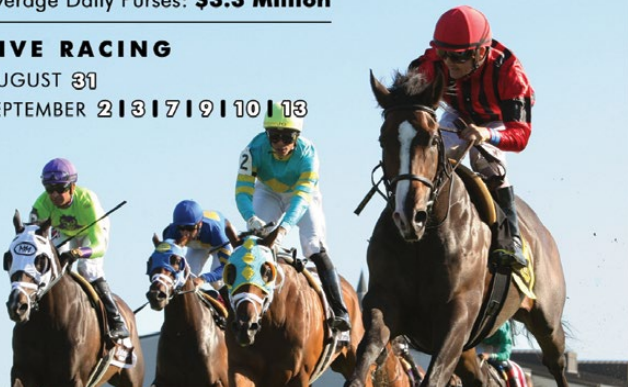

TAMARA DOMINATES DEL MAR DEBUTANTE

Tamara's complete domination of the Del Mar Debutante (G1) field Sept. 9 looked eerily familiar. Eight years before, her mother, Hall of Famer Beholder, put on a similar display, albeit against older males, in the Pacific Classic (G1), also at Del Mar. Beholder vanquished her rivals by 8 1/4 lengths that day. Her daughter's margin was 6 3/4 lengths. Both were breathtaking.

The similarities didn't end with the huge gap back to the second-place runner. Tamara resembles her dam in looks and dark bay coloring, and she sported the same orange and purple silks of owner Spendthrift Farm. Another member of racing's Hall of Fame, Richard Mandella, trained both mother and daughter.

Tamara was making only her second start, but that didn't stop bettors from sending her off as the 13-10 favorite in a large field. She had stumbled at the beginning of her racing debut, a maiden race at Del Mar Aug. 19, and still managed to win by 2 1/4 lengths. This time she broke better and put on a clinic of professionalism, especially for a lightly raced 2-year-old filly.

When the gate opened, Tamara bumped with Pushiness to her inside, but that didn't bother

either runner. Pushiness, owned by Mike Repole and winner of the Aug. 6 CTBA Stakes, set the pace, and jockey Mike Smith let Tamara play follow-the-leader down the backstretch, knowing he was sitting on a powder keg of talent.

Pushiness raced the first quarter-mile in :21.85 and was also responsible for the half-mile fraction of :44.45. But midway on the turn, Tamara flew past Pushiness in just a couple of strides. Laurent, a daughter of Practical Joke who broke her maiden in her first and only outing, started to pass horses on the outside with a move that might have been a winning one had she not been facing Tamara.

Tamara galloped down the Del Mar stretch, conjuring up images of her dam as she floated home the easiest of winners. She defeated Laurent in 1:22.41, with Gate to Paradise another 2 1/4 lengths back in third.

"I was fortunate to have ridden her mother once," said Smith. "She's just taken after her mom. She does things that are just way above average. The best part of the race was at the wire, and I was actually kind of gearing her down."

Mandella, while admitting that he expected Tamara to run well, did not expect that level of amazing.

"Watching it, he had so much horse he didn't want to restrict

her," Mandella said. "He just had her do what she wanted to do. She's very quick, so I thought he would put her right there (near the pace), and we both agreed to that—just see what everybody else does."

All anybody else could do was watch an awesome performance.

The race originally had a full field of 14, but Dreamfyre, winner of the Sorrento Stakes (G3) at Del Mar and the Everett Nevin Stakes at Pleasanton and the 4-1 second choice on the morning line, was scratched the morning of the race. Dan Preiss, the bloodstock agent who had been involved with Dreamfyre's purchase for owner Dan Eplin, tweeted that "Dreamfyre didn't clean up her bucket this morning and out of an abundance of caution we've decided to scratch her."

That left 13 in the post parade, but when the field began loading for the start, Where's My Ring flipped behind the gate and ultimately had to be scratched. The race was delayed while the remaining fillies were backed out and reloaded.

The commotion didn't faze Tamara, who became Mandella's second Debutante winner, following champion Halfbridled in 2003. In winning the Debutante, Tamara also avenged one of Beholder's most heartbreaking losses. Beholder went into the 2012 Debutante after two starts as an 8-1 third choice to the odds-on Bob Baffert-trained favorite, Executiveprivilege. Beholder hit the side of the gate at the start, but surged to the lead and set the pace throughout until the very last stride, losing by the slimmest of noses to Executiveprivilege.

Beholder went on to win that year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) and the first of her four Eclipse Awards. With Mandella giving Beholder several judicious breaks through her long career, she raced through age 6, racking up earnings of more than \$6 million. Tamara, bred by Spendthrift in Kentucky, is the mare's fourth foal and second stakes winner, following Teena Ella, who won this year's Senorita Stakes (G3). Mandella also trains Teena Ella, a daughter of War Front, for Spendthrift.

In the pipeline is a yearling colt by Curlin. Beholder does not have a 2023 foal, and she was bred back to sprint champion Jackie's Warrior.

Tamara, Major Dude, Instant Coffee, Thirty Thou Kelvin, Boppy O, Corona Bolt, and Bold Discovery are 2023 stakes winners sired by Bolt d'Oro, the leading first-crop sire of 2022. Bolt d'Oro won the 2017 Del Mar Futurity (G1) and FrontRunner Stakes (G1), and he stood for a 2023 stud fee of \$35,000 at Spendthrift near Lexington. **BH**

LOOKING BEYOND YEARLING AVERAGES WITH FIRST-CROP SIRES

A number of ways exist to gauge how the marketplace is assessing a stallion's progeny. The most common, straightforward metric is the yearling average but even stallions not among the top 10 by average, for example, could be providing plenty of value to breeders.

Spendthrift Farm's Authentic, Gainesway's McKinzie, and Claiborne Farm's War of Will—all first-crop yearling sires—head into the Keeneland September Yearling Sale as the leaders of their class with year to date yearling averages of more than \$200,000.

Authentic, a 6-year-old son of four-time leading sire Into Mischief and 2020 Horse of the Year, leads his sire class with a \$446,333 average from 15 sold. Another metric used to determine relative value is the times national average ratio, which compares a sire's average to the overall North American yearling average. For 2023

as of Sept. 8, the overall yearling average was \$98,456, which gives Authentic a robust TNA ratio of 4.53.

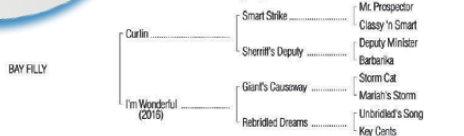

McKinzie's year to date average is \$230,222 (18 sold), and War of Will has a 201,263 average (11 sold). The TNA for these sires is 2.34 and 2.04, respectively, but even more impressive for these two sires is another metric that is particularly important to breeders—the yearling average as a multiple of stud fee at conception.

War of Will's average is more than eight times his entering-year stud fee of \$25,000. BloodHorse MarketWatch determines a yearling is profitable by doubling the stud fee, adding \$20,000 for the cost of maintenance and getting a horse to a sale, and accounting for the 5% commissions charged by the sales companies and consignors. Using this formula, the son of War Front's yearlings are generating overall 159% return on investment.

McKinzie's yearlings are performing nearly as well with a 7.67 multiple from his entering-year stud fee of

\$30,000. Yearlings by this son of Street Sense overall also are generating a 159% ROI.

Authentic entered stud at \$75,000, the highest for his sire class, so his yearling multiple is 5.95 and his overall sales yearling ROI is tracking around 136%.

Besides the top three sires, five others that will be represented by a yearling in the Keeneland September sale are represented by overall averages above the national average. They include WinStar Farm's Improbable (1.65), Three Chimneys Farm's Volatile (1.50), Spendthrift's Vekoma (1.11), and Airdrie Stud's Complexity (1.02). One overseas stallion is among the five—Coolmore Stud's 2020 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1) winner Sottsass, whose yearling average in U.S. dollars is around \$195,587 with a TNA of 1.99. Sottsass, a son of Siyouni, entered stud at €30,000 (US\$32,123) and is represented by one yearling cataloged in the September sale.

While 15 other first-crop yearling sires are tracking below the national average, it should be noted that 10

of these have overall stud fee multiples making their yearlings sold to date collectively profitable.

