

OPENING DAY AT SARATOGA A CAUSE FOR CELEBRATION

For centuries, the town of Saratoga Springs, N.Y., has been revered as a place for healing, where the mineral water and cool mountain air can bring vitality back to the sickly.

For a considerably shorter time, say the last 40 years, Saratoga and its beloved Victorian racetrack has been the cure for the New York Racing Association's ills.

On an annual basis, the red ink of miserable winters and disappointing springs has been washed away by the euphoria and bustling business generated by the streams of fans who pour into Saratoga Race Course on a daily basis.

This year, from the July 14 opening day until the curtain comes down Sept. 5, the 154th meet at the Spa has the potential to showcase the joys of live racing in front of 20,000 or more fans and provide NYRA with some much-needed relief from the small fields that turned out for many of the best races at the Belmont Park meet and made filling daily cards a challenge.

"What's important about Saratoga is that you provide great racing for the horsemen," said Frank Gabriel, NYRA's senior vice president of racing operations. "It's a key meet for the owners, trainers, and jockeys. It's their big meet and it's a big meet for NYRA as well. We want to be able to offer big days with the caliber of horses to fulfill the interest in them and offer the right field sizes every day, not just on weekends or in the graded stakes."

The timeless charm and allure of Saratoga with its 77 stakes worth \$22.6 million will be matched against an alarming trend at the Belmont Park spring/summer meet. While a bevy of the sport's brightest stars turned out for the meet, including Flightline, Life Is Good, and five of the top seven horses in the National Thoroughbred Racing Association's most recent Top 10 poll, the field size for those high-quality stakes was anemic, especially on the main track.

A total of 12 grade 1 and 2 stakes were contested on dirt, with seven of them grade 2 affairs. Yet those 12 races attracted just 64 starters for an average of 5.3 horses per race. The seven grade 2 stakes had the lowest turnout with 36 runners for an average of 5.1 per race, with three of them contested with just four starters. The five grade 1 dirt races had 28 starters for a 5.6 average.

The grade 1 and 2 turf races were a mixed bag. Seven grade 1 turf races had 62 starters for an average field size of 8.8, while the five grade 2 turf stakes featured 30 horses for a 6.0 average.

Average field size at the meet dropped to 7.35 per race from 7.62 in 2021.

Clearly, Saratoga, and a full 1,800-horse backstretch, could not arrive fast enough this year.

"The stalls are filled and we have some good outfits on hand and we should get the positive response we always get from horsemen at Saratoga," said Gabriel, who worked at NYRA as director of racing in 1998-99 and a racing secretary in 2014 before taking over as the SVP of racing in February. "Some very nice horses

competed in the graded races at Belmont. We got to see some great stars and we hope it will be stepping stone for them to be at Saratoga.

"I thought there was a lull after the Belmont Stakes (G1) and then it picked up. Entries weren't too bad. I thought it helped to have the consistency of the same racing secretary (Keith Doleshel) for all the meets. We got the condition book out early so people knew what the races at Saratoga would be and how they could use a Belmont race to prep for it. We're hopeful for a very positive meet."

In the first season at Saratoga under Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority protocols, the early returns are at least promising with Thursday's 10-race card drawing 105 entries (10.5 average) and 95 horses turning out for 10 races (9.5 average) on July 15. The two Thursday stakes, the Wilton Stakes (contested on the rebuilt one-mile Wilson Chute) and the Schuylerville Stakes (G3), each attracted nine entrants, and Friday's stakes, the Forbidden Apple Stakes (G3T), closed with a field of 13, including one main track only entrant, and the Coronation Cup Stakes closed with a field of 11, also including one main track only entrant.

A paucity of 2-year-old races contributed to the racing office's struggle to fill cards at Belmont Park, which was reflected in none of the nine 2-year-old fillies entered in the Schuylerville having a race in New York. Yet that situation figures to make a 180-degree turn in a positive direction at the Spa.

