

EPICENTER OFF TO ASHFORD AFTER MENDING AT SHANTERA FARM

Winchell Thoroughbreds' Epicenter, on the mend from an injury to his right foreleg sustained in the Nov. 5 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1), left Shantera Farm near Versailles, Ky., Jan. 13 for Coolmore's Ashford Stud, where he will begin stud duty for the 2023 season.

The now 4-year-old Not This Time colt, a finalist for champion 3-year-old male of 2022, was pulled up in the Breeders' Cup Classic at Keeneland by jockey Joel Rosario and later transported to Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital, where he underwent surgery the following day for a condylar fracture, an injury to the cannon bone above the fetlock that ended his racing career.

Winchell Thoroughbreds racing manager David Fiske tweeted a video Friday of Epicenter being loaded into a horse van for transit to Ashford.

"He looks fantastic, given everything he's been through," Fiske told BloodHorse later Friday afternoon. "Hopefully he excels in his new career."

Fiske thanked Becky Maker of Shantera Farm, Rosario, surgeon Dr. Larry Bramlage, and the Lexington Metro Police Department for the roles they played in caring for Epicenter after he was injured. Lexington PD provided an escort for the equine ambulance that transported the colt from Keeneland to Rood & Riddle.

"Like everything else in horse racing, it's a team effort, and Dr. Bramlage and the folks over at Rood & Riddle were great, and he's been living at Becky Maker's for the last two months over on Shannon Run Road and

she did a fantastic job with him," Fiske said.

"When you look at the X-rays, and you have to think that if Joel hadn't recognized the problem and gotten him pulled up as quickly as he did, it could have turned into a compound fracture, and that's never good," he added.

Epicenter's recovery has not been without complications. Fiske said the original screws that were inserted during the first surgery broke, and the colt had to have a second surgery in December.

"Dr. Bramlage said, 'I've done 500 of these and never had a broken screw,'" he said. "It was right around the first of December; he had just started walking and I guess something shifted, and those screws just broke.

"After his second surgery, it had been on the calendar for him to be re-assessed and X-rayed again, and if everything was going good, for him to head over to Ashford. He got the green light from Dr. Bramlage earlier in the week.

He'd already been walking twice a day and he can walk at Ashford just as well as he can walk at Becky's. He was starting to get to be a little bit of a handful."

Fiske later provided a follow-up tweet showing a picture of Epicenter alongside 2018 Triple Crown winner Justify at Ashford Stud. Epicenter's stall is across from that of 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah.

"He's in the big boy barn," Fiske remarked. "I think he was very happy to get out of his stall at Becky's. He'd been walking twice a day but I think when the van backed up, he thought, 'I don't care where it's going, I'm getting on it.' I think he'd had enough of that rehab stuff."

Bred in Kentucky by Westwind Farms out of the Candy Ride mare Silent Candy, Epicenter was a \$260,000 purchase by Winchell Thoroughbreds from the

Bestersworth Westwind Farms consignment to the 2020 Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

Winner of the 2022 Travers Stakes (G1) and runner-up in both the Kentucky Derby (G1) and

Preakness Stakes (G1), he compiled a 6-3-0 record in 11 starts for Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen, making \$2,940,639.

Fiske said the bay colt resonated with fans in part because of "the regularity with which he ran." After a sixth upon debut in September of 2021 at Churchill Downs, Epicenter returned in November with a maiden win, then impressed in December with a 6 1/2-length romp in the Gun Runner

Stakes at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots. Second by a head to Call Me Midnight in the Lecomte Stakes (G3) in January 2022, he returned with back-to-back victories in the Risen Star Stakes (G2) and Louisiana Derby (G2).

Favored to win the Kentucky Derby, he was caught in the final strides by longshot Rich Strike, who rallied to deny him by three-quarters of a length.

