

Mystik Dan Wins Three-Horse Photo in Kentucky Derby

Kentucky Derby.

A trainer since 1985, Kenny McPeek has won more than 2,000 races, including the 2002 Belmont Stakes (G1) with the longshot Sarava and the 2020 Preakness Stakes (G1) with the filly Swiss Skydiver. Yet before this year, two of the country's most prestigious races, the Kentucky Oaks (G1) and Kentucky Derby (G1), eluded him.

Not any longer.

In one of the great training feats in Oaks and Derby history, McPeek—teaming with his primary rider Brian Hernandez Jr.—won the May 3 Kentucky Oaks for 3-year-old fillies with Thorpedo Anna and May 4, the \$5 million Kentucky Derby with Mystik Dan when the colt prevailed in a three-horse photo finish with Sierra Leone and Forever Young.

In so doing, McPeek, a Kentucky resident, became just the third trainer in the two races' 150-year history to win both the Kentucky Oaks and Kentucky Derby in the same year and the first since Ben

"Plain Ben" Jones managed the feat for a second time in 1952.

"It still hasn't sunk in. You know, it's unbelievable," McPeek, 61, said of the accomplishment. "We came into the weekend thinking we had good chances, really big chances, both Friday and Saturday, and then to just have the horses pull it off for us."

Campaigned by his breeders 4 G Racing, Lance Gasaway, and Daniel Hamby III, as well as Valley View Farm, Mystik Dan, a son of Goldencents—Ma'am, by Colonel John, completed the 1 1/4-mile classic in 2:03.34 on a fast track.

Hernandez also joins select company, becoming just the eighth jockey to capture both races, the last of which was Hall of Famer Calvin Borel in 2009.

The 38-year-old rider—who as a younger man, idolized Borel, a fellow Louisiana native—recalled watching Borel's rail-skimming tactics in notching his three Kentucky Derby victories. He did not just watch; he learned.

In Borel-like fashion in Saturday's Kentucky Derby, he angled Mystik Dan to the rail soon after the start, placing his mount a few lengths off the early pace, as Track Phantom shot to the lead with longshot Just Steel and favored Fierceness in hot pursuit.

There, Mystik Dan remained, tracking the leaders, as Track Phantom established moderate fractions of :22.97, :46.63 and 1:11.31. Then while in fourth, opportunity arose when Track Phantom drifted narrowly off the fence. That provided the opening Mystik Dan needed, and he shot through a narrow gap on the inside, desperately close to the rail.

"We might have took out a little bit of the inside fence, but that's OK," Hernandez quipped. "Once he cut the corner, he got a little separation on the closers that were forced to kind of go around horses and he was able to hold them off."

He did, but just barely. After striking the front with a mile in 1:37.46 and opening up a two-length midstretch lead, he lasted for a nose victory over a wide-rallying Sierra Leone. Japanese invader Forever Young was another nose back. It took placing judges a couple of minutes to separate the first three finishers before the official result was posted.

The Derby, often called as "the greatest two minutes in sports," became the longest two minutes in sports in terms of the photo wait for Hernandez, who did have the luxury of watching slow-motion replays that appeared to show Mystik Dan narrowly in front despite a favorable head bob from Sierra Leone.

The crowd of 156,710 at Churchill Downs exclaimed when the results were announced.

McPeek felt his horse had won, giving him a Derby win in his 10th attempt, nearly 30 years after Tejano Run became his first starter with a runner-up finish in the 1995 Derby.

Mystik Dan, a rail-skimming, eight-length winner of Southwest Stakes (G3) in the mud earlier this year and most recently a wide third in the Arkansas Derby (G1), paid \$39.22 for a \$2 win wager.

Along with his earlier achievements, McPeek now seems a near certainty to soon take his place among the sport's legends in the Hall of Fame, perhaps by next year. Asked how he feels on the brink of such an honor, McPeek replied, "Goosebumps."

Mystik Dan's time was the slowest since 2019 when Maximum Security crossed the wire first in the Derby over a wet track in 2:03.93, only to be disqualified for interference, resulting in the elevation of Country House to first.

The stretch run between runner-up Sierra Leone and Japanese invader Forever Young was also rough, with the two making repeated contact down the stretch. They were also separated by a nose.

Besides impacting the second and third place, the contact they had and corrections from their jockeys may also have stalled their momentum in pursuing Mystik Dan. Stewards did not post an inquiry, nor was there a rider's claim of foul.

"There definitely was some bumping in the lane there," Brown said. "My horse does tend to lean in and lug in a little bit, so maybe it's him actually causing it or whatever.

"I wish there wasn't a horse there, but that's their right to be there."

"He wanted to lean in today and made it a little difficult," Sierra Leone's jockey, Tyler Gaffalione, added. "I had a hard time keeping him straight, and that definitely cost us. He gives you everything, very responsive, but he loses concentration."

For Brown, the loss left him disappointed in the outcome, though not in his late-running horse. The Gun Runner colt started as the second favorite in the Kentucky Derby after winning the Risen Star Stakes (G2) and Blue Grass Stakes (G1) earlier this year.

"You get beat a nose in the Kentucky Derby—it's a tough one," said the four-time Eclipse Award-winning trainer, who is 0-2-1 with nine Derby starters.

Domestic Product, his other entrant Saturday, ran 13th. Nearly winning the Derby for Japan was Forever Young, whose defeat by two noses was the first loss of his six-race career. Off poorly and in 16th place of 20 horses down the backstretch, he rallied wide, ahead of Sierra Leone until late, giving the Americans all they could handle.

Louisiana Derby (G2) winner Catching Freedom ran fourth, 1 3/4 lengths behind Forever Young.



Another Japanese horse, T O Password, rallied from 18th to grab fifth. Japanese runners are now o-for-8 in the Kentucky Derby, though they turned heads with how they fared Saturday. Never before had a Japanese horse run better than sixth in the race.

