FURTHER ADO ROLLS TO VICTORY IN BLUE GRASS STAKES

Before **Ted Noffey** was sidelined with bone bruising earlier this spring, Spendthrift Farm appeared to have the favorite to win the May 2 Kentucky Derby (G1) at Churchill Downs.

Maybe it still does—or if not, one of the supporting favorites—in **Further Ado**, who scored an emphatic 11-length victory April 4 in the \$1,237,813 Blue Grass Stakes (G1) at Keeneland. His margin of victory was the largest in the historic race since **Sinister Minister** prevailed by 12 3/4 lengths 20 years earlier.

Just as he had in a 20-length maiden romp at the Lexington oval last fall, Further Ado skipped

over the Keeneland main track, gliding effortlessly under Irad Ortiz Jr. Fifth early in the 1 1/8-mile race, as John Battaglia Memorial Stakes winner **Great White** shot to the lead with fractions of :23.60 and :47.71, Further Ado advanced easily up to third on the backstretch, and took over with a three-wide advance to the lead coming into the stretch. Then, with Ortiz merely hand riding and showing his riding crop to Further Ado, the chestnut **Gun Runner** colt opened up, lengthening his lead all the way to the finish.

Ottinho, a half brother to Gun Runner by **Quality Road**, rallied for second, 1 3/4 lengths ahead of **Talkin** in third. **Creole Chrome** was fourth and Great White fifth.

But the seven-horse race was essentially a one-horse contest, particularly when second favorite **Reagan's Honor** regressed in his first stakes attempt, fading to sixth, and after losing two of the race's anticipated headliners—**Paladin** and **Class President**. Paladin was not entered after being injured last week, and Class President was scratched after not training satisfactorily.

The Brad Cox-trained Further Ado was timed in 1:49.58, the fastest time in the Blue Grass since dual champion and fellow Cox trainee **Essential Quality** sped the distance in 1:48.50 in 2021. Further Ado paid \$3.70 as the heavy favorite.

"I wish they'd run the Derby here," Cox quipped on NBC.

Further Ado is a winner at Churchill Downs as well, having won the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (G2) there last fall, though in more workmanlike fashion than in his runaway Keeneland victories. He took the Kentucky Jockey Club by 1 3/4 lengths.

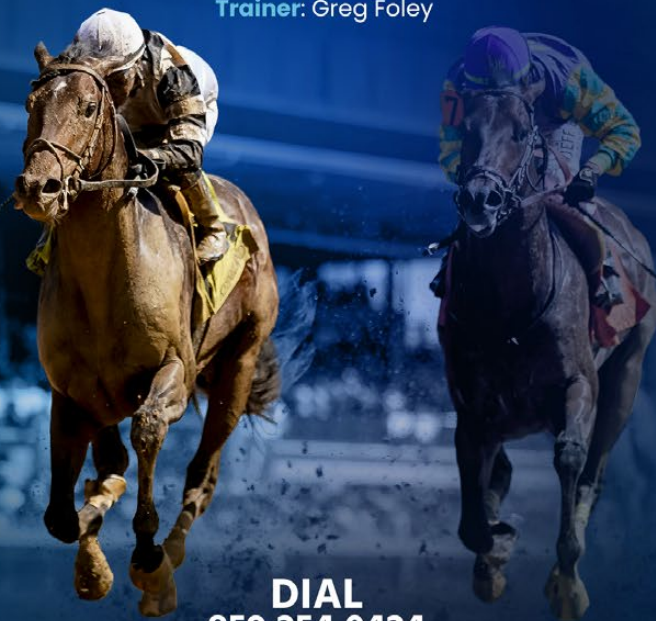
"He's obviously trained there a good bit and is obviously 1-for-1 over there," said Cox, who stables his best horses at Churchill Downs from much of the spring through fall. "He's put us in a great position. He's a great colt and I'm excited and proud of what he was able to accomplish today."

That accomplishment—a grade 1 victory, accomplished in front of prominent breeders in Kentucky—essentially earns Further Ado a place in the Spendthrift Farm stallion barn when his racing career is over.

"And that's really the goal of the operation," said Ned Toffey, general manager and chief operating officer at Spendthrift Farm.

Toffey acknowledged that the past six months have been a roller coaster ride of emotions, first with Ted Noffey's highlights, followed by the disappointment of his physical setback and a last-out second-place finish from Further Ado in the March 7 Tampa Bay Derby (G3), followed again by yet another high in the Blue Grass. And the Derby is yet to come.

The Blue Grass distributed Kentucky Derby qualifying points on a 100-50-25-15-10 scale to the race's top five finishers. Churchill Downs officials use qualifying points as a preference system when the Derby attracts more than its capacity field size of 20 horses.

With the win, Further Ado now has 135 points for the Kentucky Derby. Otinho has a total of 56, also leaving him well positioned to earn a starting berth if his connections wish to run him, though his trainer, Chad Brown, has through the years kept some horses in his barn to await the Preakness Stakes (G1), the second leg of the Triple Crown. Other Blue Grass competitors may not have enough to qualify.