"Getting beat the way he did in the Derby, I think, made him almost an immediate celebrity," Fiske said. "As harsh as the loss was, it was the fastest opening quarter and half in Derby history, and an 80-1 horse beat him in the shadow of the wire. There's a lot of drama there. And people recognized early on that he was probably the best 3-year-old of his crop."

Fiske noted Epicenter has received a tremendous reception from breeders, noting, "He's basically booked full already."

He said he is finalizing the list of mares from the Winchell broodmare band that will be sent to the colt. One under consideration is Untapable, the champion 3-year-old filly of 2014.

"Her past two foals are by Gun Runner, so maybe we'll mix it up a little bit," he said.

Charlie O'Connor, director of sales for Coolmore America, welcomed the colt whose sire is by the late Coolmore legend Giant's Causeway.

"We are very excited to have Epicenter joining the roster at Ashford," he told BloodHorse. "He was an immensely talented racehorse by Giant's Causeway's best sire son, Not This Time, and he is incredibly good-looking. We are thrilled at the caliber of mares that breeders and the Winchells are supporting him with." **BH**

THORO-GRAPH SUES NYRA FOR SIX FIGURES IN DAMAGES

Thoro-Graph has filed a lawsuit against the New York Racing Association and NYRA Bets alleging breach of contract and asking for six figures in monetary damages. The underlying contract appears to be in its final months of existence as a result of the dispute.

The case filed in State Supreme Court in New York County seeks compensatory damages of not less than \$500,000.00, including actual damages in excess of \$333,000.00 to date, payment for a 50% share of profits from wagers, and attorney fees.

Thoro-Graph, which provides chart-style handicapping data that measures how fast Thoroughbreds ran races, partnered with NYRA and NYRA Bets in March 2017 to attract customers outside New York to sign up and wager on NYRA's advance deposit wagering platform, NYRA Bets.

Thoro-Graph alleges the joint venture has gone awry. The lawsuit, filed on Dec. 19 and first reported by Thoroughbred Daily News, alleges material breaches of the joint venture by the NYRA defendants. The net revenue derived from what the complaint calls "qualifying wagers" is the object of the dispute presented in the complaint.

The complaint alleges over \$100 million in betting handle was generated through 2022 "solely through the joint venture resulting in \$3 million in revenue for the NYRA defendants and approximately \$2 million for purses." Thoro-Graph seeks damages bringing its share to 50% of those revenues and claims it has made demand for payment "only to be rebuffed with the threat of termination of the joint venture" by NYRA—a threat which, according to the complaint, has materialized.

The complaint states only one side of the case, and the NYRA defendants are not required to answer the allegations until

February. Based on language in the complaint, at least part of the dispute appears to arise from expense deductions called import host fees, or host track fees, charged by NYRA.

According to the complaint, NYRA responded on Dec. 12 to multiple demands for payment by Thoro-Graph by serving a 180-day notice of a termination of the parties' agreement that will take effect June 10. Thoro-Graph says the agreement "obligates the NYRA defendants to continue to make full payment to Plaintiff for the succeeding six months of 2023 (or the remainder of the term of the existing Agreement), and then payment at 50% for an additional second six-month period in 2024."

Pending a response in court, NYRA said through vice president of communications Pat McKenna on Jan. 13, "NYRA will honor the terms of confidentiality agreed to by the parties involved and reply to the court by Feb. 10. This contractual dispute does not and will not impact NYRA customers."

Attorney Karen Murphy filed the complaint for Thoro-Graph, whose president is Jerry Brown. Brown is also known as an advisor for the purchase and management of racehorses that include 2009 Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra, two-time Breeders' Cup winner Da Hoss, and multiple grade 1 winner Victory Gallop. **BH**

2023 MATINGS SET FOR CHAMPIONS MALATHAAT, LETRUSKA

Breeding plans this year for two retired champions have been announced, with Malathaat, the Eclipse Award-winning 3-year-old filly of 2021, headed to Into Mischief and Letruska, the Eclipse Award-winning older dirt mare of that year, booked to Curlin.