Sequel Stallions New York's Honest Mischief actually has the highest stud fee multiple of the sire class at 10.67 though his TNA is 0.70. The 7-year-old son of Into Mischief entered stud at \$6,500 and to date has an overall yearling average of \$69,385 from 13 sold. His yearling ROI is tracking around 89%. Honest Mischief has only two yearlings cataloged in the

September sale. He had a stronger representation at the Fasig-Tipton New York Bred Yearling Sale where 12 of his yearlings sold averaged \$74,667.

Taylor Made Stallions' Instagrand is not far behind Honest Mischief with a stud fee multiple of 9.25. Also a son of Into Mischief with a TNA of 0.70, Instagrand has an overall yearling average of \$69,405 from 13 sold. He entered stud at \$7,500 so his ROI is around 78%. The stallion will have plenty of opportunities to build on these numbers with 40 September yearlings cataloged. So far he has two still entered in Book 2 and five in Book 3. The majority of his yearlings will be offered in Books 5 and 6. **BH**

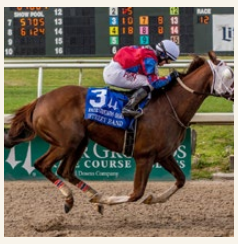

Hip 100, the colt by Tapit out of grade 1-winning mare Dream Rush

The overwhelming majority of the yearlings that fall in Book 1 of the September Yearling Sale at Keeneland have elements in their pedigrees that make them commercially attractive. Many are by elite stallions and others are out of mares that shined as racehorses or as producers.

A smaller group of these yearlings have strengths on both sides of their pedigrees, being the produce of a mating of "power couples"—a top-class sire and dam.

Hips 100, 145, 232, 309, 325, 338, and 340 are a half-dozen of such types over the first two days of the sale, Sept. 11-12.

The first of these select yearlings through the sales ring on Monday, Hip 100, possesses a pedigree that is likely to command interest, being by legendary sire Tapit out of the grade 1-winning mare Dream Rush. Consigned by Denali Stud, agent for Stonestreet bred and raised, the gray or roan colt is a full brother to multiple grade 3 winner Dream Pauline and a half sister to the A. P. Indy mare Dreaming of Julia, a grade 1 winner and the producer of multiple Eclipse Award-winning Malathaat.

"He's the total package," Denali Stud vice president Conrad Bandoroff said.

"This colt represents an incredible opportunity for someone to tap into one of the most prominent and prolific families in the stud book," he added. "This colt has the physique to back that up. And if he proves himself on the racetrack and runs to his looks, he's an extremely valuable stallion prospect. You could see him being in one of the top stallion barns in the country.

"He's one of those horses that you are just so excited and honored to represent from a program like Stonestreet—that just does such a tremendous job of raising and preparing these young athletes. We're just very fortunate and privileged that they have entrusted us with such a nice colt to handle."

Other yearlings with matings of "power couples" include the Gainesway-consigned Hips 325 and 340—with the former being a Curlin colt out of champion Songbird and the latter a Quality Road filly out 2015 Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1) winner Stopchargingmaria. Both go through the sales ring late during the Tuesday session.

Hill n' Dale at Xalapa has three impeccably bred yearlings selling over the opening two days of the sale, beginning on Monday with Hip 145 and continuing on Tuesday with Hips 232 and 338.

Hip 145 is a colt by four-time champion general sire Into Mischief out of three-time grade 1 winner Guarana, and Hip 232 is another colt by Curlin—this one the first foal from champion Midnight Bisou, and Hip 338 is a daughter of Into Mischief out of champion Stellar Wind.

"Into Mischief and Curlin, they are the top tier. They are doing things that when we look back in history, not just currently they are the top two, I think they will go down as historically some of the most influential sires of the breed," said Jared Burdine, general manager at Hill 'n' Dale.

Curlin, a two-time Horse of the Year and currently second to record-setting Into Mischief in the 2023 general sire standings, stood the 2023 season at their Central Kentucky farm for \$225,000. Into Mischief commanded a \$250,000 fee this year at Spendthrift Farm.

Hip 145, selling Monday, and Hip 232, selling Tuesday, are the first foals from Guarana and Midnight Bisou, and their dams' characteristics are apparent in their physical makeups, Burdine said. Hill 'n' Dale raised both of these young horses.

Hip 145, bred by Hill 'n' Dale and Matt Dorman, "is a fast-looking colt. He's a good blend of both of them, Into Mischief and Guarana. Guarana was just a tenacious sprinter. He

kind of has that attitude about him, too. So hopefully, he's inherited the determination," Burdine said.

Reflecting on the mating of Curlin to Midnight Bisou by breeders and her racing owners Bloom Racing Stable, Allen Racing, and Madaket Stables, Burdine marveled at the earnings compiled by the two standout Eclipse Award-winning runners with Curlin making \$10.5 million and Midnight Bisou more than \$7.4 million.

"He's a good blend of the two physically, though he definitely favors his mother," Burdine said of the bay yearling, noting that Midnight Bisou is tall, scopey dark mare.

The Orpendale/Chelston/Wynatt-bred Hip 338, who goes through the sales ring late in Tuesday's session, is a cross between Into Mischief and Curlin, with the latter the sire of Stellar Wind, who won six grade 1 races in dirt routes.

Burdine noted Hip 338's "fast-looking" appearance. She is a bay, like her sire, and shows many of the characteristics of Into Mischief's progeny.

Hip 338 is the fourth foal from Stellar Wind. Her 4-year-old first foal was unraced; her second, 3-year-old A Moment Like This, is unplaced in four starts overseas; and her unnamed Justify 2-year-old colt is unraced.



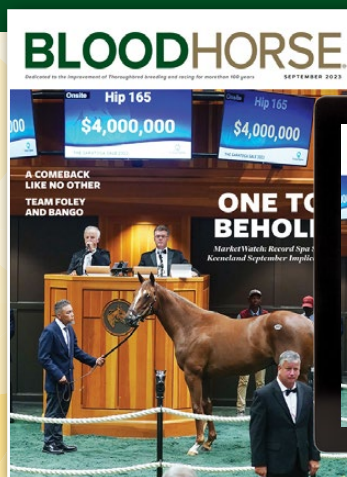

"I think the Curlin—Into Mischief cross is good both ways, should produce in the future as well, too. The residual value with the filly out of that female family is (noteworthy) as well," Burdine said. **BH**

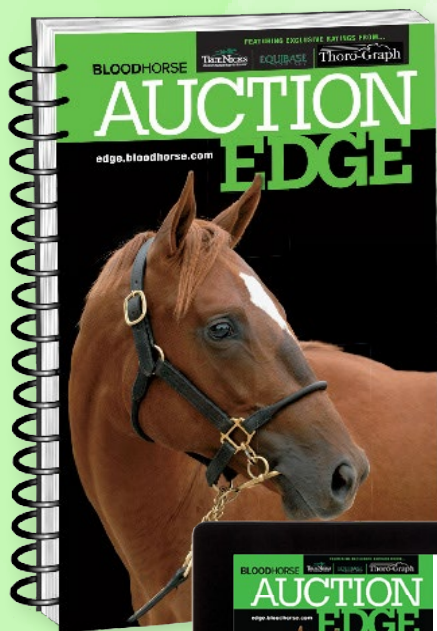

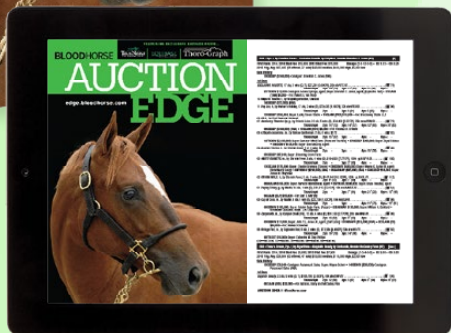

CLOSING REMARKS HAS THE LAST WORD IN JOHN C. MABEE

Closing Remarks certainly had the last word in the John C. Mabee Stakes (G2T) Sept. 9 at Del Mar, rallying from the back of field to score her second straight grade 2 victory at the meeting.

With jockey Umberto Rispoli back from a serious fall just over a week earlier, Closing Remarks raced last of six down the infield chute and around the clubhouse turn into the Del Mar backstretch. The California-bred, 5-year-old Vronsky mare then split rivals heading into the stretch, moved up quickly outside the leaders and won comfortably by 1 3/4 lengths.

