LAW PROFESSOR SCHOOLS RIVALS IN TAPIT STAKES

Law Professor has not had 2022 go his way. After a second-place finish in the San Pasqual Stakes (G2), he posted a competitive fifth-place finish in the Frank E. Kilroe Mile Stakes (G1T) and then ran ninth in the Oaklawn Mile (G3).

It's amazing what a change of scenery can do.

Returning to the turf after a nearly five-month layoff, and under the tutelage of a new trainer—New York-based Rob Atras—Law Professor earned his degree on opening day at Kentucky Downs Sept. 1. Under Julien Laparoux, the son of Constitution took the lead with a quarter-mile left to run and charged uphill towards the wire, prevailing by a half-length in the \$394,000 FanDuel Tapit Stakes.

A grade 2 winner last winter at Santa Anita Park on the dirt for Twin Creeks Racing Stables, co-owner Randy Gullatt believed there were more options for Law Professor on the East Coast, and the lucrative Kentucky Downs purses loomed as the ideal launchpad for the 4-year-old gelding.

"I thought (the Tapit Stakes) was a good opportunity," Gullatt said. "He was fit and acting like he was ready to run. So we took a shot."

Stalking just off a sprightly early pace of :22.23 and 44.91 set by Megacity, Law Professor had yet to make his move as the Joe Sharp-trained Spanish Kingdom rolled to the front past the six-furlong marker in 1:09. Leparoux shook up the gelding around the final turn and he split horses at the top of the stretch to defeat a game Spanish Kingdom under the wire in a final time of 1:38.10 for the one mile and seventy yards.

Shadow Sphinx, shipping in from California off a runner-up effort in a Del Mar \$50,000 claiming event, rallied strongly to secure third at 34-1 odds.

Law Professor, who returned \$21.10 from a \$2 win ticket, led a trifecta that paid a handsome \$1,808.36. The Kentucky-bred gelding now sports a record of 4-1-1 from 11 starts and earnings of \$516,440.

"Turning for home, I wasn't sure if we had enough horse because the fractions looked really fast to me," Atras said. "But Julien was really smart and backed off the pace a little bit. He tucked him in and then he went down the rail and then the (camera) angle changed. I

thought we had a shot, but I couldn't quite tell because the angle was really tough for me to read. All of a sudden as the camera angle kind of went more to the traditional pan shot, they were still there. Julien was going left-handed and riding him and he was still there. It was incredible. I couldn't believe it. I never expected to win first time at that track."

Law Professor was the first Atras starter at Kentucky Downs.

JSM Equine's Peace Achieved was pulled up by jockey Adam Beschizza on the backstretch and was vanned off.

Law Professor, a homebred for Twin Creeks, is the second foal produced from the multiple stakes-winning Ghostzapper mare Haunted Heroine. A half sister to grade 1 winner Celestine, Haunted Heroine is also the dam of an unraced 2-year-old gelding by Uncle Mo named Huntington and a yearling full sister to Law Professor.

The Tapit was restricted to horses that had not won a stakes in 2022. Last year In Love, who finished fifth in this year's race, used his victory as a springboard to a win in the Keeneland Turf Mile Stakes (G1T). Gullatt indicated the Turf Mile could be next on the agenda for Law Professor.

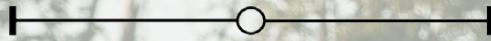

Michael J. Ryan's Irish homebred Be Your Best surged up the rail to win her stakes debut in the Sept. 1 \$150,000 P. G. Johnson Stakes, a 1 1/16-mile inner turf test for juvenile fillies, at Saratoga Race Course.

Trained by Horacio De Paz and piloted by Jose Ortiz, who won four races on the card, the Muhaarar filly entered from a stylish 3 1/4-length debut score traveling 1 1/16 miles July 31 over firm Spa turf.

"Jose had me a little worried at the quarter-pole. He was kind of inside, but he believed in the filly," De Paz said. "He's been working her in the mornings and rode her first time, so he knew what he had underneath him. Her mind is so good, I worked her with another 2-year-old and she was always handling everything very well. Everything she does is very classy. She's a classy filly."

The Junior Alvarado-piloted Recognize took

command from the outermost post 8 and set splits of :24.15 and :49.67 over the good going with Damaso tracking in second and Be Your Best saving ground in third.

Idea Generation, who was forced wide through the opening turn under Flavien Prat, advanced with a wide rally into the final turn as three-quarters ticked by in 1:15.17. But a patient Ortiz cut the corner with Be Your Best and surged to the inside of Recognize to take command a furlong out en route to a 3 3/4-length score in a final time of 1:45.67.

