

FISHMAN GUILTY IN PED CASE, FACES 20 YEARS IN PRISON

Florida veterinarian Dr. Seth Fishman, the first person to face trial in a sweeping horse-doping case that documented the widespread use of illegal and undetectable performance-enhancing drugs at tracks across the country, was convicted in New York Feb. 2 on charges that could put him behind bars for 20 years.

A jury of eight women and four men in U.S. District Court in Manhattan found Fishman, 50, guilty of two counts of conspiring to violate adulteration and misbranding laws and the manufacture of PEDS administered to racehorses by corrupt trainers for money and fame.

U.S. District Judge Mary Kay Vyskocil will sentence Fishman May 5. Prosecutor Sarah Mortazavi

told the judge prosecutors would

be seeking to detain Fishman pending sentencing.

The verdict came swiftly. Jurors got the case late Feb. 1 and deliberated for about three hours Tuesday and Wednesday. The trial began with jury selection Jan. 19 and lasted 11 days.

The jury rejected Fishman's defense that his actions were in keeping with his oath as a licensed veterinarian to protect the health and welfare of animals.

"I understand the jury has reached a verdict," Vyskocil said after the jury filed in the wood-paneled courtroom on the 26th floor of the courthouse.

The jury's foreperson then announced Fishman's guilt on each of the counts.

"I love animals. I love horses," one of the jurors, Victoria Lopez, a 61-year-old woman from The Bronx, said in an interview following the verdict. "What they were doing wasn't right."

"The jury's swift conviction of Seth Fishman reflects the overwhelming evidence of his guilt as displayed through this trial," New York U.S. Attorney Damian Williams said in a release issued from his office. "As an ostensible veterinarian—sworn to the care and protection of animals—Fishman cynically violated his oath in service of corrupt trainers and in the pursuit of profits."

Williams added, "Through the sale of untested, unsafe, and unstable drugs, Fishman's illegal drug business was a platform for both fraud and animal abuse. Today's conviction appropriately condemns the danger inherent in Fishman's crimes and underscores the seriousness with which this office takes the kind of abuse that Fishman practiced."

Stuart S. Janney III, chairman of The Jockey Club, also reacted to the verdict.

"I am pleased to see all of the effort and time spent by federal agents, prosecutors, and others who have worked so hard on this case be rewarded with a guilty verdict, and I thank them for their commitment," Janney said in a statement distributed by TJC.

"It is highly encouraging to know that those who cheat and endanger our sport's athletes, both equine and human, face meaningful and life-changing punishments," he added. "Clearly, this verdict will serve as a deterrent to others, and it also provides

hope for those who want to see true change in the racing industry. This step forward, one of many recently, reflects our steadfast determination towards maintaining the highest levels of integrity and safety for racing's athletes and customers."

Fishman wasn't in the courtroom when the verdict was announced. Vyskocil hasn't said in open court where he is. A cryptic comment from Fishman's attorney to the judge led to speculation Fishman may be in a hospital.

Fishman had a co-defendant, Lisa Giannelli, at the start of the trial. She worked with Fishman for 18 years, and prosecutors accused her of being Fishman's drug distributor. On Jan. 24, Vyskocil declared a mistrial in her case after her attorney tested positive for COVID-19.

Nearly two years ago, Williams' office charged Fishman, six other veterinarians, 11 trainers, and nine others, identified as PED distributors, with conspiring to dope horses in New York, New Jersey, Florida, Ohio, Kentucky, and the United Arab Emirates.

The investigation began in 2018 and was headed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and criminal investigators with the Food and Drug Administration.

At the time of the indictment, then-New York U.S. Attorney Geoffrey Berman said the case was "the most far-reaching prosecution of racehorse doping in the history of the U.S. Department of Justice."

At a March 2020 press conference announcing the indictments, FBI New York assistant director in charge William F. Sweeney Jr. said the doping conspiracy risked the health of horses administered PEDs.

"What happened to these horses amounted to nothing less than abuse," Sweeney said.

Those charged included top trainer Jason Servis, who federal prosecutors say juiced multi-millionaire Maximum Security, the first-place finisher in the 2019 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1), who was demoted to 17th by stewards for interference with another horse in the race.

