winner of the Aug. 21 TVG Pacific Classic Stakes (G1), on Sunday worked for the Classic at Santa Anita, clocking five furlongs in 1:01 for trainer John Sadler. In his most recent start, the Kitten's Joy 4-year-old was fourth behind Medina Spirit in the Oct. 2 Awesome Again Stakes (G1).



NEW YORK-BREDS ON DISPLAY AT F-T SARATOGA FALL SALE

There are close to 300 horses cataloged for the Oct. 18 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Fall Sale, with the majority of them being weanlings representing both established stallions and horses whose first crop have hit the ground this year. The sale kicks off at 10 a.m. ET at the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, N.Y. As of Sunday afternoon, there were 53 horses reported withdrawn from the sale.

Among the new stallions
represented at the sale are New
York-bred grade 1 winner Audible;
Vino Rosso, winner of the 2019
Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1);
and 2018 Clark Handicap Presented by Norton
Healthcare (G1) winner Leofric, who stands in New
York at Rockridge Stud.

Other New York stallions with weanlings at the sale are Laoban (who stood at Sequel Stallions New York through 2020), Bustin Stones (Waldorf Farm), and Central Banker and Solomini (both at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds).

"As we all know, there was no group hit harder during the pandemic than New York breeders," said Bayne Welker, executive vice president at Fasig-Tipton. "All of our New York-bred sales had to be canceled or morphed into mid-Atlantic venues. The breeders are very excited to offer horses back in their area."

"It's a great book, with a wide variety of quality weanlings and broodmares," said Najja Thompson, executive director of New York Thoroughbred Breeders. "With all the incentives we have in New York, we're excited for another opportunity for people to get more involved in the program, and it all starts with sales like this."

At the 2019 edition of the sale, the last time it was held, Fasig-Tipton reported 134 horses sold for gross receipts of \$3,384,700, creating an average price of \$25,259 and a median of \$15,000. Eighty-two horses failed to meet their reserve price to represent an RNA rate of 38%. A total of 271 horses were cataloged in 2019.

Lili Kobielski's The New Hill Farm is bringing

a consignment of 14 horses to the sale, a combination of horses that she owns or bred and clients' horses. The Freud-Dakota Kid colt that Kobielski sold for \$83,000 two years ago to Reeves Thoroughbred Racing at this sale, now named Dakota Gold, won the \$500,000 Nownownow Stakes on the turf at

Monmouth Park last month and is being pointed to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1T) Nov. 5 at Del Mar.

"The sales have been really, really strong this year," said Kobielski. "People are making money, pinhookers are optimistic. I'm as optimistic as I can be.

"Every year I see people here that had never come before. In 2019, people came in from Kentucky trying to swoop in and grab something at the last second. I was surprised at how much the babies were going for."

"We've done well at this sale in the past," said James Gladwell. "We go up there with a budget a

"We've done well at this sale in the past," said James Gladwell. "We go up there with a budget and a plan to spend some money. It's the biggest group of New York-bred weanlings in one spot, and we love buying them to sell them in Saratoga in August at the Fasig-Tipton sale of preferred New York-bred yearlings.

"We've got a couple of racing clients that love racing in New York," he continued, "and they've started buying some weanlings to race. You can find athletes early on and save a little money, rather than buying as yearlings or 2-year-olds."

A Practical Joke colt out of Singing Doe brought the top price of \$160,000 at the 2019 sale, selling to Steven Weston, who lives in Saratoga Springs for part of the year, not far from the sales grounds, and he plans to be back looking this year.

"It's a great sale," Weston said. "I find there's an

advantage in that if you buy a weanling, you're usually buying at a reduced price. We purchased that Practical Joke colt for \$160,000, and a few weeks later I went to the Keeneland November sale to look at weanlings and Practical Jokes were going for more money than that. Obviously buying him at the price was a pretty good idea. "The challenge is having to outbid the

"The challenge is having to outbid the pinhookers. Usually, the offspring of firstyear stallions go for a little bit more."

That's good news for Kobielski, whose consignment includes seven broodmares, six of which are

six of which are carrying the first foals by Gunnevera; and seven weanlings, of which four are by Mitole, Vino Rosso, Audible, and Maximus Mischief—all sires with their first foals on the ground this year. Hip 173 is a Mitole half sister to the \$150,000 Practical Joke filly sold two years ago.

"Our consignment is a showcase for new stallions," she said. "I've seen only good things from them. It's a reasonably small sample, but the weanlings are

"Those are two nice fillies, and they are in good shape this morning," said Baldo Hernandez, who is overseeing the Brown string at Keeneland. "They may be going back to New York tomorrow."