"The 2-year-old program started slow this year and that hurt us, but we should get going at Saratoga and fill the stakes and allowance races," Gabriel said.

Reflective of 2-year-old racing's prominence at the Spa, aside from the juvenile stakes on Thursday, there will be a 2-year-old maiden race on both Thursday and Friday. The July 16 card generated some good and bad news on the juvenile front as a robust field of 12 was drawn for the \$175,000 Sanford Stakes (G3), but, reflective of the woes at Belmont, a \$105,000 maiden race for colts did not fill. In the past, 2-year-old maiden races had been a staple of Saturday cards.

As always, a strong collection of the sport's brightest stars will be on display with eight of the top 10 horses in the NTRA poll targeting one of the grade 1 stakes during the 40 days. Life Is Good, Olympiad, Hot Rod Charlie, Jackie's Warrior, Clairiere, Letruska, Malathaat, Regal Glory, Bleeker Street, Jack Christopher, Early Voting, Rich Strike, Zandon, Epicenter, Charge It, Secret Oath, and Nest are the standouts among the runners who will make races such as the Aug. 6 Whitney Stakes (G1), Aug. 20 Alabama Stakes (G1), and Aug. 27 Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1) must-see events.

On the trainers' side, the New York regulars will be joined by an increased presence from the main string of Steve Asmussen, who broke the sport's all-time wins record and had five grade 1 wins at the 2021 meet, and Brad Cox, the Eclipse Award winner the last two years.

Other Midwesterners stabled for the meet include D. Wayne Lukas, Brendan Walsh, Tom Amoss, Rusty Arnold, Eddie Kenneally, and Al Stall Jr., and everyone

figures to be hard-pressed to keep pace with perennial Spa champs Chad Brown and Todd Pletcher.

Brown is coming off a record-breaking Belmont Park spring/summer meet with 47 wins (12 in graded stakes) which may cost him some conditions for his horses early in the meet. But as Labor Day approaches, the four-time Spa champ should be quite prominent in the trainers' standings.

"We're having a great year and you want to keep it going," said Brown, who grew up about 15 miles from Saratoga in Mechanicville, N.Y. "Obviously we ran a lot of horses at Belmont so we might be a bit light for book one at Saratoga, but don't get me wrong. We still have some nice horses to run."

Pletcher, a 14-time Spa champ, may have finished third at the Belmont meet with 25 wins but he was a powerful force in the stakes races during the final month of the meet. Topped by a 1-2 finish in the Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) with the sidelined Mo Donegal and the filly Nest, the Hall of Famer won eight stakes (six of them graded) from June 4 through July 10.

Pletcher could also have either the favorite or a top contender in the meet's five premier dirt races for older horses with Life Is Good in the Whitney, Nest in the Alabama, Charge It in the Travers, Malathaat in the Aug. 27 Personal Ensign Stakes (G1), and Dynamic One in the Sept. 3 Jockey Club Gold Cup (G1)—not to mention a top 2-year-old or two who will likely emerge during the meet.

European-based trainer Joseph O'Brien, the 29-year-old son of the legendary Aidan O'Brien, will have a string of about six horses that could send a loud message to his fellow conditioners overseas. While most Euro trainers ship in for specific races, should O'Brien thrive at the Spa, it could entice other outfits from across the Atlantic Ocean to send over horses for New York's maiden and allowance races that are much richer than the purses for similar European races.

"This time of year is a down period for Europeans," Gabriel said. "Joseph has a vision to do things outside of the box. He's raced in America and tried to branch out. He's run in the Melbourne Cup (G1) in Australia. He has some partnerships with some Americans and they want to run at Saratoga. We wish him the best. It's a great venture for him. It's not something Europeans are going to do all the time, but it can be very beneficial for them."