Whichwaze, with Dylan Davis up, rallied from last at odds of 19-1 to complete the exacta by a half-length over Recognize with Idea Generation, Pachuca, Damaso, Lady Jasmine, and Indian Spideroo rounding out the order of finish. Main-track only entrant Leave No Trace was scratched.

"I knew we were going slow going into the first turn, but I feel like the grass—the inner especially—is no good for speed. So, I decided to make a move and take that position inside," said Ortiz, who won this event last year with Miss Interpret. "The filly was so easy to ride. She did whatever I asked her to do. She relaxed well and had a beautiful turn of foot turning for home. The rail opened up and she gave it to me. I feel like she didn't give me 100%—she was playing with her ears passing the wire. She's happy and Horacio has done an amazing job with her."

It was the second Spa stakes score for De Paz, who won the 2017 Smart N Fancy with Ginger N Rye. He said the team may now consider charting a path to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T) in November at Keeneland.

"Definitely, but we'll see how she comes out," De Paz said. "I think she's deserving of that spot. We'll look at (another start). She's a pretty fit filly but (we'll) kind of get with Mike Ryan on that and make the best decision."

Be Your Best banked \$82,500 in victory while remaining perfect through two starts. She returned \$4.70 for a \$2 win bet.

She is the second foal out of the Medaglia d'Oro mare Kamakura, a full sister to stakes winner Bay of Plenty and half sibling to the grade 1-placed runner Fortify.

Ortiz, who also won races on the Thursday card aboard Numero Seis (Race 3), Invaluable (Race 8), and Be the Boss (Race 11).

PARTY STILL GOING AFTER ALBANY WIN

If you were at Saratoga Race Course Aug. 26, you saw quite the party in the winner's circle after the \$250,000 Albany was run. The connections of Bossmakinbossmoves were more than a little bit excited after their New York-bred won the 1 1/8-mile race for 3-year-olds

"We've got a great, real enthusiastic group of people with the Clear Stars Stable," trainer Rick Schosberg said Sept. 1 at his barn on the Saratoga backstretch. "Shoot, they are cheering for horses that ran third at Aqueduct in the middle of winter. When something like this happens, the emotions really come flooding out."

Schosberg is also part of the ownership group of Bossmakinbossmoves, along with Mitre Box Stable.

The group bought Bossmakinbossmoves, a son of Laoban, at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale for \$75,000.

"It really is a good group of folks," Schosberg said. "It's great to see one of the horses that we bought at a sale develop into a stakes horse. Last year, a 3-year-old state-bred filly owned by the same group—A Bit o' Irish Sass—won the \$75,000 New York Oaks at Finger Lakes.

The Albany win was Bossmakinbossmoves first win in eight starts this year. He went off at odds of 6-1 in the Albany, the longest price of the four horses in the race. He and jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. won by three lengths.

"We have a 3-year-old horse that has stamped himself as one of the top 3-year-old New York-breds at a distance of ground," Schosberg said. "It's very gratifying. We are going to have a lot of options available to us."

Bossmakinbossmoves splashes home to win the Albany Stakes at Saratoga Race Course

Temple City Terror Took Awhile to Find Winner's Circle

When the New York Racing Association runs the \$600,000 Flower Bowl Stakes (G2T) at Saratoga Race Course Sept. 3, the horse to beat in the race for fillies and mares aged 4 and up, most everyone agrees, will be the Bill Mott-trained War Like Goddess.

Trainer Brendan Walsh doesn't know if he can beat the 2-5 morning-line favorite, but he thinks he will be competitive with the six other horses in the field. Walsh will saddle 6-year-old mare Temple City Terror and she has come a long way since she first came to the barn.

Owned by Pocket Aces Racing, the daughter of Temple City took a long time before she broke into the win column.

Temple City Terror began her career on Jan. 5, 2019, with her first appearance in a maiden race. She finished fourth. The trend would continue.

It wasn't until her 10th start, on Nov. 16 of that year, that she finally found the winner's circle, breaking her maiden on the grass at Churchill Downs.

"Long time to break her maiden," Walsh said. "But she has always been a barn favorite. She never has had a bad day, just a pleasure to be around. It's always nice to have a mare like that."

Temple City Terror did not become a winning machine after finally getting that maiden score.

In the 16 races since that first win, she has won four other times. Two of those races came in the same race, the Keertana Overnight Stakes at 1 1/2 miles at Churchill this year and last.

