LEAVE NO TRACE TAKES HOME SPINAWAY WIN IN 14-1 UPSET

Trainer Phil Serpe was uncertain of what to expect from his 2-year-old filly Leave No Trace in the \$300,000 Spinaway Stakes (G1) Sept. 4 at Saratoga Race Course.

The betting public also had its doubts, sending WellSpring Stables' daughter of Outwork off at 14-1 odds.

"You just don't know who these fillies are yet," Serpe said.

People found out a considerable amount about Leave No Trace on the penultimate day of the Saratoga meet as she motored to a 1 1/2-length victory over Wonder Wheel and eight other 2-year-old fillies to provide Serpe with his first grade 1 win in 29 years.

"It's great," said Serpe, whose last grade 1 victory came courtesy of Birdonthewire in the 1993 Vosburgh Stakes. "I am really happy for the people who own this horse. They are great people. They're deserving. It's a great deal all around for everybody."

Dr. Robert Vukovich and his wife, Laura, operate WellSpring Stables, and it was their team that astutely picked out Leave No Trace, a daughter of the Good Journey mare Tanquerray, for \$40,000 from the Vinery Sales consignment at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling Sale.

"All the credit goes to the owner and his staff," Serpe said of the purchase. "They do a great job. They scope these horses out. Two years ago, they found Safe Conduct, who won the Queen's Plate last year. They found this filly and they found Bank On Anna, who won a stakes (the

Aug. 12 Union Avenue Handicap). Whatever their theories are for buying these horses, they are doing a good job."

After the purchase, Serpe turned Leave No Trace into a stakes winner following an impressive 2 3/4-length debut win July 20 at the Spa in a maiden race restricted to horses who sold or were RNA'd for \$50,000 or less at their last sale.

"We really don't wind up our 2-year-old first-time starters at all," Serpe said. "So, when she won that day, she was impressive, and that shows something in our barn."

Given that early success, Serpe didn't hesitate to target the seven-furlong Spinaway, where he found six fillies with one victory, just like Leave No Trace, but three coming off stakes wins.

"She was training great. She worked 59 and change for fun, and you have to go. Like they say, you have to make hay when the sun shines. You take a shot. That's what racing is. That's what this whole thing is about."

One of those stakes winners set the pace in the Spinaway. Adirondack Stakes (G3) winner Naughty Gal led by a length through fractions of :22.84 and :46.66 in a bid to give 87-year-old Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas a third victory on the card.

Meanwhile, Jose Lezcano and Leave No Trace pressed the pace from second and forged to the front as Naughty Gal tired and retreated to ninth. D J Stable's Wonder Wheel, the Debutante Stakes winner and 7-5 favorite, and debut winner Kaling took up the chase in the stretch but were unable to gain ground in the final furlong.

Leave No Trace (\$31.60) was timed in 1:24.03 for the seven furlongs.

"I'm not surprised the way she did it," Lezcano said. "She traveled like a good horse and she is."

Wonder Wheel, an Into Mischief filly trained by Mark Casse, was second by 1 1/4 lengths over Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners' Kaling, a daughter of Practical Joke trained by Todd Pletcher.

"Obviously, I would have liked to have won, but I thought she ran real well," Casse said. "She got hung out pretty wide (from post nine). She didn't change leads until about the sixteenth pole. I thought maybe

when she changed, she'd kick on again, and she did."

Casse said Wonder Wheel would be pointed to the Oct. 7 Darley Alcibiades Stakes (G1) at Keeneland, home of the Breeders' Cup Nov. 4-5.

While Serpe was undecided about Leave No Trace's next start, if she heads to the \$2 million NetJets Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1), she picked up some cash to make it easier on her owner's checkbook. With the Spinaway serving as a Breeders' Cup Dirt Dozen race, Leave Me Now earned a \$30,000 credit toward a start in the Juvenile Fillies. Wonder Wheel received a \$15,000 credit and Kaling \$7,500.

The first stakes winner out of Tanquerray, Leave No Trace is her third foal and second winner. She also has a yearling full sister to the Spinaway winner and a 2022 Notional colt. **BH**

FLIGHTLINE LANDS A SPECIAL PLACE IN HISTORY

At 3:45 on the morning of Sept. 3, Arene Quintana unlatched the metal grate to stall 31 in Barn J on the Del Mar backstretch and led Flightline from the shed row into the darkness. There they stood as they did every morning, allowing Flightline, in Quintana's words, "to look up at the stars."

The stars looked down, cold and unblinking, then moved along to another nighttime sky. Flightline's day had begun.

A different day, however, from any of the 83 since he had last competed in a pari-mutuel event. It would be a morning without a trip to the track for one of Flightline's robust gallops and an afternoon without the usual room service, while in between the hours would drag by on a hot, humid day relieved only by the thrum of a fan mounted high above his stall door. Come the hour, when trainer John Sadler finally cinched the girth on Flightline for the first time since June 11, the big colt was ready to eat meat.

Instead, he took a bite out of history.