Whether Ortiz will be along for the Derby ride on Further Ado is to be determined. The five-time Eclipse Award-winning jockey, never better than fourth in nine rides in the Derby, is also the regular jockey of the Todd Pletcher-trained [Renegade](#), who won the Arkansas Derby (G1) by 4 lengths March 28.

Ortiz said he would leave his choice of Derby mount to his agent, Steve Rushing. Most riders and their agents prefer to wait closer to the entries to make a firm decision. That can then give them an alternative if a planned mount cannot start because of a setback.

"I'm just happy to go to the Derby with a few good horses," Ortiz said of rides to consider.

Added Toffey, "We love Irad, but I'm pretty sure there will be a couple of very competent riders who would be more than willing to slide right in there if Irad wants to go with Renegade."

Twenty-three winners of the Blue Grass have gone on to have success in the Derby, the first leg of the Triple Crown, but none have been victorious since [Street Sense](#) captured the 2007 Derby after finishing second in the Blue Grass a month earlier. [Sierra Leone](#), winner of the 2024 Blue Grass, came close in the Derby that year running second, beaten a nose, to [Mystik Dan](#) in the three-horse photo finish with Japanese star [Forever Young](#) in the show position.

Further Ado, bred in Kentucky by John Oxley out of the grade 3-placed Sky Mesa mare [Sky Dreamer](#) was a \$550,000 purchase by Spendthrift Farm from the Six K's Training & Sales consignment to the 2025 Ocala Breeders' Sales Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training.

ALBUS TAKES FINAL WOOD MEMORIAL AT AQUEDUCT

Riley Mott grew up watching his dad, Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott, win a plethora of major races in New York.

So when the final Wood Memorial Stakes (G2) was contested at Aqueduct Racetrack, it seemed rather fitting that it featured a lesson in the circle of life.

It was like father, like son as the young trainer posted his first win in New York's definitive Kentucky Derby (G1) prep when Pin Oak Stud's **Albus** drew clear in the stretch to post a 1 1/4-length victory over a fast-closing 38-1 shot **Right to Party** April 4 in the 66th and final \$750,000 Wood contested at the Big A.

"I'm so tickled for the Bernhard family (Pin Oak Stud) and our team. We put in a lot of hard work every day and this is my life's work. I take a lot of pride in how we do things and how the barn is performing. It hasn't really sunk in yet, this year in general. Tomorrow is a new day, and we've got to wake up and work hard again," the 34-year-old Mott said.

With the Wood offering 100-50-25-15-10 qualifying points for the May 2 Run for the Roses at Churchill Downs, the son of **Yaupon** bred by Susan Casner picked up enough points in the mile-and-an-eighth 3-year-old stakes to wrap up a spot in the 1 1/4-mile opening leg of the Triple Crow, while racing outside of maiden company for the first time.

"After his maiden win (Feb. 27 at Tampa Bay Downs in his third and most recent start), the Wood Memorial was always on our mind. So, to have that come to fruition is really gratifying. Even if it is a (non-winners of two \$20,000 claimer), when you can put forth a plan and execute it effectively, it really is so much fun as a trainer," Mott said.

Mott will now be bringing two horses to the Kentucky Derby, as Virginia Derby winner **Incredibolt**, also owned by Pin Oak, has 60 points and is 13th on the list of qualifiers.

"Never would I have thought going into this year that would be happening, but we still have a long ways to go and I just hope both colts stay happy and healthy and that we can put them in the gate that day," Mott said. "This horse will go right to Churchill and is scheduled to leave (April 6). It's fun to take him there and be qualified for the Derby and not just be a bystander and watch. We're thrilled and we'll let the good times roll."

Chester Broman Sr.'s Right to Party was 11th in the field of 12 after a half-mile, but closed from seventh at the eighth pole to edge [Ocelli](#) for second by a nose and vault into the Kentucky Derby field with 65 points. The son of [Constitution](#) earned 15 points in his previous start, a third in the 1-mile Gotham Stakes (G3), and is now 12th on the leaderboard in the battle for one of 20 spots in the Triple Crown opener.

At the moment, Right to Party is not nominated to the Triple Crown, but trainer Ken McPeck said that "for sure" the late nomination fee would be paid.

"He ran super. Once he got more distance, he figured things out. He grinds it out. He deserves the nomination. He earned it," McPeck said.

[Iron Honor](#) was the 5-2 favorite in the Wood, but he had a rough, wide trip from post 12 and finished seventh.

With 50 qualifying points from a victory in the Gotham, he's 21st on the leaderboard and will need a defection in order to run. But trainer Chad Brown seemed willing to draw a line through Saturday's performance and ponder a start in the Run for the Roses.

"Let me go back to the drawing board. It was such a rough trip. This horse is really good," Brown said. "I didn't like how it unfolded at all for him after he got slammed (going into the first turn). He was flat on the bit down the backside. You'll see in the head on, he was pulling the whole way. It didn't really work out for him out there, but let me see how he comes out of it and go from there."

There was a fast pace in the 101st Wood as [Napoleon Solo](#) and [Talk to Me Jimmy](#) dueled through fractions of :22.92, :47.30, and 1:12.04. On the turn, jockey Jaime Torres moved Albus, who was eighth early on, four wide and he surged in the stretch to a half-length lead at the eighth pole and extended the margin from there.