She has chased War Like Goddess, finishing second behind her in the 1 1/2-mile Glens Falls Stakes (G2T) at the Spa on Aug. 6; last year in the same race, she was third behind the Flower Bowl's big favorite.

"She has improved with age," Walsh said. "She is a hard-trying mare and you can't beat that. She shows up and gives it her all every time."

Temple City Terror takes the Keertana Overnight Stakes at Churchill Downs

Pletcher Undecided Where Winters Back Will Make Return

Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher says he is going to wait before deciding whether or not to run Waterford Stable's Winters Back in the \$200,000 Bernard Baruch (G3T) at Saratoga Race Course on Sept. 5.

The 5-year-old son of Summer Front has been off for more than a year. He hasn't run since finishing seventh last year in the United Nations Stakes (G1T) at Monmouth Park on July 17.

Another option could be sending Winters Back on the road, down to the Jersey Shore. The \$100,000 Red Bank Stakes is being run at Monmouth, also on Sept. 5.

"I'm going to have to think about it," Pletcher said. "I'm being told the Red Bank will come up a softer spot. He hasn't run in awhile and I am going to opt for the easier place."

Winters Back has three wins and three seconds in nine career starts. He was runner-up in the Monmouth Stakes (G3T) last year before his run in the United Nations.

He has been at Saratoga since early June and has 11 published works. **BH**

HOT PEPPERS SPICES UP PRIORESS

Edited Press Release

Trainer Rudy Rodriguez will hope to see the talented Hot Peppers pick up her second graded score in the Sept. 2 \$250,000 Prioress Stakes (G2) for 3-year-old fillies sprinting six furlongs on the main track at Saratoga Race Course.

Owned by Michael Dubb and Michael Caruso, Hot Peppers enters from a game runner-up effort in the Aug. 6 Longines Test Stakes (G1) at the Spa where she was defeated 1 1/2 lengths by 17-1 upset winner Chi Town Lady in her grade 1 debut. There was a brief steward's inquiry into the stretch run of the Test after Hot Peppers drifted and brushed with the Wesley Ward-trained Chi Town Lady and third-place finisher Matareya.

"She ran a great race," said Rodriguez. "The horse for Wesley Ward looked like she was going to win either way. There was an inquiry, but everything was clear and we'll keep fighting another day. The value as a broodmare went higher for sure with a grade 1 placing."

A daughter of Khozan, Hot Peppers earned her best victory two starts back with a gutsy three-quarter-length effort over returning rival Half Is Enough in the July 9 Victory Ride Stakes (G3) at Belmont Park, scoring her first graded win on the heels of a win in the Jersey Girl Stakes at the same oval in her first start with Rodriguez. She began her career with three wins from five starts for former owner/trainer Ronald Spatz, with all three victories coming at Gulfstream Park.

"Every stakes race is tough. She's still got to show up," Rodriguez said. "But at least she doesn't look like she needs a track. She's won at Gulfstream and Belmont and (ran well) at Saratoga. That's a plus when you see horses bring their form to the next track. She's not that big, but she's got a lot of heart."

Hot Peppers will be ridden by regular pilot Luis Saez from post 2.

Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen and owner Winchell Thoroughbreds will

look to continue their graded stakes success at the Spa with Wicked Halo, who streaks into the Prioress off two solid stakes wins at Churchill Downs in the Leslie's Lady Overnight and Tepin, winning by a combined 7 1/2 lengths.

A daughter of Gun Runner, Wicked Halo already boasts a graded win at Saratoga after taking last year's Adirondack Stakes (G2) sprinting 6 1/2 furlongs.

Tyler Gaffalione, aboard for both stakes wins at Churchill, has the call from post 1.

Paradise Farms and David Staudacher's Lady Scarlet is in search of her second graded win this year, hoping to add to a late-running 3 3/4-length victory in the Miss Preakness Stakes (G3) on the George E. Mitchell Black-Eyed Susan (G2) undercard at Pimlico Race Course.

Trained by Mike Maker, the Union Rags filly returns to the dirt in Friday's race after an unsuccessful bid on the turf in the Coronation Cup Stakes at the Spa July 15. After being bumped on different occasions during the stretch run, she finished an even sixth.

Lady Scarlet will exit post 3 in rein to Jose Ortiz.

NYRA TO ADD THREE DORMS AT SARATOGA RACE COURSE

The New York Racing Association plans to add 204 beds in three new dormitories at Saratoga Race Course, officials told state regulators Sept. 1.

The addition of three dorms over three years is the first time new housing has been built at the historic track since the early 1960s, NYRA officials said Thursday afternoon.