Luis Saez will face a wave of challengers while defending his 2021 riding title against a collection of the sport's best jockeys that also includes Irad Ortiz Jr., Jose Ortiz, Joel Rosario, Flavien Prat, John Velazquez, Javier Castellano, and Dylan Davis, who had a breakthrough meet at Belmont, finishing one win behind Ortiz Jr. for the riding crown.

The meet, which can be seen on a daily basis through more than 225 hours of coverage on FOX Sports networks, will also feature the continuation of the Caesars Turf Triple with the Aug. 6 Caesars Saratoga Derby Invitational Stakes (G1T) and the filly Triple Crown with the Aug. 7 Saratoga Oaks Invitational Stakes (G3T).

As for changes, aside from the Wilson Chute, on the hospitality end, the meet will mark the debut of the two-story renovated Paddock Bar and new Paddock Suite in the backyard. New wagers will include a two-day double linking the Saratoga Derby and Oaks; a two-day Pick 6 on Aug. 26-27 and Sept. 4-5; the addition of the Cross Country Pick 5 on some Sundays, and a \$3 Pick 3 on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. Fans can also purchase tickets for a Breakfast and Breeding Farm Tour that takes patrons to the nearby Old Tavern Farm for a 90-minute walking tour.

In the end, everything will be rolled up into a sensational package that will have a high bar to match. Wagering was a record-breaking \$815.5 million in 2021, which could be difficult to match if field size remains an issue.

Attendance checked in at 1,046,478 last year, marking the sixth-straight time (excluding the 2020 meet without fans) that the total topped 1 million. As unpredictable as the future may be, barring prolonged stretches of miserable weather or a resurgence of COVID-19, adding a seventh year to the attendance streak seems one of the best bets of the meet.

As much as horses may not show up for races as often as they used to, 2022 promises to once again illustrate why Saratoga remains a nirvana for fans and NYRA's financial health.

"It's important that we have the teamwork of NYRA and the horsemen so that we can present to the world how great racing at Saratoga can be," Gabriel said. "Saratoga is truly important to the sport and NYRA." **BH**

Fasig-Tipton has cataloged 216 selected yearlings for the 101st Saratoga Sale, to be held Aug. 8-9, in Saratoga Springs, N.Y.

"We are very bullish on the quality of this year's catalog," said Fasig-Tipton president and CEO Boyd Browning Jr. "Superior sire power, elite pedigrees, and the outstanding conformation that buyers expect at Saratoga will be on offer. We have attracted an increased number of siblings to current and recent graded stakes winners this year, as well."

The Saratoga Sale is once again the top-ranked major North American yearling sale by percentage of grade 1 winners and graded stakes winners, according to statistics recently released by the *BloodHorse MarketWatch*.

Recent sales graduates are led by the brilliant (G1) winners Flightline and Bleecker Street, undefeated on dirt and turf, respectively. Flightline has won his first four starts by a combined 44 lengths, including victories in the prestigious Hill 'n' Dale Metropolitan Handicap (G1) and Runhappy Malibu Stakes (G1). Bleecker Street's victory in last month's New York Stakes (G1T) was her seventh career victory and fourth graded stakes win this year.

Maracuja and Queen Goddess are other recent top-level graduates.

"For more than a century, the Saratoga Sale has sold the sport's biggest stars," added Browning. "It is not only a sale to find a (G1) winner, but horses that are truly generational."

ZENITSU ROMPS TO BECOME COLLECTED'S FIRST WINNER

Airdrie Stud's grade 1 winner Collected sired his first winner when his son Zenitsu prevailed by 3 1/2 lengths in his second career start July 10 at Camarero Racetrack in Puerto Rico.

Bred in Kentucky by BWB Bloodstock and WDS Bloodstock, Zenitsu sold for \$22,000 to Jacobo Ordonez at the 2021 Keeneland September Yearling Sale and was then pinhooked for \$35,000 by Golden Thoroughbreds Training and Sales at the Ocala Breeders' Sales March 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale. Confederacion Hipica de Puerto Rico bought the colt at OBS.