She finished the 1 1/8 miles on firm turf in 1:48.23. Turnerloose led at the top of the stretch and held second with Paris Peacock third.

"She's very special. She really loves Del Mar," Rispoli said of Closing Remarks, who now has three wins and a second from five races at the seaside track.

Rispoli was thrown from his mount in the first race Aug. 31 at Del Mar and taken from the track by ambulance. He avoided serious injury but missed three days of racing.

"Thanks to everybody who helped me out this week, helping me come back in a week. It was very tough for me and I still have a little bit of the pain but thanks to Carla (trainer Gaines) and everyone in the barn," Rispoli said.

Closing Remarks, a Harris Farms homebred mare, has been a steady presence in the filly and mare turf ranks for Gaines and her owners for nearly two years, finishing in the money in eight of 10 races coming into the Mabee.

She was given a break of nearly three months after finishing sixth in the Gamely Stakes (G1T) at Santa Anita May 29 and returned to win the Yellow Ribbon (G2T) at Del Mar Aug. 12. That and the Mabee represented the first back-to-back wins of her career.

The Gamely was the fourth grade 1 tilt of Closing Remarks' career and her best result from those was a runner-up finish in the 2021 Del Mar Oaks (G1T). She finished sixth in that year's Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup (G1T) at Keeneland and seventh in that year's American Oaks (G1T).

Rispoli predicted better things for Closing Remarks after the Yellow Ribbon.

"I think she (Closing Remarks) has been very alive her past couple of races," he said of that effort. "Today she improved and can compete with those horses."

"Umberto is the best," Gaines said. **BH**

GET SMOKIN FIRES OFF 19-1 UPSET IN KENTUCKY TURF CUP

Crazy is as crazy does.

While a glance at the past performances for the Sept. 9 \$1.7 million Kentucky Turf Cup (G2T) may have suggested a farfetched target for 19-1 shot Get Smokin, co-owner Harlan Malter was convinced this was the perfect spot for his gutsy front-running gelding.

After the 6-year-old son of Get Stormy crossed the finish in a dazzling gate-to-wire performance, it was only the bettors that looked like the crazy ones.

"(Get Smokin is) an absolute dream to own. He just lays it out for you every single time," Malter, the managing partner of Ironhorse Racing Stable, said after the Turf Cup. "I think he was just screaming for the humans to come up with a plan for him. We made a plan. I said I wanted to run in this race, and (trainer) Mark (Casse) said to me, 'You're one of my crazier owners. This idea, I don't think is that crazy.' So I'm glad I have a trainer who is willing to listen to some of my crazy ideas."

Get Smokin had never won a stakes race or never traveled beyond 1 1/16 miles before entering the starting gate for the 'Win and You're In' 1 1/2 mile Turf Cup. None of that mattered to the gelding, who rocketed to the lead and paved the way through early fractions of :24, :49.61, and 1:14.18. Cruising loose on a two-length advantage into the far turn, he stepped into overdrive on the uphill climb to the wire, digging in for 1 3/4 length tally.

Guided by regular pilot Fernando De La Cruz, Get Smokin (\$41.14) hit the finish line in 2:28.66 over a firm turf course.

Spooky Channel got up for second over Santin, who had chased Get Smokin for most of the journey, in third.

"Going to the lead, that was the strategy," Casse said. "That's the way he runs. We felt we would establish a big lead and hope that everyone else would think he could not go that far. Guess what? He did."

Perhaps a trip to the \$4 million Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T) wouldn't seem like such a crazy idea after all.

Owned in partnership by Ironhorse Racing Stable, BlackRidge Stables, T-N-T Equine Holdings, and Saratoga Seven Racing Partners, Get Smokin was bred in Kentucky by Hurstland Farm and James Greene Jr. Hurstland later sold the chestnut as a yearling to Mary Sullivan for \$11,000 at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale.

He is the first stakes winner produced from the Smoke Glacken mare Hookah Lady, the dam of three winners from four foals to race.

Get Smokin's sire, the multiple grade 1 winner Get Stormy, died in 2022 at the age of 16. He was the sire of grade 1 winner Got Stormy, who was trained by Casse. **BH**

GEAR JOCKEY HAD JUST ENOUGH GEARS IN KY TURF SPRINT

Gear Jockey found just enough gears for jockey Jose Lezcano to get home a narrow winner in the \$1 million Ainsworth Turf Sprint Sept. 9 at Kentucky Downs—his first victory since he won the same race two years earlier.

The 6-year-old entire son of Twirling Candy, a Calumet Farm homebred, now is 2-for-2 at the unique Kentucky Downs course. Thanks to a "Win and You're In" invitation, he's also primed for a second start in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1T) Nov. 4 at Santa Anita.

Lezcano hustled Gear Jockey out of the No. 9 gate and took station just behind the early leader, Bad Beat Brian, around the sweeping turn. Heading into the stretch, he gained a clear lead and then was all out to hang onto it.

The favorite, One Timer, loomed the biggest threat, closing sharply on the far outside, but fell just a head short in a blanket finish involving seven horses, all within a length of the winner. Bad Beat Brian held third with the camera placing Olympic Runner and Cogburn fourth and fifth.

Gear Jockey, trained by Rusty Arnold, finished the 6 furlongs on firm turf in 1:10.59, winning for the fifth time from 24 starts.

"He's had his issues," Arnold said. "You get him over here without his issues and you've got a different horse. He won kind of the same way two years ago. We wanted to run here last year. We missed it. It's nice to get him back."

After the 2021 Kentucky Downs score, Gear Jockey went directly to the Breeders' Cup World Championships at Del Mar and wasn't disgraced while finishing fifth, beaten 4 1/2 lengths. He started 2022 finishing fifth in the Gulfstream Park Turf Sprint (G3T), third in the Shakertown (G2T) at Keeneland, and fourth, just two lengths adrift of the winner, Arrest Me Red, in the Turf Sprint (G2T) at Churchill Downs May 6.

The top level proved too much as Gear Jockey reported a fading 10th in the Jaipur (G1T) at Belmont Park in June. That was followed by a fourth-place finish in the Woodford (G2T) back at Keeneland and a ninth, ahead of just one rival, in the Turf Sprint Championship at Aqueduct Racetrack Nov. 25.

He beat none of his five rivals in his only previous start in 2023, the Van Clief Stakes at Colonial Downs July 22.

Winning Sire

Twirling Candy stood the 2023 season for \$60,000 at Lane's End Farm. Gear Jockey is the fourth graded stakes winner this season for Twirling Candy, joining grade 1 winner Exalted and grade 2 winners Evvie Jets and Dream Shake. **BH**

Entered by trainer Steve Asmussen as a two-time stakes winner who finished third in last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint (G1T), Private Creed landed his first graded stakes score Saturday. The son of Jimmy Creed completed the 6 1/2-furlong test for 3-year-olds in 1:17.03 on firm turf. He paid \$14.02 to win.

- With the victory Mike McCarty's Private Creed landed his second win in as many starts at Kentucky Downs, improving his earnings to more than \$1.2 million. Bred in Kentucky by Sierra Farm, he also won last year's Juvenile Sprint Stakes at Kentucky Downs.

- The victory gave jockey Joel Rosario wins in three of Saturday's first eight races, including a score aboard Vergara in the Ladies Marathon Stakes (G3T).

