STUDY LINKS GENE TO SOUNDNESS IN RACEHORSES

The results of an inbreeding study published June 29 that examines the impact of inbreeding in Thoroughbreds delivers a word of caution to breeders worldwide and at the same time offers hope.

The study showed a strong correlation with inbreeding in Thoroughbreds that never started in a race, and also identified a genetic marker that could be associated with unsoundness. Through genetic testing, breeders can now avoid producing foals that are homozygous for this gene and significantly improve their chances of becoming successful racehorses.

Scientists at the University College Dublin, the University of Edinburgh, and the Irish equine genetic testing company Plusvital conducted the study, which is titled "<u>Inbreeding depression</u> and the probability of racing in the Thoroughbred horse" and published in the peer-reviewed scientific journal "Proceedings of the Royal Society B."

The sobering aspect of the study's conclusions is a strong correlation observed between inbreeding and Thoroughbreds that never start in a race. Researchers measured the inbreeding in more than 6,000 Thoroughbreds throughout Europe and Australia that were all 5 years old and included 13% that had never raced. In order to exactly identify the DNA segments actually inherited from each horse's sire and dam, the study used DNA analysis to determine the level of inbreeding instead of pedigree analysis.

The analysis showed that for every 10% increase in inbreeding there was a 48% predicted decrease in the chance that a horse would ever start in a race, according to Dr. Emmeline Hill, a professor at the University College Dublin's School of Agriculture and Food Science and co-founder of Plusvital.

In broad terms, inbreeding is a natural function of managing a closed breeding population like Thoroughbreds. It is the method breeders use to concentrate desirable characteristics and ideally weed out undesirable traits. New genetic mutations associated with an undesirable trait, however, can arise and start showing up in greater frequency because of a variety of factors, including an association with certain sire lines, for example.

"The effects of inbreeding that we have seen are certainly not new but have only been revealed by the power of genomic data for the many Thoroughbreds that are contained in this data set," said the study's co-author Dr. Josephine Pemberton, a professor at University of Edinburgh. "These results are a warning sign about the rising trend in inbreeding in Thoroughbreds."

Being able to identify and manage for these desirable traits is what makes the discovery of the genetic markers associated with unsoundness so significant.

"The identification of the single genetic marker with a strong negative effect on racing is good news, because it means that it can be managed," Hill said. "If the 'carrier' status of a mare and stallion are known, this information can be used to avoid producing foals with two copies of the genetic marker. The immediate benefit of this will be economic gains for breeders and racehorse owners and improved animal welfare.

"The knowledge of this genetic marker will allow for testing to reduce the negative impact of inbreeding with the goal to increase the number of foals that are born that race," she added.

The study found 1% of the Thoroughbreds studied were homozygous (possessing one copy from the sire and one copy from the dam) for the gene variant negatively affecting bone development but these horses have a



32% increased probability of never starting in a race. A horse's ability to race is not influenced by the gene if it only has one allele associated with the variant negatively affecting soundness in its DNA. But if it is mated to other carriers of the gene variant, the resulting foals would be at-risk.

The study found 10% of observed horses were carriers for the gene variant and determined 15% of the stallions represented in the data set were carriers as well.

The presence of the gene is slightly higher in the American Thoroughbred population, according to Hill. While no American Thoroughbreds were used in the study, independent testing indicates the gene is present in 12.9% of the population.

"It still needs to be examined whether this marker is associated with injury risk, but the data is pointing in that direction," Hill said. "It may appear to be a small number of horses, but it has a considerable impact in the population overall. In the long run, the incidence of this marker in the breed could be reduced if a breed-wide program of testing were to be implemented. This would have a positive long-term effect on the genetic health of the population and would not discriminate against the use of any stallion because it is dependent on the mares, too."

Study co-author Dr. David MacHugh, a University College Dublin professor and Plusvital shareholder, said presence of the gene still leaves breeders with plenty of options.