The accused also included Jorge Navarro, who was sentenced to five years in prison last year after pleading guilty to conspiracy. Prosecutors presented evidence at Fishman's trial showing that the trainer paid Fishman tens of thousands of dollars for PEDs, including a substance called BB3 that prosecutors say thickens a horse's blood to make it run faster and farther.

Navarro is one of nine charged individuals who have pled guilty. Two others who were arrested entered into non-prosecution agreements with prosecutors.

The Fishman trial revealed that another of those accused, former harness trainer Ross Cohen, struck a deal with prosecutors to become a cooperating witness.

Servis and several others have pled not guilty and are awaiting trial. Prosecutors have said in court papers that they are in plea discussions with several defendants without naming them.

The Fishman verdict could have an impact on cases going forward.

The evidence against Fishman included witness testimony, emails and texts, and wiretap recordings that captured Fishman talking about doping horses, and bragging that his drugs wouldn't appear in post-race testing. Prosecutors also showed the jury thousands of vials of drugs seized from Fishman's Florida company Equestology.

Two of those witnesses were harness trainer
Adrienne Hall and Thoroughbred trainer Jamen
Davidovich. They testified they juiced their horses with
PEDs obtained from Fishman. Hall testified under
deferred prosecution agreement with the government.
Davidovich's testimony came after he was granted
immunity.

As part of their case, prosecutors also played for the jury video of Navarro's juiced X Y Jet winning the \$2.5 million Dubai Golden Shaheen Sponsored By Gulf News (G1) in Dubai in 2019. X Y Jet died of a heart attack a year later, Navarro said in a statement shortly after the incident.

"Thank you boss, (you're) a big part of it," Navarro said in a text exchange with Fishman just after the 2019 Golden Shaheen.

The Thoroughbred industry's leading publications are working together to cover this key trial. BH

F-T WINTER MIXED SALE PUSHED BACK A DAY DUE TO FORECAST

Due to the ice storm currently forecasted in the region around Lexington, Fasig-Tipton officials

are pushing back the start date of next week's Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale to Feb. 8.

The two-day auction was originally scheduled to take place on Feb. 7-8, a Monday and Tuesday, but will now be held Feb. 8-9, a Tuesday and Wednesday.

Hips 1-300 will now be offered in the Tuesday SIG-TIPTON PHOTOS

session. Hips 301 through the supplemental catalog (which currently goes through Hip 606), will be offered on Wednesday. Both sessions will begin at 10 a.m. ET.

"Our area is currently under an ice storm warning from tomorrow morning through Friday morning, and in the interests of safety we have decided to push the sale back by one day," said Fasig-Tipton president and CEO Boyd Browning Jr. "This will ensure that horses and sale participants will have ample time to arrive on

> the sales grounds and begin inspections when conditions are safe to do so."

On Jan. 31, Fasig-Tipton announced 35 additional supplements to the sale, including the stakes-placed Road to Romance (Hip 592), Smartly Agree (Hip 594), Regal Retort (Hip 598), and Taylor Avenue (Hip 599). Other

additions include Maggi O'Prado (Hip 597), a half sister to grade 1 winner Dream Tree, and Gypsy Angel (Hip 600), dam of stakes winner Mrs. Orb. BH

FASIG-TIPTON SANTA ANITA 2-YEAR-OLDS

FASIG-TIPTON PUTS CALIFORNIA 2YO SALE ON HOLD FOR 2022

Rasig-Tipton is putting its 2-year-olds in training sale at Santa Anita Park on hold this year due to logistics and the limited supply of 2-year-olds in California.

"We are taking a year off," said Boyd Browning Jr., president of Fasig-Tipton. "The numbers make it impractical and there are challenges, such as not having dedicated stalls at Santa Anita. Some trainers had to be displaced last year."

Browning said Fasig-Tipton will hold its California Fall Yearlings Sale Sept. 27 as scheduled at the Fairplex sales grounds in Pomona. Last year, this sale also offered horses of all ages. The auction sold 165 yearlings for a gross of \$6,675,050 and a \$40,455 average. For all horse types offered—broodmares, racing prospects, and weanlings included—the sale sold 177 horses for a gross of \$6,933,550.