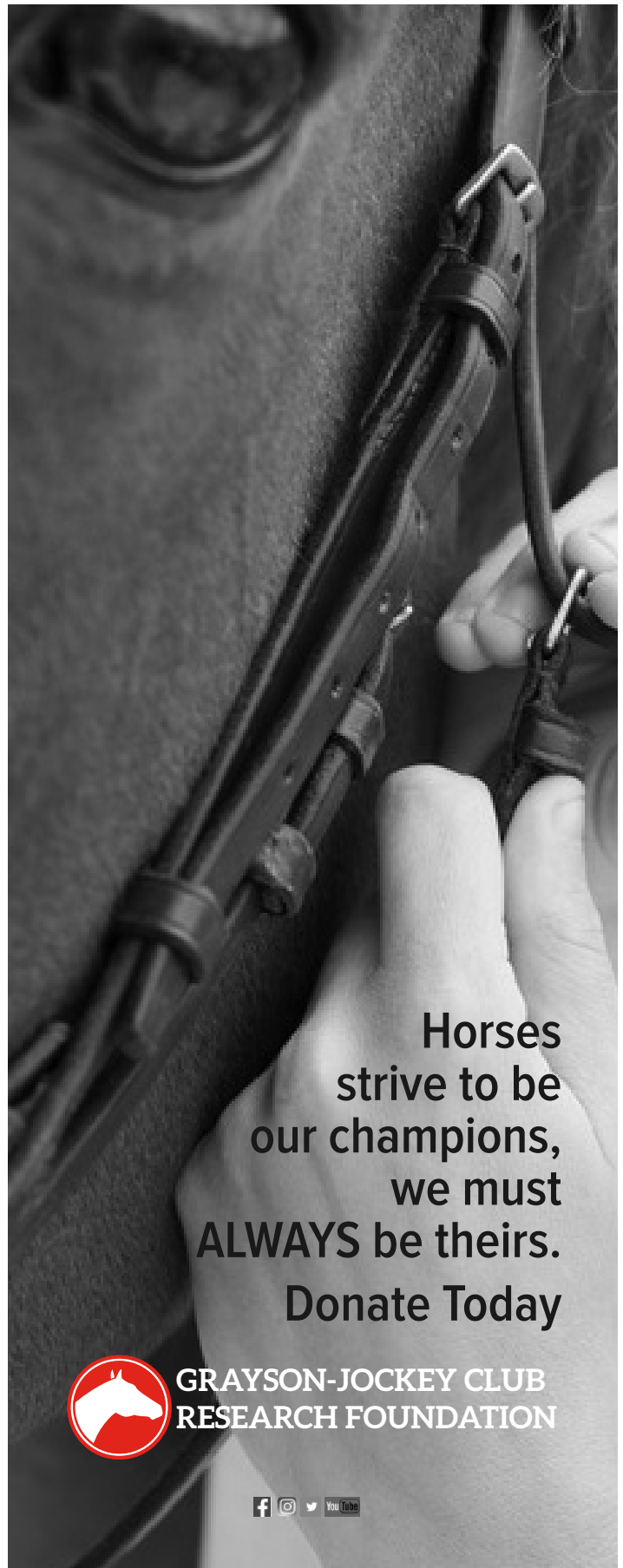
- * Playlist and third-place Sweet Cherry Pie each earned placings in their graded stakes debuts.

BAY STORM JOINS MILLIONAIRES CLUB IN LADIES TURF SPRINT

There were no Campanelles for Bay Storm to face this year, but she still faced some serious turbulence down the stretch on her path to victory in the \$1 million Ladies Turf Sprint Stakes (G2T) Sept. 9 at Kentucky Downs.

Narrowly clinging to her lead over Tony Ann through early fractions, Bay Storm turned back that stubborn rival in the stretch drive and just outlasted the late rally of Wakakanka to clinch her first graded stakes win.

One of two stakes winners on the card for trainer Jonathan Thomas, who later took the Ladies Turf Stakes (G3T) with Regal Realm, Bay Storm entered the Ladies Turf Sprint off a determined score in the Kentucky Downs Preview Mint Ladies Stakes at Ellis Park. A heartbreaking runner-up in the 2022 edition of the 6 1/2 furlong Ladies Turf Sprint to multiple grade 1 victress Campanelle, Bay Storm flashed under the finish line on top by a mere head in this year's running.

"There were a couple of dodgy moments (in the stretch)," Thomas said. "Honestly, the filly on the outside (Wakanaka) bumping her a couple of times

probably fired (Bay Storm) up. That probably helped us get to the wire the way we did, kind of made her dig down a little deeper. But that's what we expect from her."

Ridden by Florent Geroux, victorious earlier on the card above Regal Realm, the 5-year-old daughter of Kantharos stopped the timer in 1:17.06 over a firm turf course.

Wakanaka got up for second by a head over Tony Ann after a belated closing kick.

Racing for the silks of Bridlewood Farm, Bay Storm's earnings climbed past the million-dollar mark with her Ladies Turf Sprint win and now stand at \$1,313,315.

"She really deserves this," Thomas said. "She's got a crazy good resume. I think that's her (17th) lifetime start and she's only been off the board twice. It's a real credit to her, a graded-stakes winner. George Isaacs and the Bridlewood team have been really patient with her. It's kind of like a bow on a present."

Winning Sire

Kantharos stood the 2023 breeding season for \$20,000 at Hill 'n' Dale Farms. Bay Storm became his first graded stakes winner this year.

Vergara Wins Again at Kentucky Downs in Ladies Marathon

One year after capturing the Dueling Grounds Oaks, Vergara returned to the Kentucky Downs winner's circle Sept. 9 with a plucky score in the \$1 million Ladies Marathon Stakes (G3T) to land her first graded stakes win.

Owned by Gary Broad of Walmac Farm, who purchased the Noble Mission filly for \$130,000 at the 2020 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, Vergara had been winless since her 2022 Kentucky Downs victory. However, the 4-year-old had been beginning to blossom in her training during the second half of her 2023 campaign, and her connections decided it was worth a shot in the Ladies Marathon.

"Everyone has been saying she has been training great since she ran at Saratoga (5th in the Glens Falls Stakes (G3T) Aug. 3)," said Alice Clapham, a longtime assistant to trainer Graham Motion. "They were all saying she was doing really good and they proved to be right."

A stalking second under Joel Rosario, Vergara pounced on the leader turning for home and held sway in the lane. She prevailed by three-quarters of a length over Transient with Sinifiltre in third. Vergara completed 1 5/16 miles in 2:10.96 on firm turf.

"Joel (Rosario) said she was a little keen because they slowed it down quite a bit. He said she just loves it around here," Clapham said. "She won here last year.

When they slowed it down again, he said he was just going to go for home and she did all the rest on her own. When they like this course they come back and just bounce around here again. She loves going up and down the hills."

Regal Realm Wires Field in Ladies Turf

Breaking on top in the field of seven older fillies and mares, Augustin Stables' homebred Regal Realm sailed to the lead and never looked back on her way to a 1 1/4-length tally in the \$1 million Ladies Turf Stakes (G3T).

"She broke super fast and made the lead very easily," said jockey Florent Geroux of Regal Realm. "We just wanted to see how she broke. We thought she might be forward because of a lack of speed in the race. When she jumped very well I just took control of the race."

Regal Realm, a 4-year-old daughter of Animal Kingdom, notched her first graded win in the Ladies Turf after collecting her first black-type tally earlier this year in the Lady Canterbury Stakes at Canterbury Park.

The official time of the one-mile Ladies Turf was not listed due to the starting gate having been misplaced, according to Kentucky Downs officials.

Sparkle Blue and White Frost completed the trifecta. Favored New Year's Eve, the trailer throughout, never threatened, and finished last.

"We were looking forward to getting (Regal Realm) here," said trainer Jonathan Thomas. "I thought (Florent Geroux) did a great job of getting her to the lead comfortably. Took to the track very well. We're just thrilled." **BH**

• She paid \$7.90 for the win as second choice behind odds-on Fev Rover.

Emotional win for Hernandez, Attard

Winning jockey Rafael Hernandez: "Guess who is back? Moira! When she started warming up in the post parade, she started dancing, and that's it, they weren't going to beat her today. She's 100%. When she turned for home, I let her

switch her lead and said, 'Come on baby, do what you know how to do.' And she showed up today. Every time I ride her, it's not just another horse. She has a special place in my heart."