"There is still enough diversity in the gene pool for breeders to proactively manage breeding decisions and use genetically less related stallions, but because there is so much sharing of genetics due to the popularity of particular sire lines, this is not always evident from the pedigree page," he said. "The best way to assess inbreeding and relatedness is through in-depth analysis of DNA variation across horse genomes."

Hill said the identification of the gene provides a powerful tool for breeders worldwide.

"For Thoroughbred breeders, the breeding goal is to produce viable foals that will have productive racing careers and establish their value by winning races. To do this, horses need to be sound and healthy enough to race," she said. **BH**

F-T JULY SELECTED HORSES OF ALL AGES CATALOG NOW ONLINE

Fasig-Tipton has cataloged 183 main catalog entries for its July Selected Horses of All Ages Sale, to be held Monday, July 11, at the Newtown Paddocks in Lexington, beginning at 3 p.m.

The catalog, which includes horses of racing age and breeding stock, will continue to grow as Fasig-Tipton accepts approved supplemental entries until sale time.

Since 2013, 67 stakes winners have been produced by July horses of racing age sales, as well as 28% stakes horses, and earners of more than \$63 million from over 11,000 starts.

This year's catalog cover features Cross Border, Fast Boat, Fearless, Jalen Journey, Stilleto Boy, and Summer in Saratoga, all graded stakes winners since last year's auction.

Among the breeding stock offerings are stakescredentialed broodmare prospects and mares in foal to both proven and exciting young sires. Broodmares selling with foals at foot are included among this group, as well.

"This year's sale offers a strong catalog in both numbers and quality," said Fasig-Tipton president and CEO Boyd Browning Jr. "There is great variety and upside among the horses of racing age, which will appeal to stables looking to acquire ready-to-run racehorses ahead of the lucrative summer race meetings. A select group of breeding stock offerings adds another level of interest to the sale this year, as well."

Entries may now be viewed in Fasig-Tipton's user friendly <u>enhanced online catalog</u>. The catalog offers actively updated pedigrees, race replays, statistical links, Ragozin speed figures, as well as Daily Racing Form and Thoroughmanager past performances.

Prospective buyers may also sign up for <u>email alerts</u> to receive pedigree and race-record updates, as well as notifications of new sale entries as they are accepted.

The July Selected Horses of All Ages catalog will also be available via the Equineline sales catalog app. Print catalogs will be available on the sales grounds at sale time.

At the 2021 edition of the sale, ELiTE consigned stakes winner Front Run the Fed to be the sale-topping stallion/racing prospect after he realized \$440,000 to buyer George Sharp. In the breeding stock sale, a stakes-winning daughter of Cairo Prince, Jeweled Princess, consigned by Gainesway, led the way at \$225,000 selling to Stoneriggs Farm, selling in foal to Gun Runner.

Following the Selected Horses of All Ages Sale, the single-day session of The July Sale will take place July 12, with 302 cataloged yearlings set to go through the ring. **BH**

MAYLIN: MEDINA SPIRIT FINAL RESEARCH A LONG WAY OFF

D uring the summer of 2021, Kentucky Circuit Court Judge Thomas Wingate urged both sides of the Medina Spirit positive-test dispute to get results from Dr. George Maylin's scientific testing of urine samples so the resolution of the matter could move forward. Almost a year later, Maylin said his full research related to specific tests is not close to completion.

According to testimony he gave in a June 10 deposition, Maylin read about trainer Bob Baffert's claim that betamethasone found in Medina Spirit's blood after the 2021 Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1) at Churchill Downs originated from Otomax, a skin rash salve.

That betamethasone positive would ultimately lead Kentucky stewards to disqualify Medina Spirit and issue a suspension and fine to Baffert—actions that are under appeal.

Maylin, director of the New York Equine Drug Testing and Research Laboratory where postrace samples are routinely tested for prohibited substances, said he decided on his own, with the 2021 Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) looming weeks after the Derby, "I'd better see if, in fact, (topical application of) Otomax... could result in a positive test..."