The first of the 68-room facilities is set to begin construction next year near the Oklahoma training track. In all, two of the three new dorms will be on the training track side of the property.

"That gets the most use," Glen Kozak, NYRA's senior vice president of operations and capital projects, told members of the New York State Franchise Oversight Board.

The dorms will cost \$2 million apiece, officials said. The third dorm will be located on the main track side of the property.

The announcement comes after NYRA has spent \$37 million improving backstretch housing at Saratoga and Belmont Park since 2013. It also comes after Brian O'Dwyer, the head of the New York State Gaming Commission, which regulates horse racing in the state, last month raised concerns about the state

of backstretch housing after he toured the Saratoga facilities.

Kozak told the Franchise Oversight Board, which monitors NYRA's finances and capital projects, that the racing corporation is working with Saratoga Springs historic preservation officials and its architect on the program to build the three new dorms.

The facility slated for competition next spring will be located adjacent to the recreation center near the Oklahoma Training Track. The training track is used from April until mid-November, and so the need for new housing near there is a key goal for NYRA, officials said.

NYRA officials also told the fiscal oversight panel that its year-to-date handle from all sources is up 2% compared with the same period a year ago, despite six fewer racing days in 2022. Total handle in 2022 stood at \$1.75 billion. The average daily handle on NYRA's races rose 6.7% year-to-date in 2022 compared with a year ago. The overwhelming share of that, as had been the case for many years, came from wagers made through off-track betting entities.

Patrick McKenna, vice president of communications for NYRA, said NYRA has renovated more than 100 residences at Belmont and Saratoga in the last decade.

"But there is always more work to be done, which is why NYRA plans to construct three new dormitories at Saratoga over the next three years," he said Thursday afternoon.

McKenna said NYRA will work closely with the Saratoga Springs Preservation Foundation and other stakeholders "to ensure these new buildings align with the historical architecture found throughout the property.

"When complete, these new residences will represent the most significant upgrade to backstretch housing in the history of Saratoga Race Course," McKenna added.

Five Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" Challenge Races take place this weekend, split between the major summer racetracks of Saratoga Race Course and Del Mar, with two 1 1/4-mile qualifiers Sept. 3 providing entry into the Longines Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) Nov. 5 at Keeneland.

The first of those Saturday Breeders' Cup Classic preps goes to post at 5:45 p.m. ET at Saratoga when the upstate New York track hosts the Jockey Club Gold Cup (G1), a longtime Belmont Park race that was moved to an earlier slot in the year and to the Spa beginning in 2021. Roughly three hours later on Saturday, the TVG Pacific Classic (G1), featuring the unbeaten Flightline, goes off at Del Mar at 5:30 p.m. PT, or 8:30 p.m. ET.

Though it carries a top-tier grade, the Jockey Club Gold Cup appears a cut below in quality compared to the Aug. 6 Whitney Stakes (G1) at Saratoga, a race that Life Is Good, one of the world's top-ranked dirt horses, took in front-running fashion over Happy Saver and Hot Rod Charlie. Only Olympiad returns on 28 days rest from the Whitney, seeking to rebound from a dull performance when fourth, beaten 9 1/4 lengths, his lone defeat in six starts this year.

Grandview Equine, Cheyenne Stable, and LNJ Foxwoods' Speightstown colt, trained by Hall of Famer Bill Mott, has already punched his Breeders' Cup Classic ticket, having taking the WAYI Stephen Foster Stakes

(G2) at Churchill Downs in early July. The allure of the Jockey Club Gold Cup for his connections is the grade 1 prestige of Saturday's race; a grade 1 victory is the primary accomplishment missing from the colt's race record.

He projects to receive a favorable up-close trip under Junior Alvarado, perhaps rating just off Tax to his inside, in a race with limited pace.

China Horse Club and WinStar Farm's Americanrevolution, second to Olympiad in the Foster, beaten 2 1/4 lengths, leads four Todd Pletcher trainees in the eight-horse field. With Olympiad coming off a subpar recent outing, Americanrevolution owns the top last-race Equibase Speed Figure, a 120.

Winner of the Cigar Mile Handicap Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) in December at Aqueduct Racetrack, in which he defeated fourth-place Olympiad by 4 1/2 lengths, Americanrevolution is one of many in the Jockey

Club Gold Cup that line up without a win at 1 1/4 miles. Dynamic One is a sole winner at the classic trip, having narrowly defeated fellow Jockey Club Gold Cup starters First Captain and Untreated in the Suburban Stakes (G2) at Belmont Park at the distance.