Winning trainer Kevin Attard: "She is a very special horse. It was a little disappointing at the start (of the season), she just had some hard racing luck. Last time, she put it together and had a good trip, just kind of ran out of ground. She looks probably the best she's ever

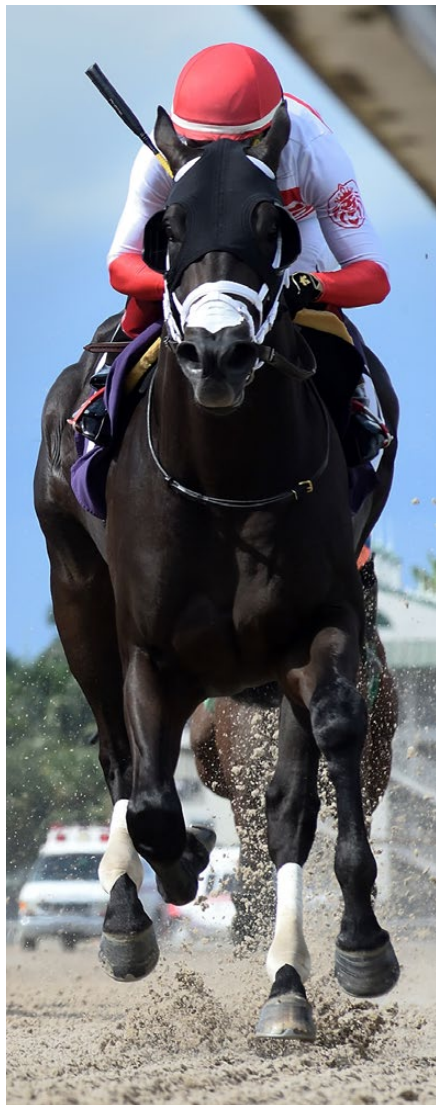

Welcome Back will be pointed toward the \$200,000 Susan's Girl, the seven-furlong second leg of the Florida Sire Stakes series Oct.21.

Despite their interchangeable names, Bentornato and Welcome Back have different ownership, breeders, and parentage. D'Angelo is the only common denominator. BH

CAN BAFFERT WIN A 17TH DEL MAR FUTURITY?

By Tracy Gantz

Trainer Bob Baffert's domination of the Del Mar Futurity (G1) raises two questions for this year's Sept. 10 renewal: Will Baffert win a record 17th edition and will he run one-two for the third time? Five other trainers have entered horses to try to thwart both of those possibilities.

In 2022, Baffert captured his 16th Futurity with Cave Rock and clinched the exacta with second-place Havnameltdown. The Hall of Fame trainer had run one-two 20 years before with Icecoltbeeratreds and Kafwain. Baffert-trained Chief Planner and Friendly Mike finished third and fourth that year for a Baffert-trained Superfecta.

Prince of Monaco and Mirahmadi, the two colts Baffert has entered in the 2023 Futurity, have similar ownership and different resumes. SF Racing, Starlight Racing, Madaket Stables, Dianne Bashor, Robert Masterson, Waves Edge Capital, Catherine Donovan, and Tom Ryan own them both, with Prince of Monaco's owners also including breeder Stonestreet Stables.

Prince of Monaco cost \$950,000 at the 2022 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale. He began his career with an eight-length triumph in a five-furlong maiden race at Los Alamitos July 9. The son of Speightstown followed that with a 4 1/4-length victory in the six-furlong Best Pal Stakes (G3) Aug. 13. Flavien Prat rode him that day and returns in the seven-furlong Futurity; Prince of Monaco drew the rail.

Mirahmadi, a son of Into Mischief who sold for \$1,050,000 at the 2022 Keeneland September yearling sale, became stakes-placed in his racing debut, but remains a maiden after three starts. He finished second in the June 17 Fasig-Tipton Futurity at Santa Anita Park and then raced greenly in two maiden events.

Going five furlongs at Del Mar July 23, Mirahmadi brushed the gate, ducked in sharply at the start, and finished fourth. Trying a mile Aug. 26 at Del Mar, he took the lead on the second turn and looked like he would win easily at the top of the stretch. But he began running erratically, veering out and then veering in, and finished third. His antics cost him, as the stewards disqualified him from third to fourth.

Juan Hernandez, the leading rider at the Del Mar meeting, has piloted Mirahmadi in all of his starts. The jockey sticks with the colt, who drew post 3.

Raging Torrent, a son of Maximum Mischief trained by Doug O'Neill, in only two starts has faced a plethora of Baffert runners costing considerably more than his \$75,000 purchase price at this year's Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's April 2-year-old sale.

In his debut, the same July 23 maiden race in which Mirahmadi competed, Raging Torrent won by 2 1/4 lengths. Tall Paul, a Baffert trainee and \$475,000 son of Frosted, finished third in that race. Tall Paul subsequently traveled to Saratoga Race Course, where he broke his maiden by three lengths at 4-5 over Quiet Wisdom, an Into Mischief colt trained by Todd Pletcher.

Raging Torrent returned in the Best Pal and finished third to Prince of Monaco and Baffert-trained Muth, a \$2 million 2-year-old. Antonio Fresu rode Raging Torrent in both of his races and will be back aboard from post 4.

Tim Yakteen trains Rothschild, a Del Mar Futurity entrant owned by the same ownership group as Prince of Monaco. Rothschild, a son of Uncle Mo, cost \$700,000 at the 2022 Keeneland September yearling sale. The colt finished fifth in Raging Torrent's maiden

race and then broke his maiden by 5 1/4 lengths going 6 1/2 furlongs Aug. 25 at Del Mar. Ramon Vasquez is set to ride from post 5.

Mary's Boy Bolt at 50-1 won the Aug. 26 mile race in which Mirahmadi was disqualified, edging Malibu Rain by a nose. The Bolt d'Oro colt had gotten away slowly in Raging Torrent's maiden race and finished last.

Mick Ruis trains Mary's Boy Bolt, bred and owned by Ruis Racing, and has named Ricardo Gonzalez to ride from post 7. Ruis also trained Bolt d'Oro, who won the 2017 Del Mar Futurity.

Next Level, trained by Keith Desormeaux and to be ridden by Desormeaux's brother Kent from post 6, ran fifth in the Fasig-Tipton Futurity in his debut. He returned Aug. 5 to vie with Mission Beach on the front end of a six-furlong maiden race and finished second to that rival by 1 1/4 lengths.

Valiant Knight has yet to meet any of his Del Mar Futurity rivals. That's because up to now, the son of Uncle Mo has been competing in Wyoming. He is by far the most experienced in the field, having started six times at such venues as Energy Downs, Wyoming Downs, and Sweetwater Downs. He has won three races, including the Big Horn Futurity and Sweetwater Futurity, and he ran third in the Cowboy State Open Futurity.

Conditioned in Wyoming by Calli Dominguez, Valiant Knight is now trained by Adan Farias. Erick Garcia will ride from post 2. **BH**

Pin Oak Stud's Boltage, a strapping son of Bolt d'Oro, was unplaced on the dirt first time out for trainer Richard Mandella before rebounding with an authoritative score on the Del Mar lawn Aug. 24. Stalking the early pace, the colt handily separated himself from his rivals at the top of the lane and coasted clear to a 5 1/4-length score. The runner-up in that mile maiden special weight, Glandford, a European import trained by Edward Freeman, returns in an attempt to turn the tables on Boltage.

Cranking up for the Del Mar Juvenile Turf with a :35 3/5 three-furlong blowout Sept. 4, Boltage will be ridden back by Ramon Vazquez on Sunday.

Although the field includes five maidens, there are two notable last-out winners that should challenge probable favorite Boltage.

Team Valor's Sea Singer, an Irish-bred son of Sea The Moon, captured his maiden June 22 in Ireland. Unraced since that effort, the colt has been breezing steadily the last month towards his North American debut for the Michael McCarthy barn.

McCarthy will also saddle Del Mar debut victor Endlessly on Sunday. Owned by Amerman Racing, the Oscar Performance colt overcame a troubled trip to rally home a 2 1/4-length winner of a July 30 maiden special weight. **BH**

BREGMAN OUT FOR ANOTHER SCORE WITH KODIAC WINTERGREEN

All the essential timing elements Sept. 10 have dovetailed for Houston Astros star third baseman Alex Bregman and his very promising filly Kodiac Wintergreen.

By the time she goes to the starting gate for the \$500,000 Global Tote Juvenile Fillies Stakes at Kentucky Downs at 5:28 p.m. CT, the Astros' home game with the San Diego Padres should be long finished. His day's work on the diamond at Minute Maid Field done, Bregman will be parked in front of a television to watch how the 2-year-old filly handles the one-mile race, the biggest test of her young career against a full field that includes Royal Ascot participant Cynane and first-out winner Mo Fox Givin.