It is the job of racing writers to take a stab at placing Flightline's performance in the 32nd running of the TVG Pacific Classic (G1) Sept. 3 at Del Mar in

some sort of perspective. But it is not enough simply to say he humiliated a small collection of serious stakes winners and that he did it quickly. The margin at the end of 10 furlongs was 19 1/4 lengths, the time was a near-track record 1:59.28, and the widely recognized Beyer Speed Figure of 126 was higher than all but one among the millions computed over the past three decades.

Such measures are fine, and no doubt they'll stand the test of time. Yet they do not address the unadorned joy of the moment, the silly thrill of beholding the impossible, as Flightline and Flavien Prat rendered announcer Trevor Denman, his voice choking with emotion, to a series of hyperbolic proclamations that climaxed with "You're not going to see this too often—maybe never!"

Maybe never? That would be too bad. Then again, such sights are so few and far between that each generation may be blessed with only a single rare glimpse into the deepest recesses of what a truly great Thoroughbred racehorse can summon when asked. Their names are second nature: Man o' War, Count Fleet, Citation, Kelso, Damascus, Dr. Fager, Secretariat, Spectacular Bid, Rachel Alexandra. Each had that day of days, a separation from not only their contemporaries but from time and space as well.

Now that Flightline has done what he's done, his place in history is secure. It does not matter that he never will carry weight like Forego, or run as often as John Henry, or attract adoring fan clubs like California Chrome or Zenyatta. He will not compete again for another two months, which is fine, since it may take that long to digest what happened at Del Mar. No one can eat chocolate cake every day and survive.

Even better, the unfolding of the race begs for repeated viewing and happy dissection. It's almost a shame it was over so quickly. Juan Leyva, whose work aboard Flightline each morning has been a master class of horsemanship, watched from the grandstand tunnel as Prat negotiated the opening straightaway.

"I was thinking, 'C'mon. Let him go and drop to the rail!' " Leyva said. "The rail was golden. I wanted him to get there as soon as possible and do what he does best."

Prat had his own agenda, however, which put Flightline well out from the rail around the first turn and onto the backstretch. The aim, he said, was to relax his colt, an admirable goal, but not one to which Flightline necessarily ascribed. His head was high and he was yanking at Prat's long hold, and then, in exquisite transition somewhere around the half-mile mark, the rider lightened the pressure and Flightline's head lowered. The race, in essence, was over.

But not the show. There came next the optical illusion of the far turn, where the disheartened Extra Hope gave up pressing the pace and backed up just as Flightline lunged into his final quarter-mile and banked into the stretch. By now Prat was hugging the rail, Leyva's heart was pounding in sync, and Sadler was gape-mouthed in the stands, eyes flashing between the scenes unfolding on both the track and the huge infield video screen. Prat gave a peek arrears to provide a photo for the ages, then crossed the line standing in the saddle.

At such moments, bordering indescribable, this writer resorts to the movie "Tombstone" (everyone's favorite Western whether they admit it or not) and the scene in which Wyatt Earp wades into waist-deep water and a hail of gunfire to wipe out the remains of the outlaw band without suffering so much as a scratch. Once the smoke had cleared, Earp's sidekicks—Texas Jack Johnson and Turkey Jack Vermillion—were heard muttering in amazement:

"You ever see anything like that before?"

"Hell, I ain't never even heard of anything like that."

No one had ever heard of an older horse running in a grade 1 race at a mile and a quarter having never before gone beyond a mile and one turn. Now they have, but it was not an accident. With the latitude provided by Flightline's ownership, Sadler decided some time ago that less would turn out to be more than enough for a horse of such transcendent ability.

And so, Sadler did not pass the San Diego Handicap (G2) earlier in the Del Mar meet because he was nursing a problem, or he didn't like the weight, or he wasn't sure of the track. Sadler passed the San Diego because if he had run, and Flightline had done his number, then the Pacific Classic

would have been no big deal, impressive, yes, but essentially just more of the same. In passing a traditional choice like the San Diego, Sadler was being trainer-as-impresario, setting the stage, raising both questions and expectations that would tantalize the intended audience and drive analysts to distraction. Mission accomplished.

When it was over, and Flightline was back at Barn J an hour after the race with his entourage of Leyva, groom Adolfo Correa, and second assistant Enrique Miranda, Sadler shed his good-luck blue tie, now 2-for-2 this year, and laid a hand on the colt's broad bay chest.

"Still warm," Sadler said. "I'm not surprised, as hot as it's been today."

Earlier, after he'd wrapped things up at the barn, Sadler allowed himself some quiet moments and a little TV.

"I'd been watching the U.S. Open, mostly because of Serena," Sadler said, referring to the tennis icon, no surname required.

"She was amazing, winning those two rounds in what was her last Open, when no one thought she could. To arrive at that point in such a great career was inspiring. During the telecast, one of the players walked by a plaque on the wall of the stadium. There was a quote on the plaque—'Pressure is a privilege'—from Billie Jean King. I took that to heart and decided it would be my mantra for the day."