Rounding out the 20-horse field after T O Password were Resilience, Stronghold, Honor Marie, Endlessly, Donorch, Track Phantom, West Saratoga, Domestic Product, Epic Ride, Fierceness, Society Man, Just Steel, Grand Mo the First, Catalytic, and Just a Touch.

Reigning 2-year-old male champion Fierceness was one of the biggest disappointments of the race. A record-setting 13 1/2-length winner of the Florida Derby (G1) in his last start, he continued his history of alternating banner performances with subpar efforts. Seemingly well positioned, pressing the pace three-wide after hopping at the start, he came up empty after John Velazquez said he became a bit aggressive after he asked him to recover from being a step slow at the break.

"When I let him go, he just didn't have it."

Saturday's milestone running of the Kentucky Derby, run for a record purse, featured most, but not all, of the best 3-year-old dirt horses in the world.

Absent from the race were horses trained by Bob Baffert amid Churchill Downs Inc.'s continued ban of the trainer imposed after his horse Medina Spirit tested positive for a prohibited race-day medication in 2021. Medina Spirit was disqualified from his first-place finish in the 2021 Derby, resulting in the promotion of the Brad Cox-trained Mandaloun to first.

Muth, who had beaten Mystik Dan last month in the Arkansas Derby (G1), was one such Baffert trainee ineligible for the race. Muth is expected to compete at Pimlico Race Course in the May 18 Preakness Stakes (G1), the 1 3/16-mile second leg of the Triple Crown.

The third and final leg of the Triple Crown is the June 8 Belmont Stakes (G1), which this year will be run at 1 1/4 miles at Saratoga Race Course owing to ongoing construction at Belmont Park.

If Mystik Dan exits the Kentucky Derby in good condition, he would seem a viable candidate for further Triple Crown participation.

The mating to Goldencents was recommended by McPeek. A two-time winner of the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1) in 2013-14, Goldencents stands for \$10,000 at Spendthrift Farm in Kentucky. A top-25 sire last year, Goldencents is on the rise in 2024 buoyed by the success of Mystik Dan.

"You just wonder if this is real. You just won the biggest horse race in America," co-owner and co-breeder Gasaway said. BH

MYSTIK DAN tracked the leaders in rail skimming fashion, slipped throughto make a bold bid nearing the quarter pole, came t o level terms entering the stretch, shook clear approaching the furlong marker, dug in dogged y and was fully extended to prevail by the slimmest of margins. SIERRA LEONE settled in hand, tucked in along the rail, shifted out a bit on the backstretch, took closer order between rivals it frough the second turn, worked his way out eight wide entering the stretch, exchanged burns with FOREVER YOUNG (JPN) from the three-sixt eart is pole to the furlong grounds, fought on tenaciously under sternleft handed urging but was deried. FOREVER YOUNG (JPN) lurged at the start andwas away slow, was caught in traffic into the first tenand steaded near the fifteen-sixteenths pole, leveled into stride and moved out five wide, mounted a long drive a half mile out, moved up swiftly through the second turn, came seven wide into the stretch, swapped burns repeatedly with SIERRA LEONE through the upper stretch, battled on stubbornly between rivals thereafter but was narrowly bested. CATCHING FREEDOM settled off of the inside, tucked in on the secondtum, followed the winner into the lane along the inside, continued on well andwas making up ground TO PASSWORD (JPN) broke a step slow, checked in traffic into the first turn, settled off the inside into the backstretch, came under a ride rearing the seven-sixteenths pole, looped seven wide through the second turn and into the stretch, had the jockey lose the crop near the furlong marker and continued on well under a fierce hand ride. RESILIENCE settled in pursuit from mildback three wide, ranged up with a bold six wide gain turning for home to bid along with inner rivals entering the lane but failed to keep pace with his innermost counterpart in upper stretch, got outkicked for place between rivals in midstretch and yielded. STRON GHOLD stalked behind the leaders and from the three path around the first turn, came under rousing within striking range in the four path turning for home, bid along with rivals on both sides entering the lane, but fall ed to keep pace with his inner counterpart, while getting brushed and floated inwardly by an outer rival in upper stretch and gave way. HONOR MARIE was jostled hard early between rivals, settled toward the inside, was caught intraffic and steadled into the first turn, leveled into stride while saving ground, moved up on the second turn, wered out sharply inside the three-sixteenths and boxed on willingly.

ENDLESSLY leaned outwardly at the start, was allowed to settle at the rear along the inside, improved in the threeto four path and between horses around the far turn before swinging len wide into the lane, then moved up willingly with reaching contention. DORNOCH settled saving ground, was shuffled back in traffic inside the half mile marker, came again between foes, was bumped and checked hard of theels near the quarter pole, angled out into the stretch but came up empty in the drive. TRACK PHANT OM showed the way inside of a pair of prompting foes, remained hounded inside of rivals one path off the rail around the far turn but was headed by challengers on either side entering the lane and folded. WEST SARATOGA raced forwardly two wide and between horses, chased from the two to three path around the far turn, was bumped and jostled by an innerrival to the fourto five path entering thelane, was brushed again by an innerfoe in upper stretch and gave way. DOMESTIC PRODUCT broke a step slow before being bumped and pinched between horse sat the start, tugged while off of the pace four wide into the first turn, got brushed and put into tight quarters between foes while getting outmoved by a wider rival around the far turn, shifted to the nine path into the lane and passed tired ones. EPIC RIDE stalked outside of the leading trio, came under a drive in the five path and bet ween horses around the far turn but retreated entering the lane then shied from an innerfoe and brushed an outer rival at the three sixteenths pole and faded. FIERCENESS hopped at the start, prompt edithe pace three deep, vie din the four patharound the far turn, but was surpassed by an outer pair and an inner bidder entering the lane and folded between horses. SOCIETY MAN raced off of the pace four wide, then failed between horses around the fair turn. JUST STEEL was bumped hard early, was quickly into stride and contest edithe pace between horses, faitered midway through the second turn and failed GRAND MO THE FIRST ir ushed

It is a marriage of convenience, in the best sense of that word. Trainer Kenny McPeek and jockey Brian Hernandez Jr. are partners in peaceful coexistence.