Bregman expects Kodiac Wintergreen to emerge as the second standout in his nascent and fast-growing Thoroughbred stable, Bregman Family Racing. Trained by Rusty Arnold and to be ridden again by Jose Ortiz, she is the 3-1 favorite on the morning line. So far, No Nay Mets, with two stakes wins on his resume, is the most accomplished Bregman runner. He will try for a third stakes victory Sept. 9 at Colonial Downs in Virginia.

Two years after Bregman, his wife Reagan, and his parents, Jackie and Sam, made their first purchases at auction, the stable is emerging as a player at major racetracks.

"And we've been really fortunate this year to have an exceptional start for our 2-year-olds," he said.

Racing alone and in partnerships, the Bregmans had a 2022 record of 3-4-2 from 11 starts. This year they are 4-4-2 in 18 races. Kodiac Wintergreen was a member of the group of yearlings purchased last year. She debuted with a second-place finish before showcasing a strong finish to win a 5 1/2-furlong maiden race at Saratoga Race Course by three-quarters of a length.

"Jose called me immediately after the race and was like, 'Honestly, she wants more ground,'" Bregman

said. "That's what we're looking forward to giving her at Kentucky Downs, some more ground. I think we're going to see a great account of her this coming weekend and we're really excited.

Leading the opposition is Cynane, who after winning her debut at Belmont Park May 11 ran 10th of 26 runners when sent to Britain for the Queen Mary Stakes (G2) at Ascot June 21. Sunday's race marks her first start since for trainer Tom Worley and VinLaur Racing Stables, West Paces Racing and Rainbow's End Racing Stable.

Preceding the Juvenile Fillies is the Kentucky Downs Juvenile Mile, which also drew a deep field.

Favored at 3-1 is Winchell Thoroughbreds' Aspenite, who narrowly lost the \$250,000 Keeneland September Yearling Sale allowance race on opening day of the Kentucky Downs meet. He runs back 11 days later on Sunday for Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen in search of his first victory in three starts.

Trainer Saffie Joseph Jr. sends out Ken Ramsey's Billy the Greek, who boasts a nose win at Saratoga in a maiden race and a fourth in the Skidmore Stakes, with both races taken off the turf.

Others in the full field of 12 include maiden winners from a variety of tracks.

With Flightline's dominating performance in the 2023 Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) embedded in the minds of many in attendance at the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association's National Awards Dinner Sept. 9 in Lexington, his owners landed one of the coveted national awards.

In Saturday's dinner held at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky, just a few miles from where Flightline closed out his undefeated career with that 8 1/4-length victory in the Breeders' Cup Classic at Keeneland, the Cot Campbell Partnership of the Year award was presented to his owners, which included Hronis Racing, Siena Farm, Summer Wind Equine, West Point Thoroughbreds, and Woodford Racing.

Bill Farish of Lane's End and Woodford Racing accepted the award, noting that they never get tired of watching Flightline's record-breaking wins in the Breeders' Cup Classic and Pacific Classic (G1) as video of those races played during the night.

"This horse brought us even closer together," Farish said. "It's been a real honor to be associated with this horse."

Godolphin was announced as the winner of the 2022 National Owner of the Year, and 2022 National Breeder of the Year.

Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin operation enjoyed another sterling year, saving a particularly memorable day in North America for late in the racing year. Godolphin set the record for the most Breeders' Cup World Championships wins in a given year as an owner and as a breeder behind victories by homebreds Cody's Wish in the Dirt Mile (G1), Modern Games in the Mile (G1T), Rebel's Romance in the Breeders' Cup Turf (G1T), and Mischief Magic in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint (G1T).

In accepting the owner award, Gerry Duffy, stud manager at Godolphin's Stonerside Farm, thanked the farm leadership that has helped carry out Sheikh Mohammed's vision.

"It's the whole team top to bottom," Duffy said. "We're a family and it's all the men and women that show up every day and put their heart and soul into it. So thank you all very much."

Eighteen Godolphin homebred runners won 29 North American stakes throughout the year, which included 23 graded stakes. Remarkably, 13 (57%) of those graded stakes victories came in grade 1 races.

In accepting the breeder award, Danny Mulvihill, manager of Godolphin's Gainesborough Farm, accepted the owner award. He thanked Sheikh

Mohammed for making it possible and noted the strength of the Godolphin team.

"Awards like this come down to the sheer dedication, the hard work of every single member of the staff that we've got, everyone that puts on that blue shirt."

Other finalists for the national owner award included Peter Brant, Hronis Racing, Klaravich Stables, and Winchell Thoroughbreds. Other finalists for the national breeder award included Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings and Summer Wind Equine.

Elizabeth M. Merryman, breeder of Pennsylvania-bred Caravel, who defeated males in winning the 2022 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (G1T), was announced as the winner of the National Small Breeder of the Year.

"All the breeders know what it is to dream and work and try their best. You make the best that you can with the best that you can afford to breed to. You hope for the best and take the best care of those babies from the day they hit the ground to the day they hopefully reach the starting gate because they try hard not to," Merryman said with a laugh. "I feel like I've gotten so lucky with Caravel and she's taken me to places that I never imagined going and I just couldn't be happier to be here or more honored to be here."

Dreaming of Julia, owned by Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Farm, was named National Broodmare of the Year. Dreaming of Julia is the dam of two-time Eclipse Award winner Malathaat as well as grade 2 winner, grade 1-placed Julia Shining from her first two starters.

"She was the first foal out of our foundation mare Dream Rush and I named her for my beautiful daughter Juliana," said Stonestreet's Barbara Banke. "And she has been a joy ever since; every fall is something to look forward to. And she'll continue, hopefully, to produce great stakes winners from from now on.

The Robert N. Clay Award, presented by Equine Land Conservation Resource, was awarded to Greg Goodman, which recognizes a member of the Thoroughbred community who has made an outstanding contribution to preserving land for equine use. One night earlier Goodman's Mt. Brilliant Farm had hosted the annual Bluegrass International Cup, which showcases polo and raises money for the Fayette Alliance Foundation and the University of Kentucky Markey Cancer Foundation.

The Fayette Alliance, co-founded by Goodman, is dedicated to smart, sustainable, and equitable growth in Lexington-Fayette County through land-use advocacy, education, and research. It aims to build ties between Lexington and the Bluegrass farm community

through advocacy at City Hall and with local decision makers and community education.

"It's an honor to be in great company of the previous winners of this award, key figures in protecting the farm industry," Goodman said. "I'm proud of the work the Fayette Alliance has done."

Old Friends founder Michael Blowen was honored with the J. David Richardson Industry Service Award. Launched in 2003, Old Friends has grown from the original farm near Georgetown, Ky., that provides a home to Thoroughbreds retired from racing and breeding—including many of the sport's biggest stars—to housing more than 200 horses in multiple states and even Japan.

"It's such an honor. I'm flabbergasted that Old Friends now has its name attached with David," Blowen said. "He loved the sport—everything about it. He worked on trying to solve racing's problems. That's one of the bonds we all have."

Invaluable was honored as Claiming Crown Horse of the Year, presented by the National HBPA. Claimed for \$32,000 at Saratoga Race Course in the summer of 2022 by trainer Mike Maker for owner Peter Proscia of Paradise Farms, the mare splashed her way to victory on a sloppy track in the \$109,850 Claiming Crown Glass Slipper—a one-mile race for fillies and mares who had run for a claiming price of \$12,500 or less in 2021-22.

"She was a nice, balanced filly—looked sound. She was consistent," said Maker, a 21-time Claiming Crown winner. "She was running at Saratoga. If you run well up here (at Saratoga), you have to like your chances for the Claiming Crown."

The Rood & Riddle Sport Horse of the Year went to Satins Angel (Queen Satin). In 2022 Satins Angel and rider Alexa Lee of Columbus, Ohio. In 2022 the pair won the Rood & Riddle Jumping Open Horse of the Year Award, earned Champion Junior Amateur at the World Equestrian Center in Wilmington, Ohio, won the Ohio Hunter Jumper Association Junior-Amateur/Owner Jumper, were the United States Equestrian Federation Reserve Horse of the Year for Low Adult Amateur Jumpers (Zone 5), and won the Thoroughbred Incentive Program Championship for the High Central Division.

Well-traveled during her racing career, Satins Angel has found a home as a sport horse.