"We had a great yearling sale last year and were ecstatic with the results," Browning said. "We are very bullish about the California market with some new stallions coming in. As for the 2-year-olds, we still think it is an important spot in the market."

Following the end of Barretts Equine Sales' 28year run conducting sales in California in 2018, Fasig-Tipton stepped in to hold its first 2-year-olds in training sale in 2019 at Santa Anita. The sale was conducted using four rows of temporary barns in the track's parking lot, near the seven-furlong chute.

This inaugural sale sold 69 juveniles for a gross of \$3,769,500 and averaged \$54,630.

The California 2-year-olds sale got shelved in 2020 due to restrictions associated with the COVID-19 pandemic and returned last year to sell 53 horses of the 68 on offer June 23 for gross receipts of \$2,981,000, an average price of \$56,245 and a median of \$50,000. Fifteen horses failed to meet their reserve.

The 2021 edition was topped by a Tiznow filly out of Soot Z (by Empire Maker) who worked in :10.3 at the under tack show held two days before she sold as Hip

36 with Pike Racing, agent. Spendthrift Farm scooped the juvenile up for \$250,000, the leading price of the sale by \$95,000. The filly was bred in Kentucky by Tolo Thoroughbreds and Art Tanaka.

As with any sale, there was solid demand for the horses attracting the most attention last year when eight horses sold for \$100,000 or more. By comparison, the inaugural sale of 2019 sold 10 horses for \$100,000 or more. The top of the 2021 market, however, was softer than in 2019. The top price at last year's sale landing at \$250,000 compared with 2019 when four horses sold for \$250,000 or more. The top seller in 2019 was a \$420,000 Bernardini filly named Eclair, who went on to become a stakes winner. BH

VANLANGENDONCK SUCCEEDS O'FARRELL AS OBS BOARD **CHAIRMAN**

rancis Vanlangendonck became the fifth chairman of the board in the history of Ocala Breeders' Sales. Mike O'Farrell steps down after nearly 40 years as an OBS board member. George Onett was the first chairman in 1975, followed by Harry Mangurian Jr., Norman Casse, and O'Farrell.

Vanlangendonck operates Summerfield Sales with his wife, Barbara. Prior to being elected chairman, Vanlangendonck has been an OBS board member since 1990, became secretary/treasurer in 2005, and then vice president from 2007-21. Summerfield has been a perennial leading consignor at the OBS yearling and mixed sales. Last year, Summerfield ranked 15th nationally with yearling sales of nearly \$9 million. Their full-service farm includes a swimming pond for rehabilitation and to prep and condition yearlings.

O'Farrell was elected to the OBS board in 1983, was vice president from 1986-2006, and chairman since 2007 before stepping down this year. The O'Farrell family's Ocala Stud has been a mainstay in Ocala since 1956 with Mike and his two sons, David and Joe, now directing operations. Ocala Stud is synonymous with the Florida breeding industry and OBS. His father, Joe O'Farrell, was a true promoter of Florida breeding and pioneer of the 2-year-old

in training sales concept. He was one of the founding members of OBS in 1974 and the first vice president of OBS.

Barry Eisaman was elected vice president of the OBS board. Eisaman, a veterinarian, has been secretary/treasurer of OBS since 2010 and was first elected to the OBS board in 1996. Along with

his wife, Shari, Eisaman operates Eisaman Equine which is a constant presence and leading consignor at the OBS 2-year-old in training sales. Many of the top racing stables in the country rely on Eisaman Equine to provide the foundation for their young horses for their racing career and to rehabilitate older horses for their return to the races.