Olympiad and Americanrevolution have never tried 1 1/4 miles. They are both dual stakes winners at 1 1/8 miles.

Out west, Flightline stretches out even further, coming off a six-length victory in the one-mile Hill 'n' Dale Metropolitan Handicap (G1) June 11 at Belmont. His three preceding starts, also runaway scores, similarly came around one turn, ranging in distance from six to seven furlongs.

His win in the Metropolitan Handicap, a race known as the Met Mile, earned him an automatic berth in the \$1 million Big Ass Fans Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1), also Nov. 5 at Keeneland—though that's not the prize his connections want. Trainer John Sadler and owners

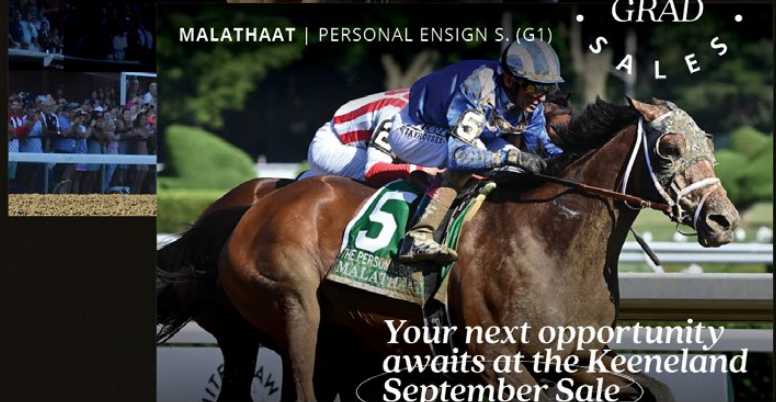
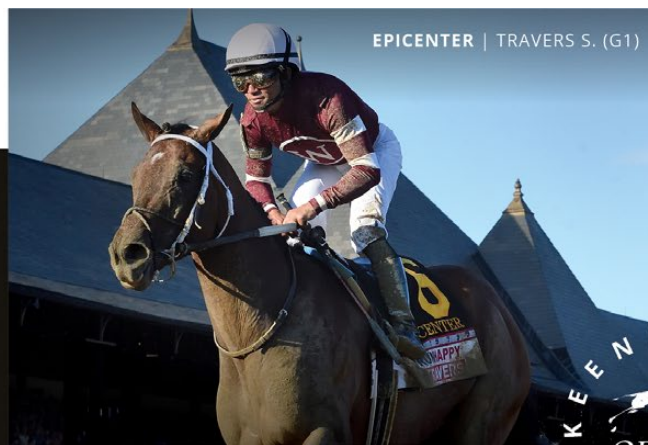

MILLIONAIRE GRADE 1 WINNER GAYEGO DIES AT 17

Multiple track record-setter and grade 1 winner Gayego lost a battle with colic Aug. 31 and died at 17, according to Bar None Ranches in Alberta, Canada, where the stallion stood since his second year at stud in 2013.

"The grade 1 winner and millionaire was as kind as he was fast, and his loss is felt by everyone at Bar None Ranches," the farm wrote on its Facebook page.

Hargus and Sandra Sexton bred Gayego in Kentucky out of the Lost Code winner Devils Lake. The colt was a son of Eclipse champion 2-year-old male Gilded Time and was sold at the 2006 Keeneland September Yearling Sale for \$32,000 to Cubanacan Stables out of Warrendale Sales' consignment.

Gayego won his debut by three lengths at the former Hollywood Park for Cubanacan and trainer Paulo Lobo and went on to set his first track record going 6 1/2 furlongs in the San Pedro Stakes at Santa Anita Park, where he stopped the timer in 1:13.07. Two races later he won the Arkansas Derby (G2) by three-quarters of a length. He would be unplaced in the Kentucky Derby (G1) and Preakness Stakes (G1), then return to the West Coast where he regrouped and ended the 2008 season with another 6 1/2-furlong record, this time at Hollywood Park where he won in 1:13.37 and earned a 116 Equibase Speed Figure for the performance.

Godolphin bought Gayego and campaigned him during 2009-11. At 4, he won the Dayjur Mahab Al Shimaal (G3) at the former Nad Al Sheba racetrack in Dubai and was second in the Godolphin Mile Sponsored by Etisalat (G2). He was sent back to the U.S. where he won the Ancient Title Stakes (G1) during the Oak Tree at Santa Anita meet. At 5, he placed third in two other grade 1 stakes—Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1)

and Triple Bend Handicap (G1)—and won the Presque Isle Mile Stakes in track record time of 1:34.90.