AUGUSTE RODIN BOUNCES BACK IN IRISH CHAMPION

Auguste Rodin re-established himself as the best of the Classic generation with a courageous return to form in the Sept. 9 Irish Champion Stakes (G1) for Aidan O'Brien and Ryan Moore.

The Deep Impact colt flopped in the King George (G1) following his Derby double at Epsom and the Curragh but looked better than ever when moving into Saturday's star-studded highlight with his usual class before holding off stablemate Luxembourg and a fast-finishing Nashua to justify 11-4 favoritism. King Of Steel was not far behind in fourth.

Auguste Rodin was positioned prominently behind stablemates Point Lonsdale and Luxembourg and was always doing enough under a smart tactical ride. It was a 12th victory in the race for O'Brien, with Moore recording his fifth win in the race.

Moore told Racing TV: "It's very satisfying for him to come back and prove how good he is. He was excellent at Epsom and maybe wasn't quite as good in the Irish Derby. I think he might've just been feeling it the last day but Aidan has got him back.

"Cantering to the start he felt in a real good place and floated around there. He's a very well-balanced horse, a beautiful mover, and it never really felt in any real doubt. I'm delighted with him. It's a fantastic job to get him back, he's beaten some proven group 1 horses there so it's satisfying."

Paddy Power halved Auguste Rodin to 10-1 for the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1) in October, while he also has an entry for the Champion Stakes (G1) at Ascot later next month.

O'Brien said: "We're delighted with him, he's a beautiful mover and easy-cruising horse. I couldn't be happier with him.

"His action is so slick and so much went wrong for him at Ascot; he's obviously not a soft-ground horse.

"You'd say you wouldn't go to the Arc on soft ground, but if it came up nice ground you'd be delighted. The lads love the Breeders' Cup though and you know you're going to get fast ground at Santa Anita, so that's a strong possibility."

Tahiyra Nabs Fourth Group 1 Glory in Matron Stakes

The exceptional Tahiyra faced a few questions in her bid for a fourth group 1 success in the Matron Stakes (G1). In addition to a 78-day break since her Coronation Stakes (G1) triumph at Royal Ascot, she had never run at Leopardstown and was facing her elders for the first time.

We now know the filly had all the answers.

Jockey Chris Hayes has built a remarkably fruitful partnership with the daughter of Siyouni and he deserves immense credit for her stylish performance in the Sept. 9 Matron Stakes, having pressed down on the accelerator at a most opportune time. It proved decisive.

Hayes settled his mount in mid-division from the get-go but he began to click through the gears as they straightened up, while still clinging on to the thunderous turn of foot he knew he had underneath him. Tahiyra glided past Prosperous Voyage and Zarinsk into second before taking dead aim at the Paddy Twomey-trained Just Beautiful, who had shown a potent burst of pace of her own to dart clear by a length or two.

It was soon evident Billy Lee was there on sufferance as Hayes unleashed his mount's change of gear. Tahiyra duly did the rest. In response to her rider's urgings, she flashed by the leader and scampered clear by a length and a quarter before Hayes saluted the crowd with a celebratory burst at the line. Rogue Millennium stayed on into second for Tom Clover.

Trainer Dermot Weld was landing this race for the first time since 2011 when Emulous scored under the late Pat Smullen, and he said: "She was very good today. She's been good all year and has been on the go since March. I was happy with her beforehand, she was eight or ten kilos up from her weight at Royal Ascot.

"She's an amazing filly. In some ways she's very similar to her half sister Tarnawa and totally different in other ways. Tarnawa was a brilliant filly, she was the joint-highest-rated filly in the world. She was an outstanding filly to train and now her half-sister has come along. Both of them are ruthlessly tough and genuine.

"It planned out exactly as I saw it. I reviewed it quite a bit and I reckoned where the speed would be and it turned out that's where it was. She only does what she has to do. This is the wonderful thing about her. People at home ask me how she's working and whether she has improved and I keep saying I'm satisfied with her. She does very little at home, just the minimum."

Bar an agonizing defeat on her seasonal reappearance at Newmarket, Tahiyra's career has been unblemished and she has confirmed herself again and again as one of the best fillies of her generation.

Asked whether we could see an even better filly next year if she stays in training, the response from Weld was swift, assured, and terrifying for those looking to dethrone her.

Tahiyra earned an automatic berth to the Nov. 5 \$2 million Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (G1T) at Santa Anita with her win in the Matron, which is part of the Breeders' Cup Challenge Series: Win and You're In.

Regional Prevails in Sprint Cup

Bargain-buy Regional claimed a first group 1 for trainer Ed Bethell and jockey Callum Rodriguez in a four-way finish in the Sept. 9 Sprint Cup (G1) as favorite Shaquille finished last in his bid for a group 1 hat-trick.

Considerable attention had been paid to Shaquille's antics at the stalls, where he had lost significant ground before winning both the Commonwealth Cup (G1) and the July Cup, but this time he jumped fastest of all to lead under jockey James Doyle.

The runners tore down the straight at Haydock in pursuit of Shaquille, with several keeping pace with the hot favorite and readying themselves for the final battle to the finishing post.

However, this battle went on without Shaquille as he weakened dramatically, as did second favorite Sacred, leaving 10-1 shot Regional to fight it out with Shouldvebeenaring, Believing, and Swingalong.

Each appeared to hold a chance as the winning line loomed, but it was Regional, a 3,500 guineas buy in the summer of 2021 by Bethell for owners Future Champions Racing, who came out on top. In a finish of outsiders, Shouldvebeenaring was second at 50-1, Believing third at 66-1 and Swingalong fourth at 14-1.

"It's unreal, the things you dream of," Bethell said, taking a moment to compose himself. "I'm over the moon. I'm in an incredibly fortunate position to take over from my father (James) and my parents have been incredible supporters of mine.

"These guys (Future Champions Racing) have supported me from the word go, and (bloodstock agent)

Tom Biggs also deserves a massive thank you as does my team at home.

"I bought him just to win a race, so this meteoric rise is down to the team at home."

Diego Velazquez Keeps Unbeaten Streak Alive in Champions Juvenile Stakes

Diego Velazquez remained unbeaten for Aidan O'Brien in the Champions Juvenile Stakes (G2) Sept. 9 but it was not all straightforward, with the 8-15 favorite taking his time to win a protracted battle with stablemate Capulet up the Leopardstown straight.

The Frankel colt, who put in an impressive display on his debut at the Curragh albeit with signs of greenness, again showed plenty of inexperience here when Ryan

Moore asked him to pick up.

He was under a full drive early in the straight in second place but chipped away at Seamie Heffernan's lead on Capulet and edged to the front with 100 yards to go before pulling half a length clear.

Dual Derby winner Auguste Rodin won this contest last year before going on to land the Vertem Futurity Trophy (G1) and Diego Velazquez is set to follow an identical path.

O'Brien said: "We liked the

second horse a lot and we knew we needed something to take Diego Velazquez and stretch him a little bit. Ryan (Moore) was delighted. He said he had to catch hold of him and make him learn. He's still a baby and we were surprised the first day he ran at the Curragh how babyish he was as he never took hold of the bridle.

"I'd imagine he'll go to Doncaster. We think he'll step up loads from today. We did it with Auguste Rodin last year but we knew this horse had to learn a lot more than Auguste Rodin did when coming here."

The Champions Juvenile Stakes offers the winner an all-expenses paid berth to the Nov. 3 \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1T) at Santa Anita as part of the Breeders' Cup Challenge Series: Win and You're In.

TOP STAYER KYPRIOS BACK FROM 1-YEAR LAYOFF IN ST LEGER

King Kyprios is back to defend his crown. Last year's outstanding stayer won six on the spin last year and the fifth leg of that winning sequence arrived in this very race, the Irish St Leger (G1), when he fought off the challenge of Hamish to win a thriller.

A 20-length romp in the Prix du Cadran (G1) followed and we all presumed he would dominate the staying division in 2023. It hasn't panned out like that, though, as an infection in a joint ruled him out for most of the season and this will be his first outing for 344 days. If anyone can get him back, Aidan O'Brien can, and the fact he is here suggests he has been showing all the right signs at home.

O'Brien cannot believe Kyprios has made it back to the Irish St Leger and the master trainer has made no secret of the fact he didn't think he would make it back at all.