Sent off at 11-1 (\$25.78), Albus covered the mile and an eighth in 1:51.71.

Albus, out of the Bernardini mare Adream, was bought for \$320,000 from the Taylor Made Sales Agency

consignment at the 2024 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. A half brother to grade 3 winner [Song of Spring](#), he is Adream's ninth and most recent foal and second winner.

Albus is the 10th black-type winner and first graded stakes winner for Yaupon, the 2025 leading freshman sire. Yaupon stands the 2026 season at Spendthrift Farm for a \$60,000 fee. **BH**

SO HAPPY ANSWERS DISTANCE TEST IN SANTA ANITA DERBY

As a son of champion male sprinter [Runhappy](#), [So Happy](#) wasn't supposed to be able to get the 1 1/8-mile distance of the Santa Anita Derby (G1). But he did—by 2 3/4 lengths—and the reasons could range from the practical to the spiritual.

First of all, credit the colt's own constitution and fortitude, along with an excellent training job by Mark Glatt. Then add in [Blame](#), his broodmare sire, who defeated the mighty [Zenyatta](#) in the 1 1/4-mile Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) in 2010. But the real truth could be it was a push from Dena Glatt, Mark's wife, who died unexpectedly Feb. 12 at age 57.

The distance was the biggest question mark, as So Happy squared off April 4 at Santa Anita Park against 6-5 favorite [Potente](#), a \$2.4 million yearling sale purchase who was undefeated in two starts from the Bob Baffert barn; Baffert-trained [Cherokee Nation](#); grade 1 winner [Intrepido](#); and three others.

Potente and [Robusta](#) set the early pace, with Potente being responsible for the first quarter-mile in :23.03. So Happy, under jockey Mike Smith, rated in third.

"Today he really felt fit and ready to race," Smith said.

The stalking position suited So Happy perfectly. He was able to challenge the leaders going into the second turn. Robusta began backing up, ultimately finishing last, but Potente stuck with So Happy around the turn and into the stretch.

The favorite gamely battled with So Happy, but So Happy "kept on going today," Smith said. In the final sixteenth, So Happy put away Potente to cross the wire 2 3/4 lengths ahead in 1:49.01. Potente was the best of the rest, coming home 6 3/4 lengths in front of longshot [Vitruvian Man](#) in third.

"There's more there in the tank for sure," Smith said. "I'm looking forward to going to Kentucky again."

So Happy earned 100 Kentucky Derby (G1) qualifying points with the win. The Santa Anita Derby also awarded 50-25-15-10 Kentucky Derby points for second through fifth.

So Happy races for Hans and Ana Maron's Saints or Sinners and Robert Norman's Norman Stables. The Marons are longtime clients of Glatt's, and over the years had become good friends with Mark and Dena.

"This is very emotional because of what Dena went through," Ana Maron said. "I kept saying it's not just for us anymore. You have to think about what a joy this will be bringing the Glatt family."

Mark Glatt, usually all business in posttrace interviews, spoke emotionally with Michelle Yu of Santa Anita about what the win meant and how the Marons have supported him.

"We have had an overwhelming amount of support that's helped us get through this very tough time," Glatt said. "(Dena) got that horse there today. I'm just so thankful to the owners for giving me this opportunity. They are big contributors to my stable. I just appreciate their friendship. Since Dena's passing, they've called me every night. They've just been tremendous."

Following that on-camera interview, Glatt gathered his more practical trainer thoughts and spoke about So Happy.

"He got back within a month's time, and horses are going to improve second time two turns," he said.

So Happy won his first two starts around one turn, including the 7-furlong San Vicente Stakes (G2), and then ran third behind Potente and Robusta in the 1 1/16-mile San Felipe Stakes (G2).

"I thought Mike put a beautiful ride on him today, settled him into a perfect spot," Glatt said. "Just having had a two-turn effort under his belt and getting back in in a relatively short period of time and then getting a really nice trip today was the difference."

Immediately after the race, Hans tried to process the fact that their horse could actually start in the Kentucky Derby.

"Hans loves this and this has been his dream," Ana said.

"It's pretty amazing," Hans said. "The horse took us here. Mike was always really confident. Today he got to settle, get in his rhythm, and run his race."

The Marons live in Chandler, Ariz., but recently bought a farm near Versailles, Ky.

"We've got broodmares," Hans said. "I've been messing around with this for about 50 years personally."

Leverett S. Miller bred So Happy in Kentucky, and Glatt bought the colt for \$150,000 at the 2025 Ocala Breeders' Sales March Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training. So Happy had previously sold for \$12,000 as a weanling at the 2023 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale and \$20,000 as a yearling at the 2024 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale. So Happy is out of winner **So Cunning**, a homebred for Leverett and his late wife, Linda.

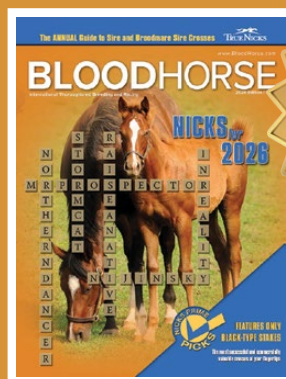

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ECLATANT RUNS DOWN GRAND JOB TO SCORE IN MADISON

In a dramatic edition of the April 4 Madison Stakes (G1) at Keeneland, **Eclatant** ran down **Grand Job** in the stretch to get the win in the \$629,357 event.