Gayego retired with an 8-4-2 record from 21 starts and earnings totaling \$1,751,120. He entered stud at Norse Ridge Farms in Ontario in 2012 and then was moved to Bar None Ranches, where breeding manager Shaun Rathy managed the remainder of his career. He sired 44 winners from 83 starters, led by Sadie Diamond Futurity winner Spirit Bay and multiple winner Lookout Taylor, who placed in the Supernatural Handicap.

"He enjoyed racing his sire Gilded Time up and down the long fence lines when he arrived, never one to turn down a challenge or an opportunity to show off," Bar None Ranches wrote about its sire. "In later years, because of his excellent, quiet temperament he was able to live by 'his mares,' enjoying his post watching the daily activities of the broodmare pens and socializing with anyone who'd stop in for a visit. His foals were known for their quiet, biddable personalities and reflected his large, kind eye and considerable size. The big black stallion with a heart of gold will be missed greatly by Shaun and her team, as well as anyone who had the fortune of having met him." **BH**

FORMER PTHA EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR BALLEZZI DIES AT 76

The Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association is saddened to share news of the passing of Michael P. Ballezzi, who served as the organization's executive director for 25 years prior to his retirement last year. Ballezzi, age 76, died Wednesday, Aug. 31.

"We've lost not only a great horseman, but also a great friend and leader," said Salvatore DeBunda, president of the PTHA board of directors. "Mike dedicated 25 years of his life to championing the well-being and care of equine athletes, as well as championing the interests of horsemen at Parx Racetrack and across Pennsylvania. When he retired, Mike left behind an incredible legacy at the PTHA."

"Mike Ballezzi's impact on Pennsylvania racing, horsemen, and our retired race horses will live on for many years to come," said Jeffrey Matty, executive director of the PTHA. "But his impact extends far beyond the policies and programs he championed. He touched so many people on and off the track on a personal level, and that may be his greatest legacy."

One of Ballezzi's most significant accomplishments, Turning for Home, was an outgrowth of his deep commitment to the health and well-being of our retired racehorses. Since Turning for Home's creation in May 2008, the non-profit has placed more than 3,200 former Parx Racing racehorses in new homes and racing careers. The non-profit is now considered by many as the gold

standard for track-based racehorse retirement programs.

Ballezzi served as executive director of the PTHA in February 1996 through December 2021 and served as an Owner Director on the PTHA's board of directors. During his tenure, Ballezzi played an integral role in shaping Pennsylvania's horse racing industry as a fierce advocate for passage of the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development and Gaming Act (Act 71 of 2004). The legislation legalized slot machines in the Commonwealth and set aside a percentage of the revenues to bolster racing purses and breeding incentives, as well as provide health and pension benefits to individuals in the racing industry. Mike was also instrumental in negotiations with Parx Racing management that led to significant capital investments in the backstretch, including dorm renovations and the construction of new barns.

At Parx, he also created the Horsemen's Purchasing Association which provides horsemen on the backstretch of the track with bedding, feed, supplements, and equipment at supply-discounted prices. In 2000, he spearheaded the creation of The Granny Fund—named in honor of Catherine "Granny" Youmans, the mother of PTHA office manager and longtime personal secretary to Ballezzi, Connie Youmans—which provides scholarships to Parx stable employees to continue their education in college and night classes.

A graduate of Widener Law School, Ballezzi was also an attorney and previously served as a District Justice in Delaware County, Pa.,

ALCOHOL FREE TO BE SOLD AT TATTERSALLS DECEMBER SALE

Four-time group 1 winner Alcohol Free will be sold at the Tattersalls December Mares Sale taking place from Nov. 28—Dec. 1, featuring in the new Sceptre Session on the second day of the auction.

The versatile daughter of No Nay Never is owned by Jeff Smith and has won four contests at the highest level: the Juddmonte Cheveley Park Stakes (G1) at 2, the Coronation Stakes (G1) and Qatar Sussex Stakes (G1) at 3, and the Darley July Cup Stakes (G1) this summer at 4.

The Andrew Balding-trained filly was third to the brilliant Baaeed on her most recent start in the Sussex Stakes at Goodwood and is on course to bow out on Champions Day at Ascot next month in either the QIPCO British Champions Sprint Stakes (G1) or the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes Sponsored by QIPCO (G1).

Following her emphatic win in the July Cup, Smith said of his superstar: "This filly is something else, the way she has won that is simply incredible. She's a champion, there's absolutely no question in my mind."