No stress. No tension. "No drama," McPeek says, repeatedly.


He said it May 3 after Hernandez rode Thorpedo Anna to the trainer's first victory in the Kentucky Oaks (G1), and he reiterated the sentiment May 4 after Hernandez beat Sierra Leone by Mystik Dan's nose to win the Kentucky Derby (G1).

No trainer had completed the Oaks/Derby double since Ben Jones did it in 1952, and few trainers have developed so strong a bond with their first-call rider than the one McPeek has forged with Hernandez. Where others clash, they coordinate. Listen to them long enough and you're sure to hear an echo.

"He entrusted me and lets me kind of go out there and do things and not tie my hands to force horses to do things they might not like to do," Hernandez said. "I think my riding style fits with his training style, as well, where we let the horses develop and let them take you around there and try to find the trip with them.

"It's just been a great relationship, and I have been fortunate enough to fall into a good spot."

McPeek's methodology is somewhat unusual for top-tier trainers. Openly unconcerned with his winning percentage, he prefers to play the long game, letting his horses "learn some lessons," even when that means courting adversity and losing races.

"We tend to—I'm almost going to say 'schooling race' the first time out, which usually hurts our percentage," McPeek said Saturday. "And Brian's familiar with that process every time. We try to teach horses to take a little dirt in their face. This colt (Mystik Dan), he had some schooling in his first start. He could have won first time out if you wanted him to, but he wouldn't have learned anything."

Hernandez embraced McPeek's philosophy early in their relationship and rapidly earned his trust. Saturday's Derby 150 was McPeek's 10th Run for the Roses and Hernandez has ridden for the trainer the past three years he's had horses in the race. He is the only rider McPeek has used more than once in the country's most famous race. When the two men are finished celebrating their wondrous weekend, Hernandez is scheduled to ride all three of McPeek's entries on the May 9 card at Churchill Downs—two allowance optional claiming races and a starter allowance.

"Frank Bernis is Brian's agent and there's nothing complicated about either one of them," McPeek said. "It's all business, business, business and there's no drama. And I like no drama, especially the older I get.





"I want to know that somebody is there; that you don't have to beg them to come. You don't have to worry about them not showing up, conflicts and things like that. But more than anything, I put Brian on horses on a daily basis—good horses and average horses—and he does a good job on every one of them. I have rarely come back and said, 'That was horrible.' No, I don't have that."

What he has is a jockey as steady as a metronome. Riding primarily for McPeek, Hernandez has exceeded \$10 million in earnings three years in a row and now ranks fourth in 2024 earnings after his back-to-back breakthroughs at Churchill Downs.

"I have just been very fortunate," Hernandez said.

"Like Kenny said, a big part of this goes back to my agent,
Frank. We got together 12 years ago and we were—at
the time, we were both kind of struggling, just kind of
making ends meet. We made a pretty good career for the
last seven, eight years riding for Kenny.

"...We have learned the program. With the first-timers and the horses like that, we know they don't need to win the first time out. If they are really, really good, they will overcome just the little things, that they will get in trouble and stuff like that and they will be able to overcome it."

Saturday, Hernandez followed a formula made famous by three-time Derby winner Calvin Borel, who was the seventh and most recent rider to sweep the Oaks and Derby in 2009. Clinging close to the inside rail to save


ground, Hernandez had paint on his boot by the end of the race according to McPeek. Given his miniscule margin of victory, every inch he saved proved to be crucial.

"I had no doubt that he was going to get him around there in perfect order," McPeek said. "He's the difference in winning and losing today, for sure."

He is McPeek's go-to guy pretty much everywhere he goes.

"Maybe I will go to Saratoga and I will ride some other riders and go, 'Boy, I miss Brian. I miss Brian,' because he doesn't make very many mistakes. And I don't want you to write that at all. I don't want anybody to know how good Brian is."

CDI REPORTS RECORD HANDLE FOR KENTUCKY DERBY RACE, DAY

Inlike the 150th Kentucky Derby (G1) itself, where winner Mystik Dan edged Sierra Leone by the closest of margins, no photo was needed to determine if the business records for Churchill Downs Inc. were a winner or loser. Records were established for wagering on the Kentucky Derby race, full day wagering, and betting for the week.

After the conclusion of the May 4 card, Louisville, Ky.-based CDI reported strong business results for Kentucky Derby week, which is a huge driver for the gambling company's racing division. The company credited improvements at the track—including a new \$200 million paddock and all of its premium seating—with aiding those gains.

All-sources betting on the May 4 Kentucky Derby card at Churchill Downs reached \$320.5 million, up 11% from last year's previous record of \$288.7 million.

Betting on this year's 20-horse Derby race totaled \$210.7 million, up 11% compared with last year's previous record of \$188.7 million for that 18-horse race. Handle typically rises with larger fields.

Derby week handle was a record \$446.6 million, up 8% from last year's previous record of \$412 million. Combined all-sources handle of \$395.8 million was up 9% compared to the prior record of \$363.6 million reported last year for both the Kentucky Oaks (G1) and Derby days. The Oaks set records despite intermittent showers during the afternoon and a sloppy track.

The Derby Day crowd of 156,710 was up 4% from last year's 150,335. The record of 170,513 was established in 2015.

Churchill also reported its TwinSpires.com advance-deposit wagering service saw \$92.1 million in wagering on Churchill Downs races for the Derby Day program, a 22% increase over last year's record of \$75.5 million.

The Derby race handle of \$60.9 million for Twin Spires was a record, up 24.5% over last year's then-record of \$48.9 million.

With two horses in the race from Japan, all-sources wagering from Japan was \$10.1 million, eclipsing the previous record of \$8.3 million from 2022. Forever Young finished third and T O Password finished fifth.