Maylin said he discussed the potential for problems in the Belmont in mid-May 2021 with Ronald Ochrym, acting director of the Division of Racing at the New York State Gaming Commission.

According to his testimony, Maylin became further involved in June 2021 when veterinarian Dr. Clara Fenger, on behalf of connections of Zedan Racing Stables' Medina Spirit, asked if he would perform testing and research on the issue. Maylin agreed to do it.

In the meantime, Maylin and lab associates applied Otomax and collected urine samples from two research Thoroughbred mares in May and August 2021, and urine samples from Medina Spirit were delivered to him on July 14, 2021. There was a waiting period of several months while another laboratory worked on developing metabolites needed for testing.

A December 3, 2021, report letter from Maylin to lawyers for Baffert and the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission says he tested samples both from Medina Spirit and the two research mares, and that analytes from ingredients of Otomax were found in both. The letter concludes, "We consider this to be a research project that will be submitted to a peer-reviewed journal and as such is confidential until the data is submitted for review."

And therein lies the rub. Although Maylin disclosed to KHRC and Baffert/Zedan in due course a laboratory packet about his testing of Medina Spirit's urine, he refused, and still refuses, to provide written analytical details of the lab's research on the two test mares.

Further, under questioning from KHRC attorney Jennifer Wolsing, Maylin said his work on the test mares has not been peer-reviewed or shared with another laboratory, and that it will not be peerreviewed until "we get our results finalized." Asked when that would be, Maylin initially said, "I'm not sure," then added, "within a year."

The research can be finalized, Maylin said, "when we have sufficient data to submit it to a scientific journal... a significant amount of additional studies, additional administration trials."

"What is the holdup in continuing to test and administer this medication to more horses?" Wolsing asked Maylin.

"Our primary job is testing samples of racehorses' blood and urine," Maylin responded. "This is not a high priority in our routine work. And we'll get it done when we can get to it."

Pressed for more information, Maylin said he would need to test at least eight horses in order to have publishable results.

In denying access to the work, Maylin testified there is California case law saying he doesn't have to release his research on the test horses, and that he is not willing to release it even with a protective order limiting its dissemination.

"So basically we just need to take your word for (the research); is that correct?" Wolsing asked.

To which Maylin answered, "Or you can do your own research."

Otomax Applied in Gaskin Area of One Test Mare, Another Applied Around Mouth

Maylin testified it was his understanding Otomax had been applied to a "rear leg" of Medina Spirit based on his review of a photo he saw in BloodHorse. He testified that Otomax was applied to one test mare in the gaskin area. The gaskin is a part of the hind leg between the stifle and the hock, corresponding in human terms to an area between the knee and ankle.

BloodHorse reported May 11, 2021, that according to a statement issued by Baffert, his staff treated Medina Spirit's hind end for dermatitis with Otomax.

Otomax was put on the other test mare in the mouth around her lips and on her tongue in case Medina Spirit had licked the area of application, Maylin said.

An Objection-Filled Examination

Maylin appeared at his Zoom deposition with a lawyer who appeared remotely, Joseph Farraldo. Craig Robertson appeared for Baffert, and there was no announced appearance by a lawyer for owner Amr Zedan or his racing corporation. Between Robertson and Farraldo, they objected 134 times during Wolsing's direct examination of Maylin, which encompassed 113 pages in the transcript obtained by BloodHorse. BH

LIFE IS GOOD FACES SPEAKER'S CORNER IN NERUD STAKES

In theory, comeback races are supposed to be relative easy tests to prepare for bigger races on the horizon. That's not the case with WinStar Farm and China

Horse Club's Life Is Good.