The Brad Cox-trained filly broke sharply under jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. and settled just off pacesetter **R Disaster**, who set fractions of :21.95 and :44.68. She continued to travel in hand, edging closer to the leader as they entered the turn. As they hit the stretch, one of the two Bill Mott trainees, **Grand Job**, took command with **Eclatant** hot on her heels. The two of them pulled well clear of their competition and battled down the stretch. **Eclatant**, so game, got the edge and hit the wire a nose in front in a final time of 1:21.84 for the 7 furlongs on a fast track. They were 6 lengths clear of **R Disaster**, who finished third.

Post-time favorite **Clicquot** rated midpack but weakened and was eased to finish last of eight. Mott's other runner, third choice **Ragtime**, never showed interest in catching the leader and finished seventh.

"I just tried to follow instructions to get behind the speed," winning rider Ortiz said. "The filly helped big time because she broke sharp. After that I just took my time. I was able to get her out at the three-eighths pole, which I did, and I felt good at that point to go ahead and start working on her, and she got there."

Eclatant won the Forward Gal Stakes (G3) at Gulfstream Park as a 3-year-old. She had two off-the-board finishes after that, leading to an eight-month layoff. She scored in her 4-year-old debut Feb. 15 at Gulfstream, and now the Madison in her second start back.

"I want to start by thanking Stonestreet for bringing her back at the age of 4," Cox said after the win. "I didn't know if she was going to get there. (The finish) was a head bob, and it went our way. I'm very proud of her, obviously. I thought her run off the layoff was huge at Gulfstream. I thought we'd go to a grade 2, grade 3, but (grade 1) was the right number. The time did her some good since the last win, and she responded big time today with a great run."

Eclatant paid \$9.58 for the win. Owned and bred by Stonestreet Stables, she became perennial leading sire **Into Mischief**'s 30th grade 1 winner. **Into Mischief** stands for \$250,000 at Spendthrift Farm in Kentucky.

She looked terrific, and Brad has done a really great job with her. Irad managed to get the trip from the one hole and get her there. That was fabulous. SAUDI CROWN, STORM'S WAKE, MY BOY PRINCE WIN STAKES

In just his second start in 10 months, multimillionaire [Saudi Crown](#) put his class on display, winning the \$340,125 Commonwealth Stakes (G3) at Keeneland.

Running off the lead from the start, Saudi Crown stalked the early leader [National Identity](#) from the far outside through the opening quarter-mile in :22.68. A surging [Dr. Saikali](#) came up along the rail to procure the lead by a length, reduced to a head after a half-mile in :45.73.

As the field moved around the far turn, Dr. Saikali, National Identity, and Saudi Crown bunched together with the latter coming forward toward the top of the stretch. Widening his lead to 2 lengths with a furlong left to the wire, Saudi Crown proved too strong, completing the 7 furlongs in 1:22.56 on a fast main track.

When coming into the fight with a heavyweight such as the son of Always Dreaming, the expectation is to win. Mission accomplished. But with the horse preferring extra time between starts, trainer Brad Cox said he doesn't know when and where the next start will be, but that over the last two to three months, Saudi Crown has "really been touting himself, that he's doing well."

The trainer said he anticipates Saudi Crown will get pretty good race figures out of Saturday's effort, which would "push me toward giving... maybe seven, eight weeks between now and his next run."

"It'd be cool to obviously try to win another grade 1 with him," Cox said of the 2023 Pennsylvania Derby (G1) victor. "I'm not certain which one that would be and, and, you know, there's some in Saratoga that might make sense."

The win moves Saudi Crown's lifetime record to 9-3-1 from 18 starts and \$3,686,508. He is owned by FMQ Stables and was ridden by Flavien Prat, who won last year's Commonwealth aboard [Extra Anejo](#).

[Crazy Mason](#) rallied from last to get second and National Identity was third. Saudi Crown paid \$4.02 for the win.

A FIRST FOR STORM'S WAKE

William Werner's homebred [Storm's Wake](#) conducted a furious rally down the stretch after racing toward the back of the field for almost the entirety of race to conquer the \$490,625 Appalachian Stakes (G2T). It is the first graded stakes win for the daughter of [Oscar Performance](#).

Despite being more than 6 lengths back, jockey Joel Rosario exhibited patience as he kept the 3-year-old filly engaged. Hitting the top of the stretch, Rosario swung her out seven wide. Five rivals were vying for the lead and another two were less than a length back.

But Storm's Wake (\$45.36) came out of the turbulence, powering ahead to edge [Imaginationthelady](#) by a neck in a final time of 1:35.51 for the mile on firm turf. The runner-up was a head in front of [Lion Lake](#), who was third.

"I thought she would appreciate the long stretch here and she got her chance," trainer Brian Lynch said. "There was a bit of pace in front of her and it really set up well for a filly who could close from out of it. I think she appreciated every step of the ground coming down the lane. We've always had a good feeling about this filly, and she's getting older and stronger and just maturing into racing."