An infection on the inside of a joint, suffered in the spring, has deprived us from seeing last year's Ascot Gold Cup (G1) hero until now and O'Brien believes he will improve hugely for the run given he does everything in second gear at home.

O'Brien said: "I didn't think he would come back at all and there are a lot of people we have to thank for getting him back. We have had to be very careful with him. He's ready to start back and it will be interesting to see how he gets on.

"Hopefully he will pull up okay and we will be able to plan forward with him after the race. He's moving well and seems in good form, but I didn't think he would make it back."

The real Kyprios is a far superior animal to Eldar Eldarov. We know that for certain, but the aforementioned setback in the spring, combined with fast ground over a trip that is on the sharp side makes him vulnerable and it will be interesting to see what sort of market confidence is behind him. A 90% Kyprios would win this, an 80% one might not.

Eldar Eldarov is two from three over trips in and around a mile and six furlongs. He won the Queen's Vase

(G2) and the St Leger, and his sole reversal at the distance was back in May, when touched off by Giavellotto having met traffic in running in the Yorkshire Cup (G2). These are his terms and conditions and if Kyprios is badly in need of his reappearance, this son of Dubawi will be ready to gobble up the scraps.

This small field could get even smaller if Emily Dickinson does not show her face. She is a different animal altogether on softer ground so it remains to be seen whether she will be allowed to take her chance on a rattling quick surface again if no rain arrives.

On soft ground she might even be favorite, but it looks as though the weather gods are not going to shine on her.

Yashin has a mountain to climb on the figures. He is only rated 105, but his Ebor effort can certainly be upgraded. He was beaten three lengths into seventh by Absurde, but that doesn't tell the whole story as he was short of room for most of the closing stages on the nearside rail. He is more dangerous than his rating would suggest.

It is hard to imagine Dawn Rising having the pace to trouble the big two. He is a thorough stayer who will presumably make the running, but it seems unlikely he will be staying at the head of affairs.

Four of the last eight favorites have obliged in the Irish St Leger, but Order Of St George was beaten at 1-7 by Wicklow Brave in 2016. Incidentally, the last 5-year-old to win the race was also Order Of St George the following year.

Highfield Princess Leads British Assault on Flying Five

British-trained sprinters have outscored the home team by three to two in the five years since the Flying Five was raised to group 1 status in 2018. That lead, symptomatic of a general Irish weakness in this division, is likely to be extended in the Sept. 10 renewal at the Curragh.

Last year's blistering winner Highfield Princess bids to become the first back-to-back scorer since Benbaun, who won it three times in a row (2005-07) in its group 3 days. The John Quinn-trained mare is one of five runners from Britain in a field that has also attracted a rare French sprint raider. Bouttemont has done most of his racing over six furlongs but captured a listed event over the minimum at Chantilly in June.

The Flying Five is a "Breeders' Cup Challenge Series: Win and You're In" event offering a fees- and travel-paid berth to the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint.

The spotlight falls on Highfield Princess and Bradsell, a colt half her age and winner of last year's Coventry Stakes (G2). The pair meet for a third time as Archie Watson was inspired to supplement Bradsell for the King's Stand (G1) at Royal Ascot after two early-season defeats over six furlongs. Taking the

lead around two furlongs down, Bradsell was strongly challenged by Highfield Princess inside the last furlong and Hollie Doyle was unable to prevent him from drifting left in the closing stages. However, it was a case of intimidation rather than direct interference, and the mare was not generally deemed an unlucky loser.

After a game effort in taking third place behind two rivals running down the centre in the six-furlong Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes (G1) on the final day of the royal meeting, Highfield Princess regained the winning thread with a comfortable odds-on success in the King George Stakes (G1) at Goodwood. From there she went to York, bidding for a repeat of last year's Nunthorpe (G1) triumph.

Though unable to get to grips with the front-running outsider Live In The Dream, she got the better of the rematch with Bradsell to the tune of three-quarters of a length. That could be the crucial piece of evidence as the pair meet again in the race in which the mare bolted up 12 months ago.

The Tim Easterby-trained Art Power presents contrasting statistical claims. On one hand, he is a very appealing contender due to his perfect record in four visits to the Curragh. On the other hand, he has contested 12 group 1 races over the course of three seasons without winning one, a distinct negative.

Speedy Ylang Ylang Represents Ballydoyle in Moyglare

O'Brien has landed the Moyglare Stud Stakes (G1) with some exceptional fillies such as Love, Misty For Me, and the outstanding Minding, and hopes will be high Ylang Ylang is of that ilk in Sunday's renewal.

The Moyglare is a "Breeders' Cup Challenge Series: Win and You're In" event offering a fees- and travel-paid berth to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf.

The Frankel filly Ylang Ylang has looked a consummate professional in her two starts. She had little trouble making a winning debut over seven furlongs at this track in June, racing with plenty of zest out in front under Ryan Moore before putting the race to bed with a potent turn of foot just after the two-furlong pole to win by 2 3/4 lengths.

Her victory in the Silver Flash Stakes (G3) at Leopardstown was similar as she again led from pillar to post, going through the race with ease while leaving the impression she could prove an even more formidable proposition if she got pace to aim at.

While there is no confirmed front-runner in the field, there might be some pressure applied to her at the head of affairs by the likes of Fallen Angel and She's Quality.

The Willie McCreery-trained Vespertilio shaped encouragingly in second behind Ylang Ylang in the Silver Flash and confirmed herself an exciting filly when she produced an electric turn of foot to go from last to first on her next start in the Debutante Stakes (G2) over course and distance.

She would appreciate a decent pace to aim at, which might not be forthcoming here, but if Ylang Ylang is unduly bothered on the front end then she could be the one coming home fast late.

The one filly with group 1 experience is Porta Fortuna, who represents Donnacha O'Brien. She lost her unbeaten status when taking on the colts in the Phoenix Stakes (G1) over six furlongs last month, but there was little shame in chasing home the talented Bucanero Fuerte on that occasion.

The Caravaggio filly is reunited with Frankie Dettori, who partnered her to victory in the Albany Stakes (G3) at Royal Ascot.

The extra furlong is the question mark, although she did stay on to good effect in a strongly run Phoenix.

2024 Guineas, Derby Favorite City of Troy Favored in National Stakes

There is something of an anomaly on the roll of honor for the Vincent O'Brien National Stakes (G1). Aidan O'Brien, who has won the race 11 times during his stellar career, has not trained the winner of it since Churchill in 2016.

Ryan Moore has been booked for City Of Troy and the Superlative Stakes (G2) winner is likely to be the one to bring up the dozen for O'Brien and end his unusually long drought in the race.

It is rare for a juvenile to earn a three-figure Racing Post Rating on their debut but City Of Troy was given 103 for his maiden win over course and distance in July. The third horse won next time out and the form looks solid.

It was his performance at Newmarket's July Cup meeting that took our breath away. He looked in his comfort zone throughout there and what he did from the furlong pole to the line was extremely easy on the eye. He put 6 1/2 lengths between himself and Haatem, who won the Vintage Stakes (G2) at Goodwood on his next start, and an RPR of 117 followed.

Everything about City Of Troy oozes class and he is a strong stayer over this seven-furlong trip. Moore will be keen to ensure this doesn't develop into a sprint given his main market rival Bucanero Fuerte displayed an explosive turn of foot when running away with the Phoenix Stakes over six furlongs.

Warm Heart Could Give O'Brien First Prix Vermeille Win

O'Brien has found the Prix Vermeille (G1) a hard nut to crack and, even allowing for a few long-priced pacemakers among his 15 previous starters, it is still something of a surprise that he is yet to win this prestigious French prize.

It is certainly not for the want of trying. Having hit the bar at the first attempt when Yesterday was beaten a head by Mezzo Soprano in 2003, O'Brien has saddled high-class runners-up in Magic Wand and Snowfall, while Tuesday was only fourth 12 months ago.

None of that is to denigrate the claims of Warm Heart, who showed her liking for fast ground when defeating her elders in the Yorkshire Oaks (G1) last month and who is reunited with the winning rider from that day, James Doyle.

The Coolmore partners also send the Joseph O'Brien-trained Above The Curve, who has shown high-class form at group 1 level over 10 furlongs and looks ready for a first try at 1 1/2 miles.