When he returned from ankle surgery last year after nearly six months on the sidelines, he ran into a buzzsaw by the name of Jackie's Warrior in the seven-furlong H. Allen Jerkens Memorial Stakes (G1). Though he ran courageously after the layoff, the talented son of Into Mischief suffered his first defeat when he was second by a neck to a rival

who was ultimately named 2021's champion sprinter.

Now, in his first start in a little more than three months since finishing fourth at 1 1/4 miles in the \$12 million Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (G1), the 4-year-old colt is facing another formidable challenger.

In the July 2 seven-furlong \$250,000 John A. Nerud Stakes (G2) at Belmont Park, Life Is Good will face four rivals, topped by Godolphin's Speaker's Corner, who is undefeated in three tries at the distance, including a decisive 4 1/2-length score in the Carter Handicap (G1) earlier this year.

"We're looking forward to running Life Is Good, but Speaker's Corner is a very good horse; a grade 1 winner," said Elliott Walden, CEO, president, and racing manager of WinStar Farm. "I wish they'd double the purse."

For Life Is Good, who has enjoyed his greatest success around two turns, the Nerud is indeed being viewed as a springboard to longer and richer races, namely the \$1 million Whitney Stakes (G1) at a two-turn, 1 1/8-mile distance Aug. 6 at Saratoga Race Course. "We're looking for a way to bridge the gap between Dubai and the Whitney and we felt it was better to come into a race like that with a race under his belt," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "So far he's training every bit as well as he did before the World Cup."

Life Is Good came into the Dubai World Cup as America's top older horse following back-to-back wins in the Big Ass Fans Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) and

the \$2.94 million Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes Presented by 1/ST BET (G1) by a combined margin of nine lengths. While traveling a mileand-a-quarter for the first time in the March 26 international test, he set the pace but tired late and finished fourth on a track that did not complement his keen early speed.

"It's kind of unfortunate the track he caught in Dubai. It was a

really deep, demanding track. It wasn't the best for a horse with speed like him," Pletcher said.

Bred by Gary & Mary West Stables out of the Distorted Humor mare Beach Walk, Life Is Good was purchased for \$525,000 by China Horse Club and Maverick Racing from the Paramount Sales consignment at the 2019 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. He won his first three starts for trainer Bob Baffert and then was sent to Pletcher following the surgery that knocked him off last year's Triple Crown trail. Overall, he has won six of eight starts with earnings of \$3,414,200 heading into Saturday's sprint stakes.

"There's always some apprehension after a long trip but this horse has showed us the same signs that he always has in his workouts and enthusiasm," Walden said. "So, we wouldn't anticipate any effort that's different from what he's given us before."

Life Is Good is the second of five foals and first stakes winner for Beach Walk, who also has a yearling Candy Ride colt and a full brother to Life Is Good born this year.

At the very least, Godolphin and trainer Bill Mott deserve a medal of valor for running Speaker's Corner in successive races against high-profile foes. At a time when tracks are struggling to fill stakes and numerous horsemen are opting for the easiest possible race, the homebred Street Sense 4-year-old comes into his showdown with Life Is Good, who is third in the National Thoroughbred Racing Association Top 10 poll, after running in the prestigious Hill 'n' Dale Metropolitan Handicap (G1) and finishing third behind the unbeaten Flightline, who is number one by a wide margin in the NTRA poll.


While it may not be case of going from the frying pan to the fire, it's definitely worthy of a fire to the frying pan comparison.

"It's not by choice that we're facing two horses like Flightline and Life Is Good, but that's who is turning up," said Michael Banahan, director of bloodstock for Godolphin USA. "We'll take a chance and see how he does."

The Met Mile was billed as an exciting duel between the heavily favored Flightline and 5-2 second choice Speaker's Corner, who had three straight graded stakes wins coming into the June 11 stakes, but it turned into a mismatch. Even though jockey Junior Alvarado and Speaker's Corner broke quicker than Flightline and tightened things up for the 2-5 favorite along the rail, Flightline moved outside of the Godolphin homebred to take the lead on the turn and then motored to a sixlength win in 1:33.59 with Speaker's Corner winding up third, 8 3/4 lengths behind.