And for all days, as long as Flightline is part of the picture. Before long he was back in his stall, the fan was on, and supper was served. Soon it was dark.

Then, at 3:45 on the morning of Sept. 4, Quintana unlatched the metal grate to stall 31 in Barn J on the Del Mar backstretch and led Flightline from the shed row into the darkness. There they stood as they did every morning, allowing Flightline, in Quintana's words, "to look up at the stars."

PLENTY OF TALK ABOUT FLIGHTLINE AT SARATOGA

There weren't many spots on the backstretch at Saratoga Race Course or the Oklahoma Training Track Sept. 4 where the conversation wasn't about the jaw-dropping performance by Flightline in the \$1 million TVG Pacific Classic Stakes (G1) at Del Mar the day before.

"He looked spectacular," Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott said outside his barn at the Oklahoma. "To me, it was a Secretariat-type performance that we saw. There's not much more to say about it."

"Very impressive," fellow Hall of Famer Todd Pletcher said at his Oklahoma barn. "He hasn't been beat yet. Very impressive, for sure. I expected him to run well."

Flightline ran his record to 5-for-5 with his 19 1/4-length runaway. He has won both his starts this year.

The next stop for the son of Tapit will be the \$6 million Breeders' Cup Classic at Keeneland Nov. 5.

That is also the probable landing spot for horses trained by Pletcher and Mott.

Pletcher is targeting Life Is Good, who won the \$1 million Whitney Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Aug. 6, to the Classic. Mott is hoping to run Olympiad, the bounce-back winner of the \$1 million Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes (G1) Sept. 3.

Pletcher will aim Life Is Good, a son of Into Mischief, to the \$500,000 Woodward Stakes (G1) at Aqueduct Racetrack Oct. 1. When asked about Life Is Good running against Flightline at Keeneland, Pletcher was not going to offer much.

"Hopefully, (the Classic) is a successful one for us," he said. "I mean, we have tremendous respect for (Flightline). We also have a lot of confidence in how good we think Life Is Good is. I am looking forward to running in the Breeders' Cup Classic if Life Is Good runs well in the Woodward and keeps moving forward."

Olympiad rebounded from a disappointing fourth-place finish in the Whitney to win the Jockey Club Gold Cup by two lengths. Mott said the son of Speightstown will remain in Saratoga, where he will train him up to the Classic.

And as far as facing Flightline? Well, let's go, Mott says.

"We are leaning toward the Breeders' Cup Classic," he said. "Of course, the next question is going to be 'what about Flightline?' They usually run more than one horse in the race, and we'll probably be a participant. It's the end of the year with a big purse."

Smullen Still on Road to Recovery

It has been a long year for Heather Smullen. The exercise rider for trainer Barclay Tagg has been recovering from a horrid riding accident that saw her break her tibia and fibula in her right leg. It happened at the end of the 2021 meet at Saratoga Race Course, and the road to recovery has been slow.

She was the familiar partner of 2020 Belmont Stakes Presented by NYRA Bets (G1) and Runhappy Travers Stakes (G1) winner Tiz the Law. She worked

the New York-bred for much of his racing career in addition to several other horses in the Tagg barn.

The 40-year-old Smullen, the niece of Tagg's longtime assistant Robin Smullen, injured herself when Blitz to Win jumped on the rail at Saratoga on the far turn and landed on her knee.

Smullen had surgery last September and, at the start of this year's meet, had another one.

"They had to remove a growth that had developed," she said. "They put a plate and seven screws on the fibula and bone and grafted the area that is not healed."

Getting back to work for the Tagg barn is a goal, but she isn't sure if that will ever happen.

"I don't know if I will be able to," she said. "If you aren't going to be able to do it well, you don't want to do it. If I can't hold a squat position, I won't be able to gallop."

Blitz to Win, owned by Tiz the Law's connections, Sackatoga Stable, is still in training and finished fifth in an allowance race at Saratoga Aug. 20.

Smullen, who calls Florida home, has been at Saratoga for the entire meet because she had the surgery in the Capital Region and her doctors are here.

"I miss the horses, but I still get to be around them, which is nice," she said. "You can't sit around at home and do nothing. I do miss riding nice horses. The obstinate ones that are being ridiculous, I don't miss them too much."

Smullen said she will see how long it takes for her leg to fully heal before deciding what is next for her career. She estimates that her right leg is at 75 percent.

"We will just wait and see how it heals," she said. "Right now, it's sore, but it's stable." **BH**

IMBRIALE RETIRING AS NYRA'S FULL-TIME TRACK ANNOUNCER

Edited Press Release

The New York Racing Association announced Sept. 4 that John Imbriale will retire as NYRA's full-time track announcer at the end of 2022.

Although he will step away from the microphone at Saratoga Race Course and Aqueduct Racetrack, Imbriale will continue to serve as primary track announcer at Belmont Park in 2023 and beyond.