Shantisara, owned by Michael Dubb, Madaket Stables, and Robert LaPenta, surged to a record-setting five-length victory over Klaravich Stables' Technical Analysis.

The previous week, the Brown-trained duo of Blowout and Regal Glory ran 1-2 in the First Lady Stakes Presented by UK HealthCare (G1T) for owner Peter Brant.

Hernandez said Blowout and Regal Glory also would head back to New York with the QE II runners.

Flavien Prat rode both grade 1 winners with Jose

Ambition in the filly's graded stakes debut.

"I have no idea what I am going to do with her next since there is obviously no turf racing in Kentucky for a while," Cox said. "Possibly the American Oaks."

The \$300,000 American Oaks (G1T), run over 1 1/4 miles at Santa Anita Park, is Dec. 26.

Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and TOLO Thoroughbreds' Queen Goddess, who finished fifth in her stakes debut, will train at Churchill Downs the next couple of weeks and then ship to California, trainer Michael McCarthy told Keeneland media via text.

Harris Farms' Closing Remarks, sixth on Saturday, was scheduled to return to trainer Carla Gaines' Santa Anita base on Tuesday.

James Wigan's Cloudy Dawn, seventh in her U.S. debut for trainer William Haggas, was scheduled to ship back to Europe on Monday, according to head lad Suraj Bissessur.

G. Watts Humphrey Jr.'s Flippant is scheduled for a two- to three-month break following her eighth-place finish, according to Phil Oliver, husband of trainer Vicki Oliver.

Leaving for Europe Sunday was Mrs. John Magnier, Michael Tabor, and Derrick Smith's Empress Josephine, who finished last of nine as the favorite. "The lack of cover early in the race didn't help her," said Kieran Murphy, who has overseen the filly's training at Keeneland for Aidan O'Brien. "It was tough to come back that quick from what was a tough race last week for her (in the First Lady in which she was third)."

Murphy also said Katsumi Yoshida's Nicest, who finished fourth for trainer Donnacha O'Brien, would not be leaving Sunday with plans to be determined.

Charles Fipke's undefeated Lady Speightspeare, who was scratched at the starting gate prior to the QE II, is scheduled to return to Woodbine on Monday.

"She's OK this morning. It's just disappointing to come all this way and not run," said Ally Walker, assistant to trainer Roger Attfield. "She has a bit of a wild side, and yesterday she reared up four times in the gate and then tried to lay down."

Breeders' Cup Preparations

Thunderous Affair, trained by Lindsey Partridge, was selected by the panel of judges of the Thoroughbred Makeover and National Symposium, presented by Thoroughbred Charities of America, as the 2020 Thoroughbred Makeover Champion, sponsored by Churchill Downs.

The 2017 16.2 hand gray/roan mare was bred in Kentucky by Jim Williams. She never made a start, but did train to race. By Liaison out of the Thunder Gulch mare Thunder Fan, Thunderous Affair was placed through CANTER Michigan.

Lindsey Partridge, a professional based in Pontypool, Ontario, is no stranger to the Thoroughbred Makeover—she won the overall title back in 2015 with Soar—but this particular journey

has not been without its challenges.

"She didn't trust me in the beginning," recalled an emotional Partridge. "I really had to slow down and just go to events, and just not make it about competing. Just the fact that she was so calm and relaxed here and able to trust me to do everything gosh, I'm going to start crying!"

Partridge, who has made a name for herself with her unique brand of horsemanship and crowd-pleasing freestyle routines, trained Thunderous Affair to not one but two discipline championships—Freestyle, in which the pair played with Partridge's signature big blue tarp and other props, and Competitive Trail, in which Thunderous Affair's easygoing demeanor impressed judges and spectators alike.

"It's all about putting that relationship first," Partridge described, reflecting on her past Makeover performances and her road to success. "I've done ranch and field hunter and trail and freestyle, but it all comes back to that partnership first."

Loves Only You, a 5-year-old Deep Impact mare who finished third in the Longines Dubai Sheema Classic (G1) and won the FWD Queen Elizabeth II Cup (G1) at Sha Tin in the spring, will be entered in both the Longines Turf (G1T) and the Maker's Mark Filly & Mare Turf (G1T). Marche Lorraine, a black-type winner on dirt, is intended for the Longines Distaff (G1).

AKAITORINO MUSUME WINS SHUKA SHO AS SODASHI RUNS 10TH

A kaitorino Musume stepped up to carry her owner's colors to victory in the Shuka Sho (G1) Oct. 17 at Hanshin Racecourse as her white compatriot, Sodashi, faltered through the final 200 meters to finish 10th.