Though it seemed as if Speaker's Corner might need some time to regroup afterwards, the way he's bounced back from that loss convinced Mott and Banahan to target the Nerud.

"He's been tearing down the barn and worked very well last Saturday (five furlongs in :59.60). He's been telling us he wants to run. Bill is very happy with him. It's a quick turnaround, but as well as the horse is doing, we felt this is a good opportunity for him. The distance is perfect and it's one turn," Banahan said.

The lack of another suitable seven-furlong stakes until late August also came into play.

"The way the stakes program is set up, there's nothing for him until the Forego (G1) at the end of the Saratoga meet (Aug. 27) and that came into consideration in deciding to run Saturday. It didn't make sense to keep him in the barn without racing for another two months," Banahan said about the first of four foals out of the Bernardini mare Tyburn Brook and the lone winner from her two starters.

Tactics should play a key factor in the outcome with both colts possessing sharp early speed, creating an interesting dynamic in the early stages of the race for Alvarado and Flavien Prat, who will ride Life Is Good for the first time while subbing for the suspended Irad Ortiz Jr.

"We thought we would be sitting off Flightline but (Alvarado) gave himself every opportunity to win the race. We were fine with him being in front," Banahan said. "Hopefully we'll see an improved version of Speaker's Corner Saturday."

A bitter speed duel will be sweet music to the other three entrants: grade 3-placed Repo Rocks, WinStar and China Horse Club's Harvard, who was seventh in an allowance optional claimer last time, and War Tocsin, who was a distant third behind Jackie's Warrior in the True North Stakes (G2) at 69-1 odds.

Due to the small field, the Nerud will be contested as the fourth race on Saturday's card. ${\sf BH}$

CHARGE IT RETURNS IN BELMONT'S DWYER STAKES

S is months after a promising career debut, Charge It is still playing catch up with the top runners in his 3-year-old crop.

After he made up a ton of ground on the division leaders when he rallied to finish second by 1 1/4 lengths in the Curlin Florida Derby Presented by Hill 'n' Dale Farms at Xalapa (G1) in his third career try, he suffered a setback in no less of a setting than the Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1).

Breaking from post eight in a 20-horse field for trainer Todd Pletcher, the Whisper Hill Farm homebred was steadied and altered course entering the first turn. He never recovered, finishing 17th. The gray colt also came out of the Run for the Roses with a displaced palate, requiring a minor surgical procedure that knocked him off the Triple Crown.

Two months after the first Saturday in May, the son of Tapit will embark on another game of catch-up when he tops a field of six July 2 in the \$250,000 Dwyer Stakes (G3) for 3-year-olds at Belmont Park.

"He's training really impressively and we're looking forward to getting him going again and hopefully the Dwyer can bring him up to some bigger races down the road," Pletcher said.

Depending on what happens Saturday in the oneturn mile test, the Aug. 27 Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Race Course could be the main

summer objective for Charge It with a prep race in the July 30 Jim Dandy Stakes (G2) a possibility.

"The long range goal is the Travers and we'll see what we do in between, with the Jim Dandy in the mix," Pletcher said. "Hopefully we can get things moving in the right direction."

Out of the Indian Charlie mare I'll Take Charge, a daughter of multiple grade 1 producer and \$2.4 million earner Take Charge Lady, Charge It's lone victory came in his second of four starts when he romped by 8 1/2 lengths in a Feb. 12 maiden race at Gulfstream Park.

A month before that, he was second by a neck in his career debut.

Charge It is the second of three foals and lone winner for I'll Take Charge, who also has an Into Mischief colt born earlier this year.

Among the five rivals, Peter Brant's Nabokov enters off a front-running 3 1/4-length maiden win in a May 15 1 1/16-mile test at Belmont for trainer Chad Brown.