Imbriale's 43-year tenure with NYRA dates to 1979 when he won a New York Daily News contest, which gave him the opportunity to call a race and work with the NYRA press office. In 1990, the Queens, N.Y., native became Tom Durkin's backup. Along the way, he took on other responsibilities at NYRA, working with Harvey Pack on the popular Inside Racing television program, and in a variety of roles within NYRA TV.

Imbriale has served as NYRA's full-time track announcer since January 2020, the latest in a line of distinguished New York race callers including the likes of Durkin, Dave Johnson, and Fred "Cappy" Caposella.

"NYRA is the pinnacle of this wonderful sport, and these last three years have been filled with incredible moments and races that I will never forget," said Imbriale. "I'd like to thank the fans at Saratoga for truly embracing me, and I look forward to being in the booth the rest of the year and at Belmont Park moving forward."

Frank Mirahmadi, the track announcer at Santa Anita Park since 2018 and Monmouth Park since 2015, will take over the race calling duties at Saratoga Race Course in 2023. A Los Angeles native, Mirahmadi is well known to racing fans in New York through his work at Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga in recent years. In addition, his prior experience includes calling races at Oaklawn Park, Louisiana Downs, Golden Gate Fields, and Hialeah Park. Mirahmadi, 54, will relinquish the race calling duties at Monmouth Park and remain as track announcer at Santa Anita.

"I felt the history and tradition of Saratoga Race Course the moment I entered the gates for the first time 25 years ago," said Mirahmadi. "It is a magical place, and I am beyond grateful to follow in the footsteps of John Imbriale next summer at the Spa."

"Aqueduct Racetrack plays a central role in New York's thoroughbred racing ecosystem, and it was a privilege to be able to call races there last winter," said Griffin. "I thank NYRA for this opportunity and can't wait to get back to the Big A to begin this new role."

BLEA TO RESUME ROLE AS CHRB MEDICAL DIRECTOR

Dr. Jeff Blea, the former equine medical director for the California Horse Racing Board, will return to his position Sept. 21, Thoroughbred Daily News first reported Sept. 4.

According to the TDN, Blea's attorney, Michael Casey, confirmed Blea has reached a settlement with the California State Veterinary Medical Board. Casey also confirmed to TDN that Blea will be serving a three-year probationary period as part of the settlement.

Blea was forced to vacate his role as equine medical director this past winter after an anonymous tip and investigative report by the California State Veterinary Medical

Board revealed that he was violating board procedures.

These violations, which claimed Blea prescribed and administered medications to horses without an examination or medical necessity, had occurred before Blea took up his role as medical director in July 2021.

The California Horse Racing Board placed Blea on official administrative leave Dec. 21 and successfully petitioned to have his veterinary license temporarily suspended Jan. 3. An appeal to revoke Blea's license suspension was denied in February of this year.

In March, Los Angeles County Superior Court Judge James Chalfant [denied a stay request from Blea](#) that would have allowed him to resume his duties as medical director of the CHRB.

Blea was first licensed to practice veterinary medicine in California in 1993.

Blea did not return calls Sunday seeking comment from BloodHorse. **BH**

LIEUTENANT DAN DOMINATES DEL MAR'S GREEN FLASH STAKES

Multiple-stakes winner Lieutenant Dan overcame a 10-month layoff and post 9 to cruise to victory in the \$152,500 Green Flash Stakes (G3T) Sept. 4 at Del Mar.

The California-bred stalked pacesetter Dubai Key until the leader drifted out two paths in the upper stretch. Juan Hernandez sent the 4-5 favorite through the hole, and they took the lead inside the eighth pole and drew off by 1 1/4 lengths over 9-1 shot Lane Way. Coulthard was third, a head farther back.

It was Lieutenant Dan's first start for trainer Steve Miyadi since he ran second in the Breeders' Cup Sprint (G1T) at Del Mar, and he earned an automatic berth in this year's renewal at Keeneland. He ran 5 furlongs on a firm course in :55.87 after chasing fractions of :21.77 and :44.54. He paid \$3.80 and improved his career record to 9-for-18 with his third graded stakes win in the past year. That streak began with the 2021 Green Flash.

The remarkably consistent bay gelding has finished worse than third only once, and he's 9-for-9 in the money on the grass. He earned \$90,000 to raise his total to \$923,740 for owner-breeder Nick Alexander.

The son of California sire Grazen is out of Excusabull, a daughter of Indian Charlie. Grazen has sired 16 stakes winners, while Lieutenant Dan is Excusabull's only stakes winner out of eight foals to race.

Midnight Memories Takes Torrey Pines Stakes

Midnight Memories, a 3-year-old daughter of Mastery, entered her race Sunday coming off her lone defeat in her young career. The Bob Baffert trainee wasn't about to even out her record.

Getting out of the gate quickly, Midnight Memories led from start to finish but not before fending off a game challenger to take home the \$125,000 Torrey Pines Stakes (G2) at Del Mar.

She finished the mile race for 3-year-old fillies in 1:36.32. She posted fractions of :23.25, :46.95, 1:11.23, and 1:23.63.