Racing for VMH Stud, Zenitsu broke cleanly as the 2-5 favorite and stalked pacesetter El Zafiro in the early going of the five-furlong race. He took command at the top of the stretch and pulled easily away from his eight challengers. The final time on a sloppy track was :59.76.

The colt is out of the Majestic Warrior winner Acapella, who is a half sister to grade 3 winner Vinceremos and stakes-placed winner Paz the Bourbon. The mare has a yearling by Accelerate named Axel and produced a Shancelot colt this year that later died. Zenitsu is her first winner.

Collected, a 9-year-old son of City Zip, won five graded stakes, topped by the 2017 \$1 Million TVG Pacific Classic Stakes (G1). He retired with an 8-2-1 record from 15 starts and \$2,975,500 in earnings. He stood the 2022 season at Airdrie for \$15,000. **BH**

COUNTRY GRAMMER ZIPS SIX FURLONGS IN 1:12 4/5

Country Grammer, winner of the March 26 Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (G1) at Meydan, recorded his longest workout since he resumed training following the Dubai race in posting a six-furlong breeze in 1:12 4/5 July 13 at Santa Anita Park.

The workout was his second for Bob Baffert after the Hall of Famer resumed training in early July after serving a 90-day suspension for a medication violation from Medina Spirit in last year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Woodford Reserve (G1). Country Grammer has worked seven times since late May, first at WinStar Training Center and later at Santa Anita.

A 5-year-old Tonalist horse, Country Grammer defeated Hot Rod Charlie in the Dubai World Cup for Commonwealth Thoroughbreds, WinStar Farm, and Zedan Racing Stables.

Speaking with BloodHorse last week, Elliott Walden, president, CEO, and racing manager for WinStar Farm, remarked that Country Grammer is "doing really well."

Baffert told Walden that Country Grammer "looks great." He's very happy with him," Walden added.

Country Grammer will likely return at Del Mar in Southern California. The track's two major dirt races for older horses are the \$300,000 San Diego Handicap (G2) July 30 and the \$1 million TVG Pacific Classic (G1) Sept. 3.

He has never raced at Del Mar but captured the 2021 Hollywood Gold Cup Stakes (G1) at Santa Anita last year in advance of a runner-up finish in this year's Saudi Cup (G1) and winning the Dubai World Cup. **BH**

Country Grammer wins the Dubai World Cup at Meydan Racecourse

NJ STEWARDS SUSPEND LOPEZ, JUAREZ AFTER DQ, ALTERCATION

New Jersey stewards have issued suspensions to jockeys Paco Lopez and Nik Juarez, the former for careless riding in the seventh race at Monmouth Park July 1 and the latter for "initiating a physical confrontation" after the race.

In a ruling issued July 7, Lopez is hereby suspended for five New Jersey racing days, July 29, 2022, through and including Aug. 1, 2022, and Friday, Aug. 5, 2022, for changing paths aboard Midnight Diva without sufficient clearance, causing La Costa, under Juarez, to clip heels and "stumble badly, losing all chance" in an allowance race on the turf. Juarez managed to stay aboard his mount and pulled her up. She walked off the track after the race.

Following an inquiry and claim of foul, Midnight Diva was disqualified from third and placed last, the race chart indicates.

Juarez received an eight-day suspension, from July 15-July 22, plus a \$500 fine in a ruling issued July 10.

Leland Moore, public information officer for the New Jersey Attorney General's Office and a spokesperson for the New Jersey Racing Commission, wrote in an email that the altercation initiated by Juarez toward Lopez occurred in the scales area at Monmouth Park. Juarez had not appealed or sought a stay as of early afternoon on July 13, Moore indicated.

Lopez has received lengthy suspensions on multiple occasions for riding infractions, including a 14-day suspension this year for his ride in the Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) at Gulfstream Park in piloting In Due Time to a runner-up finish. Two horses fell in the race, and their riders were unseated.