Mark Casse was elected secretary/treasurer. He and his wife, Tina, manage the vast Casse Racing operations from their base in Ocala. He has been an OBS board member since 2001 and his father, Norman, was a founding member of OBS and chairman of the board of OBS for over 20 years. Mark has won more than 3,200 races as trainer with career earnings approaching \$200 million. He has been

inducted into the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame and Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

Joining the OBS board for the first time are David O'Farrell (Ocala Stud) and Paul Sharp (Paul Sharp Stables). The rest of the board includes Tom Ventura (president), Carl Bowling, Nick de Meric (de Meric Sales), Jimbo Gladwell (Top Line Sales), Jesse Hoppel (Coastal Equine), John Penn (Pennston Farm), Bryan Rice (Woodside Ranch), and Eddie Woods, BH


L'sold for a session-topping \$85,000 to lead sizeable year-over-year gains Feb. 1 at the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association Winter Mixed Sale at Fairplex.


There were 113 horses sold for gross sales of \$1,298,407, an average of \$11,490, and a median of \$5,200. At last year's Winter Mixed Sale, 73 sold for gross sales of \$575,100, an average of \$7,878, and a median of \$3,200.

The California-bred Vronsky colt, out of the Cee's Tizzy mare Arousing, was bred by Harris Farms and Donald Valpredo and purchased by Dare to Dream, Don Calabria, and John Crawford. He previously sold to Jeff Ganje at the 2021 CTBA Northern California Yearling Sale for \$32,000.

A close second to the topper was Prince Jimi, a California-bred son of Jimmy Creed out of the Tiznow mare Following a Dream, which sold to Super Horse, agent Sweetwater Trading, for \$75,000. He was bred by Tony and Carol Busching. The colt initially went through the 2021 Fasig-Tipton California Fall Yearlings and Horses of All Ages Sale, failing to sell at \$7,000 for consignor Easterbrook Livestock Management.

The highest-priced filly purchase was a 2-year-old Kentucky-bred filly by Gun Runner, out of the A.P. Indy mare Mahogany Lane, purchased by Ron Thomsen for \$42,000. The unnamed filly was bred by Calumet Farm and purchased from their consignment at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale for \$10,000

FIRST FOAL FOR HIGHER POWER A FILLY OUT OF CURLITA

Darby Dan Farm's Higher Power, a grade 1-winning millionaire by Medaglia d'Oro, sired his first reported foal Jan. 26 when a filly out of the Curlin mare Curlita was born at Julie Rini's Crowning Point Farm. Bred by Deann Baer, the filly hails from the family of stakes winner and graded stakes-placed Daring Reality and grade 3 stakes winner Ski Dancer.

Higher Power, a dominant 5 1/4-length winner of the \$1 million TVG Pacific Classic Stakes (G1) at Del Mar with a career-best 113 Equibase Speed Figure, was a five-time winner of nearly \$1.6 million. In addition to his score in the Pacific Classic, he also placed in the 2019 Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1), 2020 Hollywood Gold Cup Stakes (G1), and 2019 Awesome Again Stakes (G1) for owner Hronis Racing and trainer John Sadler. He won at 2 and was stakes-placed at 3.

Bred in Kentucky by Pin Oak Stud, Higher Power is out of the multiple stakes-winning Seattle Slew mare Alternate, the dam of multiple graded stakes winner Alternation and multiple stakes winner Interrupted. Alternate is a half sister to 1995 Canadian Horse of the Year and multiple grade 1 winner Peaks and Valleys from the family of grade 1 winner Mucho Gusto.

Higher Power bred 152 mares in his first season at stud and stands for \$10,000. BH

MULTIPLE STAKES PRODUCER **BLENDING ELEMENT DIES AT 29**

I raded stakes winner Blending Element died at Jage 29 Jan. 27 at Sheltowee Farm in Midway, Ky.

The mare, whose five stakes winners include current California sire Texas Ryano, has been one of the foundation broodmares of the Williamson family. Raced in this country by the late Warren Williamson, Blending Element produced 12 foals, all bred by Williamson or in the name of Williamson Racing, operated by Williamson and his son Henry.

"We are all very sad," said Henry Williamson. "But she lived a long and productive life, both as a graded stakes winner and mom to multiple stakes winners, including our stallion Texas Ryano."

CANTERBURY TO OFFER INCENTIVES TO RACE-READY HORSES

anterbury Park racing officials announced Feb. 2 several incentive programs designed to reward owners of Thoroughbreds that arrive in Shakopee, Minn., ready to enter and run when the meet begins May 18. Notably, a \$1,000 bonus will be paid to the owner of any horse that races during the month of May. This bonus is in addition to any purse money earned.