"He's a lightly raced horse but we've always thought a lot of him. I want to give him a shot running against his own age group rather than searching for an allowance race against older horses that may not go," Brown said. "He's all legs. He always looked like a true two-turn horse."

The son of Uncle Mo out of the Bernardini mare Peppy Rafaela was second at Keeneland in his April 14 career debut at 6 1/2 furlongs.

"I was a little disappointed in the Keeneland race," Brown said about the \$775,000 purchase by BSW/Crow from the Mulholland Springs consignment at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale. "I don't know if he handled the track. He had a tough trip with an inside draw."

The Dwyer could continue a stellar Belmont meet for Brown, who enters the penultimate week with 40 wins, four wins shy of the meet record set by David Jacobson in 2013. With a mark of 124-40-27-16 (32% winning percentage) through June 26, he has won a meet-high 13 stakes, including the last three open stakes.

Bred by Frank Batten, Nabokov is a full brother to both grade 2 winner Mopotism and a weanling filly.

The field also includes recent Delaware Park allowance optional claiming winner and stakesplaced No Sabe Nada (Jersey Town), Fluid Situation (Warrior's Reward), Runninsonofagun (Gun Runner), who was third in the six-furlong Gold Fever Stakes, and Unbridled Bomber (Upstart). BH

N.Y. CHANGES RULE MANDATING COUPLING OF MARRIED JOCKEYS

New York State regulators unanimously gave final approval June 29 to a change in rules that previously made it mandatory for married jockeys to be coupled in races for the purposes of wagering.

It took more than a year of efforts by jockeys Trevor McCarthy and Katie Davis, who were married in December 2020 and at the time riding at Aqueduct

Racetrack, as well as state lawmakers who unsuccessfully sought last year to change the requirement through state statute.

New York Gov. Kathy Hochul last fall vetoed a measure to end what lawmakers called a "sexist and outdated" coupling rule that did not, for instance, apply to brothers who might be racing in the same race.

Hochul at the time said the rule was intended to uphold the "integrity" of horse racing, but she ordered the state gaming commission to revisit the requirement to see ways in which it could be relaxed.

The state's gaming commission earlier this year preliminarily okayed the change to end the coupling requirement, and Wednesday it was given final approval.

The rule, lawmakers said, also applied to parents or other members of a jockey's household besides a spouse. McCarthy and Davis McCarthy had just gotten married before they began racing at Aqueduct when they first learned of New York's coupling rule.

"It's not the 1800s anymore. The rule needs to be changed," Davis said at the time.

The rule finalized Wednesday does still give gaming commission stewards "the discretion to require coupling in any circumstances in which such steward concludes coupling is necessary in the public interest."

The commission received five public comments before taking final action. The rule change was backed by the New York Racing Association and the New York Thoroughbred Breeders. The New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association also backed the change but wanted it expanded so that horses trained by those with relationships to other trainers are not required to

be coupled.

"As an example, NYTHA objects to coupling of entries when a trainer trains two horses in a race, one of which is owned by the trainer's spouse," the commission's counsel said in a memo to the agency's board.

The memo said Thoroughbred horse owner Tina Maria Bond objected to the board about the coupling of her horses trained by her husband. Trainer James Bond wrote the board to say the coupling rule will be "detrimental to my business" but that he did not

explain how or why, and did not specifically address the heart of the new rule change: uncoupling for relatives of jockeys entered in the same race.

In a separate action, the gaming commission also approved creating standard time periods—as soon as 10 days depending on the section of law that applies—for individuals to request a formal hearing before the state if they are denied a horse racing license. The change was backed by the NYTHA and the NYTB. **BH**

POSNER PLEADS GUILTY TO DRUG ADULTERATION, MISBRANDING

eterinarian Michael Posner entered a plea of guilty June 29 in federal court to a single count of drug adulteration and misbranding.