Twice in the first half of 2019, Lopez also received 30-day suspensions from Gulfstream stewards for careless riding. At the time of his first 2019 suspension, Stephen DiMauro, associate steward at Gulfstream Park, noted Lopez's suspension was lengthened due to multiple occurrences "of being either reprimanded or fined or suspended."

Lopez, eight times the meet-leading rider at Monmouth Park, holds a commanding lead in the current Monmouth riding standings with 48 victories through July 12. Juarez is seventh with 10 wins.

The two jockeys finished 1-2 in the standings during the 2019 meet at Monmouth when Lopez edged Juarez by a 109-107 win margin.

Post-race confrontations among jockeys are not uncommon, though they more often occur in the jockeys' room after a race than in public view.

Gulfstream Park stewards fined Irad Ortiz Jr. \$1,000 for punching a seated Lopez in March 2021 after a race at Gulfstream. The altercation was captured on track cameras.

In another high-profile incident, Hall of Fame jockeys Calvin Borel and Javier Castellano were fined \$5,000 and \$2,500, respectively, for fighting in the winner's circle area after the 2010 Breeders' Cup Marathon (G3) at Churchill Downs. Borel received the larger fine for initiating the winner's circle skirmish. **BH**

TYLER'S TRIBE BRINGS FIGHT AGAINST LEUKEMIA TO RACING

In only two starts, Tyler's Tribe has reimbursed Tim Martin and Tom Lepic in ways far beyond monetary value.

Named for Lepic's 8-year-old grandson Tyler who has battled leukemia since his diagnosis in August of 2020, the pair plucked the gelding from the 2021 Iowa Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association Fall Mixed Sale for only \$34,000.

"Before the sale I realized that he hadn't been named yet, and I was pretty excited because we have a grandson named Tyler who has leukemia. He's got a big following on Facebook and you can go on there and look at Tyler's Tribe," Lepic said.

"We thought what a super thing to do for him to get more exposure for leukemia, lymphoma, and the whole story. We named him Tyler's Tribe not knowing what kind of horse we were going to have."

The 2-year-old son of Sharp Azteca bred in Iowa

by Clifton Farm and Derek Merkler has blown away expectations, becoming his sire's first stakes winner in the July 9 Prairie Gold Juvenile Stakes at Prairie Meadows, taking it by 8 1/2 lengths. His maiden victory was double that, finishing 16 3/4 lengths in front.

"Everything's been pretty easy for him," Lepic said. "We were going into the winner's circle

and Tim said, 'Look, Tom, look at Tyler's Tribe, he isn't even breathing. It's not even like he ran a race; this is crazy.'"

Martin, who trains the gelding, says he is one of the most talented horses he has had within his stable.

"I've never had a horse even close to being this impressive ever, none of the same caliber," Martin said. "He isn't just a fluke. He's a big, good-looking horse; he's got a stride that is unbelievable."

"He's got a lot of brains for a 2-year-old, he's advanced in his mind a lot now. He's sharp. You take him out of the stall and he's like an old pony horse; he's quiet."

Though the gelding has already made what he was purchased for a couple times over, his earnings come second to his mission—spreading cancer awareness.

"We had fans from five or six different states that came in. We had people flying in from as far as Atlanta to come be part of Tyler's Tribe's big race," Lepic said. "After the race Tyler and I both spoke with the microphone on the apron and told the story about how it had come to fruition and the fans just went crazy. They said they were going to be there for every race; it's just a wonderful thing."

As for Tyler himself, Lepic says that he has faced many challenges throughout the past two years and is very aware of those who support him.

"He was blown away. He's kind of a quiet young man but that night he even had tears... He's had a couple friends in the hospital that he got to know very well when he was there that did not make it, so he knows that it's not a thing where everything is good, and it hasn't been for him. Even a few months ago he had a really scary time.

"To hold that trophy, he couldn't believe that he was holding onto a trophy like that and seeing everybody who was there to support him. It was pretty amazing. He understands how blessed he is by his following."