As in prior years, the Derby growth continues to improve the company's earnings before taxes and other factors are taken into account, the company said in a release.

"The Kentucky Derby is a testament to the enduring spirit of sportsmanship, unity and the power of tradition," CDI CEO Bill Carstanjen said in a statement. "We were honored to debut our transformational new paddock as we celebrated this milestone 150th Run for the Roses. The new paddock has fundamentally enhanced the experience of all of our guests as they pass through our front gates and is a steppingstone to

the next chapter of this timehonored event. As we reflect on 150 years of our storied past, we remain committed to innovating new experiences for Derby fans."

nogram Trading, under Flavien Prat, squeezed through along the rail inside Naval Power and Frankie Dettori in the final strides to win the \$1 million Turf Classic Stakes (G1T) May 4 at Churchill Downs by a head.

Webslinger was third after looming boldly at the top of the stretch with a wide move and Integration finished fourth.

"We had a great trip," Prat said. "We were able to save ground as much as we could. A great job by Chad and his team to get him ready after such a long layoff."

Prat said the stretch run tactics were dictated partly by circumstances and partly by his confidence in Program Trading.

GUN PILOT LANDS FIRST GRADED WIN IN CHURCHILL DOWNS

It was a monumental moment in the winners' circle of the \$1 million Churchill Downs Stakes (G1) as Gun Pilot earned jockey Cristian Torres his first grade 1 victory and became sire Gun Runner's 10th grade 1 winner.

"It feels great," Torres said. "It's my first Derby week riding here. To get a grade 1 is a special day. It's something I cannot explain. I feel like I'm in a cloud right now. I'm blessed."

Torres did not disappoint on the big stage, giving what trainer Steve Asmussen called a "textbook" ride. Breaking well, Torres tucked Gun Pilot in behind the speed battle of Here Mi Song and Zozos.

After fractions of :22.56 and :44.87, Torres called upon his steed approaching the quarter pole. Drawing alongside the pacesetters with a furlong to go, Gun Pilot moved clear to open up and win by 2 1/2 lengths, stopping the clock for seven furlongs in 1:21.95. He paid \$12.68 for a \$2 win bet.

Here Mi Song and Zozos continued their duel the length of the stretch, respectively finishing second and third. "He's a nice horse, he does everything that I ask him for," Torres said. "When I asked him to run at the quarter pole, he was there for me."

The first top-level victory was the fifth career win from 11 starts for Gun Pilot as he increased his career earnings to \$975,575.

"He's unbelievably talented," Asmussen said. "I chased (the Kentucky) Derby with him last year. This is what he's meant for. I'm so fortunate to have him. I am so pleased for Three Chimneys and the whole group."

It was an extra special day for Three Chimneys, who bred the son of Gun Runner, as it was the stallion's 10th grade 1 winner, and second on Saturday's Churchill Downs card.

Gun Runner stands for \$250,000 at Three Chimneys Farm near Midway, Ky. Gun Pilot is Gun Runner's fifth graded stakes winner this season, a group that includes Blue Grass Stakes (G1) winner Sierra Leone and Vahva, who captured the Derby City Distaff (G1) four races earlier May 4 to become the stallion's ninth grade 1 winner; as well as grade 2 winner Red Route One and grade 3 winner Il Miracolo. Sierra Leone is entered in the Kentucky Derby (G1) Saturday.


"Huge win with this beautiful Gun Runner," Asmussen said. "He's absolutely beautiful, meant for this stage.

For him to come through today means so much to us. Such a big horse for Three Chimneys and winning for (Three Chimneys chairman) Mr. (Gonçalo Borges) Torrealba in those silks today means a lot."

Asmussen said there is no immediate target for Gun Pilot, as he had been pointing specifically at this race all winter. The June 8 Metropolitan Handicap (G1) at Saratoga Race Course was mentioned as a possibility for his next start.

"We targeted this and he came through for us," Asmussen said. "Cristian believed in this horse like I did. He had come back so good this spring. We felt seven-eighths was perfect for him, and he came through today on a stage that matters."

VAHVA TURNS TABLES ON ALVA STARR IN DERBY CITY DISTAFF

Top female sprinter Vahva got revenge on grade 1 winner Alva Starr in another enthralling renewal of their rivalry in the \$1 million Derby City Distaff Stakes (G1) at Churchill Downs May 4.

After defeating Alva Starr in the Raven Run Stakes (G2) at Keeneland Oct. 21, Vahva was defeated by her nemesis

in her season debut, the April 6 Madison Stakes (G1) at Keeneland. In the rubber match, it was Vahva who came out on top.

Stalking in third just about a length behind Alva Starr, Vahva got a perfect trip in the clear for jockey Irad Ortiz Jr.

Following fractions of :22.36 and :45.12 set by Spirit Wind, Alva Starr pounced from her second position at the five-sixteenths pole with Vahva in hot pursuit.

With eyes trained on her rival, Ortiz drew his filly alongside at the eighth pole and drew off to prove an impressive winner, defeating Alva Starr by two lengths while completing the seven furlongs in 1:21.75 and paying \$5.44 for a \$2 win bet.

"She broke sharp," Ortiz said. "I just go with the flow, let her settle and find her stride. When it was time to go, I asked her and she was there."

Bred by Woodford Thoroughbreds, Vahva was sold for \$280,000 at the 2021 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. It was a packed winners' circle at Churchill Downs as she is owned by the partnership of Belladonna Racing, Edward Hudson Jr., West Point Thoroughbreds, LBD Stable, Nice Guys Stables, Manganaro Bloodstock, Runnels Racing, Steve Hornstock, and Twin Brook Stables.

The 4-year-old daughter of Gun Runner picked up her fifth victory in 12 career starts, pushing her career earnings to \$1,578,310 while picking up her first grade 1 victory.

"I'm really pleased with her, she's a filly that means a lot to our entire team," trainer Cherie DeVaux said. "She's just one that has a nice special presence about her."