Lynch also trained favored [Sister Troienne](#), who finished fifth. Last time out in the Herecomesthebride Stakes (G3T), [Lion Lake](#) came out on top, with [Sister Troienne](#) second, and [Storm's Wake](#) third.

"I thought she was in the perfect spot, and she made the lead. And (jockey Irad Ortiz Jr.) said that when she did (take) the lead, she lollygagged there a little bit. Everybody was running, and she just got beat," Lynch said of [Sister Troienne](#).

Lynch said the May 1 Edgewood Stakes (G2T) at Churchill Downs is the likely target for [Storm's Wake](#).

She is 3-0-2 from seven starts with \$461,925 in lifetime earnings.

MY BOY PRINCE BREAKS THROUGH

Ten times Ontario-bred [My Boy Prince](#) attempted to achieve graded glory. Four times he finished second, including being beaten by a neck in the 2025 Highlander Stakes (G2T) and 2 lengths in the Jaipur Stakes (G1T) in the start before that.

In his 11th try, the [Cairo Prince](#) gelding wasn't going to be denied.

Rallying down the stretch, [My Boy Prince](#) pulled ahead late for a 1 1/4-length win to capture the Shakertown Stakes (G2T) Saturday in a time of 1:02.11 for the 5 1/2 furlongs on the firm turf.

Saturday's victory was the payoff for trainer Mark Casse, who last year moved [My Boy Prince](#) to turf sprints.

"Last year, we started him at turf sprints in New York and he ran pretty good," Casse said. "We tried different things with him, but this year I gave him a break, brought him back, and that's what was presented to us. We tried it at Gulfstream, then we took him to Tampa, and I always felt this course would really suit him."

Jockey Jose Ortiz moved [My Boy Prince](#) to the center of the course as they entered the stretch to reel in leaders [Joe Shiesty](#) and [Yellow Card](#). After catching [Joe Shiesty](#), [My Boy Prince](#) matched him for five strides before turning on the jets.

"I was able to put him into a good position going into the turn," Ortiz said. "I just was waiting for the right time to take him outside and let him go, and when I did he was there for me."

Bred by Murray Graham Smith and owned by Gary Barber, [My Boy Prince](#) is now 9-6-2 from 23 starts with \$1,454,650 in career earnings.

He paid \$12.12 for the win. [Yellow Card](#) was second and [Mondogetsbuckets](#) completed the trifecta. **BH**

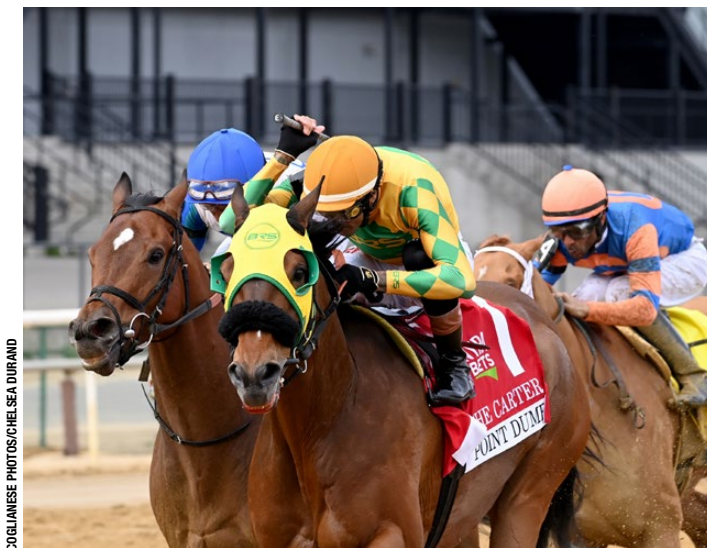
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POINT DUME SCORES EMOTIONAL CARTER UPSET OVER BOOK'EM DANNO

With an eighth of a mile to go in the April 4 \$291,000 Carter Stakes (G2), **Point Dume** looked as though he may be in deep water. After setting the pace, he prepared for the onslaught of champion male sprinter **Book'em Danno**, who would draw directly alongside.

However, if there was one lesson the 5-year-old **Into Mischief** gelding may have learned from the humans who surround him daily, it would be to never quit. Just like those humans, especially owner Bryan Bushey, **Point Dume** dug deep, found more, and battled for a neck victory over the champ.

a gateway into the industry for many of his friends and family members since. Always sporting a smile and wearing a pair of shorts, he has become one of the most loved figures on the Penn National Race Course backstretch, finding time to give back to those who take care of his horses. He said the backstretch community there was having watch parties in support of Point Dume.

In 2024, Bushey was diagnosed with stage 4 pancreatic cancer. At the time, he was given just five months to live. But Bushey possesses the same fighting spirit that Point Dume displayed Saturday and, two years after his diagnosis, he stood triumphantly in the Aqueduct Racetrack winner's circle surrounded by family and friends on his birthday, celebrating the first graded victory of his career. The win was extra meaningful as, after several good months, he recently had to begin undergoing chemotherapy once again.

"Just being here; being here is No. 1," Bushey said. "The win is icing on the cake."

The gelding, who was claimed by Bush Racing for \$40,000 in July 2025 at Penn National, has taken the Busheys on a journey they never expected. In November, he took the team to Churchill Downs to compete beneath the twin spires in the Claiming Crown Jewel. At the time, given their business is purely claiming horses, they believed that was the pinnacle achievement of their decades of hard work.