Both Tyler and his horse have promising futures ahead with the gelding likely aimed toward local stakes and a step up in class later this year while Tyler continues on a path of remission.


"He's had a lot of ups and downs and some very serious times," Lepic said. "As it is right now, he's four or five months away from being pronounced cancer free.

ARIZONA TRAINING CENTER OWNER MCKEE DIES AT 90

Entrepreneur and Arizona training center owner Robert "Bob" Harley McKee died earlier this year at his Phoenix home. He was 90.

McKee was born and raised in Hamilton, Mo., in the home behind a service station owned by his grandfather and run by his father. He graduated from William Jewell College with a bachelor's degree in economics and eventually moved to Arizona in 1969, where he developed one of the largest independent chains of self-serve gas stations in the Southwest.

According to his family, he then branched out into banking, procuring Ralston Bank in Nebraska, which he sold to Norwest Bank that later became Wells Fargo Bank. In 1988, he founded the board of the Torrey Pines Club after successfully acquiring the lease of the 36-hole municipal Torrey Pines Golf Course owned by the city of San Diego. He served as the board chairman up to his death.

McKee got involved in Thoroughbred racing in the 1970s. Either solely or with his wife of 44 years, Mary Ellen, McKee raced several stakes performers, including Keep On Top, who won the Molly Butler Handicap at Turf Paradise in 1988 and the 1989 Las Palmas Stakes at Los Alamitos Race Course; and Blacktie Bid, who won the Black Swan Stakes at Fairplex Park in 1995. They also raced turf stakes winner Nice Choice, who won the 2005 Dwight D. Patterson Handicap at Turf Paradise. The son of Society Max was bought for \$29,000 at the 2001 Arizona Thoroughbred Breeders' Association Fall Mixed Sale from Triple AAA Ranch.

Their stable—sometimes listed under their own names and sometimes as Double Kee—included several black-type homebreds as well, including Biltmore Breeze (out of Keep On Top), who D. Wayne Lukas trained for them to finish third in the 1997 Hollywood Wildcat Handicap at Hollywood Park.

In 1999 the McKees established Hidden Springs Ranch, a 222-acre breaking, training, and boarding facility in Peeples Valley, Ariz. The training center included a five-furlong track and swimming facilities to handle lay-ups and rehabilitation.

McKee was an avid handicapper and enjoyed following up a day at Del Mar with a good poker game.

McKee was preceded in death by his parents: Robert Doak and Helen Williams McKee; two grandsons; the mother of his children, Peggy Kelly; and brother-in-law Richard Poulsen.

He is survived by his wife; two daughters: Sherri McKee, her children Linden and Allen Foster, and Marlowe (Kim) Quart, and Kathleen McKee (Michael) Johnson, and her children Dustin (Christina) Johnson, Luke Johnson, and Chelsea Johnson (Brian) Roberts; son Robert Thomas "Tom" (Tracey) McKee and their sons Harley and Matthew; two great-granddaughters Colette and Chloe Johnson; four brothers-in-law James (Davey) Campbell, Calvin, Craig, and Terry (Jean) Poulsen; sister-in-law Gail Poulsen; and nine nieces and nephews. **BH**

NOTTURNO WINS JAPAN DIRT DERBY, POINTS TO GRADE 1 RACE

Notturno fought his way to the lead at the top of the stretch in the Japanese Dirt Derby July 13 and battled on resolutely over the sloppy Oi Racecourse track to win by three-quarters of a length from Eisha Es.

The Dirt Derby currently is a listed race conducted under the auspices of Japan's local governments' National Association of Racing. It is slated for an upgrade during the next two years to become the anchor leg of a new "Dirt Triple Crown" recognizing the country's recent successes on that surface in big international races.