The bonuses are made possible with the cooperation of the Minnesota Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, the organization which represents racehorse owners, trainers, and their employees. In addition, a travel loan program will again be offered to assist with the up-front expenses of shipping a stable to Canterbury Park. Both of these programs were successfully offered last season.

"Canterbury Park and the Minnesota HBPA understand the costs associated with shipping horses from across the country to Minnesota," senior vice president of racing operations Andrew Offerman said. "We hope these incentives assist in offsetting the transportation costs that we know can be an impediment to shipping a stable to Minnesota."

Average field size in May of 2021 exceeded the overall meet average by more than one-half a horse per race and average all-sources daily handle during that time was up more than 15% compared to the remainder of the 2021 meet, two factors that encouraged officials to continue the bonus program. The participation incentive will be paid for each start a Thoroughbred

makes in an overnight race during the month of May and is in addition to their regular purse earnings.

New this season is a bonus program designed to encourage owners who raced horses in Illinois during 2021 or 2022 to race at Canterbury this season. With the closure of Arlington International Racecourse in suburban Chicago, a meet which has historically overlapped with Canterbury Park's season, and Hawthorne Race Course in Cicero, Ill., racing Thoroughbreds only through June 25, Canterbury officials see an opportunity to attract new stables needing a summer venue.

"We understand that owners and trainers who have historically called Arlington home are faced with challenging decisions in 2022," Offerman said. "We respect that all horsepersons need to make the best decision for their stable and we have a desire to keep these horses within the Midwest. Canterbury Park is a great option for them to consider."

To encourage participation, Canterbury and the Minnesota HBPA are offering an incentive that will allow owners with horses that have been previously active in Illinois to receive an additional bonus for racing in Minnesota for either the entire summer or following the Hawthorne spring/summer meet. A Thoroughbred starter that raced in Illinois in 2021 or 2022 but has not previously started at Canterbury will be eligible for a \$1,000 bonus in their first start of the 2022 season through July 17. Eligible horses need to have recorded at least one start at Arlington, Hawthorne, or Fairmount Park from Jan. 1, 2021, through May 17, 2022. This incentive will be in addition to the \$1,000 participation bonus offered throughout May.

Shipping loan applications will be due with stall applications April 4. Applications will be reviewed by the stall application committee with up to \$25,000 per owner, or a maximum of \$1,500 per horse, to assist in covering the cost of horse transportation. The loan will be repaid through an agreement between the successful applicant and Canterbury Park. All information, full conditions, and loan applications specific to these programs, as well as the first condition book and stall application, can be found at www.canterburypark.com/horsemen.

Canterbury's 65-day season runs from May 18 through Sept. 17. Racing will be conducted on Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays at 5 p.m. CT and Sundays at 1 p.m. BH

Queen Goddess won't be able to skate away so easily from her rivals in the Bayakoa, as the opposing Mariah's Princess and Miss Bigly also flash consistent early speed.

Trained by Michael McCarthy, Queen Goddess will be piloted by jockey David Cabrera. While she ran without Lasix in the American Oaks, she will compete with Lasix in Saturday's race. Coach and Mariah's Princess are each exiting stylish victories over the Hot Springs, Ark., oval. Kueber Racing's Coach splashed to the wire a three-length winner of the Jan. 8 Pippin Stakes, acing her second consecutive win since returning from a near eightmonth layoff for trainer Brad Cox.

Rigney Racing's Mariah's Princess, like Coach, is another that has notched two straight wins since a lengthy hiatus from the races. The Phil Bauer trainee cruised by 6 1/4 lengths in a Nov. 4 Churchill Downs allowance contest before rolling to a three-length tally in the Dec. 4 Mistletoe Stakes on opening weekend at Oaklawn. BH

Pelta Downs will host its richest race program of the season Feb. 5 when the track will award \$933,000 in total purse money throughout 11 races, 10 of them stakes or starter stakes, all for Louisiana-bred horses. The event is called Louisiana Premier Day, and this year marks the 19th renewal of the event which will kick off with a special first post time of 12 noon CT.