Midnight Memories jumped out to the early lead, getting clear of her five competitors and moving along the rail. With Ramon Vazquez aboard, Midnight Memories kept the field at bay as they approached the half-mile pole. However, Desert Dawn and Umberto Rispoli never allowed the leader to get too far out of reach, stalking from a length back.

At the three-eighths pole, Rispoli maneuvered outside, urging his mount forward, closing the gap to a head. As they turned down the stretch, the race had turned into a two-filly battle. But Midnight Memories had more in reserve and outlasted Desert Dawn by three-quarters of a length.

Out of Tiz Midnight, by Midnight Lute, Midnight Memories improved to 3-0-1 in four starts. She also earned the lion's share of her career winnings Sunday, an amount that stands at \$166,680.

The Michael Pegram, Paul Weitman, and Karl Watson homebred returned \$13 on a \$2 bet. Desert Dawn; Grace Adler, another Baffert trainee; and Cinnamon Cat rounded out the top three. **BH**

VACATION DANCE WINS AT SARATOGA FOR THE LIEUTENANT

The ill-fated stallion The Lieutenant was represented by his first winner when Vacation Dance scored by a head in his debut in the first race at Saratoga Race Course Sept. 4.

A half brother to Triple Crown winner Justify, The Lieutenant was one of four stallions who were slaughtered at Boris Schwartzman's Haras Barlovento in Peru by a group of armed criminals. Despite the farm being set back off the main road and surrounded by a wall, the men entered the stallion barn Dec. 21, 2019, and shot and wounded the night watchman before murdering the four stallions. According to a statement from Haras Barlovento posted on social media, the criminals were suspected of having killed the stallions for their meat.

The tragedy led to the closing of the farm in the weeks following the raid. Haras Barlovento closed its doors after 68 years of operating as one of the oldest stallion farms in Peru.

The Lieutenant, who was 6, was serving stud duties in South America as part of a one-year lease brokered by bloodstock agent Marette Farrell with Sequel Stallions New York.

The Lieutenant reportedly was bred to 46 mares at Sequel Stallions New York before shipping to Peru, and he sired 30 foals in his sole crop. The son

of Street Sense, an earner of more than \$345,000 on the track, recorded his biggest victory in the 2018 All American Stakes (G3) at Golden Gate Fields for Mr. and Mrs. William K. Warner and trainer Michael McCarthy.

Vacation Dance, a gray or roan colt owned in partnership by Sleeping Giant Stables, America's Pastime Stables, and KimDon Racing, rated within striking range of the early leaders off splits of :21.55 and :45.14 before driving to the lead at the top of the lane. Under

steady encouragement from Kendrick Carmouche, the New York-bred struck the wire in 1:03.52 for 5 1/2 furlongs on a firm turf course. He paid \$18.60.

Trained by John Kimmel, Vacation Dance was purchased for \$90,000 out of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds-in-Training Sale by David

Doyle and Sleeping Giant Stables from the James Layden consignment after failing to meet his reserve at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company March Sale of Two-Year-Olds-in-Training.

Two-year-old Vacation Dance, bred by Harry Landry and James Hogan, is one of four winners produced by the Zensational mare Matinee Express. Her most recent offspring are a yearling filly by Mucho Macho Man and a filly by Heart to Heart born this past spring. **BH**

It's not easy to run into trouble in a four-horse field, but the connections of Gulfport will attest to how it can happen.

The scene was the Aug. 13 Saratoga Special Stakes (G2), when William and Corinne Heiligbrodt, Jackpot Farm, Whispering Oaks Farm, and Ashford Stud's son of Uncle Mo was about a 2-5 favorite in a field of just four 2-year-olds.

The start of the race was uneventful, with Gulfport and jockey Joel Rosario cruising along in third.

Then, while making a move on the turn, he "jostled" with the eventual winner, Damon's Mound, while racing between horses. Shortly thereafter, Gulfport checked sharply. Gulfport lost ground and momentum and found himself 3 1/2 lengths behind Damon's Mound in midstretch and had to settle for

a Saratoga Race Course 2-year-old stakes win when Flavien Prat will be aboard Sept. 5 in the seven-furlong, \$300,000 Hopeful Stakes (G1), the final stakes on closing day at the Spa.

Asmussen said, "but the Hopeful offers him the proper stage to prove who he is."

The buzz for Gulfport in the Saratoga Special was understandable, given that his 2-for-2 record was capped by a 12 1/4-length score at 1-5 odds in the Bashford Manor Stakes at Churchill Downs. A seven-length debut winner, also at Churchill Downs, he covered the six furlongs of the Bashford Manor in a blistering 1:09.25 after leading throughout.

Nasser Bin Omairah's Mo Strike has also generated considerable excitement in his two starts. After winning at first asking at Churchill Downs June 19, he shipped into Saratoga and stormed to a 3 1/2-length victory in the July 16 Sanford Stakes (G3) for trainer Brad Cox.