Vahva is the fourth graded stakes winner this season for Gun Runner, who stands at Three Chimneys Farm for a fee of \$250,000. Other graded winners include grade 1 winner

Sierra Leone, Red Route One, and Il Miracolo.

The Derby City Distaff is part of the Breeders' Cup Dirt Dozen Bonus Series, awarding Vahva \$15,000 in bonus credit to offset entry fees for the \$1 million Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint (G1) at Del Mar Nov. 2. Alva Starr received a credit of \$7,500 for her runner-up performance and Flying Connection picked up \$3,750 for finishing third.

DeVaux said the Breeders' Cup is the goal for Vahva. When asked if she would consider her star to be at the top of her division, DeVaux said "most definitely."

The Aug. 24 Ballerina Handicap (G1) at Saratoga Race Course, a Breeders' Cup Challenge Series event for the Filly and Mare Sprint, will be among Vahva's summer targets according to DeVaux.

Alva Starr and Vahva could rematch again later this year.

"Everything went to plan," the runner-up's jockey Tyler Gaffalione said. "She broke sharp, but I don't think she really wants to use all that speed early. If you can wait on her, she'll have a little more of a finish." BH

SEIZE THE GREY GRABS GRADED STAKES WIN IN PAT DAY MILE

Seize the Grey wins the Pat Day Mile Stakes at Churchill Downs

The Preakness Stakes (G1) gained a likely starter May 4 when MyRacehorse's Seize the Grey won the \$594,710 Pat Day Mile Stakes (G2) on the Kentucky Derby (G1) undercard at Churchill Downs.

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas said his vote will decide the next race among the partners of MyRacehorse, which sells fractional shares in horses, but he thinks the decision will be popular if the colt comes out of the race well.

"I think that the 680 people will want to vote for that," he said of the Triple Crown's middle jewel. "My vote'll be the one that counts, but I'll vote with them. We've got nothing to lose (if) we stick him in there. And he earned his way to run in the Preakness. He's qualified for it, and he's nominated for it, so why wouldn't we give those people that opportunity. That's what we're getting paid for, to make that many people happy."

Lukas considered entering Seize the Grey in the Kentucky Derby, but the colt would have been on the also-eligible list.

"I agonized over running him in the Derby," Lukas said. "We wanted to put him on the also-eligible and hope for some scratches. That's a negative feeling in a lot of ways because you put them on the also-eligible, and then you hope somebody else has bad luck so you get in. I didn't like that feeling. ... I wish they wouldn't even have that."

So he chose the 100th running of the Pat Day Mile for 3-year-olds instead. "I thought this horse would fit this mile pretty good," he said.

It was the third win and first graded stakes score in nine starts for the gray or roan son of Arrogate out of the Smart Strike mare Smart Shopping and raised the earnings for the \$300,000 yearling, purchased at Fasig-Tipton's The Saratoga Sale, to \$619,938. And it was the fourth win in the race formerly known as the Derby Trial for Lukas.

Seize the Grey entered the Blue Grass Stakes (G1) after a third in the Jeff Ruby Steaks (G3), but finished seventh at Keeneland. Lukas said he's had other horses run off form at Keeneland, citing Thunder Gulch finishing fourth as the favorite in the 1995 Blue Grass.

Seize the Grey "has trained so well here, I wasn't worried about that," Lukas said.

Lukas said the race was run just as he discussed with jockey Jaime Torres in the paddock before starting from post five. Eventual third-place finisher Vlahos led most of the way until overtaken by the winner approaching the sixteenth pole. The winning margin was 1 1/4 lengths over favored Nash with a time of 1:35.96. Vlahos held on for third.

"If you'd have stood there with me when I talked to Jaime Torres before the race you'd have thought we saw it already," Lukas said. "It was exactly like we said. We said stay a lap down, stalk the speed. Don't lose touch with the speed, don't lose touch with the lead. Stay there, and then when we get to the eighth pole or approaching it, go inside-outside and go for it. He rode it right to the letter.

"I could tell I was loaded around the three-eighths pole," Torres said. "He went back into the bridle really strong and never gave in. What an amazing atmosphere and race to win."

Godolphin's Nash finished second after being unable to catch Seize the Grey in the stretch.

Jockey Florent Geroux on Nash said he had a "great stalking trip on the outside. I was able to follow the 11 (Vlahos) and it looked like the (eventual winner) had to back out a little bit. Right before the half-mile, I thought I was in a lovely spot. I wish he would have finished a little bit stronger for me because I thought he was there for me pretty much the whole race, but when I asked him to go it took him a little while to get the engine going. I was able to secure second but he really had to fight pretty hard to get that. ... The winner just split horses and was a little bit better than us."

Seize the Grey, at odds of 9-1, returned \$20.84 for the win in the 12-horse field. BH

COGBURN CONTINUES TO THRIVE ON GREEN IN TWIN SPIRES

Solid throughout his career, Cogburn has found his home sprinting on the turf.

After blitzing out of gate 14 in the \$569,770 Twin Spires Turf Sprint Stakes (G2T) May 4 at Churchill Downs, Cogburn settled into tracking front-running Coppola through a quarter-mile in :22.61 before edging to the lead through a half-mile in :45.27 and flashing another gear in early stretch to draw off to a 2 1/4-length score in the 5 1/2-furlong test for 3-year-olds and up.

"I was so concerned about the outside draw and then he took care of that in one jump," said winning trainer Steve Asmussen. "The 14 hole is a lot to overcome but his break cured that problem."

In eight starts on the dirt to launch his career, Cogburn earned a grade 3 placing but he was moved to the turf in May 2023 and responded with three straight stakes wins sprinting on the grass, capped by a victory in the Troy Stakes (G3T) at Saratoga Race Course.

In two of those wins, he had troubled starts but won anyway. On Saturday he corrected that problem with a quick start.

"He has found a home, he really has. His turf races have been beyond excellent," Asmussen said. "And we're very fortunate to have him. The good start hasn't been typical for him but then he broke so well. We thought that he was doing very well going into this race off the layoff."