Shadwell Stable's Malathaat is likely to secure a second Eclipse Award, with the 5-year-old Curlin mare widely expected to be honored as champion older dirt mare of 2022 in an Eclipse Award ceremony Jan. 26 in South Florida. Last year, the Todd Pletcher trainee went 4-for-6, capped by three consecutive victories in the Personal Ensign Stakes (G1), Spinster Stakes (G1), and Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1).

The latter race at Keeneland Nov. 5 was decided by inches, with Malathaat, under Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez, prevailing in a three-way photo over Blue Stripe and Clairiere.

Malathaat was retired shortly after the Breeders' Cup Distaff and arrived at Shadwell Farm near Lexington Nov. 7. The racing and breeding operation of Shadwell is headed by Sheikha Hissa Hamdan Al Maktoum.

"We're excited. She's doing very well," said Jonny Smyth, co-farm manager of Shadwell Farm. "We spoke with Sheikha Hissa and did our mating plans, and decided on Into Mischief, which we felt was a great cross, maybe give her a bit of speed.

"Look, we're excited. She's a beautiful mare. We're fortunate to have her. We're really happy she's going (to Into Mischief). We'll look forward to her babies."

Smyth said Malathaat is enjoying her current downtime, often beside Shadwell's 2021 Mother Goose Stakes

(G2) winner Zaajel on the farm.

A \$1.05 million purchase from the Denali Stud consignment to the 2019 September Yearling Sale at Keeneland, Malathaat was bred by Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings and is out of the grade 1-winning A.P. Indy mare Dreaming of Julia, another Pletcher trainee.

Into Mischief is a four-time champion general sire who stands for an advertised fee of \$250,000 at Spendthrift Farm in Central Kentucky.

With a mating to Curlin, per trainer Fausto Gutierrez, St. George Stables' homebred Letruska will visit last year's third-ranked general sire, who stands for an advertised \$225,000 at Hill 'n' Dale Farms in Paris, Ky.

A champion in Mexico before coming to the U.S., she reached the top of the distaff division in 2021, taking the Apple Blossom Handicap (G1), Ogden Phipps Stakes (G1), Personal Ensign Stakes (G1), and Spinster Stakes (G1). The frontrunning mare's only defeats in eight starts that year were a slow-break second in the Azeri Stakes (G2) and a year-end 10th-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) after dueling through taxing early fractions.

She went on to repeat in the Apple Blossom in 2022 after a kick-off victory in the Royal Delta Stakes (G2) at Gulfstream Park. She then went winless in her final three starts of 2022 and her connections chose to skip running her in the Breeders' Cup. The 7-year-old Super Saver mare, out of the Successful Appeal mare Magic Appeal, left racing with a 19-1-2 record in 28 starts and earnings of \$3,053,529.

In the midst of her peak U.S. form over a 20-month period from August 2020 to April 2022, she won 10 graded stakes races, five of them grade 1s.

"This is something I never dreamed was possible... We enjoyed how she ran for a long time," Gutierrez said. "Now she will be a different horse (as a broodmare) and I hope she can transmit this to future champions." **BH**

TIZAMAGICIAN TO STAND AT MILKY WAY FARM

Edited Press Release



Kitodan, a \$9,000 yearling purchase, made money for his three sets of owners as a 3-year-old. After running in stakes at age 2 for Joker Racing, Kitodan was claimed in his first start of 2022 for \$35,000 by trainer Mike Maker on behalf of owners Paradise Farms Corp. and David Staudacher, who campaigned 2021 Claiming Horse of the Year Special Reserve. Kitodan promptly won another optional allowance race at Churchill Downs before taking Turfway Park's Rushaway Stakes by 3 1/2 lengths.

When Maker subsequently ran Kitodan for the \$80,000 price tag in an optional claiming race at Churchill Downs, Foster was the only one to put in a claim.