The fillies are both are owned by their breeder, Kaneko Makoto Holdings, but have different trainers. Both were well fancied in the third leg of the Japanese Filly Triple Crown, with two-time grade 1 winner Sodashi the heavy favorite.

Through most of the 2,000 meters (about 1 1/4 miles) it looked as though Sodashi was poised to pounce as jockey Hayato Yoshida had her just behind the early speed with daylight in front.

But as field turned into the stretch and hit the climb toward the finish, Sodashi began to labor while Akaitorino Musume, with Keita Tosaki at the controls, started to make up ground. Akaitorino Musume was in front with 100 meters to run and had enough to withstand a late run by the second favorite, Fine Rouge, by a half-length, clocked in 2:01.2.

Andvaranaut was third after briefly challenging the winner early in the stretch run.

"I was able to settle the filly in good position and race

her in good rhythm," Tosaki said of Akaitorino Musume. "She responded willingly and stretched really well in the lane. I think she is a strong horse and felt that she has stepped up to the next level.

"I'm really glad we were able to claim the last leg of the Triple Crown ... I look forward to her performances going forward," Tosaki said.

Fine Rouge, a Kizuna filly, also has something to look forward to after her impressive stretch move. The Shuka Sho was her second straight impressive result at 2,000 meters after a victory in the Shion Stakes (G₃) at Nakayama Racecourse.

"For the Shion Stakes, she was back bigger and stronger," Tomohiro Kusunoki, assistant to trainer Takaki Iwato, said of Fine Rouge. "And having gotten big, the distance was a concern. We decided if she couldn't handle the distance we'd pass on the Shuka Sho. But she was fine."

Akaitorino Musume is regally bred, by the late Deep Impact out of the King Kamehameha mare Apapane, herself a four-time grade 1 winner including a sweep of the 2010 Filly Triple Crown.

"Her dam, Apapane, was a tough horse and powerful," Akaitorino Musume's trainer, Sakae Kunieda, said before the race, "and I'm hoping her daughter will carry on those traits."

Kunieda also trained Apapane and 2018 Filly Triple Crown winner Almond Eye.

After a learning experience in her career bow, Akaitorino Musume reeled off three straight wins before finishing fourth in the Oka Sho (Japanese One Thousand Guineas, G1) at Hanshin April 11. Sent 2,400 meters (about 1 1/2 miles) in the Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks, G1) May 23 at Tokyo Racecourse, she produced a promising effort, finishing second, and had been idle since.

Meanwhile, Sodashi's pure white coloring captured the loyalty of Japanese fans and she fanned the flames of fandom by winning her first five starts. By Kurofune, whose progeny appear to have distance limitations, she was caught out in the Yushun Himba, fading to finish eighth.

She rekindled hopes with a victory in the 2,000-meter Sapporo Kinen (G2) Aug. 22, a race in which Longines

Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T) candidate Loves Only You finished second.

Jockey Yoshida said prior to the race that Sodashi "doesn't have any particular quirks and I don't think the hill will pose a problem. She's (a) clever horse and it's not hard to get into position. Another horse can lead if she wants. There's no need to insist on any one strategy."

In the end, it was not strategy that was lacking but, rather, stamina. $\ensuremath{\mathsf{BH}}$

HUNT BEGINS FOR ANOTHER AUDARYA AT ARQANA OCTOBER SALE

Yearling sale season moves on to Arqana this week and an event which has, should it be needed, some ready evidence that each stop is worthwhile for buyers seeking a quality horse.

August's Darley Prix Jean Romanet (G1) had two graduates of the October Sale split by a short head. Gianluca Bietolini's Grand Glory was bought privately for just €18,000 (US\$21,179) from Haras de Bourgeauville in 2017 and has won races in four consecutive years, also losing out by just a nose to Rougir in this month's Prix de l'Opera Longines (G1).

The filly Grand Glory beat at Deauville, Audarya, was the defending champion and poster girl of the October Sale not only for the auction house but for Haras des Capucines, which sold the daughter of Wootton Bassett to Stroud Coleman Bloodstock and Alison Swinburn for €125,000 (\$147,475) that very

same year. James Fanshawe's star also landed the Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1T) last year.

While it is not a sale with quite the same reputation as Arqana's showpiece August offering, there are plenty of individuals who come to hand later in the calendar and numerous top-class sires and vendors represented among a heavyweight catalog of more than 700.

"Every consignment needs to sell a good horse from time to time," said Eric Puerari, who founded Capucines with Michel Zerolo in 1994.

"It's true she was sold in October, even though (sire) Wootton Bassett was not what he has been since, but she was a beautiful filly at the time.