In that debut, the son of Uncle Mo beat Disarm, who bounced back from a third-place finish to post a 6 1/4-length maiden victory Aug. 6 at the Spa.

Mo Strike was bred by Blue Heaven Farm and Ashford Stud and sold for \$325,000 from the Gene Recio consignment at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training.

Rodeo Creek Racing's Blazing Sevens also posted a dazzling performance at the Spa, taking his July 24 debut by 6 1/4 lengths for leading trainer Chad Brown. A son of Good Magic, he was bumped at the break in his lone start and raced wide but still managed to win while being eased under the wire.

The sport's living legend, 87-year-old Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas, accounted for two of the six entrants

with BC Stables' Bourbon Bash and Western Ghent (American Pharoah), a maiden claimer winner in his fourth start who is owned by Bob and Ann Ghent and Lukas and his wife, Laurie.

Bourbon Bash, a son of City of Light, is coming off an eight-length score in an Aug. 13 maiden race at the meet, but was a distant second to Blazing Sevens before that.

"I still get excited about a promising, young 2-year-old. When Bourbon Bash won the other day, that was a highlight for me," said Lukas, who turned 87 Sept. 2. "He woke up in that race. That was a pivotal race, I think, for him. He came around and since has trained really strong. It'll be interesting to see if he can step up in the Hopeful."

Lukas, the former holder of the sport's mark for all-time earnings, has won the Hopeful a record eight times. His most recent victory came in 2017 with Robert Baker and William Mack's Sporting Chance.

Repole Stable and St. Elias Stable's Forte was fourth in the Sanford after recording a 7 3/4-length debut victory at Belmont Park.

"The track was probably a little deep for his liking (in the Sanford). The pace didn't come back much," trainer Todd Pletcher said about the son of Violence. "I think he should appreciate the added distance." **BH**

CITY MAN LOOKS TO FINISH SPA MEET WITH BERNARD BARUCH

Owner Dean Reeves is looking to end the Saratoga Race Course meet the same way he started it: with a grade 3 win with multiple stakes-winner City Man. This time, the talented New York-bred son of Mucho Macho Man will contest the Sept. 5, \$200,000 Bernard Baruch Handicap (G3T) for 3-year-olds and upward going 1 1/16 miles over the inner turf.

Trained by Christophe Clement, City Man captured the Forbidden Apple Stakes (G3T) July 15. Under the Reeves Thoroughbred Racing moniker, Dean and his wife, Patti, have won five stakes this meet.

In addition to the Forbidden Apple, their 3-year-old turf sprinter Big Invasion took the Quick Call Stakes Presented by the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation (G3T), while Isolate won the Tale of the Cat Stakes to give trainer Tom Amoss his 4,000th victory. They also won the NYSSS Cab Calloway with the Danny Gargan-trained Dakota Gold.

The 5-year-old City Man captured the April 9 Danger's Hour Stakes at Aqueduct in his 2022 debut before two unplaced efforts at stakes level at Belmont Park ahead of the Forbidden Apple. Initially slated to defend his title in the state-bred West Point Stakes presented by Trustco Bank Aug. 26, City Man

scratched out of the 1 1/16-mile event when weather conditions forced the race onto the main track.

"Hope we can get by this one without some bad weather," said Reeves, who owns City Man with Peter and Patty Searles. "We're hoping to finish the way we started. We might have run on the dirt had this race not been a week later, so it just made sense. So we figured, why not? We'll wait a week, come back and hope we get a good turf course. It's the same distance and we feel like we can be competitive in it."

Through a record of 6-4-3 from 22 starts, City Man has amassed field-best earnings of \$653,050. He was bred in the Empire State by Moonstar Farm.

"To start the meet with a grade 3 and finish with a grade 3 would be unbelievable," Reeves said. "It really will make the trip home easy. So, fingers crossed, but I think we have a live shot. I would really like the end of the meet on the last day with a win like that."

Joel Rosario, who won the Bernard Baruch in 2019 aboard repeat winner Qurbaan, will return to the irons from post 5.

Other entrants include Flying P Stable and James F. Schurman's stakes-winner Dynadrive and New York-bred stakes winner Ocala Dream, both trained by Tom Morley.

Completing the field is Mouillage, Winters Back, and Emaraaty.

JAPAN'S DO DEUCE ARRIVES IN FRANCE AHEAD OF THE ARC

Do Deuce, winner of the May 29 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby, G1), arrived in France Sept. 2 ahead of an intended start in the Oct. 2 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1) at ParisLongchamp.

One of four Japanese-trained horses aimed toward the Arc, the 3-year-old son of Heart's Cry is out of the mare Dust and Diamonds, who won the Gallant Bloom Handicap (G2), Sugar Swirl Stakes (G3), and finished second in the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (G1), all in 2012.

After producing three foals in America, including the graded stakes placed Much Better, the dam was

purchased for \$1M by Northern Farm's Katsumi Yoshida from the Three Chimneys Farm consignment to the 2016 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, and exported to Japan.