The partners recovered their investment just three weeks later when Kitodan won Churchill's Audubon Stakes at 40-1 odds. That was followed by a respectable fourth in an off-the-turf edition of the American Derby and a close fifth against older horses in Ellis Park's Henderson Turf Mile Stakes. A son of Point of Entry, Kitodan clearly appreciated the stretch-out to the Dueling Grounds Derby's 1 5/16 miles, winning by four lengths at 20-1 odds under Gerardo Corrales.

"It's one of those things you only dream about in racing to come up with a horse like this," said Miller, of Junction, Ill. "If we were trying to do this individually, we wouldn't even have thought about it. Partnering gave us the opportunity."

It was the first graded stakes victory for the owners and by far the biggest purse.

"There are a lot of people who have a lot more money and investment in the horses and never get this kind of horse," said Wargel, of Ridgway, Ill., 50 miles from Kentucky's Ellis Park. "We're just old farm boys, me and Doug. Whether we never have another one or that horse never wins another race, he made a

dream come true for us."

Foster said that Kitodan winning Claiming Horse of the Year is a team award that includes his partners who made it possible, along with the trainer's staff and family, who help with the stable.


"We would never want to accept an award like this without thanking Juan Medina," Foster said of his assistant trainer. "He not only takes care of Kitodan but is also his regular exercise rider. We also very appreciative to Gerardo Corrales and his agent Cliff Collier."

Kitodan is getting time off at Foster's farm in Utica, Ky., near Owensboro, with a major goal being Kentucky Downs' \$1 million Kentucky Turf Cup (G2T) in September and hopefully a trip to Santa Anita Park for the Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T), a race he missed last year with a minor leg issue.

"He's probably put on 100, 150 pounds. The time off has really done him some good," Foster said. "We're hoping to start back with him at the end of February. We'd love to get back to Kentucky Downs."

STAKES WINNERS CHAMPIONS DREAM, ARMSTRONG LEAD PASCO

Promising 3-year-olds, including a trio trained by Hall of Famer Mark Casse, compete Jan. 14 at Tampa Bay Downs in the Pasco Stakes for males and the Gasparilla Stakes for fillies.

Both races are at seven furlongs and worth up to \$125,000, with only participating Florida-breds in the open events eligible for the whole purse.

Also on Saturday's annual Skyway Festival Day card is the \$50,000 Wayward Lass Stakes for older fillies and mares at 1 1/16 miles.

Casse runs a pair in the Pasco: Rosedown Racing Stables' Kentucky-bred Champions Dream, winner of the Nov. 6 Nashua Stakes (G3) at Aqueduct Racetrack for prior trainer Danny Gargan, and Reeves Thoroughbred Racing and Gary Barber's Armstrong, who scored last out in the Dec. 9 Clarendon Stakes against Canadian-breds over a

synthetic surface at Woodbine. Champions Dream, a gray or roan son of Justify, starts for Casse for the first time after moving into his barn about two months ago.

"He's training really well. I have been impressed by the way he has trained at our training center," Casse said. "Obviously, he's been very successful; he's 2-for-3. He won the Nashua—in my opinion, it was kind of a weak Nashua. So he's going to have to step up his game a little bit, but he's training as nice as a horse can train right now. So I would expect him to run well and be tough to beat.

"Armstrong (a bay by Mucho Macho Man) is a beautiful horse—both of them are good-looking horses—Armstrong is a horse that we've been high on early on. He's a Canadian-bred, so he went to Woodbine. He just won a nice race in his last start—he won that stake; he beat a pretty good horse.

"Now comes the question, is he as good on the dirt as he is on Tapeta? Every indication at this point in time is he gets over the dirt well. He gets

over it well at our training center. But running on it and training on it are two different things.

"Both those horses—I'm just looking to see where their next step is, how good they are. Obviously, you always have Derby dreams, and that's what we're dreaming, but they have to show that they belong. Saturday, as I always say, is like part of putting a puzzle together."