Balding said: "She's a superstar! She is the only filly I have trained to win four group 1s and the only horse I've trained to win group 1s at 2, 3, and 4, which is pretty special—and we are hoping there are more to come.

"She's not only an outstanding race filly, she is also a gorgeous individual; an imposing, scopey filly who has improved both physically and mentally with age. She acts on all different types of ground and will one day let down into a fine broodmare."

Bred by Churchtown House Stud and a €40,000 (US\$45,820) purchase by Smith's Littleton Stud at the Goffs November Foal Sale in

2018, Alcohol Free is from the third crop of Coolmore's red-hot sire No Nay Never.

She is the fourth foal out of the winning Hard Spun mare Plying and a half sister to French listed winner Alexander James. The pair's half sister by Gleneagles will be offered as Lot 136 at Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale by Jossestown Farm.

GROUP 1 WINNER CACHET TO REST THIS YEAR, RETURN IN 2023

George Boughey has revealed that his Qipco One Thousand Guineas (G1) winner Cachet, who gave the Newmarket trainer a breakthrough first classic success at Newmarket in May, will not run again this season but is to remain in training next year, when she could be remodeled as a sprinter.

The 3-year-old daughter of Aclaim made all the running to give the former Hugo Palmer assistant a first group 1 success under James Doyle on the Rowley Mile and was denied by just a head under similar tactics in the French (Emirates Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, G1) equivalent.

Cachet, who is owned by the Highclere Thoroughbred Racing Wild Flower syndicate, was last seen finishing fifth to Inspirial in the Coronation Stakes (G1) at Royal Ascot in June.

She was being prepared for an autumn campaign

starting in the Sun Chariot Stakes (G1) at Newmarket on Oct. 1 before being pitched in against the colts for the first time on a return trip to the Breeders' Cup in November after she finished fourth at the championships a year ago.

Boughey said: "It's nothing dramatic. Cachet has had a sinus infection which has meant she has missed plenty of work just lately. I spoke to Harry Herbert this morning and we're doing what's right for a filly who is a classic winner and has been such a star for us.

"When they have a summer break they have to jump through every hoop to get to an autumn campaign. She wouldn't have been ready for the Sun Chariot and it's not fair to take her straight to the Breeders' Cup against the colts."

Cachet is to stay in training in 2023 when a drop back in trip could be on the cards. She scored over six furlongs on her debut at Newmarket last year and won the Lanwades Stud Nell Gwyn Stakes (G3) over seven furlongs on her reappearance in April.

Boughey added: "We've just run out of time for this year but she's going to stay in training at 4 which is great news. Her sire Aclaim was much the best as a 4-year-old."

He added: "I'm pretty interested in bringing her back in trip next year as she's not short of pace and it would be no surprise to see her get some entries in the sprinting division. We'd certainly be coming back in trip rather than going up."

BADEN BADEN BUYERS SEEKING THE NEXT ARC WINNER

The flags that line the entrance to the BBAG sales complex in Iffezheim, gently swayed in the warm early autumn breeze the morning of Sept. 1, their vivid colors reflecting the hues of the voices, accents, and languages that rose from the lawn, the barns, and the restaurants as buyers from around the globe descended on the sales ground.

Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1) winners Danedream and Torquator Tasso and this year's IDEE Deutsches Derby (G1) and Grosser Dallmayr Preis Bayerisches Zuchtrennen (G1) hero Sammarco are a trio of horses who have sprinkled stardust over this sales ground in recent years and their exploits, the dedicated efforts of Klaus Eulenberger and his team at BBAG, and the determination of German breeders have ensured this sylvan haven in the Black Forest is now an unmissable destination on the yearling sales trail.

Purchasers, agents, and vets from Europe, America, Australia, and Hong Kong were ferried in a fleet of vehicles from airports around Southern Germany Aug. 31 under leaden skies and roads that were dampened by precipitation not seen in great quantities anywhere in Europe this summer.

The rain that fell on Wednesday disappeared without a trace, and Thursday dawned in a blaze of sunshine and the cloudless blue skies which have come to define the summer of 2022.

It was perfect weather for viewing beautifully bred and perfectly presented yearlings from Germany's most renowned and famous breeders.

The Gestut Gorlsdorf barn, resplendent in the stud's green and white colors with yellow blooms added for even more color, bore a large banner displaying the group winners bred on the farm in recent years. Pride of place went, naturally enough to Deutsches Derby hero Sea The Moon, who stands at Lanwades Stud in Newmarket and is the sire of group 1 Coronation Stakes (G1) winner Alpine Star.