Posner admitted allegations in superseding information that from at least 2014 to 2016 he distributed a type of illicit drug and allowed others to use his name and veterinary license to generate prescriptions for the drug to customers. By entering the plea, he avoided a jury trial set for July 11.

An indictment returned by a grand jury in early 2020 named Posner and three other defendants who previously pleaded guilty: Carl Garofalo Sr., Scott Mangini, and Scott Robinson. All four defendants were involved in harness racing.

Judge J. Paul Oetken accepted the plea deal in U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York and ordered a pre-sentence investigation. Sentencing memoranda are to be filed by Sept. 15 and Sept. 22, and Posner is scheduled for sentencing on Sept. 29. Bail was continued.

Robinson was sentenced in March 2021 to 18 months in prison. Mangini was sentenced in September 2021 to 18 months. Six months was handed down to Garofalo in March 2022. Five other harness-related defendants have also entered guilty pleas to similar offenses in New York: Rene Allard, Richard Banca, Louis Grasso, Thomas Guido III, and Donato Poliseno.

Posner was represented by attorneys Amanda Senske and Gordon Mehler. Assistant U.S. Attorney Sarah Mortazavi was present for the prosecution. BH

AMERICAN PHAROAH, JUSTIFY NOT SHUTTLING THIS YEAR

Coolmore's U.S. Triple Crown winners Justify and American Pharoah will not return to Australia this breeding season with the stallions both rested from shuttle duties.

Justify, who was due to stand for a fee of AU\$55,000 (£31,000/€36,000 including GST) at Jerrys Plains this season, had his first Southern Hemisphere-bred yearlings met positively by the market in Australia when sold earlier this year. From 73 lots sold his progeny averaged AU\$241,129 (US\$165,836) and sold to a high of AU\$1 million (\$687,750).

American Pharaoh was due to stand his sixth covering season in Australia for a fee of \$49,500 (£28,000/€32,500 including GST) in 2022.

A statement released by Coolmore said: "Triple Crown winners Justify and American Pharoah will not shuttle to Coolmore Australia this year ... A decision was made to rest the two stallions, but both should be back the following year."

Justify, an unbeaten winner of six races during his on-track career, has made an encouraging start with his first Northern Hemisphere-bred

2-year-olds. The Aidan O'Brien-trained Statuette earned the stallion his first group winner June 26 when the filly won the Airlie Stud Stakes (G2) at the Curragh to be installed as the early favorite for next year's One Thousand Guineas (G1) at Newmarket.

From eight runners to date Justify has four winners, as well as the stakes-placed Tahoma in the U.S.

"Justify has made an excellent start with his first 2-year-olds in Europe and North America," the Coolmore statement continued. "His first Australianbred 2-year-olds will run later this year and he has two full crops to follow."

American Pharoah's oldest Southern Hemisphere-bred crop are rising 4-year-olds, and the stallion has three stakes winners in Australia so far, including group 3 winners Head Of State and Pretty Amazing.

This season has emerged the unbeaten 2-year-old Tijuana, a winner of the Anzac Day Stakes for Ben and J.D. Hayes in April.

American Pharoah has 30 stakes winners worldwide, including five at the elite level in Japan, Europe, and the U.S.

The stallion stood his first three years at Jerrys Plains for a fee of AU\$66,000 (including GST), before he was reduced to a fee of AU\$55,000 in 2020 and AU\$49,500 in 2021. He has 368 Southern Hemisphere-bred foals on the ground.

Coolmore's Irish stallions Churchill, Magna Grecia, Saxon Warrior, and Wootton Bassett will all shuttle to Australia, as planned.

AMO RACING LODGES APPEAL AGAINST NORFOLK STAKES RESULT

The most controversial moment of Royal Ascot is set to be revisited after the British Horseracing Authority confirmed Amo Racing has lodged an appeal against the stewards' decision not to reverse the placings in the Norfolk Stakes (G2).