Four foes are lined up against the Casse duo, led by Winning Stables' Handsome Playboy, runner-up in the Inaugural Stakes last month at Tampa and a subsequent first-level allowance optional claiming winner.

The Casse-trained Personal Pursuit, a gray Kentucky-bred daughter of Tapit owned by Tracy Farmer, is more of a question mark in the Gasparilla, moving from grass to dirt. She adds blinkers for a start against a quick field in the Gasparilla, which Casse calls "a tough little race." Personal Pursuit's lone victory came in an off-the-turf contest on dirt during the Belmont at the Big A meet Sept. 22.

"I actually thought she would run better on the grass. She just ran OK," he said of her performances when fifth in the Matron Stakes (G3T) and fourth in the Wait a While Stakes last year. "I've always felt she was a turf horse, but an early performance on the dirt was pretty darn good, so we're going to give her another try on it. She's training really well, had a nice breeze the other day."

AVOW TO TRY GRASS IN SUNSHINE FILLY AND MARE TURF

Bass Stables' Avow, impressive winner of her first two career races nearly a year apart, will return to state-bred company and try turf for the first time looking to regain her winning form in the Jan. 14 \$75,000 Sunshine Filly and Mare Turf at Gulfstream Park.

The one-mile Filly & Mare Turf for females 4 and older is the first of two stakes restricted to Florida-breds on an 11-race program followed by the \$75,000 Sunshine Sprint for 4-year-olds and up going six furlongs. By \$17 million earner Arrogate, Avow was a \$300,000 yearling who has made each of her three career starts on Gulfstream's main track.

She debuted with a last-to-first, eight-length maiden special weight triumph sprinting 6 1/2 furlongs in December 2021 before going to the sidelines. She returned with a one-mile optional claiming allowance score over older horses by 5 1/4 lengths Nov. 4.

"She was impressive in her first two starts. She's looking for two turns and more distance; hopefully, she'll handle the surface switch," Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher said. "We don't really know. It's a Florida-bred race and she's Florida-bred, and we're hoping she'll take to the turf."

Most recently, Avow faced her elders a second straight time in an open optional claiming allowance Dec. 14 at Gulfstream going one mile, racing inside

before getting out late and winding up second, beaten 2 1/2 lengths by Soul of an Angel but 10 1/2 lengths clear of third-place Three Witches.

"She got kind of bottled up in some traffic and didn't get in the clear until it was a little too late, but she still closed well," Pletcher said. "I thought it was a good effort."

Also entered are Crystal Coast, Don't Get Khozy, Extravagant Rosie, Lookinlikeaqueen, Mona Stella, Sonar, Sugar Fix, and Sweet Dani Girl.

Sunshine Sprint

Arindel's Gatsby is back to defend his title in Saturday's \$75,000 Sunshine Sprint at Gulfstream Park, where one of his six rivals will be a stablemate, Michelle and Lawrence Sargent's Legal Deal.

"We ran them in the same race last year. Gatsby won and Legal Deal ran somewhere in the middle of the field. He needed some time off," trainer Carlos David said.

The Sunshine Sprint is a six-furlong dash for older Florida-breds.

Gatsby has won only once since his Sunshine Sprint win, but the 5-year-old homebred son of Brethren is coming off a sharp effort in the seven-furlong Marion County Florida Sire Stakes, in which he closed resolutely to finish just a half-length behind victorious and multiple stakes-winning stablemate Octane and a head behind graded stakes winner Willy Boi.

"That was a good performance at Tampa," David said. "Gatsby prefers three-quarters, I think."

Legal Deal, who finished fourth in last year's Sunshine

Sprint, enters this year's running off a brief freshening after finishing first or second in his last four starts, including a narrow loss to next-out winner The Distractor at Gulfstream last time out Nov. 13.

"I gave him a little break and sent him to a friend's farm near Palm Meadows. We brought him back and he's feeling really, really good," David said.