But Point Dume kept improving.

Exiting the Claiming Crown, he finished second in a Parx Racing stakes before winning a \$100,000 handicap at Laurel Park. Then, he took the General George Stakes at Laurel Park Feb. 14 in front-running fashion by 3 3/4 lengths. On Saturday, he was cross-entered for the \$100,000 Frank Y. Whiteley Stakes at Laurel Park where the connections thought he'd be an odds-on favorite. Instead, they loaded up their friends and family in a limo and went north to Aqueduct to take on the big boys.

"This is beyond our wildest dream," Dave Bushey, Bryan's son, said. "Kentucky was a dream, this is seriously a dream. I am going to pinch myself riding back in that limo tonight. This is not real, I am floating on air, this is not real. I fell to my knees after that race.

"We came up with all the people who are most important to us, our family," he continued. "Day in and day out, the guys behind the scenes. We wanted it to

be an experience for everyone, win or lose, because we knew we had a legitimate shot. We were joking upstairs when we were eating dinner, we're kind of just a bunch of hillbillies from central Pennsylvania and here we are rubbing elbows with people who are serious in this game. I can't put it in words."

The unreal outcome came thanks to a fantastic front-running ride by Edwin Gonzalez, who got Point Dume out of the inside post and on the lead to set fractions of :23.01 and :45.70. Atlantic Six Racing's Book'em Danno settled in fourth behind horses. Turning for home, Paco Lopez found a seam and pushed Book'em Danno through. The reigning champion male sprinter, making his first start since August, drew even.

It was then that Gonzalez called upon his mount. He said Point Dume always felt comfortable, and was ready to give it his all.

"I was waiting with (Point Dume) a little bit," the rider said. "I got close to (Book'em Danno), he pricked his ears and got the job done."

Watching the horse fend off Book'em Danno in a final time of 1:22.53 for 7 furlongs created elation for the whole team, especially for trainer Timothy Kreiser. The trainer, who began his training career in 1993, earned his first graded victory.

"This is my 43rd year being at the racetrack," Kreiser said. "I felt my heart stop for about two seconds right before the wire."

The Carter reunited Kreiser and Gonzalez, who teamed up with great success when the jockey used to ride at Penn National.

"He won hundreds of races for me, and he's my kind of rider, we like speed," Kreiser said. "We go to the front; if they catch us they catch us. If we have the best horse, they can't catch us."

The victory was an 11th in 31 career starts for Point Dume, who was bred in Kentucky by Sea Horse Breeders. Out of the dual grade 1-placed Malibu Moon mare [Maya Malibu](#), he becomes the seventh graded stakes winner this season for seven-time leading sire Into Mischief, who stands at Spendthrift Farm for \$250,000 in 2026.

He paid \$16.86 for his upset Saturday. Repole Stable's [Be You](#) finished third.

Book'em Danno may have been beat, but ran well off the long layoff. Trainer Derek Ryan said after the race he was concerned about the 7-furlong distance and would have preferred a 6-furlong option. However, he still plans to move on to Saratoga Race Course, where

Book'em Danno won three graded stakes last year, for the True North Stakes (G3) June 6.

"I worked him the last time in Tampa—he's very good, we know that, but I think he needed the race today," jockey Lopez told New York Racing Association publicity. "He feels great. I feel like he is more heavy (conditioned) and comfortable—he grew up, that horse. He seems to be doing very well."

GRAMMY GIRL UPSETS IMMERSIVE IN DISTAFF

Another Eclipse Award winner—[Immersive](#), the champion 2-year-old filly of 2024—was upset later on the card in the \$139,500 Distaff Stakes (G3) when [Grammy Girl](#) swooped past on her way to victory in a scratch-reduced four-horse contest over 7 furlongs.

Last early but always within a few lengths of front-running [Hold Your Breath](#), as that one went to the lead with splits of :22.92 and :45.66, Grammy Girl swung into action with a wide bid on the turn and took over in early stretch. She opened up a 1 1/2-length edge with a furlong to run and maintained that advantage to the wire over Immersive, who outfinished [Jody's Pride](#) by a head for the place. The winner was clocked in 1:23.47 under Hall of Famer Javier Castellano, paying \$11.30 for a \$2 bet.

Immersive, who pressed the early pace in her first start as a 4-year-old, came under early urging from jockey Manny Franco, and was slow to respond, falling back to third at the eighth pole. She leveled out late for secondary honors.

Saffie Joseph Jr. trains Grammy Girl, a 5-year-old daughter of [Mastery](#) out of the Songandaprayer mare [Song Girl](#), for Red Storm Stable, Miller Racing, and Flower Power Stables. A former claiming horse, Grammy Girl captured her second consecutive stakes race and her first at the graded level. **BH**

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ALWAYS A RUNNER GETS UP TO WIN GAZELLE

If you couldn't tell by her name, [Always a Runner](#) has been a horse that trainer Chad Brown and owners Douglas Scharbauer and Three Chimneys Farm have always been high on. She proved their patience and expectations correct April 4 when scoring in the \$200,000 Gazelle Stakes (G3) at Aqueduct Racetrack.