James O'Mahony will chair a hearing of the independent judicial panel July 7, with Alison Royston and Tim Etherington also due to consider the case.

Paul Hanagan was given a 10-day ban for careless riding after The Ridler veered across the track, causing interference with fourth-placed Brave Nation and Amo Racing's Crispy Cat, before straightening up to beat another of the same owner's runners in Walbank by 1 3/4 lengths.

According to the BHA report on the incident, the Ascot stewards were "satisfied that the interference had not improved the position of the winner, The Ridler, and therefore ordered for the weighed-in to be given once the riders had passed the scale." The British rules of racing have four categories of riding offense, descending in order of seriousness from dangerous through careless and improper riding to the lowest offense of accidental interference.

No rider has been found guilty of dangerous riding in Britain since 2009.

Should a rider be found guilty of dangerous riding the stewards are duty-bound to disqualify the winning horse, but in all other cases, the only way they can amend the result is if they can be satisfied that on the balance of probabilities the impeded horse would have finished in front of the horse causing the interference.

On the day Silvestre de Sousa, rider of third-placed Crispy Cat, thought that he "definitely would have won" but for the interference, though the stewards felt that The Ridler cutting across had cost him only second place.

In the immediate post-race interview—and thus before he had reviewed the replay—Hanagan believed that the jockeys in behind did not need to stop riding and that he had "done everything I could." But Ruby Walsh was among a number of other commentators to criticize the decision not to disqualify the winner.

The BHA mounted a stout defense of the rules as written and interpreted in Britain, disputing the claim made by some critics that The Ridler would have lost the race anywhere outside North America and noting over the last decade "other nations such as Japan, France, and Germany have

all transitioned to the British approach over recent years, with all observing the number of interference inquiries decreasing significantly as a result."

Former group 1-winning jockey George Baker—a regular contributor to the Racing Post in analyzing race-riding— believes the rules need to be tweaked in order to give stewards more power to demote, especially in cases where a wide winning margin makes it almost impossible to take a horse down unless the stewards define a ride as dangerous.

"We've just got to get it cleaner," said Baker, who was one of a number of jockey coaches on hand at Royal Ascot to accompany apprentices and other inexperienced riders on course walks. "Our interference rules in terms of demotions and placings are pretty fair, and using the law of probability to judge whether the best horse has won is right.

"But I think there needs to be an element of removing that win-at-all-costs mentality.

"I don't think we see it all the time and people talk about stiffer penalties. But the biggest penalty of all is losing a race."

Gerald Mosse has been based in both Britain and Hong Kong over the years, as well as in his native France, where in March 2018 authorities moved away from a stewarding model which routinely demoted a horse if interference caused a rival to lose a place, towards one more closely allied to the British model.

That was the conclusion of more than a decade of work carried out under the guidance of the International

Federation of Horseracing Authorities aimed at harmonizing interference rules around the world.

Mosse said: "I was at Ascot and I saw the race. In my opinion, British stewards are more professional and I think they read the races better than in France. I don't want to criticize stewards, who have a difficult job in judging these things.

"But definitely it's important that they reprimand the jockey and ensure that the rules are followed. You can't cross like that and wipe out two guys without even trying to correct your course."

Mosse added: "Paul is a friend of mine and I'm not here to judge. Maybe in the moment, you think you're going quicker than the others and you don't need to correct, because you think you will pass them. But in this situation, he knows he is going to cause problems."

Asked what he thought about the BHA's characterization of the rules being applied the same in other jurisdictions, Mosse said: "In France, it used to be different and I don't think that was fair. In Hong Kong, you have to be two lengths clear. I don't know if the punishment would have been more severe because he got 10 days, which is five weeks in Hong Kong. There, he might have got four days and a fine of HK\$30-\$40,000.

"In Hong Kong, they race only twice a week, whereas here it's every day, which is why the whole punishment in Britain tends to be days and not fines."