Boca Boy, Cajun's Magic, Legends Can't Die, Lightening Larry, and Unsociable round out the field.

GAMBLING GIRL, ANISTON SEEK BUSANDA WIN FOR PLETCHER

Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher will send out graded stakes-placed Gambling Girl and maiden winner Aniston in pursuit of his sixth score in the \$100,000 Busanda Stakes, a nine-furlong test for sophomore fillies Jan. 14 at Aqueduct Racetrack.

Spendthrift Farm's Aniston enters her stakes debut off a second-out graduation Nov. 25 at the Big A in her first start contesting two turns. Although never a factor in her Sept. 18 debut going a one-turn mile at Belmont at the Big A, the daughter of Curlin showed quite the turnaround next out when saving ground a close third-to-fourth down the backstretch and slid up the rail passing the quarter pole to draw away a 4 3/4-length winner.

"She's trained well and shown some talent," said Pletcher's Belmont Park-based assistant Byron Hughes. "She's a big scopey filly and it seems like she wants to run all day. That's our mindset with her and she's proved us right so far."

Ned Toffey, general manager of Spendthrift Farm, credited Pletcher's patient handling of Aniston, who he said has come along similarly to other Curlin progeny.

"Todd feels that she's kind of a typical Curlin and he has done a really nice job of taking his time and understanding what she is, what she needs and what will suit her," Toffey said. "He's put us in a good position to begin to take advantage of the races that do suit her instead of trying to force her to be something she's not. I think the two turns is a big part of it, but I also think it was time and maturity."

Bred in Kentucky by Newtownanner Stud, Aniston is out of the unraced Indian Charlie mare Kateri, making her a full sister to graded stakes winner and grade 1-placed Souper Sensational. Her second dam is graded stakes winner Sue's Good News, who produced grade 1-winning millionaire Tiz Miz Sue and 2018 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint winner Bulletin. Aniston was acquired for \$550,000 at the 2021 Keeneland September Yearling Sale.

"Sire power, pedigree and looks," said Toffey when asked of Aniston's appeal at the sale.

"Usually, it's some combination of those three qualities and she very much has the look of a quality filly. When you see a nice Curlin, chances are you'll have to pay a bit for it."

Pletcher also sends out Repole Stable's New York-bred Gambling Girl, who enters from a third-place finish in the nine-furlong Dec. 3 Demoiselle Stakes (G2) here in her open-company and two-turn debut.

Bred by Gallagher's Stud, the daughter of Dialed In made the third time the charm with an emphatic 10 1/2-length score going seven furlongs Aug. 24 at Saratoga Race Course before capturing her stakes debut in the Joseph A. Gimma Stakes four weeks later at Belmont at the Big A.

Gambling Girl was bought for \$200,000 at the 2021 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Preferred New York-bred Yearling Sale. She is out of the three-time winning Empire Maker mare Tulipmania, whose second dam, Felicita, produced multiple grade 1 winner and 2014 Broodmare of the Year Take Charge Lady.

Rounding out the field is Chad Brown trainee Occult, Demoiselle runner-up Affirmative Lady, and Sweetest Princess who is conditioned by George Weaver.

FIRST-SEASON SIRES SHINE AT MAGIC MILLIONS

A regally bred filly by Too Darn Hot set a dizzying new benchmark figure on Friday, selling for AU\$1 million (US\$697,535)—the most expensive yearling by a first-season sire sold on the Gold Coast since 2015—while his Darley shuttling counterpart Blue Point ended the sale just shy of the record average price for a first-season sire at Magic Millions, set by The Autumn Sun last year.

The seven-figure Too Darn Hot filly, who is out of juvenile group 2 winner and Blue Diamond Stakes (G1) runner-up Enbihaar, eclipsed AU\$900,000 (\$627,782) and AU\$700,000 (\$488,275) Blue Point yearlings posted earlier in the session, as the appetite for Darley's shuttling duo lived up to and exceeded all previous expectations.