Cogburn, with Irad Ortiz Jr. up, completed the 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:03.16 on good turf as the son of Not This Time won his 5-year-old debut. He was followed home by grade 2 winner Filo Di Arianna and Mischief Magic, who has opened his North American campaign with back-to-back grade 2 placings.

As for the winner, the connections were confident that Cogburn was prepared for a big effort.

"He was sharp, the trainer had him ready today," Ortiz said. "The way he broke, Steve (Asmussen) told me he was ready. Today he was running so good, there was no stopping him."

"That was a nice effort off that long a layoff but he'd been training so well and we were pleased with the way he was going," co-owner Clark Brewster said of Cogburn's first start since September.

Bred in Kentucky by Bellary Bloodstock, Cogburn is out of stakes-winning Saintly Look mare In a Jif, who has produced three winners from as many starters.

Brewster went to \$150,000 to purchase Cogburn at the 2021 Ocala Breeders' Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training where he was consigned by Pick View.

Cogburn is the third graded stakes winner this season for Not This Time, who finished among the top 10 stallions on last year's general sires list. His other graded stakes winners are Arzak, also sprinting on the turf in the Shakertown Stakes (G2T) at Keeneland, and No More Time. Not This Time stands for \$150,000 at Taylor Made Stallions near Nicholasville, Ky.

Asmussen said the long-term goal will be the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint Stakes (G1T). BH

rifectas are difficult to hit, particularly with competitive racing on Kentucky Derby (G1) day at Churchill Downs, but apparently less so if Chad Brown is running multiple entries.

The trainer, who has pulled off 1-2-3 finishes at other tracks, struck gold, silver, and bronze May 4 beneath the twin spires when his three starters swept the top three positions in the \$665,000 Churchill Downs Turf Mile Stakes (G2T). In a test of late acceleration, Chili Flag outfinished Coppice

may have come down to recency. Chili Flag had a start in 2024, having won the March 2 Honey Fox Stakes (G3T) at Gulfstream Park, while Coppice was unraced this year after keeping demanding company in eight starts the past two seasons in Britain for owner/breeder Juddmonte Farm.

Chili Flag scored by a neck. Delahaye was another

1 3/4 lengths behind in third.

"You can see from what I've done through the years, if the horses deserve to be in the race, I individually enter them. I put great jockeys on them, and I let them settle it out on the track." said Brown, a four-

time Eclipse Award winner. "But what a good feeling to see your three settling down by the wire."

Brown won the race for the fourth consecutive year and for the fifth time since 2017.

The winner, a 5-year-old chestnut by Cityscape, rallied down the center of the course in the stretch to complete a mile on drying-out "good" turf under Irad Ortiz Jr. in 1:35.95. Ortiz notched his third win in the Churchill Downs Turf Mile, having won last year with Brown trainee Fluffy Socks and in 2019 on Beau Recall.

"I was able to roll with her when I had to. Every time that I've ridden her, she's given me that confidence to come running late," Ortiz said.

She paid \$10.06 to win as the race's second favorite

behind 8-5 favorite Coppice. The latter was away a bit awkwardly and raced in eighth early, as Ag Bullet and Walkathon set fractions of:23.40,:47.20, and 1:11.43. After saving ground on the second turn, Coppice found daylight into the stretch but did not have enough to outfinish her stablemate.

"Super run after a long layoff," Coppice's jockey Frankie Dettori said. "(We)

came there to win, but it took a bit of time (for her to) kick, and she'll definitely improve from the race. It was a great effort."

Bred by Finanza Locale Consulting out of the Pivotal mare Flag Day, Chili Flag initially raced in France, where she was foaled. Then, in 2022, she was purchased

> by Mandore **International Agency** for the equivalent of \$137,217 at the Argana Saint-Cloud Arc Sale from the Guarnieri consignment.

She has since been raced in the United States with a domestic record of 4-3-1 in nine starts.

Chili Flag outkicks Coppice to win the Churchill Distaff Turf

TRIKARI SHOCKS SOPHOMORE RIVALS IN AMERICAN TURF STAKES

Making his graded stakes debut on the Kentucky Derby (G1) undercard, Trikari gave his connections, backers, and the gathered mass of humanity something to remember with a 47-1 upset win in the \$596,560 American Turf Stakes (G2T) May 4 at Churchill Downs.

While Amerman Racing's Trikari entered off two victories and a close second in his past three starts—including a score in his stakes debut March 23 in the Rushaway Stakes at Turfway Park—bettors looked elsewhere in the talented field of 14 3-year-olds trying 1 1/16 miles on the turf.

But Trikari, the longest shot in the field, would prove up to the challenge, rallying three wide past fading favorite Legend of Time in the stretch and then surging past determined front-runner Formidable Man to win his graded stakes debut by 1 1/2 lengths.

"It was really special performance from a very nice and improving colt," said winning trainer Graham Motion. "He ran a great race."

Trikari and jockey Umberto Rispoli saved ground early but stayed close in fourth or fifth as Formidable Man raced through a half-mile in :48.15 and six furlongs in 1:12.96. Formidable Man, campaigned by William and Suzanne Warren, would repel a challenge from 7-5 favorite Legend of Time to open a clear advantage in the stretch before Trikari's winning move.

"This horse is a very special horse to my career," Rispoli said. "I won my 2,000th race (the Rushaway) aboard him and I can't thank his connections enough for keeping me aboard."

Trikari returned \$96.34 to win, \$40.20 to place, and \$22.98 to show. Formidable Man held second and Lagynos rallied from eighth early to pick up third. Cugino edged favorite Legend of Time for fourth. Formidable Man, a son of City of Light and trained by Michael McCarthy, landed his first graded stakes placing.

"He ran very well, I'm very proud of him," McCarthy said "First time traveling, big crowd like this, the horse ran well and was a game second."