In 2021, Do Deuce won the Asahi Hai Futurity (G1) and was awarded Japanese Champion 2-Year-Old Colt.

This season the colt was third in the April 17 Satsuki Sho (Japanese Two Thousand Guineas, G1), the first leg of the Japanese Triple Crown, but came back to win the Japanese Derby a month later.

Do Deuce, who is settled at Pascal Bary's yard at Chantilly, will be prepped for the Sept. 11 Prix Niel (G2) at the same course and same distance as the Arc. Yutaka Take, who has ridden the colt in all of his starts, has the mount for the Prix Niel. **BH**

DREAMLOPER WINS PRIX MOULIN MARRED BY COROEBUS TRAGEDY

Dreamloper provided jockey Kieran Shoemark with a second group 1 triumph of 2022 in the Sept. 4 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp (G1), but it was a race marred by the death of Qipco Two Thousand Guineas (G1) hero Coroebus, who broke down early in the home straight.

The Newmarket Classic winner, who was also successful in the St James's Palace Stakes (G1) at Royal Ascot, was beaten when last seen in Deauville's Prix du Haras de Fresnay Le Buffard Jacques Le Marois (G1). Attempting to get back on track, the Godolphin colt went off favorite for the Moulin and was held up in midfield by William Buick at ParisLongchamp. One and a half furlongs out, Buick angled the colt out to challenge in between horses but he stumbled and went down.

Godolphin managing director Hugh Anderson told Racing Post the rider was "fine," but Coroebus suffered a fatal injury.

Trainer Charlie Appleby added: "The whole team at Moulton Paddocks is deeply saddened by the passing of Coroebus and our deepest sympathies go to His Highness Sheikh Mohammed and everyone at Godolphin.

"It is very sad to see a great horse, who gave so much to racing, lose his life in this way. Everyone took a lot of joy from his victories in the Two Thousand Guineas and at Royal Ascot.

Buick was reported to be fine, but had to give up a later ride on West Wind Blows, who won the Prix du Prince d'Orange (G3) under Shoemark.

Dreamloper was a fine third in last season's Kingdom Of Bahrain Sun Chariot Stakes (G1) when ridden by Shoemark for the first time and the jockey has struck up a fine rapport with the 5-year-old, who is trained in Lambourn by Ed Walker.

In May, the pair landed the Betfair Exchange Dahlia Stakes (G2) at Newmarket and Prix d'Ispahan (G1) at Longchamp before two goes over 1 1/4 miles did not work out in the Alwasmiyah Pretty Polly (G1) and Qatar Nassau Stakes (G1).

However, a drop back in trip to a mile was the answer as Dreamloper shot to a five-and-a-half-length victory from the Aidan O'Brien-trained Order Of Australia with The Revenant in third.

Last summer's Nassau heroine Lady Bowthorpe was Shoemark's first top-level winner, but is now at stud, leaving space for another special mare in his heart.

"I needed to find one like this," he said. "I had an exceptional year last year

with Lady Bowthorpe and I didn't know where the next Group 1 horse was going to come from.

"I found one pretty early this year and she's provided me with another group 1, so I'm delighted. I'm grateful to Ed, Molly Stratton, who rides her every day, and the owner. I'm very lucky to be part of this story."

Walker is planning an audacious assault on the Maker's Mark Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1T) with Dreamloper and Shoemark added: "Riding her at the Breeders' Cup would be huge. It would be my first trip over and I might have some other rides, but she'd be my best chance."

Back over a mile, the daughter of Lope De Vega excelled, and Walker said: "She's an eight-, nine-furlong horse and we'd love to have a go at the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1T), which I think is nine and a half furlongs this year.

"It's around two turns, which could be perfect for her, although I'm not sure if we'll go for the Sun Chariot. The gap's perfect, but she's been busy and done a bit of traveling and we might just freshen her up."

MENDOCINO WINS VON BADEN; DETTORI GIVEN 14-DAY BAN

Torquator Tasso will head for Paris and the defense of his Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1) crown off the back of a narrow head defeat to Mendocino Sept. 4 in the 52nd Wettstar Grosser Preis von Baden (G1).

For an agonizing 10 minutes, it seemed that he would be without Frankie Dettori, whose six strikes with the whip (one over the permitted limit) looked to have cost him any ride in the Arc, let alone such a high-profile one.

Dettori left his audience with the Baden-Baden stewards convinced that he would miss Europe's greatest race after being handed a 14-day suspension, news that sent the usually imperturbable Marcel Weiss, Torquator Tasso's trainer, sprinting up the stairs of the owners' and trainers' lounge in search of his horse's owners.

The first hint that order was to be restored came from the stewards' secretary, followed shortly by Dettori himself, who had learned his suspension would run until the Saturday of the Arc meeting.

"I got it wrong, it's starting Sunday," said a relieved Dettori, who will nonetheless miss the whole of Newmarket's Cambridgeshire meeting.

"We knew it was going to be a falsely run race, that's why I kicked at the 800 (meter mark), to make a race of it. It's not his style. He needs soft ground and horses stopping in front of him.