Alastair Pulford, Darley's head of sales, said: "We didn't expect it to be quite as good as it's been. We were confident, but this is well above expectations, it's fantastic.

"It's been a brilliant sale all round, but those first-season sires have really stood up. As we had hoped, the buying bench has been fantastic.

"We're not complaining and I think the people who supported our horses will not be complaining either,

they've been justifiably rewarded for supporting three champions (including Microphone) by three champion sires. We put a lot into promoting those stallions and those stallions had a lot to promote themselves."

The Vinery Stud-consigned Too Darn Hot filly is the second foal out of high-class 2-year-old Enbihaar and was purchased by agent Johnny McKeever for the stallion's

UK-based owner Andrew Lloyd Webber of Watership Down Stud, as the famed composer and theater personality moved to back his stallion with a first investment in Australia.

The Lot 828-cataloged yearling will be trained by Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott.

"My client (Simon Marsh, stud manager of Watership Down) is on a plane to Vietnam at the moment and he told me, 'Don't spend too much money, but make sure you buy it,'" said McKeever.

"I don't know what he meant by that but, anyway, I bought it. Too late now. Done deal. When Simon lands in Vietnam for his holiday he might get a little shock. But I'll deal with that!"

Too Darn Hot raced in Lloyd Webber's pink and green sash silks to three group 1 wins, including the Dewhurst Stakes (G1) at 2 and the Sussex Stakes (G1) at Goodwood, while the stallion's first northern hemisphere yearlings sold for up to 600,000gns (\$721,561) during last year's European sales season.

"We wanted to come and buy something by Too Darn Hot," said McKeever. "(The Lloyd Webbers) still own half the horse, they stand it in conjunction with Darley, so we looked at every single yearling by this stallion in the sale and she was the one we fell in love with the most.

"We love all of them, but she was the absolute queen, we felt."

Too Darn Hot has had 12 yearlings sell this week at an average of AU\$288,750 (\$201,413).

While Too Darn Hot looks set to take top-lot honors among first-season sires, fellow Darley shuttler Blue Point is in a commanding position to be the leading first-season sire by average on the Gold Coast.

At the conclusion of Friday's session, and with all 19 of the Book 1 Blue Point yearlings on offer at Magic Millions having passed through the ring, the sire is averaging AU\$378,125 (\$263,755), short of the AU\$382,939 (\$267,113) set by The Autumn Sun at last year's Magic Millions sale.

Leading the way was the Blue Point-sired half brother to Western Australian group 1 winner Amelia's Jewel, which fetched AU\$900,000 to the bid of the Rosemont Alliance, while Japanese powerhouse Northern Farm took a shine to a colt out of a half sister to the dam of Super Seth.

Going to AU\$700,000 to prise the colt from the Newhaven Park draft, Shunsuke Yoshida, son of Katsumi, said they were on the lookout for a sprinting type.

Yoshida said: "We thought he was very athletic. We liked him a lot. Blue Point is a

young stallion. He was a very good sprinter and his colt looks like a sprinting type.

"We have many stallions in Japan, but we don't have many sprinting stallions."

Too Darn Hot's AU\$1 million filly matches the figure reached for a Justify yearling at last year's Inglis Easter sale, while Blue Point's sale ring average is the highest ever for a first-season shuttle stallion.

Pulford conceded that while the success was welcome, the expectation levels now placed on the duo are even higher for when their progeny reach the track at the end of this year.

"Expectation can be your worst enemy in the Thoroughbred industry, because expectations are now very high and they will have to perform," said Pulford.

"We've done all we can for those stallions and the public have accepted them. If they don't run up to expectations then the market will go off and that's just the way the industry works, and so it should. It's not a beauty pageant, the racecourse is the ultimate judge.

"I think the indications are that they will (perform), but expectations are going to be high and they're going to have to perform at the level the market expects them to."