Lagynos seems to have found a comfort level on the turf as the son of Kantharos has placed in back-to-back graded stakes on the grass.

Trikari is a son of Oscar Performance, a grade 1 winner at 2, 3, and 4 campaigned by the Amermans, who went to \$27,500 to purchase Trikari at the 2022 Ocala Breeders' October Yearling Sale, where he was consigned by Ordonez Thoroughbreds, agent.

Bred in Kentucky by Michael Slezak and Amy Boll, Trikari is the first winner out of the grade 3-winning Harlan's Holiday mare Dynamic Holiday, who is a full sister to stakes winner Cat's Holiday and half sister to grade 2 winner Varenka, grade 3 winner Lift Up, and stakes winner Appealing Cat.

Trikari is the fourth graded stakes winner this season for Oscar Performance, who stands for \$25,000 at Mill Ridge Farm near Lexington. Other graded stakes winners this season for the sire include Endlessly, who also is campaigned by the Amermans and is entered in the Kentucky Derby (G1) on Saturday's card; Red Carpet Ready; and Tumbarumba. BH

THORPEDO ANNA TIRED, BUT DOING WELL MORNING AFTER OAKS

All was well at the Kenny McPeek barn the morning after Thorpedo Anna dominated the \$1.5 million Kentucky Oaks (G1) at Churchill Downs May 3.

"We went back to the house," McPeek said of his post-Oaks celebrations. "We had a house full of family and some of the partners came over. It was a pretty quiet evening."

The 3-year-old daughter of Fast Anna was a little tired after setting quick early fractions en route to a 4 3/4-length victory, leaving about one quart of the six quarts of grain she received after the race. McPeek said this is typical of his runners.

"She left a little bit of grain last night, about half a scoop," McPeek said. "No big deal. It's something we watch regularly. She typically eats up every night. She was a little tired, she ran hard."

The victory was a first in the Oaks for McPeek, who has finished second in the race three times. The trainer said he felt relief finally adding his name to the record books.

"I was going to be upset if she didn't win," McPeek said. "We felt like she was sitting on tilt. ... It was nice to check that box."

McPeek stated before the race that he would have felt confident running his star filly against the boys, but plans for Thorpedo Anna's next start are still under consideration.

In 2020, McPeek-trained Swiss Skydiver finished second in the Kentucky Oaks before defeating Kentucky Derby (G1) winner Authentic in the Preakness Stakes (G1). That year, the Preakness was held in October one month after the Derby due to the Covid-19 pandemic. With the May 18 Preakness just two weeks away, McPeek ruled out the same path for Thorpedo Anna.

Connections of Thorpedo Anna, who is not nominated to the Triple Crown, would have to pay a \$150,000 supplemental nomination fee in addition to her entry fee in order to make the filly eligible for the remainder of the series.

"She left a little grain last night. We will let her recover from her race yesterday and take it from there. But she's not going to run the Preakness. And we wouldn't want to supplement anyway. It didn't make any sense."

Should McPeek supplement to only the June 8 Belmont Stakes (G1), the supplemental fee drops to \$50,000. With the Belmont contested at 1 1/4 miles this year at its temporary home of Saratoga Race Course, McPeek said the final Triple Crown jewel could be under consideration. However, he mentioned the June 7 Acorn Stakes (G1), run at 1 1/8 miles at Saratoga, as "the next logical step."

Regardless of plans for her next race, McPeek said the ultimate goal will be the \$600,000 Alabama Stakes (G1) at Saratoga Aug. 17. BH

SOUL OF AN ANGEL BEATS RANDOMIZED IN RUFFIAN

n May 3, Idiomatic, the winner of last year's Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1), won her 2024 debut, taking the La Troienne Stakes (G1) at Churchill Downs.

A day later, the results were not as kind for the Distaff runner-up.

After leading from the start, Klaravich Stables' Randomized weakened in the final furlong and wound up second to 24-1 shot Soul of an Angel in the \$200,000 Ruffian Stakes (G2) May 4 at Aqueduct Racetrack.

"She was probably a little tired at the end. She gave me the left lead down the lane and was getting tired. She ran a decent race," said jockey Manny Franco after the Chad Brown-trained 2023 Alabama Stakes (G1) winner ran for the first time since her half-length loss in the Nov. 4 Distaff.

The Ruffian marked the first graded stakes win for C Two Racing Stable and Agave Racing Stable's Soul of an Angel. Now trained by Saffie Joseph Jr., the 5-year-old daughter of Atreides was sixth in the March 9 Azeri Stakes (G2) in her previous start for trainer Gerald James.

"She was on her toes and really feeling herself all week," said assistant trainer Electra Boone.

Soul of an Angel (\$51), bred by Westbrook Stables in Kentucky out of The Factor mare Factor One, covered the mile in 1:35.40 under Trevor McCarthy. She is the first graded stakes winner for her sire, Atreides, who stands at River Oaks Farm in Sulphur, Okla., and is the second-leading sire in the state through May 3.

MASTER PIECE TAKES FORT MARCY

Kentucky Derby (G1) day is apparently trainer Rick Dutrow's lucky day.

A year ago, he returned from a 10-year suspension on Derby day and won with his very first starter.

On Derby day 2024, Dutrow won two races at the Big A, capped by Master Piece's dramatic victory by

a neck over favored Ottoman Fleet in the \$194,000 Fort Marcy Stakes (G2T).

Owned by Michael and Julia Iavarone, Nicholas Zoumas, and Frank Argano, Master Piece (\$7) was coming off a third in an April 6 allowance race at Keeneland. He closed out 2023 with a win in the Red Smith Stakes (G2T) at Aqueduct.

Godolphin's Ottoman Fleet came up short at 1-2 odds in his bid for a second straight Fort Marcy win. The 1-2 favorite made a strong wide move on the turn and seemed ready to roll past Master Piece, but veered out in the stretch, losing his momentum, and settled for second.