The featured race on the card will be the \$150,000 Louisiana Premier Day Championship for older horses competing at 1 1/16 miles, which will be the 10th race on the program. This year's Championship attracted a full field of 12, which includes two also eligible runners.

The lukewarm 3-1 morning-line favorite for Saturday's feature is Keith Plaisance's Langs Day, who won the Gold Cup Stakes at Delta Downs Oct. 30 impressively before finishing a hard-closing second in a tough allowance race Jan. 12.

The Championship field also includes

Kendel D. Standlee's Izzy's Baby Boy (5-1), who most recently won a dramatic B-Connected Stakes on New Year's Day; Robert Asaro Enterprises' Maga Man (8-1), who comes into the event with the highest career earnings mark of \$289,480; and the Sam B. David Jr. trainee Jax Man (6-1), who ran second in the B-Connected for owners Alston Thoroughbreds, E. and K. Hernandez, and J. Duvieilh.

The \$100,00 Louisiana Premier Day Matron is headed by P. Dale Ladner's grade 2 winner Cilla. The Brett Brinkman trainee and daughter of the great California Chrome is the solid 6-5 favorite as she goes for her seventh career win and attempts to add to her lofty \$416,000 bankroll.

Another race that will get plenty of attention will be the \$100,000 Louisiana Premier Day Starlet. The one-mile event will be a rematch between 5-2 morning line favorite Free Like a Girl and Buckley Bunny.

Winners will be announced after the fifth race and will have to be present to win when the announcement is made from the winner's circle. To qualify for the drawing, entrants must be enrolled full-time for spring or summer 2022 classes and in good standing with their Louisiana college or university. BH

SCOTTISH TRACKS LOOK FORWARD TO RETURN OF CROWDS

Racegoers are finally free to return to Scottish courses Feb. 3 following the end of COVID-19 restrictions that have in effect barred paying spectators since before Christmas.

Kelso expects a "quiet start" for its meeting after first minister Nicola Sturgeon lifted the ban of more than 500 people attending outdoor events, but Musselburgh is hoping for 2,000-3,000 people for its Festival Trials meeting this weekend.

The track's popular New Year's Day meeting was held behind closed doors and general manager Bill Farnsworth said: "New Year's Day was a complete disaster, it was the worst thing that's happened during COVID for us. We were virtually sold out before Christmas; with the weather forecast we'd probably have released another 1,000 or 2,000 tickets so we would have had a record crowd for a jumps fixture at Musselburgh.

"Everything was aligned, the weather was fantastic, and we ended up behind closed doors. It was really difficult to stomach. But we've put that beyond us and we're very much looking forward to getting crowds back."

He added: "It's difficult to forecast a crowd as people are generally booking a lot later—the lockdown caught people by surprise and they're now reluctant to buy tickets until they know for certain there isn't going to be another one.

"We can't compare it to other years and it's a difficult time of year to get a crowd but we'd like to think we'll get between 2,000 and 3,000 on Saturday, when we're up against 60,000 people watching Scotland playing England at Murrayfield. We're doing our best to get as many people in as possible but we're just happy to have the public in."

Managing director Jonathan Garratt is looking forward to the return of a proper crowd at Kelso, whose last meeting came just a day before the restrictions were removed.

"We had our annual members in for the two meetings we've had since Christmas and I think they enjoyed the extra space but you do miss the added atmosphere of having a larger crowd," he said.

"It's going to be a quiet start for us. We wouldn't expect a flood of racegoers through the turnstiles for a Thursday at the beginning of February. And during the period when we were in a form of lockdown nobody was booking for this meeting. But we've had a few inquiries and I'm sure people will come and enjoy the day.

"The days that are selling terrifically well are the March Saturdays—Morebattle Hurdle day and the Go North weekend—those are the fixtures that seem to have attracted the attention and that people are really looking forward to."

Scottish trainer Nick Alexander has seven runners on the Kelso card and said: "It will be great to have a crowd tomorrow. It was a disappointing spell, particularly around new year when some very good meetings had no crowds."