Dettori said: "(Torquator Tasso) got a turn of foot with a good gallop but today the turn of foot was in the straight. If we go to France, get soft ground and a strongly run race, we'll be in business, but today we went too slow—he wasn't beaten far today."

"He didn't run that bad but he needs a race to suit his style, not one with four runners. I did everything I could to make a race of it."

IDEE 153rd Deutsches Derby (G1) winner Sammarco showed a good turn of foot in the steadily run race to sweep to the front after the bend but was caught by both the winner and Torquator Tasso before the line to check in third.

The opportunity to ride Torquator Tasso opened up because regular rider Rene Piechulek, who won the Arc last year, is retained by Mendocino's 90-year-old owner, Hans-Gerd Wernicke.

With an entry in the Arc already next to his name, Mendocino brought a trip to Paris much closer in running down Torquator Tasso, a fact not lost on the connections of the runner-up.

Dettori's immediate post-race debrief to the press was joined by Gestut Auenquelle's Karl-Dietrich Ellebracke, who asked of his jockey: "What do you think about him?"

Dettori's reply will have been reassuring to Ellebracke, who must already have been resigned to not having Piechulek available Oct. 2.

"When we go to France with soft ground and a strong pace, we'll be in business. If Rene's horse runs, I'm free and we're done," said Dettori, the two men concluding with a

handshake.

Although the difference between winning and losing the prep race was just a head, Paddy Power eased Torquator Tasso to 10-1 (from 13-2) for the Arc.

For Weiss, the test will be how his horse of a lifetime reacts to such a hard race when he returns to the turf gallops in Mulheim in the build-up to what will almost certainly be his final race.

This was undoubtedly a career best from Mendocino, having last year finished second to Alpinista, the golden thread that runs through all of Germany's middle-distance form.

"(Torquator Tasso) had a long break for three months, and with just three runners in the race, I wanted to sit last," said Piechulek. "We were not in the same condition as the others, that's why I wanted to sit last and then try and pick them off as they came back to me."

Piechulek paid tribute to his mount and to Mendocino's trainer, Sarah Steinberg, who struck at group 1 level for the first time in Germany's biggest all-aged race.

"She rides him every day and she really knows him, whereas I just sat on him for his final two pieces of work," he said.

As for what may transpire in four weeks' time at Longchamp, Piechulek was firm as to his commitments, if not Mendocino's chances in the Arc.

"I have to ride him, I'm in a contract with the owner, which is why I rode him today," said Piechulek. "We will see (about the Arc). That was a hard race after three months off, so we will see how he comes out of it."

Dettori was making a long-overdue return to Baden-Baden after a decade away. It won't be among his fondest memories of this corner of Germany, but he escaped with his dreams of a seventh Arc intact, though only just.

IRISH RACING COMMUNITY MOURNS DEATH OF JACK DE BROMHEAD

The Irish racing community is in mourning following the tragic death of Jack de Bromhead, 13-year-old son of leading jumps trainer Henry de Bromhead and his wife, Heather, after what has been described as a freak fall at Glenbeigh horse and pony races in County Kerry Sept. 3.

A twin brother to Mia and older sibling to Georgia, Jack de Bromhead was already a familiar young face to racing fans, having featured in various television interviews as the likes of Honeysuckle, A Plus Tard, Minella Indo, and Minella Times dominated for his father's County Waterford stable.

He was known as a pleasant and humble boy who was regularly seen by his father's side at the races, and had begun to carve his own career on the horse and pony racing circuit over the past couple of seasons, making a big impression by riding a handful of winners this summer.

On Saturday he was participating at the historic Glenbeigh races two-day event on Rossbeigh Strand in west Kerry.

It is understood de Bromhead was riding in the fifth race when his mount veered into the sea as they rounded a bend and fell, landing on top of him. An air ambulance was summoned to attend the stricken rider, but despite the best efforts of all the emergency services he died at the scene.

"A male in his teens received treatment at the scene following the incident but was later pronounced deceased," Gardai said of the accident.

"His body has since been removed to the morgue at Kerry University Hospital."

The remainder of Saturday's card was abandoned immediately, as was Sunday's scheduled fixture. It

was the first time the Glenbeigh meeting had been held since the pandemic.

The de Bromhead family's devastating loss comes at a time when Henry's stable has dominated jump racing's most prestigious events. He has sent out Honeysuckle to win the last two Champion Hurdles at the Cheltenham Festival, where he has also won the past two Gold Cups with Minella Indo and A Plus Tard.

He and Rachael Blackmore also combined to scale the sport's highest summit when landing a famous victory in the 2021 Grand National with Minella Times.

Funeral details have yet to be announced.

"A one-of-a-kind child who touched all our lives in the best way possible—he will be forever present in our lives. Always cherished, always loved, frozen in time with a beautiful young soul," de Bromhead's parents wrote in a tribute that was published in the Racing Post the morning of Sept. 4.