Master Piece, an 8-year-old son of Mastercraftsman bred in Chile by Haras Don Alberto, was ridden by Dylan Davis and covered the 1 1/8 miles in 1:48.68. BH

GOLD PHOENIX OUTGAMES PRINCE ABAMA IN WHITTINGHAM

Trainer Phil D'Amato's stable may not have been able to win the Kentucky Derby (G1) with Stronghold, but it didn't miss a beat at Santa Anita Park. D'Amato trainees Gold Phoenix and Prince Abama ran one-two in the May 4 Charles Whittingham Stakes (G2T) to give D'Amato his second victory on the card.

Both of those wins came for horses owned all or in part by Little Red Feather Racing. Rexford took the third race for the ownership group, while Little Red Feather owns Gold Phoenix with Sterling Stables and Marsha Naify.

Balladeer set most of the fractions in the 1 1/4-mile Whittingham. Gold Phoenix, ridden by Kyle Frey, raced in third on the rail, moved outside on the second turn, and gamely surged between horses. He held off closers Prince Abama and favored Planetario to score by a head in 2:00.91. Prince Abama outfinished Planetario by a nose for second.

The Whittingham win comes with an automatic entry to the July 6 Eclipse Stakes (G1) at Sandown Park in England.

"I think the team needs to discuss whether to go to Royal Ascot and just stick around England for a few extra weeks and have a nice start to the summer," said Gary Fenton of Little Red Feather.

Irish-bred Gold Phoenix won last year's Frank E. Kilroe Mile Stakes (G1T), Del Mar Handicap (G2T), and Eddie Read Stakes (G2T). Mighty Universe bred



Play the Music paid \$8.70 to win as the second choice in the wagering. Trained by Mark Casse, the 4-year-old Mo Town filly was winless in two previous runs on the all-weather but she had won the Lightning City Stakes two starts back going five furlongs on the turf at Tampa Bay Downs Feb. 24.

The Whimsical was her first graded win. Bred in Kentucky by Laura McKinney, Play the Music is out of the unraced Jump Start mare Hey Little Sister. Play the Music sold for \$110,000 at the 2021 Keeneland September Yearling Sale and then Glassman purchased her for \$300,000 the following year at the Ocala Breeders' Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training, where she was consigned by Eisaman Equine.

Storyteller Racing's Peacock Lass finished second to give the 4-year-old daughter of American Pharoah her first graded black type. There was a dead heat for third between Dolce Sopresa and Baby No Worries. BH

NOTABLE SPEECH PROVES SUPERIOR IN TWO THOUSAND GUINEAS

For so much of last year Charlie Appleby had to play the gracious loser in Europe. He would appear fleetingly in the winner's enclosure to offer congratulations to the victorious connections, before disappearing to chew over performances that were underwhelming by his own high standards.

By the end of the season, Arabian Crown, Ancient Wisdom, and Dance Sequence had emerged as potential classic horses, but it was relatively unknown Notable Speech who was pitched into the May 4 Two Thousand Guineas (G1) at Newmarket.

It was a ballsy call on the face of it—a three-time allweather winner who had not raced at 2 making his debut on grass in the year's first classic. What a decision it was. Notable Speech was electric.

So much talk during the winter had focused on City of Troy, the unbeaten champion 2-year-old who would conquer the world this year. Yet he performed terribly on his first test as a 3-year-old and was soundly defeated; no doubt Appleby could sympathize with the colt's trainer Aidan O'Brien having had many such days in 2023.

Notable Speech oozed class under jockey William Buick as the race boiled down to a straight shootout between himself and Rosallion in the final stages. Rosallion's connections had shouted loudly in the build-up to the race about how fast their horse was, but even his scintillating speed was made to look ordinary by his opponent.

"What he did on his last start really made us think there's a racehorse here for sure, it had a real 'wow factor'" Appleby said. "From that point to when we galloped him here everything we were learning about him gave us confidence. Paul Eddery sat on him the other day and he got off him and said the favorite would have to be very good to beat him, and he's sat on a lot of good horses.

"Will said if he was a pattern winner as a 2-year-old you'd be delighted with what he did in that gallop and you'd be happy coming here to take on the world. Last year the lads who rode him said he was a nice horse and he just went weak, but he's not looked back this year."

Having offered the congratulations last year, Appleby was the recipient of them this time—including from Richard Hannon, the trainer of Rosallion and third-placed Haatem, who praised Appleby before saying: "I hate you," with a smile as he left.

In previous years, congratulations would also have been offered in the winner's enclosure for Sheikh Mohammed. The Godolphin founder continues to be absent from British racecourses, but his pleasure at owning and breeding Notable Speech was palpable, according to Appleby.

"He said, 'Namus, namus', which means well done, and I know he's delighted because he bred the horse as well. It means a lot to him and his family."

By Dubawi, Notable Speech is the first foal out of the winning Invincible Spirit mare Swift Rose, a half sister to Godolphin's 2021 Natalma Stakes (G1) winner Wild Beauty and group 3 winner Desert Wisdom, who is also by Dubawi.

Notable Speech was a second Two Thousand Guineas winner for Appleby, whose previous winner Coroebus in 2022 was ridden by Godolphin's then second jockey James Doyle with Buick having selected the eventual runner-up Native Trail.

Given all the top-class horses he has ridden, it was striking to see how stunned Buick seemed to be by the performance of his first Two Thousand Guineas winner.

"I've never ridden a horse with his acceleration. It was incredible really," he said. "He's got such a great mind and you can do what you want on him.

"Every time he ran at Kempton he improved but it was a significant gap he had to cross coming here. He was hard to measure up against a horse like City of Troy and the rest, but I knew he had something in his armory that they didn't—that acceleration.

"That turn of foot for a miler is incredible, I've never sat on a miler that has that sort of pace and speed. He went past them so easily that I could have sat there longer but when I asked him he just turned on. It's the first time I've won this race and it's such a great feeling and I'm delighted for the horse, for His Highness Sheikh Mohammed, for Charlie and the whole team."