With her victory, she clinched a spot in the May 1 Kentucky Oaks (G1) at Churchill Downs as the top five finishers were awarded qualifying points on a 100-50-25-15-10 scale. Despite being a filly he always thought of as an Oaks horse, Brown wasn't sure if she would make it.

Last year, Always a Runner developed a bad case of pneumonia, as did a colt in Brown's care, [Emerging Market](#). In a weird twist, fast forward to the spring and that seemed to be an omen of good luck, as Always a Runner won the Gazelle two weeks after Emerging Market won the Louisiana Derby (G2).

"Both of them had to leave my care and go in a hyperbaric chamber (because of pneumonia)," Brown said. "This filly's pneumonia was more serious than (Emerging Market's) and that's why they didn't start in the fall. ... I was just sick over it, because I really felt I had an Oaks and a Derby horse in both horses."

After debuting a 6 1/2-length winner Feb. 6 going 1 mile and 40 yards at Tampa Bay Downs, Always a Runner looked like an Oaks horse in the Gazelle, a race Brown said was a "last-minute decision" to run in.

Settling sixth on the rail down the backstretch beneath Dylan Davis, Always a Runner waited patiently while taking kickback. Red White and Blue Racing's [Pashmina](#) set fractions of :23.84, :48.51, and 1:13.00, as she led by herself. Davis launched his filly up the rail at the three-eighths pole and rallied to Pashmina's outside in a hurry by the quarter pole.

Pashmina sneaked away again off the turn, but once Davis got Always a Runner to focus in the lane, she locked in and ran Pashmina down to win by 1 1/4 lengths. Over a track rated fast—but had received quite a bit of rain as the fillies were in the paddock—she completed 1 1/8 miles in 1:50.97, 0.74 seconds faster than the boys in the Wood Memorial Stakes (G2) one race later. She was 10 lengths clear of [Paradise](#) in third.

Always a Runner is the first foal out of the grade 2-placed Malibu Moon mare [Always Carina](#), who is a half sister to 2019 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1T) winner [Structor](#). She brought \$1.05 million from Scharbauer, who co-owns with breeder Three Chimneys, at the 2024 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. Taylor Made Sales Agency consigned the filly.

Although 2-for-2 and proven at the distance, Brown said he still is uncertain about whether or not he'd want

to run in the Kentucky Oaks, or if it would be asking the filly for too much too early.

"I think it could go both ways. Big risk, big reward," Brown said. "I don't want to be careless with these horses, but she's really talented. She's not that big, but she's handy and a very athletic sort. The Oaks, you don't have the 20-horse field (like the Derby). Is there that much risk? I don't know, I'd have to look at the field and look it over and talk to the owners. My gut would tell me it's not that risky."

Always a Runner is one of seven graded stakes winner this year for Gun Runner, who was also represented Saturday by Blue Grass Stakes (G1) winner [Further Ado](#) and Santa Anita Oaks (G2) winner [Meaning](#). Gun Runner stands at Three Chimneys for a \$250,000 fee in 2026. **BH**

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FAVORED MEANING STORMS HOME IN SANTA ANITA OAKS

If the connections to Santa Anita Oaks (G2) winner **Meaning** look familiar, it's because the same group triumphed a year ago in the Santa Anita Derby (G1) with **Journalism**. The connections turned to Santa Anita Park with a filly this time, one who has marched up the ladder with a professionalism that should serve her well in the Kentucky Oaks (G1).

Seven 3-year-old fillies broke from the gate in the April 4 Santa Anita Oaks, with Bob Baffert-trained **French Blue** going to the front. Baffert's other runner, **Forced Entry**, got away slowly, and jockey Mike Smith pulled her up before the first turn.

Meaning settled into fourth under jockey Juan Hernandez, as French Blue traveled the first quarter-mile in :22.88 and a half in :46.55. Meaning angled out at the five-sixteenths pole, and **Brooklyn Blonde** made a move around leaders French Blue and **Red Cherry** to poke her head in front between calls around the second turn.

Once Meaning found clear running on the outside, she ranged up alongside of Brooklyn Blonde to challenge. Those two battled briefly in upper stretch before Meaning, the 9-10 favorite, went on to score a 2-length victory in 1:43.99 for 1 1/16 miles. Brooklyn Blonde finished second, 13 3/4 lengths ahead of third-place **Bank Shot**.

Forced Entry came back under her own power after being unsaddled and accompanied by an outrider.

"She broke really well, but she must have hit herself leaving the gate," Smith said of Forced Entry. "She was real choppy and didn't feel comfortable. I would rather not take any chances, so I wanted to pull her up."

Added Baffert: "We checked her out and she seemed fine. She must have hit herself leaving the gate."

Michael McCarthy, who also conditions Journalism, trains Meaning for owners Bridlewood Farm and Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, two of Journalism's primary owners. Aron Wellman, Eclipse's president and founder, noted that while Meaning had to alter course midway through the race, it didn't stop her onslaught.

"It got a little tight," Wellman said. "The three just kind of stopped in front of her, and J.J. had to check and go around. It wasn't overly dramatic. Once he got her out in the clear, she took care of business from there on."