As the race itself moves up in importance, Notturno's performance could move him up among the nation's dirt contenders. None of Japan's dirt stars was involved in the Oi affair but Notturno, a Heart's Cry colt out of the Unbridled's Song mare Sheikh's Serenade, showed potential in victory and his trainer said bigger things are on the horizon.

Parked outside rivals' flying mud, jockey Yutaka Take kept Notturno close enough down the backstretch and moved up as he hit the second turn. The colt advanced willingly, then edged clear in the final 100 meters. He finished the 2,400 meters (about 1 1/4 miles) in 2:04.06.

"In the gate, I could feel that the condition of the horse was better than ever so I was able to ride with confidence," said Take, who won the race for the first time in 17 years.

The NAR traditionally asks the winning jockey of stakes races to address the fans and Take said:

"Thank you for coming in the rain. I myself am very happy to win the Japan Dirt Derby for the first time in a long time... I'm 53 years old, but the horse is only 3 years old, so I hope we can continue to work hard together in the future."

Notturno won twice earlier this season at Hanshin on the Japan Racing Association circuit. He then finished second in the Fukuryu Stakes at Nakayama Racecourse—the final leg of the Japan Road to the Kentucky Derby.

Returning to the NAR circuit, he then was second in the listed Hyogo Championship at Sonoda Racecourse. The Dirt Derby was his first race at 2,400 meters.

"I'm thinking about heading to the Champions Cup in the future," said winning trainer Hidetaka Otonashi. "We will inform everyone as soon as it is decided."

The Dec. 4 Champions Cup (G1) is run at 1,800 meters (about 1 1/8 miles) on the Chukyo Racecourse dirt track. Chuwa Wizard won that event in 2020 and placed second in 2021 and moved on to finish second, then third, in the Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (G1) at Meydan in 2021 and 2022. **BH**

IRISH RACING TO NOT FOLLOW LEAD ON STRICTER WHIP RULES

There is no desire from the Irish Jockeys Association or Irish Horseracing Regulatory Board to amend whip rules in Ireland after significant changes were recommended in Britain.

Proposals for possible disqualification when hitting a horse four times above the permitted level, as well as using the whip only in the backhand position, will mean Irish-based riders face a very different set of rules when they cross the Irish Sea.

Given Irish-trained horses have won 41 of the last 56 races at the Cheltenham Festival it is sure to be a major factor come next March and indeed for all major festivals.

However, Irish Jockeys Association secretary Andrew Coonan said riders were already adapting to different whip rules when riding in other international jurisdictions and he did not believe the move would cause issues for Irish riders competing in Britain.

"I don't think it's a huge obstacle because each weekend we see jockeys travel to the likes of France, Britain, and America, where there are varying rules in terms of numbers," Coonan said.

"Our association discusses whip-related matters on a regular basis with the IHRB and we're relatively satisfied at the moment as to where we are. We were aware this review was coming up and there wasn't an

immediate call from the IHRB or riders that we wanted to adopt anything the UK is considering bringing in."

Coonan added: "I think there's a well-established system now, which took some time to get used to

in terms of modifications and numbers, and that has bedded in quite well. There is always room for discussion and debate, but I think at the moment we have it pretty right."

Niall Cronin, communications manager for the IHRB, said there were no plans in place to alter the current whip rules in Ireland and added that no review would be taking place in the short term.

Cronin said: "There are no major plans for any changes on the agenda at the moment. We constantly

review all elements of everything we do, and that includes what happens on a raceday and stewarding but, no, we have no intention of reacting to this."

Bruce Raymond, racing manager for Suhail, said on Wednesday: "It's in the foot, it's not a joint and it's not a tendon, so hopefully it's not too bad."

"I think if it were a lesser horse we'd just leave him in the box, but because of who he is they're being extra cautious and will check him tomorrow and scan the foot."

"In my opinion he's fit enough to be able to miss a few days. I don't know what Michael (Stoute) thinks about it but he's a very fit horse, although he wouldn't want to miss too much and he wants to be working on Saturday, that's for sure."