"I think it's very important to sell a horse who has some maturity and of course competition is less important in October. The results of the sale are pretty good, a lot of nice horses are coming from there. It's a bit less expensive, but usually, a well-bred horse with quality does well there."

Puerari brings more than 30 lots to Deauville through the week and selected a few to note from

the draft.

"I have a bunch of nice Almanzors," he said. "He's a young stallion, he hasn't had a lot of precocious horses yet but he's on his way.

"There are two very interesting colts, one is out of Rapid Transaction (Lot 98), he's a half brother to two black-type horses and is a beautiful colt, and another who is nice out of Bartira (Lot 196), she's the dam of a good stakes winner as well.

"There are two nice colts by Le Havre too, one out of a stakes winner in Persona Grata (Lot 87),

who is a half brother to Lovely Esteem, who was group 2-placed in Ireland this year.

"There's a nice Wootton Bassett colt out of a young Siyouni mare, Swing For Me (Lot 124), that's an interesting cross, and it's the family of Last Tycoon."

He continued, "We have an Australia colt (Lot 182), he's doing really well this year and he's a half brother to a group 2 winner in Australia called King of Leogrance. Then there is a Kingman (Lot 224) out of Dancing Breeze, a young black-type mare from the family of Halfway To Heaven.

"They're nice horses from top-class stallions, they just needed to mature a little bit. They could have been in August as well, I think they have the same quality as my August yearlings."

Capucines offers plenty of its own stock and was

in the news lately with the €400,000 (\$463,734) purchase of Gleneagles filly Tabera at the Arc Sale, and also boards for elite owners such as Martin Schwartz. Exceptional performers from Winged Love to Flotilla have come from the farm over the years and Puerari has noted some encouraging performances from the

most recent classes.

"I'm not really a consignor but we have some regular clients who give us their yearlings to sell, we sold Cheshire Academy, he won the Prix Noailles (G3), a prep for the (Qatar Prix du) Jockey Club (G1), and Etoile, a grade 1 winner (in the E. P. Taylor Stakes) for close friends as well," he said.

"We've also had some 2-year-old winners bred from the farm. Who Knows won the Circus Maximus Prix Francois Boutin (G3) and Welwal won the Prix de Crevecoeur for Jean-Claude Rouget, which is a top-class maiden race at Deauville in August. Cheshire Academy has been resting since the Grand Prix de Paris (G1) but I think he'll make a nice 4-year-old."

GROUP 1-WINNING SPRINTER BRANDO RETIRES AT AGE 9

The remarkably durable 9-year-old Brando has been retired after finishing 12th on his sixth and final crack at the Oct. 16 QIPCO British Champions Sprint Stakes (G1).

He was beaten just a nose by Glen Shiel when second in the Ascot group 1 event last year and had also finished third, fourth (twice), and sixth in the race in previous years.

Angie Bailey's sprinter did score at the top level in the LARC Prix Maurice de Gheest (G1) at Deauville in 2017, 11 months after he had given Kevin Ryan the fourth of his five victories in the William Hill Ayr Gold Cup.

Brando will spend his retirement with the trainer's daughter Amy and partner Tom Eaves, who rode him through most of his career, and Ryan said: "I had it in my

mind that win, lose, or draw on Saturday it was probably time to pull up stumps. We owe him more than he owes us.

"He's going to Tom and Amy, they have a yard next to my gallops and he's going to be retired there, he'll have a great life for the rest of his days. He's raced at the top level for so long, it's amazing really."

The son of Pivotal was bred by Car Colston Hall Stud and is the second top level scorer produced by the Silver Hawk mare Aregent Du Bois, who is also the dam of American Oaks Invitational (G1T) and Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes (G1T) captress Ticker Tape.

Brando, who was bought for 115,000 guineas (US\$202,003) at the Newmarket breeze-up sale in 2014, earned nearly £1.15 million (US\$1,513,752) in prize money and retires with a record of 9-12-7 from 53 trips to the post.

Ryan picked out the Maurice de Gheest, in a season when his North Yorkshire yard was hit by an equine herpes virus outbreak, as a particular highlight, and said: "That year we got closed down and within a fortnight of getting back racing he went and won a group 1 for me so that was very special. It's a day I'll never forget."

On top of his Deauville and Ayr successes, the chestnut gelding also won at the group 3 level in the Coral Charge Sprint Stakes at Sandown and two runnings of the Connaught Access Flooring Abernant Stakes at Newmarket.

Though unable to find the winner's circle this year, he was beaten less than three lengths when seventh in the July 10 Darley July Cup (G1) at Newmarket and was fourth in the Aug. 8 Maurice de Gheest—a race in which he also finished second in 2019.