Meaning has impressed her connections from the very beginning, being a daughter of **Gun Runner** out of the **Into Mischief** mare **Figure of Speech**.

"With fillies especially, it's about trying to pick up on nuances—intelligence, class," Wellman said. "She had all of that at the yearling sale."

Bred by Stonehaven Steadings in Kentucky and sold for \$440,000 at the 2024 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, Meaning last year broke her maiden in her debut and finished fourth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) in only her second start. She is now 2-for-2 in 2026, having first captured the Feb. 8 Las Virgenes Stakes. Meaning earned 100 qualifying Kentucky Oaks points in the Santa Anita Oaks, which also offered 50, 25, 15, and 10 points for second through fifth.

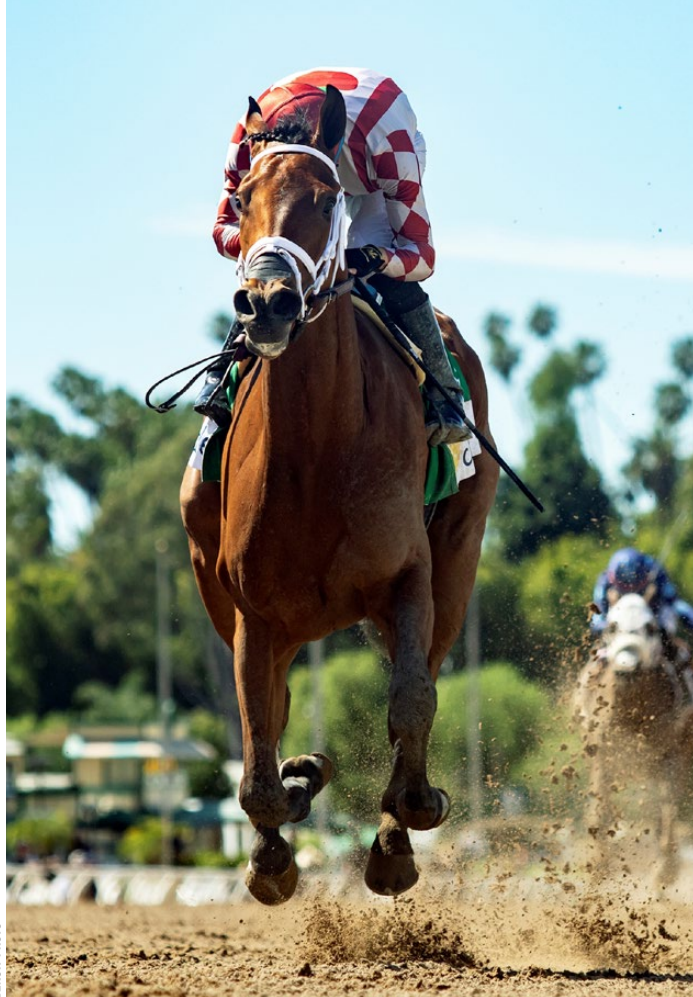
SPIRITED BOSS UPSETS MONROVIA STAKES

Later on the card, the Florida-based **Spirited Boss** shocked favorite **Queen Maxima** in the Monrovia Stakes (G3T).

Trained by Jose D'Angelo, Spirited Boss broke cleanly under jockey Mike Smith but trailed the field while **Amorita** posted fractions of :21.94, :44.45, and 1:06.21. She saved ground along the rail as the field moved down the hill. The fillies and mares crossed over the dirt and moved into the stretch, and Spirited Boss was well within striking range. Set under a drive in the final sixteenth, she came head to head with the leader and edged clear to win by three-quarters of a length on the wire. Amorita held second while Queen Maxima settled for third.

The daughter of **Street Boss** completed the 6 1/2 furlongs on the firm downhill turf in a final time of 1:12. She paid \$38 for a \$2 wager, and earned her first graded stakes win on her first trip to California. **BH**

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BHA WEIGHING ROOM UPGRADES WILL BE 60% COMPLETE BY MAY

It is expected that 60% of weighing room upgrades that were deemed necessary by the British Horseracing Authority will be completed by early May once more racecourses have started their flat turf seasons.

After a [Racing Post exposé](#) last April, the BHA imposed various deadlines for important work that addresses issues such as placement of equipment, availability of hot water, damp and mold, and appropriate facilities for female jockeys.

The regulator had hoped racecourses would reach the 60% threshold prior to the Lincoln meeting at Doncaster last weekend, but further grace is being given to the tracks that have yet to stage their first flat turf meetings.

Any course that fails to meet the required standards by Dec. 31, 2027, will be unable to stage fixtures until the redevelopment of facilities is complete.

Dale Gibson, racing director for the Professional Jockeys Association, said: "I'm in no doubt that without the Racing Post's support for this hugely important project there would still be many more racecourses dragging their heels.

"At the time of the report, just 16 of the 59 British racecourses had modern, equitable changing facilities for male and female riders and a gender-neutral valet area. Twelve months later, 37 tracks will provide jockeys with modern, clean, and nondiscriminatory changing facilities when their seasons recommence.

"This has been a game-changer for female riders, but the improved facilities, including better rest areas, working showers, clean and comfortable changing rooms, and decent canteens, where jockeys can more easily chat to each other, are making a material difference to all riders."