Heike Bischoff, owner of Gestut Gorlsdorf and Sea

The Moon, would dearly love to breed and own a Preis der Diana (G1) winner, after so many near misses with the talented group and listed-winning fillies that adorn the banner alongside her Derby victor.

Dressed in shades of her farm's vibrant green, she was delighted at the reception Gorlsdorf's draft of nine yearlings garnered from the cast of international buyers.

"The whole world is here, it seems—from America, Ireland, England, and France—and right from yesterday morning, we have been extremely busy. It is a very good sign," she remarked.

The yearlings and the team traveled the 10 hours from Gorlsdorf, which lies an hour to the northeast of Berlin, overnight on Aug. 29 and settled into their temporary home Aug. 30.

Naturally, Sea The Moon features prominently in the Gorlsdorf consignment as well as members of the 11-length Classic winner's family and Bischoff reflected with pride and emotion on the privilege it is to breed horses by a stallion she had bred and foaled.

"It is just marvelous, it couldn't be more wonderful," she beamed. "It is perfect. He was such a lovely and good character and did extremely well for us, so it is such a pleasure and joy to see him become a good stallion."

Sea The Moon's progeny in the Gorlsdorf draft includes a full brother to listed third Party Moon, already named Putyourmoneyonme (Hip 109), while an Iffraaj colt (Hip 159) is the first foal out of Sea The Moon's full sister Sea The World.

However, it is a colt by his wonderful sire Sea The Stars (Hip 49) that Bischoff believes will be the headline maker for Gorlsdorf come sale time.

"The Sea The Stars colt will be our most valuable yearling at the sale I think. He has lovely breeding as he is out of an Adlerflug mare and he has done so well with Torquator Tasso and lots of other good horses," she added.

He is a three-parts brother to listed-winning filly Mercedes, by Sea The Moon, out of Diana Trial (G2) winner Meergorl, one of the Gorlsdorf poster girls.

The consignment from Gestut Etzean, stabled across from the training yards in Block B, had a shorter journey than the Gorlsdorf yearlings, coming just two hours from the farm between Frankfurt and Heidelberg.

In a couple of years, the first crop of yearlings by Etzean's young sire, the Juddmonte International

Stakes (G1) and Juddmonte Grand Prix de Paris (G1) winner Japan will follow in their hoofprints. The signs for the son of Galileo and Shastye have been very encouraging, reports the stud's manager Ralf Kredel.

"Japan has been very well received in Germany and all of the top breeders sent good mares to him. He covered 80 mares plus in the end, which was the biggest number for any German stallion this year, so we are very happy with him," Kredel commented.

"He has let down already after his first covering season and he behaves very well. We were very happy to get the chance to stand such a horse in Germany and hopefully make him successful like other big imports before such as Big Shuffle and Dashing Blade."

Etzean, which lies in the forested mountains of the Odenwald, was home to Lord of England, a son of Dashing Blade, until his death last year. Sire of Deutsches Derby (G1) winner Isfahan, among others, he is the sire of Kredel's pick of the Etzean draft, a filly with the portentous name Olympia (Hip 55).

"We have a very good filly by Lord of England, called Olympia, which is a great name. She's a full sister to a group 3 horse and from a very stout German family with a lot of stamina. We have plenty of fillies from this family which is why we are selling this one; even if it is hard for a stud manager to sell such a nice filly, but somehow we have to generate an income for the stud so from time to time we sell a filly like this, but we usually sell the colts," he smiles.

Olympia is a full sister to Olorda, whose wins included the Prix Vanteaux (G3) and The Very One Stakes (G3T). She was also third in the Pour Moi Coolmore Prix Saint-Alary (G1).

Etzean consigns yearlings by the farm's own mares and for clients who board their mares permanently on the farm, ensuring that all yearlings in the Etzean draft have been raised on the hilly swards, almost 1,000 meters above sea level.

Kredel is proud of the farm's excellent record at this sale, from where genuine top-class horses have been found and at prices that cost less than a holiday in one of nearby Baden Baden's opulent hotels.

"Maybe we are lacking a superstar by a foreign stallion, but the main idea of the stud was always to support their own stallions, and that is what we are

popular for," is his honest assessment. "We have sold a lot of group 1 winners here, 11 so far, and not costing a fortune with only two of them making more than €50,000."

As the flags continued their laconic dance in the breeze, the buyers and vendors, inspections complete and showing over, were left to contemplate their fortunes tomorrow, wondering if the soft breeze will blow in their favor.