Desert Crown gave Stoute his sixth Derby win in emphatic fashion at Epsom in June, when Westover finished an unlucky third, and bypassed a crack at the Irish equivalent to wait for Ascot.

All had seemed well as recently as last Saturday when Richard Kingscote rode the unbeaten colt in a piece of work on the Cambridge Road Polytrack where he worked a mile with his usual lead horse Solid Stone.



UNBEATEN ELDAR ELDAROV FACES FIVE RIVALS IN GRAND PRIX

The Grand Prix de Paris (G1), featuring six colts who are covered by just three pounds on official ratings and represent the form of Europe's three major Derbys, provides an evening treat well worth tuning in for.

While the sextet who contested the Coral Eclipse Stakes (G1) at the start of the month left us wondering beforehand who might inject sufficient pace into the contest, there are several candidates for the role here.

El Bodegon has plenty of form in the book as a pacesetter, snaring his first group 1 in the 2021 Criterium de Saint-Cloud (G1) from the front, while Ioritz Mendizabal looked prepared to assume a share of that duty before Modern Games swept to the front in the Qatar Prix du Jockey Club (G1).

Finishing runner-up to Vadeni at Chantilly entitles him to top billing by one pound, and while he was beaten five lengths by the future Eclipse hero, he looks likely to appreciate the extra furlong and a half.

Piz Badile returned to more prominent tactics as well in the Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby (G1) and

while he was no match for winner Westover, he proved his stamina at a mile and a half when staying on well to be best of the rest.

One of two colts supplemented at the start of the week for €15,000, the Niarchos family representative would be a dangerous opponent for the other five if let loose on the front.

Also added late in the day was Simca Mille. Trainer Stephane Wattel had given a strong indication that this would be his next race the day he danced away from his rivals in the Prix du Lys Longines (G3) in June.

Both Simca Mille and L'Astronome made the running last time out and Wattel might have been speaking for several sets of connections when he said: "He is so uncomplicated that you don't need to adopt any particular set of tactics."

L'Astronome was last seen making all in the Prix Hocquart (G2) over a furlong shy of this course and distance in May but none of the four candidates considered so far are devoid of finishing speed; rather any one of them could ensure a decent rhythm if nobody else goes on.

So it might be an error to naturally assume that the race will automatically set up for the remaining two, the unbeaten Royal Ascot hero Eldar Eldarov and Prix Greffulhe (G2) winner Onesto.

Roger Varian stepped Eldar Eldarov up by half a mile from his win in a Newcastle novice to the Queen's Vase (G2) at Royal Ascot over 14 furlongs and although he was at his strongest at the line—David Egan struggled to pull him up before the mile start down the back—he again was swift over the final two furlongs.

Onesto is the one with the most obvious turn of foot, having flown late in the Prix du Jockey Club from a compromising wide draw.

By Frankel, out of a Sea The Stars mare, he ought to have the stamina for this task, though the fact he was able to clock a faster time than Vadeni from the two marker to the furlong pole suggests speed rather than staying power is his real strong suit.

El Bodegon cemented his love affair with French racing with a series of excellent efforts in the autumn of his 2-year-old season and it should not have come as any great surprise that, following a below-par comeback effort in the Al Basti Equiworld Dubai Dante Stakes (G2), he roared back to form when chasing home Vadeni in the Prix du Jockey Club last month.


The son of Kodiak has been a real flagbearer for trainer James Ferguson, who believes he has progressed again since Chantilly.

Ferguson said: "I've been delighted. I think he's matured and it's certainly been the biggest change since I've had him. I think I'm sending him over in tip-top condition.

"We're going there with form on our side, having been second in the French Derby and then Vadeni going on to win the Eclipse. It's a very competitive race; I don't think the mile and a half will be a problem.

Ioritz (Mendizabal) is back on and knows the horse very well. I know they've watered plenty and hopefully they will continue to do so."




